2001 OLYMPIC

Almost a year since the Olympic Games Cecil Park played host to the 2001 Olympic Discipline National Championships.

COMMONWEALTH OLYMPIC TRAP CHAMPIONSHIP

Only 58 competitors nominated for this event. Jeff Tonna top qualified into the final with a score of 121/125. Tom Turner, Nathan Cassells, Kevin Perkins, Brett Dunstan and Harry Kassianou were also in the final.

A perfect score of 25/25 in the final secured the Commonwealth Olympic Trap Championships for Tom Turner with a final event score of 145/150. Second place went to Nathan Cassells on a score of 143/150 and in third place Jeff Tonna on a score of 142/150.

AA Grade winner was Brett Dunstan 118/125; A Grade winner was Kevin Perkins 116/125; B Grade winner was Bruno Veronese 111/125; and C Grade winner was Louis Chahine 103/125.

A score of 136/150 was sufficient for Andrew Brady to claim victory in the Junior section. In second place was Sam Price 132/150 and third place went to Steve Calleja with a score of 129/150.

In the Women's Commonwealth Olympic Trap Championship Nessa Jenkins from Maryborough was successful with a score of 90/100. Second place went to Suzanne Balogh 87/100 with Rebecca Attard in third place on a score of 85/100.

NATIONAL OLYMPIC TRAP CHAMPIONSHIP

Top qualifiers from a field of 56 were Russell Mark and Brett Dunstan with a score of 120/125. Fil Petriella 118/125, Tom Turner 117/125 along with Glenn Kable and Nathan Cassells both 115/125 made up the six finalists.

Russell Mark shot a perfect 25 in the final to take the 2001 National Olympic Trap Championship with a score of 145/150. The Silver medal went to Brett Dunstan on a score of 143/150 with the Bronze medal being won by Fil Petriella on a score of 142/150. AA Grade winner was Tom Turner 117/125; A Grade winner was Kevin Perkins 115/125; B Grade winner was Tony Arvanitakis 105/125; and C Grade winner was Stephen Thompson 95/125. Andrew Brady also won his second Junior event with a score of

Andrew brady also won his second Junior event with a score of 137/150 from Sam Price 132/150 and in third place was Steve Calleja score of 131/150.

WOMEN'S NATIONAL OLYMPIC TRAP CHAMPIONSHIP

Rebecca Attard 65/75 was the top qualifier into the final from Nessa Jenkins 63/75, Suzanne Balogh 61/75, Donna Follett 60/75 with Angelique Psarakis and Dot Trindall both 59/75.

Rebecca Attard from Morwell won the event with a final score of 86/100 from Suzanne Balogh of Canberra International 84/100 and Nessa Jenkins of Maryborough 83/100.

TRAP HIGH GUNS

The Open Olympic Trap High Gun winner with a score of 238/250 was Brett Dunstan from Frankston Australian.

The Junior Olympic Trap High Gun Winner with a score of 230/250 was Andrew Brady from Morwell.

The Women Olympic Trap High Gun Winner with a score of 130/150 was Rebecca Attard from Morwell.

Art Goodman Trophy winner with a score of 174/250 was Nigel Cheung from Hong Kong.

COMMONWEALTH ISSF SKEET CHAMPIONSHIP

A total of 25 competitors entered this event. Top qualifier into the final was George Barton with a score of 124/125. Clive Barton 115/125, David Cunningham 114/125, Pedro DaSilva 110/125, Tony Kidman 109/125 and Webley Hirt 108/125 completed the six finalists.

In the final George Barton shot a perfect 25/25 to win the Commonwealth title with a near perfect score of 149/150. Older brother Clive claimed second place with a score of 140/150 from David Cunningham in third place with a score of 138/150.

AA Grade winner was Michael Inguanti 97/125; A Grade winner was Pedro DaSilva 110/125; B Grade winner was Darren Perkins 105/125; and C Grade winner was Justin Ehrenreich 102/125.

After a shoot off the Junior section was won by Adrian Calvi

In the Women's Commonwealth ISSF Skeet Championship Lauryn Ogilivi from Werribee Victorian was successful with a score of 92/100. Second place went to Christine Alexander 62/100 with Zita Dettori in third place on a score of 45/100.

