2001 Skeet

Shooters from around Australia and New Zealand again came to the National Shooting Ground in Wagga Wagga to renew old friendships and enjoy the annual National Skeet Carnival.

All was again in preparation with the grounds being manicured to perfection by Dave Jocelyn the groundsman.

NATIONAL 20 GAUGE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The first event for the carnival saw 43 competitors line up for the National 20 gauge Championship. At the end of qualification two shooters stood alone on 99/100 both shooters taking to the field to determine a winner. 26 targets later Adrian Cousens claimed victory for the third year in a row from Laurie Sceresini with Chris Langley in third place on a score of 107/109. Adrian received the Royal Blue Sash, Silver Australia Badge and John Withers Memorial Trophy.



Section wins went to Karen Cousens in the Women's 94/100, David O'Sullivan 93/100 the Juniors and Ray Smith 84/100 the Veterans.

PRE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Sixty-two shooters nominated for this event with the only possible being achieved by Paul Johnston from Melbourne. After

a short shoot-off second place went to Neil Thompson on a score of 107/108 with Adrian Cousens in third place on a score of 106/108.

In the Sections John Cunningham was successful in the Veterans on a score of 102/107, Katrina McLaren in the Women's on a score of 96/100 and David O'Sullivan in the Juniors on a score of 97/100.

STATE TEAMS MATCH

Open: Again not all states were represented at this years Nationals. However, some fine shooting was displayed by the states represented with the final winning state being South Australia. The team of Andrew Norman, Sim-Hee Neoh, Reg Combes, Michael Ryan and Harvey Nunn shot a score of 242/250 to win by three targets from the New South Wales team on 239/250. In third place was Victoria on a score of 238/250 with Queensland and Tasmania equal fourth place on 235/250 and in fifth place was Western Australia on a score of 232/250.

In the Sections Hugh Fairfield-Smith (+8) was successful in the Veterans on a score of 120/129, Carol Tipler (+6) in the Women's on a score of 77/84 and Nick Moroni (+10) in the Juniors on a score of 157/158.

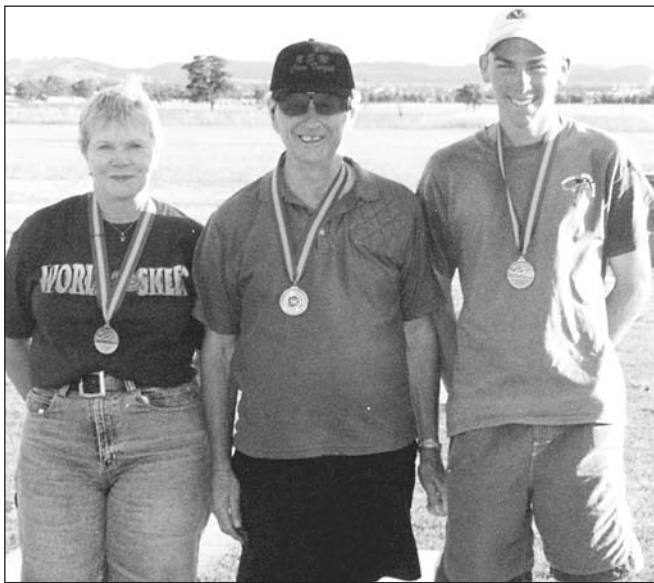
COMMONWEALTH SKEET CHAMPIONSHIP

This 100-target event attracted a field of 119 shooters. At the conclusion of qualifying four possibles remained these were Ray Everett, Adrian Lucchitti, Reg Clarke and Mark Newman.

At the completion of the shoot-off Ray Everett had withstood all challengers and was unbeaten on the day with 187/187 to become the 2001 Commonwealth Skeet Champion. Second place went to Adrian Lucchitti with a score of 186/187 and in third place was Reg Clarke with a score of 129/130.

