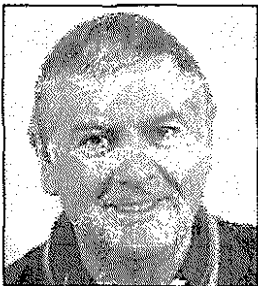

With the Qld. Labour Day Public Holiday the first Monday in May - comes the Qld. State Trap Carnival - and this year the Brisbane Club hosted the Carnival. Aside from a short passing shower of light rain on the Sunday, the weather was fine, warm and sunny - with just enough breeze to cause the target duck and dive.

Shoot Marshalls, Col Witt and Mike Swale got proceedings underway with the first event being the 25 target Winchester Point Score - the defending champion was Dennis McIntosh and this year, 2 possible were returned by the 153 shooters who nominated. The overall winner, from the Sunshine Coast was Geoff Fett with

With the assistance of neighbouring Clubs the five competition layouts and the practice trap were equipped with the new Canterbury Electronic Releases - which again proved a great success.

81/81, 1st in AA Grade was Robin Loy (Warwick) 140/141, from Mike Swale 137/141. Ballandean member, George Costanzo was the A Grade winner with 75/75, from Dan Moffitt (Brisbane) 74/75. In B Grade, Garry Alexander (Dalby) was the winner on 72/75, from Junior, Travis Vaina 70/75. Another Sunshine Coast shooter, Jim Davison returned 66/75 to claim the C Grade trophy, from Barry Perks (Brisbane) 65/75. In the Womens section, Cherie Reeves returned 66/75, Travis Vaina claimed the Juniors with 70/75 and George Mariner (Gold Coast) was the Veteran winner on 73/75.

The State Double Barrel was the next event on the program and the defending champion was Angus Anderson - a surprising 6 possibles only were recorded from the 154 shooters. The overall winner, from Terranora Lakes, was Gary Redmond with 94/94. Gary was presented with the O.W.Smith Perpetual Trophy by Doug Smith and the Winchester Trophy by Bob Dupuy. Wes Humphreys from Sunshine Coast was 1st in AA Grade on 93/94, from Greg Newey (Warwick) 74/75. Brisbane shooter Dan Moffitt had the handicapper looking for the calculator - when he took out the A Grade section with 50/50 and second in A went to Victorian shooter, Keith Saggars with 78/79. Garry Alexander from Dalby took the B Grade honours with 57/59, from John Baccetti (Ballandean) 58/61. Redcliffe shooter, Barry Wiseman was the C Grade winner with 46/55, from Ian House (Warwick) 44/55.

The Burdekin Secretary, Carol Betteridge was successful in the Womens division with 47/50, from Cherie Reeves (Normanton) 44/50. Wandoan youngster, Rowan Woodrow was the Junior winner with 48/50, from Adam Healey (Gladstone) 54/58. The Veteran section was taken out by Bill Frances (Chinchilla) 49/50, from Eric Little (Richmond River) 53/55.

The Annual General Meeting was conducted on the Saturday evening, with Robert Nugent re-elected un-opposed as President. There were two changes to the QCTA Management Committee - with Noel Beale (Northern Zone) and Tom Meadows (South-East Zone) retiring - their replacements are Ray Collinson (Northern) and Karl Nasarenko (South-East), they join Peter Henderson (Central) and the State President.

Sunday morning was again a very pleasant morning and 151 shooters faced the starter for the State Single Barrel Championship - with all scores recorded - two shooters, Bill Iles and Ray Wise lead the field with 49's.

The Overall winner, Bill Iles 50/51 - leaving Ray Wise to take AA Grade on 49/51, second in AA Grade was Col Witt 54/56. Brisbane shooter, Col Tanner was successful in A Grade with 47/50, from Dan Moffitt 46/50. Junior shooter, Travis Vaina was again successful in B Grade with 47/50, from Robert Page (Warwick) 46/50. Kwan Lien claimed C Grade with 44/50 from Meredith Page 41/50.

The Overall winner, Bill Iles 50/51 - leaving Ray Wise to take AA Grade on 49/51, second in AA Grade was Col Witt 54/56. Brisbane shooter, Col Tanner was successful in A Grade with 47/50, from Dan Moffitt 46/50. Junior shooter, Travis Vaina was again successful in B Grade with 47/50, from Robert Page (Warwick) 46/50. Kwan Lien claimed C Grade with 44/50 from Meredith Page 41/50.

The Womens section was taken out by Kaye Rehbein with 45/50, from Carol Betteridge 44/51. In the Junior division, Josh Walsh from the Clermont Club was the victor with 48/50, from Travis Vaina 47/50. The Veteran winner was Richmond River shooter, Eric Little 45/50 from Barry Nasser (Clermont) 44/50.

The State Double Rise Championship was the next event, and the defending champion was Neil Berry. From the 145 shooters, 2 recorded 47/50 - Keith Sagers (Frankston) and Peter Freeleagus (Brisbane) - the shoot off resulted in 56/60 from Sagers, earning him the Richard Dean Perpetual Trophy and the Olympic Target Perpetual Trophy. AA Grade went to Peter Freeleagus 47/50 from John Mack (Gold Coast) 52/60. Herbert River Visitor Barry Bosworth claimed A Grade with 42/50 from Barry Finch (Guyra) 49/60. Veteran Arthur Page won B Grade on 41/50 from Travis Vaina 47/60 and in C Grade Liam Murray from Sunshine Coast was the winner with 38/50 from Kurt Goody (Mungungo) 35/50. The Womens section was won by Carol Betteridge with 33/50 from Kaye Rehbein.

The Page family again a C Grade with Meredith taking 1st with 133/150 from Frank Dibartolomeo (Brisbane) 131/150.

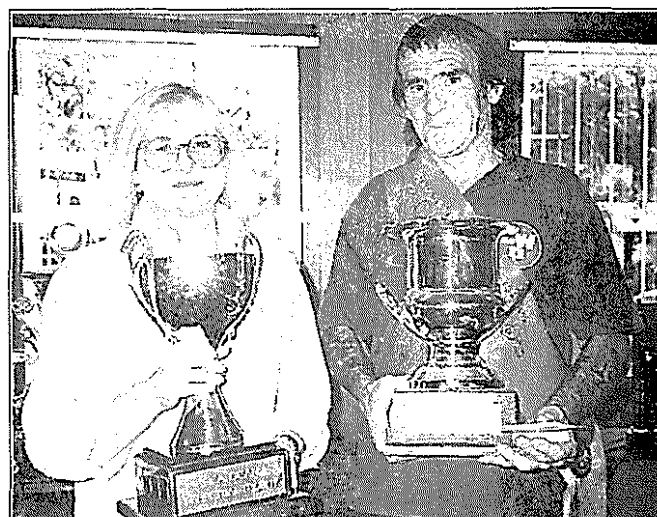

Thanks also to all the State Councillors who helped out with various office tasks - checking scores - etc - a very happy office again this year and a pleasure to work with such a great bunch of people.

