### National President's Notes

### **CLAY TARGET SHOOTING NEWS**

On attending a shoot recently I was again approached by a shooter who complained that his CTSN had once again not arrived until the end of the month. We work with a very late deadline for the CTSN — one month prior to printing, to enable associations, clubs and contributors to supply the most up to date information possible.

Almost all other monthly publications have a three month deadline. We do our utmost to get everything to the typesetter well by his deadline, he in turn does his utmost to get the copy to the printer as soon as he can, and the printer in turn, prints the magazine and gets it to the mail house as quick as he can.

Once at the mail house we are then reliant on it and Australia Post to do their part. We have no control over this final stage of having the magazine delivered.

The question then is "what can we do to overcome this problem?" There is no quick fix answer, but it has been suggested that we extend the deadline for copy to two months prior. I do not believe this is what the shooter/reader would want.

Some years ago we conducted inquiries to establish the feasibility of having the magazine printed by a commercial publisher. The first thing he wanted to do was make a three month deadline, and the second major change he wanted was to remove the results section. Granted there are a number of members who would be happy to see this section removed, but the results of a questionnaire circulated among shooters some time ago found that the one section they wanted retained was the results section.

Further to this, he wanted the major part of the magazine to consist of advertisements he was able to obtain. The ACTA would not be able to vet these advertisements.

After assessing the CTSN, the publishing house who conducted the feasibility study suggested that the CTSN met all the requirements of an in house publication. To change would involve considerable cost to all concerned without the guarantee of success as a commercial venture.

Contributors in the main are our own members and we are continually asking for articles. If you are one of the minority that like to criticise the content of the magazine, why not send in a story about your own club or shoot, or an item you may feel would be of interest to all? It does not have to be 100% specific to clay shooting, but be of interest to members.

Most stories printed in the CTSN are written and submitted by our own members in their own time. In the main they are not edited by ACTA staff. If you feel that any area of our association, or any of our disciplines are not getting what you consider a fair coverage, fix this by writing a story all will enjoy and benefit from.

As for the simple answer to our problem. There is no quick fix solution, all I can say is that we will continue to do our best to get the magazine to you on time, but every now and then, this will not be possible. We can only do our best.

Last month I omitted to mention the outstanding performance of Clive Barton, who won a Bronze medal at the World Cup. As you can see from the story in this magazine, Clive and the rest of the team shot on a layout that had been finished the day before the event. Clive shot extremely well and continues to grow in status on the World stage. Well done Clive.





Arthur Turner, HOA in both double barrel and double rise.




Bill lies, Overall High Gun winner.






A very popular Kiwi veteran Murray Havill was successful in taking out the Veterans event with a score of 49/50 off 20m.









A creditable sixth to Adam and silver to the Team. Russell's stomach bug had became worse during the doubles so his was a courageous effort to finish as high as he did.


Whilst the double trap had been on, the skeet team had arrived and practiced at the other club and were keen to get into competition.


The final medal count - Australia: Gold - one, Silver - two, Bronze - one.

Vins vast mechanical knowledge, together with his quiet unassuming nature, will be sadly missed by all who knew him and especially the people of Dookie and Surrounding District.



### CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS JUNE 1999

Earlier this year I wrote an article containing my thoughts on the problems we face with refereeing in Trap and Skeet shooting in Australia, and some possible solutions to those problems. That article was published in the March edition of CTSN. Refereeing as such, where it entails ruling, adjudicating and scoring, as it does in most other sports, is seldom ever an issue, and when it is, such things can usually be adequately resolved after the occurrence. However, in our sport, the referee's duties also include launching the target, so a material effect, albeit unintentional, in the equity of the competition, inevitably results.

At the time I believed that the most viable method of launching a target was to use a human puller who possessed all the necessary qualifications to perform that function correctly. Such as enough experience to have the timing correct and sufficient powers of concentration to maintain that timing, each and every time, over an extended period. At small to medium shoots, where the shoot marshall can hand pick the referees, this works OK. But at large shoots, such as State shoots and the Nationals, this intimate control is impossible, and a rotational roster system (which I facetiously refer to as the "lucky dip" method) is the only workable option under the current rules. The inability of this system to provide consistent pulling is it's major downfall and the root of the bulk of our refereeing problems.