In the Sections Reg Clarke was successful in the Veterans on a score of 100/100, Carol Tipler in the Women's on a score of 97/100 and David O'Sullivan in the Juniors on a score of 99/100.

Nine shooters on 99/100 now proceeded to the field to compete for

third place. Finally Laurie Sceresini was successful with a score of 167/168.



In the Sections Reg Clarke was successful in the Veterans on a score of 98/101, Glenn Moorby in the Juniors on a score of 132/133 and Hamish McMaster was successful in the Sub Juniors on a score of 88/107.

Wendy Wellam was successful in the Women's section with a score of 95/100. Wendy was presented with the Barney Rooke memorial trophy kindly donated by the Guberina and Satara families.

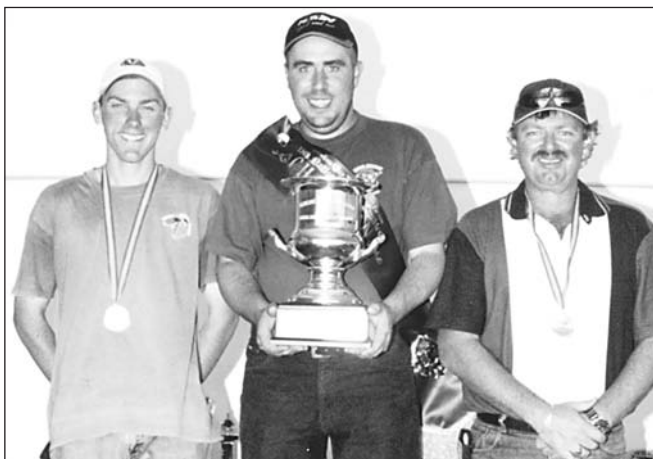

Byrnes, National President, presented Adrian with the trophy.

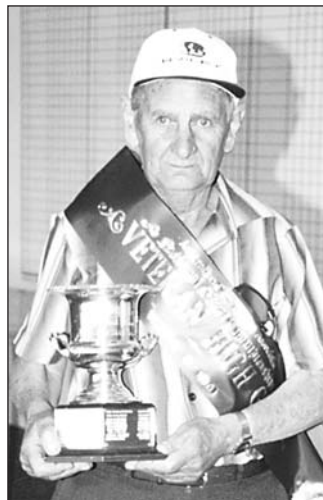

COACHING ACCREDITATION

At the full Executive meeting in July 2001 a decision was made that a moratorium be run for a period of six months on coaching. The following exceptions are being offered during this period:

- 1) All coaches that have let their accreditation expire will be re-accredited on application.
- 2) Level one coaches who feel that they meet the requirements for Level 2 can apply through their respective State Associations for accreditation to Level 2. State Associations will then forward their applications and recommendations to the ACTA Coaching Council for approval.
- 3) Shooters who feel that they meet the requirements for Level 1 accreditation can apply to their respective State Associations. State Association will then forward their applications and recommendations to the ACTA Coaching Council for approval.

This moratorium will run for a period of six months starting on 1 October 2001 and concluding on 31 March 2002. Questions on the moratorium can be directed to the Chairman Coaching Council, Mr. Gary Cassells, on 03 5461 4435.

