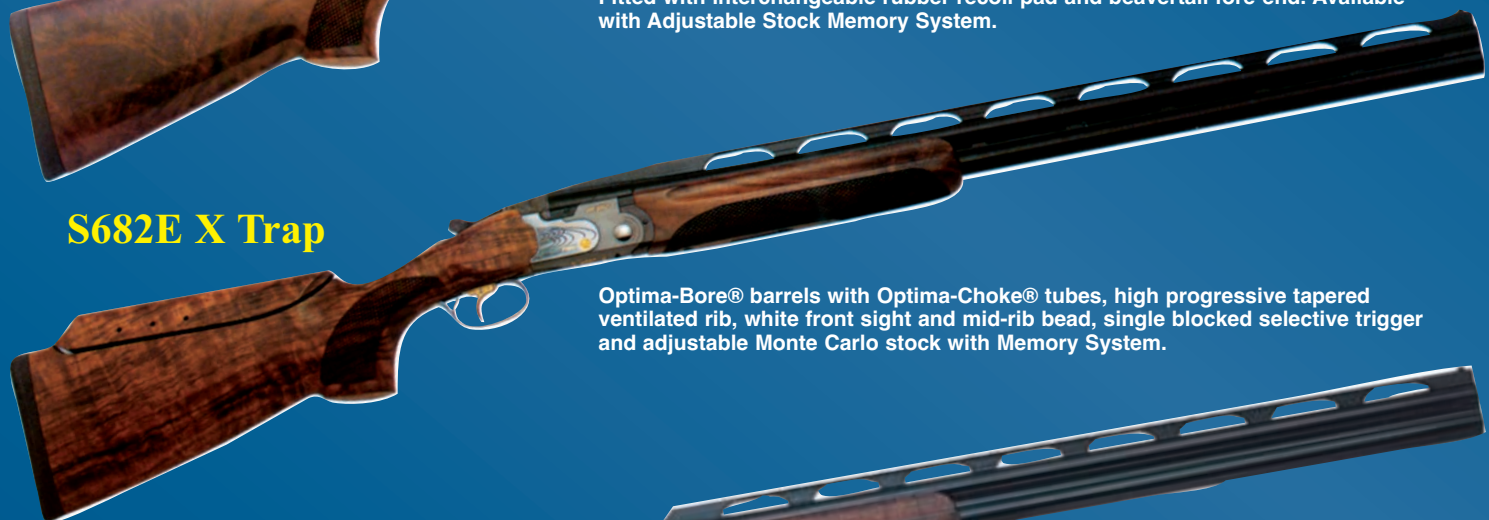

2001 WACTA

The Western Australian Clay Target Association 3-day Carnival was held over the long weekend of 29th September - 1st October, 2001 on the grounds of The West Australian Gun Club at Whiteman Park. Preparation of the grounds was of the usual high standard including the slashing of the background.

Weather for the first day of Skeet was nothing short of a disaster with gale force winds and heavy rain and storms throughout the competition for the day, with obvious reflections on scores.

The WACTA President Mr Glenn O'Brien and for the second year running, the Tournament Director Mr Murray Alexander addressed the shooters with the normal pre-shoot welcomes and information.

Event 1, was the Skeet Zone Teams shoot of 25 targets contested by 1 team each from 6 zones. This event was won with a score of 120/125 by the Metro Zone being represented by Clem Bertini, Marco Ponta, Nino Amato, Peter Vospa and Frank Shim. A very good result considering the weather conditions. The South West Zone scored a very close 119/125, Great Southern Zone 107/125 and the Northern Zone 97/125.

Event 2, 50 target WACTA Skeet Championship had 78 shooters squadded. This event progressed well with everyone fulfilling their duties as referees and scorers with the usual crowd around the scoreboards watching with interest as the scores were being chalked up. No possibles were posted, the best scores were Vince Marney, Clem Bertini and Geoff Day on 48/50. After the shoot off, Clem Bertini of WAGC won overall as he had done in the previous year. Other places as follows - 1st AA Phil House 51/54, 1st A Mick Howley 46/50, 1st B Vince Marney 57/60, 1st C Gary Kelly 46/54. 2nd AA Marco Ponta 50/54, 2nd A Paul McGowan 59/64, 2nd B Geoff Day 52/55 and 2nd C Tim Steer 42/51.

