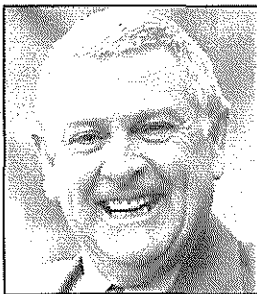

SHOTGUN SHOOTING FOR THE DISABLED INAUGURAL NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Earlier this year a demonstration event in Clay Target shooting for disabled was held at Melbourne Gun Club. Three disabilities were represented - amputee, stroke and spinal cord injured. Even though numbers were small, such was the interest generated by the event that the inaugural Australian National Championships for Clay Target shooting for the disabled are now planned for Brisbane, Queensland, to be held from 11 to 14 April, 2000. The events will include Olympic Trap, Down the Line and some Points events.

The Clay Target events will be held at the same venue and at the same time as the Australian Nationals for Pistol and Rifle shooting for the disabled.

STATE HANDICAP

There were ten possibles in the Handicap, from the entry of 197, ranging from 11 to 22 metre. The V.C.T.A. again offered \$1000 in added money, divided equally from 1st to 10th place, in addition to the usual prize money, so competition was very keen.

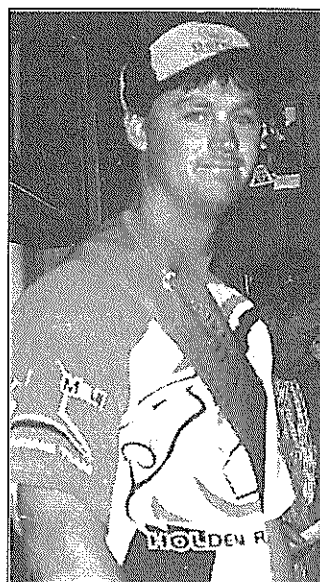

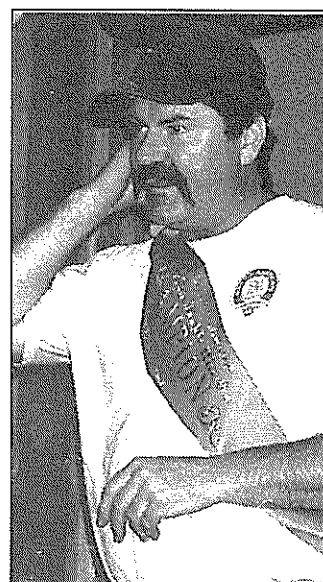

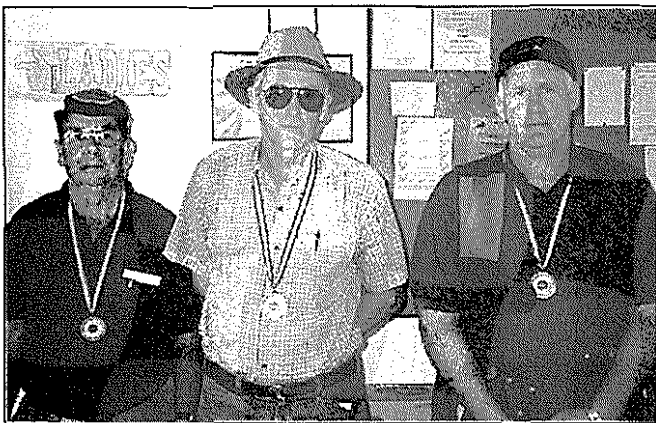
Australian sporting clays champion Peter Tobin with David Colman.

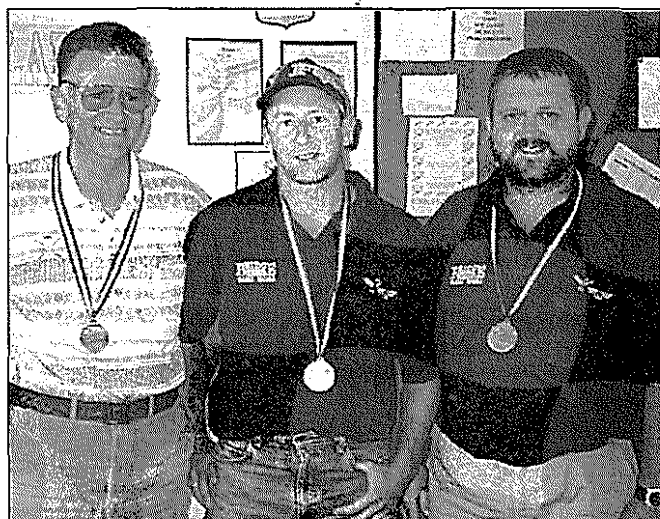

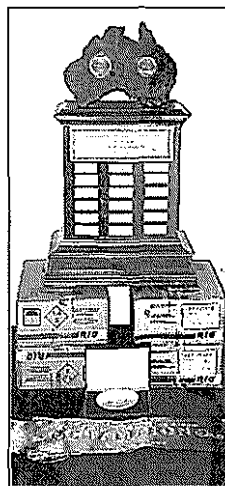
Michael Reed from Wagga Field & Game with a score of 128/150.

Now, your call directly releases the target. There is no more reliance on a good puller to give you consistent targets. Imagine it - no more 'fast' or 'slow' targets. You are **TOTALLY** in control of the target release. It doesn't matter any more who you get on the scorer's seat, as they no longer have to "pull" the target for you.

This system **REALLY** works. Have you shot at the new National Range in Wagga Wagga, or attended the NSW or Vic State Champs, or the National Skeet Champs, or went to Wales and shot at the World DTL Champs, or maybe travelled to the US and shot at the Iowa or Illinois State Champs (36 traps in a row operating at these venues)? Then you will have experienced this system for yourself.

All very well for the big clubs - sure, but the advantages for small clubs are just as significant! It has the same delay as a manual pull and fits to any trap machine on the market. Fully self-contained with it's own transformer, it runs off mains power (or a 12v option is available if required) and simply connects through the release socket on the trap machine. 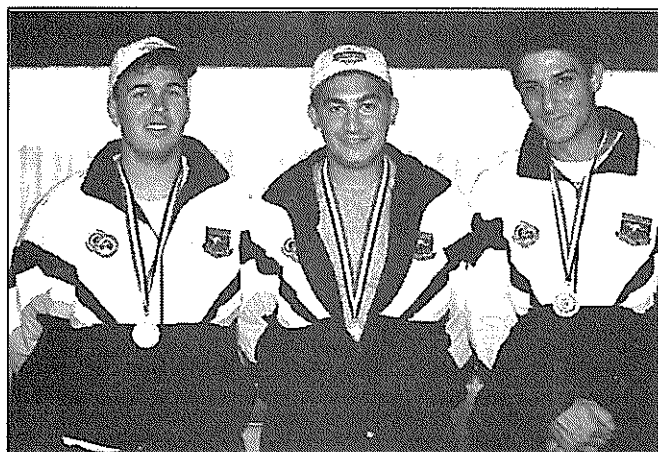

