

The office will be officially opened during our 2000 Trap Nationals giving every member the chance of attending the opening of their own building. The proposed date is Tuesday the 11th April.

OVERLOOKED AGAIN.

Recently on television a programme was screened applauding Australia's sportmen and women and showing the many world championships and titles Australians had won during 1999. Surprise, surprise - not one mention of the outstanding results of shooting achieved for the year.

As we win titles we contact all media outlets with the news of our win and infrequently we feature a single column article on page 54 of the sports section. Every now and again there is a good feature article on one of our shooters, but let a small controversial issue arrive, and the writers/editors really want to sensationalise it. Any solution to getting favourable media coverage for shooting would be eagerly accepted by all shooting bodies.

TRUE STORY?

Speaking recently to John OSBORNE, the long time Manager of the Welsh Shooting Team, he detailed the following story to me which he states is true.

At a large shoot in Ireland last year all traps were set for height with the height poles. One particular trap had a considerably shorter pole than the others due to a fire hydrant being situated exactly where the height was taken from. The shoot was well underway when a number of competitors stated that they were dissatisfied with what appeared to be low targets on another trap.

The height stick was called for and the targets consistently passed through the middle. The shoot continued for some time before it was brought to the attention of officials, that possibly height sticks had been mixed up. They stated that this was not possible as they had received no complaints about high targets on the layout with the fire hydrant.

It was then requested that the height stick be measured. The shoot marshal and one of his assistants walked out onto the ground, and whilst one held the height pole up, the other climbed onto his mates shoulder and with the aid of a tape measured the height.

They then walked back to the shooters, where one shooter innocently enquired "Why didn't you just lay the stick on the ground and measure it?"

Without a moment's hesitation the shoot marshal replied, "It's the height you wanted, not the bloody length. There is nothing wrong with it."

After many weeks of hard work following the torrential rain that was experienced for the NSWCTA State Carnival in October the National Shooting Ground was now ready for its first Nationals hosted by the ACTA. And what a picture it looked, with all 8 layouts now fully equipped with Gemini Skeet traps, the new skeet phono-pull system by Canterbury Voice Release in operation, the scene was set for all to have a tremendous week of shooting.

A light shower the night prior to the first day caused a slight heart flutter. However, Mother Nature was kind enough to supply the shooters with a sultry overcast day with a stiff cool breeze in the afternoon thus providing some interesting targets.

The first three days of shooting were taken up with the Pre-Nationals, this year run by the Wagga Gun Club. The first event of the pre-nationals was the National 20g Skeet Championship, introduced by the ACTA this year for the first time. This event is a memorial to John Withers who sadly completed his career early in 1999. The trophy for the John Withers Memorial was kindly donated by his good friends, Karen & Adrian Cousens, and his home club of Terranora Lakes.

A field of 42 shooters hotly contested this event with the overall winner being Adrian Cousens with the only perfect score of 100/100. What a fitting tribute to a close friend and good mate.

The first event for the carnival saw 138 competitors vying for the overall sash and trophy. Bathurst member Glenn Moorby won the Junior section with a score of 93/100. 




All State Skeet Championship overall winners.

150 keen competitors took to the layouts seeking National glory. After the dust had settled only two shooters remained on a perfect 100/100, the golden Col Burt and the up and coming Julian Lucchitti. Out onto the field the two competitors went for what the crowd thought was to be a long tussle but much to everybody's surprise eight targets later it was all over with Col Burt, Tamworth, the 1999 National Skeet Champion with a score of 108/108. Second place going to Julian Lucchitti, Cecil Park, with a score of 107/108 and Geoff Faulkes, WAGC, in third place with a score of 137/138.

ALL AUSTRALIAN TEAM



We look forward to seeing all competitors at the 2000 Skeet Nationals.













Shooting should be to enjoy yourself and no one should be tied

down to see over rules. Most of the rules are changed to catch one or two shooters. If I had my way to do the cards it would be like golf and as you came off in a squad another member of the squad would mark your card and you would mark off another members card and go around the squad changing different cards every event, or something to this effect. In the July edition of the CTSN the National president, Mr. Glenn Woodhatch, announced a competition for the naming of the new National Ground.