Thus I concluded that until we get the necessary rule changes to allow shooters to pull their own targets, or supply their own pullers, the best option would be phono-pulls, such as they use in Olympic Trench. This conclusion involved a great deal of soul searching, because it involved choosing the lesser of two evils. If you could not guarantee a continual supply of good human pullers, you were better off with the disadvantages of phono-pulls, than you were with the problems created by inconsistent pulling. Another option, which I did not consider at the time, was to attempt to eliminate the disadvantages of phono-pulls so that you could have the best of both worlds. The reason I did not consider this option was because, at that time, such a



concept was only a pipe dream. However, that situation has now radically and dramatically changed, which is the whole basis for me writing this article.

First, let's examine the inherent disadvantages of conventional phono-pull equipment for Trap or Skeet shooting. Initially they are the same as in Trench, such as:

They require a trained operator - pushing buttons, making adjustments, and overseeing their operation

They can be prone to interference from other noises on the layout, such as guns closing or ejecting etc

They can be prone to interference from shooting on other layouts

They can be prone to interference from other unassociated background noises

However, the biggest disadvantage of all is the fact that:

They are instantaneous and a human puller is not. So unless the rules were changed to make them compulsory, as in Trench, then the problems associated with changing back and forward between human pullers and phonos would be almost as bad as, and similar to, adjusting to the inconsistency between good and bad pullers.

The ideal answer to all this would be to invent a phono-pull system which:
Was fully automatic and worked perfectly without any human input (sort of like "magic")

Was totally immune to all extraneous interferences and responded only to the shooters call

Was programmed to incorporate the normal delay of a human puller. By doing this you could obtain the desired performance parameters of good human puller, without having to accept the biological inevitability of occasional human failings, and the whole process would be perfectly integratable, and smoothly interchangeable, with our current system of refereeing.

This was the exact task that was put to a research scientist, by the name of Graham Callander, in New Zealand a couple of years ago. Graham was chosen for several reasons. Five years earlier, while working for the DSIR (NZ's equivalent of our CSIRO), he had done some work on a voice activation system for a double-throw trap machine that their Mechanical Engineering division were working on. Additionally Graham's background in analogue and power electronics is widely recognized, and his detachment from emotional involvement in the project, by virtue of not being a shooter, as well as his vast research experience, meant that a very critical and constructive approach was assured.

Anyway, Graham then spent the next eighteen months patiently and methodically researching, developing and testing the system, with a lot of practical assistance from members of the Christchurch Gun Club amongst others. By September of 1998 the prototypes were ready for evaluative testing, and were used for the first time in competition at Canterbury. Initial success there was followed by their use in Dunedin in November for the South Island Championships, and then at Woodville in January for the North Island Championships. During this time the units were continually refined and improved and eventually totally satisfied all the desired design criteria listed above. By now the performance and acceptance of the system, at the test venues, so far exceeded even the most optimistic expectations, that Graham was forced to accept the reality that he had developed a product that had serious marketing opportunities.

The testing of some units in the U.S. market led Graham to working with Bruce Rickard of the N.Z Trade Development Board (NZ's equivalent of Austrade), who also saw the marketing potential of the product. The nett result of that union was a partnership, and the setting up of a company called Canterbury Voice Release International Ltd, where the advantages of Graham's technical expertise can now be maximized by Bruce's marketing skills.

The new business partners then attended the Spring Grand, in Phoenix in the United States, where the CVRs performed flawlessly on the practice traps, and created a ripple of excitement throughout the U.S. trapshooting scene. Upon returning to New Zealand they convinced the NZCTA to use their product for the NZ Nationals, where they worked almost flawlessly for eight days. The attendance there of our National President, Mr Glenn Woodhatch, with the Glenn Cup team, certainly did nothing to harm CVRIL's efforts to have their new equipment used at our Trap Nationals in Roma the following month. However the word had now well and truly started to leak out on CVRs, and their Australian debut was also being pushed by numerous people over here, including Ray Wise, Steve Laffey, George Sckaf and Robert Nugent. I congratulate all these people on their foresight and perseverance.

Enter yours truly at Roma! I knew nothing of CVRIL's achievements, but had been advised in advance that phono-pulls were to be used at the Pre-Nationals, and that if they were well received, may be carried over to the Nationals. In my position as National Shoot Marshall, I looked forward to the elimination of the dramas created by slow and/or inconsistent pulling, but was apprehensive of the peripheral problems usually associated with phono systems. Imagine my astonished delight when the full advantages of the new equipment became apparent to me.

