

ACTA EXECUTIVE MEETING

At the time of writing these notes we have just concluded 3 full days of Executive Meetings in Wagga. The ACTA sub committees and the full executive held several meetings during this period.

The following points from the meetings may be of interest to members

- The proposed trap rules changes will now be debated for another year and no changes will now be introduced until the start of 2003.

- The skeet rules will also continue to be debated and if changes are needed, they will also happen in 2003.

- State Associations will be encouraged to have a greater input into discussions on proposed rule changes.

The roles of Referees, Referee Examiners and Rules Supervisors will be reviewed.

- As of 2002 all ISSF Nationals will be held in the last 2 weeks of January. The Championships committee believe this will prove to be a better time to hold these Nationals in future vears.

- A request to move the 2002 DTL Nationals was unsuccessful, the Championships committee is trying to accommodate for as many visitors as possible coming from the New Zealand World DTL Championships.

- The ACTA Membership for 2002 has been set at \$68 including GST. The slight increase is to offset increased costs associated with insurance premiums.

WORLD POLICE & FIRE GAMES

The World Police and Fire Games has recently been allocated to Adelaide for March 2007. These games will involve more than 10,000 competitors in 64 different sports. Trap, Skeet and Sporting clays are well supported in these games and will draw a lot of attention from overseas shooters.

NATIONAL HIGH GUN

It has been queried as to why the High Gun at the DTL Nationals has 2 high gun trophies. The Ron Porter Remembrance Cup is given for the Overall trap high gun winner. In the past the Newton Thomas Cup was given to the high gun winner for trap and skeet when both were shot at the one National Championship. As it has not occurred for many years both cups were given to the DTL National High Gun winner.

STATE AND NATIONAL CARNIVALS IN SEPTEMBER

In September there is an ISSF State Carnival on nearly every week as well as the National ISSF Carnival from Sept 15th - 22nd at Cecil Park. The long weekend Sept 29th, 30th & Oct 1st also see the NSW and WA trap carnivals being shot. There is certainly plenty of trap shooting available for everyone during September.

WORLD CUP - KOREA- MAY, 2001

Reports by Graham Michell and Greg Chan

What a hectic, chaotic, exciting, frantic - 6 week period in the ISSF shooter's calendar - from mid April till late May our shooters represented Australia and the A.C.T.A. at the above competitions.

The first competition was in Cyprus where Greg Chan was the Manager/Coach and his Team report is as follows:

WORLD CUP - CYPRUS 22nd - 28th April, 2001

Trap - Michael Diamond, Ben Kelly, Nathan Cassells Double Trap - Russell Mark, Adam Vella, Steve Haberman Coach/Manager - Greg Chan

The Team was split into two groups for the trip to Cyprus with Greg, Steve and Nathan departing Melbourne and Michael and Ben from Sydney on the 20th leaving Russell and Adam to come over on the 22nd

The first two groups flew Singapore Airlines and met up in Singapore after a seven hour flight, then continued on together for another seven hour leg to Dubai. We had a six hour stopover in Dubai before finally boarding an Emirates flight to Cyprus. Twenty six hours after leaving Australia we landed at Larnaca Airport, tired but happy to be on solid ground again.

We were met by Cypriot officials and transported to the Lordos Beach Hotel which would be home for the next week.

The 22nd was unofficial practice and as we were all up early, not having had time to get over the jet lag, we decided to head out to the range to have a couple of rounds to settle in. The range in Cyprus is carved into hills and has green crops growing right in front of the layouts giving a terrific background before hitting the skyline and it's not hard to see why some big scores have been shot on this ground

The next day was official practice and the Opening Ceremony. The weather changed dramatically that afternoon as we arrived back at the range for the Opening. The temperature dropped to around 14 degrees and the wind started to blow a gale. The organisers cut short the ceremony to avoid exposure to the conditions and all adjourned to the clubhouse for refreshments before heading back to the hotel for another early night.

Meanwhile Russell and Adam had left Melbourne on the 22nd following the same route as the first group, except they had plane trouble in Dubai and ended up waiting there for twelve hours instead of six. They were two very weary travellers when they finally made it to the hotel that night.

Trap - Day 1: The day started with ideal conditions but the wind came up in the afternoon, so Michael's 73 to lead the field at days end, was a great effort. Ben's 69 was still within reach of the final but Nathan's 66 had put him out of contention.

Trap - Day 2: Ben posted a tremendous 49, Michael 48 and Nathan an uncharacteristic 35. Michael would lead into the final and Ben's effort rewarded with a Final's berth as well.

On completion of the double trap, we were booked to fly to Cairo for the World Championships via Athens on Olympic Airlines. Our flight out of Cyprus at 9.30 pm was delayed for two hours causing us to miss our connection to Cairo by half an hour. The USA and Croatian Teams were also on our flight making a total of 21 passengers heading for Cairo and instead of holding the flight, Olympic let it depart with 21 empty seats and no more flights for 24 hours and no guarantee of seats as it was fully booked. After 4 hours of negotiating they finally agreed to send some via Switzerland, Paris and Milan with all groups of mixed Teams.

To cut a long story short, we all finally arrived in Cairo on trips varying from 18 to 24 hours, that normally takes less than one hour on a direct flight. We were all exhausted from lack of sleep but ready to give our best at the World Championships, but that's another story......

We would like to thank Luca Scribani Rossi from Beretta Australia and Alessandra Socci from RC for making ammunition available for us in Cyprus. Without these valuable sponsors' arrangements to organise ammunition would certainly be much more difficult.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP - CAIRO

The next competition to be contested was the World Championships in all ISSF disciplines, including Juniors, and these were held in Cairo, Egypt.



These ended in being the largest Championships in the history of ISSF shooting in both numbers of competitors and numbers of countries contesting, and it was also the first time that there were enough Juniors to enable World Championship status on their events as well. A milestone for ISSF shooting as far as the Juniors were concerned with the United States of America and Australia being the two countries who have been promoting the Junior side of ISSF. In total there were 54 countries competing and 608 competitors. The United States had the largest team with 40 competitors, Australia with the second largest, with 34 competitors, followed by Italy with 33 and Russia with 32.



At the end of the World Championships, Australia had:

- 3 Individual World Champions
- 2 Individual Bronze Medallists
- 1 World Championship Team Men's Trap
- 1 Bronze Medal Team Women's Trap



'official hotels' with Dr. Sue and me staying with the Junior Team at the Meridian Hotel and the Senior Team, along with John, Greg and Darrien, stayed at the Sofitel Hotel about 500 metres away and from both we had a splendid view of the pyramids. A few people made comments of why had I split the Team in this way but I believe it worked out exceptionally well with the Senior Team enjoying their freedom and the Junior Team dining and enjoying each other's company and I thought this created a greater Team atmosphere. I believe the results have proven this.

On arrival at the Cairo Airport on the 27th April, we were met by members of the Organising Committee and we proceeded through Customs and all of the formalities. As usual, the Egyptian Customs do their own thing and then the Egyptian Police come in and repeat

the process - never thinking or working in with each other - and all of the paperwork is written in Arabic so you can't really see what details they are actually writing down and you just hope that they have got it all right. About 3 hours later we were ready to depart for our accommodation.

Under a new agreement we all flew with Singapore Airlines to both World Cups and the World Championship where we had no problems what so ever with excess baggage and/or seating arrangements with the carrier going out of it's way to assist our Teams. The only airline problems occurred when we had to use Olympic Airlines to get our Team back out of Cyprus - that was a complete and utter disaster as you have already read in Greg Chan's report.