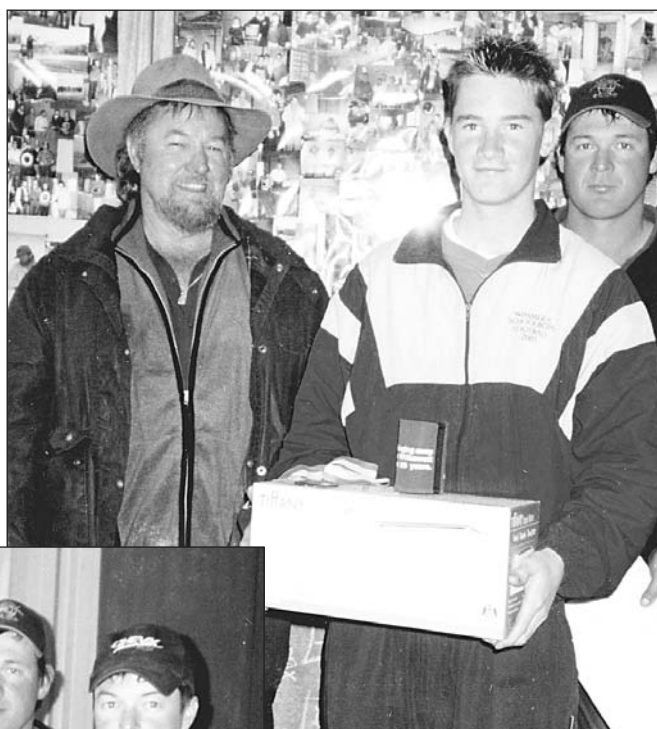

Laurence George Connors

26-02-1928 — 23-11-2001

A funeral service for past ACTA and VCTA president Laurie Connors who passed away suddenly on 23 November was conducted at St Andrew's Uniting Church, Mildura on 29 November.

With the church filled to overflowing and unable to accommodate the large number of local people who were in attendance as well as the many who had travelled to Mildura, the funeral service was broadcast in the grounds of the church to enable those present to pay a final tribute to a man whose life had been devoted to his wife Agnes and the sport of clay target shooting.

Many of those attending the service would have met and known Laurie outside of his chosen sport, clay target shooting. Others such as myself would have first met Laurie through our own involvement with clay target shooting, a sport which was pretty dear to his heart.

Irrespective of how we were fortunate enough to meet and know Laurie, those who knew him will all have their own special memories of him and how he influenced our respective lives.

I first met Laurie in 1985 in his capacity as vice president of the Australian Clay Target Association when I was being interviewed for a position with the ACTA, neither Laurie or myself realising at the time that a long standing friendship was being born.

In 1985 my knowledge of clay target shooting was non-existent, while Laurie had done it all. From his earliest beginning at Mildura Clay Target Club through to Zone, State and then National level, before finally returning to his grass roots to become secretary manager of the Mildura Clay Target Club.

It did not take long for me to discover that Laurie was one of those rare people who was prepared to share his knowledge with others for the betterment of the sport that he willingly and tirelessly gave so much to. Laurie was never found wanting in this regard and it was through his enthusiasm that I too came to share his love for clay target shooting and the Australian Clay Target Association.



In my early days with the ACTA I would have spoken to Laurie on an almost daily basis as I endeavoured to gain an understanding of the intricacies of the sport, let alone understand its political side that Laurie, whose positive forward thinking was at times misunderstood, knew so well.

Laurie Connors joined the ACTA as a shooter on the first of September 1958. When he decided that he could best assist the sport in an administrative capacity Laurie changed direction and as Agnes well knows, became a man on a mission. Virtually nothing deterred him as he worked long and tirelessly for the betterment of the sport.

While he sacrificed his own participation in shooting to improve the lot of others, he remained an A grade 22 metre handicap shooter, both of which he was proud of achieving.

Over his 43 years membership of the ACTA during which he made many friends, Laurie served the sport with great distinction at its highest level for many years:

President of the Mildura Clay Target Club
North West Zone Delegate
Victorian State President 1998
National President 1981 to 1986
National Vice President 1984 to 1986
Awarded ACTA Life Membership in 1984.

During his years as National President Laurie and Agnes became a familiar sight to shooters as they visited many clubs throughout the country. This personal contact with shooters enabled Laurie to gain an insight into their thoughts on shooting and their views on what improvements could be made to the sport on their behalf making Laurie, always accompanied by Agnes, the most travelled and therefore the most approachable President in the history of the sport.

In 1998 Laurie's contribution to the promotion and development of clay target shooting throughout Australia was further recognised within the sport when he was awarded the ACTA's most prestigious award, the Presidential Medal, an award for which there was no person more deserving.

