D.T.L. NATIONALS

The recently held DTL Nationals at Wagga appears to have been a very successful carnival. I would like to formally thank each and every person who assisted in any way with the planning, organising and running of the carnival.

In general the responses I have heard is that every one enjoyed themselves, the weather was excellent and the targets good. The scores shot and the quality of thrown targets appeared to be a lot better than last year.

The fact that 136 possibles were shot in the Double Barrel event, 15 in the Single Barrel event and similar in the Points Score event clearly indicates that many were shooting very well. Even a 50/50 and several 49/50s were shot in the Double Rise event.

To gain selection in the McIntosh team showed 22 places filled by shooters 3 points or less down which was fantastic shooting. 3 competitors from 24 at 4 down filled the last 3 places. I believe this is probably the highest qualifying scores ever for the team.

National President, Mr. John Byrnes, welcomed all shooters and friends to the National Grounds in Wagga Wagga with the official party consisting of: Mr. Kevin Wales, Mayor Wagga Wagga, Mr. Russell Mark OAM, Mr. Keith Livingstone NZCTA and Mr. Bill Jones, National Vice President.

It was with great pleasure that the National President, Mr. John Byrnes, presented the following recipients of the Australian Sports Medal with their awards for services to Clay Target Shooting: Mr. Reg Clarke, Mr. John Kent, Mr. Bill Jones, Mr. John Maxwell, Mr. John Murphy and Mr. Pud Burgess.

Mr. John Byrnes also had the pleasure of bestowing life membership of the Association to Mr. Glenn Woodhatch and Mr. Ross Silvester for their contribution to the sport.

STATE SHOULDER TO SHOULDER TEAMS

A very keenly contested event with all States competing vying for the winning badges.



New South Wales, competing in the Open event, were successful with all of their team shooting 25/25 to finish first with 125/125. The team captained by Glen Sinclair also included Glen Castellaro, Robbie Thompson, Gary Rootes and Arthur Turner.

Points had to be used to separate the next two teams with Victoria coming second with 123/366, followed by Western Australia on a score of 123/361



Trap Championships

A team of top women shooters from Queensland led by Annette Vassalini, with Carol Betteridge and Diane Reeves won the Women's Shoulder to Shoulder event with a score of 70/75 with points being used to determine first place. Queensland shot 207 points with the Tasmanian team shooting 70/75 (201 points) to finish in second place and Victoria was successful in third place with 69/203.



The Queensland Junior team made it a quinella winning the event with a score of 73/75. Captained by Travis Vaina, the team included Heath Cauley and Mathew Gall to win the event. Once again points had to be used to determine the next two placings with Victoria placing second with 72/209 followed by South Australia on 72/207.



Four Veterans teams competed for their shoulder to shoulder badges with the Western Australian team of Tim Catling, Gerald Vandeleur and Ivan Halbert shooting 72/75 (209 points) to nar-



rowly take the event from South Australia who shot 72/75 (208 points). New South Wales placed third with a score of 71/75.

Members of the Official party judged the best presented teams and awarded the SACTA Perpetual Trophy to a very well presented Queensland Team.

52ND GRAND AUSTRALIAN HANDICAP

A total of 379 competitors took to the tracks to compete for the Gordon Hall Perpetual Trophy, Royal Blue Sash and Silver Australia Badge to be awarded to the winner of the Grand Australian Handicap.

At the conclusion of the 50tgts twenty-one possibles remained including four Juniors. After a

further forty-nine targets only three competitors remained. Glen Hayden, Noorat Vic was the overall winner with a fine score of 116/116 of 22m. Donna Follett, Broken Hill SA, won the silver medal with a score of 115/116 and Sox Pilipasidis, Werribee Vic, took home the

bronze medal.

