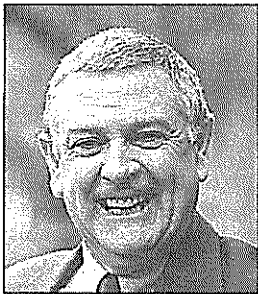

National President's Notes

DRESS CODE:

One issue that continues to arise is that of the standard of dress when shooting. It is not covered in our rules and I do not believe that we should now add to our already bulging rule book, a rule that should be predetermined by the shooter.

Today, shooting and shooters are continually being subjected to scrutiny by the general public at large, therefore our image must be promoted at every opportunity. When a new-comer visits one of our clubs his first impression, is a lasting impression.

I am not advocating a return to the days of collar and ties, but a standard of dress expected at any sporting event. The issues most complained about are footwear and shirts, or more to the point, the lack of these items.

LEAD SHOT:

With the introduction of lead shot being phased into all our wetlands hunting areas, one wonders how long before this becomes an issue with our clubs.

Despite many strong arguments supporting the retention of lead shot and the lack of conclusive evidence to support the introduction of non toxic shot, it seems we are really fighting a losing battle.

Recently I received a booklet in the mail advising me of the negatives of lead in the environment and the need to change as quickly as possible to non toxic shot. On reading the booklet I could not help but get the feeling we will be next.

OLYMPIC COMPLEX:

Our Olympic complex will be on show from the Oceania Championships being conducted there from the 5th to the 12th November. All members and friends are invited to come along and not only have a preview of the grounds, but to witness some top shooting during the week.

Rule changes as of January 1, 2000

Rule 1.04(d) - Delete in full and replace with

(i) Squads will be filled in order of nomination, on the day of competition.
(ii) Shooters may enter full squads, but must accept the next vacant squad number.

(iii) Club management shall have the right to squad shooters to assist in the organisation of the competition.

Rule 1.24(g) - Add to end of sentence after . . . 25th target:
"where he must reload"

Rule 2.01(a) - Add into Note after . . . Double Rise:
"Mackintosh"

Rule 2.01(h) - Add at end of paragraph:

"Note: All night double barrel targets are to be entered in the Continental/Single barrel column"

Rule 2.07(a) - Add to front of sentence:

"Club Management"

Rule 3.02 - Delete in total.

Rules 3.15, 3.16, 3.17 and 3.18 - Add into Rule Heading

"Day or Night"

Rule 3.16(d) - Delete . . . from 15 metres and insert:

"from 15 or 18 metres"

Rule 3.28(a) - Add

"(vi) All Trap grade shoot-offs will be shot single barrel, miss and out. To be shot squad system.

Rule 3.28(b)iii - Amend grades to read:

"AA - 93% and over; A - 82% and under 93%; B - 70% and under 82%; C - under 70%"

Rule 3.29(b)i - Amend grades to read:

"AA - 85% and over; A - 75% and under 85%; B - 65% and under 75%; C - under 65%"

Rule 4.05(a) - Alterations:

Delete - "whether single or doubles"

Replace "45 degrees" with "35 degrees"

Rule 4.05(a) - Add to end of paragraph:

"Note: Those clubs which due to undulating ground are unable to comply, should establish appropriate measuring facilities which allow them to throw legal targets."

Rule 4.05(b) - Delete in total Note at end of paragraph.

Rule 4.06 - Add at end of paragraph:

"Targets shall be thrown a maximum of 45 metres, minimum of 40 metres."

NOTE: Rule 2.02(c)ii - There was an error in the previous notice to changes made to this rule. This rule should read 94% or above and not 95%. Any inconvenience in this notification is regretted.

NOTICE

Please be advised that the ACTA will be using the Phono Pull System designed by Canterbury Voice Release at the 1999 Skeet Nationals.

However, this System will be optional and shooting over a referee operated conventional button release will also be available.

Shooters will be asked as to their preference when squadding each day and squadded accordingly.

WORLD DTL - WALES - 1999

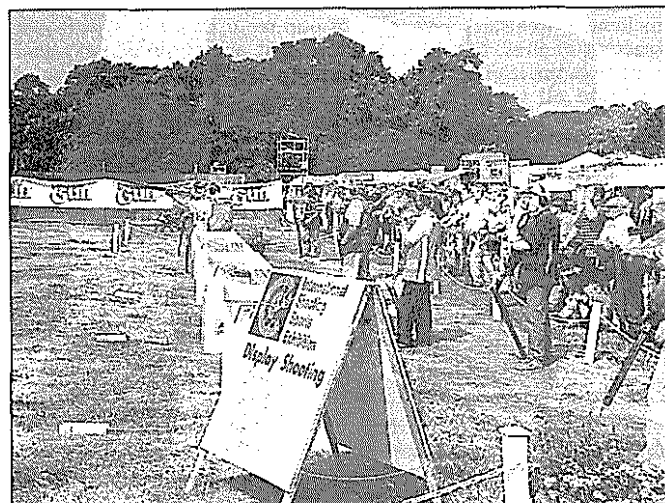
Newtown, Wales was to be the venue for the 1999 World Down the Line Championships and we were to send one of the largest clay target teams we have ever sent overseas to contest the titles. We selected a full complement of Open, Ladies, Junior and Veteran teams at our DTL Nationals conducted earlier in this year at Roma to make the trip.

Unfortunately the full team could not travel together due to a number of various commitments of some of the members.

The majority of the team left Australia at 11am via Sydney and United Airlines on Sunday, July 25. It was little disconcerting for those of us that arrived at Melbourne around 6am for an 8am flight to Sydney to find that the flight did not exist. A little bit of reorganisation and we were off to Sydney at 7am. Not a really great start to our trip. It was also at Melbourne we were assured that our baggage was checked all the way to Heathrow, which also was not to be the case.

With a little time to kill in Sydney before our flight to our next destination - San Francisco - members got to meet one another, do a bit of Duty Free shopping, or to catch up on a little sleep. 13 hours after take off we arrived in San Francisco to be told we would have to collect all our luggage and pass through USA Customs, place the baggage back into the system for our flight to Heathrow, via New York even though we were only in transit. On speaking with a Custom official there, I was told this airport was one of only two in the World where this situation occurs.

We arrived in London at 6.40am on Monday the 26th July their time.

A quick conversation with Customs officials re our firearms and on being assured that no problems were evident, I went to meet Julie Schultz who was to be our host on a guided tour of London until our hotels rooms became available. I then returned to wait for everyone to clear Customs. A short time later I was approached by a Customs official who stated there was a problem with three of our people in that they only had fax/photocopies of their British permits. Returning to the Customs room it was clearly evident that a senior Customs official was making things difficult on insisting on seeing all original permits. I explained that these had not arrived prior to our departure and that enquires with British Police and the Clay Pigeon Association before leaving Australia indicated that this would not be a problem as the faxed copies would be sufficient. Despite this we had a two and a half hour wait until the Police could be contacted. A very brief conversation with the Arms Officer and we were on our way.

