ISSF NATIONALS - BRISBANE

The ISSF Nationals will be shot at the Brisbane Gun Club at the end of the month. It is hoped that many of you will be attending these events which commence on October 28th and run for 9 days. The program has been well publicised in previous clay target magazines. A special thank you to those individuals and companies that have donated sashes and trophies for these events. The Qld Association has taken on the repsonsibility for running these championships; we appreciate their efforts in this regard.

STATE CARNIVALS

Over the next few weeks several State Carnivals will also be conducted around Australia. These carnivals are usually very well run shoots and I encourage all shooters to support their State Associations by attending these events. The sad part is that some carnivals are being shot on the same weekends. I would strongly encourage the State Associations to negotiate with each other and attempt to programme these events to avoid such clashes. Some shooters do travel around and would like to attend the carnivals in each state. Cooperation is essential for the well being of our sport and our shooters.

JUNIOR SKEET TEAM

Congratulations to Brett Miall, David O'Sullavan and Joshua Daly on being selected in the junior skeet team to travel to the USA. These shooters will take part in the Work Skeet Championships held in San Antonio, Texas. Team coach Mr Adrian Cousins who has proven experiences and success in this environment will able assist them. I am sure that these juniors will benefit greatly from the experience.

FIREARMS LEGISLATION

The issue of the Firearms Legisla-

tion and National Gun Laws continues to be a festering sore for all of us. Recently major changes have been announced in regards to the importation and availability of handguns and the laws on how gun shops sell these weapons. On a more positive note a recent report commissioned by Amanda Vanstone, Minister of Justice and Customs highlighted the fact that legitimate. licensed firearms owners and registered guns are involved in only a small percentage of incidents involving firearms. The report concluded that legal firearm owners are not causing the problems and that they should not be further penalised for the actions of people in possessions of illegal firearms. One of the main methods of illegal acquisition of firearms by individuals is through theft from gun dealers and licensed owners. Given that thefts from licensed firearms owners serve as one source of firearms for illicit traffickers, it is important that firearms owners comply and store their firearms according to set regulations. This in effect may contribute to the reduction of opportunistic theft rendering securely stored firearms less accessible. As legal firearms users we need to demonstrate that we are responsible in our actions and give no opportunity for us to be further penalised for participating in our chosen sport.

QLD STATE ISSF CARNIVAL


The Townsville Gun Club hosted this years event — and for all those suffering from the southern cold — the 28 degrees plus for a few days was certainly a very welcome respite.





CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A fee of \$20 may be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

2. Ŝquads of 5 (or 6 if necessary) to shoot 100 targets per day, in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps, 2nd 50t moving up one trap. eg 1-2, 2-3, 3-4, 4-1, etc.

3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.

4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets. Shooters are expected to perform changeovers (between rounds as well as between squads) as quickly as possible, and certainly not exceed the maximum time limit allowed of two minutes. Anyone exceeding that time limit may be penalised.

5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be resquaded later in the event, but resquading is not guaranteed, and non-participation is a possibility.

6. Should a shooter being late for his squad not be resquaded or elect to withdraw from the event, any refund of nominations paid is not guaranteed.

7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.

8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the loss of one target in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the loss of one target may be incurred in the event concerned.

9. Shooters will be selected from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, any penalty for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.

10. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot

Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised.

11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.

13. Optional purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.

14. Optional purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.

15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.

17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals, trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.

18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00 am. or at the discretion of the Tournament Director

19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate

20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors -Tournament Director to adjudicate.

22. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors and second family members only, they being wives or husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.

23. All competitors must comply with Firearm Licensing Laws in their state of residence and in the state hosting the National Championships.






William Edward Shields 22/3/1923 - 25/7/2000

Ray had been an inspiration in what he had achieved and anyone that had read his book would agree that he was a true Aussie battler that made it.



CONDITIONS OF ENTRY -OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE NATIONALS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

2. Targets to be shot in brackets of 25, squads of 6 Olympic Trap, squads of 6 ISSF Skeet and rounds of 25 Pair for Open/Jnr Double Trap and 20 Pair for Womens Double Trap.

Nominations to be received by 3pm the day prior to the beginning of an Event or such time as determined by the Tournament Director.
 Shooter will be squadded as per ISSF rules and regulations and any

4. Shooter will be squadded as per ISSF rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw.

5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable event. 6. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.

7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

8. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.

9. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfill their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement who must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement no being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may INCUR A PENALTY AS PERSCRIBED UNDER INTERNATIONAL RULES.

10. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may will be penalised up to FIVE (5) TARGETS.

11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.

13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective High Gun.

