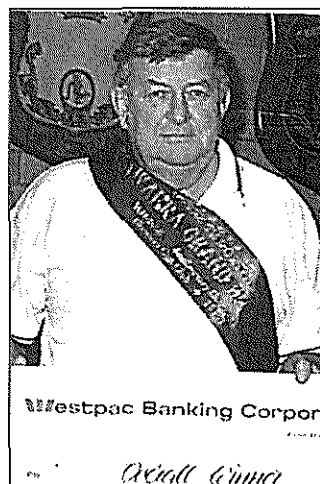

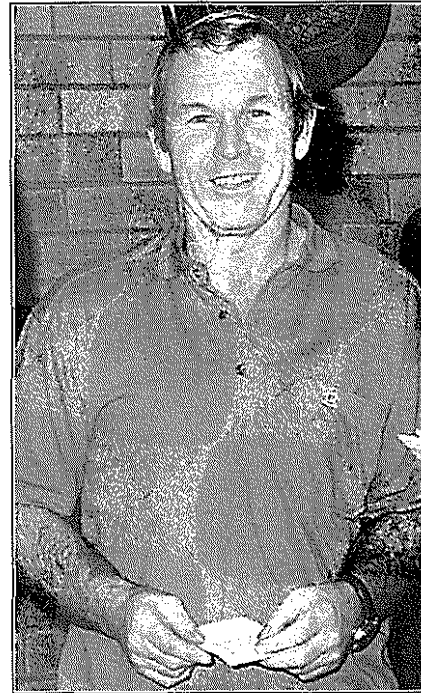

Selection Criteria for the Year 2000 ISSF Shooting

The Year 2000 is the Olympic year and this in turn affects the year 2000 Training Squad.

The base of the year 2000 Training Squad will be made from shooters who attended the World Championships and those particular shooters do not have to qualify at the 1999 ISSF National Titles. They are as follows:

Mens Trap: Michael Diamond, Russel Mark, Glen Kable.

Mens Double Trap: Russel Mark, Michael Diamond, Adam Vella.

Womens Trap: Deserie Wakefield-Baynes, Lisa Smith.

Womens Double Trap: Ann Maree Roberts, Deserie Wakefield-Baynes.

Mens Skeet: Clive Barton, David Cunningham, George Barton.

Womens Skeet: Natasha Lonsdale, Janine Kettels.

As Australia still needs to gain 2 quota spots, one in Mens Skeet and one in Womens Double Trap, these will have to be gained at the 1999 Oceania Games in Sydney in November.

The following shooters will now make up the 'A' Team in Mens Skeet following their performance at the World Championships and they will automatically go to the Oceania Games:

1. Clive Barton
2. David Cunningham
3. George Barton

and the following two women will also go into the Womens Double Trap Team at the Oceania Games:

1. Ann Maree Roberts
2. Deserie Wakefield-Baynes

The shooters that will be needed to make up the remainder of the Training Squad and who will compete at the Oceania Games and the Commonwealth Shooting Federation Championships in New Zealand in November, will be picked from the National ISSF Championships.

- Mens Trap 6
Mens Double Trap 6
Womens Trap 6
Womens Double Trap 4
Mens Skeet 3
Womens Skeet 6.

The Junior Training Squad will be selected as per the new Selection Policy from the nominations put forward by their respective States and will be chosen by the Shooting Committee.

The following policy of the A.C.T.A. and the A.S.A. for the Olympic Shadow Team should be read in conjunction with the Selection from the Olympic Discipline Nationals.

PLEASE NOTE:

There is no funding whatsoever for Oceania Games Teams or the Commonwealth Shooting Federation Championship Teams - These will be on a self funded basis only, excepting for nomination fees.

Shooting Committee Australian Shooting Association Inc. Clay Target Olympic Games 2000 Nomination Policy

1. GENERAL PRINCIPLES

1.1 Selection Panel.

The Selection Panel will consist of the National Coach employed by ASA; the High Performance Manager; and the Chairman of the ACTA Shooting Committee.

1.2 Travelling Score.

No Australian is eligible to compete at World Cup level or World Championships unless he/she has made a travelling Score at one of the domestic ranking events in the current season (commencing with the National Championships each year). This is to ensure minimum standards necessary for selection.

2. BACKGROUND.

2.1 Clay Target Training Squad (Seniors)

The Training Squad is the Squad selected at the 1998 National Championships. This consists of six shooters in each Olympic event, being the top six placed shooters in the High Gun at the Championships. In exceptional circumstances up to two more Wild Cards per event have been handed out at the discretion of the selectors.