Zone represented by Ollie McPartland, Paul Finis, Robin Bailey, Lars Bager and Carsten Bager. Well done.

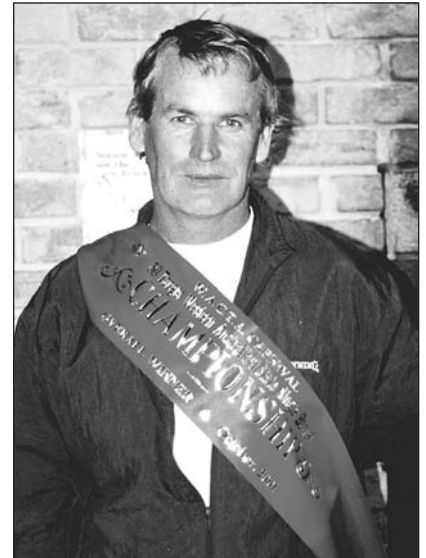
Event 5, WACTA Champion of Champions event was now underway with 118 names on the board.

The WA State Junior Champion was sponsored by Roy Alexander (himself) with a magnificent Perpetual trophy won by Clinton Smith with 49/50, 2nd place was won by Sam West with 57/59, and in 3rd place was Matt Biddulph on 56/59, the 2nd and 3rd place winners also received a trophy. Well done.

Monday 1st October the days first event, Event 7, State Single Barrel Championship sponsored by Greg Coverley from Pine Hauliers with the Roy Holtfreter Perpetual Trophy was off to a good start right on time. On the board were 109 names, and as time progressed it was obvious that 49's would be shooting off for the title. Just 4 shooters, David Fox, Murray Alexander Dennis Lymn and Gary Kelly were in the running. It took just 10 targets for Gary to take the title from David with 59/60. Ironically last year David succeeded in winning the title from Gary.

It was now time for the top 15 open team members to shoot at a final 50 targets points score to confirm the 5 man Shoulder to Shoulder Team for the 2002 Nationals. The top 6 Ladies, Juniors and Veterans were to shoot a final 25 targets points score for their respective 3 person Shoulder to Shoulder Teams. Also in each category a Team High Gun was to be selected over this event.

Once all the scores were in, a shoot off was required to decide the open team high gun between Gary Kelly and David Fox. It was Gary's day, winning the Team High Gun, including the Doug Cummings Memorial Trophy.

By now all the names in order of qualification were written up as follows. - Gary Kelly - Team High Gun 188/189, David Fox, Sam Forsyth, Carsten Bager, Trevor Morris were selected as the 5 man team Shoulder to Shoulder Team, with reserves Arthur Pagett, Mike Daden, Eddie Toomey, Shane Williams, Mick Howley, Clinton Rayner, Paul Finis, Trevor Chaplin, Lars Bager, and Jim Chandler.

