STATE CARNIVALS

Tasmania's Carnival on the long weekend in January will be happening at the time of the printing of this magazine. The South Australian carnival early in February would be a great warm up for the DTL Nationals. The support for recent State Carnivals has been very good and I hope this trend continues for the South Australian event.

2000 SKEET NATIONALS

Shooters from around Australia and New Zealand came to the National Shooting Ground in Wagga Wagga to renew old friendships and enjoy the annual National Skeet Carnival. All was again in preparation with the grounds being manicured to perfection by Dave Jocelyn the groundsman. The weather was fine but overcast and the scene was set.

NATIONAL 20 GAUGE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The first event for the carnival saw 49 competitors line up for the National 20 gauge Championship. At the end of qualification Adrian Cousens stood alone on 100/100 to claim victory for the second year in a row. Adrian received the Royal Blue Sash, Silver Australia Badge and John Withers Memorial Trophy.



Several shooters on 99 proceeded to the fields to determine second and third place overall. After a short shoot-off second place was taken by junior shooter David O'Sullivan with a score of 103/104, third place overall went to Peter Vella on a score of 102/104.

Section wins went to Karen Cousens in the Women's 94/100, David O'Sullivan 99/100 the Juniors and Ray Smith 93/100 the Veterans. Other placegetters were: AA Grade 1st Neil Thomson, Kopuku NZ, 100/104; 2nd Ray Everett, Canterbury NZ, 99/104; A Grade 1st Mick McGill, Mt Isa, 104/108; 2nd Steve Pellegrino, Melbourne, 103/108; B Grade 1st Mike Kindmond, Kopuku NZ, 100/108; 2nd Ray Smith, Hobart, 99/108; C Grade 1st Cecile Edmonds, Mt Isa, 87/100; 2nd Michael Chelepy, Rockhampton, 81/100.

PRE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Seventy shooters nominated for this event with the only possible being achieved by Robbie Marino from Melbourne. After a short shoot-off second place went to Laurie Chelepy on a score of 121/122 with Adrian Lucchitti in third place on a score of 120/122.

In the Sections John Harris was successful in the Veterans on a score of 92/100, Karen Cousens in the Women's on a score of 92/100 and David O'Sullivan in the Juniors on a score of 95/100.

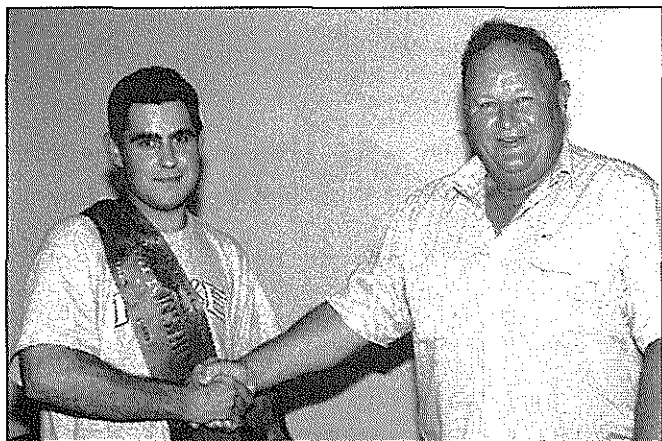

STATE TEAMS MATCH

Open: Unfortunately not all states were represented at this year Nationals. However, some fine shooting was displayed by the states represented with the final winning state being Victoria. The team of Gary Avison, Leigh Roberts, Bill Iles, Glen Clarke and Mal Briggs shot a score of 247/250 to win by five targets from the Western Australian team on 241/250. In equal third place were New South Wales and Queensland on a score of 239/250 with Tasmania in fourth on 236/250 and last years winners South Australia in fifth place on a score of 233/250.



Women's: The Queensland team of Margaret Denton, Toni Dierke and Nichole Hyland were successful this year with a score of 69/75 from Victoria in second place on a score of 66/75. New South Wales were in third place on a score of 59/75.



Juniors: Three teams contested for the juniors with the team of Brett Miall, Leigh Barry and Anthony Gray from Victoria being the eventual winners on a score of 69/75. New South Wales placed second on 63/75 and Queensland third on 55/75.

