The Victorian State Skeet Carnival was held at the Melbourne Gun Club on Saturday 6 May and Sunday 7 May 2000. It was preceded by the Pre State Carnival held on Friday 5 May. The competitors were fortunate to have good shooting weather on each of the three days although Friday was somewhat windy.

Pre State Carnival Results

1. 50 tgt 12 gauge Skeet Championship.

The overall winner and first in AA grade was Leigh Roberts with a perfect score of 89/89. Adrian Cousens was a close second with 88/89.

Andrew Chuck won the A grade with another perfect score of 50/50. Steve Pellegrino was second with 58/60.

Graham Whitaker alias "coach" won B grade with yet another perfect score 50/50. David Jackel junior was second with 54/55.

Victorian State Skeet Carnival Saturday 6 May 2000

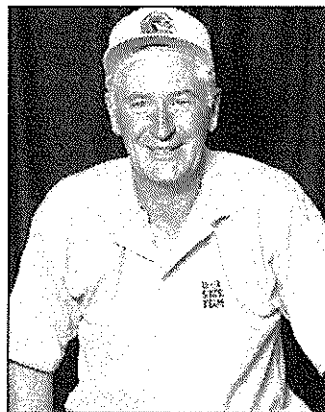

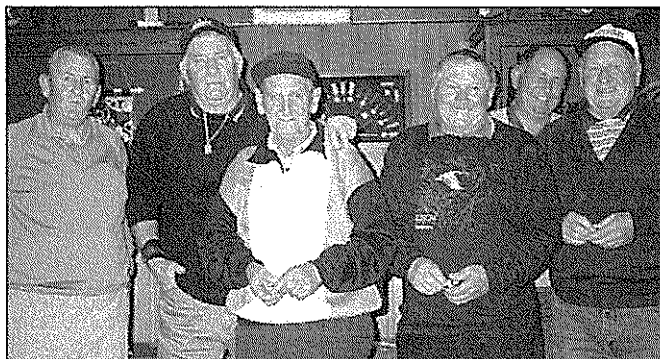

It is great that large numbers of shooters competed, although this can bring its own difficulties in organisational terms for example there were several instances where shoot-offs were conducted in less than favorable conditions given the late hour. The poor quality of the light resulted in some competitors finding themselves in a situation they considered to be disadvantageous. In the Ladies postal shoot for example some competitors shot literally in moon-light conditions. This being a year in which the Olympic Games are again being held in Australia some may hark back to the Men's High Jump held at the Olympic Games in Melbourne 1956 in its final stage when "Chilla" Porter (Australia) found himself in twilight jumping against Charlie Durnas (USA) who some people thought could see in the dark. Chilla on the other hand was reputed not to be endowed with the best eyesight. Many people had the perception that the result might well have been different had the final stages of the event been held in broad daylight. Perceptions of fairness in competition are very important. We seem to be challenged by time or lack of it. Do we need four days not three for the Championships? Should we choose to hold the event when the days are longer?

Last and very importantly we must not omit to acknowledge the work of the President of the Melbourne Gun Club, Bob Buchan. The Committee and staff, office, kitchen and groundspeople. Everyone involved in the organisation and running of these Championships must be commended because they all worked extremely hard and produced a tremendous event. The targets produced were described by several competitors as perfect. Nothing was too much for the people involved. They were not able to influence the weather but even so it was very kind. The speeches and general atmosphere at the presentations on the Sunday night made for a very friendly and convivial gathering and provided an appropriate cap to an exciting weekend of shooting for both experienced and not so experienced shooters alike.