NATIONAL ISSF SKEET CHAMPIONSHIP

25 competitors lined up for the 2001 National ISSF Skeet Championship.

After 125tgts the final six consisted of George Barton 120/125, Clive Barton 122/125, Webley Hirt 113/125, Barty Brighenti 110/125, David Cunningham 112/125, and Ross Salpietro 106/125. With another perfect 25/25 in the final, George Barton of Tamworth was successful in winning the National Title with a score of 145/150. Brother Clive 144/150 also from Tamworth won Silver with the Bronze going to Webley Hirt 135/150.

AA Grade was won by David Cunningham 112/125; A Grade was won by Barty Brighenti 110/125; B Grade was won by Darren Perkins 103/125; and C Grade was won by Joshua Daly 101/125. Webley Hirt was again successful in the Junior section with a score of 136/150 from Adrian Calvi 126/150 second with Joshua Daly in third place on a score of 122/150.

WOMEN'S NATIONAL ISSF SKEET CHAMPIONSHIP

Lauryn Ogilvie 69/75 was the top qualifier into the final from Christine Alexander 47/75 and Zita Dettori 45/75.

Lauryn Ogilvie Werribee Victorian won the event with a score of 91/100 from Christine Alexander 62/100 and Zita Dettori from Cecil Park 45/100.

ISSF SKEET HIGH GUNS

The Open ISSF Skeet High Gun winner with a score of 244/250 was George Barton from Tamworth.

The Junior ISSF Skeet High Gun winner with a score of 221/250 was Webley Hirt from Tararalgon.

The Women's ISSF High Gun winner with a score of 138/150 was Lauryn Ogilvie from Werribee Victorian.

COMMONWEALTH DOUBLE TRAP CHAMPIONSHIP

30 competitors lined up for the 2001 Commonwealth Double trap Championship.

Top qualifier for this event was Steven Baynes on a score of 138/150. Steve Haberman 137/150, Adam Vella 136/150, Russell Mark and John Maxwell both 133/150 and Tom Turner 132/150 completed the six places in the final.

Continuing on with a score of 46/50 in the final to secure first place for Steven Baynes with a final event score of 184/200. After a shoot off the Silver medal went to Steve Haberman on a score of 183/200 plus 12 and the Bronze was taken by Adam Vella on a score of 183/200 plus 11.

AA Grade winner was Russell Mark 133/150; A Grade winner was John Maxwell 133/150; B Grade winner was Michael VanDerGulik 118/150; and C Grade winner was Daniel White 106/150.

Rocky Manno from International was successful in the Junior section with a score of 162/200 from Michael VanDerGulik 155/200 with Robert Cameron in third position on a score of 154/200.

In the Women's Commonwealth Olympic Double Trap Championship Suzanne Balogh was successful with a final score of 130/160. Second place went to Susan Trindall 129/160 with Sophia Psarakis in third place on a score of 119/160.

NATIONAL DOUBLE TRAP CHAMPIONSHIP

The Junior section saw Rocky Manno from International win his second section with a score of 177/200. After another shoot off second place went to Robert Cameron 158/200 plus 3 from Michael VanDerGulik in third position on 158/200 plus 2.

WOMENS NATIONAL DOUBLE TRAP CHAMPIONSHIP

Susan Trindall was again the top qualifier into the final in this event with a score of 106/120. Suzanne Balogh 101/120, Sophia Psarakis 93/120, Dot Trindall 86/120, Donna Follett 79/120 and Rebecca Attard 77/120 completed the six finalists.

A score of 33/40 in the final was enough for Susan Trindall to take the 2001 Womens National Double Trap Championship with a final score of 139/160. Second place went to Suzanne Balogh on a score of 133/160 and in third place Sophia Psarakis with a score of 120/160.

The Junior Double Trap High Gun winner with a score of 252/300 was Rocky Manno from International.


The Women Double Trap High Gun winner with a score of 204/240 was Susan Trindall Showmans Gun Club.

The weather was beautiful for the eleven days that we were there, excepting for two, when it rained. The temperature each day was around the mid 20's with the sun shining and virtually no wind, in fact the days were most pleasant.