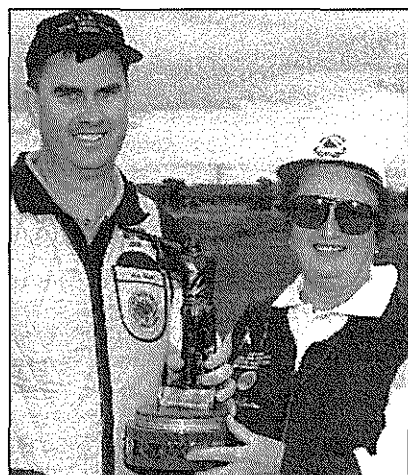

NATIONAL SKEET HANDICAP

The inaugural National Skeet Handicap attracted a field of 126 shooters all excited at the prospect of being the first name on the Col Burt Perpetual Trophy. Mrs. Jenny Burt donated this magnificent trophy in remembrance of her late husband Colin. The ACTA would like to express its sincere thanks to Jenny for this trophy.



Several shooters managed to hang onto some of their handicap and proceeded to shoot-off for the trophy. In third place was Laurie Chelepy (+2) with a final score of 124/127, Second place went to Mike Kindmond (+6) from Kopuko in New Zealand on a score of 123/130. The inaugural winner of the National Skeet Handicap went to Clem Bertini on a score of 130/130. Yes, Clem was on scratch from target one.



In the Sections Hugh Fairfield-Smith was successful in the Veterans on a score of 53/55, Nichole Hyland in the Women's on a score of 62/69 and Stuart Pennells in the Juniors on a score of 50/59.

A total of 133 competitors took to the fields for this event with only two shooters recording the possible. Visiting shooter Andy Peter from New Zealand and Chris Rockliff then proceeded to compete for the overall placing in this event. Unfortunately after only eight targets Chris missed allowing Andy to claim the Overall win with a score of 108/108. A shoot off was needed to determine the overall third position and the eventual winner was Scott Wright 151/152 from Neil Thomson 150/152



The Women's section was won by Katrina Thomson 97/100, Bill Hine 97/100 won the Veterans and David O'Sullivan 98/100 the Junior section.

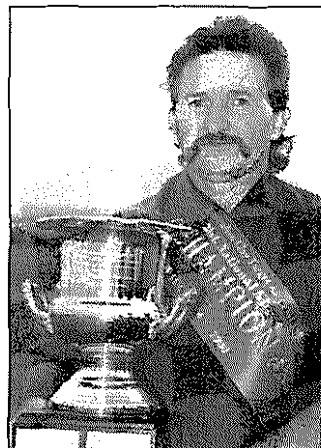

Laurie Chelepy, from Rockhampton, 216/216 placed overall first and received the Royal Blue Sash, Silver Australia Badge and Tup Pederson Perpetual Trophy.

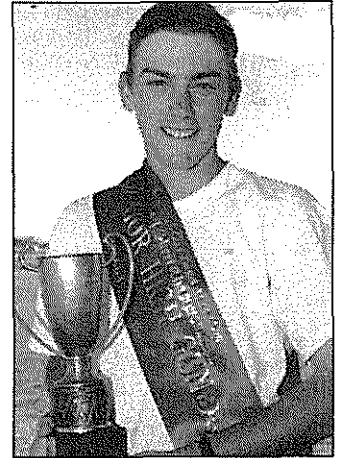


HIGH GUNS

Conditions of Competition - Entry

Entry into the 2001 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2001 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors must produce their 2001 registered shooter record book before nominating, to the 2001 Nationals Office Handicapper.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate Championship Titles for Open, Ladies, Juniors and Veterans, excepting the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Ladies, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.

A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before sashes/medals/cash/trophies are awarded.

When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as selection teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.

To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors over the age of 65 years on April 3, 2001.

Juniors - are those competitors who, on April 3, 2001 will be under the age of 18 years.

Sub Juniors - are those who, on April 3, 2001 will be under the age of 14 years.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.

Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure or equivalent shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Management Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers.

