



Travel

Travel for some members of this team turned out to be a huge saga involving a cast of thousands, mainly customs and police in ports through which several people had to be routed.

Of the first group leaving Australia. three members of this team plus one person representing Great Britain departed from Melbourne and four others from Sydney with the intention of meeting in Singapore for a flight to Fukuoka International Airport in Japan. However, the Melbourne group was delayed by a defective battery in the aircraft's computer system. A borrowed battery from another recently arrived Singapore Airlines aircraft finally rectified this. Departure was delayed for this group by about 4 hours and led to a missed connection in Singapore by approximately 1-hour.



Michael Dlamond --- Gold


The next Singapore Airlines flight to Fukuoka was not until 24 hours later. It took some lengthy negotiations and a brainwave by our British colleague Claire Watts who remembered that the British Team was travelling via Hong Kong before a re-routing was arranged through Hong Kong and Okinawa. This would theoretically get us to Kumamoto on the same day as the missed flight. Further strenuous negotiations resulted in rooms being provided in the Airport Hotel within the terminal rather than out in the city for the three hours before we needed to catch the next plane.

We knew going through Hong Kong would be difficult with firearms and it proved to be yet another lengthy negotiation - this time on the tarmac with about 14 customs and police officers before we were able to board our once again delayed aircraft. Full firearms inspection was carried out and every piece of official paper that we could find was produced. In the end the ammunition



proved to be the biggest stumbling block but finally we were on our way with all our possessions.

The total journey of more than forty hours for at least one member of this group exceeded the time taken to travel to some South American cities and we arrived in Fukuoka just twelve hours late. Remarkably, every item of baggage arrived with us. arrived with them. They were accommodated there overnight. It was not known whether their baggage had been re-tagged for Tokyo or whether it had gone on to Fukuoka. If the former then the case, guns and ammo would have to be cleared through customs in Tokyo and the team members would be flown direct to Kumamoto - if the latter they would fly to Fukuoka, clear customs

This was not the case for the second group departing from Melbourne. Whilst their aircraft actually took off, after about an hour and a half it returned because a passenger had noticed a wire protruding from the wing and thought it was sparking. It was checked out and eventually this flight left Melbourne several hours later resulting in another missed connection to Singapore - this time by only about 30 minutes. This group was re-routed to Tokyo, after overnighting in Singapore, only to find that their baggage had not

there and then take the two hour bus trip to Kumamoto. As it turned out the first scenario applied.

The organising committee advised me that if they had to clear customs in Tokyo they would unlikely be able to bring their ammunition with them. Meanwhile new gun permits were hastily organised with the police in Tokyo in case their guns arrived there. Although there were apparently "discussions" with customs and police in Tokyo, mainly because the ammunition package was over 5 kilograms in weight, they were permitted to take it with them after it was split into two.

By the time this second group from Melbourne had arrived at the hotel, they had been in transit for more than two days, even longer than the first group out from this port.

Once everybody had arrived it was time to start organising departures. Three people were to leave the day after the arrival of the last group, two Australians and one British. This required a 5.00 am bus because the other teams were leaving on different flights and the need to go via the

armoury at the range to pick up their firearms.


The last group of Australians to depart was scheduled to leave the hotel by bus at 6.00 am. This was advised at the team meeting the night before and on the morning the rooms of all team members were rung by the manager at 5.15. Only one person failed to respond, even though his room was rung at least 10 times between then and 6.00 am when the bus left. The conclusion I reached in the absence of any response was that he had not come home and we had no alternative but to leave without him. We were all at the ticket counter less than an hour before the plane was due to depart when he turned up luckily, having caught the last possible bus to connect with his flight.

Customs clearance in Japan.

On arrival, each firearm was inspected and the serial number checked by customs officials. This was friendly and carried out quickly. However, the first group from Melbourne then had to wait for a further two hours for a bus to Kumamoto only 120 km away and then the trip took two hours, following which firearms had to be deposited in the armoury at the range. Processing then took place at the hotel before this group was able to reach their rooms at about 2.30 am totally exhausted. The only consolation was that the time change was minimal, Sydney being just 1 hour ahead.