In 2000 Laurie was publicly recognised when he was awarded the Federal Government's Australian Sports Medal for his services to shooting, again an award for which there was no person more deserving irrespective of their sporting discipline.

Fittingly the ACTA Clay Target Shooting news to which Laurie was a great contributor, featured him on the cover of its November 2001 issue doing what he loved, working for the betterment of clay target shooting and as was the case in the earlier part of his career. The Mildura Clay Target Club, whose Easter shoot and social, which Laurie and Agnes together were largely instrumental in making so successful, was an annual event on the ACTA shooting calendar not to be missed. What a great memory for Agnes and the Mildura Clay Target Club to retain.

Apart from fond memories of his many outstanding personal attributes which others who knew Laurie are far more qualified to speak about than I am and his devotion to his wife Agnes, Laurie Connors will be remembered fondly and well in shooting circles for the outstanding contribution he made to the growth and development of clay target shooting throughout Victoria and Australia, in particular the Mildura Clay Target Club where the name Laurie Connors became synonymous with the very best that clay target shooting had to offer.

With the sudden and sad passing of Laurie Connors, the Australian Clay Target Association, Mildura Clay Target Club and the Shotgun Shooters of Australia have lost a great supporter whose influence and commitment to shooting and the shooters of Australia will be greatly missed. Those who knew Laurie as I did, and there are many, have lost a true and valued friend.

Deepest sympathy to Agnes who would have been consoled by the large number of people who came to Mildura to pay their last respects to Laurie Connors, the man with whom she so lovingly shared her life.

May he rest in peace.

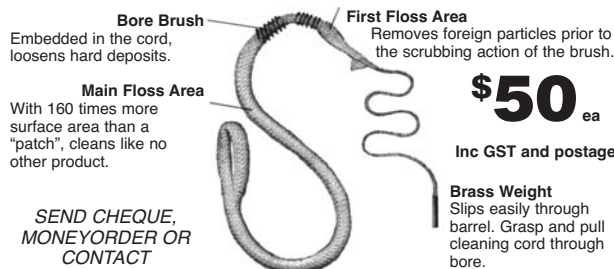

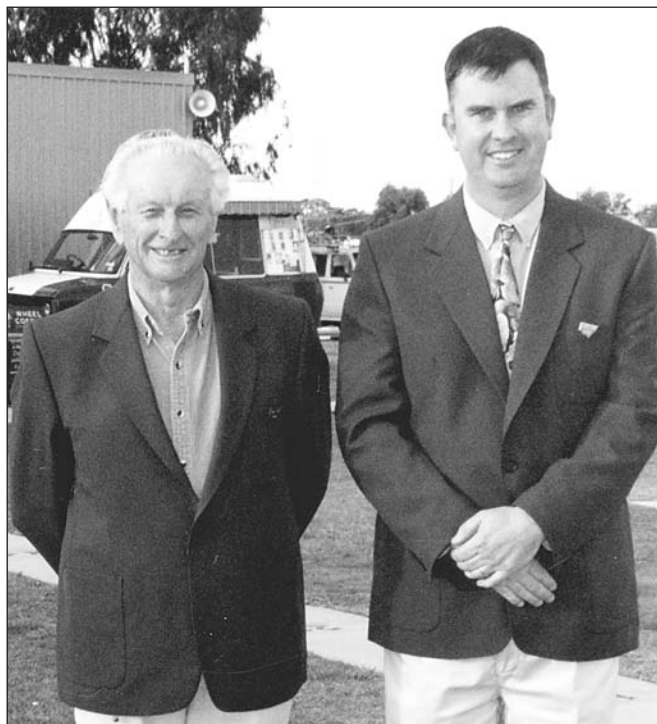

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS

February 2002

Early last November, I made my annual pilgrimage to the Metropolitan Gun Club for their "big shoot" of the year, the Metro Grand Prix. Now that's not to say that the GP is the only time I go to Metro, but as it is the feature shoot on their calendar, and they put a great deal of time and work into it, and always have excellent prizes, I generally try to do my part in giving them the support that such an effort deserves. Anyway, while I was there, I ran into an old mate of mine, Steve Haberman.