After due consideration of all entries by the Executive Committee the final name has been selected.



Event 8: 50 Target State Single Barrel Championship sponsored by Latitude Fisheries (Bert & Julie Boschetti)





The final State Title event for the weekend, shooters were vying for the sash and the Roy Alexander Perpetual Trophy, With no pos-




Ric Vivante, winner Event 8, State Single Barrel.

In one shoot-off there were around nine competitors shooting on the same field, my rule book states no more than six to a squad. The officiating representative from the ACTA (Andy Sanders) also seemed to turn a blind eye to the aforementioned squadding situation.

Another let down in the shoot-offs was that competitors were intimidated or embarrassed to shoot-off for an event that they qualified in regular skeet to shoot-off in doubles on stations 3,4 & 5, which in my opinion is a different discipline.

After speaking with some of the competitors involved in the shoot-offs, it is my belief that they agreed to shoot doubles so that they would not seem to be complaining.

There is no way that up and comers can shoot long breaks in skeet if the above prevails. Also no current break record can be broken. Is this what we are about in the name of saving some targets?

I say we pay to shoot regular skeet, then we shoot-off likewise. This is also the opinion of many others that I have spoken with. I hope that they too will voice their opinions.

In this day and age where communication and information technology are growing so fast it is hard to believe that we still have the dreaded old "Shooters Card".

Not only are these cards very time consuming and cumbersome to complete they are open to unauthorized changes.

What we need is a system that has a central data base, located at Wagga Wagga, for every shooter that is registered with the ACTA. To gain access to the data base and the shooters details, each shooter is issued with a plastic card i.e. similar to the card you use to access you bank a/c with. Shooting scores are entered via a remote terminal at the club where the shoot is being held.

There is no need to send out new books as the card should be useable as long as the shooter remains registered with the ACTA or until it becomes damaged. This system may incur a large initial cost to start with but there may be an overall saving in the long run. It may even enable shooters to compete against each other at different shoots.

The length of what you can go to is endless and limited only by budget.

However the system we have at present is outdated and requires change.

I believe this change to be a detrimental step, which would leave all the older Veterans in a non-competitive section against shooters of 65 years. A good example would be the 1999 National Skeet. The O/A High Gun winner would be in the Veterans Class for the Year 2000.

I have spoken to dozens of shooters of all ages at the '99 Skeet Nationals' and received unanimous agreement that the age should be left at 65.

I urge all shooters who agree to write to the ACTA now.

Psychological Skills for Shooting: Relaxation

Being the start of a new year, it may be opportune time to look back at last year and see if the goals we set were met. If they were, then where do you go from here; what goals need to be set for this year that will help you accomplish your five year or life time plan. If this years goals were not met then now is the time to evaluate: are the goals appropriate, achievable and worthwhile. A review of the goal setting article in the October magazine may be a necessary exercise. Ask yourself, how will what I aim to achieve this month or this year help me achieve my life time goals.

As I write this article, I am recovering from a serious attack of Ross River Fever which caused my withdrawal from the State Carnival and other shoots that I had been planning to attend. As a result, it is timely to examine the skill of relaxation together with goals setting: as these, according to Winter & Martin (1988) are essential techniques required to assist athletes deal with stressors including injuries.

When dealing with injuries it may be necessary to set realistic and achievable goals for the rehabilitation program. This is important because it puts you in control of your progress rather than you feeling overwhelmed by the injury or worse still identifying with injury or condition.

In the December article, I concluded with the Nideffer centering technique as a way of improving concentration and staying in the here and now. This technique when learnt and generalised to a variety of situations can provide you with a quick and effective technique for calming both the body and the mind. Centering is a relaxation and concentration skill that can be used by athletes, reducing their arousal level and assisting their focus of attention on the task at hand.

