WORLD CUP FINALS



Shooting Report XXVII Olympic Games Sydney 2000

After four years of commitment and training by athletes and over four years of planning by SOCOG, the XXVII Olympic Games are now over. A total of 411 athletes from 103 nations took part in the shooting competition which was described by the ISSF Secretary General, ISSF Technical Delegates and International Technical Officials as "the best Olympic shooting competition the sport has ever had"

What wonderful praise toreceive for all of those involved in the years of planning. To then have the IOC President Juan Antonio Samaranch describe the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games as "the best ever" was the icing on the cake.

Credit of course for the success of the Olympic Games in particular the shooting competition, is shared by the many hundreds of people who gave of their very best to make the Games such a success. Australia has never before called upon volunteers in the numbers that were needed for the Olympic Games. The number of people from all walks of life who volunteered their services is testimony to their desire to see Australia produce the best Games ever, which they did. Congratulations to all who assisted with the success of the Games. The contribution which you have made will go down in the history of shooting as one of sports finest achievements.



2000 Victorian ISSF Grand Prix Series

The series, held on a monthly basis from May through September, involved 5 host clubs, Werribee -Victoria, Mildura, Frankston Australian, Melbourne and Echuca.

Some 70 competitors shot the Olympic Trap, including 11 juniors and 6 women and Double Trap 44 competitors including 7 juniors and 3 women. Visitors came from South Australia, NSW, Queensland and from Overseas, the New Zealand Olympic Team and TISA

A wild and woolly weekend, weatherwise, in July saw Frankston Australian host the third Grand Prix of the series and again a good rollup of competitors. 34 nominations were received for the trap event and 19 for the double trap. Melbourne Gun Club was the next host club in August and again numbers were consistent with 38 trap nominations and 18 double trap.

Echuca on the first weekend in September, saw numbers down to 24 trap and 11 double trap entries, perhaps with good reasons, as the Sunday was Father's Day and due to the Olympic Games, the AFL Grand Final was rescheduled in Melbourne to the Saturday.

The object of the Grand Prix Series in Victoria is to promote the Olympic Disciplines, to encourage junior competitors, and aspiring Michael Diamonds and Russell Marks to make the National Training Squad, and not forgetting the competitors who just love shooting the Olympic Disciplines.

Selection of the State teams also comes from the series, with the

three best scores plus the State Title qualifying for the State Shoulder to Shoulder teams.

There was a High Gun for the series, the qualification being the best score over the 5 competitions. The Olympic Trap High Gun, AA grade was won by Adam Vella, A grade by Joseph Ruffo, B grade by Frank Ruffo, and C grade by Wes Asmar. Frank Ruffo also won the Junior High Gun and Joanne Kerr the Women's High Gun.

Presentation of the Olympic Trap High Gun, generously sponsored by Elite Shooting Supplies and Beretta Australia, were made by Brett Dunstan and Luca Scribani Rossi and a great array of trophies they were. A big thank you is extended to Brett Dunstan and Luca Scribani Rossi for their support of the series.

The Double Trap High Gun, AA grade was won by Russell Mark, A grade by Brett Dunstan, B grade by Daniel White and C grade by Claire Watts. Daniel White also won the Junior High Gun and Claire Watts the Women's High Gun.

The Double Trap High Guns generously sponsored by the 5 host clubs, Werribee-Victorian, Mildura, Frankston Australian, Melbourne and Echuca, were presented by Frankston Australian President Paul Calvi. And a big thank you to the clubs for their generosity, without them the series could not be.

Weather wise for the first day of Skeet there were a few showers however these dissipated as the day passed.



Event 1 was the Skeet Zone Teams shoot of 25 targets contested by 1 team each from 6 zones. This event was won with a very fine score of 124/125 by the South West Zone being represented by Max Weston, Sam Forsyth, Peter Vosper, Peter Fost and Phil House. Well done. Event 2 50 target WACTA Skeet Championship had 92 shooters on the board. Like clockwork this event progressed well with everyone fulfilling their duties as referees and scorers with the usual crowd around the scoreboards watching with interest as the scores were being chalked up. The scores were good with 3 possibles posted, Clive Shepherd, Clem Bertini and Geoff Faulkes. Ten shooters were on a 49. After the usual shoot offs

Machinery was performing well and none of the usual "men with spanners and hammers' was evident. Families were enjoying the sunshine and lawns.