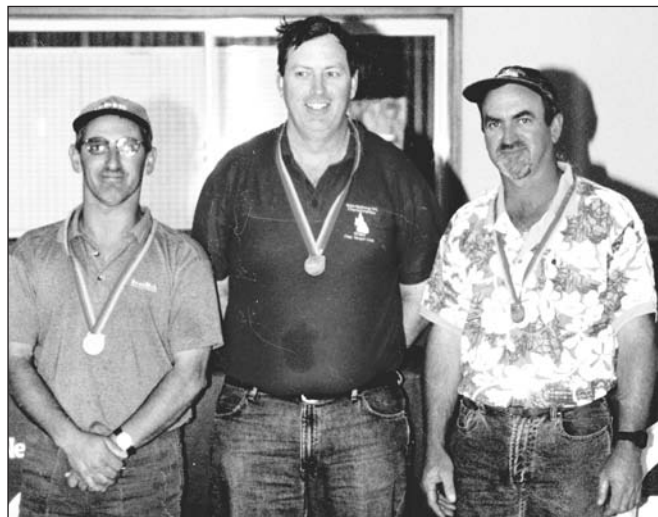

COACHING ACCREDITATION

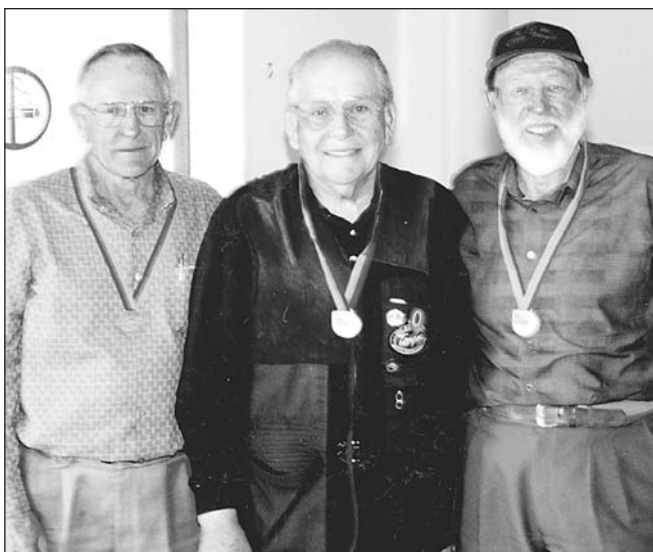
At the full Executive meeting in July 2001 a decision was made that a moratorium be run for a period of six months on coaching. The following exceptions are being offered during this period:

- 1) All coaches that have let their accreditation expire will be re-accredited on application.
- 2) Level one coaches who feel that they meet the requirements for Level 2 can apply through their respective State Associations for accreditation to Level 2. State Associations will then forward their applications and recommendations to the ACTA Coaching Council for approval.
- 3) Shooters who feel that they meet the requirements for Level 1 accreditation can apply to their respective State Associations. State Association will then forward their applications and recommendations to the ACTA Coaching Council for approval.

This moratorium will run for a period of six months starting on 1 October 2001 and concluding on 31 March 2002. Questions on the moratorium can be directed to the Chairman Coaching Council, Mr. Gary Cassells, on 03 5461 4435.

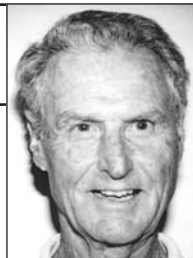

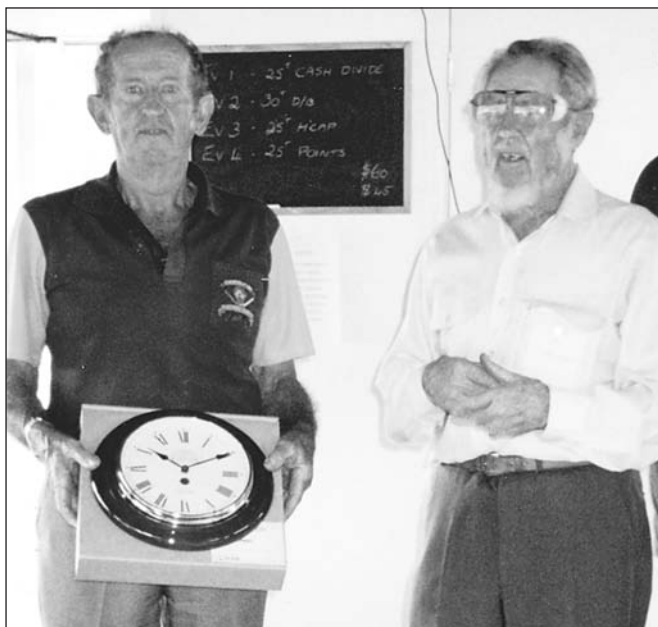

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS JANUARY 2002

Last month I wrote an article that contained travel advice specifically relevant to shooting trips. By the time I finished the first draft, I was way over the word-count the editor allows me each month for my column, because he believes there is definitely a limit to the amount of "Cuzzo's Crap", as someone so eloquently described it recently, that any one edition of the magazine can handle. However, I just hate to cut a long story short, so here is another instalment of that draft.