15. Junior shooters are eligible for their section as well as the Open.

16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.

17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing, 1st, 2nd, 3rd in all events.

18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.

19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.

21. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to second family members only, they being wives or husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.

22. All competitors must comply with Firearm Licensing Laws in their state of residence and in the state hosting the National Championships.

Note: In the Women's squad 1 - 5, the next shooter with the highest score, i.e. number 6 will be the first reserve. If a shooter is unable to take their place, the first reserve will then take that place in the Training Squad.

1. Points will apply for national ISSF Championships and each elimination.

2. Points will be allocated to the competitors for Trap, Skeet and Double Trap, who go to the World Cups. The highest placed Australian in each dis-cipline will receive 15 points for first for the men, then 12 points for second place, 10 for third, then 8, 6, 5, 4, 3 and 2. The six (Men) and five (Women) with the highest points after the Nationals, Elimination 1 and the World Cups, will make the Squad invited to participate at the Australia Cup Final, from which the World Championship Team will be selected. 3. At the completion of the Australia Cup in January, 2001, the competitors will select the World Cup that they would like to attend.

will select the World Cup that they would like to attend. The highest Point scorer in each discipline will have first choice of the World Cups (as a reward for their efforts). Each shooter (in accordance with their points total) will then be asked for their preferences until all have had a choice.

4. After the World Cups and the Australian Cup Final are all completed, the three highest Point scorers in all disciplines, will be selected for the World Championships.

5. Shooters who are unable to fill their positions will be replaced by the next highest scorer.

6. The Shooting Committee will have the right at eliminations to adjust the amount of targets to coincide with the State or Territory.

PERFORMANCE

Open: After three World Cups, the lowest three scores will drop out, leaving a squad of six to compete in the Australia Cup Final. The three highest point scorers who are chosen to compete at the World Championships will attend the last World Cup, which is usually held back to back' with the World Championships. In the year of the Commonwealth Games, the top two will compete. If the Commonwealth games are before the World Championships the two highest point scores will be selected.

Women: After the Nationals and one elimination, the lowest point scorer will drop out, leaving five shooters in each discipline. We will then send

that five to the first World Cup for Women's events. The highest three point scorers from the eliminations will shoot in the first three positions. The lowest two will shoot in MQS positions. Points will be allocated after the first 75 targets in Trap and Skeet and after 120 targets in Double Trap. The five shoters will then compete at the Australia Cup Final and the three highest point scorers will be selected for the last World Cup's Women's events and the World Championships.

A shooter must attain these travelling scores before they are sanctioned to attend international events.

TIED SCORES

1. Any tied scores at eliminations will be broken by the ISSF shoot off system - miss and out.

2. If at the end of elimination's/World Cups there are any ties for placings, the positions will be determined by the ISSF shoot off system - miss and out.

JUNIOR (TRAP, SKEET AND DOUBLE TRAP)

Juniors will be selected to form a Training Squad in ISSF shooting disciplines and this will be known as the Elite Junior Squad. The States will nominate the Juniors whom they feel meet the criteria. The Shooting Committee may also select Juniors who come to their attention as outstanding competitors or are showing immense improvement. This training squad will attend the Australia Cup in January as their first camp. Their scores will be noted, as will their behaviour and compatibility with other team members, their willingness to listen and to learn.

They will then attend the Australia Cup Final (which will be held in the middle of the year). At this event a team will be chosen to compete at the ISSF World Championships, in all disciplines. The team will be chosen on the scores posted at this event only, including the finals. 1st, 2nd and 3rd. No competitor will be selected for international competition if he/she has not shot the travelling score nominated by the Shooting Committee for each of the particular disciplines at the Australian Clay Target Association's ISSF National titles, the Australia Cup and the Australia Cup Final.

The Australian Clay Target Association will endeavour to have funding available to help competitors chosen, but some personal funding may be necessary. The availability to fill these positions must be made as the team is named, at the end of the Australian Cup Final. The amount of funding will be announced as soon as possible for the Junior squad and we would ask all parents or guardians, to inform the Australian Clay Target Associa-tion if their Junior/Juniors will be able to attend the World Championships. The year 2001 event will be held in Cairo, Egypt.

CRITERIA FOR SELECTING JUNIORS FOR ISSF ELITE JUNIOR SQUAD

1. Shooters showing potential and interest for ISSF events, and who are posting reasonable scores or have shown a vast improvement every time they have competed.

2. Preferably in the 13 year to 17 year age bracket.

3. Those who are willing to mix readily with other Juniors and whose social behaviour is acceptable i.e. behaviour and manners.