The Team was accommodated at two 5 star hotels which were the

Remembering our last trip to Cairo and our experience with the 'land travel', I jokingly said to the Organising Committee delegate that I hoped they had an appropriate sized bus for our Team of 22. He assured me we had a modern coach but when it arrived from the bus park, it turned out to be a 26 seater, but without any provision for baggage to be stored and as everyone had 2 to 3 pieces of luggage this created a huge problem. We filled the back seat up with as much as we possibly could. Incidentally, the bus had a back door, so we thought we could load the luggage in through this door but when we tried to open it, it felt like it was jammed and as



I was supervising the loading I gave it a bit of a kick and suddenly the door fell off it's hinges just as the driver told us that we couldn't open the door. So we pushed the door back inside and leaned it up against the framework, using some of the bags that we had inside to jam it and hold it in place. All of the excess baggage, most of which were the heavier pieces, had to go up on the roof rack and with the driver on the roof we proceeded to pass all of the pieces of luggage up to him. Luckily it all fitted but with most of it standing on it's end and the driver then had to go and look for someone who had some ropes so he could tie down the load. Finally we were away with a Police escort. We came across a Security Check Point about a half a kilometre from the airport and the Police drove straight through - our bus being stopped as the bus did not have the proper authority to go straight through. After about 10 minutes we were able to proceed but not once did our so called 'Police escort' come to our assistance even though parked only some 30 to 40 metres up the road. We were finally off to our hotels and after a couple of wrong turns, about an hour later we arrived at our hotel where we had to unload all of the luggage and sort out what belonged to everybody and then John took the Senior Team off to the Sofitel Hotel while I booked in with the Juniors at the Meridian Hotel.

We then had a couple of hours to unpack and get settled before we had a Team meeting for the Juniors with John and me talking (Dr. Sue and Darrien observing), on what we expected of the Juniors and we all passed on any prior knowledge we had of Cairo and the hotel and we made times for breakfasts and dinners so we could all eat together 'as a Team'. At dinner that night I was informed of the delays with the Team coming in from Cyprus but at that stage there was very little that I could do from Cairo.

28th April - Everyone was up early and very keen to get out to the shooting range where we planned to get some unofficial training in. As the grounds were open for training, everyone elected to have at least 1 or 2 rounds of practice but our first priority was to see if the 14 cases of cartridges that I had pre-ordered was there waiting for us. I was then told that the PB cartridges that I had ordered, all that they could supply was just 4,000 to the Australian Team and in fact there were only 7,000 in total on the grounds and that we would in fact have to take the balance in Maionchi or Viri shells. I purchased a case of the Maionchi for the shooters to practice with and the Team members all went off, keen to have their 2 rounds of practice each.

In the meantime I went off and started paving all the entries and tried to finalize the book work with the authorities. These Team Managerial duties took about 3 hours a day for each of the next 8 days and all I can say is there were a lot of head-aches. I found the hotels had over booked all of the rooms (this was their High Season and there were a lot of tourists about) and they also booked them out to the names of the people in them, not to the Australian Team as a whole, and when I had to juggle people around once the Team came in from Cyprus, chaos reigned for a couple of nights as we had been booked 2 rooms short. When the Cyprus Team arrived they found they had 2 bags missing along with Nathan Cassells' gun and the Team members were all completely worn out, virtually having had no sleep for one and a half days.

April 29th - Up early again for this was 'official practice' day for Trap and as usual Australia was up first on the grounds (countries practice in alphabetical order). All of the Trap shooters were keen to get in a solid practice and we had Nathan trying to familiarize himself with a loan of Adam's gun.

I attended the Technical Meeting that day. The Opening Ceremony was on the agenda in the early evening and we saw two very proud Juniors carrying the Australian flag into the Opening Ceremony - Angelique Psarakis and Robert Cameron. All of the Juniors and some of the Senior Team attended` this ceremony dressed in their official track-suits and this was great to see. We were entertained by some Egyptian musicians, dancing horses and then Egyptian dancing - this was all very lovely but I found the music a little too loud and went on a little too long.

Prior to the Opening Ceremony taking place we had been notified that the missing bags etc. had turned up at the airport and they needed Greg and Nathan to go out and pick up the articles. The Organizing Committee were supposed to supply a vehicle for this but after waiting for an hour and a half, Greg was informed that he would have to take a taxi. 100 Egyptian pounds later and about 4 hours of time, Greg and Nathan returned with the suit cases but still no gun.

April 30th - The competition started and we saw the first 50 targets of Trap being shot.

The weather conditions were quite warm for the whole 10 days of competition except for one day where we had gusty winds for the full day. There was a lot of pollution every morning and usually a little sand blowing about.

A lot of work had been done on the ranges since my last visit here (in 1998) with a new range having been built and all the grounds levelled out in front with imitation green lawn in strips along the front of the each trap house to help the shooters see the orange clays as they flew out into the golden sand back ground. The clays that they used were Nasta clays, thrown by Sienna machines. The targets were very good but difficult to see against the sand.

At the end of the first day in the Men's competition we had Michael on 50/50 and both Ben and Nathan on 48/50. The Junior Men's scores were: Travis Vaina on 47/50, and Robert Cameron and Andrew Brady both on 45/50. In the Women's competition we saw both Deserie and Suzanne scoring 47/50, with Nessa shooting a 43/50. Lastly the Junior Women's results showed that Angelique Psarakis had shot a 44/50 and Leanne Smith a 43/50.

We all left the grounds and headed back to the hotels feeling satisfied with our results for the first day's competition and I would like to take this opportunity to thank both John and Greg for the magnificent jobs they did as Coaches, for their support given to the shooters and I know this was appreciated by the shooters themselves as much as it was by me. Thanks fellas !

1st May - Competition on day 2 was another 50 targets of Trap for both the Men and Junior Men and 25 targets + Final for the Women and Junior Women.

At the end of the day's competition we found the following results: Men - Michael had shot a 47/50, Ben a 47/50 and Nathan a 46/50.

The Junior Men - Robert Cameron 46/50, Andrew Brady 45/50 and Travis Vaina a 41/50. For the Women, Suzanne shot a 22 putting her on 69 and into the Final, Deserie shot a 19 and that gave her a 66 and Nessa also shot a 19 giving her a score of 62. After the Women's Final was shot, Suzanne finished in 6th position on 89/100, Deserie was placed in 9th overall and Nessa, = 25th place. The Australian Women's Trap Team did however win the Bronze Team Medal - well done ! Our Junior Women's results had us really smiling - Angelique shot a 22 giving her 66/75 and Leanne a 20 making her total 63 and we had a new Junior Women's Trap World Champion - Angelique. The presentation followed and what a proud and lovely young lady she made, standing there on the dais, receiving her World Champion trophy. Well done, "Squirrel".

By this time I am afraid to say, sickness had arrived in the Australian camp with Jarrod Fletcher violently ill and many others having upset stomachs and Coach John was feeling 'poorly' as well. Dr. Sue had her time cut out running from room to room and she did a magnificent job keeping most of the Team on their feet with Masseur Darrien working tirelessly trying to ease those aches everybody had, at the hotel as well as out at the Gun Club.

May 2nd - Competition for day 3 - the last 25 targets for both Men and Junior Men + the Finals for each.