All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified - and indication can be obtained for the daily scoreboard. This applies to trap grades, Open, Ladies, Juniors and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

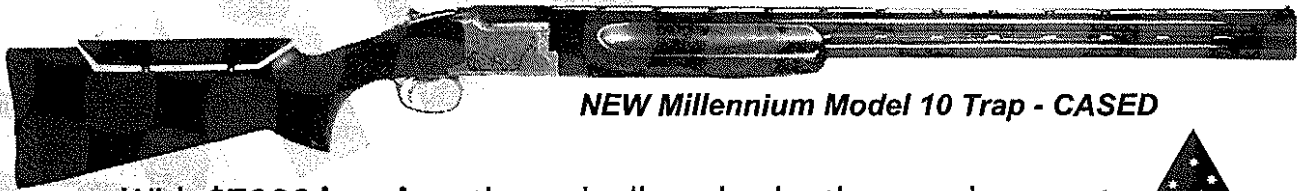

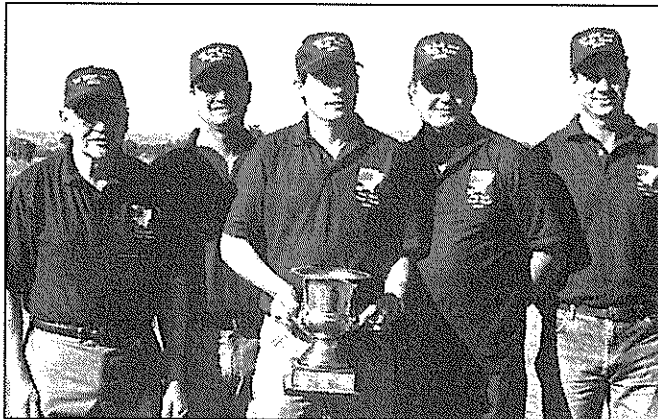

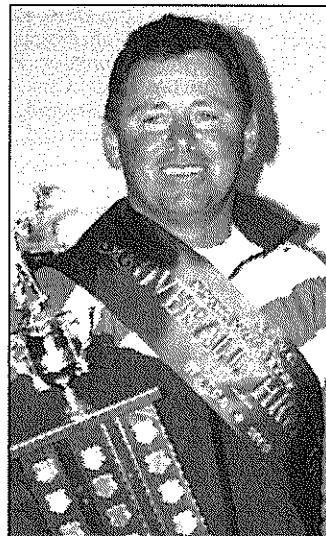

Dear Sir,

Having been a registered shooter since 1959 I have seen my share of changes within our association as a whole and not least of all to the Australian (repeat Australian) rules for skeet shooting. Some of the recently suggested changes, in my opinion, detract from what we already have, not improve them!!

Some years ago the skeet rules were dramatically revised and the format for what was then commonly named "The Quick Round" emerged. Changes made to create "The Quick Round" included such things as: -

Double Loading i.e. load 2 shells instead of 1 (release triggers now being the exception)

Not allowing shooters to queue up at No 8 station. This was considered unsafe due to debris from targets, after having been shot, falling on fellow competitors.

I find it difficult to accept that any able bodied person would need more than 10 seconds to prepare and call for a target. In all probability if 15 seconds were allowed there would be still those looking for 20 seconds!

When the Skeet Nationals were held in Western Australia in 1998, I timed several visiting shooters at around 18 seconds and one was taking 21 seconds, with monotonous regularity!! I was on the grounds before shooting started and still there after the last shot was fired (some of them after sundown) and I did not hear any requests made by shoot management that perhaps shooters could reduce the time they were taking (funny about that!! but perhaps I missed the announcement!!).

The adage of "If it ain't broke don't fix it" comes to mind, and so far as the Australian Skeet Rules are concerned they are just that "Australian". Personally I don't have a problem with that.

Dear Sir,

Just a note regarding the proposed Rule Changes as set out in the November issue of the CTSN. If all associations changed rules as often as we change ours, chaos would certainly be the result. Even now, because of the ceaseless bombardment of rule changes, our rules books are usually out of date before the ink dries. They are even printed with provision for new rules and amendments.

Do we not have the determination to establish a logical and positive set of rules and abide by them or do we skip and dance to a tune that suits a certain element or a particular circumstance? This is a nationwide association which includes the biggest and the smallest of clubs and the greatest and the not so great shooters all of whom pay the same affiliation fees.

Do the target angles really need to be changed? 22 degrees is approximately straightway from lanes 1 & 5 and the term "up to" indicates that it could be even less.

Why alter the angles for a shoot-off? Shouldn't the shoot-off targets be the same as the event targets, as is an eyepener event? Perhaps the intention is to make the targets a little more difficult to minimise the shoot-off. If this is the case, why change at all when we already have the advantage of Rule 3.22(j) (change to pointscore after 100) for this purpose.

Consider the trap mechanics (shooters/voluntary workers). They will have to adjust all of the traps out to 35 degrees for the shoot-off which might last only a few shots and then change them all back again before the commencement of the next event. For a larger programmed shoot this could occur four or five times a day. This proposal doesn't make much sense, does it?