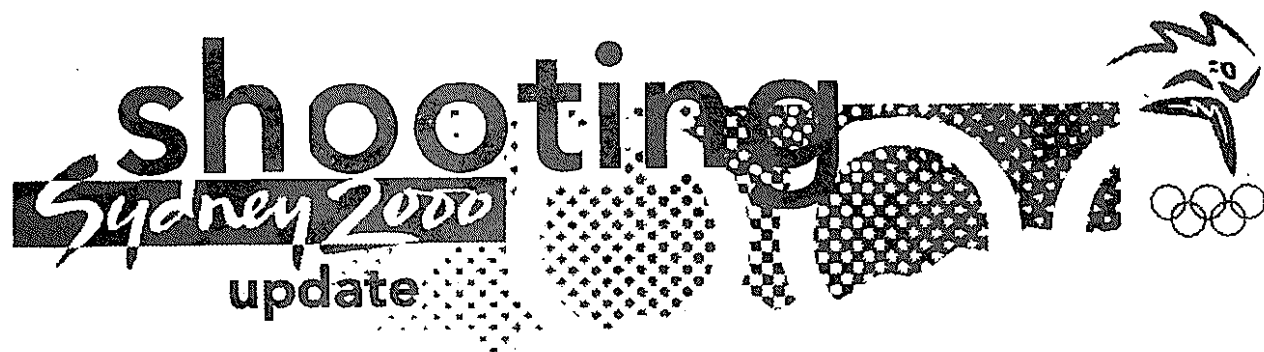
Appreciation also to our Shoot Marshalls - Col Witt and Mike Swale from the Gold Coast Club - and their band of helpers - a team effort - well done.

Welcome to SOCOG Shooting Program Update No 6

Since our last update, SOCOG's shooting staff has continued planning for the success of Sydney 2000 Olympic and October Paralympic Games, with the main focus currently on the March ISSF World Cup which will duplicate the Games program. We have,

- had a successful visit by Technical Delegates from the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF), and the International Shooting Committee for the Disabled (ISCD).
- watched with great interest the development of Sydney International Shooting Centre;
- been encouraged by the initial response to our call for shooting specific volunteers;
- been visited by Sius Ascor and Ennio Mattarelli during planning for the installation of the electronic and clay target systems;
- attended more meetings than one could imagine and been well satisfied with the level of planning that the functional areas of SOCOG and SPOC are undertaking to ensure the success of the respective Games.

ISSF & ISCD TECHNICAL DELEGATE VISIT

In February, ISSF Technical Delegates, Gary Anderson (USA) and Jes's Elizondo (Mexico), together with ISCD Technical Delegate, Dave Baskin (USA), participated in a joint ISSF & ISCD inspection of Sydney International Shooting Centre.

The Technical Delegates reported 'tremendous satisfaction with the preparations that were made for their visit and with the excellent progress that SOCOG and SPOC has made in preparing for an outstanding Olympic and Paralympic Games'.

The technical inspections did not identify any areas of concern highlighting instead the degree of planning undertaken by SOCOG and OCA during the initial design process for SISC.

SYDNEY INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING CENTRE

Visitors to the Sydney International Shooting Centre (SISC) are unanimous in their opinion that the design of SISC is a credit to all concerned and a magnificent legacy for shooting.

The Sius Ascor electronic target/scoring system for pistol, rifle, running target, together with the Mattarelli clay target equipment is shortly to arrive in Australia. The installation of the target equipment which is a major and sophisticated operation will be done in close cooperation between OCA (Olympic Coordination Authority) and Swiss Timing.

Construction of the main building which is approximately 62% complete is progressing at a steady pace with the project expected to be finished according to schedule in mid 1999 well in time for the first major competition to be held at SISC - the Oceania Shooting Championships in November of this year.

ISSF WORLD CUP....

An estimated 800-900 of the world's best shooting athletes are

expected to converge on Sydney in March 2000 for the ISSF World Cup (SOCOG Test Event), the largest ISSF competition ever held in Australia. The Opening Ceremony will be held at Sydney International Shooting Centre, Cecil Park on March 23, 2000 to which all are invited to attend.

We will keep you informed in following Updates on the progress of what promises to be an exciting competition.

What is a Test Event ??

Test events are nominated pre-Olympic events which will be used by SOCOG (The Sydney Organising Committee for the Olympic Games), ORTA (Olympic Roads and Traffic Authority) and OSCC (Olympic Security Command Centre) to test the actual venue and elements of operational plans, facilities and systems in event mode.

Being a non ticketed event spectators will be admitted to the ISSF World Cup free of charge with large numbers expected to attend.

VILLAGES

The Olympic Village on approximately 100 hectares is located at Newington, adjoining Sydney Olympic Park.

The Village is planned to accommodate 10,200 competitors and 5,100 delegation officials at the time of the Olympic Games and to form a new residential community afterwards.

The NSW Government announced in December 1996 that the Mirvac Lend Lease Village Consortium (MLLVC) will finance, construct and market the major housing development proposed for the Olympic Village.

During the Games the Village will contain 1,150 permanent dwellings and specially-designed modular houses. Many advanced environmental features have been incorporated into the design of the Village, including extensive use of solar power.

The Village will offer a secure environment in keeping with the needs and expectations of participating delegations. Dining facilities catering for a broad range of international cultures, tastes and nutritional requirements will be provided in the residential zone.

Shopping, information and commercial services required by the residents will be provided. In addition, the Village will offer residents a wide range of leisure and recreation activities based on experiences from previous Games.

Transport to competition and training at nearby Sydney Olympic Park and other Olympic sites will be by bus from the Village. The Location of the Village will provide residents with convenient walking access for Sydney Olympic Park and for trips to Sydney's many attractions.

The Olympic Village will open on 2 September 2000 and close 4 October 2000.

It will then undergo a transition to accommodate 7,000 Paralympic Games athletes and officials from 11 October to 1 November 2000.

The MEDIA VILLAGE is situated in Sydney's west, Lidcombe is the proposed location for the Media Village. Located 15 minutes travel time to Sydney Olympic Park and 30 minutes to the Sydney Harbour Zone, it is planned that the Media Village will accommodate up to 6,000 accredited media representatives.

The Media Village will provide services and accommodation from 5 September 2000 until 4 October 2000 in a mix of new, refurbished and modular buildings.