There is definitely something missing in my weekend routine. It needs a bit of zip. I wrestled with the question until an idea emerged from my distant past. My dad was a rifle shooter. I remembered when he used to take me over to the range on occasions when I was a small boy. I guess other things got in the way and I never actually followed through with the sport myself. That's it! Decision made. I'm going to take up rifle shooting. I'm not really sure where to start particularly with all this confusion over gun laws, and so on, but I guess the best place would be at the Woodville rifle range. I'll head over there tomorrow.

My name is Jim and it is Saturday, 6 June 2000.

So for me began one of life's big adventures. Little did I know that what lay in store for me as I ventured to fulfil that competitive spirit in my soul that had lain dormant for so long.

Sunday, 7 June was a regular day. Woodville Range was fairly easy to find. It was marked on the street directory and probably had been since WW2. I must admit I hadn't been out this way for ages and I was amazed at all the residential development. Nonetheless, the range was where it was supposed to be, no sign up, except there was a big lock on the front gate and not a person in sight. I really should have called first but then I didn't think it would be necessary on the weekend.

I got out of the car and was considering my options when a bloke walking his dog came along. I said, "Gidday mate, you wouldn't happen to know what time the range opens would you?" He looked at me as if I was an alien or something and said, " they don't shoot on Sundays.... they make enough bloody noise on Wednesday and Saturday afternoons", and off he went.

I had a slight feeling of uneasiness in the bottom of my stomach. This was not a good start but I was determined and I didn't like the look of his poodle anyway. At least I now knew when to come back.

Saturday, 13 June, was an all right day, just. Rain threatening but I was still determined to get this off the ground. Undeterred, I set off for Woodville hoping that my poodle-loving friend of the previous week was correct when he said the range was open on Saturdays. There just didn't appear to be any way to confirm the set-up. I'd searched through the Yellow Pages and found nothing on shooting. It was almost as if the sport had gone underground.

Anyway my fears were soon put to rest. The range gate was open and there was a red flag flying just beside the entrance. The place was a bit run down. There was a dirt track with potholes each the size of a

politician's super account heading to what appeared to be the clubhouse. It had seen better days; could certainly do with a bit of an upgrade.

I'm normally a fairly confident person in these things but I don't mind telling you that this was starting to look a bit daunting. I bowled into the clubhouse and, thankfully, there were a couple of guys there who looked like they knew what it was all about. I introduced myself and told them that if things went well it was likely that they were looking at the next 'Michael Diamond'. I said, "The only problem is that I'm starting from scratch and it may be some time before I'm a household name in shooting". They agreed.

"Mate, we've got some vacancies in the club and you're welcome to apply but it's going to be a while before you get to fire any rounds downrange. The first thing you need to do is get a licence".

I said, "That's okay, but what about a bit of a shoot today".

They laughed, "No way, you don't get to use one of these until you're licensed and that could take a couple of months".

"A couple of months, surely not", I thought.

I was lucky, I guess. One of the guys at the club, Rod, was the Club Captain and also a Firearm Safety Awareness Officer. He explained that under the new gun laws it was no longer possible to join a club and learn to shoot even under their expert supervision unless you were licensed or you had a permit from the government. Apparently there was some concern that I might have been a bank robber or something. He didn't recommend the permit option because you could only apply for it once in a lifetime and if it turned out that I didn't like this type of shooting there was no way I could ever try out another discipline. The best option for me was to apply for membership, get licensed and take it from there. It is a bit of a risk but at least I had options left if this didn't work out.

"Fair enough, where do I start?" I said.