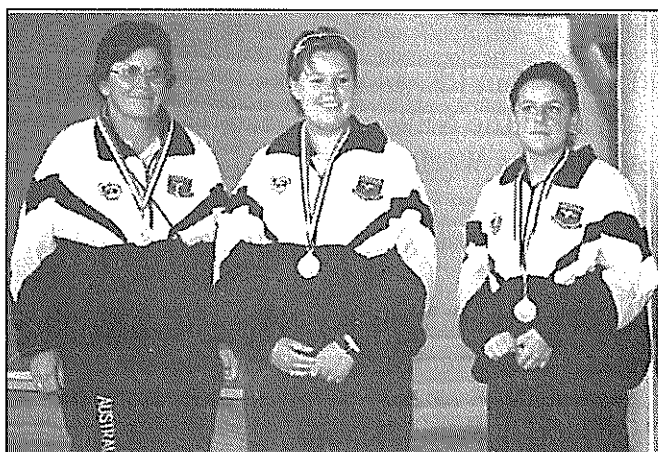

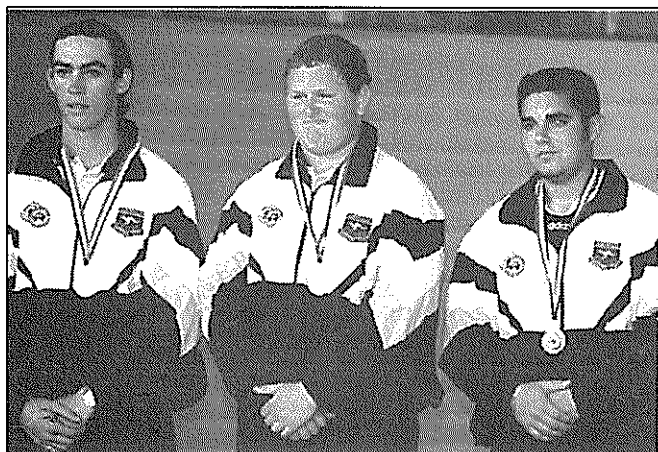

The Teams began to assemble on the 4th November with the A Team (ISSF) stopping at the Rydges Hotel and some of the B Team, Juniors (ISSF), and the Standard Trap and Skeet shooters stayed at Hunts Motel at Liverpool leaving the rest of the Team staying at the homes of friends/relatives etc, around Sydney.

The venue of the shooting was at the Cecil Park Clay Target Club Range, the home of the forthcoming Olympic Games.

There has been a huge amount of money spent at Cecil Park on the main Pistol and Rifle ranges, but sadly not much has been spent in comparison on the Clay Target Range. What has been spent is just that necessary for running an Olympic Event only. 3 super-imposed Trap/Skeet layouts fitted with brand new Mattarelli equipment and it will have electronic score boards that hopefully will be left there after the Games are over.

The grounds were not completely ready for the holding of such a major shoot as the Oceania Games as a lot of things that we have come to expect to be at shooting ranges from this caliber simply were not there. For example shelters from the sun and rain for shooters and Officials, tables and chairs for referees/scorers, gun racks, shaded seating areas for spectators and following squads of

shooters and numerous other things that go to make a successful shoot.

The administration office at the range was not nearly big enough to accommodate the necessary people to run such a shoot. The presentation facilities were inadequate with no PA system, a portable cassette player, no tables on which to place the trophies for presentation and inadequate flag poles to raise the winning

countries flags. This all came about because the area that had been designated for presentations was at the main building (some 300 metre away) on the Pistol "Finals Range". Given the use of this range it was nigh on impossible to arrange presentations for Clay Target in between there other events. It would mean our shooters would have to sit around for hours waiting for a time when this area would be free and losing the prestige that these awards should mean. The organisers did as well as could be expected with the facilities that were otherwise available to them.

The catering service provided by the Oceania Committee was nothing more than what I would call 'Chuck Wagons' that would go around to factories delivering 'smokos and lunches'. The quality of the food left a lot to be desired and the prices were exorbitant. I believe the Local Board of Health closed them down not once, but twice, during the Oceania Games.

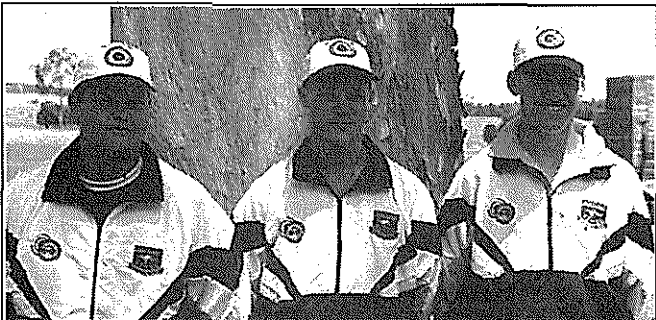

Luckily one of the Cecil Park Clay Target Members who is also a care-taker, happens to work night shift at a local bakery and he ran the small canteen at the range supplying us with fresh pies, pastries, chips and hot dogs + coffee and drinks. What a savior and worker this man was - baking all night and working in the canteen for most of the day with very little sleep. The official caterers even had the gall to complain that he was taking their customers away by uncutting their prices, so they demanded that the Official organiser make him (our baker friend) nearly double his prices if he wanted to sell any food. After the huge nomination fees that we had paid, I would have expected the facilities to have been much superior to those we were provided with.

The atmosphere at this tournament was no where near that experienced at our two prior Oceania Games, those held in New Zealand in 19995 and the 1997 Games held in Adelaide. This I believe was brought about by many factors, the main one by the splitting of the A Team (in the ISSF events) from the B Team, the Juniors and the Standard Trap and Skeet Shooters and the poor representation on New Zealand's part. There were many competitions that New Zealand had no entries for, much to their shooters huge disappointment as apparently there were many willing to come and participate if only they had been given the chance. For this very reason Australia was unable to have full Teams and

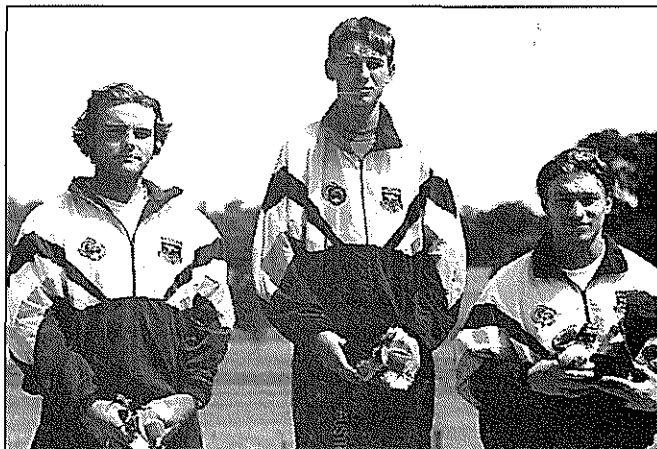

Individuals entered as well, for if you don't have more than 2 countries entered in to a competition - there is no competition. This does not help for the future of shooting in the eyes of the ISSF - especially after the years and years of hard work at getting the standard Trap and Skeet to be allowed to be shot at these Games, where the smaller Oceania Countries can have a chance to compete. I believe the ASA should be asking a lot of questions.