The TECHNICAL OFFICIALS VILLAGE will also be located in Sydney's West accommodating up to 1,300 Technical Officials.

PARALYMPIC TICKETS

Tickets for the Sydney 2000 Paralympic Games will go on sale on 18 October 1999 and will be moderately priced. Three different types of tickets will be available.

Opening and Closing Ceremonies

Day Pass - where you see several sports on one day

Finals

The ticketing program will cover tickets for the Paralympic Games Opening and Closing ceremonies, competition and Arts Festival.

PARALYMPIC SHOOTING MASCOT

The Mascot for the Sydney 2000 Paralympic Games is Lizzie the frill-necked lizard.

She was chosen to carry the Paralympic messages of performance, power and pride to both Australian and international audiences.

Lizzie has come down from Kakadu, a wilderness area in the far north of Australia, to join Paralympians in spreading the word about the ability and achievements of those athletes with a disability.

Lizzie has incredible strength, tenacity and energy. She strives for the same things Paralympians strive for - power, performance and pride. Lizzie was chosen as the symbol of the Paralympic Games athletes.

Lizzie's frill is shaped as the map of Australia with its green and gold colours while her body is the ochre colour of the land.

PARALYMPIC FACTS

- 18 sports
- 125 countries
- 4 000 athletes
- 2 000 team officials
- 1 300 media
- 1 000 Technical officials
- 2 500 IPC/NPCs/VIPs and guests
- 000 volunteers

There are 18 sports on the competition program, 14 of which are also on the Olympic program. Unique to the Paralympic Games are boccia, goalball, powerlifting and wheelchair rugby.

A Paralympic sports festival atmosphere will be created at Sydney Olympic Park, which is home to 14 of the 18 sports. Shooting with twelve events providing the first gold medal of the Games will be held at Sydney International Shooting Centre. Cycling, equestrian and sailing will be held at satellite venues within 30 minutes drive of Sydney Olympic Park.

The awarding of the Paralympic Games to Sydney confirms Australia's ability to stage events ranging in scale and diversity. The tourism and economic benefits flowing from the Paralympic Games will be considerable.

The Paralympic Games is a catalyst to improve transport systems, accommodation and venues. The development of the Sydney 2000 Paralympic Games transport strategy will leave a legacy of accessible, useful and viable facilities for the entire community after the Paralympic Games.

Shooters must have a combination of upper and lower extremity impairments to be considered eligible to compete. Apart from the individual events, both males and females compete in the mixed events in their specific class, that is SH1 - Pistol and Rifle competitors who do not require a shooting stand, and SH2 - Rifle competitors who have measurable and/or visible permanent disability in upper limbs and therefore are unable to support the weight of a rifle with their upper limbs and require a shooting stand.

150 athletes from the 40 countries affiliated with the International Shooting Committee for the Disabled will participate in the Paralympic Games.

In brief...

Is 2000 a leap year? The subtleties of the Gregorian calendar and leap years have many people confused. The earth takes 365.2422 days to orbit the sun and so the leap year day created every four years is dropped at the end of each century to compensate for the over adjustment. But this adjustment is an approximation, so every 400 years the leap day is revived - 2000 is such a year. This is a once in a millennium leap year!!!

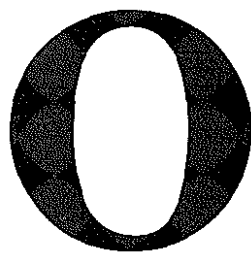
Central Zone will also conduct their Zone Skeet Elimination in July on Sunday 18th at Bathurst Gun Club.

Report on Cyprus World Cup - 1999

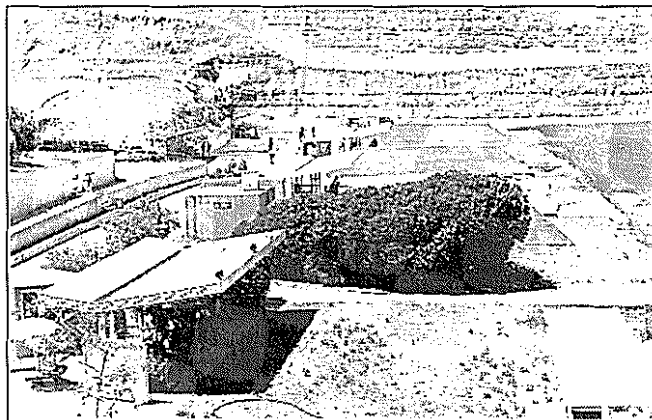
Luca, the 3 Double Trap shooters and I met at the Melbourne Airport on Sunday 25th April where we were to depart via a new airline that has not been tried before and also to follow a route not previously used. The airline we had chosen was the Emirate Airline which has proven to be an excellent choice - the plane we had was a new boeng 777 and the service we received was the best we have ever encountered. The route taken was Melbourne to Singapore (8 hours) with a 1 hour stop-over in Singapore, Singapore to Dubai (about 7+ hours) with a 10 hour stop-over in Dubai where the airline had booked us into a 5 star hotel, the Ramada Continental, which was all part of the airfare. During this 10 hour stop-

over we had a couple of hours sleep, refreshing showers, a change of clothes and we were off to what is known as the Golden Mile in Dubai.

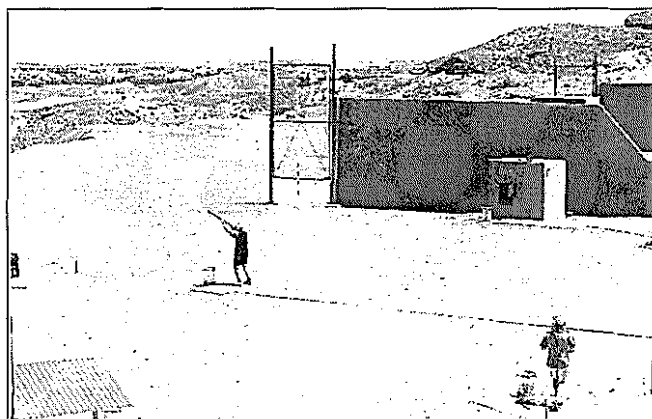
Now that was an eye-opener if ever I had seen one! There was literally a mile of shops that sell mainly gold jewelry. Hundreds and hundreds of shops on both sides of the street where you could buy anything from the smallest gold chains worth a few dollars to the very expensive jewelry worth hundreds of thousands of dollars. It was hard to believe that there was so much gold in the world that

could all be sold in the one area - but seeing is believing and you can get quite good bargains with a bit of haggling over the prices as it is all sold by weight.