After we had joked around for a while and reminisced about old times, Steve remarked that as I am widely acknowledged as the ACTA's worst nightmare when it comes to agitating for changes to rules and procedures, he had a number of shooting related ideas that he would like to bounce off me. So he asked if I could find half an hour to sit and chat seriously with him during the weekend. Having known "Habie" for a very long time, I know him to be an accomplished shooter of great experience, as well as a pretty sharp operator, and now that he is a major player in the firearms distribution industry, he obviously has a vested interest in the well-being of our sport. Thus I was most interested to hear his thoughts, so later that evening we had a long yarn.

However the extent and variety of his ideas surprised even me. He had obviously been giving a wide scope of matters a great deal of thought for quite some time, as he had fresh and innovative thoughts on just about every facet of our sport, ranging from rules changes through sponsorship and promotion to administrative matters at the Nationals. Naturally, I disagreed with a few of his ideas (but that's certainly not to say that they're wrong), however the vast majority were extremely interesting, and some were just plain exciting. In order to subject some of these "brainwaves" to as much learned debate and constructive criticism as possible, before exposing any of them to the light of day, we decided that as the State Trap Carnival was only a week away, we would convene a meeting there amongst as many "experienced" shooters as were interested.

So at Echuca we gathered together about a dozen shooters, with over 300 years of combined shooting experience between them, around a table to discuss the pros and cons of a lot of Steve's ideas, and then several other related items that eventuated from the debate. One of the realisations that this meeting brought to light was how seldom this wealth of knowledge and experience converges, and how difficult it is to get it all together at the one time, and yet how valuable and constructive such "think tanks" can be. As a result of all this, a lot of issues were thrashed out and a few rejected, but a lot rehashed and refined. Over the next few months I will attempt to give most of them an airing, but this month I intend to elaborate upon a complex one that I consider to be both urgent and important.

It is an attempt to pacify all sides of the "National Ground Debate". On one side are those people who look upon the Nationals as a serious attempt to decide who, amongst our best shooters, is worthy of being proclaimed National Champion for the year. To do that in the most equitable manner, you obviously need to hold the Nationals in a central location, so that the maximum number of those people can afford to attend, and you need to stage them at a venue which has premium shooting facilities, so that luck, in a variety of facets, has the least chance of determining the various outcomes. In short, you need to stage the event at the National Shooting Ground in Wagga on a continual and on-going basis.

On another side of the debate are those people who look upon the Nationals primarily as a family holiday, secondarily as a chance to shoot clay targets every day for nine consecutive days, thirdly as an opportunity to win something in their grade at a major event, and lastly and "leastly", as the place where Royal Blue Sashes and Silver Australia Badges are handed out. Now don't get me wrong! I don't underestimate the numerical size of this group of people, or the importance of catering to their particular needs.

But I also believe that establishing the ground rules for the Nationals, to the exclusive satisfaction of this group, as we did up until a couple of years ago, is not the answer either. Circulating the Nationals around the various States, and to varying venues in some of those States, inevitably leads to holding the Nationals, on occasions, at substandard venues, albeit with loads of enthusiasm, but with totally inadequate infrastructure and facilities, and surely this cannot be good for the long-term viability of our Premier Event.

The third and last significant side in the debate, are those clubs who have invested varying amounts of time, money and effort into upgrading their facilities in order to be able to meet their moral responsibilities, when their State's turn to hold the Nationals came around. I classify the venues that fit into these criteria into two groups: the Majors and the Minors, due to the size of the investment each club made specifically to cater to the Nationals. The Majors are easy and clear cut: Perth and Roma. The Minors are a little less apparent, but Launceston, Melbourne, Brisbane, Adelaide and Echuca would all rate a mention.