Alan Blease, Melbourne Vic, was successful in taking out the Veterans section with a perfect score of 50/50. Gold Coast shooter, Travis Vaina, shot 69/69 to win the Junior section and Donna Follett, Broken Hill SA, was successful in winning the Women's section with a score of 65/65

61st National Champion of Champions

A field of 392 shooters entered into this event and at the conclusion eight shooters remained on one point down. Bill Eagle, Euchua Vic, shot 223/225 to claim victory and received the Mackintosh Perpetual Cup, Silver Australia badge and Royal Blue Sash. Glen Castellaro, Griffith NSW did not miss a target in the event winning the J M Wilson Perpetual Trophy, Silver Australia Badge and Royal Blue Sash to take out the 2001 Double Barrel Championship with a score of 396/396. Glen was also presented with a Miroku Shotgun kindly donated by Highland Sports.

Glen Kable, Cecil Park NSW, stuck with Glen until the 396th target and accordingly was successful in winning the silver medal with a score of 395/396. New South Wales shooter Arthur Turner, Warren NSW, took home the bronze medal with a score of 363/364.

WA shooter, Tim Catling outlasted the field to win the 2nd Veterans National Double Barrel Championship on a score of 101/101. Wilson Ronald, Wagga NSW, shot 100/101 to win the silver medal from Kevin Heywood, Warren NSW, who took home the bronze medal with a score of 87/88.

Beretta Australia proudly sponsored this event.


Perfect weather conditions greeted the 434 shooters entered into this event. With the excellent shooting conditions fifteen possibles were recorded.







CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS JUNE 2001

Well, that's the Trap Nationals over for another year, and I for one enjoyed them immensely. Now that's not to say that I don't usually enjoy the Trap Nationals, because I do, but this year I enjoyed them even more. One of the main reasons for that is because this year I was less pig-headed than usual. Being a typical Virgo, I do not delegate authority well, and thus in my capacity as Shoot Marshall, I generally try to run the shoot alone and do everything myself.

As an outspoken critic of others for failing to apply common sense when required, this is clearly a double standard on my part. And it provides the fundamental reason why the Nationals have never run as smoothly as I know they could. By attempting to "play God", I inevitably wear myself to a frazzle, lose the plot from time to time, and occasionally even lose my cool, which reflects badly on my personal professionalism and on the ACTA in general.

This year I turned over a new leaf, accepted some constructive criticism on confusing my ambitions with my capabilities, and agreed to the appointment of not just one, but two extra people to help me. And to add a little irony and intrigue to the situation, the two people selected to assist me were Ron Traill and Gary Cassells, who are the two Victorian delegates to the ACTA. Several informed people suggested to me, with tongue in cheek, that this was a rather strange collaboration, considering my historic inability to establish any sort of working relationship with the VCTA.

On that general situation I do not intend to pass any comment, as I am hopeful of one day obtaining a solution to it. However, in regard to this specific case, I'm happy to be very outspoken. Both Ron and Gary did a great job all week and helped me no end. They both worked tirelessly and unselfishly all day every day, and took the stress right out of my work. I got to eat lunch every day, I got to socialize more with the people, and this year I even got to screw some tighter chokes into "Godzilla" (the old Miroku) and have a shot each day.

These days I can't even find the time to shoot much Skeet, let alone any Trap, so although I barely created a ripple on the winner's pond, I was tickled to death to finish, on a couple of the days, as a "good also-ran". Obviously this also added to my enjoyment of the week, and for that, as well as countless other things, I am pleased to extend my personal thanks to both Ron and Gary for their vast assistance. If I get the job again next year, and have any say in my assistants, you two will be on the top of the list.

Enough of my problems. I guess there were numerous "big-news" items over the Nationals, but in my opinion, three stood out. The weather, the target presentation and the scores. I drove over to Wagga on the Friday prior to the Pre-Nationals, and drove home on the Monday afterwards. Of the eleven days that I was there, eight of them could only be described as absolutely glorious - blue sky, no wind and pleasant temperatures.

