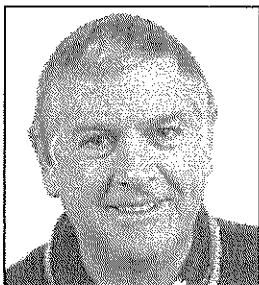

At the World DTL Championships recently held in Wales, our teams turned in outstanding performances. Our Open, Junior and Veteran teams each won gold and our Ladies took out the silver medal. The nominated 3 person team event was also won by our shooters. Arthur Turner was 4th overall (1st AA Grade) and Terry Walls came in second in the Junior section, a great effort. A GREAT GESTURE

The ACTA has received a very generous donation of 11 Canterbury Voice Releases from Mr Steve Laffy of Queensland. The success of the Voice Release at the Roma Nationals with our shooters was such, that almost without exception I was approached and asked to make them a permanent part of all future major events. This very kind donation has enabled this to happen. A very big thank you is extended to Steve for his generosity from all members of the ACTA.

THE GRAND AMERICAN

Approximately 40 of our members attended the 100th Grand American held in Vandalia, Ohio in August. 1155 squads (Yes—I did say squads) shot the main event, The Grand American Handicap. Organisers certainly had their work cut out with so many competitors but despite some events being reduced in the number of targets, all who attended enjoyed themselves. Again our shooters more than held their own. Two achievements of note were Bill Iles' 2nd placing in a preliminary handicap and David Fox shooting 99/100 to win A grade in the Double Rise. Other shooters to do well were Arthur Turner, Tom Turner and John Crompton. Those attending for the first time could not believe the enormity of it all.

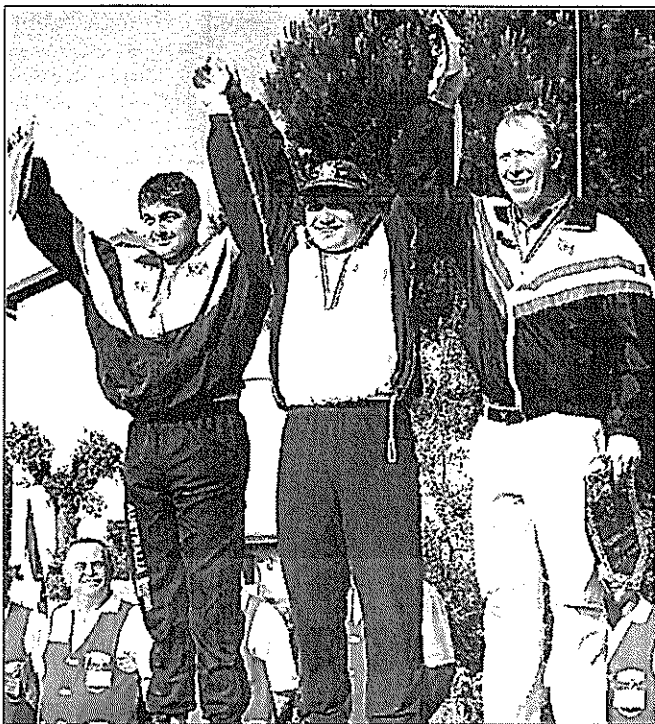
Report of LONARDO WORLD CUP — ITALY

The team departed in two groups from Australia, the first group on the 22nd June and the second on the 24th June and all returned home in three groups, that on the 6th July, the 10th July and the last on the 14th July - an extremely long trip especially for the Juniors, which for most of them was their first long trip away on their own, and given the average age of them was 16 years, it was in fact a wonderful experience for them.

The results that were achieved on this trip, which I believe were magnificent, especially Michael's World Championship Gold Medal in Trap and the Trap Team also winning the World Championship Gold for the first time and all of the other performances that you will see throughout this report.

This report may seem 'long' to some people but I believe when Teams represent their country in an Olympic sport, the Team Manager and Officials are always learning something new that should be passed on to you, the Australian shooters, and Australian shooting has got a lot of catching up to do, to catch up with the exciting world of shooting especially now that the A.C.T.A. is investing in our own National ground.

Months of planning went into this trip because it had such a large contingent of shooters and with the Juniors self funding themselves, tenders were sent out to 6 different travel companies for quotes on airfares. KLM - Air Italia, through AIS Travel, came in \$600.00 less per ticket and were the only airline to give us excess baggage allowance, which started off at 15 kilograms, then went back to 10 kilograms as the plane filled up. Any one who has ever travelled would know that to pack enough clothes etc. to last for three to three and a half weeks plus guns, to stick within the baggage limit is high on, an impossible task. As there was plenty of time given to the travel agent to have everything finalised early we hoped to have our tickets issued at least two to three weeks before we were to leave and after hundreds of phone calls to and from Canberra, I thought this trip would be well organised.....WRONG!

shown were old black and white 1940's vintage (most with sub titles) but for most of the flight, we were entertained by some of the 50 Australian grid iron footballers, heading to Italy for a major competition.

We arrived at the Milan Airport early Wednesday morning with a reasonably smooth passage through Customs with the guns and ammunition, then we had a three hour wait while our bus was filled with other shooters arriving from around the world for the Lonato Cup and then there was a 2 hour drive to Desenzano, most of us at this stage were very, very tired.

Desenzano is situated on a large lake, with Austria being visible across the lake - this was a very tourist orientated town with very old buildings and narrow streets, many small hotels like ours, the 'Hotel Vittorio' and hundreds of restaurants with mainly outdoor eating. Our hotel as I have said was old, a lot of the rooms being very small and my bathroom was perhaps the smallest that I have ever seen. I realize that I am a 'big man', but when you have to back into a shower alcove to wash one side and then go out, turn around and then repeat the procedure to wash the other side, I thought that was 'a bit much'. The other thing we noticed was that in Europe, the guest does not have control of the air conditioning, in fact each time we wanted it on, a phone call had to be made to reception to ask that it be switched on.

However, after a few hours sleep and a bit of a look around, we were all eager to head out to the shooting range which was approximately 10 kilometres from the hotel. The weather was fine and quite warm when the sun was out and as there were no buses running to the range prior to the official practice I inquired on the cost of hiring a mini-bus - the cost \$250 Aus per day plus petrol, so it worked out cheaper for us to hire 4 taxis to take us there and back.

Our first sighting of the Gun Club left us very impressed and envious of such lovely green lush looking grounds with very large offices, a Club House and restaurant. It was equipped with 9 layouts, 3 of which were dedicated to Skeet only, 3 to Trap only whilst the remaining 3 were Trap superimposed with Skeet.

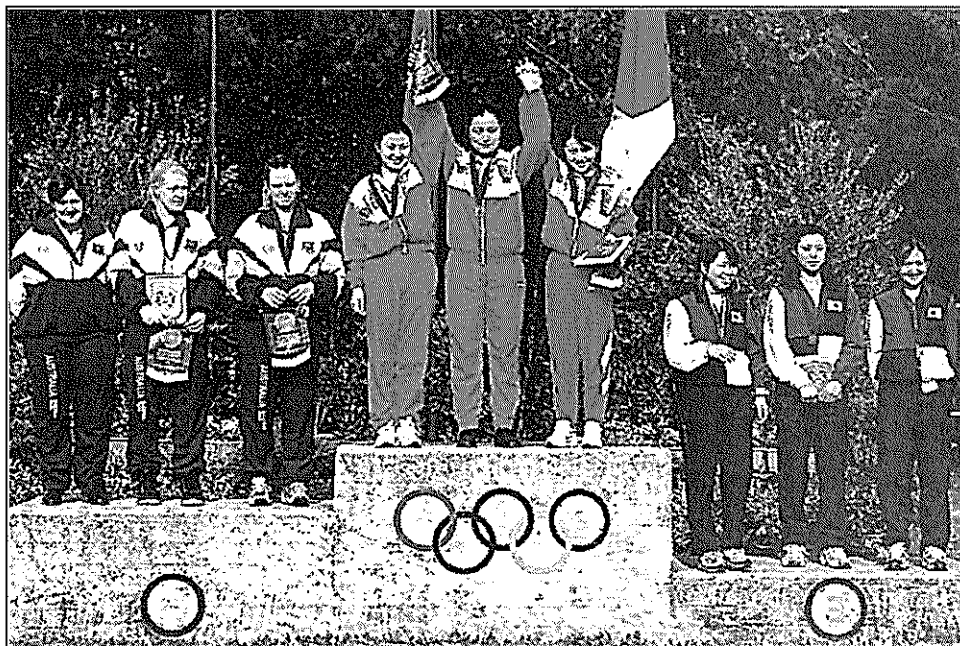
The foreground of all of the ranges had mesh shade cloth erected to catch as much shot and broken clays as was possible. The grounds were all irrigated with lawns, trees and shrubs

Most of us didn't get our tickets until the day before we left and then the tickets were all marked with 20 kilogram baggage limit as per normal tickets. Many phone calls later, direct to KLM Sydney, regarding the seating arrangements etc, found out that the team had not been made as a 'group booking' but as individuals and were seated from one end of the 747 to the other. This was somewhat rectified, as best as it could be, given that the seating allocations were done in a plane that was already crammed full of passengers.