4. Are willing pupils who are not afraid to try new techniques/methods suggested by the coaches.

5. Have strong parent/guardian support and financial backing. 6. Juniors in the age bracket of 17 to 19 years will be considered if they show exceptional talent - thus making their transition into the Open section easier.

FUNDING

The funding for all World Cups and World Championships will be on a funded basis. The Australian Clay Target Association will endeavour, through the Australian Sports Commission, to apply for support to encourage shooters to maintain high standards, but some self-funding may be necessary depending on the funding allocated by the government.

SHOOTER RESPONSIBILITY

All shooters must abide by the ISSF eligibility rules and anti-doping regulations. The Olympic Team members will have first priority on World Cups as part of their training for the year leading up to the Olympics. This will be clearly made known in the year of the Olympics.

SHOOTING COMMITTEE

At the discretion of the Shooting Committee, it will have the right to alter or amend any of these rules.

It will not have the right to disadvantage any shooter who has qualified according to these Rules.

The Australian Clay Target Association's Shooting Committee shall submit the selected names to the Australian Shooting Association who shall have the final decision on team selections for international events.

NSWCTA JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT CAMP Newcastle-Lake Macguarie **Clay Target Club, June 2000**

The weather could not have been more perfect on 24 and 25 June for the coaching weekend organised by NSWCTA.

Twelve young shooters ranging in age from 13 up to 17 assembled at the Newcastle-Lake Macquarie Clay Target Club with a view to improving their shooting capabilities. Coaches for the weekend were Level 2 coach Pud Burgess and Level 3 coach Robyn Faber. Some of the young shooters were accompanied by one or both parents and some of these tagged on to the training sessions with good results.

Accommodation as at the NSW Sport and Recreation Ground at Myuna Bay in a brand new 8 bedroom lodge with extensive recreation room, large kitchen and room for 36.

Some of the attendees had only a few month's experience whilst the remainder had been competing on average for 2 years. On the evening before coaching commenced, each shooter was invited to write down some personal short and long term goals for their shooting and identify aspects of their performance which they wished to address.

Program consisted of a general discussion on factors which can affect the performance generally, including nutrition, hydration, fitness and flexibility, vision and the importance of routine. This was followed by gun patterning, which identified some gun fit and gun mount problems, and discussions and demonstration of stance and basic techniques.

After lunch prepared by Sue Lindsay and her helpers from the Club, the group divided into two squads according to grade designation for some practice at personally analysing individual shots and then shooting 25 targets DTL with some analysis of identified problems. During this session each shooter's individual 'routine' was recorded. Following individual advice on technique to each shooter, the squads tackled a further 25 targets shot DTL, pointscore, before returning to the clubhouse to discuss skills awareness and complete a personal assessment of their abilities in many aspects of their shooting. During the shooting phase one shooter shot his first 25 break. A very happy young man!

Having all partaken of a BBQ tea cooked by some of the parents, watched the Australia/Argentina rugby test and worked off some energy playing mini soccer with a tennis ball, each participant sat down individually with either Pud or Robyn and developed a personal plan for their shooting taking into account their goals, their observed routines and their skills awareness assessments.

Next morning we all discussed techniques for improving performance, how to concentrate and how to use visualisation in training. Competition routine, planning and shooting routines were all included. Then back to the traps. Everyone concentrated on perfecting their individual routine and working on particular problems identified the day before. The 25 break shooter of Saturday proceeded to make it a 50 break! (actually for the whole 100 targets he made a 70 break so the mental hurdle of getting the first 25 is well and truly over). Another, known as the 'dustman' for his love of really breaking the targets, recorded a 25 break with a Personal best pointscore of 69 in C grade! Then another recorded a 75/75 in B grade, also a personal best. Another raw beginner shot 13 single barrels in a row. Overall each shooter achieved some personal best and it will not be long before most are looking at regrades if they stick to their plans. One who had reached AA grade just prior to the camp is settling into a good routine and looks set to become a very consistent competitor.

Following a short revision of the training in the club house, each shooter received a certificate of participation and had lunch prior to departure. There were some keen shooters who stayed to shoot some trench and skeet and applied some of their new techniques to these disciplines with good results.

Thanks go to the NSWCTA, coaches Pud Burgess and Robyn Faber, Newcastle-Lake Macquarie Gun Club, mums and dads for transport and assistance and to the participants who were a credit to their sport. A great bunch of kids and a real depth of talent. It will be interesting to see how they develop.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS OCTOBER 2000

My periodical references to NSSA's refereeing system generate numerous enquiries as to how that structure operates. Fundamentally, it's quite different to ours. The first thing you notice is that there are no scorers. That's because the referees are not voluntary labour. They are paid trained professionals who perform all three functions of pulling, adjudicating and scoring. They are readily distinguishable from the shooters by their uniforms, which are plain white, collared T-shirts, which have "referee" printed in bold black lettering across the back. Actually, the basis of their whole system works almost in reverse to ours.