2.2 Ranking System (1999 only).

At all domestic Ranking events, points will be awarded from 1st place down to 6th place.

Where Wild Cards have been given out at the National Championships, these shooters received 4 points each.

2.3 Ranking Events (1998-99 only)

Domestic Ranking events are (in chronological order):

National Championships 1998

Australia Cup 1999

Australasian Pacific Grand Prix 1999

Australia Cup Final 1999.

After the World Cups in 1999, further points will be awarded to the shooters who participate according to the following formula: Within each discipline,

the athlete who has achieved the highest World Cup placing will receive 15 points, the second highest 12, third 10, 4th 8, 5th 6, 6th 5 then 4,3,2 if applicable.

2.4 World Championships 1999 Selection.

Following the World Cups in 1999 the top 6 in each discipline will be invited to participate in the Australia Cup Final. The 1999 World Championship Team will then be selected by the Selection Panel from the top 5 ranked shooters following the Australia Cup Final.

2.5 Olympic Shadow Team Selection Procedure.

Following the selection of the World Championship Team, the Mens team will be automatically selected into the Shadow Team for 2000 as will the top 2 women place-getters in the World Championships. At the 1999 National Championships, the 3 highest place-getters will be selected to the Oceania Championships A Team and the next 3 to the B Team. The top 3 scorers in the individual ranking at the Oceania Championships (including Finals), but who are not already selected into the Shadow Olympic Team, will form the Commonwealth Championship Team. In each discipline the top 2 in the Commonwealth Championships 1999 (Mens Events) and top 1 (Womens Events) will also qualify for membership of the Olympic Shadow Team.

3. OLYMPIC GAMES TEAM NOMINATION PROCEDURE.

3.1 Nomination conditions.

- Nominations will be made in accordance with the ISSF Special Rules for Olympic Games as published in the IT Journal 5/97 pp. 44-46 and amended in the IT Journal 6/97 p.39.

- Only athletes meeting the ISSF Minimum Qualifying Standard at the time of nomination will be eligible.

Provided Australia has sufficient eligible athletes in each event, the 2000 Australian Olympic Team will consist of one athlete (possible the same athlete for two or more Quota Places in different events) for every quota Place held by Australia following the final closure of the ISSF Qualification System for the Sydney Games (See Annexure A). In the event that (As a result of some athlete being nominated for more than one Quota Place) the number of athletes selected by the AOC is less than the number of Quota Places held by Australia, the AOC will return surplus Quota Places to the ISSF.

- In order to maximise the placings gained by the 2000 Australian Olympic Team the ASA reserves the right (after first consulting with the AOC) to apply to the ISSF, in advance of the Year 2000 Australia Cup Final, to exchange Quota Places held, for Quota Places in events in which Australian Athletes have demonstrated clearly higher standards of performance in the 1999 and 2000 seasons.

3.2 Mens Disciplines.

Each member of the Shadow Team will be ranked following the Australia Cup in 2000. This will be a subjective decision by the Selection Panel, based firstly on current form as shown at the National Championships and Australia Cup, and secondly on recent (1998 & 1999) past performance at International Level, and the rankings will be published. The top 4 members of the Shadow Team will compete in at least 2 World Cups and the 5th in at least 1, depending on the number of World Cups the Shadow Team attends. At each World Cup, the 2 shadow Team members who are not competing may be entered for MQS at the coach's discretion.

Following the Australasian Pacific Grand Prix, 1 member of the Training Squad will be selected to compete against the Shadow Team in the Year 2000 Australia Cup Final which will take place some time after the Sydney World Cup. Within 5 days of the conclusion of this event the Sydney Olympic Games Team will be nominated to the Australian Olympic Committee by the Selection Panel. Nomination will be by subjective decision, paying particular attention to:

- Medals won in World Cups attended by the Shadow Team in 2000.

- First place in Australia Cup Final (if the score is at expected Olympic Finals Level or above)

- Past performance especially at Olympic Games and World Championships.

- General current form.

3.3 Womens Disciplines.

The whole Shadow Team will compete in the Australia Cup Final and in 2 World Cups (if available).

Following the Australasian Pacific Grand Prix, 3 members of the Training Squad will be selected to compete against Shadow Team in the Australia Cup Final which will take place some time after the Sydney World Cup. Within 5 days of the conclusion of this event the Sydney Olympic Games Team will be nominated to the Australian Olympic Committee by the Selection Panel. Nomination will be by subjective decision, paying particular attention to:

- Medals won in World Cups 2000

- First place in Australia Cup Final (if the score is at expected Olympic Finals Level or above)

- Past performance especially at Olympic Games and World Championships.

