The 8th National Sporting Clays were held at the ACTA National Ground in Wagga Wagga on the 19th and 20th May. Participation at this years Nationals was slightly down on last year and visitors were attracted from as far away as Western Australia. Members from the ACTA, SSAA and Field & Game were all represented at these Nationals

The format at this years Sporting Clays Nationals was unchanged from the previous year with the ACTA Sporting Clays Championship being conducted on the Saturday and the Commonwealth Sporting Clays Championship being conducted on the Sunday. The National Sporting Clays Champion was again to be decided over both days.

Saturday saw 46 competitors contest the ACTA Sporting Clays Championship on a glorious warm autumn day. The overall winner of this event was Soc Pilipasidis with a score of 95/100. The grade

Accordingly the grade placings for this event are as follows: 1st AA Grade Soc Pilipasidis 100/110 2nd AA Grade Peter Muntz 92/100; 1st A Grade Ashley Matuch 91/100, 2nd A Grade Tony Panetta 88/100; 1st B Grade Peter Whyte 76/100, 2nd B Grade Ross Dawson 75/100 and 1st C Grade Keith Saggers 81/110, 2nd C Grade Brian North 80/110. Junior section was won by Ashley Matuch with a score of

91/100 and Reg Clarke won the Veteran section on a score of 76/100.

Third place in A Grade was taken out by Beaufort GC member Greg O'Shannassy with a score of 169/200. After a short shoot-off Field & Game member Ashley Matuch claimed second place with a score of 189/210 from fellow Field & Game member Tony Panetta in first place with a score of 190/210.



Letter to the Editor

ACTA CREDIBILITY, LOST OR JUST MISPLACED?

During my time as a member of the ACTA Management and Executive Committee, the majority of the Executive had little experience or time for what was then know as ISU shooting which was considered to be too hard.

One even went so far as to state that the ACTA should move to downgrade the importance of ISU shooting as it was detracting from the more favoured traditional DTL shooting. What an error judgement that turned out to be.

The majority of international teams and team officials representing Australia prior to today's unprecedented success of our shooters were partially self funded. Putting their hands into their own pockets to encourage and support the growth of the sport at its highest level, the sport is now seeing the benefits of their efforts and the personal sacrifice and cost which went hand in glove with their support.

HOW TIMES HAVE CHANGED. Now it appears most of the Executive have jumped on to the bandwagon. For one who appears to have discretionary rights concerning the composition of international teams, managers, coaches and judges, travelling the world at the sports expense appears to be his sole right.

HAS THE ACTA MISPLACED ITS CREDIBILITY? What about the old fashioned idea of a fair go for all. Why can't the ACTA revert back to the tried and true method that used to and should apply for the appointment of managers and coaches for overseas teams? This was achieved by calling for expressions of interest in the CTSN. In doing so why not include judges for international events, all of which would go a long way to broadening our base of experienced personnel.

More than a little transparency is called for to do away with the closed shop attitude that currently prevails and the chance for the decision makers to exclude certain individuals from any consideration at all without having to answer for their decisions.

TEAM PERSONAL. Through the CTSN I am asking the ACTA to go back through its records, surely not a difficult task in this day and age, and publish in next months CTSN the names of the officials that have accompanied standard discipline and ISSF international teams competing overseas since 1996 Atlanta Olympic Games to today and the method of their appointment.

I wonder just how many of the teams will have included a member of the ACTA Executive. How many trips have some Executive members had at the expense of more highly qualified people who were simply not considered? How many qualified people outside of the inner sanctum were not aware of the appointment until they read about it following the teams return?

CTSN. Should the ACTA accept my challenge then let us go all the way. When publishing historical team information in the CTSN, let us also have details of the judges appointments to ISSF international events in the same period and in particular details of when the appointments were not self funded.

YOU DECIDE. From the pattern which I believe will emerge, ACTA members will be able to decide for themselves if all members of the Association, many of which have gone to considerable personal expense to gain the necessary knowledge and experience to equip themselves for a role at international level, are really receiving a fair go. Or is it just the chosen few.

I would like to congratulate Laurie Sceresini on his contribution to YOUR SAY, June 2001. As I could not agree more with his comments

The name "Skeet" is owned by its members and administered by the National Skeet Shooting Association (N.S.S.A.) both registered and incorporated under American Law in Delaware, USA.

Prior to 1946 the name "Skeet" and it's shooting rules were owned Lock, Stock and Barrel, by the founder of the sport, a Mr. Homer Tilton. He initially administered and publicised "Skeet" through his chain of Sporting, Hunting and Fishing Magazines. As popularity of the sport grew, administration of "Skeet" became time consuming for Mr Tilton. He reluctantly handed over the administration and subsequent ownership to the newly formed NSSA in 1947 with a number of conditions, the most pertinent being:

- 1. That the sport of Skeet belongs to its members. ie. The NSSA.
- 2. The sport resemble and mirror it's original form and intent.
- 3. That it's administration be "stringently transparent"

The above mentioned reluctance of Mr Tilton, in hindsight, was well founded. Mr Tilton rightfully anticipated that his beloved sport may be, and has obviously been (over the past 20 years in Australia) "Bastardised".