Also, the handicap formula is to be changed yet again. Under the present system it is possible, for A and AA grade shooters to be handicapped to the 16 metre mark (Rule 2.02 (c)(ii)) and compete

with B and C grade shooters who have been stranded at that mark and beyond thanks to a previous system. What chance do the B and C grade shooters have against AA graders under this fiasco. None other than to make a contribution to the prizemoney, I suggest. Other A and AA graders shoot from a minimum 19 and 20 metres and as far back as 25 metres, also a legacy of some former system.

At most country clubs the annual program would take about two years or so to notch up 500 handicap targets and, therefore, at 87%, inward movement if any would be a very slow process. A junior could end up a veteran before he takes a forward step.

Part 2(d) of the proposal refers to "members of other clay target associations" who are to be subjected to a special handicapping formula, ie. C-16, B-18, A-20 and AA-22. Who might these people be and, why them and not us?

Imagine an AA grade visitor from, say the SSAA. He/she is immediately in competition from 22 metres against our AA graders on 16 metres.

On the one hand we are trying to encourage new members to bolster the association then, on the other, as soon as they set foot on our grounds they are penalised. I think that that sort of treatment would soon take the smile from our faces if the boot was on the other foot.

However, it is popular opinion around the traps that this formula or something similar (perhaps C-15, this being a common mark, B-17, A-19 & AA-21) should be made the standard rule, with backwards movement adjusted according to performance. This would group all shooters of like ability, be a blessing to the office secretary and be a much fairer system that would never need to be changed again. It would also check the 'spoil-sport' who would deliberately miss a target to avoid handicap.

Prima facie, a handicap system involving penalties of 1/2 metre on an increment basis is ridiculous to say the least. If a shooter wins a 25 target handicap event (with a possible score and/or wins a shoot-off) then he/she deserves a penalty of one metre regardless of the number of shooters competing. I fail to see what is so terrifying about handicap shooting or the prospects of moving back one metre. Perhaps it's the fear of being disadvantaged or maybe losing.

And why do we need a separate grade for Double Rise? if we don't handle double rise so well, maybe its more practice we need and not a lower grade.

It is common consensus that if the rules are to be constantly pushed and shoved apparently to suit some minority ends then country clubs, which constitute a vast majority of the ACTA, will almost certainly rebel.

Accordingly, I see this as change for change sake and for no beneficial purpose and request that some common sense reconsideration be given to these proposals. After all, for most of us, it is recreation/sport where fairness and good fellowship are paramount.

I take this opportunity to reply to a letter sent by Mr Domenic Tigani.

It would appear that Mr Tigani seems to have had a problem

understanding the new system adopted by the NSWCTA in regards to Sections and Teams selection and I hope I can clarify this situation.

What are the changes that the NSWCTA have made to their State Trap Carnival format?

The New South Wales Clay Target association has decided to abandon the concept of Open sections and Open Teams at our State Trap Carnival. We now have a mens section, a womens section, a boys section, a girls section and a veterans section.

Why did we do this?

Previous to this change it was possible for some competitors to nominate in more than one section. Now, all competitors are only able to nominate in one section. Overall winners can come from any section and thus we are not removing this opportunity from any competitor.

Do we see these changes as discriminatory?

We certainly don't see these changes as discriminatory, in fact our view is quite the opposite, we believe that we have removed an anomaly that allowed some competitors to have multiple entries in the one event.

How does this affect state team selection?

In regards to NSW teams, we now have a mens team, a womens team, a junior team and a veterans team. We would like to see the junior team divided into a boys team and a girls team and will be encouraging the ACTA to establish an interstate girls competition so that we can accomplish this.

How are men, women, boys, girls and veterans defined?

Mens Section - male and over 18 years

Womens Section - female and over 18 years

Boys Section - male and under 18 years

Girls Section - female and under 18 years

Veterans Section - over 65 years

Each competitor is eligible for only one section as defined above.

Dear Sir,

Once again I attended the Skeet Nationals in Wagga and, as usual, had a very enjoyable week.

However there were a few things that I believe warrant comment. The Shoot Marshall, our own esteemed Adrian Cousens, supervised the setting of the targets each day. At the start of the shoot Adrian said that he only wanted everyone to leave at the end of the shoot having had a good time and that he wouldn't be reaching for the rule book all the time.