The picture was much the same for each of the other groups on arrival.

On departure the inspection was less rigorous, the only hitch being that the person who missed the bus out of Kumamoto had all the paperwork from Tokyo for the two girls who came in with him and this was something of a hitch. This lesson had been learned many times in the past and that is that each individual

shooter must carry all his own paperwork especially those pieces to do with his or her own firearms in the event of groups or individuals being separated which has happened many times before causing problems.

Ammunition.

Several members of the team brought ammunition packaged and in most cases there were problems, some on departure from Australia and certainly in Hong Long and Tokyo, even though each port had been advised in advance (albeit with short notice). I had been informed that shooters had been told not to take ammunition

with them in case of problems. The shooters, however, told me that they had been asked how much ammunition they were taking with them and this was borne out by the paperwork sent to the organisers in advance from Australia.

Accommodation.

There were two official hotels and we were in the New Sky, which is generously described, in the Lonely Planet Guide as a luxury upmarket hotel. The other official hotel was the more upmarket of the two while the New Sky had definitely seen better days. However, it was comfortable and clean. All team members' rooms were not on the same floor but the big advantage was single rooms for everyone. Meals at the hotel were fairly expensive so most team members ate most nights at other places such as the nearby hamburger place, a pizza house or local Japanese restaurants.

Competition venue.

The shooting range, built in 1998 at a cost of US\$40 million for a major sport festival to be held later this year, is a good range for competition and is in a very pleasant location at the foot of Mt Aso, the resident volcano. Fitted with Mattarelli equipment the general consensus of opinion seemed to be that it is an excellent venue and could be expected to produce high scores as it did. The background was a fairly steep mountain slope covered with dark green trees with a foreground of green grass. The orange clays stood out well against this background and many shooters commented on how clearly they could be seen. This coupled with beautiful, sunny, mostly still weather all contributed to the high standard of

competition.

Opening/closing Ceremonies.

The opening ceremony was held at the range and was a relatively short affair. The closing ceremony was buffet style at the official hotel, the New Sky. Medals for Trap and Skeet were presented at the start of this function, which was a relatively informal affair.

Ground Transport.

Organisers provided buses between the two official hotels and the range as well as between airport and hotel and vice versa. The trip to the range from the New Sky Hotel was generally about 40 minutes or longer depending on traffic conditions. Buses were always punctual if not as frequent as some might have liked.

Performances.

Performances of note included Michael Diamond's individual gold by a clear margin in the Men's Trap Event. Russell Mark placed fifth in the same event after going into the final in third place. Team silver in the same event was just a smidgen away from gold. The team bronze medal in Men's Double Trap rewarded a solid performance and Michael placed seventh in the individual. Otherwise everyone put in the best that they were capable of on the day and whilst some undoubtedly would have been disappointed with their performances, there is no question that they worked hard to produce their best.

The team.

Team members were responsible and conducted themselves well. All were cooperative and pleasant and it was a real pleasure to be associated with them. Particular mention must be made of the contributions of Luca Scribani Rossi and Greg Chan. Both are very competent and reliable. Being new to travelling with a solely target group I was pleased to have their help and advice which was willingly and pleasantly provided on several occasions.

The main problems we faced had to do with the travel delays, which were out of our control, and ammunition which was a concern to customs and police officials. Team members handled these problems with maturity and good will. David Cunningham and two younger team members must make special mention of the marathon journey of about 48 hours from Melbourne. David took responsibility for guiding the group through a very trying time and, by report, handled all the problems with efficiency and exemplary self-control under difficult circumstances.






The next event of the day was the Mount Isa Gun Club Day Single

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS AUGUST 1999

Last month I elaborated at some length on the discrepancies between the World Standard Rules for Skeet Shooting, as laid down by the NSSA, and the Australian Skeet Rules as determined by the ACTA, which have run off at a shallow tangent over a period of time. If you read that article, there probably won't be any doubt in your mind about a couple of things. The first is that I firmly believe there should only be one set of Rules worldwide, and the second is that the ACTA Rules Committee now probably believe I am a trouble maker with a smart mouth and far too much to say. While I am forced to admit that there may be some semblance of truth in the latter, I am hopeful that our opposing positions may be able to be reconciled to some degree, and that the former can eventually pretty much come to pass.