"This is the Handbook on Firearms Safety Awareness produced by the NSW Firearm Safety Awareness Council. Study this and we'll test you on it next week", said Rod. "Take this membership form as well and, by the way, pick up a licence application from your local police station during the week.

So ended the second week of my new adventure. Still no closer to firing a few shots downrange and with an armful of papers I headed off to launch myself into the paper war.

During the next week I squared away the safety manual and visited a couple of police stations in the great quest to secure a licence application form. The first station I tried said they didn't hold them anymore and didn't know where to get them. The next station had a few copies and was happy to hand them over.

Saturday, 20 June, was another good day. I knew I wasn't going to fire any rounds today but at least; I was further advanced on my big adventure. I knew I was full bottle on safety with firearms.

Rod and the boys were there and after we'd finished the safety test; which, for the record, I passed with 100%, we sat down to complete the licence application. I must admit I thought I'd had a fair bit of experience with forms over the years but this one was a ripper. Genuine reasons, special needs, categories, certified copies (of what I had no idea), registration schedules and on and on... I don't mind telling you I was lost and if Rod hadn't been there to assist then I would still be filling it out. We fixed up the club membership side and eventually I had a completed application package. Rod explained that after the package was received at the Firearms Registry there would be a 28-day cooling off period during which they would carry out police checks, etc, and, hopefully, the licence would be issued soon after.

It is Monday, 5 August, some six weeks since I sent the application to the Registry and about nine weeks since that fateful Saturday morning when I searched my inner self to find a pastime that would brighten my weekends. I checked the mail and was relieved to find a notice to attend the local RTA office and pick up the licence. Next Saturday is going to be the big day. I hope it doesn't rain.

Please forgive the cheap theatre. I know Wilbur Smith has little to fear from my dramatic story telling but I thought this little playlet was a useful vehicle to highlight a dilemma facing the sport of shooting daily. There are many issues involved in this scenario and I won't try to address all of them in this article. I will focus on one of the fundamental issues facing the sport today; getting new members into the sport.

Some of you will say that the legislation facing shooters in NSW is their problem. Indeed it is, but I am equally sure that if an unreasonably stringent regime of regulation that far exceeds the intention of the National Firearms Agreement of 1996 is able to persist in a populous State such as NSW then there will eventually be ramifications for the rest of the Commonwealth.

The process facing our friend, Jim, took about three months from the time he decided to take up shooting until he fired any rounds downrange. There was little information available to help him get started. He got the run-around from various bureaucracies and if it wasn't for a few sympathetic club members who knew the ropes do we really think he would have persisted in his big adventure. Unlikely, most probably he would have done what a lot of prospective shooters do in these circumstances- take up golf or fishing.

Perhaps the greatest disincentive facing him is that at no time did he really know whether or not he was going to enjoy the sport. How many people do you know would be prepared to submit themselves to three months of bureaucracy, expense and effort when all may be in vain? I am sure there is very few compared to the number of people who phone our offices each week inquiring about the sport. We give them all the information and contacts they need to get into a club and yet we know that only a small percentage follow through to eventually fire rounds downrange and enjoy the wonderful camaraderie that exists within the shooting fraternity.

Why is this so? The answer is enormously complex and no single remedy will resolve the issue.

The point is how did we allow our honourable sport of shooting to fall into such a fractured state.

To a large degree many of us stood on the sidelines, sometimes shouting, sometimes swearing under our breath but sidelined, nevertheless, while politicians and bureaucrats legislated our sport into a semi-comatose state.

This is the first in a series of articles where I hope to highlight some of the major pressure areas on the sport and suggest what we might do to resolve them. I fully accept that the cap will not always fit and that some States are marginally better off than others. Generally, however, the sport is under pressure and many of these pressures can be easily alleviated by applying equity and commonsense.

For example, what could have made Jim's entry into the sport a good deal easier than was his experience?

The first thing is that the club at Woodville range could have been more visible to newcomers than it was. I will deal with profile later in another article.