- General current form.

3.4 Nomination Date

The 2000 Australian Olympic Team nomination date will be fixed and published as soon as the date for the Australia Cup Final in 2000 is known for certain. As the venue for this event will be Sydney International Shooting Centre, the date cannot be fixed without agreement from the Managing Body. To be eligible to be nominated to the AOC for potential inclusion in the

2000 Australian Olympic Team, athletes must meet the criteria contained in clause 4.1 of the Selection Agreement.

3.5 Selection to the 2000 Olympic Team by the AOC.

i) The fact that an Athlete or Official is nominated to the AOC does not ensure that the AOC will select that person as a member of the 2000 Australian Olympic Team. Selection to the Team and to participate in events at the 2000 Olympic Games is at the discretion of the AOC.

ii) In order for Athletes to be selected by the AOC for inclusion in the 2000 Australian Olympic Team, they must meet the criteria contained in clauses 5.3 (1), (2) and (5) of the Selection Agreement and in addition, satisfy the requirements contained in the AOC Selection Criteria contained in Annexure B of the Selection Agreement.

(iii) The AOC will determine the date when it will announce the selection of Athletes and Officials in the 2000 Australian Olympic Team, and this date will be advised.

3.6 Post-selection Period.

Athletes are required to maintain a training programme and performance to the satisfaction of the head coach throughout the interval between selection and the Olympic competition date. In cases where athletes do not comply, selectors will recommend to the AOC that the athlete be removed from the 2000 Australian Olympic Team.

1999 OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE NATIONALS

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

2. Targets to be shot in brackets of 25, squads of 6 Olympic Trap, squads of 6 ISSF Skeet and rounds of 25 Pair for Open/Jnr Double Trap and 20 Pair for Womens Double Trap.

3. Nominations to be received by 3pm the day prior to the beginning of an Event or such time as determined by the Tournament Director.

4. Shooter will be squadded as per ISSF rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw.

5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable event.

6. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.

7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

8. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooter's signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.

9. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfill their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement who must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may INCUR A PENALTY AS PERSCRIBED UNDER INTERNATIONAL RULES.

10. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised up to FIVE (5) TARGETS.

11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.

13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective High Gun.

15. Junior shooters are eligible for their section as well as the Open.

16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.

17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing, 1st, 2nd, 3rd in all events.

18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.

19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.

21. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to the second family member competing in the same event. They being wives, husbands and juniors. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.

E.g. (1) Father and 2 children - father pays full noms whilst the 2 juniors pay 60% noms each.

E.g. (2) Husband, wife and two children nominate - Husband pays full noms whilst the other three pay 60% noms each.

22. All competitors must comply with Firearm Licensing Laws in their state of residence and in the state hosting the National Championships.

After some Friday practice for a few and very little sleep for others, the proceedings got under way on Saturday with the first 75 targets of the State Championships in both Trap and Skeet. The first days competition would also see the selecting of the State Teams to contest the postal events in trap and skeet, with the double trap team selected on Sunday.

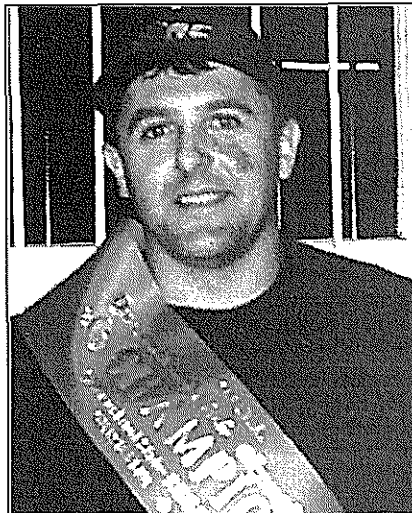

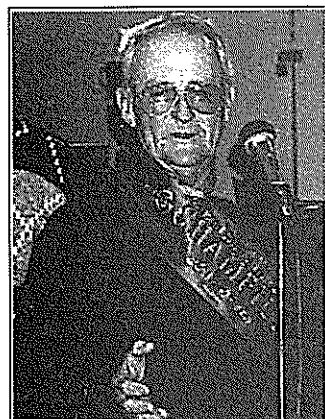

Adrian is exactly right in his assertion that our Skeet Rules should never have been allowed to drift away from the NSSA World Standard. The ACTA Rules Committee needs to take careful steps to realign them as closely as practicable, and do so as soon as possible. However a couple of issues need to be addressed immediately. Our target distance needs to be extended to read "55 to 57 metres" and the shooting sequences on stations 7 and 8 need to be changed back to the original format.