On the basis of that assumption, I intend to elaborate this month on some other areas closely related to the Rules and their application and consequences. When quoting from the NSSA Rulebook, I do not intend to attempt to convert the measurements from Imperial to Metric for a couple of reasons. Firstly I do not believe that it is either relevant or necessary when dealing with international specifications. And secondly I know that such conversions are fraught with dangers, such as misunderstandings due to the inability to visualize abstract concepts, and the tendency to overlook seemingly obvious typos for much the same reason. A typical example of this can be found in our current Rulebook, where the distance between Skeet stations is incorrectly transposed from 26 feet 8 3/8 inches to 8.3 meters, instead of 8.13 meters. This type of error never becomes obvious until you try to lay out a field using these specifications and find that station seven ends up out in no-mans land.

First letis look at the flight path of a Skeet target. It is governed by the Rulebook, which states that the target shall pass over the crossing point at a height of fifteen feet and carry to a distance of sixty yards in still air. Thus each traphouse provides a target with a different trajectory due to the difference in height from which it is launched. The high house target originates from a point 10 feet above the ground and directly above the base chord. The low house target originates from a point 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet above the ground and 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet outside the base chord. The Rulebook allows a tolerance of plus or minus 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet at the crossing point in both height and direction due to the widespread use of a 3-foot diameter setting hoop.

I dwelt fairly heavily last month on the difference in target speed created by the difference in stipulated distances between the NSSA and the ACTA, and the additional confusion created by differing practical applications of these distances between the two main disciplines that are jointly administered in this country. The reason I dwelt on this is because the speed of the target is probably the most important of all the variable factors from a shooters point of view, and the one most likely to cause a miss with the least amount of variation. Each individual target speed should theoretically be constant due to its necessity to conform to the standard target light. The fact that the low house target needs to climb an additional 6½ feet on it's way to the crossing point, and yet still cover the same distance as the high house target, would seem to suggest that it would need to be launched quite a bit faster. However this is almost negated by the fact that the low house target covers it's distance with a more arcing trajectory, and arrives at it's distance marker with very little retained velocity. The high house target, on the other hand, is driven with a much flatter trajectory, and arrives at its distance marker with considerable retained velocity.

In actual fact, both targets leave the arm of the throwing machine at reasonably similar speeds of around 50 m.p.h. The invention of radar guns, and their application in recent years to clay target setting, has pretty much borne this out. It has been found that under normal conditions, initial readings of around 46 m.p.h. for the high house and around 48 m.p.h. for the low house, will provide targets which conform to standard specifications. Part of the reason for this apparent difference in speeds is due to the fact that practicality dictates the high house target being measured further out along, and from a greater angle to, it's flight line than the low one. The major benefit of using radar guns, apart from being a little quicker and easier, is the consistency of target speed from field to field that they produce.

The initial velocity of both targets will also vary due to air density. Thus it will vary slightly at any given club from day to day, depending upon changes in barometric pressure. More noticeably, it will vary considerably from club to club depending upon elevation above sea level. The higher the altitude, the lower the average air pressure and density. This would seem to suggest that at higher altitudes, with less air resistance, the target would not need to be launched as fast in order to reach the same distance. If the target was spherical, like a shot pellet, then this would certainly be true. But as the target is somewhat aerodynamically shaped like an aircraft wing, it actually generates lift as it travels through the air. This elongates its flight as compared to a non-airfoil shaped object, and thinner air will provide less lift.

Thus, the question is, do these two effects cancel one another out or does one override the other? Practical experience has shown that, at high altitude, the effect of reduced air resistance outweighs the effect of reduced aerodynamic lift and thus the target does not in fact need to be launched as fast in order to conform to the specified flight path. A machine set in Savannah (sea level) and then installed in Denver (5000 ft.) will throw the targets about 65 yards and will require the speed to be backed off a couple of mph to bring the distance back to 60 yards.