In Australia, refereeing is nearly always a by-product of being a shooter. However, that is not the case in America, where most referees don't shoot, and if they do, it is generally a by-product of being a referee. Over there, refereeing is almost a totally separate activity to shooting. Most people get into refereeing as a second job, which you can do on the weekends to generate extra income. They are usually paid around \$100 per day in cash (so it's tax-free) and at the larger shoots, where complimentary meals are generally provided for the shooters, the referees are always included too. And at the Major Shoots, where the most experienced referees are sought, and may sometimes travel almost as far as the shooters, accommodation is also often included in their remuneration package.

Examining the system from the top down, NSSA appoints a National Chief Referee. This is a permanent position and generally continues until that person retires or resigns for some reason. Adequate notice is usually given in either of these cases, and a carefully groomed understudy is then the next appointee. The Chief Referee's responsibilities are quite vast. His duties at the World Shoot are similar to, but more extensive than, those of our Shoot Marshall. They include the advance recruiting, sorting and appointing of all the required referees. During the Shoot he supervises all the on-field activities, including referees rosters, scoresheet movement and the arbitration of rules decisions. He also arranges, collates and supervises all shoot-offs.

Outside the World Shoot, he devises the referee's test each year, handles all the necessary paperwork and maintains the referees register. Towards the end of each shooting year, he screens candidates for the Master Referees Awards. These awards are very prestigious, are presented at the World Shoot, and only about 20 referees qualify each year. To be considered for selection, you need to fulfil fairly extensive criteria. First you need to have an unblem ished record for the year, combined with several written references from designated people. Then you need to have pulled a minimum of 25,000 registered targets during the year, and finally you need to have pulled at the World Shoot for at least three of the past five years.

Directly under the NSSA Chief Referee are the Chief Referees of each of the nine Zones that the membership is divided up into. The order of States and Zones in the US is in reverse to the system we use in Australia. Instead of each State being divided up into Zones, the country is divided up into seven Zones, each of which contains about seven States. Zone 8 is all the various military forces and Zone 9 is all other countries. Thus Australia is in Zone 9, but as the bulk of Zone 9 members reside in Canada, that's where the zone is administered. The Zone Chief Referees are responsible for all the referees in their Zone, and for organising and running all the field activities at the Zone Shoots, which are always held on the second week-end in August each year.

Next in the chain of command are each of the State Chief Referees, who are appointed by their various State Associations. They are responsible for all the referees in their respective State, and for the field operations at their State Shoot. One step down from them are the Chief Referees of each of the registered Clubs. They are appointed by the Club's Committees and are responsible for all the referees in their Club, and for all the field organisation during competition shoots at their Club.

Working from the bottom up, if you wish to enter the world of professional refereeing, you generally start out by approaching the Chief Referee of your local Club. He will give you some basic training and then put you to work as a "paid unskilled labourer" pulling on practice fields. When you and he feel that you have reached the required level of expertise, he will put you through the standard referee's test, which involves both written and practical exams. If you pass these, he signs your application form and forwards it, with your fee, to the State Chief Referee for approval, after which it goes to NSSA.

They send you back a referee's licence, which is a little card about as big as a credit card, and a round cloth patch for your shirt, which reads "registered referee" and the year. Incidentally, your accreditation is only good for one year. If you wish to continue refereeing, you have to take the new written test each November, for the upcoming year, as NSSA's year runs from November 01 to October 30. Once you have your licence, your progress is then only limited by your enthusiasm. Many referees just work around their local area, whereas others aspire to greater heights.

Those who have their sights set on working at the World Shoot some day, or becoming a Master Referee, will phone the Chief Referees of all the surrounding Clubs and inform them that they are accredited, looking for work and willing to travel. After that it's a waiting game. Like most things, it's a little hard to break into when you're new, but provided you do a good job, once you get established and known, you can probably get work somewhere, just about every week-end of the shooting season, which runs from April through October. And if you're still keen, during the winter you can probably find work pulling practice on hourly rates around the local clubs.

Actually, although the money is probably what got most of the top referees started, it's not what eventually keeps them in the game. It becomes a mixture of the social aspect and the camaraderie and the fun of travelling and the desire to excel at what you do, and to earn the respect of your peers and the other "players" in the whole shooting game. Rather than being a means to an end, it becomes an end in itself. It becomes a separate hobby or pastime that you just happen to do at the same time and place that the other people shoot. I know a lot of referees who are keener than many of the shooters. I have shot at a Major Shoot one weekend, travelled hundreds of miles across several States to another one the following week-end, and found half the same referees.