Within a couple of hours on the first day, it was obvious to me that CVRIL's new product was not only the greatest thing since sliced bread, but also one of the biggest single steps forward in the history of clay target shooting. In my opinion, it rivals screw chokes and adjustable comb stocks in terms of technical advancement in our sport. There was never any question of the units not continuing on after the Pre-Nationals, and they proceeded to work practically flawlessly, and to the delight of shooters and organizers alike, for the entire duration of the National tournament

I was so impressed by the ingenuity, simplicity and reliability of the units that, at my first convenient opportunity, I approached the manufacturers, who were present at the shoot to promote and service their product, to arrange the purchase of two sets for my own club. I had hoped to take two of the sets being used home, but by the time I appeared, all of those had been spoken for, and a large backlog of orders already existed, so I had to be content with being placed in the backorder book with everyone else.

For those people who have not seen the CVR system, I offer this description. Five conventional looking phono-pull microphones sit atop metal ground spikes. These are connected by cables about the size of TV co-ax, to a central control box, about the size of a box of chocolates, which just sits on the ground in the center of the layout. Two other similar cables are also attached to that box. One goes to the traphouse and plugs into the trap via a small power box about the size of a mobile phone charger. The other goes to the activator box, which is about the same size as a normal target release module. However, instead of just a button, it also has an on/off switch, similar to a household light switch. The button is only for manual overriding, and never normally gets used.

To operate the system, the referee simply clicks the switch to the on position, puts the module back down, and then stands there and calls one or lost until the shooting is finished. The central control box has no buttons, no dials, no meters, no adjustment, no nothing! It just sits there quietly, minding it's own business, and works like "magic". The inner workings of this box have been explained to me in layman's terms, and although the technicalities are a little over my head, all the problems that previously plagued conventional phono-pull systems have effectively been eliminated. This has been done by some pretty fancy selective acoustic filtering, a preprogrammed time delay that is spot on, and various other advanced solid-state electronic gadgetry. No wonder CVRIL choose to carefully avoid any mention of the term "phono-pull" in connection with their product, and refer to it instead by the highly descriptive designation "Clay Target Voice Release System".

Now that this equipment exists, and is available at realistic and affordable pricing (change out of a grand), I cannot imagine the Trap Nationals, or for that matter any of the State shoots, ever being conducted again without it. I did not speak to one person that shot over it, who was not totally satisfied with it, and who would not have been going home trying to convince their own club or their State Association to purchase the equipment. I don't have a crystal ball, but I would like to hazard a guess that, within five years, no gun club in Australia will be operating without CVRs.

At the time of writing, the exact details for Australian distribution of CVRIL's products had not been finalized. However, they indicated to me that they will probably service the Australian market directly from NZ via an Australian freecall phone number, and ship the product from a contract warehouse somewhere in either Melbourne or Sydney. I guess it will come as no surprise to anyone to learn that after watching their equipment work for a couple of days, I approached Graham and Bruce and asked them if they had considered adapting their concept to operate Skeet machines. Although they have not done so yet, they advised me that it is on their agenda of future developments, and after learning of my interest in that field, they have invited me to participate in the research and development of that product. Obviously I accepted without hesitation and look forward with anticipation and excitement to the prospect of participating in a project that would allow the Skeet fraternity to capitalize on the benefits of the technology now available to Trap shooters. Watch this space for future updates.

On the subject of Skeet shooting, I am very pleased to be able to advise that the Wagga Gun Club have invited the Small Gauge Skeet Club to assist them, not only with the running of the National 20 Gauge Skeet Championship this year, but with the whole three days of the Skeet Pre-Nationals. A joint Organizing Committee has thus been formed and we are all looking forward to three great days of preliminaries prior to the Skeet Nationals in November. A program has been drawn up which incorporates the 100 target 20 Gauge event on the Monday (kindly sponsored by Mr George Sckaf with Bornaghi ammunition) and two 50-target events each day on the Tuesday and Wednesday. A 100-target event had been considered for Wednesday due to the necessity to finish early that day. However to provide the opportunity for the maximum number of people to be able to participate in shoot-offs, two 50 target events was decided upon. In order to maximize the available time, shoot-offs on both days will be held at the end of each day, one of

Wednesday's events will be a doubles match, and on Wednesday both shootoffs will be conducted via doubles at 3,4 &5.