The funding of the Games was virtually non-existent from the Australian Government or the ASA except for the OAP funding

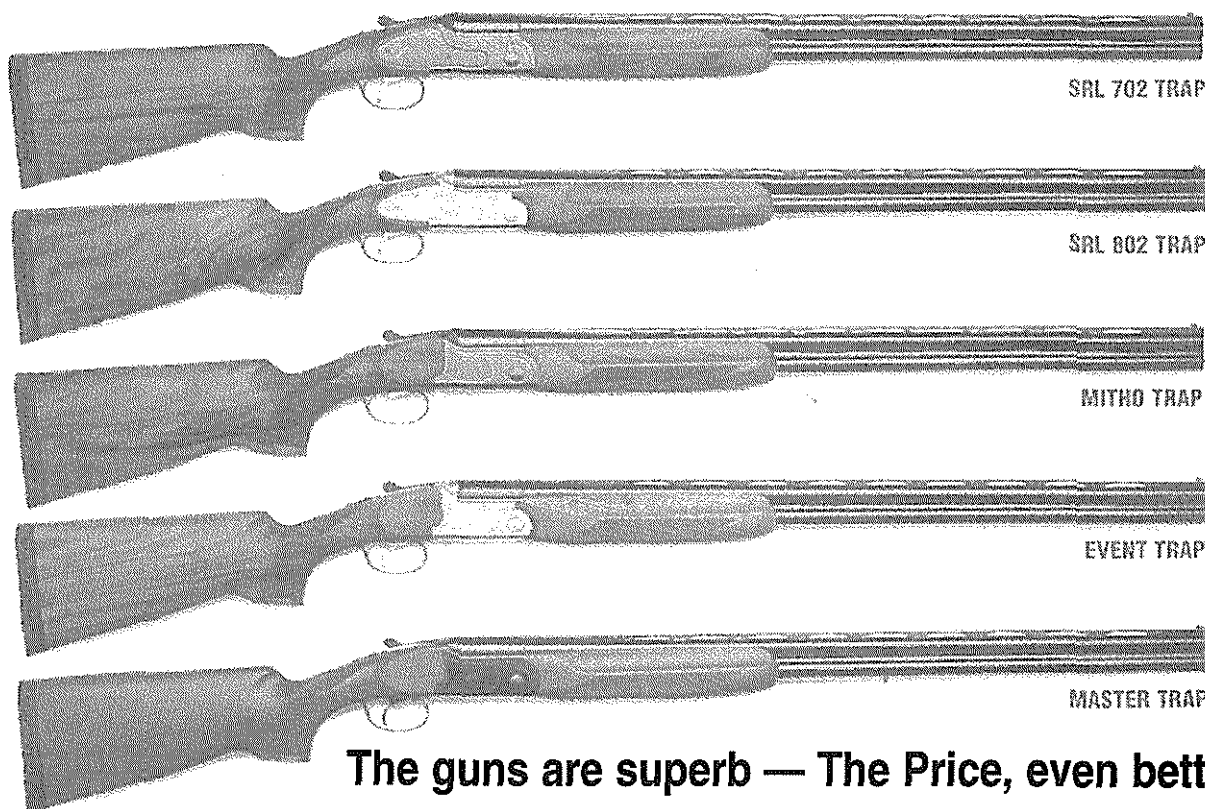

that was given to the A Team for accommodation, ground transport, nominations and doping control and the providing of the 2 coaches, the High Performance Manager, the Selection Manager, the Team Doctor, Masseur and Gun Smith for their benefit.

I sincerely congratulate the ACTA for the support it gave the rest of the Team by paying the nominations, some ground transport and for me as their Section Manager (to some 50 odd competitors). The ACTA contributed around \$12,000.00 towards this. What a great effort seeing that it was supposed to be an ASA Team. Even with this generosity it still cost the B Team and Juniors (ISSF) and the A & B Teams in standard Trap and Skeet quite a considerable amount personally to be there at these Games, representing their Country. I would like to apologise if I missed out on giving my 100% attention to those in my care, but with the problems I had thrust upon me, I did the best that I could under the circumstances and I assure you that thing will be much different at any similar Games.

The other factor that I believe contributed to the lack of atmosphere was the spitting of the accommodation. It should all be at the one venue to keep the Team spirit of 'togetherness', but when you are not financing the accommodation, you must give the people who are paying, the chance to find their own, which is most suited to their own budget. The 'big city' is no where near as friendly as those at smaller cities.

The hustle and bustle encountered in getting people 'to and from' the airport and getting those same people 'to and from' the gun club also created a that everything was going at 'break-neck' speed and there was no time to sit down and have a quiet talk or even to think. Given all the downsides we still accomplished many victories in all disciplines, we obtained those two quota spots we needed for the Olympic Games in Women's Double Trap which Deserie Wakefield-Baynes won for us and in the Men's Skeet, when Craig Meuleman from the B Team, took the honours. It was great to see Craig coming back and hitting great form at the right time. Well done.

There were also many 'invited' shooters from countries outside the Oceania Region and they came from Czech Republic, Portugal, the USA, Northern Ireland, Scotland, Canada, Finland, the Isle of Man, Malaysia, England and Wales. All shooting along side the New Zealanders and the Australians. A total of 13 countries in all.

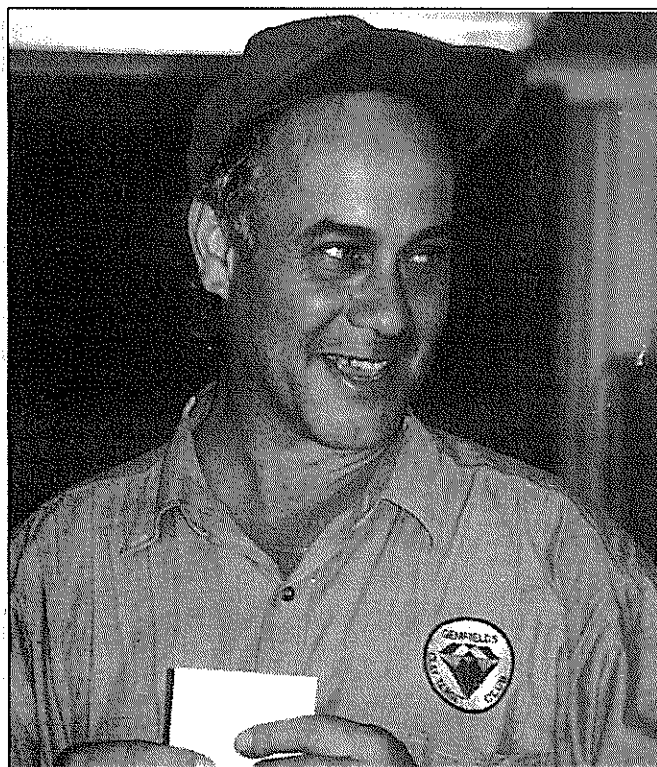

Firearms Safety Training - Release of consultation Draft Report

The Minister for Justice and Customs, Senator the Hon Amanda Vanstone, has urged responsible and experienced shooters in all fields, as well as other members of the community, to consider the Consultation Draft Report on firearms safety training. Interested groups and individuals are encouraged to put forward any view that might assist the development of a national firearm safety training framework.

On 5 November 1999, Senator the Hon Amanda Vanstone, launched a Consultation Draft Report on firearms safety training after the recent Australasian Police Ministers Council (APMC) decision to release the document for community consultation.

The report was developed following the agreement by all Australian Government for firearms controls after the Port Arthur tragedy. Part of the National Firearms Agreement reflects APMC's recognition that high levels of firearms safety training contribute significantly to minimising the risk of harm arising from the misuse of firearms. The Agreement requires States and Territories to ensure that all first time firearms licence applicants successfully complete an accredited course in safety training.

The Consultation Draft Report provides standards for a training framework that could be adopted by jurisdictions as a best practice model for safety training in Australia.

Dear Editor,

I read with interest Mr Adrian Cousens column in the December journal regarding the trap machines used at this years State Carnival at Wagga and his theory that the traps threw a lower percentage of straight away targets and higher percentage of swingers.