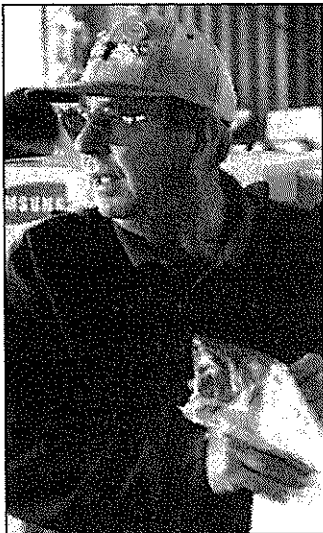

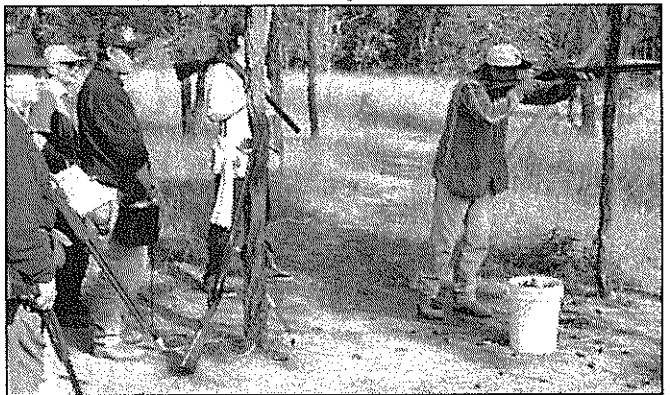
Joanne Nichols won the Ladies High Gun with 145/200. The Veterans High Gun went to the evergreen Bill Williams with 127/200.

Possibles are rare at the tricky Singleton layout. G Condron shot the only possible for the weekend and his achievement is worthy of recognition.

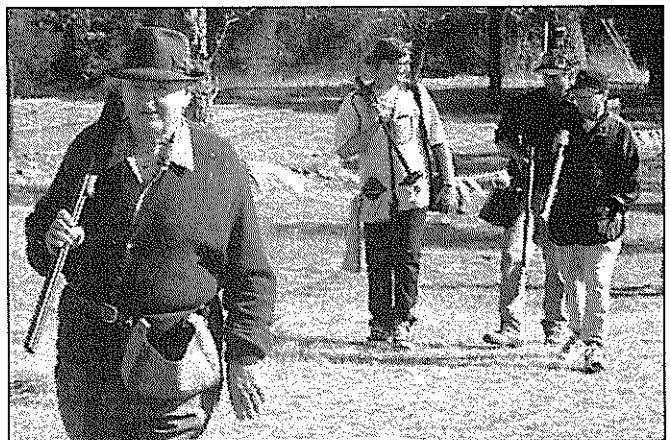
Evidence of how popular this shoot has become is the number of campers who drive in a tent peg and light a camp for a night or three.

Singleton Retravision and Samsung were again the major sponsor for Sundays Championship.