The other three were still "good solid sevens" on a scale of one to ten. During one day of the Pre-Nationals, it came over cloudy late in the day and threatened to rain, but didn't. On the Pointscore day, the wind came up a bit for a while in the morning, but then settled down and turned nice again. And on the Double Rise day, the wind blew steadily from the back of the traps. Although that was a bit of a shame, because if ever there is a day you don't need any wind, it's double rise day, at least the wind stayed constant all day, so it was the same for everyone.

Such a fabulous run of good weather, in my opinion, is a testament to two things. The first is the wisdom of establishing a fixed date for the Trap Nationals and of having that date fall in the middle of autumn, which is one of the most stable weather times of the year. And the second is the wisdom of establishing a National

Ground in an inland city, which is large enough to have all the required infrastructure, but is far enough removed from the coast, to be insulated against the more radical weather variations that plague coastal areas.

The target presentation this year could only be described as spectacular, and must surely, once and for all, destroy the unfounded myth that there is something wrong with the targets that a Gemini Trap throws. I have given that myth a "more than adequate" airing on a couple of previous occasions, and so far no-one has ever been able to come up with even a shred of conclusive evidence that Gemini Traps don't throw as good, if not better, targets than any of the other machines currently available on the market.

We have had a Gemini Trap in our primary layout at my local Gun Club for several years and we could not be happier with it. It works away flawlessly and reliably, with a minimum amount of maintenance or attention. It hardly ever breaks a target, even when we re-throw pick-ups through it, and we shoot good scores and good breaks over it. And to further prove a point, we have a self-loading White Flyer in our second layout, and a long-term survey recently showed a higher strike rate over the Gemini.

Unfortunately, I think we have recently fallen into the bad habit of convicting the Trap, at the first sign of trouble, on circumstantial evidence, without even investigating several other much more likely suspects. Such as bad weather, bad target composition, bad target presentation, and even sometimes just plain bad shooting.

I still believe that unsuitable target composition and/or specification, has been the root of most of our recent problems. Kevin Tunney from Olimpyc Targets (now Clay Targets Australia P/L) later openly admitted to having inadvertently produced a batch of very hard targets a while ago, apparently as a result of a specification mistake by his lime supplier.

However, he assured me that this oversight not only resulted in much closer monitoring of target composition and quality control, but also directed him down the path of producing a wider range of different targets, specifically designed for the various disciplines. I think he's on the right track there, because I still believe that targets produced for ISSF shooting are unsuitable for Trap and Skeet. Anyway, target hardness is not the current issue. Target presentation at the Nationals is.

Here's a sweeping statement. I think the target presentation at this year's Nationals was superior to any previous Nationals. Why? Astute planning and quality control! Mark McInnes, who is chairman of the ACTA Rules Committee, has been working for some time on changes to our Trap rules, which are designed to provide us with better and more consistent target presentation.

Every morning during the Nationals, Mark arrived early and personally supervised the setting of the targets, along the guidelines of the various target presentation issues he is seeking to refine and standardize in the Rulebook. The nett result of all this was a whole week of good consistent shootable targets and lots of happy shooters. Please take the time to examine the various issues that Mark is seeking to improve, and hopefully support him in that difficult endeavor.

The only "fly in the ointment" of an otherwise exceptional target week, was the double rise. For reasons associated with the weather, as detailed above, and due to some physical and practical problems, the double rise targets were not as good as everyone would have liked. However, at the end of the day, most people agreed that they were as good as they could have been under the circumstances, and they at least they were consistent and equitable for everyone. Several improvements, including upgrading the

antiquated trap mounting system, should alleviate these problems for next year, which is another advantage of having a National Ground.

The third major talking point of this year's Nationals was the quality of the scores that were shot. I guess a number of different issues provide the reasons for this, and a combination of the two discussed above, good weather and good targets, certainly played a big part in it. Anyway, the bottom line is that there were more possibles shot, and more people involved in shoot-offs this year, than any other year that I can remember, maybe even any other year ever.