I agree with his theory as I have held a long term view of the unsuitability of imported and locally made traps that do not continually oscillate but fire a target from a fixed position and when a target is released it moves to another fixed position determined by electronic means.

As I understand after 32 years involvement of the sport the simple principal of a continuing oscillating trap is that the direction of the target is determined by the call of the shooter.

As to a tendered price for targets I believe that for a premier shoot like the Nationals and State Championships the tender process should be discontinued and the bottom line should be:

1. The best available continually oscillating traps should be used
2. The best suitable targets should be used irrespective of price. This would provide a level playing field for good and fair competitions.

Conditions of Competition - Entry

Entry into the 2000 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2000 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors must produce their 2000 registered shooter record book before nominating, to the 2000 Nationals Office Handicapper.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate Championship Titles for Open, Ladies, Juniors and Veterans, excepting the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Ladies, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.

Note: A junior female must decide which section she is to enter, either Ladies or Juniors, she is not eligible for both.

A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before sashes/medals/cash/trophies are awarded.

When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as selection teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.

To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors over the age of 65 years on April 7, 2000.

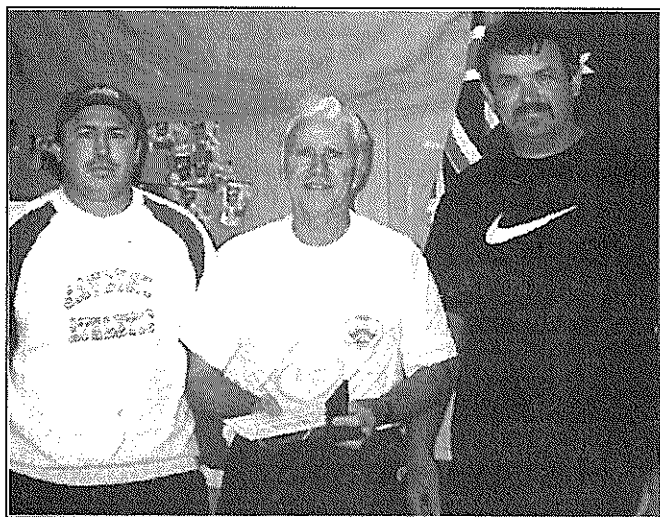

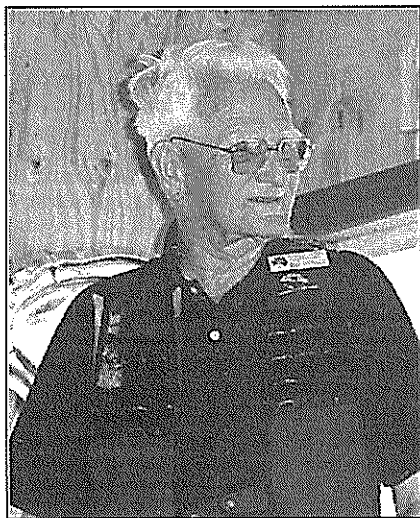

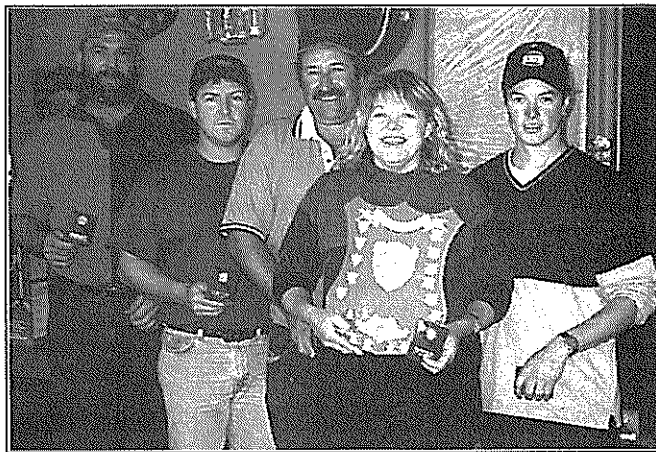

Jim Cornwell won the Day 1 High Gun with 76/81 and L Sharam won the Veterans High Gun with 60/75.



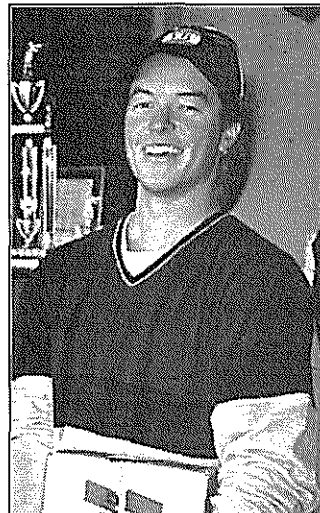

The days shooting ended off with a delicious Webber tea and catching up with 'old' friends who turned up for the weekend.

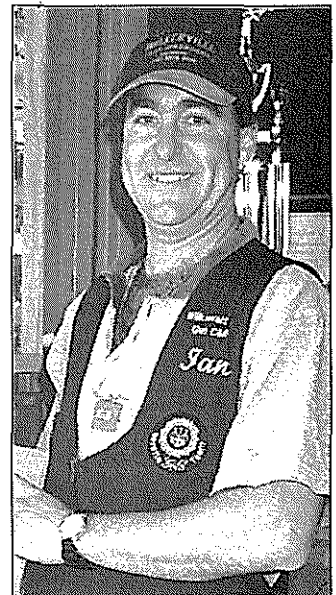

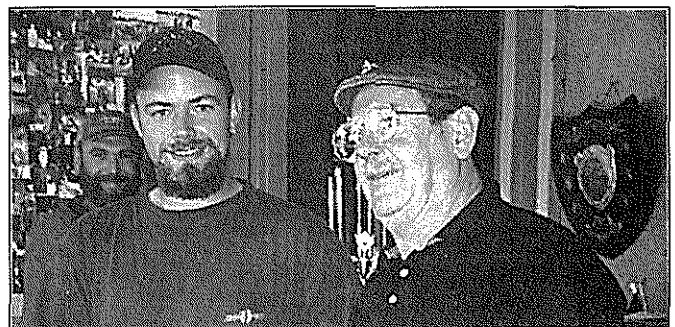
Each Grade Winner won 1/2 case of shells whilst Bob won a Case. This will certainly help keep the boys shooting.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS FEBRUARY 2000

The year 2000 marks the 100th anniversary of the death of The Marquess of Queensberry. But the boxing rules, which were drawn up under his supervision in 1867, are still observed to this day. However I doubt if even the Marquess himself fully appreciated the effect that the "intent" of those rules would have on most other sports, as well as many other areas of human behaviour, some far removed from sport. Even warfare eventually came under their far-ranging influence, particularly in the field of aviation.

During the First World War it was not uncommon for pilots on both sides to cease firing at their opponent once his machine became disabled, or even sometimes if he simply ran out of ammunition or his guns jammed. Many notable examples also occurred during the Second World War. Such as when Sir Douglass Bader, the famous legless "ace" was shot down over Germany, and the Luftwaffe granted an amnesty for a British plane to fly him over a new pair of legs. And later in the war, when American pilots were ordered to machine-gun any German jet pilots that baled out, most simply refused to do so.

The Marquess's famous rules simply dictated that when opponents are pitted against one another, the match should not only be conducted in such a way as to reflect fair play and chivalry, but also for mercy and compassion to be exercised by the one who gained the upper hand. This whole scenario is especially intended to be observed when the losing protagonist has gotten "behind the eight-ball" through no fault of his own or due to the influence of some abstract or irrelevant technicality. The reason I have raised this matter is to examine and hopefully moderate the way in which we interpret and administer our rulebook in Trap and Skeet shooting in this country.