1. Targets

Well Adrian certainly didn't reach for the rule book when the targets were set at the beginning of the day. The low house would normally go through the hoop (the top part) but the high house was usually set to pass at least 50cm above the top of the hoop in still air. The reason for this (I was told) was to take into account the wind, which usually comes from behind the high house, and prevent sudden dipping targets which placed shooters at a disadvantage.

The fact that targets set as above are completely illegal was obviously not part of the equation (see rule 4 11). If a shooter or squad asked to have the targets set to go through the hoop (I saw this on two occasions), this would be done but the targets would immediately be reset (without even the use of the hoop to give a semblance of legality) for the next squad.

For someone used to shooting at legal targets, wind or not, the whole set up seemed to be merely to suit the preference of a group of shooters.

At future Nationals could the ACTA executive please ensure that targets are set to conform with whatever rules we are using at the time.

If the NSSA shooting rules are adopted, I hope that they will be strictly followed.

2. Phonopulls:

Canterbury Voice Release again agreed to demonstrate their equipment as they did last year. What was not stated was that the units were of a new, unproved design. New software in the machines combined with additional filtering to prevent firing of the traps when an auto was closed were the innovations. The results of software errors and failure of the unit to operate with

some shooters call detracted from the obvious advantages of these machines. On the subject of calls, I believe the manufacturer should design to suit all shooters calls, not advise people to change their call if it doesn't suit the machine.

As to whether they affect the results, it is interesting to compare the scores on the day the phonopulls were unserviceable with those of the following day when they were again in service. There was very little difference. Food for thought?

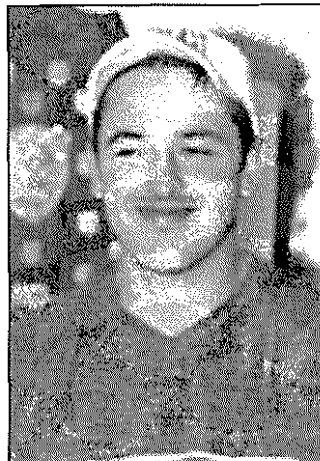

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS FEBRUARY 2001

During the recent Skeet Nationals, in my capacity as Shoot Marshall, I ran into some controversy concerning Rules vs Procedures. The difference? Rules are the directives and guidelines laid out in the rulebook. Procedures, on the other hand, are the way we implement those rules. They are partially the way that we interpret the rules, partially the way we handle areas not specifically covered in the rulebook, and as we shall see, partially the way we actually deliberately diverge from the rules, from time to time, when it happens to suit us.

Sometimes procedures are actually written down somewhere, such as in an addendum to the rulebook or in some other place, but usually they are simply "known" and passed on by example or word of mouth from one regime to the next. Although interpretation of rules by "known" procedures works OK in situations of either continuity or close connection, it can sometimes go astray when this method is applied in an isolated or detached environment.

Have you ever read the book called "Men are from Mars, Women are from Venus". If you haven't, you should, especially if you're married. Anyway, imagine for a minute that you put the rulebooks for Tennis and Golf in unmanned rocket-ships, and send one to Venus and the other to Mars. Then about five years later you travel to both planets to see how they're getting along. I will guarantee you that although the games will be basically similar to what you see here, you will find at least a couple of very strange practices being employed in both places, due to the organizers being deprived of the luxury of "known" precedents for interpretation.

And when you ask them why they are doing it that way, rather than such and such a way, they will simply look at you blankly. In Golf it will be something like half-meter-long tees combined with short-handled drivers, and in Tennis it might be underarm serves. Upon carefully reading the rulebooks you will find that the point in question was not actually spelt out. You then realize that we have obviously simply continued to follow the originator's vision, or the initial interpretation. It has just never occurred to us to do it any other way, or in fact that a different interpretation could be obtained.

In a lesser way, we did a similar thing with American Skeet shooting when we transplanted it into Australia. Rather than having someone from NISSA come out here and set up a field and show us how it is done, or send someone from the ACTA to San Antonio to get a first hand knowledge of the game, we simply imported a rulebook, built fields, and started shooting. Thus, with very little first hand experience of how the game was actually played, or how the rules were interpreted, we proceeded to run off at a tangent in a number of areas. Along with 99% of the other Skeet shooters in Australia, I did not realize this until I first went to America to shoot. At first I was mystified by some of the differences, but in time came to appreciate how and why some of our interpretations and procedures differed from theirs.