And they are a very tightly knit community. They go to great lengths to assist and co-operate with one another, and they usually don't allow egos to cloud their thinking. You'll often see State Chief Referees working on the fields pulling targets in neighbouring States, when there is a big Shoot on there. And be very careful that you don't blame your bad shooting on the referees or abuse them unjustly. Otherwise you could end up with your name in the black book of half the referees in the country. Having said that, they will also sweat blood for you if you do the right thing by them. And another thing; they love to pull 100s just as much as you love to shoot them. Although they will never give you anything you don't deserve, they and their peers will rate the success of their day by how many 100s they pulled, so you never have to wonder how hard they are trying to do a good job.

Skeet shooters usually travel around in groups of five because that's a squad. However, referees usually travel around in groups of three, because that's a "field crew". Obviously a referee can't stand out on a field and work nine hours straight, without a drink or a meal or a rest, so all the fields are divided up into pairs, with three referees assigned to each pair. How they work those fields is entirely up to them, and provided they stay within the generally accepted guidelines, the Chief Referee will not normally interfere with any system they devise, provided it works.

Sometimes they will work 200 on and 100 off, but that's rather unusual and fairly hard work, particularly on hot days. The usual roster is 100 on and 50 off. Under that system, first thing in the morning, one referee starts out pulling 100, another starts out pulling 50, and the other starts out on a break. At 9.45 the third one takes over from the second, at 10.30 the second one takes over from the first, and that pattern rolls on through the day. Thus, when you go out to shoot, you have a 50% chance of either getting one referee for the whole 100 or changing referees at 50. However, you generally won't know which pulling roster you're on, until you've shot 50, and see if they change. Most shooters prefer to work with the one referee for the whole 100, because after a couple of stations they usually settle into "synch" with you. But you don't have any control over this, and just have to take your chances. Occasionally, if your whole squad is trying very hard and shooting well, a "split" referee may give up his break for you. Always remember to thank him afterwards, because this is the highest compliment a referee can pay you. And by doing so he confines himself to pulling 250 straight and working almost four hours without a break, because their roster system cannot accommodate reshuffling.

Also shooters and referees don't usually mix socially. Perhaps this is partially a class barrier, but it is also a reflection of the fact that they are simply two different groups of people, doing two different jobs, who just happen to be doing them in the same place, at the same time. Initially, I did not recognise this distinction. And for a variety of reasons, not the least of which was the fact that referee's card games are a lot easier to break into than those of the shooters, I became an exception to that general rule, almost to the point of becoming an enigma within the system.

During the six years between 1988 and 1993, I pulled over 100,000

targets, but never accepted any payment for it. However, what I do have to show for it, are a pair of Master Referees certificates that hang in pride of place on my memorabilia wall, right alongside my 400x400 badges, my All American Team patches and three World Championship awards. And along the way I gained a lot of extra friends, shared in a lot of great times and accumulated a bunch of great refereeing stories, but that's another tale for another day.



Dear Sir,

I write this letter in reply to those sent in by Tom Turner and Barty Brighenti which I found printed in the September, 2000 CTSN magazine.

on behalf of the Shooting Committee and the ACTA I would like to take this opportunity to explain to everyone just what had been happening with the Team selection process for ISSF shooting, for the training squads and the Final Teams.

My involvement here is that I have been the Chairman of the Shooting Committee since 1994, the ACTA delegate to the Australian Shooting Association (referred to late in this letter as the ASA), Team Manager since 1995 and an Olympic selector since 1997.

prior to 1994 the selection procedure was indeed a very haphazard process, where Teams were picked from National Titles on a 'first past the post basis", which meant that not always the most consistent or top Australian shooters picked for the Teams. I have seen both Michael and Russell have an 'off day' with their shooting yet they are consistently in the top 2 to 3 shooters in the world. I have also seen a shooter 'win' major events at the National titles and not even be considered for a position on the team as he did not have 'overseas experience'. How are you supposed to get this without being included in a team is ludicrous!

Our Committee in 1994 wanted to rectify the selection process, to make it as fair as possible for all competitors, whether they were experienced or inexperienced, for those who could shoot 'consistent' scores over a period of different competitions.

At the 1994 ISSF National Titles in Melbourne we called a meeting with all interested shooters so we could talk over selection procedures and asked what the shooters wanted the ACTA to do. This meeting was well attended and produced many ideas. At the conclusion of that meeting I asked all in attendance to go away, think about what we had spoken of and put pen to paper and send me what they saw as the fairest form of team selection. I received 7 replies to this, mostly from the better performed shooters with 'international experience'. Of course there were 7 different systems put forward but there were similar threads in all, but the most noticeable was the amount of targets deemed necessary to select the Teams over, and certainly did not include 'first past the post' Nationals.