This is not meant to apply in any way shape or form to any of the ISSF disciplines. ISSF shooting is not, and never was, meant to conform to the Marquess's principles. The ISSF rulebook is very technical and precise in every detail and was always intended and designed to be applied at all times to the very letter of the law. ISSF shooting was never designed to be a casual Saturday afternoon game. It was never designed to be a socially oriented recreational activity. It was designed to be an ultra competitive sport, which is conducted at the very highest levels and for the gravest of stakes, such as Olympic gold medals.

With such serious international and political ramifications hanging upon the outcome, there can be no room in such sports for any flexibility whatsoever with the interpretation of the rules. Any time that your opponent has broken one more target than you, but is unintentionally in breach of some minor irrelevant technicality, you would be well advised to win by protesting against him and having him disqualified, because in a reverse situation he would certainly do the same to you.

Due to the small population of Australia, it is not economically viable to have separate organisations controlling Trap, Skeet and ISSF shooting, as they do in the United States. Thus the ACTA is faced with the daunting task of trying to adequately administer and oversee all three. One of the unfortunate but unavoidable side effects of this is a certain amount of cross-pollination within the disciplines, particularly in the area of rules and their interpretation. As a result, a marked degree of technical inflexibility has crept into our application of Trap and Skeet rules and this is a great pity, because neither of those games were ever intended to be played that way.

When the American Trap and Skeet rules were originally laid down by the ATA and the NSSA, they both assumed that common sense and perceived equity would always prevail when those rules were being applied or interpreted. That principle remains to this day in both of those sports in the United States, and works extremely well due to a "flow-on" effect derived from the Marquess's original intention. If you write a rulebook that allows a degree of flexibility and then educate the participants in the Queensberry principles, it is amazing how far most people will go in an attempt to uphold those principles. And how quickly they will usually sort out anyone who deviates from them, without management ever needing to intervene. In effect the partici-

pants themselves control the interpretation of the rules, and continually strive to elevate the nobility of them.

Unfortunately, the reverse effect will also manifest itself equally quickly and strongly. If you write a rulebook, which from the very outset attempts to close every imaginable loophole where people might try to gain an unfair advantage for themselves (read "cheat"), then prepare yourself for an ongoing loophole contest. Due to human nature being what it is, the very same people mentioned above, if exposed to a situation where they perceive that their guilt is assumed before it is established, will prove equally amazing in how inventive they can become in finding ways to circumvent those rules. And they will have no conscience problems in doing so, as it was not they who laid the "ground rules" for the way in which the game was to be played.

Now let's get back to American Trap and Skeet and the practical application of their rulebook and it's interpretation. When I first began to shoot in America, due to a solid grounding in technical rules interpretation, I was initially amazed at how liberally the rules were interpreted and how shoot management seemed to condone this and not interfere.

During my first trip to the Grand American Trapshoot, I was watching a squad shoot and saw a competitor break a small piece off a target. The little girl who was pulling and scoring called lost, whereupon the lead-off shooter immediately turned and said, "No, that was a hit". The puller simply said "Sorry sir", amended the score and they carried on. Now although I could see that justice had been observed on this occasion, I immediately started to wonder just how much exploitation such a system would endure.

Fortunately I did not have to agonise over this dilemma for very long. Soon after I saw what I thought was another one of the shooters break a small piece off a target. However, when the puller called one, the lead-off shooter again interjected and said, "No, that was the wad, mark that lost". Again the girl simply said "Sorry sir", amended the score and they carried on. Suddenly the penny dropped! They were shooting under Queensberry rules. They did not need any supervision. They were bound by their honour and God help anyone who would tarnish it or cast dispersions upon it.

An offshoot of this principle is the way that they conduct their shoot-offs. They have never lost sight of what a shoot-off really is: a number of competitors who are tied, establishing amongst themselves who shall be the winner. Shoot-off procedures are laid out in quite some detail in their rulebook. However, everyone understands that they are only there to establish guidelines and in case there is a situation where there is disagreement amongst the competitors, which there almost never is. Once a shoot-off starts, shoot management usually stay out of it from there on. The competitors are pretty much left to their own devices in so far as rules interpretation is concerned, provided they all agree and provided Queensberry rules are strictly observed.

Let me quote a couple of examples. I was once shooting off for the 28 Gauge Title at a major shoot in Washington DC. As this was one of the top 20 shoots on the professional circuit, a lot of money and prestige was involved, not to mention the All-American points at stake. After three rounds of doubles at 3, 4 & 5, only the great Wayne Mayes and myself remained. Returning to the field at the start of the fourth round, Wayne said "Hey Cuzzo, how about a box at four?" I said, "Suits me Bubba". Wayne looked at the referee who had heard our discussion. He simply nodded, picked up the button and walked over to station four, from where we both proceeded to shoot another full round without missing.

Returning with more ammo for the fifth round, Wayne said "Whatta ya say we split the money and entertain the crowd?" I replied "I'm game" to indicate that I would shoot any format he chose. Wayne then told the referee "We'll shoot two pair each, one each way, total score to count, but we'll both shoot left handed." The referee simply nodded

to indicate that he understood what he was to adjudicate upon. After we broke eight targets, Wayne turned to the puller and said "Same again but this time we'll shoot from the hip." I think we both broke three out of four that time and the trick shooting continued for almost a full round before we finally got a result.

Why do I remember that evening so clearly? Maybe it's because although there were almost 300 people watching that shoot-off, during the last two rounds you could have heard a pin drop. Perhaps it's because, at the end, the cheering and clapping went on for over a minute before it finally abated. It could be because that shoot-off is still talked about to this day. But I think it's mainly because although most of the "who's who" in skeet were there, including probably half of the National Directors, there was never any chance that some misguided "do-gooder" would run out onto the field waving a rulebook and shouting "you can't do this or you can't do that."

Why? Because equity was never compromised. Because Queensberry rules were strictly observed at all times. Because when it's all said and done it was really between Wayne and I anyway. And because in the NSSA rulebook, towards the end of the section on shoot-off procedure, there is some fine print in a little section called 2-B-9-j. Here they are astute enough to have a clause that says "if shooters involved in a shoot-off offer management a mutually agreed upon method of determining the places, management may accept." And who said common sense was extinct?

On another occasion I saw Wayne Mayes and George Desatoff shooting off for the World 12 Gauge Championship. Both were shooting autos. After a while George's gun started jamming occasionally. After three of these, the referee politely reminded George that the next one would be lost if he did not change guns. Wayne then said "It's not annoying me if it's not annoying you, partner." George nodded and simply said "Thanks Wayno" Wayne looked over at the referee and said "Stop countin em." The referee replied "Yes sir." A buzz went through the crowd followed by a round of applause and the shoot-off continued. That's the stuff that legends are made of and the Rules Committee joined in the applause.