The Double Barrel shoot-off comprised no less than 23 squads of six shooters each. This adds up to almost 140 people, and from a field of just under 500, this is almost 30% of the participants. On most years, by the time the shoot-off has reached 200, it is usually down to one squad. This year, at 200, there were still three squads shooting.

I don't remember three squads of possibles, in either the Single Barrel or the Pointscore, in any previous year. This year both of those events had three squads in the shoot-off. Most years neither of these shoot-offs goes another 50 targets. This year the winner of both of these shoot-offs had to shoot in excess of 100 targets single barrel for the day.

Both the National Double Rise Championship and the Macintosh High Gun required perfect scores to win them this year. And although there were no possibles shot in the Champion of Champions, a full squad of 124s shot off for the event, which put a big smile on Steve Atkins, because he won the event last year with the only 124.

And talking of smiles, Glen Hayden had a pretty big one on him, when he won the Handicap off 22 meters. However he did not get to smile on the first day. In keeping with the rest of the week, there were three squads of possibles in the shoot-off, which wasn't finished by the time it got dark. Glen had to come back the next morning and eventually shoot over 100 to win.

Actually, the Double Rise was probably the best indicator of the lot. There have been plenty of years when this event has been won with 47 or 48, and considering the wind that prevailed and the previously mentioned target setting problems, such a score would probably have been a good bet for this year. However, not only was there a 50 shot, but also there were three 49s and a full squad of

48s to shoot off for the minor places.

The answer to April's STQ is: Three people have had to shoot over 600 targets to win the National Double Barrel. They are Warren Charlton who shot 620 in 1974, Roger Duthie who shot 634 in 1994. and Michael Diamond who had to shoot 749 the following year in 1995. The first correct answer drawn was submitted by Bill Attwood from Coburg in Victoria, who wins a free entry to next vear's National Double Barrel. Now, several people have commented that April's question was not hard enough and thus not interesting enough. So for June I intend to rectify that by reexamining the same situation from a different and more difficult aspect. How many people have shot over

600 targets in the National Double Barrel shoot-off, but have never won the event? Mail your answer to: Shooting Trivia, PO Box 265, Bairnsdale 3875, to arrive by 20-06-2001. Dear Sir,

I read, "Downrange" in the December CTSN, where it took 3 months before an applicant was allowed to fire his first shot on a rifle range in NSW. The article was initially humorous but ends on the serious note of how do we promote a sport that is an Olympic discipline? I note the Olympic Games 2000 had 12 shooting events and I believe the Paralympics Games also have 12 events.

Born and lived in Australia for the first 26 years, and under a healthy environment of club and parental guidance, I had become a keen shooter. I migrated to Denmark 16 years ago and decided to take up pistol shooting, as it was one discipline I have never tried before.

Denmark, like most western countries, has been through a political firearms process. The few that use firearms illegally brand the legal users of firearms as "not wanted or necessary". This is an easy area for politician to score votes from the non-shooting public. Most of Denmark's competition shooting associations are under the umbrella of the Danish Sports (athletics) Federation (Danmarks IdrÊts-Forbund). This puts shooting, correctly so, on par with football, swimming, gymnastics, etc. If this logic is not correct, then shooting should be removed from the Olympics.

More common sports, like football, are typically more appealing to youngsters but the Danish Sports Federation does offer interested persons, young or old, easy, well-supervised and in-expensive access to shooting.

Examples: My daughter started shooting smallbore when she was 9 years old. Club membership is about \$50/year. The club owns has a number of guns that the members can use free of charge. Ammunition (.22) is not expensive. Open days are held even for schools, allowing 12-13 year old students to "come and have try." Not everybody has a passion for football or softball!