ACCOMMODATION

When most of us first start going away on shooting trips and need to arrange accommodation, the first and only option we generally consider is Motels. For short duration trips these are still probably the best choice, but for more extended periods, there are other options which can not only be more cost effective, but also sometimes more practical and convenient as well. In Australia I believe the best alternative is Holiday Apartments. With these you basically get a furnished house for not much more than a Motel room and by the time you split that four or five ways between a group of friends, rather than in half for a Motel room, the savings are obvious. Then you benefit even further by having all the amenities that a house offers over a Motel room, such as a kitchen, lounge room, laundry, garage and maybe even a backyard for parties and barbecues.

When traveling to America, Hotels and/or Motels are again the best alternative for short stays and the only major difference you will notice between them and their Australian counterparts is the lack of even a small bar fridge in the rooms. For reasons I can't figure out, fridges have never become standard equipment in even up-market American Hotels and Motels. The rooms are equipped with small plastic ice buckets and on each floor/block, as well as the lobby, they have large ice block making machines, from which you fill your ice bucket. I never did come to grips with this very "quaint" idea of trotting around the place with your little bucket in hand, looking for the ice machine and I think that the American Motel Owners Association should hold their annual convention in Australia one year, where they might just have their horizons expanded.

However, when in the US, for any stays longer than one or two days, try a concept they are renowned for that is a halfway between a Hotel and a Motel, called a Serviced Apartment Complex. These specialise in medium term occupancies, which is just exactly what you want on a shooting trip. And when you combine this with their eagerness to offer weekly rates, they are definitely a much more cost-effective option than either of the more conventional alternatives. You'll find that the rooms are generally very nice, at least on par with a Hotel or up-market Motel, yet offer the additional advantage of looking like an apartment ie full kitchen, large refrigerator, dining table etc. Other amenities usually include a Pool, Laundry, Security Service and Airport Shuttle Bus. Combined with all this, they also often provide a free buffet breakfast each morning in the dining room and sometimes even a free light dinner on weekday evenings.

OPERATIONAL DIFFERENCES

Whenever you attend a Shoot outside Australia, always obtain both a program and a rulebook and read them carefully before shooting, to prevent being caught out by "home rules" and/or other oddities. Back in the days when I was a half-handey Trap shooter, I once turned a pair of targets in the New Zealand National Double Rise into sooty black smudges in the sky, only to be duly and loudly scored "lost and lost" by a very officious little referee, whose belligerent attitude I shall never forget. Upon questioning this very surprising adjudication, said referee, who appeared to have a set against everyone and everything Australian, took great delight in informing me that it was because I had failed to advise him that I intended to shoot the left target first on lane number four.

After a protracted discussion it emerged that the New Zealand

Rule Book did in fact contain this obscure provision. It had apparently been invented to ensure that if the referee could not see which target the competitor intended to shoot at first and was looking at the other target and the competitor dislodged only a small piece from the first target, he would not be deprived of the score. However, this character was intent on taking creativity to a whole new level with his interpretation of this rule, and no amount of pleading on my behalf by the other shooters and numerous spectators was going to deprive him of his prized Australian scalp. When they called me to shoot off for the Overall National High Gun a few days later, the memory of that pair of targets was still indelibly etched in my mind.

Now maybe I'm thick, but I could never quite follow the thought process behind taking a rule that was clearly designed to enhance equity and technically reinterpreting it to effectively provide moral and material inequity. At such times, the only thing I'm sure of is that the Marquis of Queensberry would not have been impressed. Anyway, it was eventually the culmination of several such "memorable" experiences to both myself and others, over a long period of time, that resulted in my decision to take on the role of Shoot Marshall at our major tournaments. For the true sportsman, a sound but fair beating should be a character building exercise, but a good shafting will always be a bitter experience.