Men: Michael finished with a 25 giving him 122/125 and there were 4 shooters on 121/125 and 7 shooters on 120/125 and they were all looking for a place in the Final. Ben finished in 13th placing overall with a score of 119/125 after having shot a 24 in the last round and Nathan finished in = 21st place having shot a last round of 23 giving him a total of 117/125. Michael shot a 23 in the Final and this left 3 shooters on a score of 145/150 and they had to shoot off for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places. It then went into a Single Barrel Shoot Off with these results:

AUS DIAMOND, Michael 145 + 6 Gold USA ERICKSON, Bret 145 + 5 Silver RUS GOURKIN, Pavel 145 + 3 Bronze This gave Michael his second World Champion Trap title for the second year in a row (he had competed against 99 others in this competition). This was indeed a popular win, for Michael is admired for his shooting all around the world, and rightly so. None were more proud than the 2 Coaches who watched along with the Team Manager, who was having a case of nerves at the time.

Australia also won the Men's Team event, taking Gold and being recognised as the World Champion Team in Trap yet again - two years in a row - what an effort. Great stuff !

In the Junior Men's results we saw Robert Cameron finish 8th overall, shooting a 23 in his last round giving him 114/125, Andrew Brady was placed = 11th overall having shot a 23 making his score 113/125 and Travis Vaina was place = 18th after shooting a 22 to give him 110/125.

At presentation time it was with great pride our Team watched as the Australian flag was raised for Michael's win as World Trap Champion and again when the Men's Team took their Gold. What a result !

For dinner we had a small celebration for Michael at the Meridian Hotel dining in the Mexican restaurant. Senior Trap and Double Trap competitors had been invited on a dinner cruise on the Nile - Dr. Sue took those who wished to go to this and they had a wonderful evening.

May 3rd - A full day for Double Trap practice. By this time Jarrod Fletcher was up and about and feeling much better. John M was still very ill but managed to get himself out to the range to help Greg with the shooters - everyone trained well.

As Dr. Sue had the day off from the range she took those Juniors who were not shooting Double Trap, on a visit to the famous Cairo Museum and then shopping to the bazaars. Those that went on this trip had an enjoyable and memorable day out. I must say that there has not been a spare hour wasted in taking the Juniors to

see as much as possible in Cairo without interfering with their shooting programme. We have already had an excursion to the pyramids (for all those who wanted to go), to the Sphinx and to the old temple and to the Papyrus Art Gallery plus some shopping at the bazaars.

Our 4 Skeeties, Clive, George, Neil and Natasha arrived today. Nathan's gun also turned up and this time I had to go out to the airport and deal with the Customs and Police in order to pick it up. Another 150 Egyptian pounds later and one of the worst nights I have ever experienced in my life for by this timeI found that I had caught the dreaded bug (that being experienced by both John and Jarrod and diagnosed by Dr. Sue as 'viral meningitis'), I finally had to get Greg to meet me at the Meridian Hotel so that he could go and put Nathan's gun into the armoury. By the time I had arrived back at the hotel I was shaking and shivering so violently that I thought I was going to pass out - another patient for Dr. Sue - and she prescribed for me some medication to help relieve my symptoms.

May 4th - Double Trap competition with the full amount of targets for both Men and Junior Men, Women and Junior Women being shot for on this day. At the end of the day the results for the Men were a little disappointing when we were hoping to do well. Adam Vella came in = 9th with a score of 46+46+47 = 139 (which in anyone's language is a pretty good score), but the lowest score to go into the Final was a 142 with the highest score being 144.

She can now place these beside the Bronze Medal that she won in the same event at the World Championships in 1999 in Finland. Rocky, equally proud but very modest, accepted his Bronze Medal and I can't speak too highly of these Juniors who did more than was expected of them - well done ! They were equally delighted when confronted by the owner of Perazzi Gun manufacturers who came up to congratulate them as did Alessandra Socci of RC Cartridges. I believe both Suzie T.and Rocky are now the proud owners of new Perazzi guns, replacing their old Perazzi guns. What generous sponsorship from the gun manufacturers. Congratulations Perazzi for your gesture.

This day also saw the departure for Australia, Michael, Angelique, Ben, Travis and Andrew.

May 5th - Official Skeet training.

Both John and I were ordered to stop in bed by Dr. Sue as we were both very ill but John still went out to the ranges for a couple of hours but was soon back in fed feeling very weak and sweating profusely. We were extremely lucky to have Greg with us as he seemed to escape 'the dreaded lurgy' that had befallen us.

May 6th - First day of Skeet competition. This was to be held over 3 days instead of the usual two. 50 targets for all Men, Junior Men, Women and Junior Women.

At the end of the day's competition in the Men's section we had George on 47/50 and Clive and Neil both on 44/50. This was disappointing as all had shot good training rounds. The Junior Men's scores were Adrian on 45/50 and Paul on 44/50. Natasha shot a frustrating 40/50 in the Women's division but we saw Natalia leading the Junior Women's section after having shot a 44/50.

The only record that the Skeeties and I did make in Cairo was that all of us fitted into what was, I think, a Toyota Corola. One of the bazaar owners offered us a lift from his shop back to the hotel one night and when we told him how many we were he said, "No worries, no worries!" There were 6 of us plus him, the driver. Fairly squeezey...but he did have a captive audience as he told us how great a friend he was to us and how he had the cheapest and best buys in all of Cairo - this done all at the top of his voice - I am sure he could have talked under water with a mouth full of marbles and back home I am sure he would have made a great 'demolition derby driver'.

May 9th - This day saw our departure from Cairo - some to fly home while others of us were heading to Seoul, Korea for the Seoul World Cup.

I was still having problems with the hotel who were trying to charge us with things we had not had and I was still trying to track down our National Anthem and flags. We once again had a battle with the Customs and Police at the airport and as I stated earlier, both work independently of each other and we found that one of them had the serial number of Natalia's gun under Natasha's name - all written in Arabic. After some heated discussion some one and a half hours later and we were ready to depart from Cairo. Two things that I did learn on coming out of Cairo was that there was no weight limit on my baggage, for with all of the Team trophies and extra paperwork etc. that I had, my suitcase weighed in at 37 kilos and nothing was said and the other was with the banks, including the Egyptian Bank - they don't like taking Egyptian money back. Some of us ended up having to take some French francs for it and as one of the tellers said, "Go and spend it in the bazaar or the Duty Free shops."

Singapore Airlines had everything organised as a group booking and all went very smoothly. The flight to Singapore was via Dubai where we had an hour stopover and where most of us disembarked, either to get something to eat and drink or to go to the Duty Free shops.

Dr. Sue, Darrien, John, Diane and I headed to a coffee shop and as I hadn't had a decent meal in the last 5 - 6 days, I ordered a bowl of seafood bisque (the best I have ever had) and a steak sandwich. The steak sandwich was shared around - John said he was now a

vegetarian and ate one of the rolls that came with my soup and the lettuce out of my sandwich and Darrien ate the other roll and some of the salad from my sandwich. The soup, steak and a decent cup of coffee saved my life for I knew I wouldn't be able to face the food served on board the plane.

The city of Seoul is situated in the Han River Valley and is surrounded by mountains and it was quite different to what I had expected. A very large, modern city, filled with freeways and modern apartment buildings. The hotel that we were booked into was the Olympic Park Parktel Hotel and it is situated right alongside Olympic Park which is a legacy from the Olympic Games and is still widely used as a recreational area. and Brett Hall. Barty Brighenti was to fly in later for the Skeet.