The guided tour by Julie and our bus driver, Adam, was excellent. We visited Westminster Abbey, central London, Buckingham Palace and many other points of interest in and around London. Despite everyone being a little tired it was certainly one of the highlights of our trip. Over the next two days everyone was free to explore London. Such points of interest as the Tower of London, Tower Bridge, Madam Tussauds, Harrods, Oxford Street, Convent Gardens and Holland & Holland to name a few were all visited. On the second evening as some of us were looking for a venue for dinner in Gloucester Street, Kensington, it was a welcome surprise to have Queen Elizabeth and Prince Phillip drive past.

From London we all set off for Yorkshire where we would attend the CLA Game Fair and take part in a challenge shoot against the English Open DTL team. An impossible task to keep our convoy of a small bus and 9 cars together on the freeways and through the cities. Despite this we all arrived at our accommodation at a farmhouse at Summerhill all in one piece. The farmhouse and surrounding countryside was idyllic and our host, Angela, could not do enough for us. From here we travelled to the Game Fair and to the North of England Clay Target Centre.

On arriving at the Game Fair on Friday, the first day no one could believe the enormity of it all. The fair was conducted in the grounds of Harewood House, home of the Earls of Harewood for over 200 years. A quick search of the ground soon had us meeting up with an old friend, Emilio Orduna Executive Director of the CPSA and his staff at their display tent. Our members then took the opportunity to view the many sights, exhibits and take part in the shooting programmes and exhibitions. Every possible country pursuit was catered for at the Fair and it would be a virtual impossibility to visit each display or demonstration. The weather was in a word - hot, but all thoroughly enjoyed the first day.

It was decided on the Saturday to take advantage of a 100 target practice shoot at the North of England Clay Target Centre just outside York. Club members made us welcome and it was great to

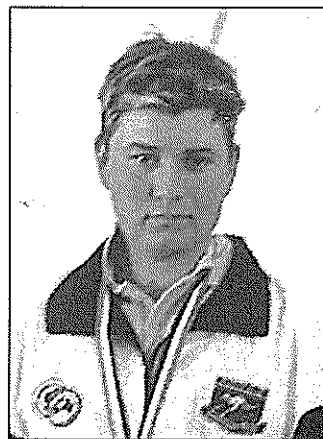

catch up with John Adams and Barry Stephenson who had visited our nationals at Roma. Our team recorded some excellent scores over the 100 targets. Arthur Turner 299/100, Alan Denton 298/100, Bill Iles 297/100 were our stand out shooters. Ken Neill from Port Macquarie who was taking advantage of the tour also recorded an excellent 297/100.

Sunday saw us back at the Game Fair to do battle with the English Open DTL

team in a challenge match. Our host for this event was well known British International and exhibition shooter, John Bidwell. A little surprise for both teams when it was announced the match would be compact sporting and with trap guns, oh well, it was all in good fun and the boys certainly enjoyed it with England coming out in front by some 20 points over the 50 target event.

Up early on Monday and we bade farewell to Clough House, our farmhouse accommodation, and our lovely hostess, Angela, and set off for Newtown, Wales the venue for the World DTL. Again our large convoy, which had been increased by another mini bus, proved impossible to keep together and as it had been arranged for all to meet at the Newtown Tourist Information Centre, we all arrived at our destination within a short time of each other. Because of the size of our team, and the lack of motel type of accommodation, our lodgings were well scattered. Despite the distance apart, all facilities were excellent.

As we had arrived reasonably early in the afternoon, some took the time to drop in on the Mid Wales Shooting School and renew our friendship with Arthur Williams, the owner of the ground. Arthur is well known to many Australians having hosted an Australian team in 1991, the 1993 World DTL and he having visited Wagga Wagga in 1997. Throughout the event Arthur and his family could not do enough for us, and we thank him for this.

The ground at Mid Wales is situated on Arthurs farm and it has an excellent background with 10 layouts. A number of the layouts have a roof constructed over the shooting stands (for the frequent inclement weather) and some of our team found it a little distracting at first, but soon adjusted to it and recorded very good rounds in the lead up to the Championships. During these days we observed all teams practising. Teams attended from Australia, New Zealand, France, Germany, Scotland, Ireland, Wales and England.

The first day of competition saw our team members shoot early and experience some considerable variance in light conditions, but at the end of the day they were all well within reach of the leaders. On day two we shot midmorning, and as we would complete the first 200 targets of competition thereby deciding the team events, all eyes were firmly on us. Our teams performed outstandingly, as when all results were in for the day, we had won 3 gold and 1 silver medal of a possible. Our teams had certainly achieved what they had travelled to the United Kingdom to do.

Our team members were: Open - Bill Iles, David Fox, Arthur Turner, Steve Habermann and Phil Headon - Gold.

Veteran - Tim Catling, Bert Boschetti and Alan Denton - Gold.

Junior - Terry Walls, Murray McAllister and Matt Kelly - Gold

Ladies - Kathy Gault, Dianne Reeves and Nan McCallum - Silver.

In addition, Arthur, Bill and Steve won the three man team event. Day three saw the completion of the competition and the individual events. Terry Walls took silver in the Junior Section, Arthur Turner 4th overall (1st AA grade), Kathy Gault 4th and Dianne Reeves 6th (Ladies), and Murray McAllister, 6th Junior. A very successful World Down the Line.

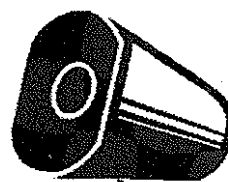
The 5th World DTL will be held in Christchurch, New Zealand in 2002.

Gold Coast 3rd & 4th July 1999

Queensland's wettest winter for 16 years did little to enhance the QCTA State Sporting titles staged at the Gold Coast Club on the first weekend in July. Persistent rain right up to the eve of the first day's competition made it a nightmare for officials and volunteers in setting targets with both our field layouts well and truly underwater.

Sunday saw the start of the 100 Target Pacific Coast Championship sponsored by Under & Over Guns and although the grounds were still under water the rain stayed away long enough for the sun to poke its head through. Gumboots still essential, but raincoats were dispensed with! Following the same format as the previous days competition but with all the targets altered overnight, competitors did their best to out smart the wily volunteers who had reset the targets for Sundays shoot. It would have to be said that the shooters came out the winners as the scores on the board - some in red figures, were very creditable indeed. 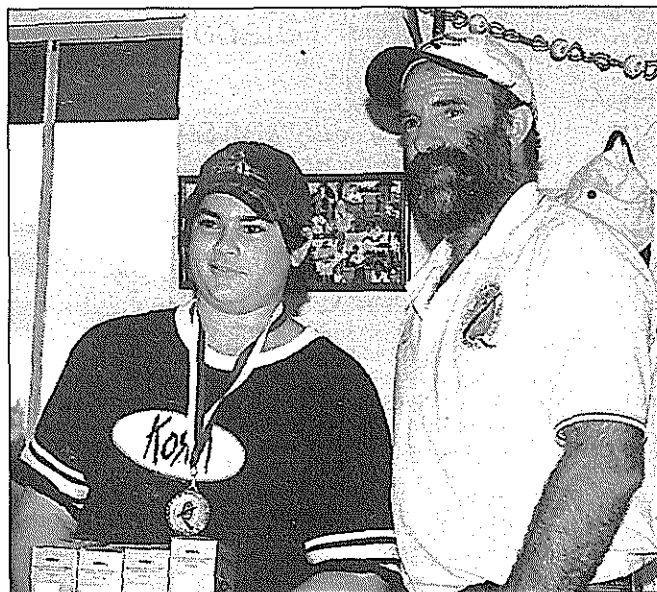