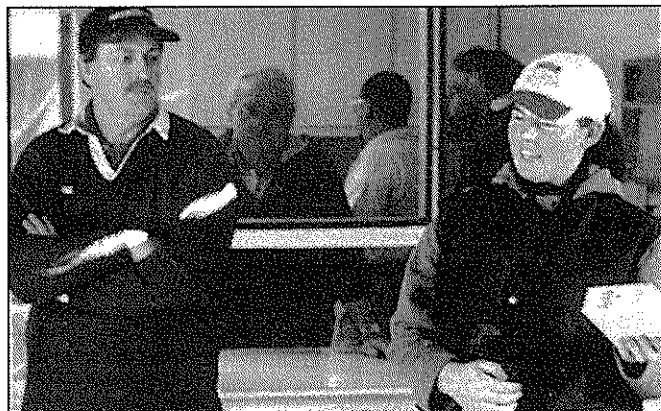

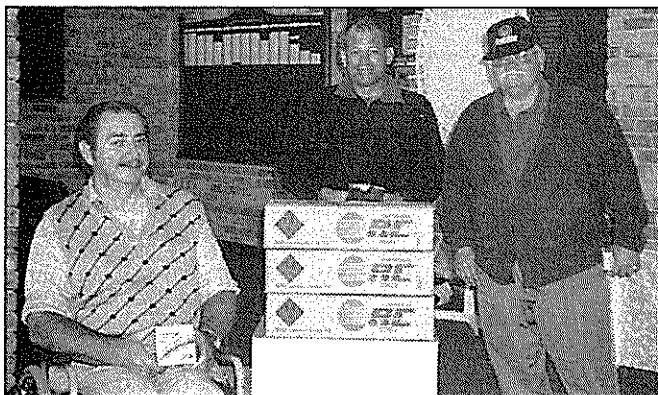

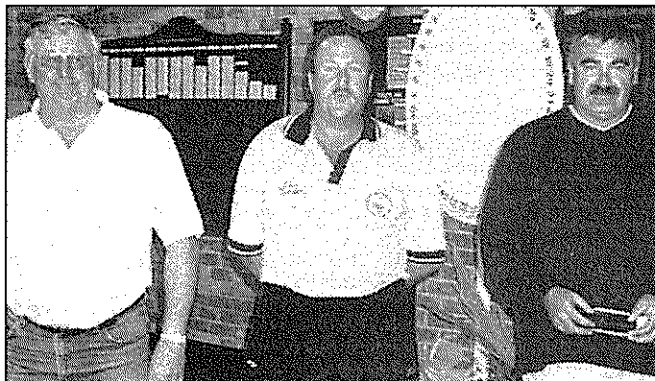

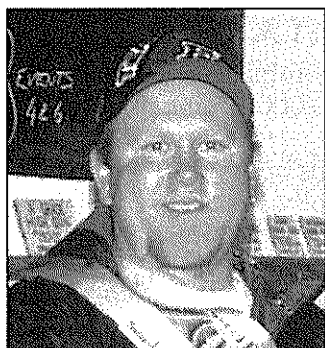

Over the past 10 Yrs, I have competed at 9 out of 10 I.S.S.F. National Championships with the hope every time of making the National Training Squad, and on several occasions I was fortunate enough to do so.

However, the issue that still bewilders me is the lack of organisation in the system and the lack of professionalism in the selection process. Not once has there been a selection criteria available in "Black & White" prior to paying your nominations and competing. When the criteria was once published in the ACTA magazine, it was changed afterwards, which seems pointless to start with.

What I find most unbelievable is the last team I was involved in was the Olympic Shadow Team, which was supposed to be the basis for Olympic Selection, and this was the most disorganised of them all. The days of a set selection process where the competitor that breaks the most targets to give every person an equal opportunity, would obviously be too fair and simple a process, I would like to see other shooters support my thoughts prior to the same process happening again and again.

I would like to take this opportunity to make a public apology to Pam Cook. After going through the selection process to make the Olympic Shadow Team, which included the nationals, Oceania Games, Commonwealth Cup - NZ, at our own expense, on several occasions I was asked by officials why I was not wearing an Australian Shooting Jacket, and I advised them that the last jacket I received was a DTL Jacket in 1994, which no longer fitted me. Upon being selected for Sydney World Cup Team, I was told that I required an Australian Shooting Jacket as they wanted the Aus Team to be in uniform. I was also told by Team Officials to order a jacket immediately, and that I should not worry about the cost, in which I did order the jacket through Pam Cook. When the jacket was finished, I was advised by Pam that she was not to send me the jacket until I had paid for it myself. Out of principal and sick and tired of being told two different stories, Pam is stuck with a jacket with my name on it, and again I apologise to her. I would also like to thank Newcastle/Lake Macquarie and Hermidale Gun Clubs for their support given to me throughout this period.

To the Editor

I am writing to express my frustration and disappointment, in the treatment ISSF shooter have received from the ACTA when it comes to Australian Team Selection.

Myself, like many other Olympic Trap and Skeet shooters, have spent countless hours training and thousands of dollars in an attempt to have the honour of representing this country overseas. However it appears that this association places little value on our efforts or insuring their selection procedure is fair to all shooters.

Without any knowledge as to the criteria used to select the Australian Team, shooters are required to first pay their nominations at the National Titles, in order to qualify for selection in the Australian Training Squad. Last year, the only time the criteria was published, it was changed numerous times throughout the year.

How are shooters expected to have confidence in pursuing team selection when the ACTA acts in such an unprofessional manner? If this was the action of a private enterprise it would be continually subject to legal challenges.

When I inquired as to why there isn't a set criteria or why it has been continually changed, the buck was passed from ACTA to ASA to coaches, selectors and the high performance manager. There are no excuses, it's just not good enough.