May 11th - Official Trap training day and Technical Meeting (for me), Opening Ceremony in the afternoon followed by a Welcome Banquet which we all attended. A very busy day.

The Opening Ceremony was very colourful with folk dancing and some Junior Martial Arts performers demonstrating their skills. The weather for the whole time we were there was very good with warm sunny days of around 22 degrees C, excepting for May 15th where we had bitterly cold winds and some light showers of rain.

The shooting ground in Korea is, I believe, that which was used for the Olympic Games and combines all of the shooting sports. It is built in quite a large wooded area on the outskirts of the city and was a one hour drive from the hotel at Olympic Park. The grounds here were also utilised for other outdoor activities with many playing fields for sports such as volley ball, basketball etc. and many picnic areas. These grounds are used 7 days a week by the public for recreational use including kindergartens and school children for every day there were bus loads of children wandering about watching the shooting sports and picnicking in the area this was tremendous. I was also told that the Seoul Zoo allows certain animals (deer etc.) to graze and wander about the park at certain times of the year. There were also some large office blocks with amenities, and a very nice restaurant and an out-door eating area situated at the main buildings.

The Clay Target Range is situated about three quarters of a kilometre from the main buildings and mini buses run from the main bus park out to the Clay Target Range every 10 minutes. The Clay Target Range has 3 grounds cut into the side of a hill with the back ground being densely covered native forest, similar to that in Langkawi. There was also quite a nice restaurant situated at the Clay Target Range with plenty of seating for a viewing area. The trap layouts were equipped with Spieth throwing machines, Matarelli traps for the Double Trap and Nasta Skeet traps - the targets used were Corsivia - coloured orange. All targets thrown were of a high standard with some of the trap programmes having some very hard targets - throwing the full distance into the foliage. The Flash targets being used in the Finals were all together different and were not of a very good quality making the refereeing very difficult under the new rules where coloured powder could be seen without actually breaking the target(can be called a hit) and in many instances where the targets did not break till some time after they were hit and spun themselves to pieces. This happened on quite a few occasions making the decisions made having to be altered and this was all very confusing to the flip board operators and scorers, competitors and spectators.

The settling of all accounts was also done today and this was finalised in about 3 hours - very unlike my experiences in Cairo.

The Welcome Banquet at the Shooting Ground was quite a lavish affair with a huge crowd in attendance and with many of our Team members not wishing to try some of the different Korean dishes, we all caught the first bus back to the hotel and then John and I, along with a couple of the girls, headed for the restaurant while most of the Team headed off to either McDonalds or Hungry Jacks which were situated about a kilometre from the hotel.

The food in Korea is very expensive, as is clothes, electrical goods etc. and I believe things are cheaper back home. There are some bargains if you go to the street stalls and barter for them but the quality then is unknown. It was here that a shop owner told me that he had some "very cheap imitation copy watches, but not as good as the usual copies", can you believe it, at least he was honest!

Korea is one of the most progressive countries that I have been to with their building of freeways, high rise buildings, modern cars, a very modern underground railway system and all very, very clean and something that was very noticeable, NO GRAFFITI to be seen anywhere.

One of the American competitors who had previously been stationed in Seoul 8 years ago with the American Air Force, told us that while he was there only about 2 or 3 bridges crossed the river

that runs through the city and there were very few building over 30 - 40 metres in height. Now there are dozens of modern bridges and everywhere you look there are high-rise buildings and not much pollution for such a large city.


May 12th - This is not only a World Cup for Clay Target shooting but for Pistol and Rifle as well, they are all here in Seoul for the combined World Cups - 475 competitors from 33 countries.

The first 75 targets of the Trap competition for our shooters plus the Final for the Women. At the end of competition we had two Women in the Final. Diane in 2nd place on 69/75 and Suzanne in 5th place on 66/75. Nessa came in 10th place with a score of 60/75 and Leanne who was shooting an MQS position shot a disappointing round of 52/75. At the end of the Final, Elena Tkach posted a 24 giving her a score of 97/100 - a new World Record and the Gold Medal. Dianne had to shoot off for 2nd and 3rd place with Keiko

Suzu of Japan and as Dianne missed her first target she had to settle for the Bronze. Scores were:

Suzanne finished in 5th place with a 66+22 for a total of 88/100. Well done girls - this was exceptionally fine shooting.

In the Men's Trap, Tom had shot a 72/75, Nathan and Nidal each 67/75 and our Junior, Robert, shooting for an MQS, shot 65/75.

Off to the presentation ceremony which was held outside and this was a very colourful affair for the women carrying the medals and flowers were dressed in their colourful national dress. A proud moment for Diane as she received her Bronze Medal. Diane puts a huge amount of effort into her training and is one of the best Team members we have on any trip as she is always willing to help where ever she can. Thank you.

May 13th - Nessa flew out this morning after catching the 5 am bus for the airport. With the last 50 targets of Men's Trap plus the Final to be shot, there was also some Double Trap practice to follow, so we all headed off to the shooting range.

At the end of the day we had Tom on 119/125 which put him into 4th place going into the Final. Nathan finished on 114/125 leaving him in 10th place and Nidal in 13th place after shooting 113/125. Our Junior Robert shot a 109 in his MQS position.

The Final was not a straight forward Final either as there were many dubious decisions made, targets being dusted and called 'lost, targets being dusted and called ' hits and one target in particular that was clearly broken and apparently unseen by the referee was called 'lost' but seen by many of the spectators as being broken. This caused a shoot off for 1st, 2nd and 3rd for at the end of the Final Glenn Kable (formerly of Australia but now shooting for Fiji), Alexei Alipov of Russia and Dominic Grazioli of the USA were all on 144/150. This Shoot Off could have been averted if Glenn had a coach/Manager present. He did end up winning the shoot off by shooting 4 single barrels. Tom shot a 24 in the Final which was really great but it left him to shoot off for 4th and 5th overall and he was contesting this with our old friend from the UAE, Ahmed Al Maktoum. Tom won the shoot off by shooting two targets over Ahmed's one target. Well done Tom.

May 14th - Practice for Double Trap and one shooter departing for Australia - Nidal up early to catch that 5 am bus for the airport.

Once again Australia was up first for practice with all shooting exceptionally well - particularly Russell, Nathan and Brett. Suzie Trindall experienced a double discharge in her gun and John had the gun smith check the triggers and did what he could and they seemed to be working well after being worked on. We had an early finish today and went back early to do some laundry chores etc. and then went shopping. John and I found a Sizzler type restaurant where we dined with reasonable prices and a good variety of food to choose from - the steaks still very expensive and very small compared to those at home. Barty flew in this evening and as John and I were returning to the hotel we met the boys just heading off for a Big Mac for dinner.

May 15th - Double Trap competition for Men and Women plus the Final for both. At the end of the 120 targets for the Women we saw Suzanne B. as the number one shooter for the Final on a very good score of 109/120. Those on 98/120 had to shoot off for 6th place and this was a shame as Suzie T. had shot a 96/120 but missed 2 targets when she had experienced two double discharges with her gun and this was a very big disappointment to her. Diane came in 10th place on 32+28+35 giving her 95/120. The Final for the Women saw four of those women going into the Final with scores of 107 up to Suzanne's 109 and this was going to be a nail biting affair. The flash targets again proved to be a big challenge but in

the end we saw Suzanne hitting 37 of her targets putting her two targets clear of her nearest rival, a Korean shooter. The results were:

I have seen a lot of happy winners over the years but I don't believe that I have ever seen a happier person and a prettier smiling face than Suzanne had at the time of winning her event. A few drops of rain started falling so the presentation ceremony was held under the cover of the large restaurant area. Suzanne was a very proud recipient of her medal.