I believe that any departure from the shooting sequence and format as currently laid down by the NSSA, is not only insulting and disrespectful to the founders of the sport. But also shows lack of tactility for the total abandonment of the games traditions and history.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE NATIONALS

1.In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note:A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

2.Targets to be shot in brackets of 25, squads of 6 Olympic Trap, squads of 6 ISSF Skeet and rounds of 25 Pair for Open/Jnr Double Trap and 20 Pair for Womens Double Trap.

3.Nominations to be received by 3pm the day prior to the beginning of an Event or such time as determined by the Tournament Director.

4.Shooter will be squadded as per ISSF rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw.

5.Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable event.

 $6. Shooters \ who fail to appear in time for their squad may be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.$

7.Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

8.All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.

9.Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfill their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement who must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement no being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may INCUR A PENALTY AS PERSCRIBED UNDER INTERNATIONAL RULES.

10.Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may will be penalised up to FIVE (5) TARGETS.

11.All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

12.All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.

13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective High Gun

15. Junior shooters are eligible for their section as well as the Open.

16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.

17.The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing, 1st, 2nd, 3rd in all events.

18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.

19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

20.An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.

21.Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to second family members only, they being wives or husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.

22.All competitors must comply with Firearm Licensing Laws in their state of residence and in the state hosting the National Championships.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS AUGUST 2001

A great deal of debate still seems to be going on about the "new" Skeet rules. I believe that this only highlights the fact that the majority of people are still confused as to just exactly why the Skeet rules were changed at all. Additionally, a lot of people, including some of the most vocal of the opponents of the changes, do not even seem to understand just what the actual changes are, let alone why they were made, even though they were published in full in the January issue of the CTSN.

Well for a start the "new" Skeet rules are not new rules at all. They are the old rules. The original rules as laid down by the National Skeet Shooting Association, who invented the sport and who are still the worldwide governing body. The Skeet rule changes that came into effect on January 1st 2001, are the result of a decision by the vast majority of serious Skeet shooters to revert back to the NSSA "standard" rules, rather than continuing to shoot under a unique set of "home rules" that had progressively been implemented in this country over the past twenty years or so.

Up until the early eighties, NSSA Skeet rules were used in Australia. Then unfortunately, some presumably well-meaning, but clearly misguided ACTA administrative people, who were basically "Trap oriented" and obviously had no serious involvement in, or clear understanding of Skeet shooting, decided they would "improve" Skeet shooting by making a number of "new" rule changes.

These changes involved incorporating both some ISU Skeet rules and some Trap rules into Skeet, as well as making up a few of their own rules as well. These "new" rule changes were not at all well received by the majority of serious Skeet shooters at that time, some of whom went to great lengths to try to rescind and/or block their implementation. Unfortunately the Skeet shooters were outnumbered and "outgunned" by the administrators, and after what I still believe was the implementation of an "underhanded technicality", the "new" rules were forced upon us.

Then, to make matters worse, several years later, the ACTA rulebook was reformatted, and in an attempt to standardize and simplify many of the rules in it, a lot of the Trap and Skeet rules were "similarised". Unfortunately, these changes were again executed by "Trap oriented administrators", so no Trap rules were altered to align with the Skeet rules. Every similarisation that was made, altered the Skeet rules to line up with the Trap rules. The nett result of these two periods of "improvement" was a mismatched set of unique "home rules" that has been the curse of serious Skeet shooters ever since.

The problems manifested by the use of "home rules" for a sport that is not uniquely Australian are many and varied. To cite just a couple, World Records are unable to be established here, and meaningful performance comparisons with overseas countries are unable to be made. However, a much more fundamental dilemma is created by the dual problems of visiting overseas shooters being unfairly disadvantaged when attempting to compete here, and of Australian shooters having to try and make the frustrating transition to "standard rules" in order to try and be competitive at the World Championships.

I have recently heard this latter problem being dismissed "out of hand" by some of the detractors of the recent rules realignment, on the basis that very few overseas shooters visit here, and only a handful of Australian Skeet shooters compete at the World Championships each year. Thus their line of argument then proceeds along the line of "Why should we, the rank and file shooters, be disadvantaged by having to adjust to changes in the rules, just so that a very small minority of the sport's upper echelon competitors will not be disadvantaged if they aspire to greatness?"

Even if we were currently "changing" the rules, in order to achieve such an outcome, I would consider this type of attitude to be unreasonably selfish and narrow-minded. However, as we are only trying to correct a wrong that was previously perpetrated by the inept people who bastardized our rules in the first place, I find such attitudes to be very un-Australian and almost impossible to comprehend. The only justification I could see in their defense would be ignorance, as presumably such people would not have been shooting long enough to have ever shot under the "real rules" or perhaps even realize that we shoot "home rules" in this country.