Given that we had a responsibility to the Australian Government (whose funds were use for these Teams) and to the ACTA to field the best possible teams at International events, the Shooting Committee then looked at some of the Selection Policies used by leading shooting nations around the world and coupling the best ideas from these with the 7 replies received and what the Australian Sports Commission (later referred to as the ASC) and the ACTA required, we formulated a Selection Criteria policy in 1995 using a Point System giving the shooters points on a scale of 10 to 1 from the National Titles (10 points for 1st down to 1 point for 10th place), these continuing to add up over the following 3 elimination events (combined with Training Camps) plus the international events the shooters attended.

When making up this Selection policy, we the Committee, wanted to give every shooter selected in the Training squad an opportunity to prove themselves at international level at World Cups held overseas and both Tom and Barty were funded to go to these on different occasions, giving then the same opportunities as the others. We had to put a very strong case to the government as to our reasons for wanting the whole of the training squad to benefit from the overseas experience, for they seemed only too happy to see all the funding go to the proven 4 to 5 shooters only. This would have been great for that 'chosen few', it would have been the easy way out for all of the administration in running the training camps and sending that 'chosen few' team away, but it would have been detrimental to all those other clay target shooters who deserved the right to shoot for Australia as well. We believe we have done the right thing for Australian shooting by taking the hard road and giving everyone a fair chance.

The selection criteria at that time we thought was excellent but after

12 months we found it contained a number of flaws which had to be changed as the ASA was by then heavily involved they insisted that the changes be made.

To those not familiar with the ASA and the role of this body, I shall endeavor to explain it as best I can. The ASA is the only body that the ASC (a Federal government department), the Australian Olympic Committee (later to be referred to as the AOC) and all overseas shooting organisations will recognize and deal with as the official governing body of shooting in Australia.

Prior to 1996, all government grants were given directly to the ACTA but in 1995 the ASC through the Federal government instigated a huge review of the allocation of funds for all sports, and these were now to be directed through the National bodies such as the ASA for shooting. We then had to come up with a 4 year Development and Training Programme for shooting leading up to the 2000 Olympics. The ASA employed a High Performance Manager (later referred to as the HPM), Bill Murray, whose job it was, together with the affilitate's representives, to set up a programme that would havve to be approved by the ASC. This proved to be a huge task and caused many a headache and it had to changed many times as different problems arose. Just the story of this programme would fill the whole of the CTSN but to cut it short I believe Bill Murray had done an excellent job for Australian shooting in general. He seemed able to get more and more funding each year out of the government than that which was to be allocated and he was there for me when problems required fixing.

With the huge success of Michael, Russell, Deserie and John (Maxwell) at the 1996 Olympic Games and the many successes our shooters have had since then, the Federal government had been very generous to the clay target shooters, giving us enough funding to be able to send "full teams" to World Gups and the World Championships since 1996.

With the advent of the ASA having full control of all the funding (from 1996), the selection policies of all International ISSF Teams to be approved by the ASA as the governing body, and here again the changes had to be made to the Selection Criteria in both 1996 and 1997 to cover the different areas that they believed necessary. I, and my committee, fought very hard to keep most of our selection criteria in tact bot we had to give in on occasions to the requests put forward by the ASA and the Australian Institute of Sports programme.

In 1997, with the aid of Murray Alexander (National Coaching Director), the Shooting Committee dedicated this year's allocation of funding go to the up and coming Juniors as well as the elite shooters and we took Juniors to international events in both Germany and Brunei, for experience.

1998 saw the employment of the internationally renowned shooter, Luca Scribani Rossi, as the Clay Target Coach for Olympic Disciplines. Luca was employed by the ASA on behalf of the ASC to set up an Olympic training programme to be based on Canberra. This programme was fully funded by the government and was named the Olympic Athlete Programme (to be referred to later as the OAP). Luca and the HPM had full control of the training but I was also given an equal voice with the proceedings, as the ACTA's representative.

Luca and the OAP Board wanted changes made to the selection criteria and as they were paying for everything, along with their vast experience, we negotiated some minor changes to the satisfaction of everyone. These changes were made prior to the 1998 National ISSF titles.

In January 1999, the selection criteria policy was sent by the ASA to the OAP Board and the AOC as members of this 1999 Training Team were now making up part of the Olympic Shadow Team. Bearing in mind that the ASA is responsible for all Olympic shooting disciplines, and that this was the year leading up to the Sydney Olympics, all ISSF selection criteria policies had to be passed on to the AOC, and from January through to June 1999, these policies were scrutinized by the lawyers.