Syer & Connolly (1984) sees relaxation as temporary and deliberate withdrawal from activity, which if correctly timed, allows you to recharge and make full use of your physical, mental and emotional energy. Relaxation is characterised by an absence of activity and tension: a period of stillness when you let go of sense of need. Relaxation and its opposite, tension should be viewed as positions on the same continuum.

Relaxation.....Tension
(non-arousal).....(arousal).....(over arousal)

Each athlete must find the position in the continuum that is right for them. Different sports have different arousal requirements; archery requires calm whereas weightlifting may require the individual to be worked-up, rifle shooting will need calm as opposed to trap or skeet shooting which requires a mild level of arousal and tension.

Relaxation training is a skill and probably the most widely used application of psychology in sport. Winter & Martin (1988) suggest that there are four areas in which athletes can benefit from relaxation techniques. These are: stress management, physiological benefits, self regulation and relaxation as the basis for mental rehearsal.

Stressors, that are likely to affect shooters are the demand or desire to "get up" for the game, injuries, relationship problems and problems related to retirement or adjusting to life without sport. Some stress management techniques such as drugs, alcohol, over eating, etc will provide short term release of the symptoms but will not provide a solution or will have serious long term affects. Physiological benefits from relaxation are a decrease in the consumption of oxygen, rate of perspiration, heart rate and metabolism. Relaxation training helps the athlete increase body awareness and provides techniques for controlling over arousal before and during competitions. Finally, relaxation techniques can help quieten the mind and make it less susceptible to distractions.

Syer & Connolly (1984) see learning to relax for athletes will vary from individual to individuals and from occasion to occasion.

Learn to relax and withdraw completely.

- (a) to acquire a point of reference, a recognition of your own zero arousal level
- (b) to increase awareness of your own physical, mental and emotional resources and how best to use them.

(c) to gain a detached impression of your environment.

(d) to simply experience a positive pleasurable and beneficial state of being that allows regeneration of body mind and emotions.

Learn to relax momentarily

(a) to reduce over-arousal to a manageable and productive level, during and immediately before competition.

(b) to become aware of your kinesthetic sense.

(c) return to your point of balance.

If you train yourself to relax momentarily and to withdraw at appropriate moments before or during competition, you will find your awareness and speed of reaction to be greatly increased when you focus in your performance again.

There are numerous self-help books that describe or outline relaxation techniques. The technique that you choose for yourself must be something you enjoy and feel comfortable with. The following are some examples of relaxation techniques that shooters may find useful.

1. Progressive muscle relaxation (Winter & Martin, 1988) This approach was developed in the 1930's and involves learning relaxation by systematic tensing and then relaxing various muscle groups within the body. The theory behind the tensing of the muscles is that an overexaggeration leads to a more pronounced relaxation of these muscles and this helps the individual to more easily recognise the feeling of relaxation in a particular muscle group.

2. Scripted relaxation techniques. These techniques involve listening to or reading a script that has been designed to focus awareness on particular parts of your body.

MENTAL SKILLS TRAINING WORKSHOP

The purpose of this workshop is to teach specific exercises of visualisation, concentration, relaxation, goal setting and mental rehearsal. The workshop will have a practical focus and participants will receive a comprehensive booklet of activities to practice and use.

If you are unable to attend the pre-nationals individual sessions can be arranged during the Nationals or other workshops can be organised. Please let me know your needs.

3. Visualisation and/or imagery are often used in conjunction with relaxation. Syer & Connolly (1984) use an example where the athlete imagines themselves in a shed filled with a beautiful, coloured liquid and that there are taps on their fingers and toes and that as the liquid in draining relaxation suggestions are given. Gallwey (1979) gets the golfer to imagine he is floating upon a lake and as the water calms so does he. The use of scripts in relaxation provides a visual focus in our effort to withdraw from our world.

4. Hypnosis and self-hypnosis also provide effective means of relaxing and dealing with stress, injuries and lapses in concentration. Nideffer (1992) sees self hypnosis as a technique that allows you to become more totally immersed in your feelings and thoughts because there is a greater breakdown in the normal shifting of attention from an external to an internal focus.

article will take relaxation one step further when I examine the mental training skill: visualisation.



CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS JANUARY 2000

Well the new millennium is now upon us and I hope that as you read this, the remote control for your TV still works and your car engine still starts and that the end of the world is not at hand. I'm going out shortly to see if the triggers on my gun still work and if so whether it's when I pull them or when I release them. Provided they're operating OK, Karen, Rod and I are off to Albury for their Two Day Skeet Shoot on the 22nd and 23rd and then on to Toowoomba for their Two Day Skeet Shoot the following week-end. We hope to see many of you at one or other of those venues.

The Skeet Nationals are over for another year and what a great week it was. The Pre-Nationals were "too much fun", particularly the 20 gauge event on Monday, which was well attended and greatly enjoyed. Thanks again to the many sponsors. George Sckaf of G & N Gun Supplies, Doug Moorby of Bathurst Woodturning, Peter and Joanne Vella of Earmould Sydney and John Guberina of G-Brothers Mercedes Benz. Thanks also to David Coleman, without whose help and support all week, I would not have survived.

Time was of the essence on Wednesday night, as we had to finalize the High Guns and then clean up and stock-take in readiness to hand over to the ACTA. However finishing early on Monday and Tuesday allowed us the luxury of inventing and playing a new skeet game: Skeet Deauville Doubles. The rules are simple. Substitute station 3 for lanes 1 and 2, and station 5 for lanes 4 and 5. Then line up "Indian file" and shoot in turn on each station, which allows more than two teams per squad on a layout, perhaps as many as half a dozen. After that it's pretty much the same as Trap Deauville Doubles. We found that 20 pairs made for a good event but we scored by target rather than by pair.

Shoot-offs were conducted by qualifying rules for a while and then to single barrel and finally by moving to station 4 where each team member had to have one foot on the station. Grading and handicapping was covered by allowing a maximum of only one AA shooter per team. It turned out to be a very popular event with everyone out on the verandah each night watching the shoot-offs. The only disappointment was sustained by the famous Queensland shooting team of Chelepy and Darr, who were relegated to the runner-up spot on both evenings by some old grey haired bloke and an unidentified lady shooting a 20 gauge. Better luck next year boys!



And speaking of the famous Laurie Chelepy, check out the accompanying photo. During the Pre-Nationals I re-encountered an old problem with the low house window on field number five. Somehow or other, when the house was being built, the window opening was put in half a brick too low. The nett result of which is that when the wind blows from the west, the low target can't be elevated high enough. Laurie saw me puzzling over this dilemma and said "stand back and I'll show you how we fix these problems in North Queensland". Ten minutes later I could have set a good

target in a westerly cyclone. Ingenious little chaps, these banana benders!

I am very pleased to report that CVRIL's new skeet phono-pulls were a resounding success. As advertised in the CTSN, shooting over their voice release equipment was optional and shooters had the choice each morning, when squadding up, of nominating to shoot on either a squad with phonos, or a squad that used the conventional button release. Over the course of the week I only saw a button cord rolled out on two occasions. If you do the arithmetic on that, you will come up with a usage rate well in excess of 99%. It's obvious that phonos are now here to stay in skeet as well as in trap.

The only problem we had all week was the late finish on Thursday, the first day of the Nationals. Even starting at 7.45am, by the time we photograph all the state teams and then conduct the shoulder to shoulder team shoot in up to four different divisions, and then conduct the opening ceremony, it is almost impossible to get the day's event underway before 11 o'clock. This inevitably leads to finishing the qualifying late and finalizing the shoot-offs even later.

Darkness is not the issue, courtesy of daylight saving, however looking into the sun becomes a problem on stations 1 and 8 anytime after about 4.00pm. Provided you finish the qualifying prior to this time, as we were easily able to do on every other day, it's not a major problem. With everyone concerned shooting at the same time you can simply restructure the shoot-off procedure to avoid these stations, such as doubles at 3 4 & 5 or any other equitable format that both the competitors and shoot management are able to agree upon.