The streets running off the Golden Mile are filled with boutiques selling all types of Persian-type rugs/carpets, clothes, home made perfumes (where you could have perfumes made to fragrances of your choice), and practically anything you may wish to purchase at reasonable prices.

After our shopping spree we went back to the hotel for another shower and clean clothes and we were off to the airport for our flight to Larnaca in Cyprus. This flight was on an airbus which was fully booked and no where near as comfortable as the boeng 777, but still good service and food. Our flight took us to Beirut (3 hours) where we had a 1 hour stop-over and then it was just a 35 minutes flight to Larnaca, Cyprus where we were met by an Official of the Cyprus Shooting Federation who took us through Customs which took about 20 minutes. We were then put into a

stretched out Mercedes limo and taken to our hotel, which was called the Golden Bay Beach Hotel, Larnaca - again, a 5 star hotel. There were 3 hotels situated almost next to each other, almost identical except that 2 of them were classified as 4 star while the third was a 5 star - we were placed in the 5 star but we were only charged the 4 star rate. Thank goodness, for Cyprus is a very expensive place to visit.

We found that the currency in Cyprus is in pounds and it was easy to forget that one pound was equal to 3 of our dollars or 2 American dollars. An example was a coke was 1.80 pounds (\$5.40 Australian) or a beer at 2.5 pounds (\$7.50 Australian) and most meals were around the 8.00 pound mark (\$24.00 Australian), so you can see things are quite expensive.

Each of the hotels were on the sea-shore and were surrounded by fabulous swimming pools, spas and gardens and there were facilities for sailing, jet ski-ing, speed boat riding, para-sailing etc., but most people deciding to just lay about on the deck chairs around the pools, drinking and reading. It was a bit of a surprise to see most of the women sunbaking, minus their tops, with the ages ranging from those in their teen, to the older 'grannies' - and nobody batted an eyelid!

The weather conditions were fine with temperatures ranging between 25 to 30 degrees Celsius throughout the days with moderate nights.

Although the breakfasts at the hotel were magnificent with plenty to eat of all types of food, we had dinner at the hotel only twice and these meals left a lot to be desired so most of the time we ate out at the many restaurants adjacent to the hotel. After the long days at the shooting ranges we were all ready to eat around 7 pm but it seems the tourists and the locals don't come out for an evening meal until around 10 pm - just when we were all going to bed. The accommodation was however more than adequate for our stay.

Tuesday, 27th April

We went out to the range and while I paid the bills and fixed all the paperwork, Luca and the 3 boys went down and had 'un-official practice' at Double Trap.

The shooting range is a 45 minute drive from the hotel at Larnaca in the official bus/coach (these being quite modern and comfortable and gave us good service). The Olympic Shooting Range is quite a

magnificent place set in the hills overlooking the city of Latsia. There are 4 Trap layouts on the lower level, 4 Skeet layouts separate, a good Club House and restaurant overlooking all of the ranges and adjacent to this was the administration centre, toilets and a 10 meter Air Pistol and Rifle ranges and running back through a valley were Field and Game ranges with a bitumen road which connected each range so competitors could travel to the different ranges in their vehicles. As you can see by this, shooting is a very popular past time in Cyprus for all men, women and children.

All the machines used on the grounds were Nasta, throwing Nasta targets which were orange fluro - I don't believe you could better the targets thrown by these machines or the colour of their targets.

The foreground of all trap layouts is irrigated lucerne which was about 30 cms high out to the 80 meters with the targets very visible on the dark green and I would strongly suggest to any Club that has access to water for irrigation and suitable ground, to plant lucerne, as this is probably one of the best back grounds that I have ever seen.

The Skeet layouts were cut out of the side of the hill with the shooters backs facing into the hill-side, so they faced away from the hill-side where the flying targets flew against a clear sky as the background. All the grounds, both Trap and Skeet had the same sight picture.

Cyprus, at this time of year is just coming into the Summer months and has a very dry, hilly, lime-stone looking type of ground, with many numerous, very small, cereal farms that apparently cut mostly hay to feed the lot-fed dairy cattle that we saw daily on our bus trip out to the shooting range. Water is scarce in Cyprus and each home is given a monthly allowance and I believe if they use over their quota, can get into trouble. We really don't know how lucky we are.

The organising Committee did an excellent job and the only time we had hold-ups with the paperwork was when the computer went down.

One thing that really impressed me, compared to other World Cups that I have been to, was the cleanliness of the toilets - where an old

lady took great pride in keeping these in a spotless condition.

Wednesday, April 28th

Official Double Trap training, Technical Meeting and the Opening Ceremony.

The three boys in Double Trap all shot well and were getting used to the RC shells, the back ground and the targets and with the large entry of competitors, all were eager for the coming day's competition.

After practice we were all taken back to our hotel's to change and then it was back to Latsia for the Opening Ceremony which took place in the main street where a few speeches were made and then a demonstration of traditional Cypriot dancing and then it was back up to the Shooting Range where some traditional food and drinks were served. Finally back to the hotel by 9 pm for the boys to have an early night. (Just remember that this particular day involved the 45 minute trip not just out to the range and then back the 45 minutes that night as was the case on other days, but this round trip was made twice on that day - quite tiring in fact). Luca and I sat up waiting for the rest of our shooters, Trap and Skeet, to fly in and after a couple of hours we started to worry when they had not turned up but we then found out their plane was running some 2 hours late. The rest of our Team came across on the same route as we had taken but they didn't get to see the Golden Mile in Dubai, their taxi driver instead taking them to a large shopping complex.

Thursday, April 29th

Double Trap competition and 'un-official practice' for Trap and Skeet.

Our 3 shooters in Double Trap were all very eager to get started. Michael began by posting a 47 which got us quite excited, Steve shot a 43 - disappointing for him as he just didn't seem able to get

going properly but finished off well and Craig shot a 44. He was also disappointed with his effort.

Michael finished with 139/150, his last round a 44 - he was disappointed with this but had to contend with the competitor shooting immediately prior to him, who had continual double discharges and all sorts of other problems which unsettled Michael but he was still good enough to get into the Final where 138's had to shoot off for the final position. Steve finished on 134/150, his last two rounds being 46 and a 45 and Craig finished on a 131/150 after shooting a 43 and 44 in his final rounds. Both were very disappointed but they had both tried really hard and deserved 10/10 for their efforts.

Michael shot a 46/50 in the Final which put him on 185/200 then he had to shoot off with Charles Redding of the United States, who had been the second highest scorer on going into the Final for the Bronze Medal. Charles and Michael ended up shooting at 6 pairs before Charles hit his last pair and Michael missed one giving Charles the bronze Medal and leaving Michael to take 4th place. Marco Innocenti (Italy) took Gold with a 192, Gerebics Roland (Hungary) took Silver with 187 and Charles Redding took the Bronze with 185 + 12 from Michael on 185 + 11.