The problems started at both the Adelaide and Melbourne airports with 'excess baggage'. More phone calls and much debating, with everyone eventually arriving in Sydney for the big take off. The flight was on a KLM 747, run by Air Italia. We were accompanied by Vince Mollica on this trip as he was invited to act as a Jury member at the Lonato World Cup.

We left Sydney on the afternoon of Tuesday 22nd June and the first leg of our journey was an 8 hour flight to Singapore where we had a one hour stopover and then a 12 hour flight to Milan.

Many of the younger shooters were far too excited to have much sleep and most of the movies

everywhere. We set up camp at some tables and chairs, under the trees, by the restaurant. It was lovely and cool under the trees and the surroundings can only be described as beautiful. The Club house housed a pro-shop with just about everything in it you could possibly want - guns, accessories, clothes and shoes. There were very clean, modern toilets and electronic scoreboards in the Club House where you could just sit and watch the progressive high guns and the scores of the squads out shooting - this was a very popular place. The canteen had an outdoors dining area with the upstairs section being a proper restaurant with reasonably expensive, but good food.

The traps used were made by Serena, who also made the clay targets. The colour of the targets was quite good but I didn't think they really broke as easily as others that I have seen. There were no obvious breakdowns for the whole of the World Cup but on having a look at some traps on display, I think we would have trouble in Australia with them, for I believe motors are far too small and with the temperature there being around 23 degrees Celsius (and how hot the traps were running), I think that with our extreme heat in the bunkers, they would certainly overheat - but I couldn't fault their performance at this competition.

Out side there were numerous trade exhibitors - Beretta and Perazzi had large tent displaying

all of their wares plus their own mobile workshops and these were kept extremely busy.

Each of the layouts looked as if they had separate sponsors such as Beretta, Fiocchi, Gamba etc. These are highly decorated with the sponsors signs which is something I believe our National Ground should seriously be looking into (and the same with planting and irrigating Lucerne or some such grass), this would really get Wagga Wagga going. I am sure such signs would be cheap advertising for the sponsors.

All shooters started their training and final preparations for the World Cup and we left the grounds tired but confident for the coming competition.

While out on his daily run one morning, Russell slipped over and damaged his knee and thinking that it wasn't too bad, he continued on but his knee gave him a lot of trouble over the coming days with Darien working on it, trying to right the damage. A lesson for other shooters, have your injuries checked before you continue to train for fear of doing excessive damage.

We also had quite a few people around the shooting grounds with sore throats and head colds and it wasn't long before a few of our group came down with the same symptoms. Angelique in fact suffering quite badly and Suzie Trindall feeling decidedly off colour and it was the first time in many years that I too succumbed to the dreaded bug, but thanks to the Italian Team doctor and a few anti-biotics most of us were soon on the mend.

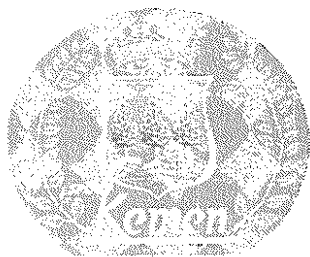
Our second group of shooters came in on the 25th June, via the same route that we had taken and they also had the 'bus wait' at the Milan airport.

The transport by bus each day from the hotels to the shooting grounds was in modern coaches and proved a very prompt service going out to the grounds, but sometimes we had to wait around to get back in the afternoons and I believe a mini bus for the Coaches, the early starters and the late finishers is essential for future trips.

Official Double Trap practice day and the Opening Ceremony. Every one was shooting reasonably well and finished their practice early. The Opening Ceremony was a fairly informal affair with the Teams standing behind their respective country's flags and following a few speeches, a buffet with food and drinks was laid out.

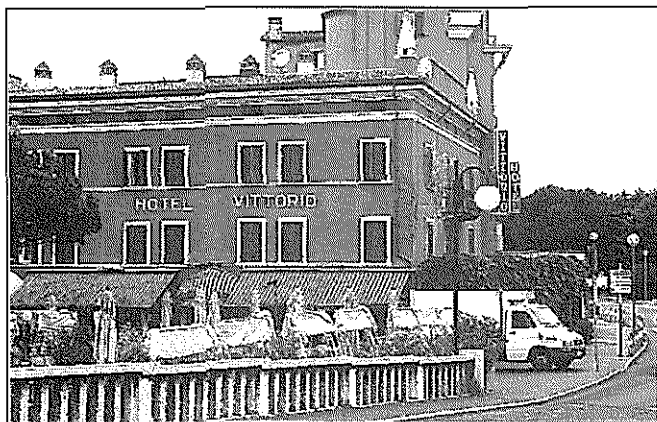

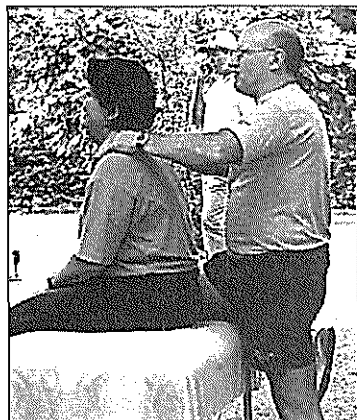

as were the Juniors, I think the enormity of the occasion getting to the nerves of the Juniors who weren't shooting any where near their capabilities. Both Luca and Greg worked tirelessly with the shooters trying to get them settled but at the end of the day we had no one in the Men's Final and the Juniors well down the field, but we did have Ann Maree who was leading the Women's event with two targets up her sleeve. She had shot a 108/120 to lead going into the Final and I have never seen her so nervous but switched on as she went out to shoot in the Final.

Right from the first pair however, disaster struck and she just couldn't get her rhythm and she lost the first 2 complete pairs and then she shot a 1-0, 1-0 and gradually settled and started to hit them like I know that she can, but after her bad start and then ending with a 27/40, she was left in 6th place. The poor girl was devastated but came off the tracks learning a huge lesson and with a lot of determination to overcome her fears in the future. The winning score was 141/160, Ann Maree settling for her score of 135/160, Suzie T came in 12th place shooting her personal best score of 98/120 and Deserie was placed further down the field. Michael, Russell and Adam all ended up in =12th place after shooting 132/150. Rocky Manno managed a 10th place in the Juniors and David Bowen was placed 13th. Australia had both a Men's and Women's Double Trap Team entered and we managed a Bronze Medal for the Men's Team and a Silver Medal for the Women's Team. Competitors for the Double Trap event were 101 for the Men, 42 Women and 15 Juniors with 69 countries being represented.

The next day was Official Trap and Skeet practice - Angelique still feeling poorly as was Lisa Smith. Lisa having come over to Italy with swollen glands, headaches and full of anti-biotics.

Paying of all the bills and confirmation of everyone's gun permits to get them out of the country was done with the help of excellent office staff - both of the girls were friends of Luca's, one in fact having been his secretary.

Luca and Greg continued running from layout to layout trying to help everyone and Darien worked on the shooters physical problems at his makeshift clinic under the shade of the trees.

At the completion of the first day of the Trap and Skeet competition we had Michael finishing equal 1st on 73/75, Russell on 70/75 and Glen way down the field. Deserie had led the Women's Trap, but shot a disappointing 17 in the last round to give her =9th placing on 64/75. Lisa was placed 24th on 59/75 -



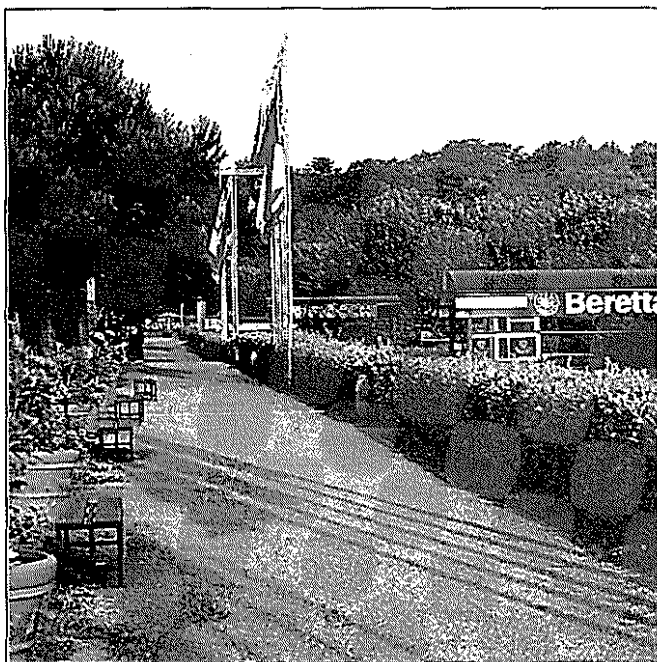
A tired shooter leaving Lonato.

not such a good day for the women Trap shooters. The winning score in the Women's Trap was 90/100 and a 66/75 and better would have made the Final. Angelique's sickness and nerves got to her and she had a disaster in round 2 but rallied with her last round and finished on a 52/75 in the Junior Women's event. The Junior Men also had a 'off' day, not shooting well and all were very disappointed.

