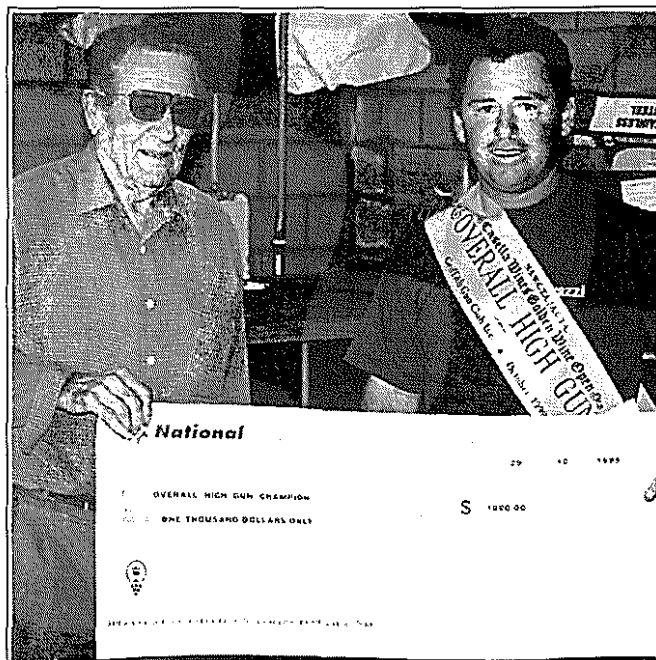

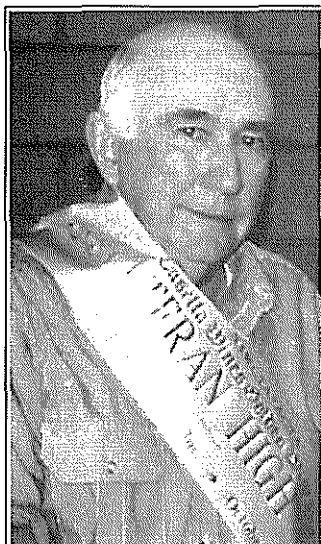

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE IMPORTATION AND PURCHASE OF FIREARMS IN AUSTRALIA

Since the 1996 Port Arthur tragedy there have been a number of changes made to both Commonwealth and State and Territory legislation in relation to the importation and purchase of firearms, firearm parts, accessories, magazines and ammunition (firearm articles). The most significant changes, of course, relate to Category C firearm articles.

The changes, at Commonwealth level, were in the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations ("the Regulations") which is administered by the Law Enforcement Coordination Division of the Attorney-General's Department (contact details below). The Regulations require that the importation of firearm articles into Australia meet certain tests.

The tests I refer to are:

The official purposes test: this test is for the import of firearms for Commonwealth, State or Territory government use. This test requires Ministerial approval prior to import (a signed permission from the Minister for Justice and Customs).

The specified purposes test: this test is used for firearm articles being imported for a film production, TV series or documentary. The test also covers those firearm articles that are being transhipped through Australia or that are owned by the government of another country and are coming into Australia for repair. This test requires Ministerial approval prior to import.

The specified person test: this test is used for firearm articles being imported for use by a person whose principal or only occupation is the business of controlling vertebrate pest animals on rural land. This test requires Ministerial approval prior to import.

The sports shooter test: this test is used for firearm articles being imported or purchased for use by members of the Australian Clay Target Association. Please see requirements below. This test requires Ministerial approval prior to import.

The international sports shooter test: this test is available for firearm articles being imported by non-Australian citizens who are competing in the following events:

The Olympic Games or an associated event;
The Paralympic Games or associated event;
The Commonwealth Games or associated event or
An event organised by the ACTA.

Those attending these events must also hold a temporary licence or authorisation in the State or Territory in which the event is being held. This test requires Ministerial approval prior to import.

The dealer test: this test is available to licensed firearms dealers to import firearm articles. If a dealer wishes to import Category C articles they must obtain prior Ministerial approval, the articles must be stored with the Australian Customs Service in their State or Territory and they may only sell the articles to primary producers, certified sports shooters or certified buyers (government agencies or vertebrate pest controllers).

* Please note that when importing firearm articles which require Ministerial approval you must have that approval prior to the articles landing in the country. Processing of applications usually takes between 10 to 14 working days once we have received all the relevant information. Processing of requests is at no charge.