Numbers attending were lower than expected, but all credit to the 7 squads of keen shooters who came to the club, some from as far afield as Gunnedah, and with raincoats and galoshes firm in hand. The 100 Target Gold Coast Championship, sponsored by Gold Coast Shooters Supplies was the first days event with the first 50 targets shot over the clubs bush layout. This course involved reasonably close targets thrown through wooded surrounds. Some fine shooting and excellent scores came in with past champion Gundy Manning 48/50 and Gold Coast President Mike Swale 47/50. Each recording one clean round apiece. Other scores of note were Chris Langley and Debbie Young (A Grade) both with a 42/50, Frank Scibilia (B Grade) 42/50, Chris Larsen (C Grade) 37/50 and Junior Jordan Malouf shooting very well with a 38/50.

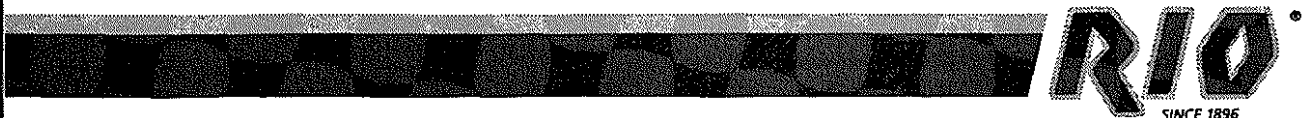

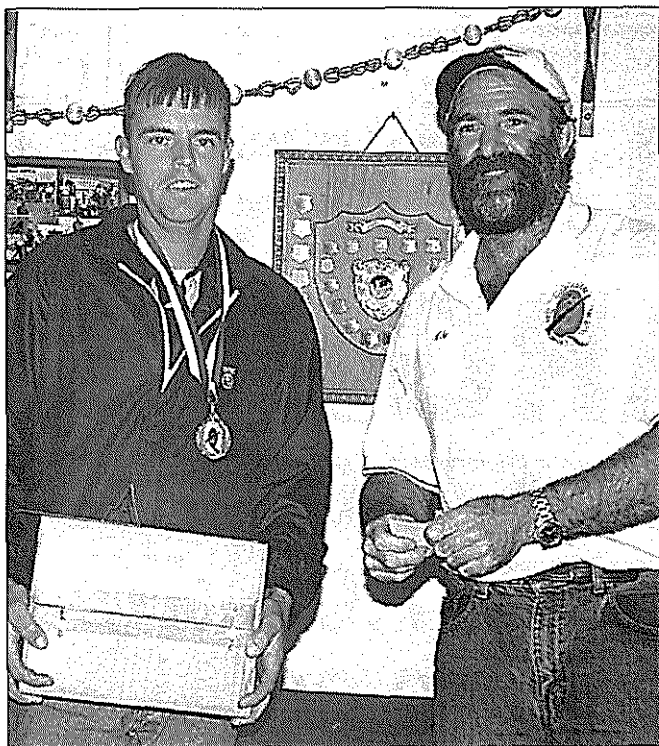

Congratulations to the Gold Coast President Mike Swale and his band of hard working volunteers for their efforts in what turned out to be very trying conditions.

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

2. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 75 targets in three rounds of 25 per day.

3. The Organising Committee will decide the order of shooting.

4. Regulation Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rocket rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot official, but shall number five (5) in total.

5. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.

6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets

7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is a possibility.

8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.

10. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.

11. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.

12. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.

13. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

14. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.

15. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.

16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.

17. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

18. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.

19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.

20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.

21. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors and the second family members entering into the same event, they being wives and husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.

E.g. (1) Father and 2 children - father pays full noms whilst the 2 juniors pay 60% noms each.

E.g. (2) Husband, wife and two children nominate - Husband pays full noms whilst the other three pay 60% noms each.

22. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.

Re-Run of Rule Classification.

NSW Rules Supervisor Bob Blake wishes to draw our attention to RULE 2.02 (C2), which states "a shooter recording 94% or above from 15m, with a handicap of 15m or less, will automatically be re handicapped to 16m". This is referring to Common mark shooting i.e. off 15m. It effectively means, that A Grade and AA Grade shooters cannot have a handicap of less than 16m.

From the Rules Chairman

Many shooters ask us why we keep changing Rules, but it is the shooters themselves who demand these changes. There always seems to be someone who will challenge a Rule, misread them, or interpret them to how they wish them to read. We are continually criticised for the changes that occur, but on the other hand, we are criticised if we do not make certain changes. It's a no win situation. Unfortunately we cannot please everyone. What most do not realise, is that we do not make changes for changes sake, but only if we feel a rule is incorrect, badly worded or if an improvement can be made to an existing rule. It is our job to research options, which is surely for the betterment of our sport.

At the Roma Nationals, an "Open Discussion Evening" was held, with any shooters who wished to discuss rules with us. We had quite a few attend. There were no promises made, it was purely a forum where rules were discussed, opinions given and a chance for shooters to talk to us. We have been accused many times of not being available to the shooters, so this gave them an opportunity to meet with us all. I believe this is a better place for them to air their grievances regarding the rules, than for them to bring them up at the AGM.

Since we brought in the new rule regarding Handicap Shooting, I have received many letters referring to problems associated with them. I appreciate all input that is received, and any constructive criticism given. We try to give all letters received from you the shooters, a fair and unbiased appraisal. Obviously there are some problems to be sorted out. I therefore wish to invite any shooters interested in discussing these with us, to meet with the Rules Committee at the Trap Nationals to be held next year in Wagga Wagga.

With the current system of Handicap shooting, the Rules Committee deemed it necessary for 12 months to pass before any changes occurred, so a clearer picture would unfold. I am sure between all of us, we can come up with a Rule that will be suitable for the majority of shooters. I hope to be able to have this meeting on the evening of the National Single Barrel Event. A definite date will be confirmed closer to the Nationals. Any correspondence regarding Handicap Shooting will be taken to this meeting so they may be part of the discussion.

Dear Editor

I have been a member of the ACTA for some years now and feel compelled to congratulate the management committee to have the wisdom and foresight to finally come up with a national ground. This long overdue achievement can only be for the better of our sport. I feel that, while there is still much to be achieved, the ACTA as a whole has been more progressive in the last number of years than ever before.

I have read with interest Adrian Cousens comments with regards to the rules of skeet as applied in this country. Could be another progressive step in the right direction?