However when qualifying is not completed by 4.00pm, such solutions are not available and then unfortunately a situation of serious inequity is unavoidable. I had a first hand experience of this on the Thursday when my squad was one of the last to shoot and we were on the field right at the height of the problem. Although Billy and I were able to draw upon our vast experience and "trick shoot" the targets, it was very nerve wracking and our success was attributable almost as much to good luck as it was to good management.

Unfortunately many of the lower grade shooters were not able to adapt to the unfamiliar and difficult conditions quite as well and I know that many of their scores suffered accordingly. My wife was an excellent illustration. She had shot particularly well in the first bracket and told me she was very confident of continuing that form in the afternoon. However, hitting only one out of six high ones in the second bracket put a bit of a damper on that plan and took most of the fun out of her day.

That evening I discussed the problem at great length with Andy Sanders, who was both the Tournament Director and the Office Manager and we have committed ourselves to finding a solution before next year. Both the Shoulder to Shoulder Team Shoot and the Opening Ceremony are fundamentally important parts of the Carnival and neither can be eliminated. However there must be some way that the Program can be restructured to incorporate all the current features whilst solving the above problem. If you have any ideas along this line, please contact either Andy or myself to discuss them. We would be most appreciative of any fresh input.

As I mentioned in my November column, the Australian Skeet Shooters Association has been in recess for several years. This is a great pity because I'm sure such an entity could do much good work in the areas of advising the ACTA on skeet related matters and of promoting skeet shooting in general. With that in mind we held a meeting during the Nationals to discuss the resurrection of the Association. The meeting was open to all and sundry and included current life members, past annual members and numerous interested visitors. After lengthy discussion regarding the history and past activities of the Association, as well as its potential future activities, a motion was resoundingly passed to curtail the recess. Glenn Woodhatch had been invited to be the guest speaker, but as he had other commitments, his apology was tendered. Andy Sanders kindly filled in and assured everyone that he saw no reason why the two bodies could not work in harmony.

An election of office bearers for the year 2000 was then held. The

result of which was that I am the president for the coming year and the other office-bearers are as follows. Senior Vice President: Max Barton. Junior Vice President: Glenn Clarke. Secretary: Jenny Burt. Assistant Secretary/Treasurer: Karen Cousens. Following this a number of general business items were discussed at length and eventually a number of motions were passed to direct the activities of the committee during the year. These included the establishment of a web site to promote skeet shooting, and investigating the possibility of running a demonstration shoot to trial pre-squadding and scheduled flight rotations.

Another major item on the agenda, which created plenty of discussion and was passed unanimously, was the need to work out the best way to align our skeet rules with NNSA rules and to assist and advise the ACTA in the implementation thereof. This task is not as easy as it might seem. Although we need to remove any practical dissimilarities between our local rules and the world standard, there are a number of technical items in the NNSA rule-book which would be either impractical or undesirable if legislated into Skeet in Australia at this time. I can see a lot of midnight oil being burnt before we get the balance on that one just right.

Membership fees and finances were discussed and although the association unfortunately lost most of its funds in the Pyramid collapse, it was decided to validate all existing \$100 life memberships and set the annual fees for next year at \$5. All previous life members are requested to contact the treasurer to reaffirm their details by writing to 36 Moroney St Bairnsdale or by phoning 0351-531079. Any prospective new members are invited to apply using the same contact methods.

Continuing on from my article on clay target hardness last month, I spoke to Kevin Tunney at Olympic Targets last week and he tells me that they have taken the matter of more reliable breakability even further than originally planned. Not only have they been experimenting with composition changes, but they have also redesigned the shape to incorporate a thinner more fragile dome along with built-in fracture lines. He tells me that the combination of these changes should return us to the point where one or two pellets will consistently break the target and any sort of good hit will smoke it up. I am waiting with bated breath for a test batch to arrive and will keep you posted on the results.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts and maximum fine of \$5,500.