The police authorisation test: this test is mainly used by primary producers and importers/ purchasers who must meet criteria set by the police in each State or Territory. As many of you will be aware, on 15 November 1996 the Aus-

tralasian Police Ministers' Council (APMC) agreed to allow certain members of the Australian Clay Target Association (ACTA) access to Category C articles. The purchase and import of Category C articles is strictly controlled by the Regulations under Schedule 6, Parts 1 and 4. ACTA members can purchase a firearm article under one of two options:

- * if you were an ACTA member on 15 November 1996 and owned a semi-automatic or pump action shotgun on that date for use in clay target shooting; or
- * you need a Category C firearm because of a physical need due to a lack of strength or dexterity.

If you are wishing to import or purchase a Category C article you must apply to the Law Enforcement Coordination Division of the Attorney-General's Department. You will need to contact either Martel Ermert on (02) 6250 6805 or Marlene Parker on (02) 6250 6730, or by writing to them at the Firearms Unit, Law Enforcement Coordination Division, Attorney-General's Department, Robert Garran Offices, National Circuit, Barton, ACT, 2600. We can also be contacted by e-mail at firearms@ag.gov.au.

When applying to purchase a Category C article you will need to provide contact details for yourself (including a phone contact), full details of the firearm article, including serial number, and name and address details of your firearms dealer. We also require the following documentation (please note that documentation provided will be verified with the relevant agencies):

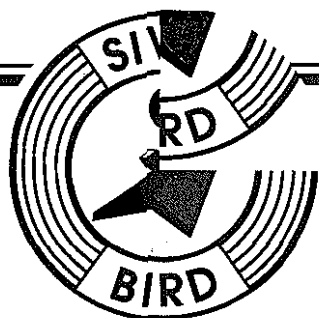
- * A copy of your current ACTA membership card;
- * Proof that you are an Australian citizen ie. a copy of your birth certificate or passport;
- * A copy of your firearms licence; and
- * A statement that provides evidence that the article is to be used solely for participating in clay target events (the conditions on your firearms licence usually contains this statement).

If applying under the first option, the applicant must provide evidence of ACTA membership on 15 November 1996 ie. your 1996 membership card (or a statement from ACTA) as well as evidence that you owned a semi-automatic or pump action shotgun at that date e.g. if you handed your shotgun in after November 1996 and received a receipt for it, a copy of the receipt would be sufficient provided it includes a description of the firearm.

If, however, you are applying under the second option, you will need to obtain a statement from a Rules Supervisor or a Referee Examiner stating that in their opinion for you to continue shooting you require a Category C firearm. The ACTA official should, of course, have seen you shoot with your current firearm. Many applicants provide a copy of a medical certificate from their doctor. Whilst this is not compulsory it is useful in proving that there is a medical condition related to the application. ACTA Executive Officer, Andrew Sanders, has agreed that in order to verify these statements, as well as the status of an applicant's membership, we will be able to confirm with both the relevant ACTA official and ACTA Head Office.

We appreciate that the National Firearms Agreement has had an impact on legitimate sporting shooters' ability to freely access certain types of firearms, but we aim to provide an informative and helpful service to you in order to limit any inconvenience. If you have any questions about these processes please feel free to contact us.