And the most important thing you have to remember is that all of these clubs built up their facilities prior to the National Ground becoming a reality and now get little satisfaction or return on that investment. Most of the Minors hold two-day shoots and/or State Shoots that utilize the facilities and thus partially justify it, but both of the Majors are in danger of becoming "very expensive white elephants" if they do not succeed in getting the Nationals back on their rotational turn, so you have to see their point when they squeal like stuck pigs over the whole National Ground concept.

And if you study the history and the timing of the whole thing, it just gets worse. Rumour has it that WAGC got grant money from their State government, on the understanding that they would get a Nationals of some sort at least every second year, with some sort of financial penalty clause if this did not eventuate. And Roma got way past the point of no return with their major expansion project, before the contract with the Wagga City Council was signed. So no matter how big a National Ground fan you may be, you have to empathise with all the clubs involved, but with Perth and Rome particularly. Surely there must be a workable solution or compromise somewhere!

Steve Haberman thinks there is. He is a died-in-the-wool National Ground man, but he thinks that the concept of a travelling Commonwealth Championships would appease everybody. Basically he believes that the full set of Commonwealth events, that are currently conducted at the Trap Nationals, (DB, SB, Pts, HC, CoC and DR) should be taken off the existing allocation system and bundled into a mirror image of the Trap Nationals and put back onto a State rotational system, similar to the old Trap Nationals roster.

Similar but not the same! Due to the greater investment and the better facilities provided by the two Major clubs currently disadvantaged, he thinks the Shoot should alternate between them every second year, giving them each a shoot every four years, and the various Minor clubs filling a rolling rotation on every other "off year", thereby giving them each a shoot every eight or ten years, if they wanted it, and thus creating a sufficiently wide holiday spacing between visits to them.

I for one personally think it's a great idea and the best solution I have heard yet to the whole National Ground argument. And from what I hear on the grapevine, Steve is not the only one advocating this type of proposal. I believe that a number of other people are pushing for the same or very similar concepts. So why don't you each give this situation some careful thought, add your own "two-bobs worth" and then make your thoughts and ideas known to National Executive members. Who knows, some sort of common sense proposal could actually eventuate.

And before I close this month I would like to make a pretty shocking announcement of my own. I may be about to formally enter the world of shooting politics myself, instead of just lurking in the fringes and using my fat mouth and my word processor to take everything from the odd pot-shot to full broadsides, at those people and organizations who currently administer our sport. How can this possibly be you say, as the "top guns" almost never get involved in "real" politics, and when they do, the "system" usually just chews them up and spits them out. Well, maybe so, but I think I'll still take my chances.

A couple of things that have happened recently have prompted me to head in this direction. The first thing was, as I do quite a bit of work with and for the NSWCTA, I had cause to take a close look at their senior management and found that one of their National Executive people, Mark McInnes, is one of the keenest and most serious clay target shooters I know, and the other, Billy Jones, is undoubtedly the smartest finance manager the ACTA has ever had, as he has taken our organization from rags to riches during the past few years since he took over. And as for their newly elected president, "she" is not only one of the nicest and most pleasant people I have ever met, but also a very astute lady into the bargain. So clearly anything is possible.

The other factor was that my minor role as club delegate recently "accidentally" dumped me into the role of Zone President, which exposed me to a whole bunch of political infighting and egotistical power-playing, which I firmly believe we can well do without. So now I'm on a "holy crusade" to clean up the politics of shooting, as I am still naive enough to believe that our State Council should comprise a dozen unbiased people, jointly and harmoniously advancing the best interests of shooting, rather than pursuing their own individual political goals. Wish me luck!

Maybe the "old boy" system will thwart me or crucify me, but maybe, just maybe, my unorthodox methods and beliefs, such as "tell it like you see it" and "play with your cards on the table" will inject a much needed breath of fresh air into a world of shooting administration, parts of which, currently appear to have a lot in common with Jurassic Park: full of dinosaurs and carnivores. At the very least, it will put a pigeon amongst the cats for a while, so watch out for the fur and feathers to start flying.