I also endorse Adrian's suggestion that the best way for skeet shooters to get some direct input into the running of their sport, and the making of their rules, would be to elect a Skeet representative to the ACTA each year at the Skeet Nationals. As this is the only time during the year that all the skeet shooters are together. I also think that the National President should convene a meeting of interested people to discuss Skeet issues and get some feed back from the shooters. Such a meeting would give skeet shooters a similar opportunity as the Trap shooters get at the AGM, and the meeting would be the perfect place to elect our spokesperson for the following year.

Just a note in support of the sentiment in Cuzzo's recent ramblings with reference to adopting NSSA Skeet Rules as standard for Australian Skeet.

You may recall in my article, which was kindly published earlier this year, about my experiences in shooting skeet in the United States late last year. It really did take a while for me to adjust to the faster speed of those targets and the different format in stations seven and eight. Of these the extra speed was the most noticeable, although I must admit I did foolishly lose a target on station seven at the World Shoot in San Antonio, because I was prepared for the low house when the high house appeared first. With the .410 bore, the pattern was too small to cater for my surprise.

I have wracked my brains trying to understand why Australian Skeet should be different from NSSA Skeet and I can't think of any good reason, especially since the game was invented in USA. I think having an International standard format for our great game will be of advantage to us skeet shooters in both International Competition and encouraging reciprocity in that it may attract overseas shooters.

We would all benefit greatly if one year some of the Champions of NSSA could visit our Nationals, for example.

I hope to see you at the State Skeet in mid-August.

Dear Handicap Rule (DTL),

I have been shooting clay targets since 1975, and how many times has this rule been changed? Whatever happened to the Handicap run on a shoot day, that all of the shooters who shot the championship also shot the Handicap. ALL Clubs are feeling the pinch these days, but if the Handicap Rule of doing a metre was the same as it was when I first started shooting i.e.: 1 metre \$100.00 - \$199.00, 2 metres \$200 and above that, and you stayed on that metre mark for a full 12 months unless you done another metre. Clubs could run a club Handicap and keep the nominations down and make a profit on the day's shooting. These days if a club run a Handicap how many shoot it, fair dinkum! If you are in the first squad and you shoot the possible or one target down even in the shoot off you can nearly guess who will get the metre. It would be nice to go to a shoot and see all shooters in the championship to shoot the Handicap for a change at a normal club shoot.

In those days everybody wanted to get to 25 metres or 27 yards. When anybody went to the Nationals those people who were not back there on 22m - 25m used to gather in mobs to watch the back markers even at club level and how many shooters are back there now.

It would be interesting to know how many have been there and how many of them are standing on 20m - 21m. Then there is the rule about regrading and rehandicapping shooters that are under graded and under handicapped.

Well that's another story!!!!

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS SEPTEMBER 1999

Big Rodney Williams would have to be one of the nicest blokes you will ever run into in Clay Target shooting. Karen and I took an instant liking to him the first day we met him, and the first time we had a vacancy in our squad, we invited him to join us, and he has shot with us ever since. After a couple of shoots, I was so impressed with his decorum and mental control that I invited him to shoot first in front of me, and he has been our fearless leader ever since.

I have had the pleasure of shooting on some great squads over the years. Including three years shooting behind Wayne Mayes and Todd Bender, and several years shooting on the Connecticut State squad with Howie Altman and John Jensen (with whom I still hold several Two-man and Five-man Team World Records). But I reckon the best squad I've ever shot on was the one we put together for most of the big events in 1998, which was Rod, myself, the great "Jeraldo" and Karen, and the late JW shooting as anchor man. We not only won our fair share at the shoots, but had a great time as well, both on and off the field. And having a great time is what shooting should be all about anyway.

I have a lot of great friends in shooting and many of them I like and admire intensely, but there are not all that many that I really like to shoot with. Some of the reasons I like to shoot with "Big Rod" are the fact that he is always ready and waiting at the field when it is our turn to shoot, and he is always the first to offer to referee or score when we are done. He never complains about anything, never argues with the referee, and always encourages the other squad members, regardless of how well he is shooting himself. And that last point is easier said than done. It's not all that hard to be bright and positive when things are going your way.