The Bisley Shooting Range Complex is very famous and has a lot of tradition - especially in rifle shooting. The Bisley Range is just outside of the little hamlet of Bisley which is about a one hour drive South of London. It is set on approximately 500 acres of land and it houses two huge Big Bore ranges, supposedly the best Field and Games ranges in the world, and I could readily believe that, for the countryside here was

quite beautiful. The complex also contains Pistol ranges for all disciplines and all Small Bore Rifle ranges - (all of Olympic Standard) and of course the Clay Target shotgun ranges which were all brand new. There are 4 Olympic Trap ranges which are used for Double Trap and Skeet and between each range there are the DTL traps. All very well built and fitted out with Matarelli Traps in all layouts. The back ground will be excellent when all the grass has grown - it has had to be re-seeded 5 times (it keeps getting washed out by the rain). The cost of building the new ranges and Club house was approximately \$12 million Australian. The 2002 Commonwealth Games will be held there.

The original shooting range was based in Wimbledon (where the tennis is held) until 1889. It was then transferred to Bisley. A special railway was built to transport the people to and from the ranges from London. The ranges were also used to train the armed forces, before and during the Wars, from 1889. There were many barracks built and many large houses on the complex - many of them by Commonwealth countries such as Canada, Kenya etc., (Australia however, does not have one here), but the Australian Pistol and Rifle shooters who were here for the Championships, did stay in the Canadian House which was huge and very nice. There are many large Club houses scattered around the complex, most of which have large Bar and Dining areas where they hold many functions (weddings and large parties). Most could hold between 200 to 300 people and they are very strict on their dress codes - no hats, sandals etc to be worn in the Bars.

There were also Gun Shops and Gun Smiths and Outfitters on the grounds. All are open 7 days a week. The highly respected gun shop near the shotgun range is run by the Kennedy Gun makers and it sells almost everything - traditional English shooting clothes, ammunition and all that is needed for field shooting. We saw 'beautiful' guns and rifles with prices of anything up to \$500,000.00 for a pair of guns or rifles. There was one miniature gun that we all fell in love with, an exact replica including removable triggers. The gun manufacturers make one a year priced at \$38,000.00 Australian.

There was also a large clock tower built on the highest hill (near the shot gun range). This had been shifted from London in 1889. The purpose of this was it rang at certain times to warn people that shooting on the Big Bore range was about to commence and that they must get off the range - you see many people, in years gone by, used to picnic on the ranges and this was the warning.

There is also a very good shooting museum and a new administration building and ranges for (Pistol, Air Pistol and Target Rifle), for the National Rifle Association of Great Britain administers the whole of the Bisley Shooting Complex. There are bitumen roads and streets through out the complex and two caravan sites filled with around 100 permanent caravans. These are used by their owners for weekends and holidays while they are shooting. Shooting is a very popular and prestigious sport in England, especially at the Bisley Range. Enough of the history

Most of the Team left Australia on the 21st August with the Skeet Team coming in a few days later. We all left our respective States by Singapore Airlines and met up in Singapore for the last leg to London - a 13 hour flight. Once again Singapore Airlines were great, allowing us excess baggage and reasonably good seating, the only down side was that all of the flights were fully booked, leaving very little room to get a good sleep.

Heathrow Airport was not as bad as I thought it would be, for going in and coming out. Maybe we were lucky but we went both in and out in a very quick time. The organisers were out side to meet us with transport to the range and our own mini bus that I had booked for 7.30 am on the 22nd August, was no where to be seen. The drive to the range was very fast as we travelled on the M4 motorway in three new Ford 4-wheel drives donated by the Ford Motor Company to the Commonwealth Games 2002 Team. This was their trial run for the Games and all I can say was that the drivers were 'mad'. 80 miles per hour on the M4 - not kilometres per hour!

Once at the Bisley Range, we had to go through accreditation and I had to pay all of the bills before we were allowed to go to our motel (which was a 30 minute drive from the range - a Travelodge. Still no mini bus! Many phone calls later I found out that the Police would not allow the fellow delivering the bus to the airport to park and consequently sent him away. We finally had the mini bus delivered to our motel that evening. As we were not staying on at the Bisley Range, we were told that we would have to get taxi cabs back to our motel and \$120.00 (Australian) later we finally made it to our motel which was about a 3* by

Australian standards - no phones, fridges or air-conditioners - and Ben reminded me of this, many, many times! It was however clean, close to the shops, quiet and it did give us a 'sort of breakfast' - have you ever seen a bowl with corn flakes, milk and a fold up spoon all sealed up in a package before?