If you want to buy a gun, you need a police permit. The club committee must first give certain guarantees on the applicant's integrity to the police. A minimum of 2 years active club membership is needed before the gun can be stored at home and this is done under a long list of sensible conditions. There is no cost involved.

The rules are different for shotguns, as the hunter is not under supervision. You must do a course, which costs \$350 and then buy a permit to hunt, which costs \$120/year.

Denmark also gets its fair share of short-sighted law change suggestions but the Danish Sports Federation has managed to maintain a reasonable balance.

The general Australian public should be shown the pleasure, responsibility and commitment dedicated to shooting by the enthusiast. If not, the shooting enthusiast will be stifled by the sensation media and bandwagon politicians.

Another interesting note is that "Paintball" clubs, which are potentially good money makers, are not part of the Danish Sports Federation, the reason being the gun is pointed towards persons. Fair enough!

Dear Sir

As an ACTA Member and the President of another shotgun discipline (Field and Game), I would like to voice my disappointment at the antics of some of the major players in the sport of clay target shooting, and shooting in general.

Our club recently had to order another shipment of clay targets from our usual supplier and to our amazement the price of clays had risen from \$72 per thousand to \$98 per thousand. "You've gotta be jokin".

Naturally, that increase has to be passed on to Mr Shooter immediately through higher noms, and with a days shooting now costing in the vicinity of \$100 per shoot (\$50 noms, \$30 shells, \$20 fuel, sandwich, drink, raffle ticket etc) it is easy to see why shooters are staying away from the sport in droves.

One only has to look at the result pages of the ACTA shooting news to see how country clubs are struggling to attract numbers, and as for getting your kids (hopefully, the next generation of shooters) into the sport it really has become financially impossible for Mr Joe Average. And just on average, I read somewhere that the average annual wage in Sydney was \$70 000. Well out here in the bush that sort of money equates to about three years wages, if you're lucky enough to have a job, and any increase in shoot day costs will only succeed in driving more people out of the sport.

So I urge the likes of clay target and cartridge manufacturers, along with shotgun makers, to bite the bullet, cut profit margins, and put the once great sport of shotgun shooting back within the reach of normal, everyday Australians. Failing this, one doesn't

Psychological Skills for Shooting; Motivation

The current debate about handicapping and system rorting needs to be put into perspective if we are able to come up with a simple and workable system. Clay target shooters like to consider ourselves as sportspeople and more importantly we like to think that we act in a sportspersonlike manner both on and off the tracks. If this is the case then why is there a problem? Why shouldn't we all just shoot, try our hardest and be satisfied with our results.

Part of the answer lies with the motivation behind why we or anyone participates in sport. There are three main theories underlying motivation in sport; Achievement goal theory, Attribution theory and Need Achievement theory. For the purpose of discussion here I will be concentrating on Achievement goal theory Achievement goal theory suggests that two major goal perspectives operate in an achievement context such as sport: a task orientation and an ego orientation.

Put simply, a task orientation implies that one participates in an activity for its own intrinsic properties. The enjoyment of the game, the way we feel when we smoke the target, or catch a great wave, or sink a tricky putt. There is a great inner sense of satisfaction when we do well or when we have achieved a personal best. Ego orientation (or outcome goal orientation) on the other hand has participants striving to demonstrate superior ability compared to everyone else or avoiding the demonstration of incompetence. The need for some athletes and coaches to use performance enhancing drugs would also fit into this area as athletes want to be the best at all costs or at least do not want to look poor compared to others. To this end, cheating is a justifiable means.

Both orientations are present in all of us; and the goal to achieve is what drives us to attend the next shoot. For the clay target shooter, task orientation occurrs when we shoot a possible, or shoot a personal best, overtake our previous longest break or just absolutely smoke a target. The break badges section of the CTSN is a perfect example of this. Task orientation is what drives us to practise, visualise, concentrate and do any of the numerous physical and mental skills that enable us to perform well. Ego orientation occurs when we focus on comparing our performance on the personal standards of others.