Of the 67 competitors in the Double Trap, Michael ended up in 4th place, Steve finished in 15th position and Craig was placed 23rd.

Placings in the National Double Trap Teams event, Gold went to Italy with a score of 411, the United States of America took Silver with 408 and Australia took the Bronze with a score of 404.

After the presentation Ceremony was completed around 4.30 pm, Luca and the boys headed back to the hotel and I stayed back at the range waiting for some paperwork before catching the next bus back to the hotel.

Friday, April 30th

Steve and Craig were to leave this morning, heading home, but both were looking forward to that 10 hour stop-over in Dubai where Steve intended heading for the Golden Mile Shops once again.

Official Trap and Skeet practice and as usual Australia is the first country to start as the organizers always go through the countries in alphabetical order, so that means a 5.30 am start for Luca and I - making sure that everyone was up and ready for the 7 am departure from the hotel and at the range in time to start shooting at 8.30 am. All of our boys practiced really well posting either 24's or 25's and this was very encouraging for all. At the end of the practice session we left the grounds with everyone feeling very confident for the coming days of competition and all ready to have an early night once dinner was over.

Luca and I were supposed to go to the Official Dinner with the President of the Federation, Horst Schreiber and the other heads of delegations but things that evening started to go wrong.

Firstly the computer at the shooting grounds went down and I had to wait 2 hours while the draw was done for the next days competition and I also had to get the official paperwork for the coming day i.e. starting time, squad makeup, bus time-tables etc.etc. Luckily I was appointed to the Jury of Appeal and the Jury had quite a comfortable office supplied with refreshments etc., where I was able to catch up on some paperwork while I waited. I ended up being the courier for about 5 different countries by picking up their paperwork for them as well.

When I returned to our hotel there was a message for me saying that Luca had taken Brett Dunstan to the hospital for X-rays for suspected broken ribs - good grief, what had happened? On Luca's return I found Brett had badly bruised and strained chest muscles, extremely painful but thankfully, no breaks.

Just how did this happen? All very innocently, I was told. While walking down the steps into the swimming pool, Brett slipped and crashed onto the side on the pool - and this was after Luca and I had forbidden anyone from going out joy riding on a jet ski, in case they were hurt!

Saturday, May 1st

Day one of Trap and Skeet competition. Brett was feeling very sore

but was still keen to do well as were the other shooters.

At the completion of the first round in Trap, Michael had posted a 25, a gutsy 25 from Brett, and a disappointing 21 from Ben who did not seem to be able to get in rhythm. Meanwhile the Skeet boys had Clive very disappointed with a 23 (missing 2 very easy targets), Goran Rahman ecstatic (shooting his first World Cup and posting a 25, he had a grin from ear to ear) and Barty shooting a 24, so in general, the day was shaping up nicely.

The next 2 rounds saw Clive posting a 24 and 24 (again missing easy targets), Goran having some problems on Station 3 and shooting a 22 and 22 while Barty also had a few problems with scores of 22 and 23. Back at the Trap, Michael had finished off with a 24 and 24, Brett a 24 and another 25 (a majorly gutsy effort) and Ben with a 24 and 24 and he looked to be pulling himself together.

We returned to our hotel, brimming with confidence for the final day with Brett being doctored with a hot bath and cold packs to his injuries.

Sunday, May 2nd

Up at 5.30 am. In Skeet we had Barty shooting in the first wave and Clive and Goran in the second so this meant an early start to the day.

Clive started the day well with a 25 and Goran did the same, shot a 25 and Barty came in with another 23.

The Trap boys by now were anxious to get going and their first round saw Michael on a 24, Brett on a 23 and Ben also on a 23.

Back to the Skeet and Clive finished with a 24, and once again dare I say, having missed an easy target. He did however finish with a score of 120/125 which is usually good enough to get you into a Final but at this World Cup his 120 put him in 17th position overall with a Norweigan going into the Final with a 124 and 6 others on 123 who had to shoot off for the other 5 positions in the Final.

The outright winner taking the Gold Medal was Harald Jensen (Norway) 148 + 6, the Silver Medal went to Andrea Benelli (Italy) with a 148 + 5 and the Bronze Medal went to Erik Watndahl (Norway) on 147. Norway would have been most pleased at getting both Gold and Bronze from the 120 competitors in Skeet.

Clive proved that he was as good a shot as any on the ground and Goran finishing on 117/125 in his first World Cup had done equally well and Barty on 115/125 was not far behind - a good effort by all shooters.

At the completion of the fifth round in Trap, Michael ended up with a score of 122 which moved him straight into the Final. There was one person on 123, 3 on 122 and 10 people on 121 who were shooting off for the last 2 positions.

Brett got out of rhythm by trying too hard in the last round and had shot a 22 finishing with 119/125. Ben meanwhile shot a 22 and completed his 5 rounds with a score of 114/125. Our Trap Team finished in = 4th position.

The shoot off for the last position in the Finals started. The Skeet was fairly straight forward but the Trap was extremely confusing as the ISSF representation wanted it shot off till the 10th position was finalised just in case quota spots were being handed down. With shooters missing the same target and rejoining the shoot off it was so confusing for scorers, referees and spectators alike, let alone the poor old shooters. They then pulled out all those that had missed targets, shot off the remaining shooters for the last two positions in the Final and then shot off the positions down to 10th place. These new rules haven't taken into consideration the possibility of such a large amount of shooters shooting off for the 6 positions and will have to be revised. I believe the simplest way would have been to shoot it off squad system, re-setting the programme at the end of each squad so that all shooters got the same targets and then shooting it till the last person was there, i.e. miss and out.

Into the Finals and the Skeet was held first and this proved to be a good display of shooting with first and second placings having to go into a double shoot off. The results are listed above.

Then the Trap Final got underway and once again it was a nailbit-

ing affair with all positions see-sawing. During this Final we had a couple of gusty squalls of wind that blew over the score boards and turned the shade umbrellas inside out but luckily it did not affect the targets a great deal, showing just how good those Nasta Traps were at throwing the targets.

It got down to a 2 man shoot off with Michael and Alexei Alipov (Russia) shooting off for the Gold and Silver Medals. Michael was the cooler/calmer shooter and I believe the stronger shooter of the two but I also believe at this level a little bit of luck can go a long way and that was what Michael did not have on his side this time and he had to settle for the Silver Medal. Scores were, Alexei Alipov (Russia) 146 + 2 for the Gold Medal, Michael with 146 + 1 for the Silver and Sergiy Okhotski (Ukraine) taking the bronze with a score of 145 + 6.