This month's Shooting Trivia Question: What is the highest score that has ever been shot to win the National Skeet High Gun, by whom, and in what year? Send your answer to Shooting Trivia, P.O. I suspect that Gil may have known this because he was one of the participants at that great inaugural event. I know he was there the following year in 1984, because I remember presenting him and his partner, Mr Peter Blackmore, with the Two-Man Team Trophy that year, after they flogged the great John Summers and myself. 



Shooting got under way on Saturday morning in perfect conditions, brilliant sunshine and not a breath of wind so all was ready for some good scores to be shot.


Round one saw only one 25 from Nidal Asmar in the very last squad with John Gilopidis, Tony Di Natale and Craig Henwood all shooting 24's.


Overall champion: Nidal Asmar accepts his Hy-Skor gun safe and Bushmaster Clay Target Trap from Brett Dunstan.


Brett Dunstant congratulates overall winner Nidal Asmar.

# Sydney International Shooting Centre

The information contained in this statement is my own personal assessment following a detailed tour of the facility yesterday. It is not an authorised statement of facts and does not represent the view of any organisation.

I'd like to start by saying that I wish I had 5 bucks for every time that I heard people - frequently people who held responsible p[positions within the sport - state with utter conviction that the Sydney Shooting Complex would be "temporary", "they'll knock it down straight after the Games, you'll see". To an outsider like me, this absolutely baseless pessimism appeared as nothing more than an excuse for the speaker to sit on his or her thumb and do nothing about the greatest opportunity ever presented to the shooting sport anywhere in the world. Which is exactly what many have done - and if you are such, dear reader, then I hope you're blushing. (Or perhaps you are one of those who has changed tune to the nobody will ever use it, it's a huge white elephant etc., etc., boogie.)

When I toured SICI yesterday, it was in the company of shooting megastar Rajmond Debevec and Miroslav Sipek, himself a former Competition Master for an Olympic Games shooting Complex. Both came to the same conclusion - echoed by the ISSF itself in the ISSF News 1/99: that this is certain to become the best shooting sports complex in the world, and by some considerable margin.

In the first place, the venue itself is set in bushland, a setting as nice as any in the world and uniquely Australian, with magnificent gum trees around the approaches. The landscaping means that the complex is all but hidden from view as one approaches. Access is easy and will become even easier when the Western distributor road is completed, close to the site. With the completion of the Federal Highway, SISC will be no more than 150 minutes from the centre of Canberra as well as being accessible from the South and North Gates without need to touch Sydney.

The building itself is absolutely massive, and for the first time in history, every one of the rifle and pistol events will be housed under one roof. Extensive use of native wood paneling throughout will ensure that the interior is both attractive, safe and that sound is absorbed effectively. The range will be 100% electronic, with (in Olympic Mode) capacity for 4500 spectators to watch the clay target finals; 2,500 spectators to watch the rifle, pistol and RT finals; and a further space where at least 1,000 people will be able to watch video monitors of all the action on a giant video wall. In all the venue is planned a 10,000 spectator venue, with single priced tickets at \$50 per day and unreserved seating making it not only one of the cheapest Olympic events to see qualification, finals and medals presentation in one or more events, in one day and for the price of a single \$50 ticket, anywhere in the Games.

From a shooting point of view, the venue will offer 60 firing points at 10, 25 and 50 meters rifle and pistol using Suis Ascor systems, and 3 multifunction layouts of Matarelli traps. All results will be instantly processed into rankings by computer, which means that

shot-by-shot information will be available to spectators. From the Olympic Games point of view, the venue offer complete segregation of spectators from athletes and officials, with multilevel Access and spaces set aside from range control, press and 'quiet rooms' for athletes to prepare themselves. Best of all is the idea of the separate Finals range where all 10,25 and 50 metre finals will be conducted. This huge arena is only half built today, but already one can feel the electric atmosphere that will soon accompany the entrance of the finalists. Although only designated for 10 firing points in Olympic Mode, afterwards this range will be a stand alone unit offering 10 firing positions at each 10,20 and 50 metres - a perfect training pod which can operate for elite training and competition in future without any impact on usage of the main ranges, which could be in use for a variety of Olympic and non-Olympic disciplines.