In the Men's section of this event, Russell had shot a 49+43+47 giving him 5th place in the Final on 139/150. Brett was placed in 15th position after having shot 42+45+43 for a 130/150 and Nathan was placed = 25th after shooting 39+44+41 for his score of 124/150. Our Junior shooter, Jarrod (who was shooting in an MQS position) shot and obtained his MQS by shooting 43+42+35 for a total of 120/150 and he also won a set of red shooting glasses from Russell - Well done Jarrod.

Into the Men's Final and again the weird flash targets were used - this time with quite a few broken targets and a 'supposed gun malfunction' by one of the American shooters who used up his allocated time to rectify his 'supposedly faulty triggers' - he later told us that he had actually run out of cartridges and I couldn't believe what he had just said. This all made the Final a long drawn out affair with Russell ending up in 4th position after shooting a 46 giving him 185/200. The winner was a young American lad named Walton Eller and he shot a brilliant 49 to give him the Gold Medal. USA ELLER, Walton 46+49+48=143+49=192 GOLD KUW ALDEEHANI, Fehaid 48+49+48=145+46=191 SILVER UAE AL MAKTOUM, Ahmed 46+48+47=141+47=188 BRONZE Yes, third place went to our little friend from the UAE - not bad for a man who shot it only for something to do.

On this night John and I were invited by some of the Organising Committee to attend a traditional Korean dinner at our hotel and we could take along some guests. We took along some Team members who were game enough to try and I believe we were all pleasantly surprised.

It was similar to a Japanese dinner where you leave your shoes at the door and then sit on cushions on the floor at a very, very low table. We were all presented with flowers and gifts on entry, the boys with nice watches that can be worn on their belts and the girls received either handbags or belts. These were given to us by one of the Korean lady shooters who was dressed in traditional dress and we were told she also was a World Champion in karate. We were plied with many, many dishes and dipping sauces and given instructions on the right sauces to use with each dish with all of us using chrome chop sticks - it was quite a sight to see ! Having the Korean lady sitting alongside me, she kept piling all the different types of food upon my plate each time I emptied it and knowing her past sporting achievements in karate and the strength that I could see in her hands, I was not going to upset her by refusing to eat everything that she gave me - except the jelly fish - I couldn't come at that. While this meal was in progress we were also given a traditional alcoholic drink (with a high alcohol content) plus quantities of beer. We were told it was not polite to refuse a drink when the host poured it out, which seemed to being poured out constantly, and it wasn't long before we saw a few glowing faces and heard a lot of laughter coming from those around the table, especially from one of the guests we took along, namely Victor Shaw from New Zealand. The Korean lady shooter had also recognised Diane as the Australian lady shooter with the very 'loud call' and she must have been quite impressed by it for she imitated it at intervals throughout the evening much to every one's amusement. We had a great night and I can fully recommend the food to anyone who goes to visit this country. Off to bed at 10 pm for a number of our shooters were leaving in the morning.

and Jarrod were all up and away on the 5 am bus and departing for home. Skeet practice was held as programmed and this was the coldest day that we had experienced. All of the Skeet shooters shot reasonably well and we were hoping for good results over the next 2 days. I caught the bus back to the hotel in the early afternoon as I started to feel those same symptoms that I had experienced in Cairo. That night John and I dined at my younger brother's home in Seoul (he is the Manager of the ANZ Bank in Korea) and we had roast Australian lamb with all of the trimmings and we both agreed that it was the best meal we had eaten in the past 3 weeks.

May 17th - The first 75 targets for Men and 75 targets for the Women plus the Final.

I awoke feeling very poorly - where was Dr. Sue now when I needed her ! I dared not go out on the first lot of buses to the Shooting ground for I felt so dizzy and had the shivers and shakes so John took the shooters out to the range. I take my hat off to John as I am sure that he had been awake for most of the night listening to me, tossing, turning, coughing and shivering. I needed to get to the Shooting ground for I had hoped that Natalia would get into the Women's Final so I finally dragged myself out and caught the 11 am bus out to the Shooting ground. Before catching the mini-bus out to the Clay Target Range, I paid a visit to the ISSF doctor on the grounds and asked her if she could give me something to relieve my symptoms. After an examination she told me that I should be put straight into hospital and I refused this as we were only a little over a day away from going home, and against her will, she gave me some medication to take and I then made my way out to the Clay Target Range feeling very, very ill.

The Skeet shooting was still in progress and I updated myself with the scores that had been shot. Natalia had in fact had a very bad first round shooting an 18, the damage already done, and even though she shot two rounds of 22 and 23 giving her a 63/75 she was relegated to 9th placing and missed out on the Final. Scores of 66 and over made the Women's Final.

For the Men's Skeet we had George on 72/75, Barty on 69/75 and Clive on 70/75 and we had high hopes for the last day of competition. I did not feel well enough to stay and watch the Women's Finals so I caught the first available bus back to the hotel and went straight to bed. John shifted out of my room when he came back with the Skeet shooters and bunked in with Barty - he needed to get some decent sleep and he also needed to get away from my 'bugs' for he had not fully recovered from the illness that we had in Cairo.

May 18th - Lauren, Russell and Natalia departed a day earlier than was planned so it meant an early start for them - that 5 am bus trip to the airport. John left early with the Skeet shooters for the Shooting grounds and I could hardly make it to the toilet without falling over through dizziness so I spent the whole day in bed hoping to recover enough for the journey home which would be starting at 5 am the next morning.

The results from the day's competition are as follows: George finished in = 8th place after shooting 119/125. Barty was placed = 15th on 116/125 and Clive was placed = 23rd on 113/125. Not the results we had hoped for. Scores of 120, 121 and 122 went into the Final and the winners in the Men's Skeet were: RUS SKOROBOGATOV, Alexei 122 + 24 = 146 GOLD UAE AL MAKTOUM, Saeed 121 + 24 = 145+4 SILVER CYP CHRISTOFOROU, Kyrlacos 122 + 23 = 145+3 BRONZE No one from the Team went to either the Closing Ceremony or the Closing Banquet, for everyone had to pack their bags and prepare for that early morning 5 am bus that would start our journey

May 19th - 5 am bus departure for the Inch'on Airport. We had a smooth flight back to Singapore arriving in mid afternoon with either 6 or 8 hour stopovers, where everyone excepting me, went shopping. I just booked into the hotel as I had already changed 3 singlets and shirts through perspiration between Seoul and

home.

Singapore and for a person who has never been seriously sick in my whole life, I didn't realise just how ill I could feel.

I was ever so glad to make it back to the Adelaide Airport the next morning and to see my lovely wife standing there waiting for me. Home at last !

Summary - As with all great things they come to an end but I believe this trip produced the best ever results from the World Championships and World Cups combined and it was the biggest Team taken to the highest of all ISSF competitions. On behalf of all the A.C.T.A. members, I would like to thank the whole Team for making this such a remarkable, successful and memorable trip - the illnesses will be forgotten but those wonderful achievements, never !