Media Release

2002 has been proclaimed as the Year of the Outback and the Queensland Clay Target Association and clay target clubs throughout Queensland will be playing a significant part in the celebrations, with the Royal Flying Doctor Service being the beneficiary.

Participating clubs will be holding special charity shoots during the year, the proceeds of which will go to the Royal Flying Doctor Service, which offers an essential service to all the people who live in country Queensland and to all those who visit country Queensland.

The year's events will culminate in a grand charity concert with well-known Country Music artist Lee Kerneghen. The concert will be held in Roma in September 2002.

To coincide with the charity concert the Roma Clay Target Club will be staging a three day shoot that will include a number of national and state events.

Clubs need only stage a 25 target point score event in their July monthly shoot with competitors competing individually, although Clubs can choose to run it as a shoulder to shoulder event. In the event of a tie, broken targets will be counted and should there still be a tie, a shoot off will be held prior to the staging of the Grand Charity Concert at Roma, or a postal shoot off will be held. The nomination fee of \$60 per team will be donated to the Royal Flying Doctor Service.

A suitable perpetual trophy will be purchased and each winning team member will be presented with a medal at the Grand Charity Concert.

The Grand Charity Concert will be the climax of the Charity Shoots with all proceeds going to the Royal Flying Doctor Service. The concert will be open to members of the public, and with a big name performer like Lee Kerneghen, we anticipate that around 4,000 people will attend.

Catering and bar facilities will be available at the concert. The concert will be promoted and publicised as a night of fun and entertainment for the whole family through the main stream media.

At the Grand Charity Concert it is also planned to hold a charity auction of memorabilia from sports and entertainment stars. Proceeds from the concert, food and beverage and charity auction will go to the Royal Flying Doctor Service.

The project will also include the following 2 excellent incentives for participating clubs:

1. The clay target club that raises the most money will be given two sets of Canterbury Voice Releases.
2. The clay target club that raises the most money per member will also be given two sets of Canterbury Voice Releases.

Participating clubs will have their charity shoot listed on the Year of the Outback web page as an official Year of the Outback event. Clubs are participating in a number of ways. Some are running special charity shoots based on guidelines provided by the QCTA, others are making the charity shoot as part of their monthly competition, while others are running raffles and making donations based on a percentage of nomination fees for club shoots.

Clubs that have already indicated that they will be participating, include Dalby, Gold Coast, Central-Burnett, Toowoomba, Cairns Target Shooting, Sunshine Coast, Burdekin, Kingaroy, Mount Isa, Tallawalla, Cunnamulla, Cloncurry, Condamine, Moonie, Toogoolawah, Blackall, Townsville, Herbert River and Roma. With some \$8,000 already in the bank this innovative Year of the Outback project promises to be very successful for the Royal Flying Service as well as a great promotion for the sport of clay target shooting.

Clubs from around Australia are encouraged to participate in this fantastic opportunity to participate in the Year of the Outback and to raise money for a most worthwhile cause. CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION - ENTRY

Entry into the 2002 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2002 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors must produce their 2002 registered shooter record book before nominating, to the 2002 Nationals Office Handicapper.

DIVISIONS

The competition will be divided into separate Championship Titles for Open, Ladies, Juniors and Veterans, excepting the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Ladies, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.

A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before sashes/medals/cash/trophies are awarded.

When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as selection teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.

To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

AGE QUALIFICATIONS

Veterans - are those competitors over the age of 65 years on April 2, 2002.

Juniors - are those competitors who, on April 2, 2002 will be under the age of 18 years.

Sub Juniors - are those who, on April 2, 2002 will be under the age of 14 years.

STARTING TIME

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded

towards the end of the event.

Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

CARTRIDGES

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure or equivalent shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships.