Secondly, once Jim had found his way to the club it should have been fully prepared to receive him as a potential new member (the club, of course, always has the right to reject applications). This includes having a comprehensive supply of forms on hand and the expertise and willingness to talk him through the process. This is something clubs and their committees can do now. Many clubs have mastered this process and before you know it good applicants are shooting downrange in the minimum of time.

Another factor that is crucial to gaining new members is a club having the authority to hold regular Open Days.

Open Days allow a club to regularly advertise and attract new participants into shooting, to demonstrate the processes, to show the outcomes, to sample the products and to gain new members. If an individual likes the experience then new participants to the sport can be won on the spot. Problem solved.

In the case of shooting the long-standing policy has been that new participants were able to attend an approved club and with appropriate safety training and supervision fire off a few rounds to get a feel for the sport. If the experience appealed then the individual could confidently move through the licensing process knowing that the time, effort and expense were not wasted. There has never been a suggestion that the individual would be allowed to remove a firearm or ammunition from the range or shoot without direct supervision. Where then is the danger to public safety in this policy?

I constantly find new applicants who have always wanted to try the sport but have never had the opportunity. Once they try it they are hooked. The NSW Shooting Association exhibits widely throughout the State using a laser-training device attached to a firearm as a medium to attract people to the sport. The response to this experience

is very positive for most newcomers. At the very least it identifies those who have absolutely no hand-eye coordination and whom should be advised at an early age to save their parents the needless cost of tennis lesson, etc, and take up chess.

The current regulation in NSW is that a Commissioners Permit is required for an Open Day and all persons who will attend the Open Day must be pre-listed and police-checked before the permit is approved which is, of course, before the Open Day is held. Apparently the inference is that there could be unsavoury characters showing up to the Open Day and using firearms. I ask you, "How many bank robbers do you know of have rolled up to a shooting club Open Day?" Needless to say there are relatively few Open Days conducted by NSW shooting clubs. Not because those participating do not wish to have their names run through the check. It is simply because it is virtually impossible for a club to identify attendees before the activity is held.

The solution is simple. Revert to the previous policy where clubs were able to hold regular Open Days and invite potential members to shoot under close supervision. Those who wish to continue in the sport can be assisted through the membership and licence application process. There is absolutely nothing lost with those who decide not to continue in the sport.

There is an argument offered by the gun control lobby that people might use this policy to shoot while avoiding the licensing process. I can find no merit in this argument since there is no possibility that an unlicensed individual could remove a firearm or ammunition from the

range. What then is the benefit to the individual? In any event if this is a concern then place a limit on the number of Open Days that an individual may attend.

It appears that the NSW bureaucracy may have seen some degree of rigidity in the current policy on Open Days and is considering deleting the requirement for clubs to pre-list attendees. The problem is that they have also recommended that clubs only be permitted to hold an Open Day once per year and that minors be denied the ability to attend Open Days.

Sorry, Doctor, do you mind if I continue with the disease, the cure is killing me. How are we expected to grow the sport if minors are denied access? Similarly, where is the justification in limiting police-approved shooting clubs to one event per year?

My view is that if a club is given a licence to participate in the sport then the club is entitled to fairly and reasonable maintain its level of participation. The minimum standard in respect of Open Days is that a club should have the authority to nominate when an event is to be held, that minors be allowed attendance, and all participants receive adequate safety instruction and supervision when on the range. I have no difficulty in maintaining a list of attendees for future reference.

Indeed, it is my belief that clubs should be able to nominate, say, the third Saturday of each month as Open Days. Jim's three-month odyssey could then have been resolved very quickly at their next Open Day when he and other interested participants could have fired a few rounds downrange.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS DECEMBER 2000

As I am writing this, I have just returned from a very enjoyable trip to the United States, acting in the role of Team Manager/Coach of the Australian Junior Shooting Team to the World Skeet Shooting Championships in San Antonio, Texas. There are a multitude of different reasons why I enjoyed the trip as much as I did, not the least of which was catching up with numerous old friends after several years of absence from the States.