To receive a clearly defined selection procedure, before the Nationals, which ensures all shooters are given an equal opportunity to represent Australia, regardless of age and personal allegiances etc. I believe it is not too much to ask, but what every shooter deserves and expects.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS

SEPTEMBER 2000

Skeet shooting was invented around 1910 by a retired businessman named Charles Davies. He devised and evolved it on the grounds of his farm, which was located just outside a little town in Massachusetts, about half an hour north of Boston, called Andover. This much I'm sure of, because during the year that I worked for the NSSA, in my spare time I availed myself of their library and extensively researched the history of the sport. On one of my visits to Boston that year, I drove up to Andover and located Davies' farm. No sign of the original shooting range remains, but never the less it was a very emotional experience for me to stand in the field that was the birthplace of Skeet. It gave me some appreciation of how tennis players must feel when they first stand on the center court at Wimbledon.

However, the origins of Skeet in this country are somewhat more obscure. By the time I joined the ACTA, Skeet was well and truly established and the NSSA rules had long since been incorporated into our rulebook, and therein lies part of the root of our current problem. Because we transposed NSSA's rules into our rulebook at some distant past point in time, instead of simply annexing them to it, we lost the continuity of the evolution of the rules through the various changes and upgrades as determined by the NSSA from time to time. Thus our Skeet rules stagnated, became out of date and fell behind the rest of the world.

Then, to make matters worse, in the early eighties, a group of presumably well meaning trapshooters on the ACTA Rules Committee decided that our American Skeet rules needed "improving". Unfortunately, instead of updating our rules to the current NSSA standard, this "improvement" involved making them more similar to the existing Trapshooting rules, incorporating some ISU Skeet rules and even inventing some new rules of their own. This immediately created great animosity with the Skeet Shooters and a "them and us" situation rapidly escalated, culminating in the Skeet shooters effectively blocking the proposed changes on the basis that the ACTA had no jurisdiction to alter the rules of American Skeet. Although this worked in the short term, the Rules Committee simply went away and voted to change the name of the sport to Australian Skeet, and then bulldozed the proposed changes through without any further consultation with the end users.

Thus we currently have a unique set of "home rules" for Skeet shooting which seriously disadvantages any Australian Skeet shooters travelling overseas to anywhere other than New Zealand, who usually pattern their rules off ours. Additionally, any overseas American Skeet shooters visiting Australia are confused and handicapped by having to come to terms with our home grown idiosyncrasies, not to mention the embarrassment that this situation causes our own shooters. I guess this is one of the reasons we never see any NSSA shooters at our Skeet Nationals, even though mid November would be a natural extension of their Skeet shooting season, which finishes with the World Championships in October.

Over the past four or five years, the desire to standardize our Rules has gathered increasing momentum amongst the progressive element of our Skeet Shooters, and it was one of the main reasons why the Skeet Shooters Association was brought back out of recess last year. So it was no surprise when Skeet Rules disparities was the first item of business raised at the AGM, or when the motion to begin trying to eliminate them was passed unanimously. Immediately after the meeting, as the elected president, I applied myself to figuring out the most diplomatic and effective way to approach the ACTA in order to attempt to secure the required rules amendments.

Now I just love stories with happy endings and this is one of them. Before I could act, the ACTA Management Committee, who are obviously well informed, met and passed a recommendation to the Rules Committee that they instigate whatever changes were necessary to align the practical aspects of our Skeet rules with those of the NSSA. Talk about pennies from heaven! Subsequently, I was contacted by one of the members of the Rules Committee, who suggested that, as the ACTA had responded so positively and expediently to our initiative, it might be prudent for us, in the spirit of close co-operation, to offer to provide our expertise and share in the quite formidable workload involved in formulating a viable new rules proposal.