However, rules differences and interpretations are not the only pitfalls. Often it can simply be unexpected procedural differences. On another occasion I saw an overseas competitor, who had broken a "possible" early in the day at the World Skeet Shoot, appear at the Shoot-off registration table punctually at 5.30pm that evening, only to find out that he had already been scratched as a no-show. He was unaware that the rules required him to report to the stadium field within 30 minutes of the end of his flight time to shoot the first round of the shoot off with all the other people who had shot possibles on that flight. As I watched him mentally calculate the "cost" of this minor technical oversight, I would say that devastated would be an understatement in describing his reaction.

NSSA REFEREES

At the World Skeet Shoot you never have to referee or score as paid professional referees are used. They take their job very seriously. They usually act very low key and will generally speak very politely to you, if at all, probably referring to you as "sir". Do not misinterpret this as subservience. They are in charge of the field and what they say goes. They are also a very tight knit group. If you upset one of them, you may alienate yourself with all of them, as even the president of NSSA once found out to his detriment. After having to get members of the National Executive to pull for him for the rest of the week, I don't think he ever "cussed" at another referee.

Go out of your way to introduce yourself to them each time before you shoot. Make a little small-talk and be respectful and polite. It will not get you anything for free, but will make sure that they do not misinterpret or misunderstand you and get offside with you. Remember, they do not have a refusal rule in the US, so if you call for a target and the referee releases it, you would be well advised to shoot at it if you think that you can hit it, as otherwise, the next one you get may be your option. If you are unsure about anything, don't try to bluff your way through it. Instead, feel free to ask the referee for assistance and advice. They will be happy to help if they can. Also, you only need to take 100 shells for the event as there are no "sighters" and he (or she) will give you a "proof shell" if you get a broken target or the like.

AMERICAN SKEET AMMUNITION

Three main brands are available at the World Skeet Shoot. They are Winchester, Remington and Federal. There is not a lot of difference in them from a performance standpoint and they all cost pretty much the same. Although 1 1/8 ounce loads are legal in the 12 gauge events, I recommend that you use the Winchester High Velocity 1oz load, as it is very similar to the shells we use here and

will do a very good job. I used it to win the 12 Gauge World Championship in 1996. In the three smaller guns, I believe that Remington probably makes a marginally better shell than the other two and thus would recommend that you use them, except if you wish to sell the empty hulls, or bring them home for reloading, and then you would need to use Winchester. Also beware of cheap hunting loads made by the big three and sold through the larger department stores like Kmart, Wal-Mart etc. They are loaded with substandard components and light loads of soft shot. They're OK for practice, provided you use a tight choke, but they are probably not worth the effort. Do not even think about using them in competition.

TIPPING & GRATUITIES

The service industries in the US operate differently to the way they work here. Wages are very low and overtime and penalty rates are almost non-existent. The whole system works on a "user pays" basis that assures the consumer of good service. The big trick for foreign visitors is to work out which are the "service people" who need tipping, and which are the "non-service people" who will be surprised and maybe even offended if you offer them a tip. As a starting point, always tip waitresses in restaurants, bell-boys at hotels and baggage handlers at airports (but not the check-in staff). If in doubt, ask someone. You'll get the hang of it after a while. The going rate is 10-15% of the bill or a minimum of \$1.00. Do not attempt to tip anyone on the grounds of the World Shoot, especially the referees, however giving out any Australian trinkets will go over well with just about anyone at any time, so take a few pins, badges, hats etc with you.

MANNERS & BEHAVIOUR

Contrary to the rumours that circulate in Australia, American people in general tend to be very polite and courteous in their speech, actions, behaviour and their driving. Try to emulate this as firstly it makes for good international relations, secondly it will get you a lot further and thirdly they tend to be intolerant of people who are not equally as gracious as themselves. Refer to all male persons as "sir" and to all female persons as "mam" and use "thank you" a lot. Drive like a little old lady and don't be surprised when people stop to let you in rather than cutting you off when you are driving.

Bruce was a past ACTA member (3618) and a devoted coach to all, especially to juniors. He was a winner of numerous championships and a hard working club and zone member. Bruce lived his life in the Warrnambool area and will be sadly missed.