To Dr. Sue, for the wonderful work that she did with so many ill people in Cairo, I am sure she saved many of us from complications while we were there and also for the help that she gave to the Juniors in taking them on outings and sightseeing trips that would have furthered their education on Egypt - I thank you - and I am sure everyone who was on the trip will agree with me.

Masseur Darrien - for once again working tirelessly, day and night, keeping everyone in tip top condition and for your friendship and smiling face - I thank you.

John and Greg - having observed now many of the Coaches from around the world, and their interaction with their Teams, I don't believe there are any other Coaches as dedicated and hard working as the two of you, and I believe the Australian shooters are very appreciative of your assistance, so on behalf of them I would like to thank you publicly for your support.

To the people who have made this trip possible, I would also like to thank you on behalf of the Team - the A.C.T.A., the Australian Sports Commission,

Peter Whelan of Uniserve and the NSW Safety Awareness Council (both of whom are sponsors of our Junior shooters), to the parents of our Juniors (for they have helped fund their Juniors to these competitions), special thanks to Alesandra Socci from RC Cartridges, Italy and Luca Scribani Rossi of RC Cartridges Australia (who made cartridges available to the Team in both Cyprus and Korea), to Perazzi Firearms for the support they are giving to our Junior shooters and to the Shooting Committee for the support that they have shown to me and finally I would like to apologise to those shooters for my non-attendance at the grounds when I was sick, and where I was unable to give them the support that would normally be expected of me.


As Harry was on squad and I was two we had no reason to wait for presentations we hit the trail leaving Kaye to forward results. Thanks Kaye.

I refer to Mr R J Smith's letter published in the August edition of the CTSN.

For a person who believes himself as 'highly credentialed' and an ex-Executive member of the ACTA, his knowledge or perceived knowledge, of the running of the High Performance Programme since 1995 for the ISSF Disciplines is absolutely NOTHING!

Prior to 1994 it was all very easy to pick Teams - First past the post at one event (the Nationals) and then depending on who you were, and what international experience you had - making it very hard to get picked if you were not part of the small select group.

Yes, the Manager's positions back then were advertised but you don't have to be too smart to look back and see just who ended up with those positions - take out the Coaching Director's and it makes for very interesting reading - so much for transparency.

Since 1994, the Shooting Committee has instigated the running of Training Camps, selection Elimination Camps and has also initiated the writing up of a Selection Criteria Policy where we have tried to give every interested competitor a chance at representing our country at overseas competitions. Yes, we have made mistakes along the way but we have always had enough sense to listen and learn and make alterations where necessary. Since 1995, Australia has had many more different competitors competing at international events than at any time in the past.

We believe we have an excellent programme both for Seniors and Junior and you only have to look at the results that we have achieved in such a short space of time to know that we are doing the right thing. Australia is recognised as one of the top three clay target shooting countries in the world and if you have not noticed, we do have extra events to look after and we also send many women and juniors to the international events as well.

As for the Manager's positions over the last four years, once again Mr Smith, your knowledge seems very limited. I will inform you just how the selection of Coaches and Managers was made during this time. These were not made at the ACTA's discretion - these positions were given by the Olympic Athlete Program Board and the Australian Shooting Association. Luca Scribani Rossi and Greg Chan were selected to be the Coaches for the period up to the 31 December 2000 including the Olympics and the O.A.P. Board also insisted that a 'pool' of four people to act as Mangers was to be made up - people who could manage multiple disciplinary Teams at an international level. My name was put forward by the High Performance Manager of the Programme, Mr Bill Murray and he asked if I would consider taking on one of the four positions. I thought that this was an honour, not just for myself, but for the ACTA, for the Olympic Team Manager was to be selected from this 'pool' of four people.

Mr Smith's allegations re selection of Teams is also WRONG! The Teams selected themselves according to the Selection Criteria. For the Team selection for the Olympic Shadow Team leading up to the Olympics, I was appointed by the O.A.P. Programme to be one of three selectors - Bill Murray the H.P.M., Luca Scribani Rossi (Head Coach) and me, representing the ACTA.

Funding - All of the Teams that I have personally been away with have been funded out of the O.A.P. funding, for the full four and a half years - at no time has the ACTA funds been used for this purpose and the ACTA also had no jurisdiction over the selection of Coaches and Managers during that same period of time.

The DTL Teams to Wales and New Zealand is slightly different. Once again, Mr Smith you do not know your facts! Glenn Woodhatch went on these trips as the Australian representative to the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association of Great Britain. General Assembly's were held in conjunction with these World DTL Championships and the ACTA Executive was saving money by having Glenn look after the Team instead of sending a Manager along as well. The Glenn Cup Teams that went to New Zealand were also looked after by Glenn Woodhatch who was attending meetings with the New Zealand Clay Target Association and I believe Glenn paid for his own fares when attending these meetings.

Judges - International Judges to World Cups etc. The Shooting Committee has only been looking after this portfolio for the past 12 months and prior to that Mr Tom Meadows was the Chairman of the Judges Committee. I believe that some funding for about 6 or 7 judges has been given - \$1000.00 each to help get them to international events so they could be 'up-graded', as the ISSF had asked Australia to have as many 'qualified Judges' as they could at the Olympic Games in Sydney. Those who received monetary assistance went through the proper procedure to get to the overseas competitions - those who approached directly the countries involved, the incorrect method, therefore received nothing. The proper procedure for any appointments to overseas competitions or up-grades of Judges' licences must go first to the ACTA then to the A.S.A. Judges Committee who then send them off to the ISSF Judges Committee who make the decisions.

Accountability - In my opinion, the Executive over the last eight or so years, have been very accountable for you only have to look at the Balance Sheets each year. The ACTA is in a very strong position. Yes, we all make mistakes but it is the real men and women who can own up to them.

Please don't forget the Executives are appointed by their own States to the ACTA and they all do a very good job in their own States as well as on the National Executive and this is all done VOLUNTARILY!

I end this reply, Mr Smith, by saying that in future, have enough guts to name these people you are accusing and if you or anyone else would like proof of how Teams have been selected, Coaches and Managers have been appointed. I have all of the relevant documentation form the O.A.P. meetings, A.S.A. meetings and ACTA meetings, plus letters to prove what I have said is correct.

Mr Smith is also the person who whilst he served as an ACTA Executive member there were insufficient funds to send a team "around the corner" let alone around the world.

Since Mr Smith's time, your Executive has become much more professional and accountable as evidenced by the now produced Annual Report and Balance Sheet.

Business plans, six year development plans, copies of financial report, names of persons nominated as sharing financial responsibility, elite Coaches and Team Management roles are all required by the Sports Commission before any funds are allocated.

Successful teams, team management and external procedures used by the Australian Shooting Team for the previous eight years are used as a "benchmark" by the Sports Commission.

As we all know, the "runs are on the board". I pose to Mr Smith "if its not broke don't fix it".

Dear Sir,

I read the latest contributions to "Your Say" with fervent vigour. However, I really must say that I am already sick and tired of the "New Skeet Rules" debate. I cannot for the life of me see how aligning our rules with an Internationally recognized, and what has been for the past 75 years, the accepted standard, could possibly be of detriment to our sport.

As to the letter from Mr Buhagiar, I am unaware of the source of his research, but I believe his "majority rules" argument for change back to "Australianised" rules is both fundamentally flawed and inappropriate. This is due to the fact that the only vote that I am aware of taking place, which involved the majority of this country's Skeet shooters, was at the meeting convened by the ACTA Rules Committee at the 2000 Skeet Nationals, where I was personally present.