Both Luca and I were extremely proud of all of the efforts that our shooters had put into this World Cup, with the performance of Michael in both Trap and Double Trap, Brett's performance in spite of his injuries, Clive's great score and not even being able to get into the Final, Goran's efforts at his first ever World Cup and with the other team members all working so hard and putting in such a great effort but not getting that ounce of luck that might have just bumped them over the line.

Both Luca and I thank you all very much for the happy team spirit and comradeship that was shown by all.

Presentations were made and a very proud Michael (as can be seen by the photo's) and a very proud Coach (photo's that I hope will be published with this report will show - but I don't know about the kiss by Luca).

After collecting our flags, anthem and paperwork we all headed back to our hotel for a dinner appointment with the Australian Ambassador to Cyprus, Mr Harold Brown, at our Hotel. After dinner the boys went out to celebrate and Luca and I collapsed in our room through exhaustion for a week + of walking up and down

To Lost Bird . . .

I would like to respond to the story in the CTSN a few months ago by The Lost Bird. My story is about some shooters from the Central Burnett Gun Club. The then President of Central Burnett Club Mr Don Gull who lived at Monto conducted an exhibition shoot at the Monto Showgrounds after this shoot a few Monto lads went to a shoot at Central Burnett. They were Noel Goody, hid brother Bevan and their cousin Ken Russell (who later became a famous jockey). This shoot was the 18-7-1968. Noel & Bevan both placed in some events. After only attending a few shoots Noel shot his way into the Queensland Team as Front Marker. The members of this team were Noel Goody (Central Burnett) 99, Stow Kentish (Central Burnett) 97, Ian Brown (Barcaldine) 98, Ray Slawson (Brisbane) 99, Merv Champeny (South Burnett) 99. Total 492. Tasmania won with 495, Western Australia second with 494, Queensland third with 492. This shoot was held on the 26th and 27th of October 1968.

Noel had only been shooting for 3 months.

Noel & Bevan combined at the Central Burnett Club on the 16-11-1968 to win Central Burnett Deauville Doubles Sparrows Championship, with George Linscott & Stan Marks second.

At the Bundaberg 1968 Two-Day Shoot the Central Burnett No 2 Team of Noel & Bevan Goody, Stow Kentish, Don Gull & Stan Marks placed first in the Teams Match Bundaberg Shield. The Central Burnett No 1 Team placed second Richard & Berkley Bloxsome, Garry Darlington, Don Taylor & George Linscott.

Another shooter I would like to mention is Arnie Williams. Arnie joined the Club about 1969. Arnie quickly learnt the art of clay target shooting. Arnie traveled to clubs all over Central & Southern Queensland, where he gained a reputation as a shooter to be reckoned with. His shooting ability was matched by his drinking ability; I have been told by shooters that shot with him the bigger the hangover the better he shot. Arnie won many Titles & Championships. Arnie's proudest moment was winning a Commonwealth Double Barrel Championship at the Central Burnett Gun Club in 1975.

In 1980 Noel & Bevan Goody, Arnie Williams, Gary Price & Ray Duffy of Bundaberg formed a Club at Monto called Munguna Social Gun Club. Arnie no longer shoots. He often talks about his days as a clay target shooter. As Arnie is my Uncle I often ask his advice on shooting. Arnie lives at Monto, he would love to hear from some of his old shooting mates. Noel only shoots at our Christmas shoot now, he usually cleans us out, taking home hams, chooks etc. Bevan Goody unfortunately passed away in 1986 aged 34.

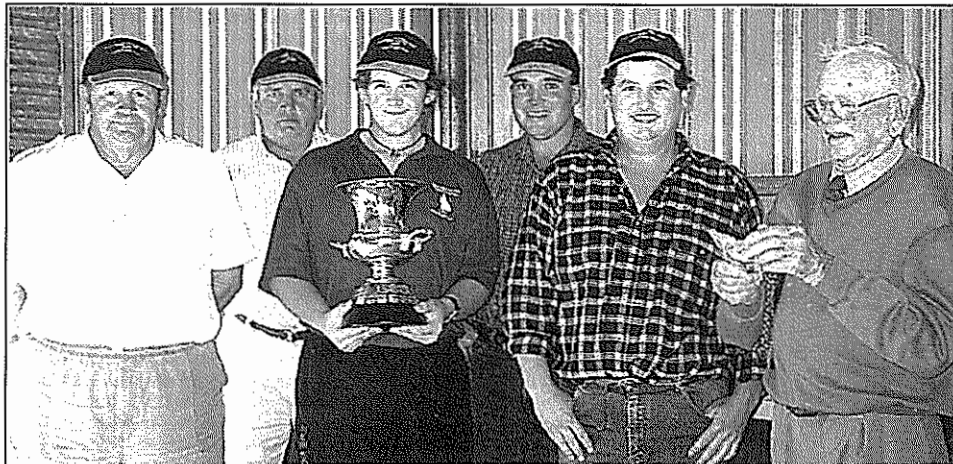

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS JULY 1999

Soon after I first started to learn the fine art of Clay Target Shooting, in my search for help in trying to understand the basic concepts, I began to read everything I could find on the subject. Most references included at least some mention of the mental aspect of the game. Not realizing the importance of this concept, I tended to bypass these sections and focus on those that elaborated on the more tangible facets of the sport. However, as time went on, I came to appreciate that although, at the thick end of the wedge, shooting was all about physics, at the thin end it was probably only 10% mechanical and 90% mental. Over the next few months I intend to elaborate on some of my own theories concerning the mental aspects of shooting. However, this month I intend to exercise an entirely different area of the mind – it's imaginative capacity.

Imagine what would happen if the Australian Lawn Tennis Association decided that the game of Tennis was too slow and boring, and that they needed to address that situation and rectify it. Imagine if they proceeded to do that by: 1) ceasing to on-flow whatever minor technical rule changes the World Lawn Tennis Association approved from time to time, and 2) making a number of substantial rule changes themselves, which they either dreamed up, or borrowed from some other game. Changes like converting the court size to metric, and then making it a meter shorter. Like raising the height of the net by 100 mm and deleting the second serve, then making the ball a little heavier, and finally substituting a squash racket in place of the tennis racket.

Imagine the uproar from the players if all of this occurred! Almost certainly the leading players would attempt to rebel against such an impractical and ill-advised situation, and would probably try to block the implementation of these non-standard rules. They could do this by arguing the case that the Australian Lawn Tennis Association did not have the jurisdiction to change the rules of a game, in which they were not the ultimate governing authority. Suppose that this line of argument was upheld and the ALTA was forced to back down, but then went away and passed a resolution at their next meeting to change the name of the game that we played in this country from Tennis to Australian Tennis.