More promise was shown over at the Skeet with Clive looking good with a score of 72/75 and both David and George sitting on a 70/75. Paul and Casey on a 63/75, but Robbie had only a 55/75 at the end of the first day. Natalia shot really well in the Women's Skeet ending with a 66/75 giving her =16th place while both Natasha and Janine shot the scores of 61/75 giving them =26th position.

The final day for Trap and Skeet saw Michael going into the Final in 1st place and Russell having to shoot off to get into the Final and this he won, giving him 6th position in the Final. A nail biting affair followed. Russell dropped 4 targets and ended up in 6th place. Michael dropped a target and then had to shoot off 'single barrel' for first place with an Italian shooter. Michael ended up in the second place to take the Silver Medal, Russell came 6th and Glen Kable took 45th place. Australia was lucky enough however, to take the Silver Medal for the Men's Trap Team. Junior Men's Trap was also completed with Rocky finishing in 14th place, David B on 17th position and Joseph came 24th. Competitors in the Trap events saw 138 in the Men's division with another 33 shooting for MQS's, 35 Women and 32 Junior Men.

Skeet finished as follows. Clive at the Skeet range was going into the Final on 3rd place and we all thought this was going to be Clive's day as he had been shooting brilliantly but as I have said on many an occasion, I think sometimes 'luck' plays a part in who wins. Clive dropped 2 targets in the Final and then had to shoot off for the third place with an Italian shooter. Shooting pairs on the second run round, the Italian who was shooting first, dropped the low house on Station 5 and it was all up to Clive to hit both targets - You guessed it - Clive missed the same target and this really put him off as after the next pair he was relegated to 4th position. Clive was very disappointed. David C finished in =24th place with the still very respectable score of 118/125 and although only one target behind on 117/125, George came in at =35th placing. The Australian Men's Skeet Team took out the Silver Medal in this event. The Junior Men finished up with Paul Rahman shooting a 114/125 to come in 6th place (well done Paul),

Casey in 15th place on a 107/125 and Robbie Marino finished in 21st place with a score of 96/125. The number of competitors for the skeet was Men's 148, Women's 31 and 22 Junior Men.

Presentations were then made for the Trap and Skeet and following this a short Closing Ceremony with another banquet put on by the Organizing Committee. After just a small bite to eat and a couple of drinks, the Australian contingent headed back to the hotel to go out for dinner and then following the packing of bags, a few hours sleep, for we were to be up at 3 am to catch a bus for the 2 hour drive back to Milan - we were on our way to Finland and the World Championships.

With so many restaurants around our Hotel we could almost try something new every night but we soon learned that the cost of food and drinks was probably double to what we would normally pay in Australia. All of the meat and fish dishes were extremely expensive and the quality and quantity, I believe, was way behind that found in Australia. The part that never ceased to amaze me was that if you ordered a meal, as an example I will use Veal Scaloppini or something similar, in most places that is exactly what would be served up to you on your plate. Fair enough, I hear you say, but if you wanted chips, they were an 'extra' and cost around \$4.00 Aus, salad another 'extra', as was bread, and each 'extra' cost you money. The antipasto bars were really great with all the different types of meats but again they were very expensive. After a while I settled for antipasto and melon entree's, followed by pizza and this would end up costing me around \$35.00 Aus. This included the 'fee for sitting down' at a table. We certainly don't know how well off we are here in Australia with the variety, quality and quantity of our meals and for the prices that we pay.

1st July

Up at 3 am for a 4.15 am departure. A couple of the juniors slept in till 4 am and had to be shaken out of a deep sleep. The 2 hour drive to the Malpensa airport, Milan, saw most people having an extra hour or so of sleep.

We arrived at the airport and then had a 2 hour wait for the KLM - Air Italia Check-In Counter staff to come on duty only to find that almost 5 hours of time that I had spent on the telephone, confirming bookings, arranging group seating etc. plus about 6 faxes that I had sent though had been a complete waste of time and money. We found that our group booking was given to a Japanese tourist group. Not impressed!

The next 'drama' started with our excess baggage and cartridges. Depending on which line-up you were in determined whether or not you got through. We were all told to line up at Business Class, but once the business men started coming in we were told to get back in line at 'any' of the check in counters. The procedure took 2 hours. At the end of this time we still had 5 cases x 5 each packets of cartridges left that the airline would just not put on the plane. No matter how much paperwork I showed them and how much we explained that it was legal to carry them, they just refused on the grounds that they were not informed by the travel agent of ammunition being carried. In the end, as the plane was due to depart within 10 minutes, we had to give in and we said that we would just leave the ammunition behind. This then created another problem and the Police were called in - the ammunition and the owners of same having to go downstairs with the Police to sign all of the appropriate documents. Tempers were rather frayed by this time and one of the plain clothed Policemen apparently was coming close to locking one of our shooters up.

We got to the departure gate at the very last minute and were ready to board the plane when we found out that our plane had been delayed by three quarters of an hour 'due to air traffic'. At least this gave KLM the chance to get the rest of our baggage aboard the flight.

We set off for Amsterdam, a two and a half hour flight. On arrival we found that we had missed our connecting flight to Helsinki by some 20 minutes and we were told at the transfer desk that there was no way that they could get 27 people to Helsinki that day, that it was not their problem and we would have to pay for our own accommodation overnight. Junior practice was due to start the next day and their attitude towards us having to pay for our own accommodation due to their inability to get us to Helsinki was just not acceptable to me.

After 2 hours of negotiating, with 3 people working on it, we finally solved the problem by our group flying to Stockholm in Sweden, Stockholm to Helsinki and then a mid-night flight from Helsinki to Tampere. The only problem with the Finn-Air flight from Helsinki to Tampere (which is only a 35 minute flight), the plane was not big enough to carry our group of 27, plus a few others, but they were willing to put us on a bigger plane if they could find a pilot and crew. This they arranged a mere 30 minutes before our plane was due to leave from Stockholm.

The next problem to arise was in finding 66 pieces of luggage and getting them onto the Stockholm plane.

At Stockholm we had to go through a procedure of identifying all of our baggage and transferring it to Scandinavian airlines to Helsinki. This was a one hour flight. At Helsinki we were again to go through all the baggage details and at this point almost everyone was positive that they would never see their bags again. However there were many relieved faces when we finally arrived at Tampere around 1 am the next morning, to see guns and bags coming out. We did end up losing Joseph's gun and suitcase, Michael's famous Perazzi bag, Ann Maree's shooting bag and Desirie's duffel bag that is stuffed with all sorts of gun covers, but within 48 hours all of these were recovered - the last being Michael's Perazzi bag and this then ended the three times daily ritual of checking the airport for lost luggage.

By the time we got to our hotel at Tampere and booked in it was already 3 am and so ended a dramatic 24 hour trip that was supposed to take 5 hours.

The hotel we were booked into was the Cumulus Hameenpuisto. The rooms were very nice and we had decent sized bathrooms and warming racks where we could dry our washing, which by this time was a great help.

Friday 2nd July.

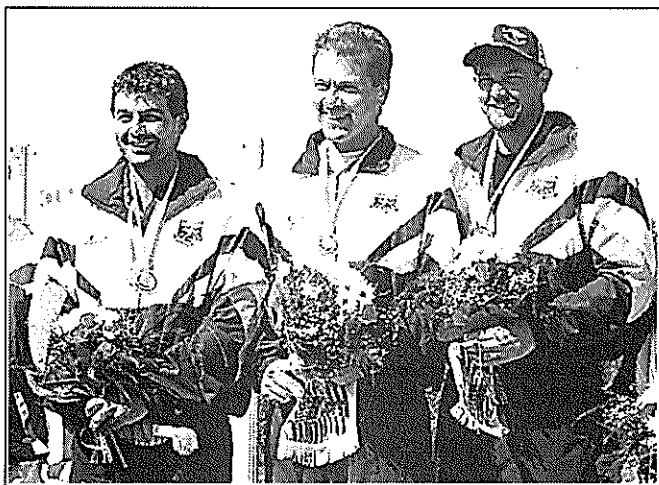
After a few hours of sleep we all headed for the shooting range where it was official practice for the Juniors and Women's Trap and Skeet.

On arrival at the ranges we found that the Skeet and Trap ranges were about half to three quarters of a kilometre apart. They were

set in thickly wooded pine forests with 4 Skeet layouts at the top end with the main office, and at the bottom end there were 3 Trap layouts.