It did however, fit our budget and it gave us freedom from the other Australian Teams of Pistol and Rifle who were stopping on the Bisley Range at 37.00 English Pounds per person per day - this included bed, breakfast and dinner but you had to make up your own bed, clean the room, use a common shower and toilet and supply your own towels etc. In Australian dollars this worked out to be \$110.00.

Most days we all had dinner together at a different old English country hotel, some of which dated back to the 14th Century, very old and quaint and very low ceilings with small rooms. Most of us had to watch our heads or we would bump them on the beams. The food was nowhere near as good as that in Australia, in any of the places that we tried, and most of the Team ate fish or chicken or vegetarian as they were concerned with 'mad cow disease'. A couple of us brave ones (or silly ones), had meat each night and I can tell you the steak was terrible. Some of us also tried a different glass of beer each night, mostly it was warm and it took a long time to drink - I very nearly had to poke it down with a stick - but if you don't try it you will never know. All of the food and drinks were very expensive, especially the pizza as Barty can vouch for.

Some of the Team who had some spare time between shooting matches, caught the train into London to go both shopping and sight seeing. They toured on the double deck buses and they saw most of the 'tourist' sights like the Changing of the Guards at Buckingham Palace and the Tower of London and they went shopping at Harrods etc. Shopping was also done in the town near our motel at Bracknell. Luckily our plane had circled London about 5 times before landing and those of us who never got to see things 'close up' (John and I), did get to see some of London from the air!

Each day driving into the Bisley Range was an experience just on it's own. Driving on the major roads and crossing the M3 and M4 (the English seem to love 'roundabouts'), is probably fine if you know the road and where you are going, and you are not driving an under powered, terrible handling bus, with 10 expert drivers telling you what to do, and not being aware of the fact that if you sit in the right hand lane, no one is allowed to pass you - and I thought all of those drivers were friendly and just waving to us !!!!

The shot gun ranges and Club rooms were all new, very well built with good workmanship, good equipment and a lot of thought has been put in for the competitors comfort on the ranges with covers etc. The back ground is excellent and both John and I feel that there will be some world records shot here.

 $24 \rm th$ August - Men's Trap Pairs - 100 targets. Ben and Nathan shot well, winning the Silver medal. Ben shot 95/100 and Nathan 93/100 - their combined score 188/200. The Gold medal winning score was shot by England, a 192/200 and this equalled the Commonwealth Shooting Federation Championships record. Suzanne Balogh and Diane Reeves won the Bronze medal in the Pairs (they shot 50 targets each, Suzanne shot 45/50 and Diane a 41/50). The Gold medal here again was won by England with their women shooting a score of 88/100 which also equalled the CSF Championships record.

25th August - Men's Double Trap Pairs - 100 targets. Nathan and Rocky won the Silver medal with Nathan shooting 90/100 and Rocky a 79/100. Nathan also won the Bronze medal in the Badge Match. The Double Trap Men's Pairs was won by England, a new CSF Championships record of 187/200.

In the Women's event, Suzanne and Susie (Trindall) won the Gold medal with Suzanne shooting 68/80 and Susie a 66/80. The Double Trap Women's Pairs of Suzanne and Susie also set for Australia, a new CSF Championships record, 134/160. Suzanne also won Gold in the Badge Match and Susie won the Silver

26th August - Men's Skeet Pairs of 100 targets. George and Barty competed and won the Bronze medal. George shooting a 96/100 and Barty a 92/100. The Men's Skeet Pairs was won by Scotland who shot a new CSF Championship record with 193/200.

We did not have a Women's Pair but Natalia came in 5th place after having shot 43/50 +3 in the Badge Match. The Women's Skeet Pairs was won by England with a new CSF Championships record of 87/100.

27th August - Women's Trap Individual of 75 targets saw Suzanne and Diane competing again. Suzanne won the Gold medal shooting a 64/75

+ 25 giving her 89/100 while Diane shot a 57/75. Suzanne, for Australia, now holds the new CSF Championships record with her score of 89/100.