A rule I have not been happy with, is the rule on cartridge malfunction. Some years ago it happened to me and I have seen it happen to other shooters as well. In my case I lost the 29th target of a 30 target event on a 3rd cartridge malfunction, using a well known factory cartridge, on a major trophy shoot. On inspection of the offending cartridge I found the wad to be crunched at about 45 degrees. That is clearly not the shooters fault, also to adjudicate a shot as fair, because the shot has left the barrel, when blind

Freddie could see that the shooter had a better chance to shoot the target with his favoured slingshot is a unfair rule.

I am aware of the reason for this rules, but that don't make them any fairer when you're on the receiving end.

On a different subject, I have toyed with this idea for some time and here it is. The creation of a charity committee to encompass all shooting organisations in this country, or at least try to get as many as possible to pull together on this one. Every club or branch of every shooting organisation in the country to run one event of a scheduled program within a nominated month, once a year, with the proceeds being collected by the charity committee and then passed on to a nominated charity, such as the Royal Flying Doctor Service, with each and every donation fully acknowledged. With good will we could raise a quite large amount of money for a very worthwhile cause and there by generate an enormous amount of goodwill for all of the shooting sports.

I'm open to suggestions and help to organise, but it would need the endorsement of the ACTA as well as other major shooting organisations. I have written a letter to Roy Smith SSAA, also with the idea of this concept. If the ACTA agrees in principal, I would be prepared to take this further.

Anyone wanting to help is of course most welcome.

I've listened/read with interest discussions regarding skeet shooting and submit the following:

(a) We should adopt the target distances used in the USA - this would make our sport an international one. Anybody who has anything to do with Politicians already knows that if we are only playing a local game they immediately turn off.

The slightly higher speed also gives greater target stability.

(b) Controversy regarding our shooting procedure on Station 7.

I believe that prudent safety management demands that we do not wait for an accident to happen, but attempt to anticipate potential problems and thus avoid them. The ACTA have acted correctly in adopting the present procedure.

I have been hit by pieces of incoming targets near/on station 7 - both my own and the immediately preceding shooters. Target marks on the low trap house testify to this hazard.

In skeet at this station (also on 8), the shooters gun is pointing nearly parallel to the public area. A shooter ducking away from a piece of target with a loaded gun has the potential to point into the public area. Please spare me from the argument that it has not happened yet. One such accident will involve the Police and Coroner - we operate in an intensively hostile political environment - why give them a stick to beat us with.

On station 1 the outgoing targets are shot first yet in 1993 at San Antonio World Shoot, a shooter was knocked down on an incoming piece of target.

(c) Our station 8 sequence brings equity to the shooting surely a desirable thing. Why should number 1 shooter be disadvantaged, everybody looking over his/her shoulder. This used to happen at all stations but the 3 metre rules overcame this. Equity is both desirable and in my opinion essential. Our present rule means every shooter goes onto station 8 on an equal footing.

Our single loading on station 8 is also sound. At the QLD State Shoot at Roma in 98, a shooter was hit in the face by a piece of target from low eight. The force of the impact was sufficient to daze him. Fortunately the gun was empty and importantly he was wearing glasses which probably saved his eye.

(d) In Australia the shooters take turns at refereeing. Shooters attend shoots to enjoy themselves not to get into arguments during their session as referee. This at one stage became such a problem that shooters were refusing to referee.

At one Trap National an attempt was made to have paid referees, but nobody answered the advertisement. This did not reflect favorably on the perceived ethics of shooters. The ACTA then introduced the refusal rule to place more responsibility on the shooters and relieve the Referee from accusations that his refereeing caused a miss. I'm sure we can think of somebody who has never missed a target - it is always somebody else's fault. This then leads to the question of selective squadding.

I'm not sure I understand the thinking ours is an individual sport, everybody shooting against the other. If it is argued that a shooter will be assisted by other members of his squad then the individuality becomes a farce - should shooters have to compete with not individuals but a combined team? It seems to me that a shooter should not be interfered with either positively or negatively when it is his/her turn to shoot.

Remembering that we do not employ paid referees - shooters taking their own turns - then it seems that for the sake of peace a Referee with out a lot of experience could be intimidated by a group of experienced shooters. I witnessed a sorry spectacle at Wagga some years ago with a squad intimidating a Referee. Fortunately later they came up against 2 Referees who would not accept this nonsense.

Until such time as we have trained, paid and independent Referees, why introduce a system that has potential for problems.

(e) It seems that I might be out of step with general thinking regarding the ACTA. As skeet shooter I do not necessarily see them as the enemy - they have been respective to some submissions I have made. Perhaps some of the responsibility rests with us. Submissions should be well thought out, devoid of emotional content and clearly state the intentions and consequences.

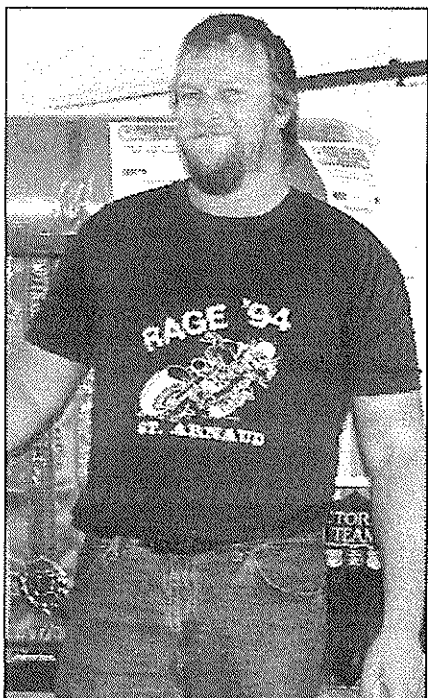

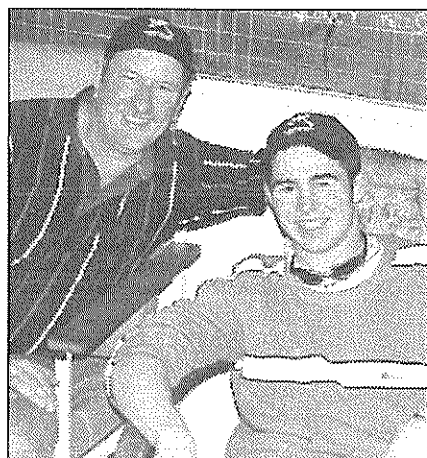

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS NOVEMBER 1999

November! What a glorious month. The last month of spring and the end of sitting around by the heater, yet still not time to blow the dust off the air conditioner. Daylight saving means that you can get up with the sun, without it still being the middle of the night, and that you can go out to the gun club after tea to shoot some practice. I bet it's always November in heaven. When I flip through the calendar and come to November, my mood just automatically picks up, even if I have a dose of the "sads" at the time. Obviously one of the reasons for this, is because November to me means Skeet Nationals time, and that has been one of the high points of my year for a very long time now. That's probably why November holds such a veritable treasure trove of great memories for me.