With regard to his own shooting, he pays attention and tries hard at all times, continuing to give 100% even when things are not going according to plan. On the days when he shoots well, he is gracious and humble, and on the other days, he never complains or makes excuses or loses his cool. If he has a dummy, I've never seen it. If you arrived at our field halfway through our last round, you couldn't tell by watching him, whether he was in the process of breaking 100 or an 87. A lot of shooters could improve both their performance and their demeanour by following his good example.

Off the field he is just as enjoyable as he is on it. He is a straight up and down guy who calls a spade a spade, treats everyone equally, and won't take garbage from anybody. He is also a great travelling companion, an astute card player and a gracious host. What more could you ask for? But where is all this leading? Well, about six months ago, Rodney had a great idea. He decided that as he would be turning forty in July, he would not only host the mother of all birthday parties, but also celebrate by putting on a Two-day Open Skeet shoot for all and sundry.

Both of these great events are now behind us, and I would have to say that the birthday party was one of the best that I have ever attended, which was somewhat of a surprise, as Rod had been deviously understating the case prior to the occasion. I had originally thought that it would probably be a pretty big show, but when I questioned Rod about it, and in particular where he intended to hold it, he simply said "Oh I think I'll just have it at home and invite a few friends over".

When we arrived at Rod's on the Saturday evening, we found that his entire large backyard was covered with an enormous marquis, complete with carpeted floor, heating, live band, bar attendant and full catering facilities. The few friends looked to be well in excess of a hundred people, who ate, drank, laughed and danced until the wee hours of the morning. I have no idea what time it wound up. The official speeches were not held until after midnight and the show was still in full swing when I dragged Karen and Gerry out protesting, at about 1.30am. I would have liked to have stayed longer, but I had a shoot to run the next day and unfortunately priorities must prevail.

The Skeet Shoot was also a great success and that is the main reason I got onto this topic, this month. Rod is a member of Melbourne Gun Club, and he had originally planned to hold the Shoot there. Unfortunately politics and personality clashes seem to be an inherent problem in many sporting organizations, and ours is no exception, which is a great pity. The end result was that Rod eventually invited Frankston to host the shoot, and it turned out to be an excellent choice of venues, as the club went "all out" to make it a success.

Right from the outset, Rod insisted that I be totally responsible for arranging and running the shoot for him. He simply wanted to put up the sponsorship money and leave the rest to me, so that he could concentrate his efforts on arranging the party. In hindsight this was probably a pretty wise move, particularly in view of the fact that he ended up so busy on the Saturday, sorting out all the last minute arrangements, that he had to phone an apology through and miss the shooting on that day. Fortunately

he was able to attend on Sunday, albeit a little the worse for wear. He claimed that he got to bed for a while, but I have my doubts.

We set the program with two 50-target events on the Saturday and a single 100-target event on the Sunday. We did this because it didn't matter if we shot until dark on the Saturday, because no-one was going anywhere anyway, except over to Rods for the "big do". However on the Sunday we wanted to finish the shoot as early as possible, so that we could finalize the presentations and get all the travelling shooters away as early as possible.

Sunday night saw three separate winners for the three events, which is the way it ought to be, and a lot of good shooting by all those present. Considering the fact that there were 50 doubles included in the program, I thought Leigh Roberts' effort of breaking all 150 singles and 48 in the doubles to take the AA high Gun with 198 was a great effort. However, when Malcolm Briggs broke the last 50 on Sunday afternoon to win the Overall High Gun with 200x200, I was truly impressed and felt compelled to literally take my hat off to him at the presentations.

I believe that performances of this standard are evidence of the fact that Clay Target Shooting has come of age in this country during the 90s. Australian Clay Target Shooters are now admired and respected the world over. I also believe that this is a reflection of the wisdom and foresight of the ACTA, in making the decision to meet the cost of sending shooters overseas in all three disciplines, over the last twenty years or so. My own achievements at the World Skeet Championships would definitely not have been possible, without the momentum provided to me by the ACTA, when they sent teams there in 1984 and 1986.

I know that Russell and Michael would both agree that their past and current performances would not have been possible without the ongoing financial and moral support of the ACTA and the ASA. And I'm sure that Billy Iles would not have been able to enjoy all of his considerable international successes without this level of commitment and support by our governing body. Just for the record, I consider Bill's runner-up spot in the Main Singles Event at the 1994 Grand American Trapshoot, to be our most outstanding clay target shooting achievement of the decade. You really would have to be there to appreciate the magnitude of that effort.