At some time in every skeet shooter's career, they will probably shoot on a field that somehow just doesn't look or feel quite right to them. This has happened to me at least a dozen times and on all but two occasions it turned out to be an optical illusion. However any time that this happens it is much better to put it out of your mind by checking it, rather than have it cause you to shoot tentatively due to wondering about it. This is another good reason to arrive a day early at any clubs you have not previously visited, and shoot some practice on each of the fields. With the help of a friend and a list of basic measurements, and a measuring tape or a little ingenuity, a field can be adequately checked out in a few minutes.

Always start by making sure that Station #8 is exactly centralized between the two traphouses. First make sure that it is centralized on the base chord line by standing with your back up against the center of the face of the high house, having your friend stand in the center of Station #8, and making sure that he appears to line up with the center of the low house. Then make sure that Station #8 is equidistant from each house by measuring it. If you have a tape measure, it should be 63 feet 4 1/2 inches to each house from the center of Station #8. If you do not have a tape, use the pull-cord to make sure that the distance from the center of Station #8 to each house is the same, and then work on the reasonably safe assumption that the two houses are correctly spaced.

Then make sure that the crossing point is correctly positioned. First make sure that it lines up with the centers of Station #4 and Station #8. Then make sure that it is located 18 feet from the center of Station #8. If you have a tape, measure it. If you don't then use the target setting hoop, which should be 16 ^{1/2} feet from the base of the pole to the top of the hoop, as the target height is 15 feet and the hoop diameter is usually 3 feet. Station #8 should be 6 feet long and 3 feet wide and thus the distance from the crossing point to the nearest edge of Station #8 should be 16 ^{1/2} feet (the overall length of the target setting hoop). Now you are in a position to check any or all of the three areas that may not feel quite right to you - the station positions, the target height or the target path.

For the Shooting Stations to be in the correct position, the center of the front edge of each perimeter station should be 21 yards from the crossing point. The distance from the center of the front edge of each perimeter station, to the same point on each neighboring station, should be 26 feet 8 3/8 inches. If you have a tape, then measure them. If you don't, then use the pull-cord to make sure that at least they are all equidistant, and then work on the reasonably safe assumption that if they are all the same, then they are probably all correct.

Now for the Target Height. If you have a tape, measure the target setting hoop and make sure that it is 15 feet from the base of the pole in the center of the hoop. If you don't have a tape, check it against some other reasonably assumable comparison such as 2 1/2 times the length of Station #8 or five times the width of any station pad. Then use the hoop to set the target height, allowing for any elevation variation between Station #8 and the target crossing point, and you won't be far wrong.

Now that the height and line of the target are correct at the crossing point, the only other variable to check is distance, which will control the target speed. First establish the boundary markers by extending the line from the center of each target window, through the crossing point, to the position where it intersects with a line extended from the front face of each traphouse. If you wish to double-check the boundary markers, they are both 22 yards from the crossing point. The high target marker is 12 yards from the center of the rear of Station #7, and the low target marker is 11 yards and

From these boundary markers, extend the "window center-crossing point" line another 16 yards and you have the distance marker points. If you don't have a tape, then 16 yards is twice the full length of the target setting hoop plus the length from the base of the pole to the center of the hoop. Now set the targets to fly through the center of the hoop and land at these distance markers, and again you can't be far wrong.

The only other questionable factor is the target emergence point. This should be the center of each target window. The center of the high house window should be 10 feet above the center of the rear side of Station #1. The center of the low house window should be 3 19 feet above the level of Station #7, and 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet beyond the center of its rear side. Sometimes, even if the window is correctly positioned, the target-throwing machine will be mounted incorrectly, such that the target does not emerge from the center of the window. From a practical shooting point of view, this is not particularly critical in either plane with the low house, or in the vertical plane with the high house. However, if the high house target emerges from either side of the window, it is advisable to be aware of this and adjust your shooting position on Station #1 accordingly.