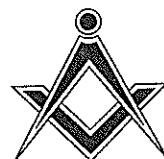

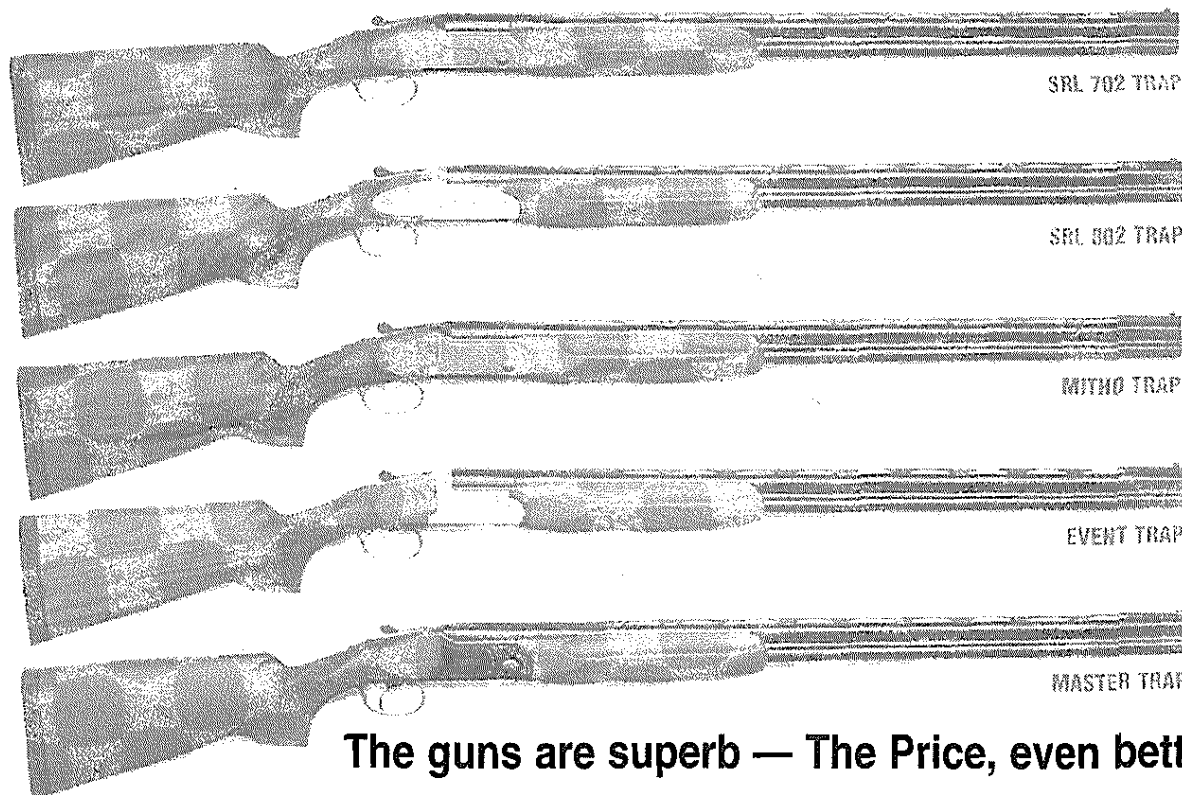

Response to President's Notes, Jan 2000 issue Clay Target Shooting News.

Section: Overlooked Again.

I have been a shooter for 34 of my 38 years. My family's connection with shooting sports goes back to the origin of firearms and my grandfather, Alex H Smith, was one of the first Australians to regularly shoot clay targets at Queensland's original Granite Belt Club in 1926. I also happen to have worked in television news for 17 years including nearly 5 years as News Editor with Seven Nightly News in Brisbane. While I now work in public relations, I also happen to be the Seven Network's shooting commentator at the Sydney Olympics.

I empathise completely with the frustration and hurt felt by shooters over the unfair hand dealt to us by government and most of the media; however, it's about time we started to help ourselves.

Glenn Woodhatch's comments last issue, while most genuinely felt I'm sure, are simply not correct. Glenn asserts that the media is constantly contacted about titles won by shooters. I honestly declare that in 5 years as News Editor of a bulletin with a state-wide audience of nearly one million people, I was never contacted by the head office of any shooting body with such news. Every time I got a story of the deeds of Mark or Diamond to air, it was only because I happened to be a shooter who knew what was happening.

The shooting sports must get proactive. When we're in a major tournament in Finland or somewhere, we should be arranging for TV pictures of our winners to be placed on international news feeds. It's the sort of job the team managers should be doing. We have to start spoon feeding the networks. We don't need great long feature stories, that's too much to ask for. We just need the odd 30 second spot and we have to start getting clever about making sure it happens. We have to help not hinder the media, react to our critics, not the media themselves.

For the perfect example, we need look no further than the Sporting Shooters Association. Its TV ads on shooting are a master stroke. For the first time since Port Arthur, evening news stories featuring the debate showed shooters to be the calm and rational human beings, while our vocal opponents appeared like rabid, irrational, radical extremists.

I am not wishing to attack anyone by my comments herein, I simply want to be of some constructive assistance and I am available should my private voluntary advice be required.