Australian-Pacific "Grand Prix" 2000

After 5 years during which it has become established as the premier International Olympic Discipline clay target shooting competition in Australia, the 2000 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" is set to break all the records it has already set when the competition is again conducted at Brisbane Gun Club between 11th and 18th March this year.

During the 5 years the "Grand Prix" has been conducted, the competition has attracted shooters from no less than 20 nations including New Zealand, New Caledonia, Japan, Hong Kong, Thailand, Singapore, Malaysia, England, Northern Ireland, Czech Republic, Canada, United States of America and many more.

The list of world class shooters who have attended the "Grand Prix" is extensive. Not only have our own Olympic and World Champions been attendees, but also many other shooters with credentials as World Record holders and World Cup winners have been competitors at the "Grand Prix". Only last year, a 6-person charity competition organised to support Brisbane's St Andrews Hospital included no less than 2 Olympic Champions, 3 former World Champions and a World Cup winner. Probably one of the best squads of Double Trap shooters ever to be on the tracks together.

The quality of shooter in attendance from overseas at the "Grand Prix" has not been limited to the trap and double trap events. In 1999, Todd Graves from the U.S., along with fellow team members, gave an awesome display of skeet shooting, which was 'as good as it gets'. Although recognised as a specialist skeet shooter, Todd Graves is the only shooter ever to win World Cup events in all three events - trap, skeet and double trap. For many of our own less proficient shooters the chance to shoot along side shooters of Todd's quality is a once in a lifetime opportunity and one that can only be had the Brisbane competition.

While many of competitors to visit from overseas have been amongst the world's best, many have been amongst the ranks of 'everyday' club shooters. Many B and C Grade competitors have shot at the "Grand Prix" and taken home grade medals which have been the most important award they have ever received.

The objective of the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" has always been to offer all shooters the opportunity to compete together regardless of their level of proficiency. This objective has always been foremost in the minds of the organising committee and the 2000 "Grand Prix" will be no different. In spite of the anticipated influx of international visitors, the organisers have already received many nominations from shooters who are not members of national teams, but who want to compete at the "Grand Prix" because of the atmosphere and opportunity to compete with many of the world's best shooters.

The 2000 "Grand Prix" will be held approximately 1-month later than normal to allow shooters from overseas to compete in Brisbane prior to attending the World Cup competition at the new Olympic site at Cecil Park, in Sydney.

Already, nominations and expressions of interest for the 2000 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" have been received from throughout Australia and from New Zealand, United States of America, Canada, Sweden, Czech Republic, Japan, Singapore, Malaysia, England and more.

As usual, all events at the "Grand Prix" will be graded and have sections for open, women, junior and veteran competitors. Three events will be conducted in each of the Olympic Trap, Skeet and Double Trap disciplines. The very successful 'Skins Badge Match' will be conducted as the lead in event before the "Grand Prix" which will be followed by the Kernen Australian Open events.

Competitors wishing to enter the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" competitions should register their early nomination as starting positions for the 2000 tournament will certainly be restricted. Entries are strictly by mail and close with the organising committee on 29th February.



Cherry Tree Pool Field Championships and the Elusive Winchester Gun

When the Katanning Clay Target Club held its first Open Championship Weekend in 1951, the visitors were entertained on the Sunday at a picnic on the property of Mr & Mrs Con Kowland at Cherry Tree Pool. The field shoot is still held there annually under the hospitality of Mr & Mrs Greg Kowland (Con's son).

The Picnic shoots were held in 1952, 53 and 54 and the Championship was started in 1955 at the suggestion of Mr Ernest Clegg, later a Life Member of the Club.

The Cherry Tree Pool Field Championship is the "Father" of all the field events now held in Australia. By 1960 the event was popular and had captured the imagination of shooters from all parts of Australia, that Mr Graham Bailey, owner of a Gun Store in Perth offered a Browning Auto Shotgun as the prize for the possible shot at the event.

This arrangement continued until 1975, when Mr Bailey and Winchester Australia jointly sponsored the gun for the possible. When Mr Bailey ceased business, the Winchester Company continued the sponsoring. The sponsored gun changed from a Browning Auto to a magnificent Winchester Presentation Skeet Gun, which has been on offer every year since, and this year 1999, was won by Mr Peter Muntz, who achieved the elusive possible.