Standing in front of the score board looking at the scores and feeling good because I shot better than so and so, is a perfect example of ego orientation. So too is the feeling we get when the sash is put over our head or when we shake everones hand on the way back to the club house.

Ego orientation, however can get in the way of sportspersonship dimensions of "respect for social conventions", "respect for rules and officials", respect for one's full committment" and "respect and concern for the opponent". These dimensions determine whether or not we are good sports.

So how does achievement goal theory impact on the current debate about rules and handicapping. Firstly, with respect to trap settings. Why is there a need to standardise trap settings? All clubs are different: the direction they shoot, the background, prevailing winds, colour and make of targets and traps, the list of variables goes on and on. It may be necessary to agree on a trap angle, height and distance setting but will it stop there? Will clubs be asked to use one make of target, one colour or one make of trap? Will traps have to be redirected so we are all shooting in the same direction. These ideas seem ridiculous. How could Mt Bogong CTC and Hay Gun Club, for example, ever offer the same thing. I have shot at both clubs and I couldn't tell what angles the targets were thrown at or even what distance: the backgounds, the changing light conditions, winds, etc make it impossible for these clubs to provide uniformity of competition. (Both are great clubs to shoot at). We can never achieve true target consistancy so we should be happy that we can participate in our sport (task orientation) and not impose impossible changes to satisfy the ego orientation of those who wish to win all the time and not be prepared to fail because of some local variable beyond their control. For me. I find it a greater challenge if I can go to a new club and shoot well on a different ground, with a different background, conditions and different competitors.

Secondly, with respect to the handicapping system, again it is ego orientation that gets in the way. Some shooters are not happy with shooting well from 21, 22, 23, 24, and 25 metres because it means that there performance may look poor or week when compared with others on the score board, or that by giving others a few metres they might do themselves out of the high gun or some other trophy. It is ego orientation that gets in the way and gives shooters the two options that appear to be problem with rorting; too easy to avoid out ward movement and too easy to come back.

I believe that handicap shooting is necessary and essential if new and lower grade shooters are to be given equal oportunity. I do not believe that a handicap system exists or can exist that will not be manipulated by some shooters to gain advantage over others. If a new system is to be developed then it needs to have one major component: it should be simple. It is not the system that will cause the problem. It will be shooters who, because of ego orientated motivation will want to win at all costs and at the expense of their competitors.

Michael Diamond Visit to Western and Central Queensland

Michael arrived in Roma on the afternoon of Wednesday March 7, 2001, for a series of visits to local schools and organisations. Michael's itinerary was very tight and busy.

He began by visiting the Roma Town Council Offices to meet the CEO, Russell Hood, and to conduct a radio interview for Brisbane ABC radio station 612 4QR. Later that evening he was the guest of honour and guest speaker at a special dinner at the Roma Gun Club, where he was welcomed to the district by Mayor Bruce Garvie. The dinner was attended by around 80 people including Disabled Olympic Gold Medallist, Darren Thrupp.

Early on Thursday morning we left Roma to drive to Springsure, 300 km North of Roma, where Michael addressed children from the local state and Catholic schools. From Springsure we went to Emerald where Michael spoke to 2 schools and gave 2 radio interviews.

From Emerald we moved to Blackwater for another speaking engagement at the local high school, and then it was back to Emerald for 2 guest appearances for local sponsors. That evening Michael was the guest of honour at a small dinner for local Clay Target Club office bearers and sponsors.

Friday morning we were on the road again back to Roma. At Roma we completed 3 more school visits to the Roma Catholic school, Roma Middle school and the Roma Senior school, and 3 visits to local businesses. That evening Michael was guest speaker at an Engineers conference in the civic centre, after which he made a guest appearance at the opening of a new tavern in Roma.