In June 1999, we received word that some modification and wording needed to be made. This was done and sent back. In August 1999 we were again told that more word changes needed to be made. In the meantime the ACTA had printed the selection criteria in the CTSN for the 1999 ISSF National Titles and I had organised for copies of the criteria to be printed (now for a 3rd time), and set in a booklet form, ready to be handed to all members making the Training Team at the National Titles.

In October the OAP Board decided that the scores shot in the Women's Skeet event at the World Championships were unacceptable for the picking of an Olympic Shadow Team, and they requested that the Shadow Team be selected from the National Titles, the Oceania Championships and the Commonwealth Shooting Federation Championships. Here again was another change being made to the selection criteria - something completely out of the ACTA's hands.

Just 2 hours prior to me giving out the latest printed selection criteria at the National titles, I had an urgent telephone from the ACTA office

saying that the AOC's lawyers wanted notification of some of the wording in the policy and I was 'not to hand them out". This was caused by the advent of a 'Sports Tribunal' where people could appeal against not selection. We had since had a number of appeals, not only in shot gun, which has ultimately cost the ASA tens of thousands of dollars and where the ACTA has had to pick up a 1/5th share of the costs and this ultimately comes our of every shooters pocket.

The final selection of the Olympic Shadow Team and the Olympic Team was made under strict conditions laid down by the AOC, the OAP and the ASA. The ultimate criteria for this was to select the best possible team for the Olympics. In my opinion, the future of all shooting in Australia resets on the success of our Olympic shooters and the Team that has been selected is, I believe, the best there is at this very moment their world ranking certainly proves this.

As you can see from this version of happenings over the past years, I have sympathy for both Tom and Barty's predicaments but I don't believe that given what they should both know by now, having been members of those teams, that they have any right to condemn / criticise the ACTA as a lot of these problems were caused through outside influences over which we had no control.

Tom, you also mention in your letter your 'shooting jacket' disappointment - if you had approached me, the ACTA's representative instead of Luca, who is employed by the ASA I could have told you the situation regarding shooting jackets. Basically the policy is that you provide your own jacket at your own expense, for there are far too many shooters representing Australia in Team situations these days whether they be at World Cups, Oceania Championships, Commonwealth shooting Federation Championships, DTL World Championships etc. etc. and the cost is far too great to expect the ACTA provide each and everyone with a jacket. The new blue shooting jackets worn by those who represented Australia at the 1996 Olympics were provided out of OAP funds and these will continue to be issued only to our elite shooters i.e. Olympians and World Championship senior Team members. These are to replace the green Australian jackets which seem to be worn by everyone and seen in all sorts of places. If you take note these blue jackets have an Australian Coat of Arms on the pocket and only Olympians or people who have been granted special permission, are legally able to wear them.

I also believe that both Tom and Barty have written letters into the ACTA office claiming they should have been funded for both the Oceania Championships (Sydney, 1999) and the Commonwealth Shooting Federation Championships (New Zealand, 1999) as they believe they were part of the Australian Team. There has never been any funding from the ASC for either of these events and there is never enough funding in the ISSF National's levy to fully fund these Teams but the ACTA has for some years, been paying for such things as nominations at these events. Everyone wishing to compete at these events know that they must fund themselves - it is that simple - it is the competitor's choice as to whether they compete or not.

I would now like to take time to answer a few queries that have come to my attention regarding officials and coaches etc. on the ISSF scene. I will start with myself being selected as Team Manager. In late 1996 when the OAP board was formed and the 4 year Development Pro-gramme was initiated, one of the directives put the ASA by the OAP Board (and p[art of their overall plan) was to have a pool of 4 Team Mangers, to manage the Teams throughout the 4 year terms, till the end of the year 2000. these Mangers were to manage multi-discipline Teams (shotgun, pistol, rifle etc), and ultimately one of those 4 would be chosen as the Olympic Team Manager for the Sydney Olympics. These same Mangers were to accompany all Teams where the HPM or coaches required assistance or where the ASA needed a Team Manger in attendance. The reason behind this was that the OAP Board and the ASC did not believe they should be funding different Coaches or different Managers to each event 'just for the experience'. I was honoured to be one of those 4 selected and I believe it was also an honour for the ACTA to have one of it's members so selected. These 4 Managers were all on a 'volunteer' basis and all that was pain on our behalf was our airfares and accommodations and we received a \$20 (Australian) a day meal allowance (this was changed in June of 1999 to \$40 Australian) all other expense we have personally had to meet. If anyone has a formula for living overseas on \$20 to \$40 a day please let me know!