I remember a November day in 1983 when Eugene Kavanagh recorded the highest losing score ever in the National Skeet, when he missed his 309th target. It was somewhat unfair because it was the last day of the Nationals and it had gotten dark and he just didn't see it. Fortunately we now shoot this prestigious event on the second last day so that the shoot-off can continue the next morning if needed. On the last day we now shoot the National Doubles and it will be a great day for shooting in Australia when the shoot off for that event goes until dark. I'm sure that some of Eugene's disappointment was softened by the fact that although he lost the event, he had broken the National Long Run Record with 366 straight, because he was carrying almost 60 targets from the previous day.

I remember a November day in 1984 when Ian Hale recorded the highest losing score in any Skeet event ever, in this country, when he missed his 460th target. Some of Ian's disappointment was also alleviated by the fact that in the process, due to some qualifying technicalities, he also had broken the National Long Run Record with 487. And any lingering sadness certainly dissipated the next day, when he won the National High Gun with the highest score ever - 399/400. I also remember a November day in 1985 when my good friend and long-time two-man team partner, John Summers, looked me in the eye and told me I had the "tinniest backside" he had ever encountered. This was just after I had gained the dubious distinction of not only becoming the first person ever to win the National Skeet outright without having to shoot off, but had also added insult to injury by doing it without even shooting a perfect score.

I remember a November day in 1986 when I went back to the carpark and burst into tears after missing my 502nd target and thus failing, by a mere 18 targets, in my attempt to break the National Long Run Record for the fourth consecutive year. The great Robert Paxton (World Skeet Champion of 1973 and the originator of Shooting Trivia Questions) was always adamant that there is a Skeet God and maybe he's right. Consider some of the instances cited above, and the fact that the next day I won the National Skeet Championship and the National High Gun, and my mother won \$20 off Ken Lowry, who wasn't even there. Five years earlier, my mother (bless her little heart) was busily bragging to him after my first National Skeet win, without realizing who he actually was. The nett result of which, Ken being the great character we all know him to be, was that he had bet her this "princely sum", on the fact that I would never eclipse his great record of three National Skeet titles.

I could probably go on forever about my memories of November, but I had better try and put some "substance" into this months column. I'm going to start with an appeal to every Skeet shooter in the country, who at this stage is still not planning to come to this year's Skeet Nationals. You're making a big mistake! When you're sitting at home in January, reading in the CTSN about the fabulous time the rest of us had, you'll wish you had it to do over again. So get of your shiny little butt right now, before it's too late, and make your arrangements to come and join us.

This year's Shoot will be the best yet! For a start we are con-

ducting a National Small Gauge Event (the 20 Gauge) for the first time ever. Which means that we now have seven consecutive days of Skeet shooting to enjoy. This is now almost as long as the Trap Nationals or the World Skeet Shoot. Who knows what this may lead to next year? And on top of this we are holding the event, for the first time, at the National Shooting Ground. Numerous benefits of that momentous decision will now start to become glaringly obvious, even to the most pessimistic detractors.

Such as for the first time we will be able to throw "World Standard" targets, and as the Shoot Marshall I can personally guarantee that this will happen. Such a rash promise can only be made possible by the reality of a National Shooting Ground enabling us to commit to the enormous expenditure required to purchase sixteen identical, high quality, self-loading target throwing machines (not counting another nine Trap ones) with more to come. Also a brand new nominations building should nearly be ready. And even if it's not, it certainly will be for next year.

As many of you will be aware from my writings in the CTSN, I have recently been assisting CVRIL in New Zealand in the practical application of expanding their Voice Release product into Skeet Shooting. My efforts in that area are basically completed and I believe that they now have a practical and viable system to market. I am personally very excited about their products and believe that the sooner we standardize such systems for Trap and Skeet shooting in this country, and thereby remove the last major area of potential inequity, the better. I hope to never attend another Major Shoot with the lingering fear that my performance could be materially effected by my luck in whether or not I draw a competent and reliable puller from the roster system.

Therefore I have recommended to both the ACTA and the Pre-Nationals Organizing Committee that they take up CVRIL's offer to supply eight units, free of charge, for use at the Nationals. However, as the Skeet units require a little more competitor adjustment time than the Trap units, their introduction needs to be more cautiously approached. Thus the decision on whether or not to use a Voice Release system at the Skeet Nationals is not as simple as it was with the Trap Nationals. I don't believe it would be fair to deprive the majority of people who have either used it or are eager to use it or will have no problem adapting to it. However I also believe that it would be equally unfair to force the use of it on those people who may be initially uneasy with it. With all this in mind I have suggested that we focus on being customer requirement oriented.

The best way to do this would be to equip all the fields with both a conventional button cord and a phono system and give the shooters the choice. From the Shoot Marshall's perspective I see no practical operating problems with such a system and in order to make it work as smoothly as possible we could simply ask their preference at the squadding window each morning and then squad them accordingly. That way anyone who arrived at the shoot with no knowledge or experience whatsoever with Voice Release equipment, could elect to shoot over the button the first day, whilst watching other people use it and trying it out for themselves on the practice field. Then each other day they could select whichever system they felt most comfortable with by then. However, as with the recent Trap Nationals, I believe that by the first day of the Nationals it will be a moot point, as most of the participants will have already transcended that situation during the Pre-Nationals, where a similar system will be used.

By utilizing such an optional arrangement, everyone's wishes and preferences can be accommodated, without anyone being disadvantaged, and the more complicated introduction of similar technology to that which has solved most of the refereeing problems in Trapshooting, can be smoothly achieved. In addition to that, the inventor of the CVRIL system, Mr Graham Callendar, has confirmed his attendance at the Nationals to



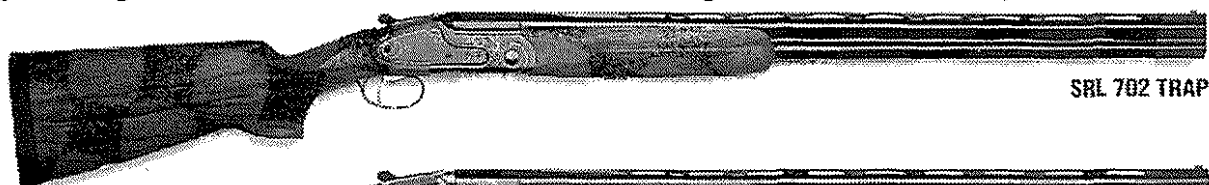

market and promote their products. He will also provide back-up support for the system during the course of the event, in much the same way as they did at the recent Trap Nationals in Roma.

Recently a number of people have contacted me with inquiries as to how the squadding will be done at the Skeet Nationals, obviously with reference to whether or not selective squadding will be available. Rather than wonder about it, I posed the question to Andy Sanders at the ACTA office, who will be the Office Manager at the Nationals. He advised me that a new rule will come into effect next year, basically to the effect that squadding will be done in order of nomination, but with two exceptions. The first is that full squads arranged by the competitors will be accepted, and the second is that management will reserve the right to adjust squadding to meet practical requirements.