Now, to change the subject. By the time you read this article, the NSW Skeet Carnival will be only a couple of weeks away. However, due to our 30day publishing deadline, as I write it, that event is still six weeks away and the electronic bits for the first prototype of CVRILis new Skeet Phono-pull System have just arrived on my doorstep. Itis my job to figure out the best practical application for these items, and I am very hopeful that only a minimal amount of field testing and fine-tuning will be required to produce a good workable system. Thus I am confident that half a dozen sets will be available to the NSWCTA for their annual tournament in Wagga on the second weekend of August. Provided they work well there, and the shooters are happy with them, I see no reason why this year's Skeet Nationals cannot utilize similar technology to that which was so successful at the Trap Nationals in Roma eaclier this year.

This was bought about with the sale of a piece of freehold land and the new owner is withholding his signature for the shooting rights over his piece of land.

The good news for Sarina shooters is a Sarina Clay Target Club was formed in the past twelve month's and now have their own incorporation and registration with the QCTA in place.

The SCTC operate on the existing rifle range, which does not have to rely on this freehold land for their safety zone.

The Club has the full support of the local authorities. Their help so far has been very encouraging for the club in their endeavor to make a small shooting complex, which will hopefully accommodate shotgun, pistol and maybe rifle again some day.

With a district population of 10,000 it is important to maintain this area of land for shooting, especially with the new gun laws in place.

At this stage we only have one temporary trap layout with an automatic thrower which delivers very good targets. In the future we hope to have a three-trap layout.

The SCTC was accepted by the QCTA as a practice club only. This in Queensland means we cannot hold any trophy shoots of any description or give out any prizes until we are eligible to apply and be recognised as a club status.

This in itself stalls any chance of the club being able to do any fund raising for improvements which are much needed in any club, not to mention the fact that we have to maintain all day to day costs or try to be self sufficient in running our own club.

The club is only about 5kms from Sarina and the people are very pleasant. You will find the people very helpful in whatever your needs.

Sarina is only a short drive to the outlets of the ever-popular Whitsunday Islands. For the travelling tourists we have an area beside the clubhouse for camping and caravan sites. All we ask is a donation to our club for the use of this facility.


We do look forward to any visiting shooter to our area to come and have a shot with us or just enjoy our popular barbecue lunch.



Ocular Dominance: (Master Eye)

The shooter will most accurately fixate the site with the dominant eye. The gun is usually held on the dominant side of the body for balance and steadiness. Ipsilateral dominance (same eye as hand) is more accurate than shooting with contralateral (different eye to hand). If cross dominant the preference should be to use the dominant eye and the non-dominant hand/arm. It is very difficult to rotate head more and use the dominant eye, with the dominant hand.

Ocular dominance should be tested in all junior and first time and novice shooters. These shooters should be encouraged as early as possible to use their dominant eye-matching arm. Blinking

A shooter should learn to control their blinking as it takes 1/5th of a second to blink (0.2 sec), this decreases the concentration, and is significant amount of time if the target has already been called. Occulars/Two eyes open:

Each eye sees an image of the world. This gives what is called "Physiological diplopis". This allows recognition of depth and location of the visual target in space. This also means that a shooter will need to suppress (turn off or not use) the non-dominant eye as the trigger is pulled.

You should always keep both eyes open while shooting; this gives judgement of depth and the ability to locate the target quickly. If you cannot turn-off the non dominant eye when you shoot, and see two barrels or two targets, a very small spot in exactly the right position will occlude stop you seeing two exactly at the same time of firing. This will allow you to keep both eyes open at all times and give you better depth perception.

Keeping the non-aiming eye open allows peripheral input. This helps to keep balance, and spatial awareness while aiming. Closing one eye will cause the facial muscles to strain, and reduces the peripheral field seen and the ability to judge depth.

Visualisation:

This is an important tool for any sports person. When dry firing the shooter needs to visualise the actual competition taking place. This will help with relaxation, breathing control, and focusing on the task of shooting. The competitive shooter needs to learn to block out all other distractions and thoughts. Visualisation is a good way of practicing this. It can be practiced at any time, in any location.