These positions mean a lot of hard work because it starts with working out an itinerary, flight bookings, relaying results through to Australia on a daily basis, right through to making final written reports to all involved bodies (ASA, ACTA, etc) on our return home. I have found these trips most enjoyable and an invaluable learning experience which I hope I can/have put back into the sport, and being with the elite shooters and seeing what they have to put up with, their highs and their lows, I have felt privileged to be part of the Team. Luca Scribani Rossi - Head Clay Target Coach. Luca was fully employed and paid by the ASA. His valuable experience and respect world wide and his tough but lovable nature with all, has been one of the greatest hi-lights of the whole shooting programme. There have been some people that have 'run him down' - these people are ill informed about him and/or jealous or don't know much about shooting on the international scene. No one is perfect but what Luca has done for the Australian shooters, especially the things that not many people know about, like supplying of stocks, guns, expert advice, all without hesitation and then organising cartridges for us throughout the world (never been done before) I can only hope that he continues with his help to the Australian shooters when his contract expires after the Olympics. Luca, on behalf of all of the shooters and the staff, I say a big Thank You for everything, especially your friendship.

Greg Chan - Assistant Coach. Greg has been the Assistant Coach since 1996 and he, like me, was appointed by the OAP Board and the ASA and he again has done this on a volunteer basis, the same conditions as mine regarding our overseas trips - airfares, accommodation, etc. The ASC and the AOC arranged for a poll to be taken by the shooters after the 1996 Olympic Games, their opinions on the Coaches and Officials in charge of their care. Greg was voted unanimously for his helpfulness and understanding by the Clay Target contingent and this was why he was appointed to this position. Those who know Greg know him to be a dedicated Coach and a good person to have around.

Sue Homolka - Team Doctor. After the 1996 Olympics with the OAP Programme in place, Bill Murray and I, along with Claudia Kulla (Mental Training Coach), believed that we need a Team doctor to look after our Team's health and to attend events like Training Camps and World Championships (where funding was available). Once news of this impending position became known one of our clay target shooters put Sue's name forward and after she attended a Training Camp at the Oceania Championships in 1997, she was appointed by the ASA as 'Team Doctor' where she then accompanied the Teams (Clay target, Pistol, Rifle) to the Training Camps and World Championships (where she actually saved two lives in Peru). She has always been on hand and has assisted me at Junior Training Camps especially helping/talking to the Junior women. Sue has also gone away under the same conditions as that of Greg and I (airfares, accommodation, etc) except that she has been paid a small retainer for being away from her private practice. Sue's happy nature has been a joy to all, ever willing to help where needed, I certainly hope the ACTA retains her for further Teams.

Darrien Roach - Team Masseur, Darrien is a Sport's Masseur who has also been with the Team since1997. His name was likewise, put forward by one our elite shooters. Darrien has accompanied our Team on many occasions and is regarded as one of the best in his business by shooters around the world and this can be verified by other country's shooters who look for his services whilst we are away. He has fulfilled his obligations to the Australian Team and will work 24 hours a day if needed. He is an integral part of our Team structure and a very likable person. Darrien has worked under the same conditions as the rest of us (airfares, accommodation etc) but he too receives a retainer for being away from his practice.

I believe that the many results our men and women shooters have achieved, both as individuals and in Team events an the achievements of our up and coming Juniors since 1995, have paced Australia as one of the top 3 clay target shooting nations in the world, proving that our Selection and Training programmes can't be that far off being right.

I would also like to inform you, the ACTA members that the Federal government is now giving all funding directly back to the ACTA for elite ISSF shooting - this is a considerable amount of money and something that I, on behalf of the Shooting Committee, have been fighting for, for some years, and we are now completely in charge of our won destiny.

Our Selection Criteria policy will be used to select international Teams and Training Squads and this Selection will not be touched by the ASA. Once the Teams are given to the ASA it is entirely up to the ASA as to whether they accept or reject the Teams and this is a far better procedure than trying to have the ASA and ACTA's policy written up in the one document. The ASA should then just rubber-stamp the ACTA's selection and this same procedure will be used by all of the disciplines ie. Pistol, rifle etc.

The Selection Criteria policy will be advertised in the CTSN and with Team Agreements, be handed out to the Training Team selected at the National titles. If any further information is required by anyone, I am available and willing to help/talk where ever possible. My phone/fax is available on page 1 of the CTSN magazine.

Western Zone QCTA — 23rd Annual Trap Carnival



Northern Zone committee wishes to thank the members of the Charters Towers Gun Club for all their work in running such a good carnival.