However, that's next year, but Andy advised me that, as the current rule which advocates squadding in order of nomination contains the word "may", then he may also do anything else he chooses, and what he will probably choose to do, is implement next year's rule a few weeks early. In this way everyone will be able to attain their own desired squadding method, whether it be selected or random, and the last clause would enable the "phono or button" squadding idea to be achieved within the rules. The squadding arrangements provided by this new rule now seems to pretty much mirror the system that has worked so well in New Zealand for many years.

I have also been receiving an increasing number of requests lately to bring the Skeet Shooters Association out of recess, and thus as the Public Officer I have scheduled the 1999 AGM to be held one night during the Nationals. See the Notice board for details. I have been somewhat hesitant to take this step for quite a while, due to the early friction between the ASSA and the ACTA. However, I have been assured that during the last couple of years before the Association went into recess, and in my absence overseas, constructive co-operation had been achieved between the two bodies.

On that basis I will be inviting the National President of the ACTA, Mr Glenn Woodhatch to be the guest speaker at the meeting and give us his views on how the ASSA can best assist the ACTA in the future. The following is a trial grading system prepared by Executive Member Mr John Byrnes of the Rules Committee.

Clubs are requested to trial this system and send their findings back to the ACTA with their recommendations.

**Averages System
(No Grades)**

Retain the existing system but use % of targets shot only for each bracket of 200 targets.

Average the last 3 groups of 200 targets for the shooters current average.

e.g. The last 5 brackets shot by shooter X are:
89%, 93%, 90%, 96%, 92%.

After 3 brackets 89%, 93%, 90% the average would be 90.66%.

After a further 200 targets shot at 86% the average would become 93% after dropping the 89% and adding on the 96%.

After a further 200 targets shot at 92% the average would become 92.66%. Drop the 93% and replace with the 92%.

At club shoots all shooters would nominate by their average not grade. Divisions would be paid out equally across the number of shooters.

Example.

10 shooters nominate e.g. 99%, 99%, 99%, 96%, 96%, 95%, 94%, 90%, 87%, 86%.

On this example 2 equal divisions could be paid, 99% to 96% for one division and 95% to 86% for the other division.

The next day the shooters who nominate might have the following averages.

99%, 96%, 94%, 94%, 93%, 90%, 88%, 88%, 87%, 86%.

The 2 divisions paid on this day would be 99% to 93% and the other would be 90% to 86%.

This system allows divisions to be adaptable to the standard of the shooters who are present and means that there is not set cut off point between divisions of shooters.

The divisions could be at club discretion or depending on the number of nominations received for the day. All divisions should have an equal number of shooters thus eliminating the grade with only 2 or 3 shooters.

The other change that I believe needs to go hand in hand is the introduction of a rule that states any score more than 8% below a current average should be deleted from the bracket of 200 targets e.g. 2 targets discrepancy in any round.

Psychological Skills for Shooting: Concentration

"I wasn't concentrating...."; "My mind must have been somewhere else...."

Comments like these, and others that indicate that the shooter was not concentrating, are often heard around the traps in an effort for the shooter to make sense of the fact that a target was missed.

Concentration is THE most important skill for both the inner and outer games. According to Gallwey (1979), nothing of excellence is achieved without it. Syer and Connolly (1984), add that concentration is a state of being that all sports people recognise as a prerequisite to good performance and involves an unwavering awareness of a specific subject to the momentary exclusion of other subjects.

Champions American Trap shooter, Phil Kiner (1997) claims that concentration is not a thing that you do but rather, is a result of other things you have done or are doing.

In the September article, I explored the notion of inner and outer games involved in shooting and talked about the interference of the mind by self 1. Concentration is one mental skill that will help quieten the mind. What are the steps in concentration:

Gallwey (1979) sees them as discipline, interest, absorption and oneness. The first step, discipline, is to make an effort to switch your attention from wherever it is and place it where you want it to be. Discipline is the ability to provide a focus for your attention on something specific, here and now, away from the interference of past, future, should, shouldn't, and what might have been. Kiner sees this as staying in the present: you cannot change the past, and the only way you can affect the future, in the manner you wish, is to stay in the present and focus on the project at hand - which is to break THIS target. The second step to concentration is interest. Concentration reaches a deeper level when the mind becomes interested in its focus.

Gallwey, states that interest is easier to establish and maintain if the object of our attention is moving. It is necessary to watch the ball in both golf and tennis; however in tennis the ball is moving and therefore it is easier to attend to. In trap and skeet shooting, the focus of our attention is also moving. Gallwey takes this notion a step further and says in tennis, the player should focus on the seams of the ball not just the ball itself. This heightens the interest level and maintains concentration. In trap and skeet shooting, the focus could be on the spinning, or the ridges or dimples of the target. The next step in concentration is absorption, and involves a deepening of interest to a point where you begin to lose yourself in what you are attending to. When your absorbed in what you are doing, you are hard to distract, the noises at the back of the layout, your opponent ejecting shells towards you, trap breakdowns etc, all mean nothing. In this state we experience an intensified contact with reality, things just seem to happen effortlessly and the targets appear to be as big as dinner plates. The final step is oneness, and involves an optimal state of mind where concentration is relaxed and awareness and perception is heightened, trust in yourself is elevated, there is an absence of self doubt, and there is a strong and undivided will.

Awareness skills increase our ability to focus our minds non-judgementally in the present moment, on details relevant to our purpose. Most shooters are aware at some time or another of their mind not being focused on the target at the time they call for it. If we are thinking about achieving a break of 100 or 200, or thinking about shooting off, the sash, high gun etc, then we are allowing our mind to move into the future. If we concentrate on a target we may have missed, or our performance in the previous event, or the thought that "I don't like right hand swingers from lane five" then we are shooting in the past. Both scenarios limit our ability to remain focussed in the present, and both situations limit our ability to do what we need to do, which is to hit this target.

Whilst concentration skills are important to achieving our best, what can we do on a day to day, competition by competition basis to improve our skills. Firstly, individual shooters need to discover where their attention is really drawn to when they are shooting and why it wants to go there. This is an important step because it will allow you to eventually break from long-held, outdated patterns of thought or behavior. You will need to become closely familiar with parts of your performance which are within your control and distanced from distractions or worries which stem from things that are beyond your control. To change these patterns shooters can:

- Build and practice a stronger pattern.

This can involve adopting rituals that can be used during warm-ups, and by practicing a number of task orientated procedures to use if distractions threaten once the event has started.

- Strengthen the attraction of the object or action on which you want to focus:

For example, looking to see the target spinning, or focussing on the outer edge. etc.

- Deliberately paying attention to the distraction:

This means treating it as if it has a life of its own, giving it space, discovering its needs and eventually making a contract to deal with it later. For example, shooters often complain about counting where they are up to. Kiner argues that counting is not important; acknowledge that you know where you are up to, but do not treat it as a big deal. When you are shooting well, accept and acknowledge the fact and then focus your energy to staying in the present and break the next target by watching it.

- Make friends with the distraction:

Either practice in an environment where the distractions are present, or find a way to view them positively. If you do not like a particular target from a particular lane, hope that you will get that one, then you will be more focused and when you hit it, it will appear a greater achievement.