There were large marquees erected for the shooters rest areas and one large marquee set up for a restaurant at the Trap ranges, whilst a permanent restaurant could be found at the Skeet ranges. There were numerous grandstands erected for the spectators and the centre Trap layout had temporary Skeet houses superimposed so that all the Finals could be shot on this range, where there were numerous television cameras set up at all angles. One was in a little bunker straight in front at about 100 metres, one was coming out of the back of the trap layout and one was in a cherry picker some 100 feet above the shooters. All very spectacular when we later saw it on television.

The foreground for all the ranges was the pine trees about 20 to 30 feet high, which gave reasonably good visibility of the targets. The targets in the competition came as somewhat of a surprise to everyone for when they hit they ended up as white dust. On making inquiries on the targets I found them to be 'environmentally friendly' - made from pine oil rosin and made by NASTA. The throwing machines were also made by NASTA and I believe they are one of the best machines around. The targets were always thrown at a constant speed and very, very straight. The only problem that I saw one day was when one of the officials forgot to switch the box from Double Trap to Trap leaving the 15 Traps all active. When the first shooter called for his target the 15 traps went off together - it was very spectacular but it was a human error.

Transport to and from the shooting grounds was by bus, they were quite adequate and the trip took some 30 to 40 minutes depending on how many pick-ups we had from the hotels and we were first in line on the trip. At the end of the shoot things started going a bit wrong as some of the drivers left because they hadn't been paid and some hasty negotiations I believe were made. This only affected us on one day when we had to arrange a few private lifts for ourselves going home from the grounds.

Tampere is quite a large city, set amongst some large lakes and beautiful trees, with plenty of shops and restaurants and the streets were quite wide with a lot of them being laid with cobblestones. Tampere is the home of Nokia phones and Luca found a hand held phone that was virtually a 'lap top computer'. You could even receive faxes and e-mail with it, plus hundreds of other options on it - it was quite a piece of work and I believe that 2 or 3 found their way back to Australia.

The food and drinks were once again very expensive and it was easy to keep track of the Juniors especially around meal times - they found the cheapest place to eat was McDonalds or similar fast food restaurants.

Following the completion of the official practice for the Juniors and Women's Trap and Skeet, the Opening Ceremony took place with the usual speeches and then a display by an aerobatics plane, which supposed to take about 12 minutes, according to the commentator. The display went on and on and I think the organisers would have liked to have had a rifle to get rid of him. Just as we would think he had finished and another part of the ceremony would start, out from behind the clouds he would fly, sometimes upside down, in this very noisy Pitt's special. Finally peace from this irritating noise and we witnessed a spectacular display on the beginnings of Clay Target Shooting with black powder guns firing at glass balls that had been filled with coloured feathers. To finish off, one of Finland's ex World Champions shooting flash targets out of the skeet houses. The flash targets were in different colours, i.e. Red, green, yellow etc.

The Technical Meeting had been held during this day and following the Opening Ceremony it was time to head back to the hotel and hopefully a big nights sleep.

Sleeping in Finland can be a bit of a problem - at this time of year the sun is up for almost 20 hours a day. Still shining at around 10 to 11 o'clock at night and up again at 4 o'clock in the morning, making for a very loooooooooooooooooooooonggggggg day. It was quite eerie when we were not used to it.

The weather could be quite cool if there was a slight wind but it could also be quite warm when the sun was out and the days were around 23 to 25 degrees Celsius. We only had one day with really cold winds and one day of rain, but generally speaking the weather was quite warm with the locals telling us that we had been 'very lucky with the weather', whatever that meant. We were not about to complain.

The organisation in the office at the shooting grounds was very good with all the score boards excellent and well maintained. The ACTA had given all shooters and officials, gold souvenir kangaroo pins and little snap on koalas which proved to be very popular both in Italy and in Finland, especially if you gave the ladies in the offices and canteens some early into our visit. We always ended up with some form of preferential treatment. Thanks ACTA, a little thing like this can go a long way.

Competitors for the World Championships were as follows:

Trap - Men 119, Women 44, Jnr Men 42, Jnr Women 9.

Double Trap - Men 63, Women 34, Jnr Men 25, Jnr Women 11.

Skeet - Men 114, Women 34, Jnr Men 44, Jnr Women 3.

I believe a big mistake at the Tampere shooting range is having the Trap and Skeet layouts separated at the distance they are, for there was just not the atmosphere or comradeship with all the teams from the different Countries split into two groups. Far different from the scene we had in Lonato and many people made the same comment. Another problem which may sound trivial, was the fact that all the walking surfaces around the shooting range was of crushed 2 inch metal and believe me, at the end of each day people were very weary indeed. I made inquiries into hiring a small motor bike for Luca and Greg to use because it was just too far to be walking to and from all the time. It was not so bad going down the hill, but coming up was the killer. So it was decided that Luca should stop at the Skeet layouts whilst Greg would remain at the Trap, meeting with each other only on decently timed breaks between rounds. I found out that a small motor bike was going to cost around \$150.00 Aus per day and they insisted that who ever was to ride would have to have Mick Doohan's credentials before they were prepared to let the bike go. A mini bus was also out of the question as private vehicles were not allowed past the car park.

Day One - Women and Junior's Trap and Skeet.

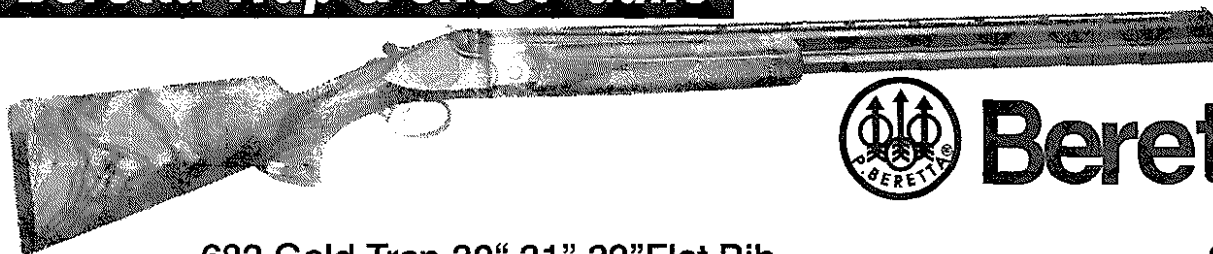
We started off well in Trap with Deserie and Lisa shooting 23's and Nessa on a 22, however at the completion of the event we had Lisa going into the Final in 2nd place after having shot a 69/75. Deserie was in =15th place on a 66/75 and Nessa in 36th place, after having shot a 59/75. Lisa, very nervous in the Final, shot a 19 and ended up in 6th position with a score of 88/100, the event being

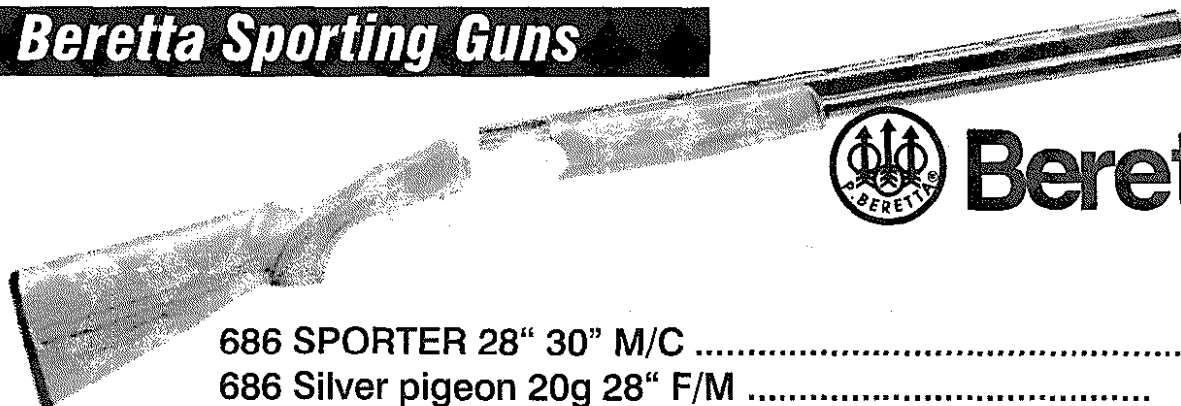

won by a shooter from the USA with 94/100.

Our Women's Skeet entrants did not have a good start to the competition. This being Natalia's first big trip away, I believe she shot reasonably well and ended up in 20th place with her score of 63/75. Natasha finished with 62/75 placing her in =22nd position and Janine shot a 60/75 giving her =28th place. The winning score, shot by a Russian, was 96/100 and you had to shoot 68 or better to make the Final.

Angelique in her Trap event again was extremely nervous but to her credit finished with a 21/25 in her last round which placed her 7th overall in the Junior Women's competition.