On that occasion, the "majority" of dedicated skeet shooters voted 57 to 1 in favour of adopting the recommendation to realign ourselves with NSSA rules. And if that is not a majority recommendation, then I don't know what is. However I do know what it is not. It is not some whimsical "majority rules" figure which has no statistical credibility and is not backed up by any legitimate survey. Mr Buhagiar's "figures" appear to have simply been plucked out of the air, or accepted from the hearsay of a "minority" of misguided whinging malcontents. One of the main instigators to this forward thinking and progressive endeavour to lift the credibility of our beloved discipline of Skeet has been the great man himself, Adrian Cousens. There appears to me to have been a great deal of negative innuendo, cowardly verbal sniping and recalcitrant backstabbing of the people who are trying to move our sport forward. For those of you who are unaware, Adrian Cousens has won no less than 21 National Skeet and Trap titles spanning four different countries, not to mention his 3 World Skeet Championships. We should not simply debate the semantics of antiquated mistakes that have been made in the past, nor merely "nit pick", take "cheap-shots" or try to score political points for whatever reason. In the end analysis this will only prove to be derogatory and counter productive to our beloved sport

The time for discussion is now past and the time for acceptance is upon us. If you still feel the need for criticism, then please my fellow Skeet shooters, make it constructive. We need to think positively and embrace the newly resurrected Skeet rules for the common good and betterment of our sport. I implore all of our many friends throughout this wonderful fraternity, to "get with the program" and accept these positive and productive changes. After all, whilst the majority of us may never even get to the World Skeet Shooting Championships, one day one of our fellow Australian compatriots may just be fortunate enough to earn the honour of becoming only the second Australian to attain the title of World Skeet Champion. And how proud would we be then, that we shoot Skeet in Australia to the World Standard.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS SEPTEMBER 2001

Back in the July issue I published the first half of an article I wrote some time ago about how I thought people should conduct themselves whilst shooting on a Skeet range. In essence, my thoughts on the correct etiquette to be observed at a gun club. Although the original article was written to be one of the chapters of a book I am writing on NSSA Skeet shooting, and thus focuses on that particular discipline, most of the points are sufficiently generic in nature that they are either relevant to Clay Target Shooting in general, or will lose little in the transposition to other areas of our sport.

As the full article was far too long to be published as a whole and thus had to be broken up into two parts, I had originally intended to present them in two successive issues of the magazine. However, as so often happens, I got carried away last month elaborating on my views of a totally different, but currently topical issue. So before we totally lose the thread of where I was with etiquette, I am printing the remainder of it this month.

As with the first installment of this subject, and the similarly structured Safety article I published a couple of months prior to that, I have asked the typesetter to print the main substance of the matter on a totally separate and independent page of the magazine. The idea here is not only to simplify and clarify it, but also to present it in such a manner that it can be put to best use. Thus I make no copyright claim to either of the articles and intend instead that clubs and individuals photocopy the various pages from the magazine and post them on their notice boards or hand them out to new members or any other worthwhile use to promote our sport.

Back in May I asked for any copies of the CTSN from 1976 or earlier that anyone could spare. In response to that I have received several nice bundles of old magazines and would like to thank all those kind people. Once I have sorted and cataloged them all, I will print another updated request, with the eventual aim of amassing a complete set of CTSNs. At the same time I also asked for any information on ISSF National High Gun winners. To date I have had no replies to this and thus would like to repeat that request.

Several weeks ago I was chatting on the phone with my old mate and sparring partner, Ken Lowry, and we were discussing the recent passing of Jack McCraith, who won the Champion of Champions in 1950. Following on from that, Ken asked me who I thought was currently the oldest living ACTA National Title winner. I have no idea, but find the concept extremely interesting, so I am going to make it this month's Shooting Trivia Question. Please mail the name and birth date of any potential candidates to Shooting Trivia, P.O. Box 265, Bairnsdale 3875. The sender of the oldest winner received by 20-09-2001 shall receive a free entry to next year's National Champion of Champions.

The correct answer to July's STQ is: The search for the fastest National Skeet Shoot-off win provides some interesting statistics. The event has been won in the first round on six separate occasions. Ray Melville only had to shoot 14 extra targets for his Blue Sash. George Biggs and Reg Clarke are tied on 12 each. Newton Thomas and Christian Naudin went one better with 11 apiece. But the clear winner is Col Burt who triumphed after only eight targets in 1999. The first correct answer drawn was submitted by Adrian Lucchitti from Sydney in NSW, who added an interesting postscript: "Unfortunately he beat my brother Julian in the process", so I'm going to give him a free "twin" entry for both his brother and himself to this year's National Skeet Handicap.

SKEET SHOOTING ETIQUETTE - PART 2

By Adrian Cousens

16) Never throw a tantrum on the field. One of the best pieces of shooting advice is "never judge a shooter by the way he breaks a target - always judge him by the way he misses a target." After you miss a target, any time spent on anything other than concentrating on breaking the next target is unnecessary and detrimental. 99% of all missed targets are due to shooter error. The other 1% which may be due to a bad pull, a wind effected target or some distraction, should be looked upon as a perfect opportunity to display your character strength.

17) Don't mess around after you miss. Any change in your shooting style after you miss your first target, such as hip shooting, shooting from a low gun position or calling quickly between singles, is very poor form. Firstly, it is bad practice for the next time you are trying to shoot well. Secondly, it is distracting to the other shooters on the squad who may be still straight or still trying to break a good score. And thirdly, the attitude that "if you can't break a straight you don't care what you shoot" is a form of semi-intentional sandbagging.

18) Never shoot twice at the same target. It is against the rules, it leans towards a safety violation, it demonstrates incompetence and it is generally considered poor form. If someone else does it, don't condone it by amusement or indifference, instead display restrained disapproval. If you do it yourself inadvertently, then make a mental note not to repeat it and don't even think about asking the referee for a proof shell, as he is probably considering disqualifying you if you continue to do it.

19) If you eject spent shells from your under/over, always watch them land. When you shoot an auto, people are aware and will be prepared for spent shells. Most under/over shooters retain their hulls and so the exception may catch them unaware. If you eject them over your shoulder the shooter behind you may either be struck by them or have his gun marked by them. Ejecting them absent-mindedly to the right as you walk off the station will often result in the referee being struck by them.

20) Do not pick up your hulls during a round. During a competition event any hulls that hit the ground usually become the property of the club. During practice it creates a nuisance to the other shooters. If you shoot a magazine gun and wish to retrieve your hulls then pick them up at the end of the round. If you shoot a pump-action and use it correctly there will only be four shells to pick up. If you shoot an auto, use a shell catcher and then you will only have eight shells to retrieve.

21) Don't coach your squad mates unless specifically requested. Many of the people that you will shoot or practice with from time to time will display a need for help. Even if you feel that you are qualified to assist, resist the temptation to give a few pointers there and then. Wait until after the round and then privately suggest that you would be willing to assist them during the next round or on some future occasion. This gives them the opportunity to either gratefully accept or graciously decline for any number of reasons. This way your well meant actions will never cause an embarrassing situation.

22) Always stand out of sight of the person shooting. The rulebook recommends for courtesy that you do not advance more than one-third of the way to the next shooting station until all the shooters on the squad have completed the station. Generally it works best if all five shooters line up behind each station and then after you shoot go to the back of the line or to some place behind that point. Allow your common sense to never put you in such a position that

you distract the shooter or require him to have to ask you to move out of sight.