Over the years, 45 of them, so many fine field shots have tried, but failed to shoot a possible. The layout has never been easy, particularly years ago, and has seen many changes. The first Championship in 1955 consisted of 24 targets and had progressed to the present layout of 70 targets from 10 stations, shot in two rounds of 35 targets.

Newton Thomas, who did much to publicize this event in the early years, coined the phrase "The 3 times winners Club" and the club consists at the present of Danny Holtfreter, (3) J Newton Thomas (3), Tim Catling (8), Bevan (Tex) Nicholls (3) and Max Cubic (5), and of all of these Tex Nicholls has come the closest to the possible with 55/56 shot in 1977. Several 1/2 possibles have been recorded, but until this year no-one has been able to put them all together. Peter Muntz, however has now done just that and in fine style, surviving the long wait between rounds, which is some 4 hours, and shooting through the layout the second time to record this historic score.

It has taken a long time to happen, but now it has, it will happen again and probably not so long for the next time. A little of the mystic has gone from Cherry Tree, but we all congratulate Peter on his fine effort, it was one hell of a score of 70/70.

TECHNOLOGY

Shooting Technology roles are shortly to be addressed

- Olympic and Paralympic Games roles will be announced shortly after the conclusion of the ISSF World Cup.

Functional Area Positions at SISC

We will shortly be advising applicants for whom roles have not been identified within sport that positions may be available at Sydney International Shooting Centre, in areas such as Spectator Services if they wish for us to forward their application details to these Functional Areas.

It is very encouraging to know that there are so many people willing to give their time and expertise - often at considerable personal expense - to help deliver the shooting competition at the ISSF World Cup, Olympic and Paralympic Games. Regrettably we were unable to provide a World Cup role for every person who applied.

Technology

It takes a large effort to make the Olympic Games a success. Part of our success will be through the use of technology. Apart from the 15000 telephone lines, 12000 radios, 6000 PC's and 11000 televisions that will be required, there is one piece of technology that is absolutely vital to shooting - Electronic Targets and Results Systems.

The use of electronic targetry makes shooting the most technologically advanced and complex of all the sports in the Olympic Games. This is a great plus for our sport because we can present our results to the world, via TV, Internet and the INFO 2000 system, faster than any other sport.

Having the technology is one thing - but we need people to operate it. This is where we will be relying heavily on technology volunteers, as they will be an integral part of the success of the Games.

Technology volunteers who are yet to be identified will be working in areas such as Results Compilation, Results Print Distribution, IT Help Desk, Venue Technology Operations plus various other areas.

It will be an exhausting and rewarding experience, working as part of a professional and energetic team and taking part in the worlds most important sporting event, The Olympic Games.

Spectator Services

Who are we and what do we do?

Spectator Services mission is to be proactive and friendly hosts to spectators by providing information and assistance to encourage a safe and enjoyable Olympic and Paralympic Games's experience.

We will be relying on the commitment and enthusiasm of volunteers to succeed in this enormous task. We will have one of the largest volunteer teams at the Olympic and Paralympic Games with more than one hundred people working at the SISC, and nearly ten thousand across the whole of the Olympic Games.

The function that these volunteers will perform will range from managing pedestrian flows, ticket taking, ushering and spectator marshalling to provide information through information booths. They will also be responsible for maintaining all of the accreditation zones at the venue through access monitoring.

Spectator Services will be the people who will be standing at the operations gates, directing athletes and officials to the right places back of house and will be the people to approach for information about transport, break areas and location of other operational area within the venue. You will also see them in the stands directing the crowd and controlling excessive noise.

Volunteer Games time training

Volunteers will be required to attend training to ensure they have the necessary skills and information to handle their roles effectively. Depending on the role, training will consist of a minimum of three half day sessions. Volunteers will be prepared for their role through the following three part training courses.