Charles Albert Linaker

Born: London, May 1920
Died: Bunbury, August 2001

Five sisters made a special trip to Thailand last year on a pilgrimage of respect for the thousands of men who worked on the Burma Railway. Though many men did not survive that wartime ordeal in Hell Fire Pass and other locations, their father, Charles Linaker, was among those who did.



At his suggestion, his daughter "enlisted" for the 2000 Quiet Lion Tour - named in honour of the army officer and surgeon, Sir Edward "Weary" Dunlop. They attended the Anzac Day service at Kanchanburi war cemetery, and trekked for another dawn service at Hell Fire Pass. It was a long walk, but one they took on cheerfully, realising the comparatively easy conditions they enjoyed.

"Dad had gone on the 1998 Quiet Lion Tour but was not well enough to come up with us last year," says his second daughter, Robin Brookes. "But we met other families, and saw broken bamboo and other reminders of what the men had gone through. We were known as Charlie's Angels."

Mr Linaker did the Hell Fire Trek in 1998, accompanied by several fellow prisoners who wanted to see where they had trod, hungry and maltreated, more than half a century ago.

If Charlie the soldier was tough enough to endure that wartime ordeal, it was possibly because his childhood was far from pampered. Arriving in Australia at the age of four, he and his parents Charles and Lilian, and younger brothers Jeff and Albert, lived at Northcliffe, scatching a living alongside other English families lured by the promise of land and a place in the sun.

He later lived in Margaret River and Kellerberrin, and at the outbreak of World War II joined the army. He served first in the Middle East, and then in Java, where his unit was among many overrun by the Japanese.

From Changi prison in Singapore, the next step was the Thai jungles and Hell Fire Pass. Charlie survived not only that, but also a spell working in coalmines in Japan. Realising that the dropping of the atomic bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki almost certainly saved his life, he weighed less than 35 kg when his captors surrendered and peace was restored.

Charlie and his wife Jenny settled in Bunbury, when he became the town's first plumbing apprentice after the war, working with builder Jack Best.

In 1968 Charlie was a founding member of the Bunbury Rifle and Skeet club, which later became the Bunbury Skeet Club, then the Bunbury Clay Target Club.

During the years since 1968, Charlie was a keen duck and clay target shooter. He will always be remembered by his fellow shooting mates as a dag in the duck swamp, and on duck shooting expeditions was always the life of the party. Charlie was also a very competent clay target shooter plus a great club contributor and loved his skeet.

In 1984, Charlie was awarded the third life membership of the club in recognition of his efforts and dedication over the years.

He also was a member of the very exclusive and famous 21 member "Billy Goats Club" in Bunbury, membership of which was nominated only by the peers of all shooters in the Bunbury region. As a sub-contract plumber Charlie was well respected by his working mates and the Bunbury community, for his amusing sense of humour and willingness to assist friends in need. Even with his many war injuries, Charlie never complained but was always first to volunteer in the rebuilding of the club and facilities. Charlie will be sadly missed by all his shooting mates.

The Linakers raised five daughters in the southern suburb of Carey Park, a tranquil contrast to the terrain where he had once struggled to keep morale. Charlie spent his working life as a plumber, declining to dwell on the rigours of captivity, preferring to recall the moments of humour that had maintained spirits.

Mrs Linaker died six years ago.

Charlie stayed in touch with several army mates, and was among the keenest contenders when the 1998 Quiet Lion Tour was on the cards.

His most positive gesture, however, came this year. When the Federal Government awarded him and others \$25,000 as compensation for their years of captivity, he gave most of it to Princess Margaret Hospital and the Royal Flying Doctor Service. Turning 81, he said, he hardly needed money. The hospital, and the pilots who flew young people to Perth for treatment, could surely use it.