23) No talking while someone is shooting. Although constructive advice and encouragement amongst squad members, between stations and between shots, is not only permitted, but also actively sought, silence must be strictly observed while the shooter is making the shot. As a general rule all noise should cease probably after the shooter closes his gun but definitely after he mounts it. Silence should then be maintained until the shot (or shots if it is a double) has been completed.

24) Try not to distract shooters on adjacent fields. Always be courteous and considerate of those people shooting next to you. Before you walk on or off your field, consider where the people on the left field are shooting. A short pause may be all that's required. After you have just shot Station #7, absent-mindedly wandering out past the dividing fence may distract a shooter on the right field who just called for high 3. After someone on your squad has broken their first 100, much rejoicing and backslapping while picking up your shell bags beside Station #1 will probably not help the guy on the next field who is trying to break a double on Station #6 in the last round for his first 100 straight.

25) Try never to be late for a shoot-off. It is fairly easy to work out ahead of time whether or not you will be in a shoot-off and where and when that shoot-off will be held. When the shoot-off is called make sure that you already have your gear and mind ready and that you can be there waiting to start prior to the indicated time. When the shoot-off is called it is very poor form to take a couple more minutes to finish your card game, then go and change your tubes, then go and buy some shells, then change and clean your lenses and then wander around asking people whether they heard which field you were supposed to be on.

26) Be careful carrying your gun on your shoulder. It has become common practice to carry under/overs in this manner. This is fine provided you use a little common sense and be careful to ensure that your gun never strikes any other person or their gun or their property. Only carry open under/overs in this fashion. Always carry them with the barrels forward. Never carry them in this fashion in a congested area such as the clubhouse or a shoot-off line.

27) No spectators on a shooting field. Even where the field is not precisely defined by a fence or rope, common sense will indicate the boundary between the shooting field and the spectator area. If a message for a shooter is important enough to disturb him on the field, then let the chief referee on shoot management enter the field and pass it on. If a shooter wishes to chat with the spectators, or needs an errand run, his option is to walk to the back of the field and do so, provided he is back and ready to shoot in turn.

28) Take only 25 shells for a practice round. Admittedly practice pullers do not supply proof shells. However, it is still better to only take one box of shells to a practice round. The odd broken target will not break you - look upon it as your donation to the club. If the club or a particular field has a bad reputation for broken birds, then take a few extra shells but put them in your pocket or a separate compartment in your pouch and use them only as proofs. Try to only ever shoot at 25 good targets in any practice round. Excuses such as "they charge too much so we need to shoot a few extras" can usually be countered by the management's view of "if we only had to throw 25 per round we could charge less".

29) Never run anywhere at a gun club except in an emergency. Gun clubs need to project an image of calm controlled safe operation. Running indicates trouble or panic and is adverse to this image. It can also be distracting to the shooters on the field. Seeing people walking around in your peripheral vision while shooting will usually pass unnoticed. However, a fleeting glimpse of a person running onto the next field just as you call for low five will probably be counterproductive.

The shoot started on a balmy, sunny Saturday with that sparkling sunlight and crisp air that Brisbane turns on regularly in winter. Mother Nature did her bit; the rest was up to us.





Improve your shooting with a EasyHit fibre optic bead

In today's world of clay target shooting shooters are always looking for that extra edge to improve their performance. This can mean a lot of things to different people, perhaps the elite competitor needs to improve concentration, or the beginner just wants to see the sight picture easier and improve their score. You also have the experienced shooter who over a period of time their shooting has deteriorated, maybe due to failing eyesight, lack of concentration or just simply boredom. Which has shooters looking for that extra gadget to break more targets and win. This natural instinct and curiosity lead me to discover the Easy Hit fibre optic beads.

This bead is simply attached to the rib with the supplied doublesided adhesive tape. I personally preferred to use Silastic as this allowed fine adjustments to align the bead and is easier to remove and try on another gun. The bead is so small in diameter and laying flat on the rib it should not change point of impact.

As I mounted the gun a small orange / red laser dot was clearly visible above the rib. If I lifted my head off the comb the laser dot faded and disappeared. Easy Hit does this by imbedding the bead in an enclosed tube. An excellent feature that is unique to Easy Hit.

This has many benefits to the shooter. It can defiantly help correct gun mounting faults. I also noticed that when closing my right eye (I shoot right-handed) I couldn't see any orange / red colour with my left eye. For those shooters like me who have a problem with eye dominants, this sight will help you to dramatically stop this annoying problem. One-eyed shooters who want to shoot with two will only see one laser dot clearly in the eye over the rib. Shooters wearing prescription glasses will see the target bead relationship better. If you miss a target you can instantly see what went wrong.

While trap shooting with the Easy Hit bead I set the gun to my hold point then lift my vision by one and a half metre's. This allows the target to fly into my central focus with good vision of the bead. Skeet shooting on pads two and six is so much easier with the advantage of being able to look off the gun for the target and still see the bead. In field shooting if I can see the bead I have mounted the gun correctly, giving me more confidence and time to shoot the target. When shooting the visual feed back of the sight picture is brilliant. Tracking and measuring the correct lead to smash a target is so fast.

The laser dot stayed bright under cloudy skies, in the rain and under lights. No longer will I use chalk to mark the end of the rib. The bead even works under the full moon. This is due to long length of the sight that amplifies its light-gathering power. Orange / red is a good colour, as it contrasts well on black, white and orange fluoro targets. Even background interference was no problem, since a high contrast visual focus exists on the target and the orange / red dot.

When you first see this bead you will be amazed at just how bright the Easy Hit bead is and you will probably say to yourself "This is too bright for me, its distracting as I keep looking at the bead not the target and it might mess up my shooting". Certainly, the first time you do shoot with an Easy Hit bead, it might cause a few missed targets. The reason is you looked back at the sight bead, which stops your swing. Many shooters do not realise that they are looking back at their sight bead and missing targets or perhaps just not seeing the target bead relationship. When you are missing targets and not knowing why, it could be you are looking back at the sight bead.

The sight assists the set-up and helps you recognise the zone where you should be hitting the target. This helps you to develop a more consistent timing to shoot the target. Eye fatigue is lessened. It's so easy to the target / bead relationship. This gives you the agility to remain focused and increase endurance. Plus, the sight can help you in shoot off situations where nerves get the better of you. The sight makes it easier to get back to the business at hand, as you can see the target / bead relationship ever so clear and bright. It helps to take away the fear and anxiety of missing the targets. The sight won't fix all of your shooting problems, but it certainly will fix many. You can learn to aim with both eyes open, as it eliminates cross-dominant problems. You will see the bright orange / red (or lime green) laser sight bead only with one eye squared down along the rib and the gun mounted properly. Easy Hit does this because the bead is enclosed in a tube. You won't be incorrectly mounting your gun! I t will certainly help you shoot better, way better and more consistent!

The company picked a good name for the product. It really is an Easy Hit. If you are a serious shooter, and you want to win shoots, you had better get one of these sights on your gun and get shooting with it. I strongly recommend these beads to all shooters, as it will assist them greatly in getting that target / bead relationship happening. Believe me, this bead is going to fix a lot of problems in your shooting. This is no gimmick or idle promise. The Easy Hit sight works! 



(a) the licence or permit number of the seller.

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts and maximum fine of \$5,500.