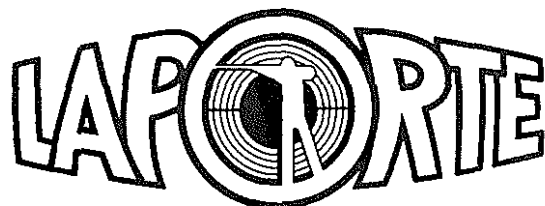
Dear Editor,

Sunshine Coast Annual January Super Shoot

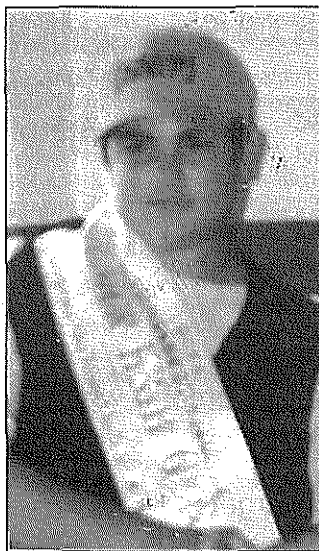

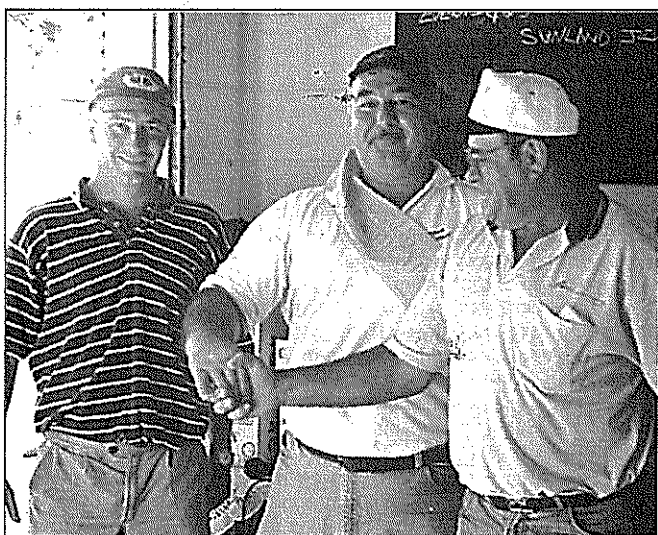

— CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS —

Back around the middle of last year I received a letter from Peter Dawson of the Lake Macquarie Clay Target Club in New South Wales.

He told me that his club had decided to run a Two-day Skeet Shoot later in the year. The date they were considering was the weekend that fell a full week before Skeet Nationals started. He asked me what I thought of the date and if I could give them my opinion on a number of other matters including trophies, advertising and target colour, but especially the formatting of a suitable program.

I gave his letter a fair bit of careful thought and then replied at my earliest opportunity. However, upon reflection, I decided that the answers to his questions were probably generically interesting and/or useful to numerous other people who find themselves in a similar situation from time to time. So this month I have decided to expand upon these issues and offer some of my thoughts and suggestions.

The date is one of the most important things to get right when you decide to run a new major shoot, because if you get this wrong, then no matter how right you get the rest of it, it will probably all be to no avail. Nowadays this shouldn't be too difficult. Back in the November 1998 issue I wrote an article on the virtues of fixed dates for major shoots and the multitude of problems caused by date changes. If you didn't read it or don't remember it, I strongly urge you to blow the dust off your pile of back issues and check it out.

Recently a fair bit of good work has been done in this area and now the Nationals, the State Shoots and most of the major shoots are pretty much tied down to fixed dates.

Both the ACTA office and I are currently accumulating this data on file and are quite happy to download it to anyone on request.

This means that if you decide to put on a major shoot, you can simply access this information and choose a date that will not clash with another similar shoot. And the flip side is that once you pick your date, you can then register that date on the master calendar, so that no-one else will later double up on your date unknowingly, possibly ruining both their shoot and yours.

Shoot trophies is another issue on which experience has given me some fairly fixed views and I will quote directly from my reply.

"Over the last few years, many people have come to see the merit in shooting for money or cartridges as prizes, as either of these two things allows you to shoot again next weekend.

However, if you get a sponsor who wishes to supply 'material' trophies, or you wish to go down that road yourself, make sure that you try to buy things that are generically useful. Most people can eventually use or give away another toaster or frypan, but silver tea services and crystal glasses will not bring people back to your club".

Advertising is another area where you can either make or break your shoot. Always list your date in the CTSN Shoot Calendar as early as possible. Six months beforehand would be good and three months should be the absolute minimum.

Then put a small preliminary notice in two months before the shoot, followed by the full program one month before the event. If your date falls near the end of the month, you may be able to bring these times up to one month before the current month, however two and one before is probably better as a general rule and imperative if your shoot falls early in your chosen month.

Target colour is totally dependent upon the terrain and background of your club. With a good background such as we are fortunate enough to have at the National Shooting Ground in Wagga, I see no reason to ever shoot anything other than black targets.

However, if your background is less than perfect, then any good contrasting colour can be used. Fluoro is a perennial favourite and works well with flora dominated backgrounds, however I have seen other colours used to good effect.