I suspect that we initially diverged from the beaten track because, due to our smaller population, there were insufficient shooters to warrant a separate governing body for Skeet. So we grafted it into an existing established Trapshooting environment. Thus, a number of people who already had a fixed mind-set from a similar but different sport, interpreted the rules and established the various procedures. A classic example of this situation is shoot-off squads. Whilst qualifying, practicality sets a maximum of six people in a Trap squad and the Skeet rulebook suggests a similar figure for that game. For shoot-offs, the same practical restriction exists for Trap, even though it is sometimes very inconvenient, such as when you have seven people for a double barrel shoot-off.

However, no such practical limitation exists for Skeet shoot-offs, and consequently I was astounded the first time I went out to shoot off at the World Skeet Championships, and found that they simply divided the number of participants up into the number of convenient fields. Thus, with about eighty possibles, they made up eight squads of about ten people each and allocated them to the first eight fields in front of the clubhouse. After being involved in it and seeing how it worked and thinking it through, it was obvious to me that this was a much better way.

However, it was equally obvious to me that it would never have occurred to us in Australia to adopt such a procedure in a million years, because we had a predetermined mind-set inherited from Trapshooting which did not allow us any lateral thinking. After this experience, it started to dawn on me that there were a number of other areas where we had diverged from standard NISSA procedures for similar reasons. These included selective squadding, professional refereeing and target setting, just to name a few.

The struggle to get acceptance for selective squadding in Australia was a long hard drawn out affair, but thanks to a concerted effort by a number of people, it is now behind us, and the system is rapidly gaining popularity in both Trap and Skeet shooting in this country. Professional refereeing just never seemed to get off the ground in Australia, for reasons that are not clear to me. This caused all sorts of problems, particularly in the area of inequitable pulling, which for a while did not seem to have an attainable solution. Fortunately, CVRIL in New Zealand came to our rescue with their innovative phono-pull system, which has now pretty much eliminated that problem too.

Before I move on to target settings, which is really the focus of this article anyway, let me diverge for a minute and give a couple of examples of where procedures literally conflict with the rulebook, but nobody cares or even notices, because the vast majority agree with the procedure. For many years our rulebook plainly stated that the referee had up to one second to release the target after the competitors call. In reality, this rule was never adhered to, and no-one would shoot at a target that wasn't instant, or would complain bitterly if they had to. This situation of clear non-compliance went on for many years, amidst much controversy and eventually resulted in the rulebook being changed to reflect a procedure that had, in effect, overruled the rulebook.

Another even better example of a widely condoned procedure that was clearly in breach of the rulebook is the aforementioned use of phono-pulls. Our rulebook plainly states that the referee must release the target for Trap and Skeet, and the only legal use of phono-pulls in ISSF. However, at the 1999 Trap Nationals, CVRIL phono-pulls were trialed, and proved so popular that they have been used at every Trap Nationals since. The result of this is that for two years not a single "technically legal" target has been shot at the Trap Nationals!

Although the procedure adopted by the management was clearly not consistent with the rulebook, everyone concerned could see that it was not only equitable, but also an improvement over the rulebook scenario, so nobody cared! When the ASSA drafted the Skeet rule changes recently, we sought permission to kill two birds with one stone and incorporate the required phono-pull authorization. Although that permission was eventually granted, it was done with an air of indifference. This was because although the procedure clearly contravened the rules, it was so popular that no-one saw any urgent necessity to technically rectify the situation.

Now let's look at target setting, particularly on windy days. Let's start with Trap. For a long time now it has been obvious that when the wind blows along the axis of the target flight, in order to set "shootable" targets, they need to be set either above or below the height bar, depending on whether the wind is blowing in your face or your back. To implement this they are usually set by the bar in the calm and by eye in the wind.

After some "do-gooders", with a mind-set apparently more aligned with trouble-making than common sense, complained that this was technically illegal, a push was made to move the target setting distance out from 10 to 18 meters. Although this would technically legalize the procedure of setting the target a couple of feet under or over the bar at 10 meters, it has proved to have some operational difficulties and I'm not really sure where we are with that one at the moment.

Similar problems exist with setting Skeet targets on windy days. Originally the target height was simply 15 feet at the crossing point, and the three-foot hoop, which gave an eighteen-inch plus or minus tolerance, was a procedure. Later that tolerance was written into the rules, but as the wind strength increases, even this

amount of tolerance is insufficient to provide satisfactory targets and NSSA procedure is simply to set them so that they are "shootable".