Unfortunately about twenty years ago in Australia a similar situation occurred. It was our premier event of the year. The National Double Barrel. It was down to two people: Doug Smith and Russell Mark. One of our all-time greats against one of our fastest rising young stars. Both were "ammunition committed" (read sponsored) shooters. Doug started to have the odd shell misfire. After three the referee warned him that the next one would be lost if he did not change shells. Thus began an ever-decreasing spiral of administrative self-destruction. In the finest Samurai tradition, Doug chose "death before dishonour." Shoot management cowered away from common sense and hid behind the ISSF code of ethics. And unfortunately, Russell lacked the maturity and/or the necessary precedents to be able to rectify the situation. The nett result? Our premier event that year was decided by a target that wasn't missed. Russell, through no fault of his own, went on to learn that a hollow victory could be worse than no victory at all. The sport's administrators appeared to learn nothing from the incident and shooting in this country continued to be poorer for it. And the only eventual winner was Doug Smith. His already God-like status was elevated to yet another level. But in hindsight I bet everyone involved wished they had it to do over again.

The moral of these stories? Such rules were originally designed to prevent ill-equipped people from disturbing other competitors and disrupting the harmony of events during qualifying. They were meant to increase overall equity in the usual circumstances for which they were intended. They were never meant to be interpreted in such a way as to be misused to deprive people of equity in specific circumstances. They were meant to be applied in conjunction with common sense, not used technically correctly but morally illogically to decimate major events.

I suspect that at least part of the QCTA empathises with me, in this matter, even if subconsciously. What makes me think so? They finalised my employment contract as Shoot Marshall for the Roma Nationals two years before the first shot was fired, yet the Tourna-

ment Director only ever gave me one directive. He told me that every night when the shoot-off got down to one squad, I was not to leave the field under any circumstances. Although I never queried this, the subject came up one night during dinner with several of the committee. One of them summed it up when he said, "We have moved heaven and earth to stage this event. If it's going to have a 'memorable incident', we want it to be one for which the shoot becomes famous, rather than infamous."

So where are we now? I believe that we are currently at the crossroads with rules interpretation in this country. Back when clay targets were shot in a collar and tie, I'm sure that chivalry prevailed. Then I think we drifted aimlessly down the ISSF path for many years. But over the last couple of years I have sensed a gradual softening in our draconian attitudes. I believe it's time now to consider whether we continue chasing technical loopholes and requiring juries to sort our problems out, or whether we follow the American example and only bring the rulebook out when common sense and fair-play fail. The Marquess may have been dead for a hundred years, but it's up to us to decide whether he grows cold or whether his legacy is allowed to live on.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts and maximum fine of \$5,500.

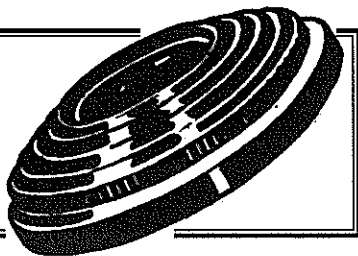

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps.
3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred in the event concerned.
9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be a different location of the area accepting shooting event nominations.
14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
Note: A junior female must decide which section she is to enter (junior or womens), she is not eligible for both.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. T Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
22. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors and second family members only, they being wives or husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
23. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.

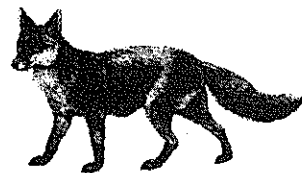

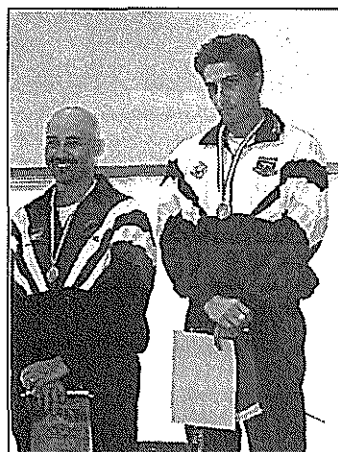

Well done Elaine, you are a quiet achiever. The motel was close to the

It gives me great pride and pleasure to report to you on the Australian Team who competed at the Commonwealth Shooting Federation Championships held in New Zealand. What a great Team this turned out to be - one of the most fun loving and enthusiastic Teams that I have had the pleasure to be involved with.

Our accommodation at Hamilton was first class and I would thoroughly recommend it to everyone. The rooms that we were allocated with were all 2-3 bedroom split-level apartments with the bedrooms upstairs and the lounge, kitchen and dinette were downstairs and some had a room with a full sized spa, which I believe got a good workout, excepting for Room 12, my room which I was sharing with the Chef de Mission of the Australian contingent, our President, Glenn Wood-

center of Hamilton and only 15 minutes from the Gun Club. Most of us arrived in New Zealand on the afternoon of the 15th November, flying direct from the Oceania Games in Sydney, while others arrived later having flown in direct from Melbourne.

We were met in the Auckland Airport by the Manager of the Hire firm we were hiring a bus from and from whom Glenn was hiring a car, to use in his job a Chef de Mission, only to find out that we were rapidly running out of room in both vehicles to transports everyone plus their luggage to Hamilton but thanks to Craig Meuleman, Cherie and Diane Reeves, they saved the day and hired a car of their own and that eliminated a fast looming problem. A quick one and a half hour drive saw us in Hamilton late in the afternoon.

The 16th November was a lay day for us as it was designated for the arrival of all delegations and for most of us who had been at the Gun Club in Cecil Park for the past 12 days (for around 10-12 hours per day), we all decided to give it a miss and have a day of either resting or sight-seeing, with Paul Rahman and Tom Turner opting to go trout fishing at the dairy belonging to Colin Moore's father. By this time we had traded in our 8 seater bus for a 12 seater and after dropping off the two fishermen along the way, 8 of us set sail for Rotorua with most doing the 'touristy' things by visiting the Agridome, the Maori village at the hot

I went to see if I could get a ride in one as it had always been one of my greatest wishes but I didn't like my chances as the wind had come up and there were 2 to 3 foot waves on the lake but after asking the pilot who said he had no problems with the weather, Suzie Balogh and I went up for a most enjoyable half hour flight and I would recommend it to anyone.

We then made a mad dash back to the Agridome where Barty and two of the girls had seen a ride that they were most anxious to have a go at - we got there just as they were closing but they ended up opening for Barty, Natalia and Nessa. This ride was like a giant swing where they laced you up in a huge canvas bag so that no possible harm could come to those brave enough to make the swing. Then you would be pulled up by a crane to a release point and the 'let go'. The arc of the swing is probably a couple of hundred feet and the two girls made the mistake of giving the release cord to Barty who had been told on a number of occasions by them to 'Let it loose!' Apparently when they did release the pod, they didn't realize that they dropped about 30 to 40 feet before the tension on the main rope took up and they actually started swinging. Photographs will tell the true story if you can get hold of one. I think the girls won that one, Barty! We all left the grounds in a happy, cheerful frame of mind and then it was back to Colin's farm to pick up the fishermen who had apparently caught plenty but had only managed to land just one trout to take home.

17th November - Skeet and Trap practice and getting ourselves organized for the coming events by buying cartridges etc. The Team consisted of:

Women's Trap: Diane Reeves, Suzie Balogh, Nessa Jenkins.

Men's Skeet: Craig Meuleman, Barty Brighenti, Paul Rahman.

Women's Skeet: Natalia Rahman, Cherie Reeves, Nicole Hyland.

Men's D/Trap: Steve Haberman, Craig Tilley, Tom Turner.

Women's D/Trap: Suzie Balogh, Susan Trindall, Sophia Psarakis.

Each country was allowed 3 entrants in each event and yes, we had 4 in the Men's Trap and this was brought about by an unfortunate incident at the Oceania Games and where I had obtained permissions from the Organizing Committee to have a 4th person shoot in the Individual and Badge Match.