I immediately appointed a Skeet Rules Revision Sub Committee who worked tirelessly at the task for a couple of months and eventually produced a fully revised draft of the ACTA rules incorporating all the changes necessary to comply with NSSA guidelines. The American rulebook includes many technical and administrative rules, which would be either impractical or inappropriate for ACTA Skeet shooting, and the big trick was to sort those out from the practically oriented rules. The desired objective was to draft a set of rules, which were totally integratable with ACTA procedures and yet fully compatible with NSSA regulations. The final goal was to enable ACTA Skeet shooters to compete in NSSA events without encountering any operational differences and vice versa.

The final draft of this document was then submitted to the ACTA and it received provisional approval at their Full Executive Meeting in June. Two more shooters input meetings have been scheduled, one at the NSW Skeet Carnival in August, which will have recently been conducted by the time you read this, and another one at the Skeet Nationals in November. Last year the National 20 Gauge Skeet Championship was conducted in the absence of any 20 Gauge rules in our rulebook, however common sense prevailed and the required rules were simply borrowed from the NSSA rulebook. This year I am

hopeful that the National 20 Gauge can be used as a tryout and full dress rehearsal of the revised rules, and that after that trial run, and the Nationals Rules Meeting, the new rules can be ratified almost immediately.

If anyone is interested in seeing the draft document, please contact me and I'll be only too happy to provide you with a copy, and even happier to receive back your thoughts on it. For those people who are interested in the changes but not enthusiastic enough to grind their way through such a long and complicated manuscript, I have drawn up the following brief overview of most of the main amendments involved.

The target distance has been increased to 55 meters with an allowable tolerance of +/- 2 meters. This increase will provide a much more stable target flight in windy conditions. The ISU target sequence on Station 8 has been deleted in favour of the original format and the ban on single loading has been rescinded which removes the necessity for our reverse sequence on Station 7. A couple of uniquely Australian rules, such as the ban on practice between qualifying and shoot-offs have been removed, and the previous harsh penalty for firing twice at the same target has been replaced by a warning prior to disqualification. Five person squads have been standardized and the several arithmetic disparities, caused by metrification and similarisation, have been tidied up and corrected.

A couple of disallowments, which would be unsuitable for trapshooting, such as shooting out of turn at the referees discretion, and keeping a single target shot at, when doubles were thrown accidentally, have been reinstated. Several other Skeet rules, that would either make no sense or provide inequity in Trapshooting, such as foot positioning and proof double procedure, have been re-introduced. The limitations for small gauge shooting have been specified and various shoot-off procedures, such as the number of allowable competitors per squad, the ability to begin shooting concurrently on multiple fields, and the "mutually agreeable format" rule, have all been defined.

Other areas where practical applications differ between Trap and Skeet have been addressed. Ten seconds in Trapshooting should be more than adequate time to shut your gun, mount it and call for your target after the previous shooter has fired. However, specifying an identical timeframe for Skeet, where you have to do all the above, after you have waited for the previous competitor to dismount his gun, break it open, unload it and step off the pad, before you can even step on, establish your foot position and load your gun, is somewhat unrealistic. NSSA's time limit of 15 seconds, combined with 22 minutes per round, makes a lot more sense.

Similar disparities arise in other areas. Clearing the machine after two broken targets in Trap is probably quite reasonable where all shots are basically similar. However, in Skeet, where some shots are relatively easy and others extremely difficult, the broken target clearing rule obviously needs to be administered appropriately. Long run breaks and records is another area where Skeet has long suffered the confines of Trap rules and sought differentiation and clarification. From now on, changing the format of a shoot-off, or shooting a different style of event, will neither add to nor terminate a break in progress. A couple of quaint Trap rules allow our "National" record to be set in some other country, and provide a separate "all comers" category for overseas visitors shooting in Australia. Skeet has never done this and now that will be documented.

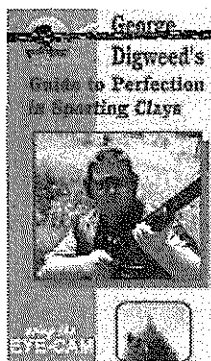
The absence of an NSSA style professional refereeing system has caused much inequity and many problems for Skeet shooting in Australia, particularly in the "pulling" of targets. The recent introduction and wide acceptance of electronic voice activated target release equipment for Trapshooting has pretty much solved most of the difficulties that they had previously experienced in that area, due to the use of manual pullers of varying quality. However our rulebook as yet has not been updated to provide the necessary authorization to permit this type of equipment to be used. In order to rectify that situation, and to provide other avenues for greater equity, where this type of equipment is not available, the relevant areas in the rulebook have also been modified and amended.