They do this for several reasons, but mainly because "averages" are an integral part of the sport in the United States. Thus it would be inequitable and unacceptable, on any given day, for some people on the east coast to be shooting at "legal" targets in calm weather, and other people on the west coast, where it might be windy, to have to shoot at "technically legal" but unnecessarily difficult targets. In an effort to equalize and rectify this situation, so that shooter's scores reflect their ability, rather than the weather patterns of their geographic location, they do a similar thing to what the Trapshooters have recently sought to do in this country.

They try to duplicate the calm day target flight path at the point where you actually shoot the target. Unlike Trap where this point is fairly fixed, in Skeet the optimum break point of any given target varies with the station you shoot it from. However, as a single target is nowhere as difficult to shoot in windy conditions as the second target in doubles, the second target break point is the place where they try to recreate the flight path. That area is somewhere between a half and two thirds of the distance from the crossing point to the boundary marker. They could build two special hoops and move the target setting distance out further, as we are trying to do in Trap here. But they see no reason not to just use common sense and allow shoot management to set the targets where they are "as shootable as possible" under the prevailing conditions.

This whole situation is even further complicated by two additional facts. The first is that, due to it's different trajectory, the high target is more susceptible to wind interference than the low target, combined with the fact that a tail wind affects it worse than a head wind. And the second is that the practical experience of "averages shooting" has shown that, even on a calm day, the most shootable targets are obtained by setting the low at zero tolerance (ie the middle of the hoop) but the high at the maximum positive tolerance (ie the top of the hoop).

The bottom line of this whole exercise is to never forget that Trap and Skeet are not Olympic disciplines. Their rulebooks were never meant to be interpreted by lawyers and their participants are generally not "paid professionals". Trap and Skeet are socially oriented recreational weekend activities whose participants are paying customers. In order to make them repeat customers, you need to give them a good time for their money and send them home happy. Giving them the most "shootable" targets on all occasions is an integral part of that requirement as one of the most basic premises is that shooting a good score and losing, makes for a much happier day than shooting a poor score and losing.

Good bad or otherwise, this is the acquired experience and the philosophy that I bring to shoot marshalling and target setting in this country. If you believe that I'm right then please help and support me in any way you can. If you honestly believe I'm philosophically wrong, then feel free to lobby for my removal from administrative responsibilities. If however, you are one of the supposed "dogooders" who simply opposes my philosophies on principal or technicality, or as a result of being stricken with the dreaded tall poppy virus, I'm at a bit of a loss as to what to suggest, other than perhaps that you find something else to play with, before you prematurely require help from an optometrist.

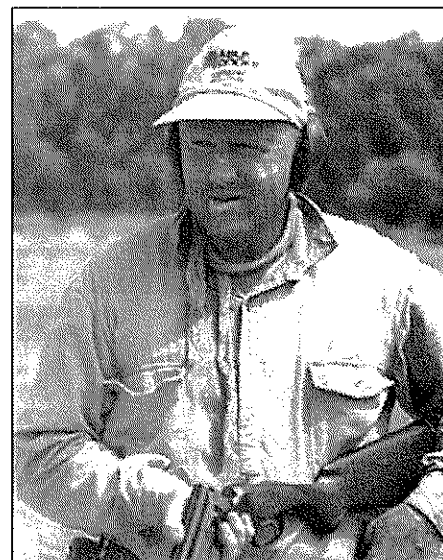

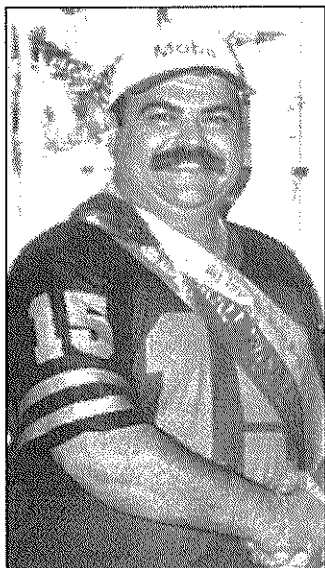

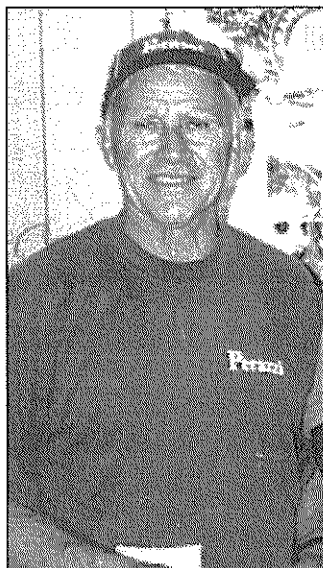
Excellent shooting by these shooters.