Getting back to Rod's shoot, one of the main reasons it was such a success was MONEY. Rod put in \$1000 to kick it off, and then Frankston guaranteed to match that amount regardless of how many entries were received. Thus we were able to advertise a guaranteed minimum payout of \$2000. Then by structuring the nominations just a little higher than what is normally par for the course, we were able to bring the break even point for the gun club down to a realizable level, with the promise of extra returns for every entry over budget. Nominations did exceed budget, and I think we eventually gave out almost 23 cases of shells during the weekend. If we ever get the chance to put on another shoot like this, and could entice State Shoot size entries, the payouts could be

enormous. People often ask me how it is that Skeet shoots in the United States can pay out enough money that some shooters are able to become professional and earn enough prizemoney to make a living at it during the "summer months". (The shooting season actually runs for six months and spans from mid spring to mid autumn). The answer is rather diverse and actually encompasses a number of cumulative areas that add up to a financially viable package. If I get enough interested inquiry, then one month soon I will explain and elaborate on that issue at length. Although I don't believe that there are enough shooters and/or sponsors in this country to make professional shooting a reality, I do believe that there are a number of things we could learn from the American system to make our shooting more attractive.

Back in June I wrote an article on the "phono-pull" system that Canterbury Voice Release International Ltd in New Zealand has developed. As I never compete overseas these days, nor in fact travel anywhere near as extensively within Australia as I once did, I had not heard anything of the CVRIL system prior to arriving at the Trap Nationals at Roma in March. Thus they came as a complete surprise to me, albeit a very pleasant one. At that time I suggested that I would be very surprised if our Trap Nationals were ever held again without them, and that within five years, probably very little shooting would be done anywhere in the country without them. CVRIL's current sales figures would seem to indicate that my five-year suggestion might have been somewhat conservative and that a couple of years may have been more realistic.

At that time I also mentioned that the owners of CVRIL had invited me to assist them in the research and development of a Skeet version of their innovative system. Since that time I have had a number of discussions with them about the technical and practical requirements that such an extension of their product would require. Well, about six weeks ago, they shipped me a manually operated prototype of the Skeet model, which, as I mentioned last month, they had built so that I could begin to sort out a viable physical adaptation of the system. Meanwhile they continued working on the inclusion of a micro-processor into their equipment so that the sequencing complexities of Skeet could be accommodated.

My "old mate" Lennie Glover has been helping me with this project, and during the week prior to Rod's shoot we modified the microphone stand for the fourth time and took the system down for its first Major Competition tryout. The electronics worked faultlessly, and the system overall was very well received by all of the attending shooters, who got a chance to shoot over it. (Jim Parsell shot his first ever 50 straight over it and wanted to take it home with him). However we did receive a good deal of fresh constructive input from numerous people, and so we went home and gave it its fifth rebuild, incorporating much of this new feedback. Subsequent testing resulted in rebuild number six, and I now believe that we are getting very close to the optimum arrangement.

The system revolves around two microphones (one for input and one for background monitoring) on a portable stand that you move around the field with you, from station to station. Most people, who have seen the Trap version, upon seeing the Skeet model for the first time, ask why it isn't simply set up with a microphone on a stand at each station, like the Trap system. Such a version would physically work, but would require seven more microphones and another 350 feet of cabling in addition to the existing equipment. The time required to set all that up, and then later pack it all away, to say nothing of the required storage space, would make such a system extremely unwieldy, particularly if only a few people wanted to shoot a couple of practice rounds.

This would probably be enough to prohibit such a version, even before you consider that it would probably double the cost, which at the moment is trying to be held to somewhere near the Trap model. This should be possible even with the inclusion of twin relays, a more sophisticated control box, and a much more complicated and expensive hand module, incorporating a micro-processor. I am still hopeful that half a dozen auto-sequencing units will be ready in time for the NSW Skeet Carnival, and that by the time you read this, they should have enhanced everyone's enjoyment of that event. Watch this space for further updates.

Olympic Games broadcast

Olympic Games host broadcasters, Channel 7, do not intend to be caught without an expert shooting commentator/reporter at Sydney 2000 as they were in Atlanta in 1996.

The unexpected (by Channel 7) clay target Gold Medals won by Michael Diamond and Russell Mark embarrassed the broadcasters and led to a scramble for film and a report for an Olympics hungry Australian public.

In order to be on top of any Australian shooting medals in Sydney next year, Channel 7 have appointed their Brisbane news editor and regular clay target shooter, Alex Smith, to cover all Olympic shooting, including trap, rifles and pistols.