Day Two - Junior Men's Trap and Skeet.

Our Juniors again battling nerves, were a little disappointing. David B finished =17th having shot a 105/125. Rocky was =23rd on a 103/125 and Joseph 31st with his score of 100/125. Two of our Skeet boys however, fared a little better, with Paul Rahman shooting a 25/25 in his first round. He was a very happy boy and at the end of the 2 days of competition his final score was 113/125 placing him in 10th position. Well done Paul. Casey also shot really well and ended with a 111/125 putting him in =14th place, but Robbie could just not come to grips with his shooting and shot 86/125, putting him in 39th place. A lad from Cyprus won the event with a brilliant score of 122/125. 116/125 and better made the top 6 shooters.

The Junior Trap and Skeet shooters came away a little disappointed but I believe all learned very valuable lessons and given that most of them still have at least 5 years before they leave the Junior ranks, the lessons learned will be of great value at the World Championships in 2 years time (there being no World Championships held in the year of the Olympics), so boys you have got 2 years to iron out your problems.

Sunday evening, the 4th July, saw some of our Team leaving us, Janine, Natasha, Nessa and Casey, leaving for their flight home.

Official Double Trap practice on Monday, 5th July for all. Everyone shooting reasonably well in practice - the day was cool, with rain and the temperature was around 18 degrees Celsius.

During the morning I went to the bank to change travellers cheques to pay the hotel bill - things were very different in the banks in Finland - you have to take different numbered tickets,

(sort of like when you take a number and wait at a supermarket delicatessen), then you had to sit down and wait for your number to be called. This is fine if you can read Finnish and you take the right ticket. After about an hour I was finally served and then trying to change Deutsche mark, Italian Lira and US Dollars into Finnish Markkaa, was quite a battle, but the staff were very pleasant and helpful. After paying the hotel bill I took myself off to the shooting range where I watched the Skeet boys having unofficial practice. We later returned to the hotel feeling confident and looking towards the next 2 days with high expectations.

Day One - Double Trap.

All shooting 2 rounds today. Russell and Michael both had a disappointing day, Russell shooting a 45 and a 43, Michael a 43 and then a 44, while Adam shot a first round of 48 and we had great expectations as he had used his Trap barrels, but then he shot a disastrous 40. For the Women, Ann Maree shot rounds of 32 and 34, Deserie a 35 and then a 30 and Suzie T shooting this time in Junior Women, shot a 34 and then a 31. Rocky Manno however was literally 'on fire'. He shot a 46 and then a 44 and was running 2nd overall in the competition. David B shot a disappointing 35 and 33 and Joseph a 31 and then a 27.

Day Two - Double Trap.

The last round was to be shot and then the Finals would take place. Here we saw Russell finish with a 45, placing him =16th on a score of 133/150. Michael and Adam both finished with scores of 131/150, which placed them =22nd.

Ann Maree in the Women's event shot a 34 in her last round to finish with a score of 100/120 giving her =9th position, while Deserie's last round of 27 and shooting a 92/120 put her into =25th place. Suzie Trindall (in the Junior Women) went into the last round and was shooting well and I thought would take out the event, but she let her nerves get to her and she ended up with a score of 31, giving her 96/120 and the Bronze Medal. Kindra Hogan of USA shot a 99 to win Gold and her fellow country person Lacey Holtz took the Silver with a 97/120. Congratulations and well done Suzie. We all thought that Rocky in the Junior Men had the title in the bag, but he too suffered a case of the nerves and after shooting a 42 in the last round ended up with a score of 132/150. Congratulations on your score in Double Trap Rocky. The winner from Italy shot a score of 139/150. David B shooting a 103/150 came in 24th place and Joseph with a score of 94/150 finished in 25th place.

It was a very proud moment seeing Suzie on the winner's dais receiving her Bronze medal with the Australian flag fluttering in the breeze.

Day One - Trap and Skeet.

The weather was fine and everyone was shooting well and we looked forward to the competition continuing. Everyone had an early night.

Day Two - Trap and Skeet.

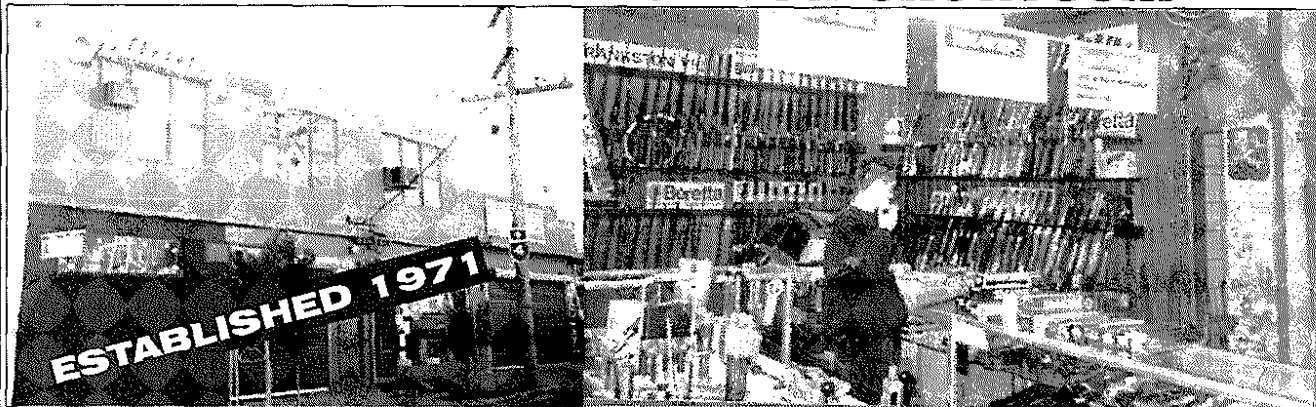
Everyone again shooting really well and score-wise our Teams were looking good. All now anxiously waiting for the final day's competition and each and everyone of them knowing exactly what they had to do. While talking to Michael on how he felt, you could tell instantly just how very determined he was about winning the Trap event. He went out in the last round and shot the 25 targets giving him 120/125 and I thought I had never seen him shoot so well - smoking each target as they came out. He then had to shoot off with 4 others for the last 3 positions in the Final. He again shot brilliantly with another 25.

Russell finished with a 23 putting him on 118/125 in =13th place and Glen Kable shooting a 24 gave him a 114/125 and put him in =43rd place, but overall it gave Australia their first ever World Championship Team Gold Medal. Seeing that Glen started with a 19 in his first round, for the Team to end up winning Gold was a real gutsy effort - Well done boys!

The Men's Final - Michael started in 4th position and he was 3 targets behind the leader. Right from the start of the Final you could see that the leader, a chap from Russia, was having a bad

case of the nerves, putting his gun up and down, up and down, and at the end of the 25 targets with Michael posting a 25, you could see that Michael was the superior shooter. With the crowd right behind Michael, for he is one of the favourite shooters of the world, it went into a single barrel shoot off between Michael and the Russian. I knew the shoot off would not go far and after just 3 targets each, there stood our new World Champion, Michael Diamond, in one of the most determined wins I have ever seen. Michael threw the empty shell into the crowd and he told me afterwards that it had been funny that a representative of his sponsor, RC Shells, had actually caught the empty shell up in the grandstand. I don't believe there would be many sportsmen of Michael's age who have been on top of their sport for as many years as Michael has been. For I remember Michael winning the Silver Medal at the World Championships back in Perth in 1991.

Men's Skeet resulted in Clive once again showing that he is one of the best in the world but once again luck was not on his side. He finished with a score of 121/125, but the 122/125's made the Final. Ganga, an Italian, won the Gold Medal with a score of 147/150. Clive, when you look at the top 10 place getters, most of whom have already won a World Cup or a World Championship, I believe the whole 10 of you are equally as good as each other and I think you are saving up your day for the Olympics. David C finished with a 25 in the last round giving him =24th place with a score of 118/125 and George finished with a 21 which put him in =36th position after shooting 117/125. I thought we had another Team medal in the bag with the Men's Skeet, but we were pipped out of a place by just 3 targets, but we were definitely in there with a chance.

It was decided unanimously that we would all go out and have a Celebration Dinner for the whole teams efforts, for Michael's World Championship win and the Trap Teams success.

We ended up going to a revolving restaurant and a more scenic spot would be hard to find in all of Europe. Not one of us had thought to bring a camera and as we were 150 metres up in the air overlooking Tampere, the lakes and city indeed proved to be a most idyllic sight. The food too was great and it was a long time since we had laughed so much, especially when Glen Kable, who kept on telling us that he was a World Champion Team member, tried to teach Clive and David C a new game (or so he thought) called 'spoons'. Little did he know we have all seen the trick many times before.

Dining at the same restaurant were the Italian Skeet Team, the Cyprus Shooting Team and the Irish Shooting Team.