- Dialogue with the distraction:

Imagine you can talk to the distraction and ask it what message it brings you, what it is that you are ignoring that is important.

- Removing focus from emotional distractions to physical and mental patterns:

The one thing that we all do in the here and now time is breathe. If you need to refocus, by concentrating on you breathing you will return to the here and now.

Concentration is integral to excellence in sport. Whether we are talking about international or Olympic standard, State level or Club participant on a weekend who is trying to win or to just improve. Whilst it is important that you concentrate on each and every target, this does not mean that you have to attend or concentrate for the whole round, on the contrary, you only need to attend to your target when it is your turn to shoot. Rather than concentrating to practice your shooting, we should be shooting to practice our concentration.

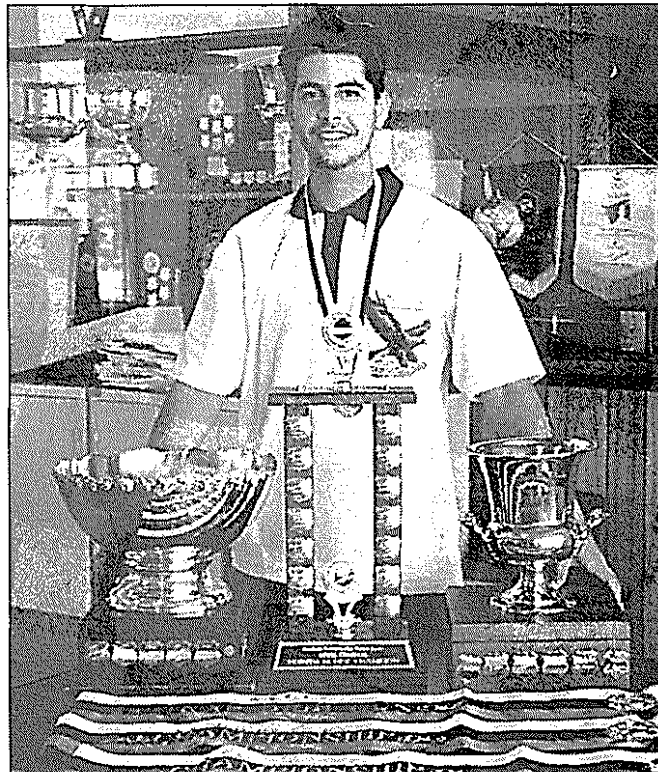

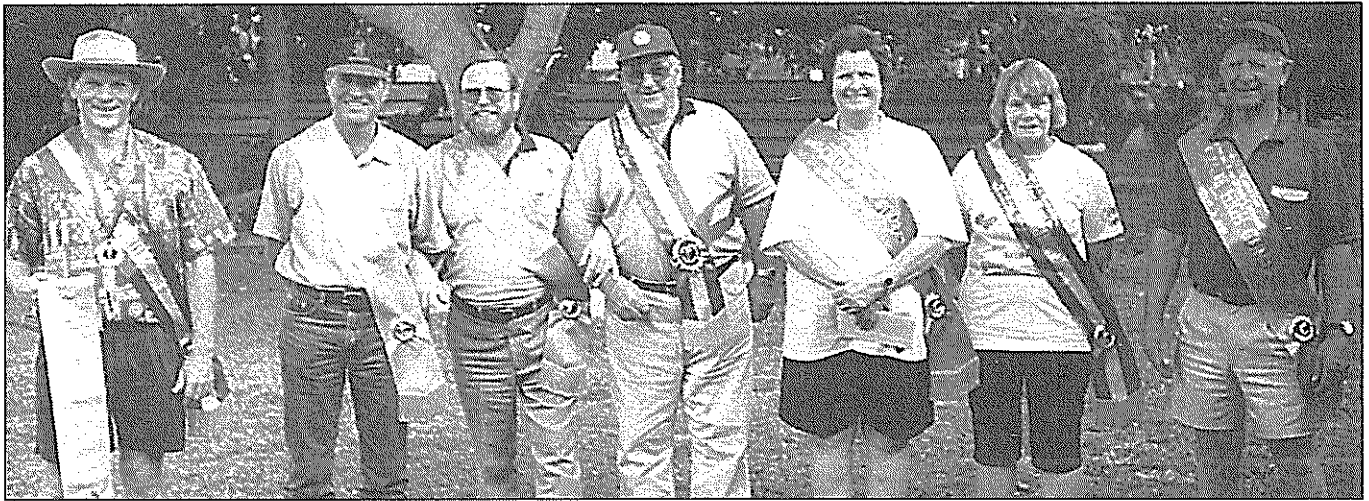

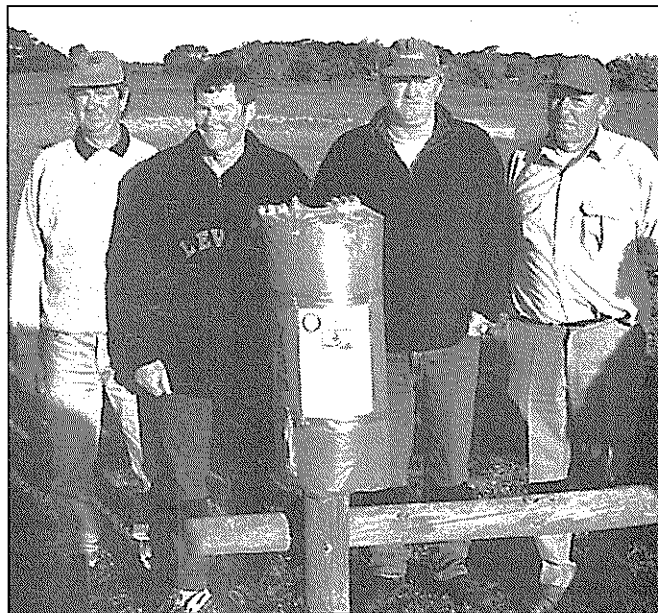

Sydney 2000 Olympic Coin Program

Bronze "Sports" Coin Collection

SHOOTING

The Olympic sport of shooting is featured in the official Sydney 2000 Olympic Coin Collection. This is the first time all sports taking part in an Olympic Games have a coin produced in their honour.

The shimmering bronze coin depicts a highly polished image of a shooting athlete preparing to fire. It is one of 28 bronze coins depicting the sports of the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games.

The International Shooting Union known as the UIT was formed in 1907 with eight member federations. In 1998 the international federation, with 150 members, changed its name to the International Shooting Sport Federation.

Baron Pierre de Coubertin, the founder of the modern Olympics, was a French pistol champion. In 1896, when founding the modern Olympic Games, he included six shooting events on the Olympic Program. Since that time, shooting has been on every Olympic Program other than 1904 in St Luis and 1928 at Amsterdam.

Shooting rules have changed considerably over the years. In 1900 Australia won gold in the live pigeon event, which was on the Olympic Program in Paris for the one and only time. Today's shooters aim at a variety of targets.