 $28 th \ August$ - Men's Trap - final day. Nathan and Ben shot again and Nathan won the Bronze medal by shooting 116/125 and then shooting a 24/25 in the Final to give him a 140/150. Ben shot a 104/125 taking 25 th placing.

29th August - Double Trap Men's Individual and Nathan and Rocky were competing. Nathan won the Silver medal by shooting a 133/150 followed by a 47/50 in the Final giving him an overall score of 180/200. Rocky was placed in 5th position after shooting a 131/150 followed by a 41/50 for his score of 172/200. The Men's Double Trap Individual Gold medal and new CSF Championships record went to Richard Faulds (England), 191/200.

Australia's trio of Double Trap shooters for women saw us make a clean sweep of the Individual event - Suzanne Balogh taking Gold, Susie Trindall taking Silver and Diane Reeves taking the Bronze. Suzanne shot a 104/120+35/40 for a total of 139/160. Susie T. shot 98/120+34/40 for her total of 132/160 and Diane shot a 93/120 followed by a 32.40 giving her a total 125/160. A new CSF Championships record to Suzanne B. with 139/160.

30th August - Men's Skeet - final day. George finished in equal 8th position on 119/125 and Barty was placed in 13th position on 117/125. 121/125 and up had to get into the Final. Mike Thompson of Scotland, with a new CSF Championships record, won the Gold medal shooting a 149/150.

The Women's Skeet Individual was a 75 target event and we saw Natalia taking the Bronze medal for Australia after shooting 69/75 followed by a 25/25 in the Final giving her 94/100. The Gold medal was won by Sophia Miaouli (Cyprus) who shot a new CSF Championships record of 96/100.

Most of our Team were departing this evening (Trap and Double Trap shooters together with Natalia as she had completed her Skeet) and they were due to fly out at 9.30 pm for Australia - a very happy and merry bunch of travellers.

Those of us left at the range saw the shooting finish in the early afternoon at 2 pm and as we had no one in line for anything at Presentation we decided, even though it was raining, that we would go trout fishing. Ian Coley, the English Team Manager, (and good friend of ours) wanted to take us to Richard Faulds parents farm, and while there teach us to 'fly fish'. He is a professional guide in hunting and fishing and he had all of the right equipment. Ian, however, had to stay at the range for Presentations and could not come with us, so off we went.

The Faulds farm, which is about a one hour drive from the range, was reached mainly by driving on the M4 freeway but after leaving the freeway we drove on a narrow road through very lovely villages with most of the houses having a thatched roof. Richard's parents met us at their house and gave us some more rods. Bruce, Richard's father, then took us down to the river that ran through his farm - about 480 acres. The river is apparently very famous, as fly fishing is supposed to have originated here. The river was about 5 metres wide and about 1 metre deep and the trout were a brown species, quite large and we could see them swimming on the bottom of the river. We hooked a few but as we were all very inexperienced, all but one of those trout is still swimming there in the river. John caught the lone trout, aided by George, and because it was big enough 'not to fit' into an RC cartridge case, it was taken back and eaten for supper.

Richard's mother and father had made dinner for us with coffee and cool drinks. They are a lovely family and very proud of their son (the Gold medal winner in Double Trap at the 2000 Sydney Olympics). They showed us the room they use to show off the trophies won by Richard - it was quite a wonderful display.

This small excursion ended a wonderful trip and competition where the shooters representing Australia and the A.C.T.A. proved yet again what a great bunch of people they are - not only for their results but also for their Team spirit and companionship. I believe everyone had a great time. Thank you all.

A big Thank you to John Maxwell for his companionship and coaching from all of the Team. The Team all commented on your expert commitment to them. Thank you. Thanks must also go to the A.C.T.A., the A.S.C.., Active Australia, the Commonwealth Games Association and to the A.S.A. and the A.O.C. for their sponsorship.





C grade: Richard Hernando 105/150 (again!)





Shoot Marshal 2000

All of us who attend shoots are aware of the work that is done by the gun club secretary. It's not just what happens at the shoot but also all the work behind the scenes before and after the shoot that add to the work load.

I was recently contacted by a young shooter, Stuart Whytcross from Barellan Clay Target Club in the Riverina who asked if I would preview his major work for his design and technology course for the Higher School Certificate. Stuart major work is a computer software program called Shoot Marshal 2000.