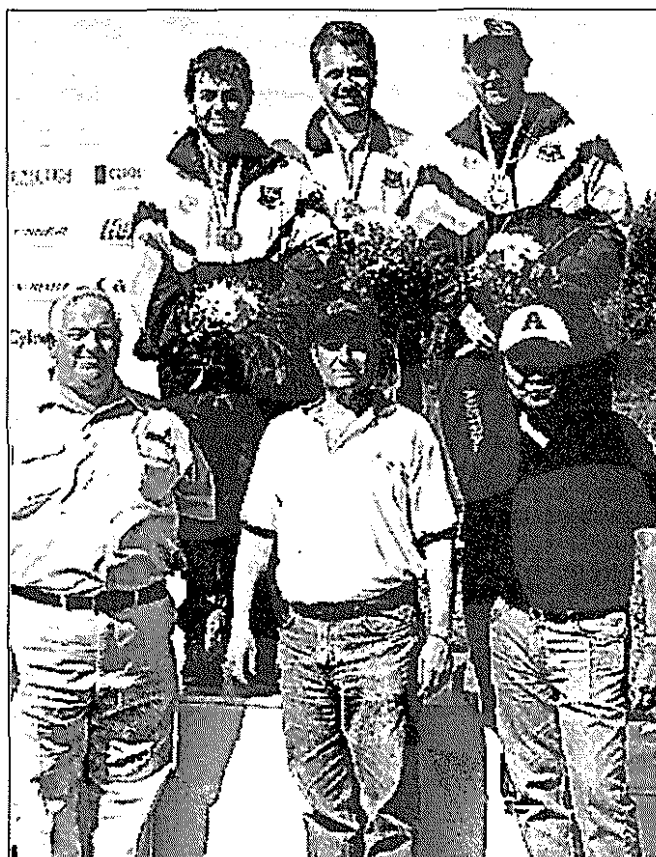
A funny thing happened at the end of the meal. Luca suggested that we have a bottle of champagne to toast Michael and the very next minute out came the flutes of champagne. We all toasted Michael's success and the Trap Teams success and then we toasted the Italian's success. The Italians and Cypriots, also flutes of Champagne also toasted Michael and the Australian Teams success, and then they thanked us for the champagne. I hadn't ordered champagne for us or them, but said nothing just in case someone else had ordered it. Unbeknownst to the lot of us, it was a complimentary drink 'on the house' from the restaurant. This ended a truly great day.

Monday 6th July

After some flight changes made a couple of days ago, we left the hotel at around 9.30am for the flight to Helsinki, which was due to fly out at midday with an overnight stop in Helsinki.

We spent the afternoon shopping in Helsinki which is a beautiful historic city and the Harbour is great if you like shipping. We all had an early night as we were to start off at 3.30am for our journey home.....and this was to start our next dilemma.

Before boarding the KLM flight from Helsinki we found four of the check in counters working, 3 of which were manned by women who were so strict with excess baggage it just was not funny. At this late stage there were only the 3 Trap shooters, 3 Skeet shooters, Luca, Greg, Darien and I left to make our way home, and it took one and a half hours to check 8 of us through - Darien with 14 kilo-

grams excess baggage and me with 5 kilograms. Some how the rest of our group had slipped their baggage through with the only male attendant on the check in counter. Clive was having problems taking his own gun as well as George's gun through, his only problem being with an oil bottle in the gun case - this appeared pernicky. With my own 5 kilograms over, I asked the woman how much I could have in my hand luggage and she answered, "10 kilograms, and only 1 piece". So I unpacked my suitcase, took out about 2 reams of paperwork and put them in my bag, gave my brief case to David C and went through the check in counter next to me and was finally let through. Darien was the only one who ended up having to pay for excess baggage which turned out to be 1400 Finnish markkaa or \$380 Aus.

What a miserable airline. This happened again and even though I made phone calls to Australia and showed the Finns the 'excess baggage' we had been allowed and AIS Travel in Australia's comment was, "What do you expect us to do?"

Once again the plane was choc-a-bloc full and the group seating arrangement pre-booked by me, was once again ignored. When we got to Amsterdam we had to check in again and as we only had about three quarters of an hour before our flight, we had to get new seating allocations. The pre arranged seating in the Frequent Flyers section that I had organised was again given away to goodness knows who, and we were scattered all over the plane and sitting on another 20 hour flight was not something we were looking forward to. All we wanted to do was to get home.

Upon our arrival in Sydney we heard an announcement. A dozen or so names were called out to see the ground staff. I heard David C name called and we were told that there was some baggage missing.

Well 'some of it' meant just about 'all of it' - plus guns - where was it - left back in Amsterdam! I received mine some 2 days later, as did the rest of those who had 'missing baggage'.

The moral of the story is - I would seriously think twice before

flying with this airline ever again - no matter how cheap they are, and as for AIS Travel's organisation - it certainly left a lot to be desired, especially with the months of pre-planning that had supposedly gone into it. It should have been straight forward, provided that all the paperwork had been done when it was asked.

In all, this was a very long trip, with a very large group of people and I have learnt a lot of lessons from it - lessons that I hope can be improved upon to make future trips better.

My thanks go to the whole Team for the effort that they put in and for the many successes that we had and for the friendship and comradeship displayed by the whole Team.

A special thanks to Luca and Greg for the tireless efforts they put in for nearly 4 weeks, working 14 to 15 hours daily for the whole trip and for trying to help everyone with all of their different problems. Thanks also to Darien who worked equally as hard out at the ranges and back at the hotel at night, keeping us all in shape so we could continue on. There are not many people who would have worked as hard as you three. My congratulations to you for helping the Team get the successes they did.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

2. Squads of 5 or 6 (as determined by the office) to shoot 100 targets per day, in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps, 2nd 50t moving up one trap. eg 1-2, 2-3, 3-4, 4-1, etc.

3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.

4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets. Shooters are expected to perform changeovers (between rounds as well as between squads) as quickly as possible, and certainly not exceed the maximum time limit allowed of two minutes. Anyone exceeding that time limit may be penalised.

5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be resquadded later in the event, but resquadding is not guaranteed, and non-participation is a possibility.

6. Should a shooter being late for his squad not be resquadded or elect to withdraw from the event, any refund of nominations paid is not guaranteed.

7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.

8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred in the event concerned.

9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, any penalty for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.

10. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may will be penalised up to FIVE (5) TARGETS.

11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.

13. Optional purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.

14. Optional purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.

15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.

17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals, trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.

18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00 am. or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.

20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.

22. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors and second family members entering into the same event, they being wives and husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.

E.g. (1) Father and 2 children - father pays full noms whilst the 2 juniors pay 60% noms each.

E.g. (2) Husband, wife and two children nominate - Husband pays full noms whilst the other three pay 60% noms each.

23. All competitors must comply with Firearm Licensing Laws in their state of residence and in the state hosting the National Championships.

I feel that it's time to make some changes in the ATA handicapping system. I have made it a point to read a number of articles in magazines concerning suggestions about changes to the system. Some of these are very interesting and worth consideration. I would like to add a suggestion of my own:

All yardage earned at large shoots (for example, over 250 shooters) stays in effect for one year and one month from the date the yardage was earned.

I have been involved with large shoots at my home club. Time and again I see shooters earning one or two yards, winning considerable amounts of money and trophies, and then coming back six months to a year later at their old yardage (sometimes at even less).

The rule change proposed above would discourage sandbagging.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS OCTOBER 1999

Karen and I have been home from the NSW State Skeet Carnival for a couple of days now, but she is still wandering around with a silly looking grin on her. She shot her first 100 straight in competition on the last day of the Carnival, and as Wayne Mayes always said, "if you're going to do something big, you might as well do it at a big shoot". Sunday's event was 75 targets and although she hit the first 50 pretty hard, our whole squad was unprepared for the way she "smoked" the last 25. High 8 is not one of her favorite shots, so when she drove it backwards in a cloud of soot and no pieces came past her, I looked at Gerry in amazement and he simply shook his head and said, "she's outa control". To cut a long story short, she went out in the overall shoot-off with the "big boys" and shot another round and a bit before finally succumbing to the moment, finishing fourth overall and first in A grade.

Even though the weather was not all that kind to us, the shoot ran quite smoothly, finishing in good time on Sunday afternoon. For that I wish to express a vote of thanks to the organizing committee, the Shoot Marshal Mr David Coleman, the Tournament Director Mr Les Abberley and the Office Manager Ms Libbie Douglass, who all did a sterling job especially considering the weather conditions. If you think it's not much fun having to go out and shoot in inclement weather for an hour or so, try spending all day out in it running the shoot. I was very glad to be sitting inside by the fire playing cards. Thanks also to Andy Karen and Deborah from the ACTA office for coming out and lending a hand.