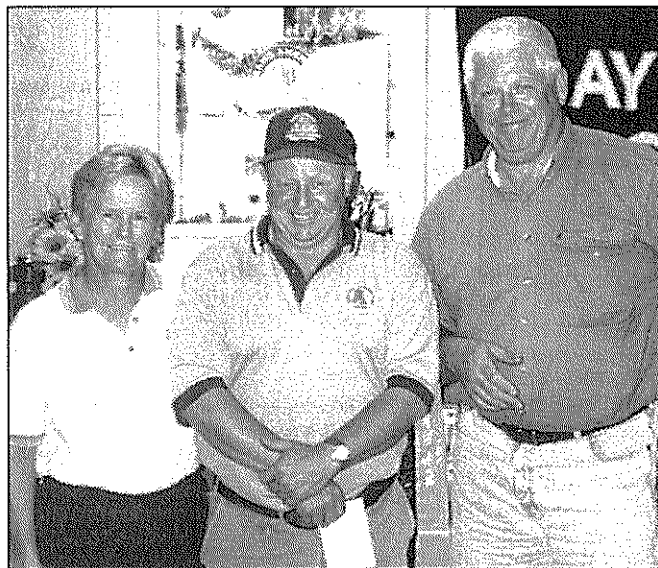

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps.
3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred in the event concerned.
9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfill their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be a different location of the area accepting shooting event nominations.
14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
22. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors and second family members only, they being wives or husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
23. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.**

1ST ANNUAL BRILEY PRE-NATIONAL SKEET SHOOT

You have all heard the stories....."Skeet in Australia is Dead". Well, Frankston Australian Clay Target Club decided that something is only dead if you let it die. So in about June last year the thinking caps went on.

First Question: How do you get more than the normal 3 to 5 squads of shooters to a club event?

First Answer: Do something different. It's funny, isn't it, how if you keep doing the same things you keep getting the same results.

Second Question: How do you make sure the shoot is attractive to shooters in all Grades?

Second Answer: Offer substantial prizes in all grades, as well as the opportunity for everyone to enjoy themselves.

With the Skeet Nationals approaching in November it was decided to stage the shoot as an opportunity to give shooters a final chance for some serious practice. A couple of false starts later we had the weekend of the 28th and 29th October organised. And the format was set at 100 targets 20 gauge, and 100 targets 12 gauge (shot in one visit to the layout). The 20 gauge event gave shooters the chance to either hone their skills or try out gauge shooting for the first time. And hopefully result in more shooters contesting the National 20 Gauge Championship.

We needed sponsors, so a visit to John Miall at Miall's Gun Shop was the first port of call. 5 minutes later 3 sets of Briley Ultralite Gauge Tubes were the three major shoot prizes. What about the shooters who don't have a realistic chance of taking out the overall and high gun prizes?.....Simple, offer a shotgun as the door prize for shooters competing in both events and provide substantial grade prizes. With the Nationals looming only two weeks later every prospective entrant at the Nationals will be counting the cost of those empties as they are ejected, so cartridges were selected as the Grade prizes.

And so the First Annual Briley Pre-National Skeet Shoot was born.

With pre nominations, defined wave times and the availability of selective squadding almost universally acclaimed (regardless of what you try some people will always complain about anything different) the shoot was a great success.

Saturday saw the 20 Gauge event held under cloudy skies and a brisk breeze. Threatening rain held off, with just a few small drizzles and the day got underway at 10am, with many competitors either borrowing a gun or a tube set to compete. With a pair of briley gauge tubes on offer to the overall winner and a case / 1/2 case cartridges to 1st and 2nd in each grade the competition was serious. When the smoke settled later that afternoon the Briley Pre-National Skeet Shoot had its first Champion. Adrian Cousens and Glenn Clarke went into the overall shoot off locked on 99/100. 12 pairs from 3, 4 and 5 saw Adrian take the honours with Glenn taking first in AA.

particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts and maximum fine of \$5,500.