On Saturday Michael did a radio interview first thing after which he attended the Roma Gun Club charity shoot in aid of the Royal Flying Doctor Service. This was an all day commitment with Michael talking with many of the 150 people who participated. A large crowd of general public also took the opportunity to meet Michael.

Sunday was a rest day.

On Monday it was back on the road again to the town of Dalby where Michael visited the local Christian school, Catholic school and High school. In between these visits Michael attended a civic reception where he was welcomed to Dalby by the Mayor. He also conducted several interviews with representatives from local TV, radio and print media.

After a quick lunch with the President of the QCTA and the President of Dalby Clay Target Club, we drove to Brisbane where Michael caught a flight back home to Sydney.

While this tour was very tiring (we covered more than 1800 kilometres in the few days of the tour), it was most worthwhile.

The response from the children in the schools was outstanding. They listened avidly to what Michael had to say

and there were always more questions than time allowed. Without exception, the children enthusiastically sought Michael's autograph, and many were photographed with him. The Teachers too were very positive about Michael's visit and they often were keener than the children to get Michael's autograph.

In his talks Michael spoke about how he got into the sport of clay target shooting, and how he had to stay focused on his goals. He urged the school children to stay focused on their dreams, to be prepared to make sacrifices to achieve their goals and listen to the advice of others particularly their parents and teachers. He also talked about the importance of firearm safety and handling firearms in general.

ACTA History books were given to schools for their libraries and to sponsors and clubs that participated. The UNISERVE posters were terrific quality and were used in both pre tour advertising and later as thank you gestures to sponsors. They acquired extra value once signed by Michael.

Overall the tour was an outstanding success due, in no small part, to Michael's humble approach, professional conduct and easy to get on with attitude. He is truly a wonderful ambassador for our sport and his country. In the few days of the tour Michael did more to promote our sport than any other publicity campaign that I have seen.

He was not afraid to take up issues with the media who were all too ready to criticise and put him and the sport down. Comments like "What is going on when we have all these shootings in schools in America, yet we allow Michael Diamond to be in our schools", were voiced on the ABC during the tour. Michael was a true diplomat and fielded those issues very competently. As he said blaming people like him for shooting deaths is like blaming Peter Brock for road fatalities.

This tour owes its success to Michael. He was very well received everywhere we went, with the children and general public welcoming him most warmly. Everyone was grateful for Michael making the time to visit the small remote towns and schools.

Apart from the time on the road, the only down side occurred in a couple of schools that were not organised properly and had not prepared for Michael's visit. At one school for example, after waiting 10 minutes for the teacher concerned to be found, we were directed to the school hall which was locked and had no chairs set up for the meeting. On the way to the hall the teacher was asking kids if they were going to attend!

To avoid incidents like this a briefing kit, including how to introduce Michael and suitable questions to ask him, needs to be prepared and given to the schools prior to his visit. Included in this kit should be contact details for the local clay target club.

The full colour sheet describing Michael's Olympic achieve-

ments, with a colour photograph of him was excellent. One copy was given to each child and many got Michael to autograph their copy. Similarly the brochure promoting clay target shooting was well received. It is a pity it still has the old Melbourne ACTA telephone numbers.

Michael's visit is an excellent opportunity for local clay target clubs to promote the sport and their club. To this end guidelines need to be prepared that include strategies for clubs to capitalise on Michael's visit. These guidelines would assist clubs to conduct activities to promote, and introduce more people to the sport and themselves in general. Whether it be suggestions on how to conduct a charity shoot, or a free "come and try day" with sausage sizzle, or how schools can include clay target shooting as one of the sports offered to students, local clubs need some guidelines on how to make the most of what is a very positive and most effective promotion for clay target shooting.

Promoting clay target shooting in the present political climate is not easy. However, using Michael in a tour like that described above was most successful and should be duplicated throughout every state and territory. I urge the ACTA and state clay target associations to get together to capitalise on Michael's outstanding achievements and employ him, or pay him a retainer, to conduct similar tours throughout Australia.