On the subject of the weather, during presentations there was mention of changing the date of the shoot to avoid the possibility of such weather in future years. Holding the shoot outside the winter months would suit me personally, as I can trim two and a half hours off the trip to Wagga by going over Mt Hotham, rather than going all the way around through Melbourne, as I am forced to do during snow season. However I am against the idea in principle for a number of reasons. The most important of these is the fact that any date change of a Major Shoot causes a ripple effect across the annual shooting calendar, that can take several years to restabilise. It can also cause a tremendous amount of heartache to an enormous number of people, that the original "date changers" may never even become aware of. For an explanation of that problem, please refer back to the article I wrote about it in the November 1998 issue of CTSN.

Apart from that, I believe that the NSWCTA have the lead-time for their shoulder to shoulder team selections just about perfect. By qualifying in August to shoot at the Nationals in November, it is close enough that none of the members are likely to "go off the boil" or give up shooting. Yet it gives them three months to organize time off work and travel and accommodation arrangements, and to initiate a meaningful training program. It also allows the State Association adequate time to arrange uniforms and shooting jackets for the selected competitors. August also fits neatly into the established pattern of State Shoots in the eastern states, where realistic travelling distances allow a degree of interstate support and competition. Victoria and SA shoot in May, Tasmania shoots in June and Queensland shoots in September.

Holding the NSW Carnival in August at the National Shooting Ground also neatly spaces out skeet shooters annual visits to Wagga. It fits between Wagga Gun Club's two-day Skeet Shoot in April and the Nationals in November. And I don't believe that Wagga's weather in August is any more likely to be unpleasant than any other time of the year. In fact, by being so far inland, the weather patterns at that time of the year are probably more stable than at any other time, as evidenced by the nice day on the Sunday and several days of absolutely glorious weather that followed it. Please NSWCTA, leave the shoot date alone.

This year's Carnival was also the first Major Shoot outing for CVRIL's new Skeet "Phono pull" system. Although I believe that the system is a good one and a natural extension of their Trap product, and certainly the way of the future, I think it would be fair to say that its reception was mixed rather than overwhelming. The reasons for this are somewhat complicated and diverse, so I have decided to examine these in detail this month. Not only to set the record straight, but also to hopefully help pave the way for the introduction of a similar system into Skeet, to the one that has solved most of the refereeing problems in Trap Shooting.

The Trap system was introduced this year at the Trap Nationals and its initial acceptance rate of 90% had probably risen to at least 98% by the end of the week. The initial satisfaction rate of the Skeet units was probably only about 65% and improved to maybe 85% during the Carnival. Unfortunately, luck probably played a part in slowing the approval rating as cold, wet, wind-blown shooters, who are therefore scoring badly, are probably less tolerant to something new and different than they would have been on a nice day when they were shooting well and enjoying themselves.

Several other major factors also caused the Skeet system to be more cautiously received than its Trap counterpart. The first was familiarity. Trap phono-pulls have been around for ages, and CVRIL's were just another type to try, whereas Skeet phono systems are rare. Thus, as with anything new and untried, there is always a degree of resistance to change, no matter how beneficial that change may turn out to be. The second was calling volume. Most Trap shooters have shot over some earlier sort of Phono system or have shot Trench. Thus they have previously learnt that a soft call won't work,

and have already adjusted to that fact. Some Skeet shooters have yet to address that situation.

The third was intrusion. Trap microphones are able to be placed off to one side and thus do not encroach upon the normally open space in front of the shooter. Not so with Skeet, where the microphones need to be placed in front of the shooter on some of the stations, due to the necessity to shoot in two different directions. Thus the microphones seem to intrude upon an area which is normally clear. As new Trench shooters seem to be able to adjust to this exact same situation quite easily on the very first day, I am sure that Skeet shooters will also be able to make a similar adjustment, in time, without too much stress.

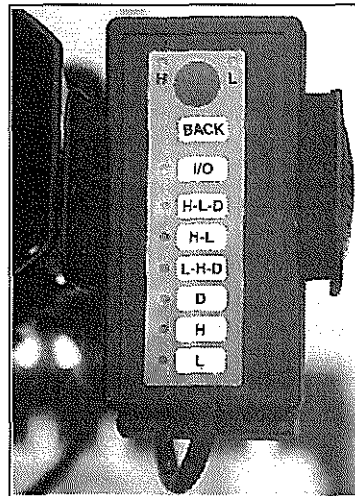
Most of the operating problems encountered over the weekend stemmed from a lack of clear understanding of the workings of the hand controller by some of the less technically minded referees. When in the automatic mode this is relatively unimportant, as you simply turn it on and watch it work. But when needing to manually override it, for competitors who call softly or are just adverse to it, a comfortable familiarity would certainly have enabled the system to work more efficiently. One of the most constructive comments offered during the shoot was that, as the referees hand controller is new and different, and needs to be more complicated in order to operate with much less operator input, it would have been better if an operating leaflet could have accompanied it. I have passed that on to the manufacturers and I am sure they will address that situation immediately.

Another excellent suggestion was that this situation could have been greatly alleviated if we had published a diagram and explanation of the system and the hand controller in the CTSN. Hindsight is a wonderful thing, however it's certainly not too late yet for next time, so this month I am including two photographs to graphically illustrate the equipment and its operation. One is a picture of my wife shooting over the microphone stand, to show the system from the shooters perspective (note that as she is shooting on her own, for convenience she has the sequence controller clipped into the removable "practice bracket"). The other is a close up of the hand controller to aid in the explanation of its operation and the referee's function.

The two lights in the top corners are the sequencer indicator lights and they illuminate to indicate which target/s will be thrown next. The large round button just below them is the override button, which allows the referee to manually throw whatever target/s are indicated by the top lights. Next is the "back-up" button. Each time it is pressed, the selected sequence backs up one phase. It is used to reverse up the automatic sequencer after a broken target or for an optional shot. Under that is a simple on/off button for the microphones, which serves the same function as in the Trap model. At the end of each round it should be turned off to prevent people inadvertently releasing a target by talking near a microphone. It's also useful if the competitors enter into any discussions whilst on the firing line. It has a light beside it to indicate whether it's on or off.

Immediately under that are the six sequencer selector buttons, which also have lights beside them to indicate which one is currently in operation, and which are marked in such a way as to be self-explanatory. The first three are for the various stations whilst shooting a round of singles. The fourth one is for doubles events and the last two are for shooting practice and/or for use in the manual override mode. Thus when refereeing a normal round, if no one missed and neither machine threw a broken target, theoretically you would only touch the controller six times in total. Once to turn it on, once between stations two and three, once between five and six, once more between six and seven, again between seven and eight and finally to turn it off when finished on eight.

Realistically, allowing for a couple of broken targets and all six option shots, you may have to push a button 15 times per round, but never in a situation of stress where your performance of that action could affect the equity of the competition. Compare this with a squad of six shooters without phono-pulls, where you not only have to push the button 150 times during the round, but on each and every occasion, that operation needs to be performed at a level of total concentration. Thus the original purpose of the whole system, which was to allow the shooters to be assured of a good consistent pull every time they call, provided they call loud enough, has been achieved. However it has also provided the secondary side effect of taking all of the stress out of refereeing.





Although some people were initially a little skeptical of using the system in competition for the first time, almost everyone that saw it, immediately recognized it's tremendous practice potential, particularly for shooting on your own. Thus even the most ardent critics wandered off wondering how they could convince their club's treasurer to part with the cost of a set, if only for their practice field, and surely that would be a great way to introduce new people to the system. By the time you read this, CVRIL should have released their Skeet machines on the commercial market. I'm led to believe that, even with a microprocessor, the cost should not be much more than a Trap set, and I suspect that, like the Trap model, they will be marketed directly from New Zealand via a free-call phone number. However check

their adverts in the CTSN for confirmation of marketing details. I have enjoyed the opportunity to assist in the development of this exciting new product and hope to maintain an ongoing interest in the project in the field of technical support.

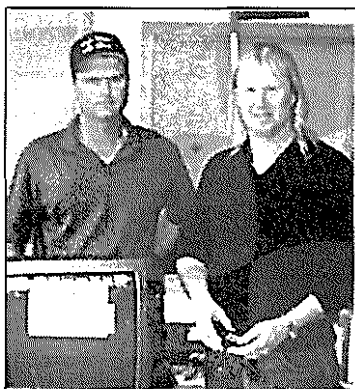

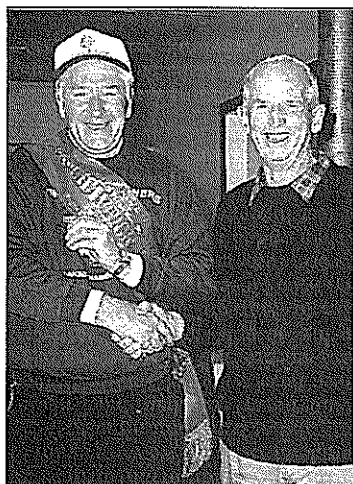

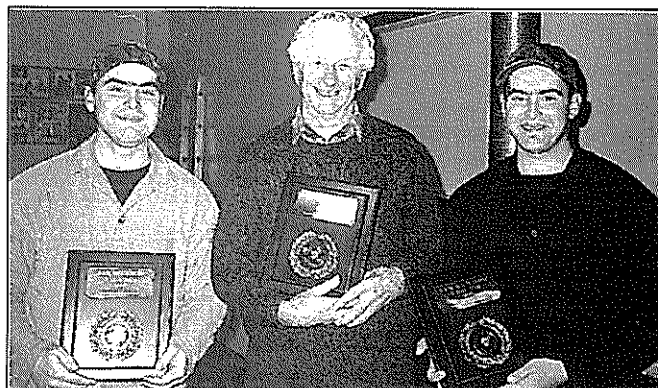
NSW State Skeet Championship winner and NSWCTA Skeet Championship winner Adrian Cousens with Les Aberley.