Alongside the three Olympic trap and Skeet Layouts, the beautifully kept DTL and American Skeet Layouts of Cecil Park Gun Club are untouched and inviting, begging more shooters to cross the seemingly impassable divide between Olympic and domestic disciplines.

The thought that has gone into the design of the complex stretches from full consideration of the needs of both able-bodied and disabled visitors/users, the needs of athletes, officials and post-Olympic users in terms of storage, meeting and recreational spaces, to awareness of environmental issues such as a massive rainwater harvest tank for irrigating the range areas, and the preservation of endangered native flora in the surrounding bushland.

Even though I have seen the plans through out the evolution of SISC, I found my first impression awesome. Like it or not, this is going to become the Wimbleton of target shooting not just for Australia, not just for Oceania, but for the World. Anyone who is half serious about the sport is going to come both to watch and to participate here. The only sad thing is, that it took an outside organisation to give this to us because we didn't have the vision and the resources to create it for ourselves.

My admiration and respect go out to everyone who has had anything to do with this project. Of course it is not yet completed, although the timescale is for the target equipment installation to begin in just three months; and of course it will cost money to use. But this is the Sydney Opera House of shooting ranges and people will come by the busload - if not us, then a new generation - if not to use, then simply to watch.

The first major event which will be staged at SISC will be the Oceania Championships in November 1999, the second will be the World Cup in March 2000. Shooters of Australia, whether you aspire to be in the Australian team or not - be there or be square.



# VISION AND CLAY TARGET SHOOTING

- Is 20/20 good enough?
- So you have had your eyes checked and have 20/20 vision, or can see well!

Just How Well?

- And what does 20/20 really mean?

20/20 vision means that binocularly (using 2 eyes) you can read a specific sized line of letters at a distance of 6m or 20 feet.

BUT:

- 1. Does each eye see that line of letters equally?
- 2. What is your vision at 2 feet, 4 feet, 40 feet or the distance of the target?
- 3. Are your eyes healthy? Compare this to going to the dentist every 6 months to find and prevent problems. You may not have known you had holes in your teeth. Well, you may not know you have a functional or pathological problem with your eyes you may not show signs of these problems YET!!
- 4. What about eye movements and refocusing to follow the flight of the target. Are the eye movements accurate, are they fast, do both eyes co-ordinate when doing this. This considers

the muscles around the outside of the eyes for eye movements and the muscles inside the eyes to refocus at different distances.

- 5. The balance between these two sets of muscles gives depth perception or stereopsis. This is the ability to see in 3 dimensions and not 2. This is very important to sight the target and decide its exact location in space.
- 6. Is your vision sharp in dull conditions or in very bright or glarey conditions? This is a measure of the contrast sensitivity.
- 7. What happens to your vision when you move you head and arms in the direction of the target? Does it blur or take a long time to recognise the position of the target?
- 8. What happens to the vision when you are thinking and concentrating at the same time as trying to focus on the target?
- What about colour vision? Is this normal, does if affect your ability to detect fluorescent targets against different backgrounds.
- 10. Does the brain accurately coordinate what the eyes see with the hands and body movement.

As you can see from all of the questions, there is a lot more to seeing than 20/20, and there is a lot that a sports optometrist may be able to answer for you!

Maybe you should have your eyes and visual system thoroughly examined, your performance may well be enhanced with a sharper prescription to make you better than 20/20 or with visual training.

Signs of Visual Difficulties

Sporting performances are effected by individuals visual functional skills. Some of the signs of difficulties with sporting performance include:

- Inconsistent performance.
- Performance not up to potential.
- Performance deterioration with time.
- Performance deterioration with increased cognitive demand or lots of thinking and concentration.

Visual signs which cause a poor performance include:

- Difficulty with distance or near vision, especially when dynamic (or moving), when changing the position of focus from distance to near, or from one position to another at the same distance.
- Difficulty viewing a full visual field.
- Difficulty with changing lighting conditions with glare, or decreased contrast (Squinting).
- Difficulty with wind, rain, dust, sunglare and other environmental conditions.
- Difficulty judging the distance of the target from yourself.
- Difficulty with timing between the release of the target and pulling the trigger.
- Difficulty distinguishing the target with different coloured backgrounds.
- Difficulty maintaining body balance, clumsy physical movement.
- Poor visual concentration at a particular task. (takes the eyes of the target)
- Double vision while aiming, seeing two barrels, a tail on the target or the appearance of target shifting position.