A member of the Warwick Clay Target Club, Alex Smith is a well-known and highly regarded competitor who is also known for his gunsmithing and renovation work, mostly on shotguns.

Although he describes himself as "just a shooter" who is likely to be seen at most competitions in Southern Queensland, Alex has won club Championships and shot a 150 break in a shoot-off for the State Double Barrel title some years ago.

In reporting at Sydney 2000, Alex said his aim is to communicate the many positive aspects of competitive shooting to the wider public.

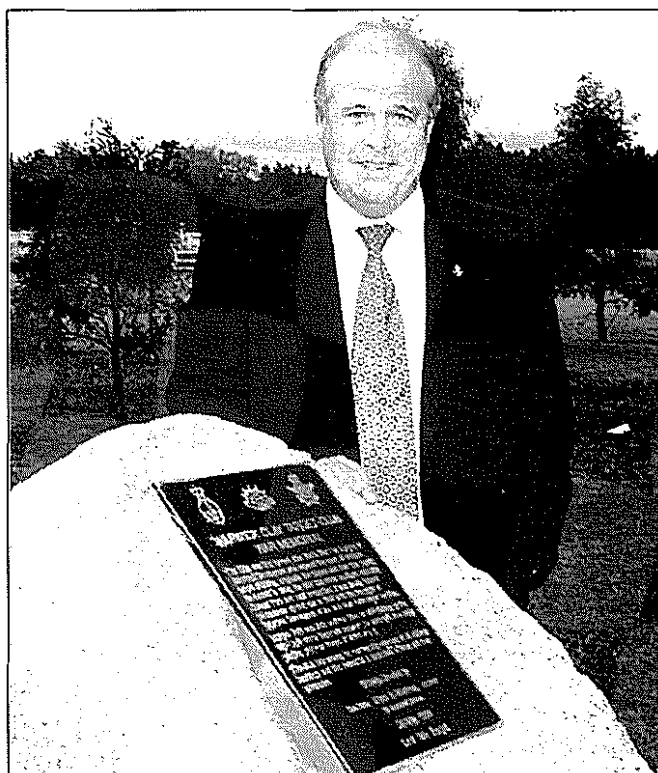
"I also want to convey the enormous cultural tradition Australia has in the shooting sports," he said.

"Very few people realise Australia's first Olympic Gold Medal was won by trap shooter - Donald Mackintosh at Paris in 1900. He was listed for some time as an Englishman however, in 1994 the record was amended and the Mackintosh Trophy was named in his honour".

Alex credits his love of shooting partly to the influence of his grandfather, Alexander Smith, a veteran of Gallipoli and a foundation member of the Warwick Gun Club.

"My grandfather drummed that great shooting ethic of his times into me as a child - he took me to many shoots at the clay target club and was a huge influence in my life".

"I believe the foundations he gave me and my own experience in competitive shooting will allow the presentation of shooting at the Olympics to be more than professional, they will be educational too".

WHEN I MISS, IS IT SELF-DOUBT?

The scene is any competition. You are shooting well and you are clean. Whilst you are waiting to shoot you start to hear in your head instructions on what to do next, thinking about the outcome of the next shot, adding up your score, working out how many targets are left, etc. With these thoughts dominating your mind, you miss.

You regain your posture and after a few more hits you start thinking about the target you missed and it's possible, if you're not careful, you'll miss again.

Shooting, like all sports, involves two games, the outer game and the inner game. The outer game involves the sport itself, shooting the target. The outer game involves physical fitness, well fitting gun, reliable ammunition, correct stance and gun hold and all variables that are outside the shooter. The inner game involves mental fitness and relies on the individual to have trust in their own ability to do what is required. Inner game strategies involve concentration, mental rehearsal, awareness, attention, relaxation, goal setting, etc.

The problem with either trap or skeet shooting is that an error will usually cost you the game or the match. There are rarely, second chances. In tennis, you can be down forty - love and still win the game; one or two poor strokes in golf don't put you out. However, depending on the day, 24/25 or 49/50 may not be good enough. If a person can do something as difficult and as complicated as shoot a small moving object 49 times out of 50, then the problem is not with their technique, equipment or ability. The problem most likely involves the inner game. We miss because we doubt our own ability.

To understand self doubt it is necessary to look at how the brain functions. Basically and for the purpose of this discussion, the brain is divided into two halves; the right side and the left side. These different sides play an important role in our ability to shoot, play golf, tennis etc. The right side of the brain is responsible for muscle movement and co-ordination. In shooting this involves seeing the target, identifying it, tracking it, moving the body, holding the gun correctly, pulling the trigger and following through. The right side of the brain does and can continue to do these functions effortlessly and continuously. All that is required is that the muscles need to be relaxed.