Sydney International Shooting Centre — Cecil Park

The Sydney International Shooting Centre (SISC) is expected to be open for firing for all disciplines on the 11th October 1999. This will enable our elite shooters to access the ranges to prepare for the Oceania Championships to be held from the 1st to the 15th of November this year. The Oceania Championships will attract shooters from all over the world to compete in the event and shoot on the ranges to be used for the World Cup to be held in March 2000, and ultimately the Olympic competition later in the year.

The SISC is located at Cecil Park in Sydney's Southwest in the Liverpool Council local government area. The facility has been developed by the Olympic Co-ordination Authority in co-operation with Cecil Park Clay Target Club (CPCTC), which has had an established shotgun range on the site since 1994 and will operate and manage the facility once opened.

The SISC will be one of the major venues for the Sydney 2000 Olympic and Paralympic Games, with a capacity to accommodate up to 10,000 spectators.

The design of the SISC is appropriate to this status, reflecting design quality, and an understanding of the sport and the Olympic movement. Innovation, environmental concern and financial responsibility are integrated in the design.

After Sydney 2000, the SISC will be the venue for training and competition for many levels of shooting in Sydney and provide an appropriate legacy for the sport of shooting in NSW. The SISC will also become the high performance centre for the Australian Shooting, but the design of the SISC will ensure that the attractiveness of the facility to the recreational Shooting market is maximised.

The facility consists of:

- 10 metre Range, 60 positions (air pistol/air rifle, including 3 moving target positions)
- 25 metre Range, 40 positions, (pistol)
- 50 metre Range, 60 positions (pistol/small bore rifle)
- 3 combined Olympic Trap, Double Trap and Skeet Layouts (shotgun)
- 10,25,50m Finals Range (air rifle and pistol disciplines)

The 25 and 50 metre Ranges will be covered and enclosed on back and two ends to protect the shooters and spectators from sun, wind and rain. The 10 metre Range will be an indoor range.

International Shooting Union approved electronic target and scoring systems will be installed within all rifle and pistol ranges, and lighting of all ranges will be suitable for full colour high definition TV coverage and photographic convenience with uniform levels over the whole competition area.

The Rifle and Pistol Finals Range will have a capacity for 2,700 spectators with firing lanes that can be rapidly converted to accommodate the finals for all Olympic rifle, pistol and running target events.

The Shotgun Finals Range will incorporate an electronic scoreboard, public address system and a grandstand with a capacity for 4,000 spectators.

A proposed 300 metre Full Bore Range has been masterplanned at the site for construction after Sydney 2000.

The five existing CPCTC shotgun layouts, set up for American Skeet and "Down the Line" Trap events, will add to the flexibility of the venue.

The Olympic Games will be held from 15 September to 1 October 2000. The Shooting competition will be conducted over eight consecutive days during the Olympic Games (Days 2-9) and involve seventeen medal events in the different disciplines.

The Paralympic Games will be held from 18 October to 29 October 2000. The SISC will also be utilised for the Paralympic Shooting competition between 22 October and 28 October 2000 and involve sixteen medal events.

The SISC has been designed such that it can be expanded and modified after the Sydney 2000 to suit the more popular Australian Shooting disciplines and their specific targetry requirements. Additional shotgun layouts will be constructed after the Olympics to expand the facility's capacity and include five stand sporting clay capability.

The SISC will provide a facility that will attract international and national events to Sydney, and engender community pride in the facility.

There is provision in the design for the facility to efficiently and economically expand on a temporary basis to meet the requirements of an Olympic Games, World Championships, Commonwealth Games or other major international Shooting event.

Psychological Preparation for Shooting: Goal Setting

Michael Kruger-Davis is a psychologist who has a keen interest in clay target shooting and mental skills training. He is a member of Hay and Narrandera Clay Target Clubs. He can provide mental skills training workshops for individuals or groups. Last month's article examined the relationship between self doubt and poor performance. Aspects such as being judgmental about our performance and allowing self 1 (the left side of the brain) to interfere, reduces our ability to perform well, enjoy the sport and have fun.

As a psychologist, shooters would ask me what they were doing wrong, or could I help them with this problem, etc....I soon learned that I knew a lot about shooting and a lot about psychology but not a great deal about the psychology of shooting. So in order to help others I embarked on some research with the primary aim to help myself become more competitive, perform better and have more fun.

Mental skills training for shooting is no different from mental skills training for other sports such as golf, tennis, ten-pin bowling etc. Mental skills training is not new. The Soviet Union was excluded from Olympic competition from 1912 until 1952. During this time, and without the pressures of competition, they developed techniques and strategies that enabled their athletes to regain a position of supremacy for several decades. (Cunningham 1980) When I first started exploring mental skills it became apparent to me that if I wanted my performance to improve then this required me to change my current patterns of behavior. Change can be threatening, even if we know it might lead to winning. And change is often more difficult, the older and more experienced we are. A consistent theme in mental skills training manuals is goal setting —and when I was reading these books it occurred to me that I just went along to shoots - I didn't have a clear goal of why I was there. John Syer & Christopher Connelly in their books *Sporting Body*, *Sporting Mind* and *Think to Win* go into great length and depth about the need for goal setting in sport, business and life in general.

It is essential that you have clear long term goals. For shooters, like any athlete, goal setting is an important component of motivation because it makes practice, competition, etc goal driven. Goal setting is an individual thing, however there are several common aspects relating to goals.

1. You must like your goal.
2. The goal must bring alive some aspect of your vision. Your vision is the picture of yourself that you are striving towards - what you want to be. Your goals need to make your vision real.
3. There is a connection between this goal and other goals. Goals and objectives cannot have too wide a spread or they are too difficult to achieve.
4. You should be able to express your personal potential through achieving this goal. Goals should be more than just winning things, they should allow you to connect with some particular quality within yourself.
5. The goal should help you gain recognition.
6. The goal is unique, innovative and creative so that life is more than just hard work.
7. You need to be committed to making this goal happen.
8. It's fun.

Goal setting exercise:

You will need:

About 30-45 minutes.

Four sheets of paper and a pencil.

It is important that you write your goals down because this makes them concrete, real and yours.

On the top of the first sheet of paper write **LIFETIME GOALS** - and take five minutes to write down as many such goals as you can - competitions you want to win, breaks you want to achieve, how

you want to train, prizes you'd like to win. Write anything that comes into your head. Try and find about a dozen or more. (Take the full five minutes even if you stop after two or three). Turn over the page and do not look at it again.

Now take the second sheet of paper and on the top write **THREE-YEAR GOALS** and then write down anything that comes into your mind without worrying about the first sheet. After five minutes turn over the page and don't look at it again.

Take the third sheet of paper and write on the top **THIS YEAR OR THIS SEASONS GOALS** and write down the goals you wish to accomplish this season. It doesn't matter how trivial or important they are. After five minutes stop and turn over the page.

Finally take the fourth sheet of paper and write on the top **MONTHLY GOALS** and repeat the procedure.

Now take some time to prioritise the goals on each page. Choose three goals and beside each write 'A', these are now your A priority goals which are the most important and urgent. Then work out 'B' and 'C' priority goals. Do this for all four pages. Then sit back and reflect for a moment.

Your monthly goals should be foundations upon which you can achieve your yearly goals. Your yearly goals should in turn help you achieve your three yearly goals and so on. For example, if my yearly goal is to make the State Team, then a seasonal goal might be to make the zone team or get in shoot offs at the zone championships. The monthly goal might be to shoot a possible at each shoot to gain experience and training for what will be needed at the State championships. My immediate goals whilst shooting will be to shoot this target, the one I am about to face.

Whilst goal setting is a relatively unglamorous aspect of mental training it is the essential foundation for the other components to be placed. However, that said, the goals themselves are what you are striving for - to achieve them involves a range of physical and mental skills one of which is concentration and will be the subject of the next article.

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts and maximum fine of \$5,500.