Townsville shoot whites all year round against a mountain backdrop and at Reno in Nevada, where the background could only be described as "camo", they found that pastel green was the optimum colour.

Now to programming! Most club Skeet Shoots are limited to two

days for obvious reasons and to 200 targets by the extent of their facilities combined with the expected attendance.

Although I support 100 target events at the Nationals and maybe some of the events at the State Shoots, I believe that 4x50 target events is the way to go for Club Shoots. Although it bumps the "noms" up, I believe this is more than offset by several advantages.

Firstly it gives the competitors twice as many chances to win something. Secondly, and probably most importantly, it gets a lot more people into shoot-offs. Aside from State Shoots and the Nationals, most serious shooters would rather get into a shoot-off and shoot well and lose, than win something outright. Why? Because when it's all said and done, shoot-offs are what shooting is really all about. Don't forget that shoot-offs are as different to qualifying, as competition shooting is from practices, and that intense pressure shoot-off experience is something you can get at your club on a Wednesday afternoon.

Thirdly it allows you more variety in your program. Handicap events have been around for a long time and I believe that they are a necessary addition to any Two-Day program. Grade shooting is okay but handicaps are the only way up-and-coming shooters can bang heads with the big boys and have a realistic chance of actually winning.

Since Skeet Doubles became a National Title event, a lot more interest has been generated in this game, and I now see them also as a mandatory addition to any Two-Day Shoot.

Additionally, due to the degree of difficulty and unpredictability of Skeet Doubles, its inclusion opens the High Gun up to a much wider range of competitors, and that's got to be a good thing.

So now that you have your content, 2x50 Skeet, 50 Handicap and 50 Doubles, all that remains is to establish the most workable format. I believe it's 50 Skeet and 50 Handicap the first day and 50 Skeet and 50 Doubles the second. There are two main reasons for setting it up this way. First, by shooting the doubles last, you keep a lot more people in with a chance in the High Gun right to the bitter end. And secondly you utilise your available time a lot better.

Skeet Handicap shoot-offs tend to be long drawn out affairs and on Saturday night when no-one is going anywhere except out to dinner, it doesn't matter if you have to shoot until dark and/or even come back the next morning to finish it off.

However, on Sunday night almost everyone wants to finish up early for a variety of reasons, so the Doubles event makes for a perfect climax.

Even over 50 targets, not all that many shoot-offs are usually required, and those that are, generally don't last all that long. The quick and the dead is usually the order of the day once you go to 3, 4 and 5.

Now, to change the subject. All during the month of January, I have been taking phone calls from people asking me what I thought of the letter published in the current CTSN which was fairly critical of both Andy Sanders and myself in the performance of our official duties at the recent Skeet Nationals.

My answer was that I thought it was a wonderful example of freedom of speech and a free press at work in a democratic country. Additionally I thought it was a fair illustration of the character strength of Andy Sanders, who, as the editor of the CTSN, went ahead and printed the letter without even an editorial addendum. Beyond that, I thought the letter should stand on its own merits and I did not intend to follow up the matter any further.

However, over the last couple of days my phone has run hot with inquiries as to whether or not my February articles was in fact a reaction to this letter. Once I grasped the point they were making and the significance of the coincidence, I thanked them for the compliment. The truth of the matter is that I had submitted the article a couple of days before my attention was drawn to the letter.

However, as Andy has lately been making a concerted effort to get the magazine out early, theoretically I would have been able to read it a couple of days before the publishing deadline.

The point of the compliment is that anyone who believes I could write an article of that depth in two days, has an evaluation of my literary skills that my abilities unfortunately cannot match, and I am humbled by the magnitude of their estimation.

In actual fact I usually spend many weeks and sometimes even months formulating, researching, writing and refining these articles. To give you some idea of the magnitude of the project and how seriously I take it, I currently have seven other different topics in various stages of research and preparation, most of which I hope will get to print some time later this year.

Anyway, now that the letter in question has become a matter of some considerable conjecture, I think I should clear up a few misconceptions. It's main criticisms are that I unfairly force people to shoot doubles in regular shoot-offs in order to save targets, that I break the rules by having more than six people on a shoot-off field at one time, and that, as the Tournament Director, Mr Sanders is a co-conspirator in my untoward activities.

Unfortunately none of the points are factual. Although doubles at 3, 4 and 5 is standard shoot-off procedure in America, I do not believe we are ready for it in Australia yet, and for that reason I always try to shoot regular Skeet to finality.