However, there are three much more fundamental reasons why I was able to derive enjoyment from what I initially perceived to be a potentially daunting venture. The first is the fact that the three boys, who qualified for the team and traveled with me, behaved impeccably at all times and represented both their country and our Association in amanner that made me very proud of them. In doing so, they certainly eliminated any stress that the acceptance of responsibility for three diverse fifteen year old boys, for eighteen days, may have entailed under less favourable circumstances.

For that point alone I must take this opportunity to thank the three boys involved, and at the same time take my hat off to each of the three sets of parents, whose upbringing of their respective offspring certainly passed a most difficult test with flying colours. The second reason was because each of the boys displayed tremendous character strength when confronted with an unfamiliar and sometimes adverse environment. Rules variations and procedural differences are always a problem for first time Australian competitors at the World Championships, but the major stumbling block for most people is nearly always the difference in regulated target speed between the two countries.

Although each of the boys handled and adjusted to these adversities differently, due to their differences is experience level and shooting styles, the one underlying and identical characteristic, was their determination to press on regardless, and do their best on each and every occasion, irrespective of the difficulties encountered and/or of their individual performance levels at that particular time. This is one of the fundamental requirements of all athletes who have what'it takes to go on to become great champions, and thus it brought a lump to my throat to watch one of the boys totally applying himself to breaking his last target of that day, which then gave him a score which was low enough to have brought a lesser individual to tears, and caused him to have given up long before.

In a similar vein from an application viewpoint, but at the opposite end of the scale in terms of performance, I was equally in awe of one of the other boys during the first day of the 12 Gauge qualifying. I shot particularly well myself that day, breaking all 125 targets and staying in the shoot-off that evening long enough to avoid embarrassing myself. However, to watch a 15 year old boy stand up there and match me target for target all day long, and then remain out on the shoot-off field breaking doubles at 3, 4 & 5, long after I had been relegated to the parking lot, was a truly inspiring spectacle.

Actually, this month's article was not meant to be a shooting report of this particular team trip, but rather a generic overview of the planning practiculaties of shooting overseas in general and in the United States in particular, with an emphasis on tips and advice on making such a trip as trouble free as possible, which leads me into the third reason why I enjoyed this particular trip so much. The fact that it ran very smoothly almost from start to finish, and that the few small glitches that arose were quickly and easily overcome. Luck will always play a significant part in any venture such as this, but lots of forward planning, combined with the benefit of extensive prior experience, will always stand you in good stead.

Before I start on that, I think I will digress for a minute and explain how I eventually came to be in the "hot seat" in the first place. As I came into the picture relatively late, I am not totally sure how the whole process evolved, but it appears that about a year ago the ACTA decided to get stuck into some serious junior development, along the lines of the National ISSF Training Squad. With this in mind they selected a group of juniors and began conducting training camps at the National Shooting Ground, with the eventual goal of sending some of these kids overseas to gain international experience.

I believe the original intention was representation at the New Zealand Nationals, but somehow or other, that concept blossomed into sending a Trap Team to the Grand American Trapshoot, and a Skeet Team to the World Skeet Shoot in Texas. Billy Iles got the original guernsey for the Trap Squad, and eventually took that Team to Vandalia. Col Burt started out managing the Skeet Squad, not only because he was an extremely experienced shooter, a great coach, and had a wonderful way with people in general and kids in particular, but also because he was temporarily residing at the National Shooting Ground, whilst building it for us. Thus his appointment also made good practical sense.

Unfortunately Col sadly passed away not long afterwards, and left an enormous gap in many other areas, apart from the Junior Development Squad. Kevin Perkins was then appointed in Col's place to look after the Skeet kids, and again I thought this was a very astute decision. Not only is Kevin also a very accomplished shooter with excel-

lent coaching credentials, but he lives not far from Wagga, has excelled in several different disciplines of shooting, and enjoys the benefit of practical experience, having previously represented his country at the World Skeet Championships in 1984. However, for personal reasons, Kevin later had to withdraw from the squad, and that's where I entered the picture.