Charlie Linaker is survived by his daughters Beverly King, Robin Brookes, Julie Russell, and twins Dawn Radvilas and Diane Sedgewick, 11 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

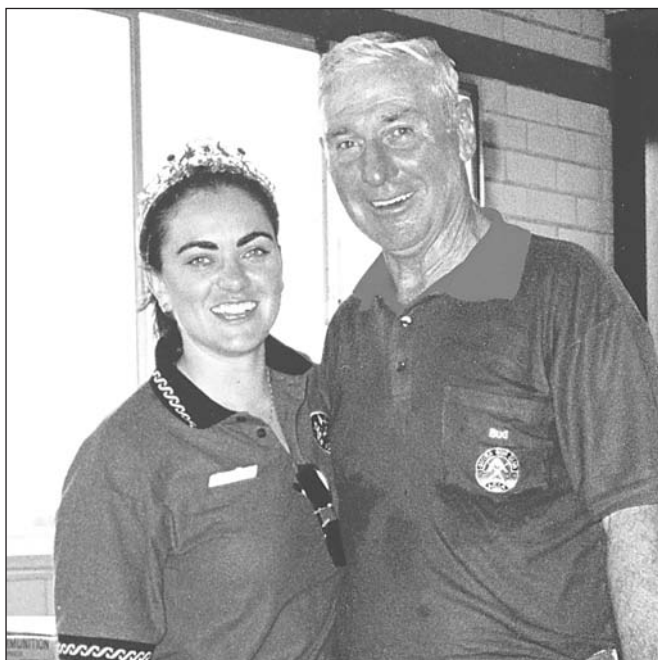

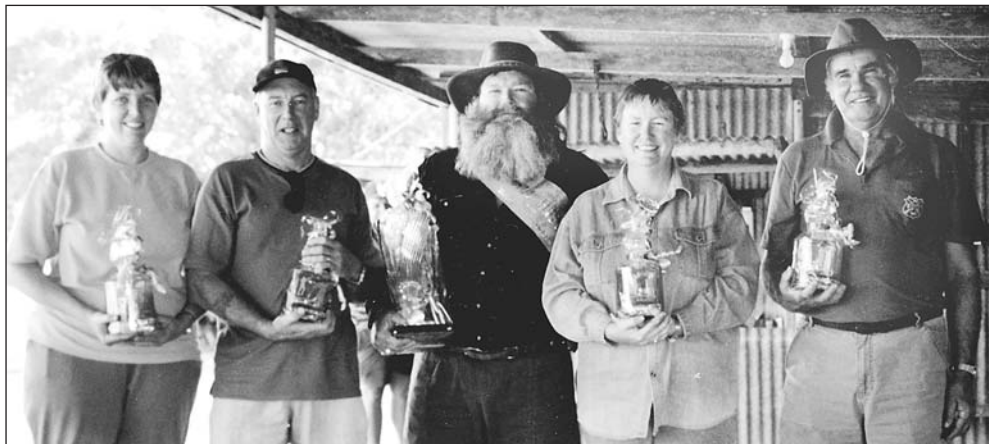
Ingham shooter Barry Bosworth missed a target in the final round to take out the overall title with a 99/100.

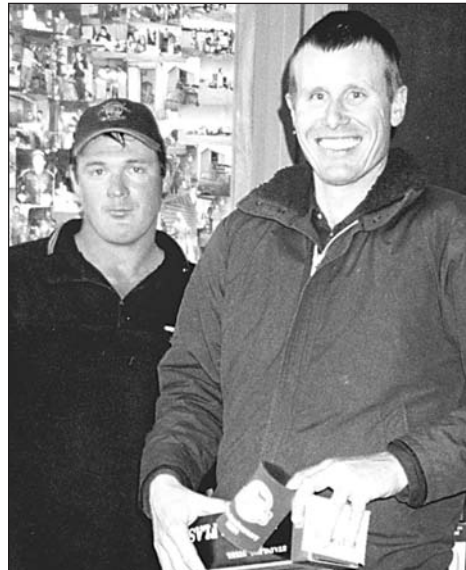
Altogether 39 shooters came from Adelaide, Bordertown, Lake Albert as well as locals.