Shoot Marshal 2000 is a computer software program designed to



make life easier for the shoot secretary. Those of you who know me will know that I'm skeptical about the possibility of a computer ever making life easier for anyone. But as Stuart has demonstrated this program is able to prepare squad sheets, tally results, provide shoot off information for overall and grades. In essence Shoot Marshall 2000 is an electronic shoot record book. A bonus however, is that at the next competition when a shooters number is typed in it searches its database for all information it currently had for that shooter: name, address, grade, handicap, etc. Shoot Marshal 2000 comes in an attractive and well designed presentation box and has a very comprehensive and understandable user

An auxiliary (sub) program is Sweepman, which is able to calculate sweeps effortlessly. This program was trailed using every conceivable probability and it always had the same figures that I had calculated by only it did it much faster.

Stuart has given considerable thought to developing software that would meet the course requirements of his HSC, whilst at the same time developing a package that will inevitably make life easier for the club secretary.

In the year of the volunteer, local communities are providing recognition for all those who work tirelessly for sporting organisations, it is a pleasure to see a concrete attempt to lessen the work load for shoot secretaries.

Stuart intends to make his software package available and I believe that in the future, the work of the shoot secretary could be substantially reduced due to the efforts of Stuart.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS DECEMBER 2001

In my October column, I wrote about some of the practicalities of the World Skeet Shoot and right at the end, almost as an afterthought, added a few little snippets of generic travel advice. Shortly afterwards, in my capacity as voluntary assistant organiser for the 2001 World Skeet Team, I wrote a six page memo to all the members of that team, giving them all sorts of advice and suggestions relevant to their trip. Several of the people who read the memo suggested that some of it's contents may be of interest to ACTA members in general, particularly those who travel overseas or are considering doing so. So here is an edited extract from that document.

ITINERARY

Always attempt to set a travel itinerary that provides a sensible balance between minimizing the time away and the associated cost, whilst providing an adequate amount of time to recover from the exhaustion of the trip and the effects of jet-lag before the competition starts, otherwise it is unlikely that your performance will be a true indication of your ability.

Until you have spent eighteen of the last twenty four hours sitting in aeroplanes, you cannot fully appreciate the exhaustion it generates And until you have arrived at some point half way around the world, at a "clock time" that is diametrically opposed to your "body time", it is difficult to understand the full effects of the phenomenon known as "jet-lag".

Therefore the planning of any such trip should entail leaving home at least five days prior to the first day of competition, in order to allow adequate time for recovery. This time can always be put to good use, by using it for practice and sight seeing. Thus if you intend to combine a holiday with your shooting trip, I strongly suggest that you plan the holiday portion of it at the start, rather than the end, for this reason.

MEDICATION

Make sure that you take an adequate amount of prescribed medicine with you, to last for the entire duration of your trip, for obvious reasons. However, what is not so obvious is that you should also take with you an adequate supply of any non-prescribed medication that you may need, for several other reasons. Such as it may not be available in country you visit, or it may be on the prescribed list in that country, requiring an inconvenient and costly visit to a local doctor, or it may not be obvious that it is available, as it may be marketed under another brand name from the one you are used to. Also, visit you GP before you leave home and obtain a supply of mild sleeping pills, such as temazepam capsules, even if you do not generally use such things. They will not only assist you to rest, doze or sleep during the trip, but will also be invaluable in helping you go to sleep at "bedtime" for the first few days in a foreign time zone.

PASSPORTS & VISAS

Make sure that your Passport is not only current at the moment, but will not expire until at least six months after your trip. This way you cannot run into any trouble. Visa requirements vary from country to country. New Zealand originally did not require either a passport or visa for visiting Australians, but this has changed and now you require a passport to enter their country, The US have gone the other way. Originally you could not enter their country without having a visa stamped into your passport by the US embassy in Australia before you left. Nowadays the INS will issue you with a temporary visa upon arrival, provided your stay does not exceed 90 days.