The ACTA usually has about 10,000 registered shooters. By my definition only about 10%, or 1000, of those people are "serious" shooters ie: they show up at the Nationals or their State Shoot. The worldwide ratio of Trap shooters to Skeet shooters is about 3:1. Thus I figure there are only about 250 "serious" Skeet shooters in the whole of Australia. As a quick double check, if you add up the attendance at the Skeet Nationals and each of the State Skeet Shoots, and then deduct the multiple occurrences, you'll find that 250 isn't that far out.

So if we average one squad at the World Championships each year, then we're looking to cater for about 2% of the people who really matter. Now if you add up all the serious Tennis players or Cricketers in Australia and compare that count to the number of them that actually go overseas each year to compete at Wimbledon or play in the English County competition, I'm sure you will find that it comes to less than 2%. And yet no-one in his right mind would suggest making Australian Tennis courts a meter longer and raising the net, or making Australian Cricket pitches shorter and deleting one wicket, just so that we can be uniquely Australian, and justifying it on the basis that only a minority of our players would be disadvantaged at an international level.

So why the hell is there all this hullabaloo about needing to have some uniquely Australian rules for Skeet shooting and how un-Australian it would be if were to revert back to using the World standard rules for our sport. Well I'll tell you why! It's because Skeet shooting is not controlled by Skeet shooters in Australia and it wasn't Skeet shooters that changed the rules in the first place. It was a bunch of meddling Trap shooters who obviously had no idea about what they were doing.

Actually, one of the things that I will never be able to work out is why our Australian shooting sports administrators have always been short sighted enough to require us to shoot "home rules" in Trap shooting in this country. Our Trap rules differ from those of just about every other country in the World bar New Zealand, who generally just follow our lead anyway. They lie somewhere in the twilight zone between ATA Trapshooting and ISSF Trench. We fight and argue about them all the time, we constantly change them, and yet we never seem to be able to get them right. I often wonder how many times we can change the Trap Handicap rules before everyone gives up and shoots Field and Game. And this is the price we pay for being able to brag that our sport is uniquely Australian.

So I guess it should have been no real surprise when this same vein of shooting administration mindset decided to take a perfectly stable World standard sport like Skeet shooting, which unfortunately they had defacto jurisdiction over, and display their incompetence by completely stuffing it up under the guise of patriotism. If I had my way I would search out every last one of them that was involved in the whole Skeet rule change fiasco and hang them from the chute of the nearest high house.

And still it goes on! I was reading the minutes of the last VCTA meeting recently and there in black and white was a motion to attempt to rescind the "new" Skeet rules. Now maybe my outlook is a bit biased here, as my inability to see eye-to-eye with the VCTA is legendary. However, not one of the twelve members of that Association meets my definition of a "serious" Skeet shooter and in all my thirty odd years of shooting, I have never seen either the mover or the seconder of that motion shoot a single Skeet

target. Yet there they were, meddling in something that history shows is of no earthly interest to them, and trying to reverse an action that was passed by a majority of 57 to one at an ACTA Rules Committee meeting convened at the Skeet Nationals. I sometimes wonder just how much it takes to drive an abstainer like me to drink?

And before I get down off my high horse this month, there is yet another related matter that I would like to take issue with. I have received several phone calls from Skeet shooters in Western Australia recently, complaining that certain high ranking officials in that State's governing body have been advising and encouraging people to shoot Skeet under the 2000 rules on the basis that the "new" Skeet rules were rushed through without proper consultation and were not constitutionally or legally ratified.

To set the record straight on that front, the Skeet rule changes that were invoked at the start of this year came as the result of over three years of meetings and lobbying by Skeet shooters, which eventually resulted in the ACTA Management Committee passing on a "strong recommendation" to the Rules Committee in October 1999 that our Skeet rules be realigned with NSSA. You'd think that it would have been a walk up start right there, wouldn't you? But it still took another fourteen months to bring it to fruition. During this time the Rules Committee invited a draft recommendation from the ASSA, which they duly considered and then published a summary of in the CTSN inviting comment from interested people. And eventually they took the unprecedented step of convening an open forum meeting at the Skeet Nationals to gauge support for the proposal. When that proved overwhelmingly positive they finally ratified the changes and approved them for the following year.

Now if that's not proper consultation and/or politically correct, then I don't know what is. I believe that many of the rule change detractors are simply displaying spitefulness at the Skeet shooters finally having some say in their own destiny. And their last hurrah of trying to block the rule changes by causing deliberate confusion with an ACTA motion not to change the Trap rules again until 2002, displays a covertly malicious intent and is nothing short of dirty politics.

However in 1994, when Roger Duthie passed 600, both Phil Grainger and Craig Bentley were still there and neither of them has ever won the event. But don't fret as Craig already had a Silver Australia Badge from winning the Macintosh High Gun in 1986 and Phil went on to win the Champion of Champions in 1998. 

Harris.


With it being Good Friday the evening meal was fish on the BBQ with salads. A great day was had by all.