The only time I advocate a switch to doubles is when three separate issues converge. Lack of time and/or light necessitates an expedient result, equity would not be seriously altered by the change, and the people concerned all agree.

Part of the reason I like to the Shoot Marshall at the Nationals is that I believe it's important to be conciliatory rather than dictatorial at such times, and that a broad knowledge of individual shooters' abilities is paramount when contemplating such actions.

Any time I need expediency but believe a change to doubles would seriously alter the equity, I generally circumvent it and offer some other alternative such as singles at 3, 4 and 5 or a coin toss, or ask for a mutually agreeable suggestion from the competitors themselves.

The number of competitors that are legally allowed on a competition field at any one time is a very interesting point. For qualifying in Trap Shooting, rule 1.04a states that it shall be a maximum of six, and for shoot-offs, rule 3.22 states how each of the events shall be shot off but does not put a numerical limit on any one of them.

However, it is a good point because in most cases (but not all — see below), regardless of whether you are qualifying or shooting off, either five or six shooters is the physical limitation of a field, depending on whether you shoot five per lane or shoot and move.

However, in Skeet no such physical limitation exists. ACTA Rule 1.05a states that for qualifying it shall be a maximum of six and that this number must not be exceeded. This has not diverged all that far from the original NSSA rule 3a.16 which states that it shall be five or less, that it may be six, and that it should not be more.

For shoot-offs ACTA rule 3.23 states that they shall be conducted squad system but, as in trap, does not specify a numerical limit. Similarly, NSSA rules 2b.8 and 2b.9 lay out all the procedures for shoot-offs but do not dictate any numerical limit.

The largest single field shoot-off that I was ever involved in was at the World Championships in San Antonio during the late eighties. Although they had been shooting doubles in shoot-offs at the World Shoot since 1985, the Shoot-off Stadium, and the continuation of the shoot-offs after dark under lights, had only just been brought in.

I think it was the 20 Gauge event and although the exact number of competitors escapes me, it was about 65. I remember them lining us all up in order, and the line stretched from station 3 back to the fence, all the way around the fence and out the entry gate.

It was a warm autumn evening and a carnival-like atmosphere prevailed. What followed was non-stop shooting action under lights for a couple of hours, much to the immense enjoyment of the vast crowd.

From about the last 20 shooters onwards, everyone who missed was applauded all the way off the field. I finished about seventh or eighth and was just glad to be a part of it.

However, these days, with eight more "lit fields" alongside the stadium, it is unusual to ever see more than about ten or a dozen

people shooting off together on the same field at the World Championships.

For qualifying in both Trap and Skeet, I firmly believe that six people is too many, and that five per squad works best and should be the normal procedure. However in shoot-offs, I think we should retain "no set limits", and allow common sense and practicality to continue to prevail. In closing I have to say that I think the letter's criticism of Andy Sanders' sterling performance in dual roles of Office Manager and Tournament Director was both unwarranted and in poor taste, but I accept the rest of the letter as a genuine attempt at constructive criticism. And on a more positive note, the letter has given me a great idea for this month's Shoot Trivia Question.

Name the one event at each year's Trap Nationals, where I usually call a dozen or more people to one field for the overall shoot-off and allow them to all shoot together to finality, just like a Skeet shoot-off?

January's STQ competition was very interesting. For the first time I got more wrong answers than correct ones and I got a lot of different ones. Newton Thomas polled the most votes, but Pud, Warren, Billy and Russell all cracked a mention.

The correct answer however was Doug Smith, who has 21 to Newton's 20. And the first correct answer drawn was submitted by Julie Allen from Dalby in Queensland, who asked that if her entry was successful, could the prize be awarded to one of the junior shooters at her club, Mr Matthew Spargo. So Matt, you now have a free entry to the National Single Barrel at Wagga in April, courtesy of Mrs Allen.

Fred married Noel in 1942, they had no children. Noel survives him, regrettably an invalid, they were the best of mates, sharing adventures, their lives revolving around one and other.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps.
3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred in the event concerned.
9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be a different location of the area accepting shooting event nominations.
14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
Note: A junior female must decide which section she is to enter (junior or womens), she is not eligible for both.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. T Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
22. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors and second family members only, they being wives or husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
23. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.

PSYCHOLOGICAL SKILLS FOR SHOOTING: VISUALISATION

Visualisation or mental imaging is a skill that can be used to improve performance. Visualisation, according to Syer & Connolly (1984) is the process of watching yourself, as if on a screen, in your mind's eye. Whilst you watch yourself you consciously evoke and guide daydreams, in which you appear, towards a specific end.