FIREARMS PERMITS & PAPERWORK

Various foreign countries have differing laws and requirements for aliens possessing firearms whilst within their jurisdiction. New Zealand is usually very helpful and generally has police at the airport to issue temporary permits. The United States does not have Shooters Licences or Firearms Registration for shotguns. Foreign visitors are permitted to carry and use firearms in the US provided they are not handguns or machine-guns, which are restricted to US citizens, and do require some form of paperwork. Therefore you are not required to declare your firearms to either Customs or Immigration upon arrival, and the process will probably go more smoothly if you remember that.

However, leaving, and more particularly re-entering Australia, is an entirely different matter altogether. You need to get an Export Permit from the Australian Customs Service to prove that the gun belongs to you and that you took it out of Australia with you, so that you do not have to pay taxes or duties on it to bring it back into the country. And you also need an Import Permit, issued by your State Police Department as, since the implementation of the new gun laws, this is the only way that anyone can bring any firearm into Australia, regardless of whether or not you own it and whether or not you recently took it out with you.

FLYING WITH FIREARMS

Most airlines, both here and overseas, require you to declare your firearms when you check-in your luggage with them, and will want you to sign a red firearms tag which must travel with your gun. Try to get them to let you put the tag inside your gun-case, rather than attaching it to the outside like a destination tag. When attached to the outside of the case, they are generally referred to as "steal-me flags". For the same reason, it is a good idea to try to disguise that fancy looking gun-case by making some sort of outer cover for it, so that it could be a cricket bat, baseball bat, hockey stick or even a musical instrument. I have a custom-made zip-up foam-lined carry-bag that neatly holds two black plastic Stamford shotgun cases side by side. It was made by my local tarp maker, out of heavy-duty olive-green canvas. It is so drab and uninteresting looking, that in all my years of travelling, it has never once been lost, stolen or misplaced.

AIRLINES

I suggest that you try to choose an airline that will be able to take you all the way to your final destination and back, in their own aeroplanes, even if this causes your journey to be a little longer, more complicated, or more expensive. If a carrier change is unavoidable, then airlines with alliance pacts are a better option than mixing unassociated airlines, but there is still no substitute for using a single carrier.

The two problems you are trying to avoid or minimize are a delayed or cancelled flight causing you to miss your connecting flight, and/or your baggage (especially your gun) becoming lost en route. A missed connection will probably eventually get sorted out if the two airlines are in an "alliance", but if they are not, then it's neither carrier's problem, it's your problem and the solution could be both traumatic and expensive. And even more importantly, if your gun gets lost en route, you have a much better chance of ever seeing it again if there is no carrier change along the way.

LUGGAGE RESTRICTIONS

Be aware that different airlines have different luggage restrictions. Always contact the airline in advance to find out what these are, so that you can comply with them. Excess baggage will not always be accepted, and when it is, it usually attracts a hefty financial penalty. Be especially careful when you have to connect to another airline. I once flew home to Australia on short notice and had to fly into Sydney and get a domestic connection to Melbourne. My suitcase that had been perfectly acceptable on United, incurred an excess weight penalty on Qantas, and then to add insult to injury, they rejected my carry-on as oversize, and forced me to check it as baggage and pay an excess item fee. Never forget the single carrier theory.

CARRY-ON LUGGAGE

All airlines allow at least one carry-on item per passenger. I strongly suggest that you carry your toilet bag and shaver in it for two reasons. First, you can freshen up on the plane or at an airport and second, if they lose your baggage, you can still look and feel human. Along the same line, I suggest that you also carry one light change of clothes in your carry-on bag. Whatever room is left in it after that, should be used to carry whatever items you are taking with you that are of sufficient monetary or sentimental value that you would not wish to lose them. Keep your ticket and passport in your carry-on at all times and never let it out of your sight, as your ticket is difficult to replace and your passport is a very "stealable" commodity.

RENTAL CARS

The rental car market is very competitive. Always shop around for a good deal, and if you are able to utilise weekly rates or weekend deals, you'll find the exercise well worthwhile. Insurance on rental cars is generally broken up into two categories: damage to the car and damage caused by the car. Both these options can be very expensive, thereby artificially inflating the total rental cost way beyond the base figure for the car. Thus you would be well advised to do a little homework in order to try to eliminate either or both of these insurance costs Ensure that your own car insurance includes a clause covering third party vehicles, regardless of what car you are driving, and then charge the rental cost on any one of the numerous "Gold" credit cards, which include free insurance cover for the rental car.