And now to a couple of other issues. I was somewhat surprised to learn recently that our long serving National President, Mr Glenn Woodhatch, had decided not to seek re-election. I think that Glenn did an excellent job of leading our organization for eight years, and I personally enjoyed his flexible and innovative leadership style while working under him at numerous National Championships. I wish him all the best for the future and I congratulate our new president, Mr John Byrne on his election. I'm sure he will also do a great job and I look forward to working closely with him.

Vale. During the last couple of weeks I have received news of the deaths of two previous National Skeet Champions. I have known Barney Rooke and Ray Melville almost as long as I have been shooting clay targets. Both men were great shooters, great competitors and close personal friends of mine and I am greatly saddened by their passing. As the defending title holder on both occasions when these shooters received their Silver Australia Badges, I was pleased to be able to hand the trophy on to men I considered to be worthy winners. In 1982, on my way up to the Brisbane Nationals, I stayed the night with Ray at his home in Tamworth. The next morning, before leaving, we shot some practice on his private Skeet field and I gave him a few pointers on his shooting. A couple of days later, after winning the National Skeet Championship, he offered to give me a few lessons on the way home. And I cannot remember the last time I shot Skeet at Wagga without having Barney on my squad, it was just one of those things we always did. In Perth in 1987, when he added the Australian Skeet Title to his New Zealand Silver Fern, I had the pleasure of pulling his last 50 targets and being the first to shake his hand..... PROPOSED ACTA SKEET RULE CHANGES

The following is a summary of the Skeet rule changes proposed by the ACTA Rules Committee and endorsed by the Skeet Shooters Association for introduction into the ACTA Rule Book at a date which is yet to be decided. The ACTA Rules Committee and Championships Committee will be convening a special open forum meeting at the 2000 Skeet Nationals to discuss the proposed rule changes and any other Skeet related issues with the shooters in attendance. As the current ACTA Rulebook does not contain the necessary guidelines for Small Gauge Shooting, the ACTA Rules Committee have also approved the conduct of this year's National 20 Gauge Skeet Championship under the new rules as a familiarization and test event.

The aim of the amended rules is to align the practical aspects of the Skeet Shooting Rules of the ACTA as closely as possible with the Skeet Shooting Rules of the NSSA, which is the world standard body for Skeet Shooting. The objective is allow Australian Skeet Shooters to compete in overseas Skeet Competitions, and in particular the World Skeet Shooting Championships, without being disadvantaged by rules variations, and to also allow overseas Skeet Shooters to compete in Australia on an equitable basis.

SUMMARY:

1. All metric measurement conversions have been checked and amended where necessary to conform to the respective NSSA imperial measurements. The main changes here will be the size of the shooting stations and the target flight distance.
2. The shooting stations become slightly smaller, but in conjunction with the foot position rule, no real change will be apparent.
3. The target flight distance changes from 50 meters with an allowable tolerance of minus nil and plus five meters, to 55 meters ± 2 meters. This will provide a more stable target flight, particularly in windy conditions
4. The foot position rule has been changed to align with the NSSA rule, where any part of both feet must be within the station area. The perceived advantage in Trapshooting, of standing with your toe slightly over the line, does not exist in Skeet shooting where different people prefer to stand in various positions all around the shooting station, and therefore a more lenient rule has been adopted by NSSA in regard to foot positioning.
5. Five person squads will be standardized and six person squads will only be used in unusual circumstances and by mutual consent.
6. One legal target may be viewed after each illegal target. It is hoped that ACTA shooters will view this rule in the manner intended by NSSA, where it is only exercised on the more difficult targets.
7. The referee will be empowered to allow people to shoot out of turn if he feels that it is warranted in the interests of saving time.
8. In singles, if a double is accidentally thrown, the shooter may elect to shoot at the first target, and if so it will be scored.
9. In doubles, provided the first target is legal, if the second target is illegal for any reason, the shooter may elect to shoot at the first target, and if so it will be scored.
10. Single loading to shoot single targets will be approved, but double loading will be recommended on all stations except seven and eight. This will eliminate the inequity currently created by the necessity for different rules for the users of release trigger guns.
11. The target shooting sequence on Station seven will revert to the original sequence, which is the same as Station six.
12. The target shooting sequence on Station eight will revert to the original sequence where everyone shoots the high target before anyone shoots the low target. The major advantage here is a very significant time saving.
13. Shooting twice at the same target will no longer result in the loss of a target, but will invoke one warning from the referee before disqualification from the event.
14. Practice between qualification and shoot-offs will be allowed. The previous rule was very confusing, almost impossible to administer and inequitable to lower grade shooters, who could not be sure of what score would shoot off.
15. The limitations and specifications for both guns and ammunition for small gauge shooting are stipulated.
16. The various shoot-off procedures are laid out, including squad sizes, the option of mutually agreeable determination methods and the fact that, unlike Trap, multiple squad shoot-offs may commence concurrently on different traps.
17. The Trapshooting time limit of 10 seconds is extended to 15 seconds for Skeet, but is controlled by specifying the time allowed for the whole squad to shoot a full round or for the completion of the event.
18. The criteria for Long Run Breaks are specified, particularly in the

areas where they differ from Trapshooting. Long Run Breaks for both regular Skeet and Skeet Doubles will be recognized, and provided the break continues on consecutive days over the same program, shooting a different event will neither add to nor terminate any break in progress. Additionally, any change in the format of a shoot-off, away from the normal shoot-off procedure for that event, will neither add to nor terminate a break in progress.

19. The criteria for Long Run Records are specified, particularly in the areas where they differ from Trapshooting. Our National Record will not be permitted to be established in a foreign country, and all entrants engaged in competition in this country will be eligible to establish the National Long Run Record.

20. As the professional refereeing structure, upon which the NSSA system of shooting is based, does not exist in this country, provision has been incorporated into the rules for the use of voice activated target release equipment (phono-pulls) or other equitable methods of target release that are approved and authorized by shoot management.

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

STATE LEVEL DRUG TESTING FOR SPORT

Reprinted with permission from Australian Sports Drugs Agency. The Australian Sports Drug Agency (ASDA) and a number of State Governments have joined forces to implement state-based testing programs. These programs, which broaden Australia's anti-doping system, deter state level athletes from using banned sports drugs through testing and education services.

Legislation

The Australian Sports Drug Agency act 1990 (ASDA Act) enables State Governments to confer powers on ASDA to conduct State Level drug testing of athletes.

State level testing can be facilitated through a Commonwealth/State Government Complementary Legislation Scheme, or through a contract with the State Government or State Sporting Organisations.

New South Wales, Victoria and ACT already have drugs in sport legislation in place, while Queensland, Western Australia, and South Australia are expected to introduce legislation soon.

Complementary State Government legislation strengthens the National Drugs in Sport Framework.

Queensland Testing.

The Australian Sports Drug Agency (ASDA) in conjunction with the Queensland Government launched a state based testing program in October 1999.

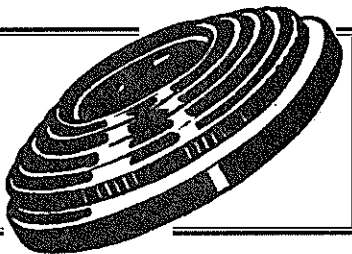
ASDA is contracted by the Queensland Government to provide education services to athletes, coaches and administrators and to promote the risk management guide. A second round of this program is planned to begin in July 2000.

The Queensland Government assists State Sporting Organisations (SSO) to meet minimum operating standards by developing "A Risk Management Guide to Anti-Doping Processes".

Minimum operating standards for SSOs include having:

- a doping policy consistent with their National Sporting Organisation,
- an education strategy
- an athlete consent form; and
- a result management strategy.