A number of terms are often used interchangeably with visualisation. These include mental imagery, mental rehearsal, ideomotor training, visual motor behavioural rehearsal. Mental imaging includes auditory and kinaesthetic (feeling) components as well as visual components; therefore, if you visualise yourself moving, you may see, hear and feel yourself moving. Visualisation is the most commonly used term and for the purposes of this article I will stay with it.

In the September article; When I miss, is it self doubt? I examined how the mind can create self doubt because the Self 1 gives a range of instructions and coaching tips to Self 2 who has to perform the task, with the result being that the muscles tense up and the shooter loses their natural flow. Visualisation, is a tool that can be used to limit self doubt because it incorporates the language that the body understands. Muscles and the nerves that are needed to move muscles, do not understand language, therefore when we tell them what to do they tighten up because they do not understand our instruction. If however, we show them a mental picture then what is needed is clearer and is in a form that they can use. If you had to learn golf, trap shooting or waltz, from the verbal instructions, most people would end up confused and unable to do what was expected. However, when we show the learner, what to do and better still when the task is broken up into small steps, learning is easier, more understandable and more fun.

The learning process is accelerated when we visualise what we have to. The brain cannot distinguish what is real and what is imagined so if we wish to practise a skill, then doing it over and over in our mind will reinforce what we have learned and accelerate the generalisation process of the skill. It must also be noted that the same goes for visualising faults and mistakes, so it is important that the correct skill is being visualised.

Visualisation also affects physical functioning if you visualise a physical action, state or process and your emotional functioning can be affected if you visualise an emotional state or process. Research in the 1930s demonstrated that when an person imagined tensing and relaxing a muscle group, he could influence that muscle group without doing any actual tensing or relaxing.

Visualisation can be different for different situations and Syer & Connolly draw a distinction between two classes of visualisation; Problem-solving and mental rehearsal. Problem-solving involves using visualisation to aid concentration, reduce anxiety and physical tension or to suggest possible courses of action. Mental rehearsal is the process of imagining yourself performing a specific movement of skill. For the trap or skeet shooter, mentally rehearsing the shot they are about to perform will quieten the mind because it has just seen the target break and therefore let the body shoot the target without interfering with a lot of useless verbal instructions.

How to visualise.

Effective visualisation is easier if it is learnt through the assistance of a sports psychologist as the leading of visualisation involves helping the athlete relax, giving appropriate instructions and affirmations, asking the right questions and noticing significant

expressions. Some guidelines for learning visualisation are;

- * Start with relaxation. Relaxation helps you learn new skills faster.
- * Stay alert. To effectively visualise both relaxation and concentration are essential. Concentration helps make the images stronger and allows clearer signals and gives more information about any skill you are visualising.
- * Use the present tense. Stay in the here and now and instructions that you give yourself should be in the present tense. This will make the visualisation more vivid.
- * Set realistic goals. Whilst it may be fun to imagine yourself as the world champion or national champion, it will be better if your visualisation involves imagining realistic steps that you can achieve in competitions. Imagining shooting a possible, then winning your grade, then the championship, and so on..... It is important that the process of shooting the target is visualised and not just the hitting it.
- * Set specific goals. Your goals in mental rehearsal should complement your goals in practise. If you choose a skill you want to improve, make it specific.
- * Use your senses. When you visualise, imagine not only what you see but what you smell, taste, feel, etc.
- * Visualise from the inside out and outside in. If you are a visual person who sees yourself in your mind's eye then also try to get inside yourself and feel, hear and see what your doing from the inside as well.
- * Visualise at the correct speed. Mental rehearsal where possible should replicate the performance situation, with the same playing conditions, such as speed of movement, objects, colours, climate
- * Practise regularly. Consistency is more important than length of rehearsal; you should practise regularly and if possible for the same amount of time and at the same time every day.
- * Enjoy it. Mental rehearsal should be enjoyable. If you get bored change your programme and remember that when you are relaxed and engaged in visual thinking, you are open to negative as well as positive thoughts and feelings.

How can I learn Imagery.

The clearer your images are the more effective they will be. To achieve this begin with 5-10 minutes of relaxation, describe your image in the present tense and use all your senses, and practise regularly.

Sit as comfortably as possible and take a few deep breaths then imagine;

1. A sunset.....a piece of sporting equipment (your shotgun).
Which sense are you using here?

2. The sound of a rainstorm on a tin roof.....sound of wind in the trees.....a favourite piece of music.
Which sense are you using here?