The left side of the brain however, houses our language, analytical and judgmental skills. The left side also believes that our right side is incapable of doing what is necessary and therefore provides it with a barrage of instructions and "coaching tips" so that it can do it properly.

In his book, *The Inner Game of Golf*, Tim Gallwey identifies these two sides of the brain as ego states and calls them Self-1 for the left side and Self-2 for the right side of the brain. Gallwey found that when he was involved in a competition he would have to continually listen to a range of self-instructional thoughts. On close analysis of these thoughts he determined that it was self 1 doing the talking, it thought he knew how to play and was supervising self 2, the one who had to hit the ball or hit the clay target in respect to shooting. Self 1 did not only give self 2 instructions but criticised self 2 for past errors, warned self 2 about probable future ones and harangued him whenever he makes a mistake. These instructions and judgements increase tension, which in turn tightens the muscles; the result is that we are no longer fluid or relaxed and therefore we cannot perform to our potential.

To summarise self-1 - the talking, thought producing self - is a lousy boss when it comes to control the body's muscle system. When self 2 - the body itself - is allowed control, the quality of performance, the level of enjoyment and the rate of learning are all improved. Self-2 is the total human organism, the natural entity. Self-1 does not have a physical existence; it is a phenomenon of mental self-interference that can and does interfere with our ability to perform.

For the brain to function to its potential the interference needs to be minimised. This means that the basic premise of the inner game is - Performance = Self-2 (potential) minus Self -1 (interference). The object of the inner game is to limit the interference of Self-1 and trust self-2 can perform and achieve.

Inner game techniques involve applying mental training skills that enable the shooter to maintain concentration, optimise performance and achieve results. These skills are not just the province of elite sportspeople and can be learnt and increase the performance, enjoyment and fun involved in competition for all.

Every time we compete, we make judgements as to our performance. When we are winning, we enjoy the handshakes, pats on the back and as a result we see ourselves and what we did as good. However when we lose a competition or miss a shot it is just as easy for us to judge

what we did as bad. This value judgement of our performance has wide reaching implications. For example, for a right handed shooter, we miss a hard right hand swinger from lane five it is possible that self-1 will say something like...."You missed again, you always miss those right hand swingers, and you're really no good at these. If left unchecked and you miss that shot again, self-1 will increase the criticisms but will begin to make it personal; for example...."you missed it again. Your no good at all". We now see ourselves as the problem not just the fact that for some reason or other we missed that target.

The first step to inner game success is to let go of the judgements. It is important that we see our performance as simply that: how we performed today. We must let go of the need to base our self-image/esteem on what we have achieved or what we think others will think about us as a result of our performance.

The second step is to trust self-2's ability and to stop trying. When we give ourselves the instruction to try harder, what we are really doing is tensing and tightening our muscles. In short trying fails. Once we can let go of our judgements and trust in Self-2 we can go on to quietening the mind.

In subsequent articles, I will look at concentration, mental rehearsal, visualisation, etc as techniques that can be used to quieten the mind and limit the interference of Self-1.

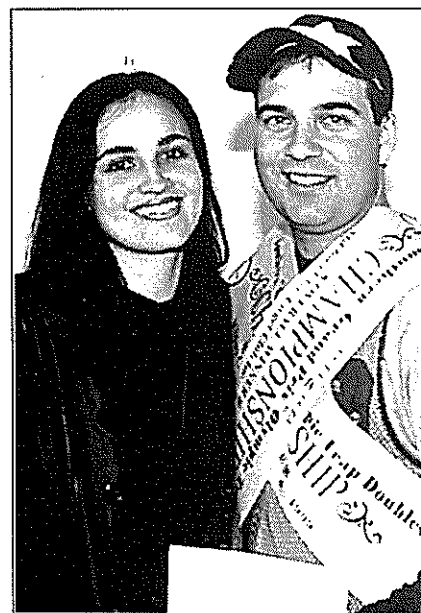

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts and maximum fine of \$5,500.

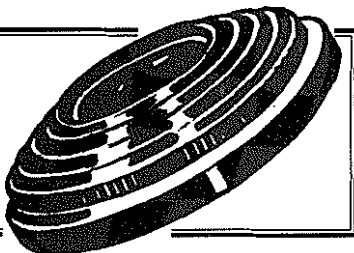