ORIENTATION TRAINING - covers the spirit of the Olympic and Paralympic Games, customer service, codes of conduct and expectations of volunteers.

VENUE TRAINING - covers the layout, functions performed and policies and procedures including health, safety and emergency procedures for the venue. This occurs just prior to the commencement of competition.

JOB-SPECIFIC TRAINING - covers specific duties and procedures for each role. This will occur both prior to and during the Games. Training will be conducted in the interstate cities of Melbourne, Adelaide, Brisbane and Canberra. More information will follow as soon as Games time roles have been announced.

ISCD Report...

The Oceania Shooting Championships was the last Qualifying competition for the October 2000 Paralympic Games. 40 countries will shortly be invited by the International Shooting Committee for the Disabled to send 150 athletes to the Paralympic Games in October 2000.

October 18 this year was the one year countdown to the Opening Ceremony of the Sydney 2000 Paralympic Games.

The Seven Network has announced that it will be the official Australian Broadcaster of the Sydney 2000 Paralympic Games. Seven will broadcast 13 hours of the Games on free-to-air television as well as another 13 hours on its pay TV channel, C7. This marks the first time the Paralympic Games have been on free to air commercial television. ABC had the domestic rights for the last two Paralympic Games.

Did you know...

Australia will be the fourth country to host a Paralympic Torch Relay, just as Australia was the fourth country to host a Torch Relay for the Olympic Games at the 1956 Melbourne Olympic Games. The Paralympic Flame will be created in a traditional fire lighting ceremony at the forecourt of Parliament House, Canberra by members of the Ngunnawal community, the original inhabitants of the Canberra area.

The language at SOCOG...

What does it mean.....

Being involved with SOCOG, you will often hear different words, phrases and terms being used to describe varying facets that make up the Olympic competition. Acronyms, codes and phrases are used generically for all sports within SOCOG and have become common language. To help you gain an understanding and to assist in the pre training for all Test Event and Games Time Staff here are just a few particular to us to get started.

Acronym & Meaning

SOCOG	Sydney Organising Committee for the Olympic Games.
SPOC	Sydney Paralympic Organising Committee.
ISSF	International Shooting Sport Federation - the governing organisation and control for the Olympic sport of shooting.
ISCD	International Shooting Committee for the Disabled - the governing organisation and control for the Paralympic sport of shooting.
SISC	Sydney International Shooting Centre - the official Olympic Games and Paralympic Game's venue.
ITO	International Technical Official - appointed by the ISSF including Jury of Appeal, Classification Jury, discipline Jury members & ISSF medical officers.
NTO	National Technical Official - appointed by SOCOG Shooting competition management.
FA	Functional Area - are program areas within SOCOG/SPOC that provide functions or activities that are required in the management of the Games and Test Event.
FoP	Field of Play - the area used for the sporting competition plus immediate & surrounding support areas at which boundary separates the attendant spectators.

FoH Front of House - is the area within a venue accessible to ticketed spectators. That is, food and beverage, toilets, spectator stands, merchandise.

BoH Back of House - the areas within a venue that are not accessible to spectators, where all operational and "behind the scenes" activities occur, including competition offices, Olympic Family lounges, athletes, officials and staff designated areas.

In brief...

More events for women

Sydney 2000 Olympic Games is bigger than Atlanta and any previous Olympic Games in terms of more women's events and number of days of competition.

There are 118 women's events in the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games compared to 97 in Atlanta, this is an increase of 21 events for women including the Sydney 2000 event of Women's Skeet and Trap events.

Women now compete in all but three sports on the Olympic program - boxing, baseball and wrestling - but at the same time exclusively compete in softball, and the disciplines of rhythmic gymnastics and synchronised swimming.

How can I book travel to and accommodation in Sydney for the Olympic Games?

SOCOG recommends that you do not book travel and accommodation until you receive confirmation that you have secured tickets. However, Ansett has an Olympic Hotline 131355. Ansett will take registrations of interest and booking requirement details and will get back to callers within one week with a special Olympic Booking reference number.