3. The sun on your skin.....the feel of your gun against your shoulder.....or your finger on the trigger.
Which sense are you using here?

Which of the three senses evoked the clearest images for you?

The use of imagery techniques is only limited by your imagination. Imagery is widely used for relaxation, mental rehearsal and problem solving. It can be effective in limiting self doubt and maintaining winning performances but it is up to you to use the techniques in your training and competition.

Psychological Skills for Shooting; Competition Preparation

In a month's time many readers will be preparing for and competing in the Trap Nationals at Wagga Wagga. In this article, I wish to explore the factors that affect competition preparation; organizational matters, expectations, information, performance anxiety, attunement and competition evaluation.

People feel more in control and are more likely to perform well in the build up to the competition is consistent and predictable. For the shooter, this means knowing the rules by which the competition will be run and any other information that is necessary to make the shooter feel comfortable and in control. Being comfortable with their gun, the type and speed of the ammunition they use, the trap type and the make of targets are all variables that will impact on the shooters ability to stay in control.

Expectations of each competitor are important and will vary considerably. Winter and Martin (1988) ask an interesting question, "Do athlete (shooters) need to be reminded about their chances of winning or are there alternatives?" Most people will falter when faced with the prospect of having to put in the perfect score. How many times have we seen at shoots where a competitor only has to shoot the possible to win the event or the high gun; for most this may normally be an easy task but faced with the expectation the shooter misses. Winter and Martin continue by stating that best performances comes when athletes have clearly defined performance goals and a strong desire to make the best of each situation that occurs during the competition. For the shooter, in the above scenario or in a shoot off, the goals into smaller and achievable segment the task becomes easier.

In the heat of the competition, shooters and athletes can be under a lot of pressure and they will not be able to recall information that is given to them. This is why coaching is best done away from the competition and in a calm and relaxed environment. Telling someone that they can win the high gun or the event if they shoot the possible, is the last thing, they either want to hear or need to hear.

Performance anxiety effects us all and though the use of relaxation, mental imaging, visualization, concentration, etc, shooters can reduce the anxiety to a level that is manageable. According to Winter and Martin (1988) from a psychological viewpoint three danger signs might indicate dysfunctional anxiety/arousal levels. Firstly, a passive attitude; where the voice tone is low, appearance is strained, reluctant to talk but just follows instructions. (To remedy this a physical warm-up and forceful instruction may be needed to raise the athlete's aggression level.) Secondly, a loss of self-confidence, where in addition to the above characteristics, athletes talk about problems, doubt their own ability and are defeatist. (To remedy this some positive mental rehearsal, specific goal setting and lots of positive affirmation). Finally, a lack of control, characterized by changed routines, lack of organization and apparent misconceptions about the competition. (To remedy this it is important to get the shooter to talk about the competition, his role and his goal).

In the weeks and days before the competition your thoughts and feeling will vary more from day to day than will your physical sensations. Whilst most shooters will try to stay fit and physically able to compete there is also a need to stay mentally attuned. To attune means to 'become aware' or focus attention'. Syer and Connolly (1984) claim that the mental equivalent of the physical warm-up that of concentration on the task at hand and that the emotional equivalent is psyching-up or getting yourself in the right mood. They add that in both cases, the process involves first noticing your thoughts and feelings and then replacing the distraction elements. Distractions that you haven't recognized and dealt with will inevitably contribute to a poor performance.

During the Nationals, to perform well and have fun, it is important that our minds are focused on the target we are about to shoot

and nothing else. Unfortunately, we are not often aware that our attentions elsewhere until we miss the target. This means that before each event you need to check by slowing down enough for any underlying distractions to surface. To do this you will need to, let out a deep breath and experience yourself physically as being where you are. Then close your eyes and notice what is happening inside, especially any thoughts or feelings connected with what was happening to you before your rival or what is due to happen to you when you leave. This moment of quiet allows the background noise of thoughts and feelings to be heard and then quieten down.

An often forgotten component of competition preparation is an evaluation of competition performance. This should be part of a review of goals and what was achieved. A revision of the goals should be made if they were found to be inappropriate.

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

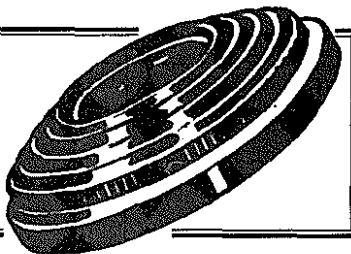