Summary.

1. Maximum visual acuity for both eyes for distance

2. Any small prescription is very significant.

3. Don't close one eye when you shoot, a very small spot on the precise position of the lens is better.

4. Prescriptions change with time \cdot they need to be checked regularly.

5. Thick plastic or polycarbonate lense for safety only.

- 6. Clear lenses with light tints.
- 7. Multicoating to stop reflections.
- 8. Vision training for depth perception and spatial awareness.

9. Vision training for changing focus quickly.

10. Blinking control.

11. Visualisation

Sports Vision Examinations.

A Sports Optometrist can examine your eyes for "normal" visual needs and occular health, as well as sporting needs.

1. The Examination:

A Sports optometry examination specific to shooters will look at distance visual acuity (the amount of detail you see at distance), accommodative skills (your ability to change focus from trap house to target), occular dominance (which is your master eye), fusion (the ability to put the picture from each eye together and see one image with depth), vergences (the ability to turn converge and diverge the eyes to follow a target). It may also include the ability to suppress the don-dominant eye, peripheral vision and the speed of reaction to a peripheral target, hand eye coordination, depth perception and spatial localization.

2. Sports Eyewear:

Suitable corrective lenses, frames, tints and coatings can be added to spectacle prescriptions and can be designed specifically for shooting, with both very sharp vision and safety involved.



A small boy once sat, impossibly still and silent for one so young, listening with the earnest intent of a scholar. He was totally absorbed in another of his grandfather's prolific stories, either from war in Gallipoli, France or Palestine or from the frontier of a pioneering youth. Such occasions were many and varied, from lounge room to gun room, from rifle range to creek bank; it was the shaping of a generation, the moulding of a boy's sense of values. It was the 1960's the era of the quintessential rural Australian family, when pastoral pursuits earnt respect, shooting was an honorable past-time and traditions were respectfully observed.

On May 26th, 1999, the anniversary of his grandfather's landing at Gallipoli, that same small boy, now husband and father with receding hairline, gathered with his parents, fellow clay target club members and many returned servicemen from the merged recognition of two great Australian traditions.

The Warwick Clay Target Club, founded in 1950 by veterans of the first war and built on a site significant to the second, has proudly established its own memorial to those who served Australia in all wars. It was the initiative of Club President Greg Newey and brought to fruition by many enthusiastic and selfless members of a thriving club with generous financial support from the Department of Veteran's Affairs.

More than fifty people, mostly returned servicemen, attended the ceremony steeped in the tradition of Anzac Day. Club patron and returned soldier, Vic Wiedman unveiled the plaque, a permanent reminder to the wider community of the indisputable place recreational shooting holds in our culture and of the many great founding fathers who wished it so.

The plaque reads:

Warwick Clay Target Club War Memorial

The club was first formed after World War One by a group of returned servicemen who enjoyed the sport of shotgun target shooting, originally live pigeon and then clay pigeon.

Reformed in 1950, the club had many locations including Queens Park and rural properties. It was finally located permanently on this site in 1966 with the foresight of returned servicemen of the club from both major conflicts.

Morgan Park was also used for bivouac and training by the 11th Lighthorse Regiment between the wars and was a major staging point for troops of World War Two.

The club has amongst it membership veterans of all military con-

flicts and this memorial is dedicated to them and their comrades.

Officially unveiled by club patron Victor H Weidman QX28387 - 1st Armoured Division - 26th May 1999.

Lest we forget.

My grandfather would doubtless be somewhat dismissive of all the fuss we have created, even be bewildered by my sentimental ramblings, but deep down there would be limited approval.

For the record, he was Alex H Smith, pioneer, Anzac, horseman, successful grazier, craftsman, good shot and fisherman, bush philosopher and mentor.

I, Alex J Smith shall not forget. (Alex J Smith is a member of the Warwich Clay Target Club, the Australian Clay Target Association and the Sporting Shooters Association of Australia.)

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts and maximum fine of \$5,500.