Of the 17 shooting events at the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games (6 shotgun, 5 pistol, and 6 rifle), ten are men's events and seven are women's.

The bronze coins are legal tender of Australia, and carry a face value of \$5.00 and the Sydney 2000 signature with rings. The obverse design depicts Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, and carries the year date '2000' and the country of issue 'Australia'. Each coin is issued in a colourful individual credit card type pack inserted in an outer sleeve, which features information about the coin and sport represented.

The Sydney 2000 Olympic Coin Program is the first to commemorate each of the sports of the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games. Priced at \$8.95, the bronze coins are available individually, or as part of the full Sydney 2000 Olympic Bronze 'Sports' Coin Collection.

An official 24-page Collector Album is available to house the collection, at a recommended retail price of \$19.95. The colourful album contains a foreword by the President of the International Olympic Committee, Juan Antonio Samaranch.

It also features facts about each sport and a complete list of current Olympic records and record holders, and the champions of the Atlanta Olympic Games.



In Australia, the coins are available through The Perth Mint, the Royal Australian Mint in Canberra, coin dealers, selected Australia Post Branches, Kmart and The Olympic Stores. Mail orders can be placed by phoning 1300-652-020. A subscription is also available at a recommended retail price of A\$259.15. Subscribers to the bronze 'sports' coin collection receive a free Collector Album, medallion and certificate of ownership, during the course of the program.

THE SYDNEY 2000 OLYMPIC COIN PROGRAM.

The Sydney 2000 Olympic Coin Program is the most significant Australian coin collection ever released for international distribution.

A partnership between the Royal Australian Mint and the Perth Mint, the program is authorised by the Commonwealth Government and conducted under the auspices of the Sydney Organising Committee for the Olympic Games (SOCOG).

Consisting of three series of coins in gold, silver and bronze - the program will be marketed in some 60 countries between October, 1997 and December, 2000.

The total collection of 8 gold, 16 silver and 28 bronze coins is unique in coin history and features numismatic innovations designed to appeal to coin collectors and the wider public alike.

The Tradition of Olympic Coins.

The Ancient Greeks believed that commemorative Olympic coins brought the general public closer to the Olympic Games by giving a souvenir of the event to those who were unable to attend.

The first Olympic coin is thought to have been struck to commemorate the chariot race victory of King Anaxilas of Messina in 480 BC.

Like the Games themselves, the tradition of producing coins to commemorate an Olympic Games has been passed down from the Ancient Greeks.

Modern Olympic Games were not commemorated through the release of coins until 1951, 55 years after Baron Pierre de Coubertin established the first modern Olympic Games in 1896. The first modern Olympic Coin was struck and issued in 1951 by Finland to commemorate the 1952 Helsinki Olympic Games.

More than a decade later, Austria struck and issued an Olympic coin to commemorate the 1964 Innsbruck Winter Olympic Games. In the same year Japan struck and issued two commemorative coins for the Tokyo Olympic Games. With few exceptions, the practice of issuing commemorative coins at Summer and Winter Olympic Games has continued ever since.

Early Olympic coins of the modern era were produced in relatively high quantities and circulated as currency in the issuing country.

More recent Olympic coins have been produced from precious metals - such as gold, silver and platinum - and struck in limited quantities for the collector. In 1972 Germany produced the first series of Olympic Coins specifically for the collector. Proceeds from the sale of the coins were used to help finance the Munich Olympic Games.

Australia did not issue commemorative coins to mark the Melbourne Olympic Games in 1956, but Sydney's "Millennium Games" will boast one of the most exciting Olympic coin programs devised.

It is hoped that with the help of John Glanville & Mackay Toyota, this will become an annual event.

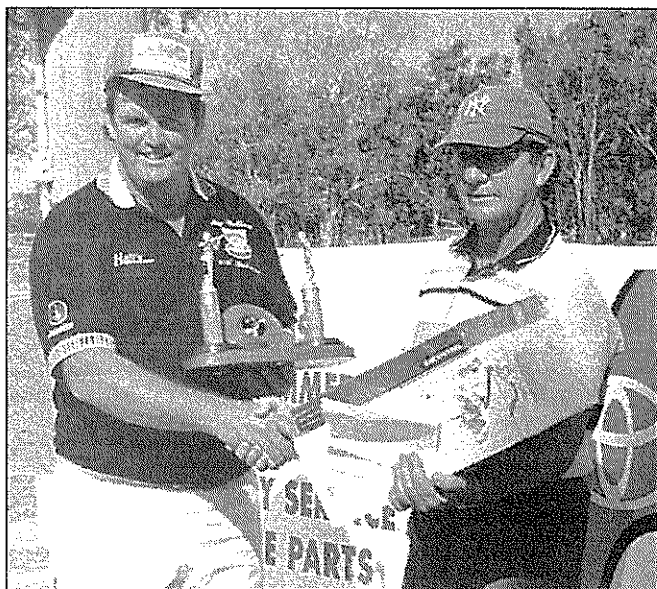

Whitsunday club has a pleasant rural feel, so if you are visiting Mackay in the future please come down on the 3rd Sunday and join us on the tracks.

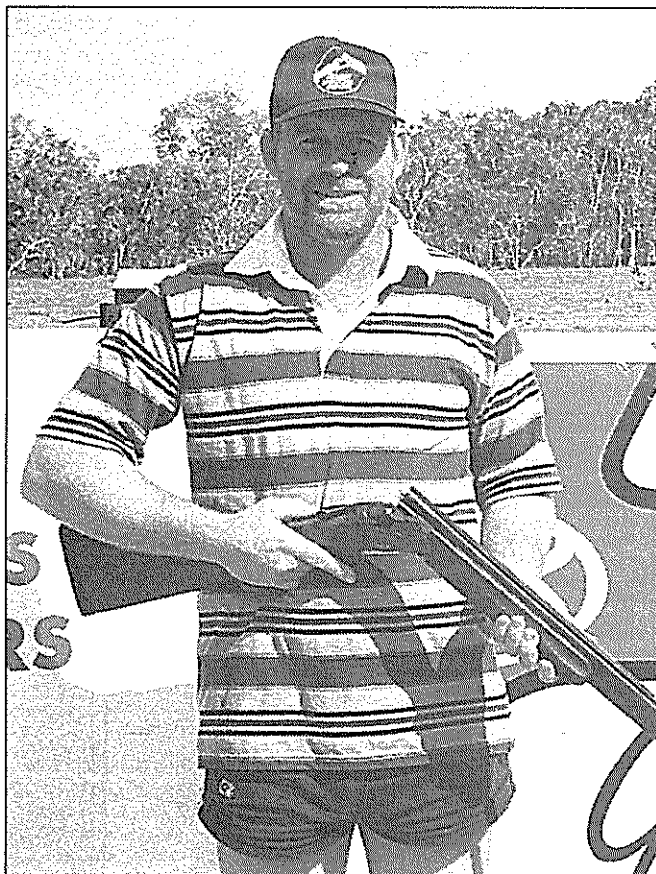

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