At the Technical Meeting this was discussed and agreed on by all of the countries present given the circumstances from how this 'problem' had arisen. Not one country disagreed with the proposal put forward and I as the Australian Manager was most grateful for their sportsmanship. Two days later however after much mumbling, one country put in a protest that we could

only shoot our '3' shooters in the Individual competition. The 'deal' that I had struck with the Organizers and the countries at the Technical Meeting was that if the 4 Australian shooters got into the Final, I would then pull one of them out. It mystifies me how people can agree one minute and then go back on their word the next.

I then called on Glenn Woodhatch as Chef de Mission and voiced my disapproval at what was happening as the Jury would not allow the competition to continue till such time as this 'problem' was overcome - this amazed me as I didn't think it had anything to do with the Jury holding up the Trap and Skeet competition.

I called a Team meeting with the 4 shooter concerned, with Glenn Woodhatch being present, where I outlined what had happened and then told them that I was prepared to make a decision as to who those 3 shooters

should be and I asked them if they had anything to say. I then witnessed one of the greatest sportsman-like gestures that I have ever come across - Nathan Cassells said that he was prepared to 'stand down' and give 'Tom and Daniel a go at the Championship as he felt that they had 'earned the right to do so'.

The reason that I am reporting on this matter which I have previously said was caused by an ugly incident at the Oceania Games is to let you know what a marvelous sports person Nathan Cassells is and he deserves all the praise that can be bestowed upon him - so next time you see him, give him a pat on the back, for he diverted yet another perilous situation, one that I was prepared to take. Thank you Nathan and I wish you well in your forthcoming endeavors.

After this sad but true episode, the Team got down to business and did what we were there for, to compete against 10 other countries in Trap,

20th November -

We had gone into the Individual Trap and Skeet in both Men's and Women's events by this time and we were experiencing some terrible weather, virtually getting all of the seasons in one day, plus rain as well.

I must tell you at this stage that the Waikato grounds has 2 Trap layouts, one with Ibis traps fitted and the other has a set of air cocked Rossini traps and we were using only one skeet layout so you can imagine the targets on the traps were no where near the same.

At the Technical Meeting it was decided by all countries that though the numbers were small we still wanted to use both traps and starting about 9 in the morning and hopefully getting the shooting over at a reasonably early hour and in a leisurely manner, with the shooters having to help the side-Referees and helping with the flip boards etc., and a squad shooting every half hour, but the Jury opted to shoot every squad on one trap before going on to the next trap and much to the amazement of all countries, they also made us stick to the half hour turnabout and this made what should have been a short day into a longggggg day!

The Finals day had come for the shooters (in the Individual Trap and Skeet) and once again the weather was extremely windy, cold and raining. Australia was looking in a very good position in both the Men's and Women's Skeet and Trap. Coming into the Finals another peculiar thing happened. The Jury made a decision that all tied scores of those in the Finals had to

shoot off for their Final's position - none of the shooters or Team Managers have ever seen or heard of this happening before as it always goes on a 'count back'. After querying this decision with some of the Jury members, we were told this was a decision by the Organising Committee and that they, the Jury had to accept and go along with it. A lot of comments were made but it all depends on how you read the rules. I have since looked up a special instruction paper that I was given at the World Championships and Lonato '99 and the procedure for breaking tied scores and the Rule number that states it and this was no where near what was done in New Zealand. A very unfair way of doing things especially for the people who are defeated in a shoot off. Back to the Skeet, where we had Craig Meuleman in the Men's Final where he finally came in 5th place on 139/150.

In the Women's Skeet we had 3 Women in the Final, Natalia, Cherie and Nicole. Natalia and Cherie had to shoot off for their positions in the Final and for this they (the hierarchy) used doubles off stations 3, 4 and 5 and Natalia won this shoot off. At the end of the Final, Natalia and Cherie were again tied scores and had to shoot off for 1st and 2nd placings. Doubles were used again and Natalia took first place. All of this was achieved in miserable, cold, rainy weather.

This was a very proud moment for the Team Manager, especially when the Organising people usually only ask for 2 flags for presentations - luckily I had 4 with me, 3 for presentation and 1 to fly alongside the New Zealand flag, much to Steve Webb's anguish (for he was Chief of the Organizing Committee and this was a private joke between him and I).

We were also lucky enough to have our 3 Women shooters contesting the Final in the Trap and before it could begin yet another shoot off had to take place. Diane Reeves went into the Final with 3 targets up her sleeve over Nessa Jenkins. After the Final however, Diane having a disastrous round and she and Nessa had to then shoot off for 1st and 2nd placings with Nessa winning the single barrel shoot off giving us the following placings:

3rd Teresa Borrell - New Zealand 83/100

Australia went into the Men's Individual Trap Final with 2 competitors, Nidal Asmar going into the Final in second place behind Brent Woodward of New Zealand who was 2 targets up one Nidal. At the end of the Final we had Nidal and Brent on 141/150 and they had to shoot off for 1st and 2nd placings - Brent missed his first target and Nidal hit his and took out the Championship. Tom Turner came in 4th place with a score of 139/150.

Glenn and I took the Team out to a smorgasbord seafood restaurant for a celebratory and farewell dinner for the Trap and Skeet shooters who were going home on the following morning. It was a lovely dinner and appreciated by all.

The next day while I took the respective shooters back to Auckland to catch their respective planes, the Double Trap shooters went out to have their Official Practice so they could familiarize themselves with the grounds.

23rd November -

The first event for the Double Trap was once again the Pairs Match for both Men and Women.

The weather for both of these matches was deplorable with the targets going so high that you damned near need a helicopter to get up to them, but still it was under the same conditions that everyone had to shoot so we cannot use that as an excuse.

24th November -

Individual Double Trap for Men and Women saw the conditions a little better with the targets much lower. Going into the final Australia had our 3 competitors in with a show with Steve Haberman leading the field on 138/150 over Craig Tilley on 136/150. The way that Steve had been shooting I never thought that anyone would catch him but he proved me wrong and shot one of the worst Finals I have ever seen him shoot - a 41/50 and with Craig not looking like missing, shooting a great round of 48/50 and Tom Turner then tying with John Bellamy of England and they had to shoot off for 4th place but Tom had to settle for 5th overall after a 'bad decision' was made and this gave the event to Craig on 184/200.

This completed what I believe is one of the most successful trips for an Australian Team and all of the Team members were a pleasure to be with and I hope that they all had as memorable and satisfying trip as I had and bearing in mind that all of these competitors had paid their own way to shoot for Australia except for their nominations, doping control and ground transport, which again was thankfully paid by the A.C.T.A.

There is one other small excursion that I would like to tell you about. I have never seen anyone as enthusiastic about fishing as Paul Rahman. Paul took his own fly fishing rod with him and he was so disappointed at not catching a fish at the dairy (the day we went to Rotorua) that I promised him that if we finished early one day we would hire a professional fisherman and go out one evening. After a few phone calls this was organized but we needed 3

people to make it worth while, as the boat would take up to 4.

The day in question came up rather 'dirty' in the afternoon but the weather forecast was not looking good for the days ahead so it was 'now or never'.

By the time we left the shooting ground at around 3pm, the number of would be 'fisher-people' had grown from 3 to 9, so after another few frantic phone calls (looking for a larger boat) we eventually got onto one that could take 10 people but it was at Lake Taupo - one and a half hours drive from Hamilton! We got to Lake Taupo around 5pm and found the lake very calm and the weather beautiful but overcast, this supposedly the best weather for trout fishing. The boat was a 7 and a half metre cabin cruiser, quite modern and powered by a large outboard motor and could cruise at around 50 kph. All the fishing gear was supplied, as was tea/coffee, the only problem being that only 2 people could fish at any one time.