RIGHT HAND DRIVING

Most countries in the world drive on the right side of the road. Unfortunately, Australia is one of a minority of countries, including New Zealand, England and Japan that drive on the "wrong" side. Thus if your overseas trip is to anywhere other than one of

these few places, you will be faced with the somewhat daunting experience of having to drive whilst sitting in the "passenger's seat" and steering with a wheel that "sticks out of the glove-box". Now don't get me wrong, the experience is not one that I would describe as excessively difficult or particularly dangerous, but do not underestimate the fact that it is "very different" and requires total concentration and maximum pre-planning. The main danger is in relaxing and attempting to drive naturally, and thus putting yourself in a situation where you may need to make an unexpected reflex reaction, which will almost certainly be wrong and may result in death, injury and/or damage to yourself, the rental car and other road users. The most dangerous time is not in heavy traffic, where you can simply follow the crowd, but in fact when the roads are quiet, and habit will generally cause you to get it wrong.

E-shoot 2001

An International event has been held in Maryborough without anyone leaving their home town.

A challenge was put out on the Internet by Maryborough Clay Target Club (MCTC), which resulted in nominations from clay target clubs in Australia, England, Israel, New Zealand, Slovenia and South Africa. The idea came from the postal shoot conducted each year against their sister club in New Zealand, Wairau Firth. Why not take it further and challenge the world to an e-Shoot?

The event was 50 target Double Barrel Points, to be shot by each club on its home ground. Each team consisted of two A Grade shooters, two B Grade and two C Grade, with the top five scores counted. The scores were submitted via the MCTC web site, with the closing date of August 31st. Nominations were received from Caboolture Clay Target Club, Downside Gun Club and Gold Coast Clay Target Club in Australia; Dani-Hi Olympic Clays in Israel; Northern Wairoa and Te Aroha Clay Target Clubs in New Zealand; Gaj Pragersko in Slovenia; and Graaff Reinet Gun Club and Valley Gun Club in South Africa. Each club received a participation certificate. Many enquiries were received from North America, but as they do little double- barrel shooting no entries were received for 2001. After a request to be allowed to compete single barrel, nominations are now being received for 2002.

The winner of e-Shoot 2001 is Fareham Clay Target Club, Hampshire, England, with 736 points and the e-Shoot 2001 trophy is on it's way to them. Spokesperson John Lower, secretary of the club, says, "We regarded this as a prestigious event and are ecstatic to be declared the winners". John is sure there will be many more entries from Great Britain in 2002. Fareham won the event by six points, with Valley Gun Club of Cape Town, South Africa, coming second. The only two perfect scores in the competition came from two Fareham members, Sean Heath and Dave Toomer, who have received personal certificates commending their achievement. MCTC came sixth, having shot the event in strong wind and with several high grade shooters absent. However they admit that no excuses detract from the excellent shooting by Fareham Clay Target Club.

E-mail friendships have been forged with many overseas clay target shooters, like Randy McNab of Bassano Gun Club in a small rural area of Alberta, Canada. The club could not enter as they only have four members, but Randy is in constant contact and says they might make it in 2002. He is also planning a trip to Australia and promises to come to Maryborough and "show y'all how to shoot". Mike Columbus of Dani-Hi, Israel, is an Israeli Border Police Sniper Commander and gives an interesting insight into life in their strife-torn region. Their club has the additional role of training military and security personnel in the use of firearms. Ron Woodd (stet) of Gander, Newfoundland, describes how their clubhouse is inaccessible for months, buried in snow during the long northern winter. They have a short trap-shooting season from late May to October.

President of MCTC, Dr Paul Anderson, says," E-Shoot been an excellent promotion for our club and brought world attention to the sport of clay target shooting in Australia". Member John Maxwell recently returned from a shooting trip to South Africa and says everywhere he went people were talking about Maryborough and e-Shoot.



To date ten clubs from Australia, Canada, England, Finland, Israel, New Zealand and South Africa have taken up the challenge and nominated for e-Shoot 2002, with enquiries from several other countries. (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual

placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts and maximum fine of \$5,500.

The High Gun on events 1 - 3 was won by Paul Farrugia 137/138. Saturday night a dinner and shooter Calcutta auction was held at