Guest speaker Graham Boyd was next up with an interesting talk of his experience of how when he was a new shooter nobody would pass on information to assist him improve. However it is very different now with people being more than happy to assist everyone improve there scores. Graham had many good tips to help everyone. The most important thing is to be systematic in your approach to each target whether it be practice at the local club or national championship.

After lunch Andrew Larson set up to speak about eyes and how to see the targets. Andrew explained how your eyes work and

how various eye exercises can help maintain good vision. Finding eye dominance was also demonstrated and how this can be corrected and that using both eyes was very important as depth perception is a critical part of judging moving targets.

The afternoon was mostly a hands on exercise with all shooters heading to the tracks to put into practice what they had learnt. First up were the junior shooters with Graham giving them ten targets to see how they shot before giving any advice on any problems they may have. The senior shooters then had a shot with the juniors watching and Graham pointing out any little hiccups they may have had to the juniors so that they could understand what he meant when he pointed it out to them. After twenty five targets the juniors were back on the tracks along with some of the new seniors to get as may tips as they could from Graham.

Everyone was more than happy with the day and on Sunday everyone had a chance to put into practice all that was learnt. There were some major improvements by the juniors and the new shooters.

The shooters and Northern Zone Clay Target Assoc. Wish to thank Graham Boyd, QCTA and Sport and Recreation Queensland who sponsored the weekend. OFFICIAL CLUB HOUSE OPENING

St Arnaud Gun club Inc held its official clubhouse opening on Sunday 28th October 2001 in perfect weather conditions. Present at the opening was VCTA State President Mr Vince Mollica and the Mayor of the Northern Grampians Shire Council, Mr Colin Hall to officially open the new clubhouse at St Arnaud Gun club.

Mr Stephen Reyne started the official proceedings at 11.00 am with a brief history.

St Arnaud Gun club was successfully initiated at a meeting held at Mr H Higginbothams Hairdressing Salon, on Wednesday July 26th 1899. Mr G Myles was appointed secretary. The club shooting grounds were situated at Edgars Paddock, Ballarat Road, St Arnaud. RK Macey Steel Manufacturers are now on the site.

The opening match was held on Wednesday August 9th 1899, and was a three bird, (Sparrow) event, scored three points for a first barrel and two points for a second barrel kill. Mr F Bray shooting off 15 yards scored the only possible out of nine points. Mr H Langshaw, shooting off 21 yards scored eight points. The prize money was one pound, one shilling (\$2.10).

In April 1953, the club purchased the land situated at crown allotment 13 and 14, Parish of Darkbourne, from Mr Kelly, (Where the present club stands). The shooting grounds were set up for live bird shooting and also for the new discipline of clay target shooting. The clay target thrower was an ICI Automatic Angle Trap (Snipe), and was cocked and released manually, and so we call, "Pull" for the puller to release the trap.

In 1984 the club installed two shooting grounds, complete with original Burton Traps. The club is now equipped with two of the latest type Burton Traps with Hopper Fed Continental Traps, and release by Canterbury Voice Release Equipment. The club also has a Ball Trap Layout.

The St Arnaud Gun Club Inc applied for and received a government grant of dollar for dollar to replace the clubrooms. The clubrooms building commenced in December 1998.

The club would like to thank Mr Vince Mollica in attending the opening. After the official opening was the Northern Grampians Shire Council Wimmera Games which commenced at 1.00pm.

- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

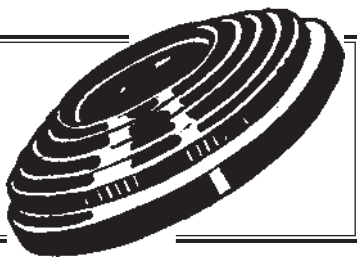

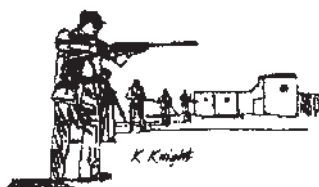

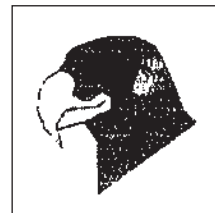