One evening after dinner, a couple of months ago, I was sitting out in my garage watching a video tape of the previous week-end's motor racing, while reloading the shells that my wife had shot off in practice that afternoon. This is a pretty normal situation for me, because I love to watch all forms of motor racing almost as much as my wife loves to shoot at clay targets. Anyway, this particular evening, my phone rang and it was Graham Michell, who is the chairman of the ACTA's Shooting Committee. Now Graham's call didn't really come as any surprise. Several months prior to that I had bumped into him at the S.A State Skeet Championships and he had mentioned the ACTA's intention to send a Junior Team to the World Skeet Shoot, upon which I offered to give him any advice or assistance that he could use.

Resulting from that, we had enjoyed several lengthy phone conversations regarding my experiences with NSSA shooting, and I thought that this would simply be another of those. Thus I was somewhat surprised when he informed me of Kevin's resignation and asked me if I would reconsider the fairly serious decision that I had made several years before, to retire from NSSA shooting and never attend the World Shoot again. After listening to his proposal, my mind still said no, but my heart said maybe. I then requested a week to think about it, during which I had in-depth discussions with all three of the boys and their parents, and to be truthful, the deciding factor was probably their enthusiasm for my participation, even after I spelt out my intended disciplinary strategy for errant youths. And the rest, as they say in the classics, is history.

Now let's get back to looking at some practical advice for shooters intending to compete in America. The Trapshooting there is conducted pretty much the same way as we do it here, in that you can simply roll up on the day and enter the events and wait your turn to shoot. This is probably due to the fact that the number of intending participants has not yet outgrown the ability of the venues to accommodate them. However, this is not the case with NSSA Skeet shooting, where demand has long since exceeded supply. To guarantee your participation at any of the major events, it is imperative to pre-nominate well in advance, and to pay a holding deposit on your position.

Thus, after accepting the position with the junior squad, one of the first things I did was to phone NSSA to confirm our squadding, only to find out that the Shoot was already full with nearly 200 people on the waiting list. Fortunately, the lady who handles the squadding is a past workmate and a personal friend, and after listening to my explanation of our dilemma, she assured me with a nod and a wink that she could not envisage the Australian Team travelling talf way around the world, only to find themselves unable to shoot.

Airline selection is another area where potential problems can be avoided. My experience has shown that using one carrier to cross the Pacific, and then transferring to a different one for internal domestic flights, regardless of any advertised affiliations, is a sure-fire recipe for disaster. Connection changes due to flight delays, and lost baggage are just two of many times when dealing with only one carrier is eminently preferable.

I have tried most of the major carriers at various times and now travel exclusively with United Airlines. Their "better airline" policy triumphed once again on our recent trip, after one of our guns failed to arrive with us in San Antonio. A short meeting with the baggage supervisor was all that was required to have the missing item traced, located, arrive on the midnight flight and be hand delivered to the security guard at our apartment complex, in the wee small hours, by a United employee on his way home from work.

While on the subject of lost baggage, I would strongly recommend that when travelling overseas with guns, you either pack them in plain generic containers, or if you must use one of those fancy aluminium gun-cases, disguise and protect it by covering it with a padded canvas carry bag. On our trip we had four guns, in two aluminium guncases and two canvas bags. The canvas bags always arrived with us, and never gathered so much as a dirty mark. Whereas the two guncases almost always required a search and rescue mission to locate them,

and both eventually got scratched, gouged and structurally damaged, due to the fact that their obvious nature always guaranteed them "special attention".

Hire cars are another trap for the unwary. Always try to use one of the smaller "off airport" companies, as not only are their rates generally lower, but you avoid the added airport taxes. And always charge them on a "Gold" Credit Card, as these can save you the extremely expensive insurance option. Also avoid motels, and opt instead for serviced apartments. These are generally bigger, better, cheaper and often have generous fringe benefits, such as refrigerators, airport transfer buses, free buffet breakfasts, and sometimes even complimentary evening happy hours.










Northern Zone junior trap team, left to right: Matt Gall, Dean Reeves, Joe Selastioni