Following the successful circumvention of the minor technicality that blocked their earlier attempt, they could then reintroduce the previously rejected rule changes, and the players would have no further redress available to them, and would be forced to play under the new rules. I should imagine that at the next election of officers of the ALTA, the incumbents would be defeated and an entirely new set of executives, which would probably include a much higher ratio of participating players, would be installed. Obviously their first item of business would be to eliminate all the new rules, change the name of the game back to its original form, and revert to observing the rules as laid down by the internationally recognized governing body.

Imagine however that such an easily attainable solution to the problem was not possible, due to another minor technical difficulty. Such as the fact that Tennis in Australia was not governed by the Australian Lawn Tennis Association, due to there being an insufficient number of players to make such a specialist organization viable. Imagine instead that Tennis was administered by an organization titled the Australian Racquetball Sports Association, which encompassed both Squash and Badminton, as well as Tennis. Now while we're toying with the hypothetical, imagine that Squash was the most popular of the racquetball games in Australia, and that Squash players outnumbered Tennis players by three or four to one. Imagine also that, although Badminton was by far the least popular of all the games, it was the only one of the three conducted at the Olympic Games. This would endow it with an almost 'sacred' status, due to its ability to enhance the image of racquetball games, and also to provide most of the sport's government funding.

Finally imagine that the practical playing aspects of Tennis made it a much more socially oriented game than either of the other two, and that therefore it tended to attract a disproportionately higher percentage of people who were socially focussed, rather than competitively driven. For that reason mainly, instead of the administrative council of the Australian Racquetball Sports Association being comprised of approximately one quarter Tennis players, the Tennis players were actually conspicuous by their absence from the council in general, and the Rules Committee in particular. Thus the scene would be set for all the unlikely scenarios detailed above to actually occur, leaving the ill-fated Tennis players with precious little that they could do about it, other than to reflect on the undesirability of having people who neither understand nor participate in your sport, making your rules for you.

The practical problems caused by all this administrative mayhem would mean that any overseas Tennis players visiting Australia would have to try not only to familiarize themselves with our technical rules variations, but also to readjust the physical playing aspect of their game to suit our quaint differences. I suspect that the difficulty for the Australian players of trying to explain and justify this situation to their visiting compatriots at the Australian Open, would be second only to their own difficulty in trying to win at Wimbledon, while correspondingly attempting to adjust and restructure their own style of play.

By now most of the people reading this article will have seen through the analogy that I have been drawing, and recognized the problem that I am attempting to address. For those who have not, simply substitute Skeet for Tennis, Trap for Squash, ISU for Badminton, NSSA for WLTA and the ACTA for the ARSA. Now the whole picture should fall into place fairly easily. Before I move away from complaining about the problems Skeet shooters face in this country, and illustrating it with similes, let me throw in one more, just in case the penny still hasn't dropped. Imagine the repercussions if the ACTA decided next week to change the name of Trench to Australian Trench, and then proceed to change even the speed, angle and colour of the targets away from the standards laid down by the UIT, let alone start messing with a whole bunch of technical rules as well!

So what are all these rule variations that Skeet shooters in Australia have to endure? Well to begin with we generally shoot at a target that is travelling far too slowly and this generates much heartbreak for Australian shooters attending the World Championships. NSSA rules stipulate a target distance of 60 yards +/- 2 yards and they always set them at the maximum distance of 62 yards, as it has been proven that the extra speed attained by this provides a much more stable target under windy conditions. We on the other hand specify a distance of '50 meters and not exceed 55'. This would be near enough if they were always set to the maximum but unfortunately confusion between setting trap and skeet targets usually intervenes at this point and provides a 48 meter target. This is because the distance pegs in both disciplines are at 50 meters, but in trap the target is preferentially set a couple of meters short of the peg. Most first time Australian shooters at San Antonio spend almost the whole week coming to grips with the different target speed, and probably would have shot up to their expectations the following week, if they had not been on the plane going home by then. The very first thing we need to do is move all the Skeet distance markers out to 55 meters.

Furthermore we shoot the targets in the wrong sequence. This occurs on both stations 7 and 8. It happens on 7 as a flow-on from a ridiculous rule change banning single loading, combined with the myth that shooting high 7 with a double loaded gun could create a safety hazard. Such as if you shot the target way too early, and hit it badly, and then pointed your gun in an unsafe direction while dodging pieces. In all my years of shooting in the US, where no such rule exists, I never saw even a hint of a safety hazard caused in this manner. You'd be more likely to get hit by lightning. Plus, if you scrapped that stupid ban on single loading, you could go back to putting a warning sign on the low house, advising inexperienced shooters to single load on 7. And there's no justification for the ban on single loading anyway. It was only brought in to try to hurry the game up, and there's already a rule containing a 15-second time limit (which has been decreased to 10 under

Australian rules). NSSA alleviate the problem much more effectively, while providing workable flexibility, by simply allocating an overall time limit.

To illustrate the undesirability of such local rule variations, I once saw an Australian shooter at the World Championships (who was still straight) forget in the pressure of the moment, and call for the low house first on station 7. When the high house target appeared he ignored it and glared at the referee, who promptly asked him to shoot his option. The look on his face when he realized what had happened, and just how much time, money and effort had just been wasted without even firing a shot, would break your heart. And to further demonstrate the wisdom of having people who don't fully understand the game making and changing the rules, this whole 'time concern' situation was then turned into a total debacle by replacing the American sequence on Station 8 with the ISU sequence. This was done on the erroneous blanket assumption that anything done in ISU must be better. In actual fact, the ISU format makes no sense, and takes almost twice as long as the original American sequence.

Another rule variations that I find particularly distasteful is the one that says that practice shall not be permitted between qualification and the shoot-off. How you could possibly even think that you could enforce that one equitably is totally beyond me, and why you would even want to, is still further beyond me. The practice fields at the World Championships are always filled, between 5.00 and 6.00pm, with the people who shot possibles, honing up their doubles timing prior to the shoot-off. And what about the one that says that if a competitor fires twice at one target, the next one shall be lost. Any rule deliberately designed to deprive a competitor of a target that he did not shoot at, obviously loses sight of the basic principle of our sport, i.e. to shoot at a target and receive 1 for a hit and 0 for a miss. Such intentional travesties of fair play clearly reflect either the utmost ignorance, or an extremely bad attitude, on the part of the rule maker. In this instance we have a classic example of an excessively draconian penalty, for something that is, at worst, a minor breach of etiquette.