After seeing some famous sights around the lake we settled down to our first experience of 'trolling' for trout. We gave Paul the go at fishing and yes, within 5 minutes he hooked one and the excitement on the boat was almost electrifying with Vince Mollica just about falling over everyone to get to Paul with the landing net. Paul's fish weighed about 6 and a half pounds, a huge trout compared to those we might catch in Australia and the look on Paul's face made those anxious moments experienced whilst trying to organize this expedition made it all worthwhile. Paul then sat back and let the other take their turns at fishing and it was another hour before Nathan Cassells too landed a trout, a little smaller than Paul's but he was just as proud of his catch as was Paul.

I left everyone to it - fishing that was, and I found a bed in the cabin and I kicked off my boots and lay there listening to everyone, talking and laughing. Everyone took turns at steering the boat and watching the echo sounder for the depth and shoals of fish. After losing 2 or 3 lures and with Barty up to his usual pranks of pulling on people's lines when they weren't looking and they then thinking they had got a bite, it was time to head back to Kinlock there was a thick fog and a drizzling rain all the way and yes, I did take a wrong turn and found a different way back to Hamilton. This I called 'a short cut' but I too was glad to eventually see the lights of Hamilton.

I would like to thank the A.C.T.A. for making this trip possible and to thank all of the shooters, for this trip proved to me that you can have some fun and still be serious when it comes to your shooting.

A record number of competitors for a Christmas shoot and a massive fireworks display ended a successful year of activities for the Warwick Clay Target Club.

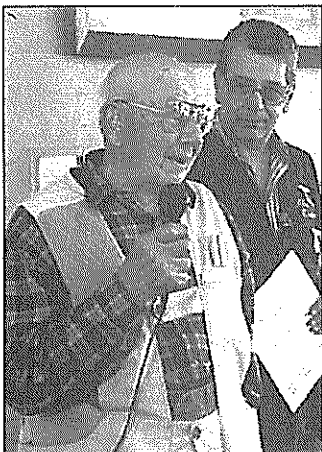

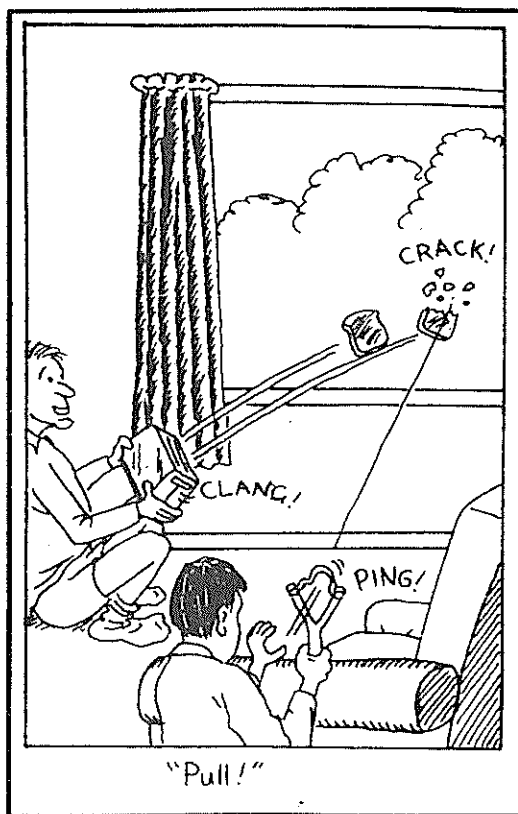
NSW GUN CLUB

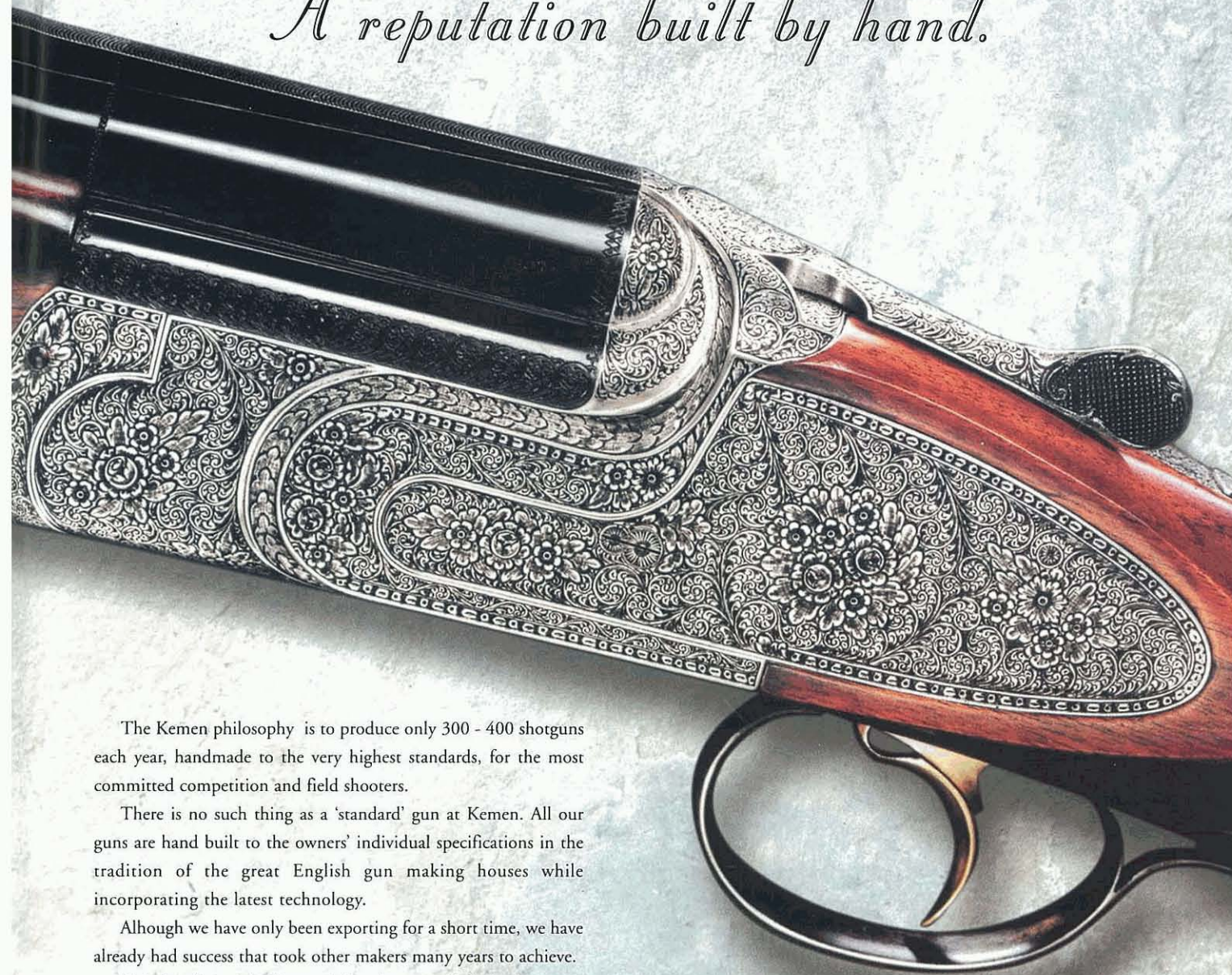