I believe that our Skeet rules have degenerated into little more than an isolationist shambles, due to being made and changed by people who don't even clearly understand the basic game, let alone it's international competition implications. The solution? In the short term, it is to either accept the NSSA Skeet Rulebook as such, or make sufficient changes to our own rulebook, to bring it effectively into line with NSSA guidelines. From a practical point of view I think that the latter would be easier to implement, due to the multiple mode requirements of our rulebook. However, in the long term, it is to somehow get a minimum of one active dedicated skeet shooter, with at least some international experience, onto the ACTA rules committee. I believe that the best and easiest way to do this, in the situation where one part of our sport is so overshadowed and dominated by the other, would be to add another position to the National Executive. This position would not be State oriented, and would be titled something like Skeet Executive or Skeet Advisor.

NSSA have something like this in the composition of their own Executive. After electing all the State Directors, they then elect several people from the shooters ranks, on the basis of their knowledge and/or experience, and call them 'Directors at large'. We actually tried a similar thing some years ago in an attempt to address this very problem. But in order to appear non-discriminatory, separate advisors for all three of the disciplines were appointed, and so the system collapsed in a very short space of time, due to being top-heavy and largely irrelevant. This was because another trap representative was redundant - we already had 15 of those. An ISU representative was unnecessary - no one in his right mind would even think about tinkering with the 'holy commandments'. And the skeet representative was appointed by the hierarchy, rather than elected by the shooters he was supposed to represent. If we ever get another shot at it, I would like to see nominations for such a position invited from interested persons each year and then an election conducted at the Skeet Nationals.

On a brighter note, the meeting between the State President and the skeet shooters, at the recent Victorian Skeet Carnival, produced some very worthwhile recommendations. These included one to restore our carnival to three days duration, and another to include a 20-gauge event on the Friday. Let's hope the VCTA sees fit to approve these. The small gauge event was in response to the fact that a National 20 gauge event now exists, however, as with the Nationals, this event would not be included in the Overall High Gun. By the time this goes to print, the Tasmanian Skeet Carnival will have been conducted, and I hope their move to the long weekend in June, to allow them to expand their shoot to three days, was successful and well received. Some upcoming events to plan for include a two-day skeet shoot at Frankston on the fourth

weekend of this month, and the NSW skeet carnival at Wagga, on the second weekend of next month. These will provide the start of a good build-up for the Nationals in November, and I hope to see many of you at both these venues.

The correct answer to last month's STQ was: John Summers was the first Australian skeet shooter to break 300 straight. The reason I was so impressed by this feat was because in doing so John increased the National Long Run Record by the largest margin ever, when he bumped it up by 95 targets from 258 to 353. The first correct answer drawn was submitted by Bernie Smith of Wesley Vale in Tasmania, who wins the free entry to this year's National Skeet Doubles Championship. Congratulations Bernie.

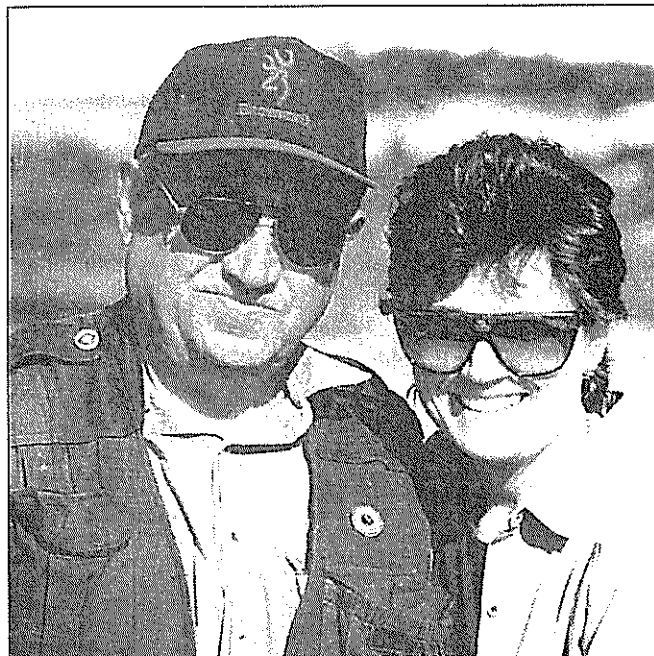
He soon bought his own shotgun and was encouraged along the hard long road to success by Club President Gary Kennerson.

TINTS

I recommend the use of clear lenses in most shooting situations. In some conditions yellow, orange, vermilion, bronze, purple or brown lenses have been found to be helpful. There is no evidence for why various coloured tints can help. Some of the tints may increase the contrast of the target with the background; this is purely personal preference and will vary between individuals. The amount or percentage of tint is also personal preference, although a tint will decrease the amount of light reaching the eye and will therefore slow the visual image reaching the brain and this will slow the reaction time of the shooter to the target. For this reason low saturation tints are always recommended.

YELLOW:

This is said to increase the contrast of the target especially in dull, hazy, foggy, rainy or low lighting conditions. A yellow lens absorbs blue-violet rays of light. I have found from 20% to 50% absorption to give pleasing results for patients.

ORANGE:

This is a tint that also blocks blue-violet rays of light. This can increase the contrast of the target to the background. This can be helpful at dawn or dusk.

BRONZE:

This is a mixture of orange and brown and can be good in bright conditions as it will cut out some of the glare, and will also highlight the target against the background.

BROWN:

A 20 to 50% brown lens is helpful in very bright lighting conditions. It helps to reduce some of the glare from the target, and allows the shooters eyes and face to relax, rather than squinting. This reduces eye fatigue and therefore provides a more consistent visual performance over many hours of shooting competition.

PURPLE:

A purple lens can be good for green shrubby backgrounds and fluoro or black targets, especially on bright days. It will highlight the target, dull the background, and block some of the glare.

VERMILION:

This is a reddish pink colour and highlights a fluorescent target against most backgrounds, especially green backgrounds. This is not a deep colour like purple, so does not dull glare to the same extent.

The use of tints are very subjective and vary between individuals. With all tints I would recommend that the tint only blocks 20 to 50% of visible light as a maximum. This means that 50 to 80% of visible light still reaches the eye.

MULTICOATING

Multicoats increase the light transmittance through the lens. This allows very little loss from reflection off the lens surface. Therefore giving a very crisp visual image. Because it cuts some reflective glare it may be the only addition needed to a basic lens in most lighting conditions. It is especially helpful at dusk and dawn.

It can only be added to a new unscratched lens.

Advisable for most competition shooters, but is more difficult to keep clean.

NSW Members and Dealers

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