TARGET AND TRAPS

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Management Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers.

All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

CLASSIFICATION

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified - and indication can be obtained for the daily scoreboard. This applies to trap grades, Open, Ladies, Juniors and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Practice, subject to trap availability, will be available throughout the championships. Tickets may be purchased at the events office.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps.

Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.

Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.

Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.

Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred in the event concerned.

Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.

Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.

All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.

Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be a different location of the area accepting shooting event nominations.

Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.

When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.

A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.

Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.

Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.

An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.

Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors and second family members only, they being wives or husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.

All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.

As can be seen from the dates that this team travelled to the United States it will come as no surprise (especially to our families) that the team travelled during troubled times. Although we have seen all the reports on terrorism it is abundantly clear that we are very lucky that we were so isolated in this region of the world. Apart from the at least once in a lifetime experience of travelling and competing in the largest Skeet event held anywhere in the world the team also experienced a country that was in a full state of alert due to the war against terrorism.

All members of the team departed Australia knowing that the US would retaliate at some stage in the near future. Little did we know that whilst we were sleeping, eating and watching movies at 35000 feet over the Pacific heading towards LA that indeed the US had started bombing Afghanistan.

Although security was tough leaving Australia with manual bag searches being carried out on all hand luggage, with items like disposable razor blades and nail clippers being confiscated, it was nothing to what was being carried out in the US. Clearing customs and getting the guns in was a piece of cake apart from the usual delay associated with the custom officers general interest in firearms at a personal level.

Once clearing customs the aim was to get to our connecting domestic flights. It was at this point that we joined a queue approximately half a mile long. No way were we going to get into the domestic departure areas without a ticket, boarding pass and photo ID, an x-ray of all hand luggage and a physical search on any dubious bags, plus explosive residue chemical analyses on selected bags. To top this off, the National Guard complete with M16 rifles were patrolling the airport on both sides of the security gates. It was at this time (1 hour before boarding our United Airlines domestic connection) that we saw all the news reports about the attacks on Afghanistan and confirmation that the country was now in a state of alert for possible retaliation. Needless to say we were pleased when we arrived in San Antonio in one piece, all the boys had to worry about would be my driving, primarily keeping on the right side of the road and secondly finding the hotel and getting in touch with the family back home who were concerned about the recent developments in Afghanistan. Both Lee and I learnt a first lesson when dialling home from our hotel phones 3 failed connections cost US\$20 each and a five minute call around US\$50 needless to say I had some words with the hotel manager regarding the failed calls and then a trip to the supermarket to buy a phone card.

The following day turned into a rest day with a trip out to world shoot range where we caught up with the remaining two team members (Dave & Laurie) who left Australia earlier for some sight seeing and additional practice. That night we started to call various contacts provided to me by Adrian Cousens and as experienced during the whole of our trip we were greeted with open arms and a days practice was organised at the "Bexar Community Shooting Range", a private gun club owned by Vern and Jennifer Winkelman. This contact turned out to be very useful as it enabled the team to buy all of its ammunition at club rates rather than the higher rate being charged at the world shooting complex.

Wednesday saw the team head into the city for some sight seeing which include the Alamo (the original) located directly in centre of the city. We did not practice at this club as it was agreed as the world shooting range was now open that all practice would be conducted at the facility where we would shoot both the Mini world and World Shoot.

By now those team members suffering a little jet lag had finally got themselves back to a normal sleeping routine. I got a cold the morning after we arrived, whilst watching the news at breakfast that morning I saw all the reports about Anthrax warnings and the symptoms to

watch out for, all of which I had, however I'm still alive and thankful it was only a cold.

Thursday was nomination day and this was made a little easier with the help of Mary Masch who is one the most helpful and obliging members of the NSSA staff. It was agreed with the team that all members would nominate as AA, which was possible as none of the team had obtained a grade through shooting the required amount of NSSA registered targets prior to arriving at this shoot.

It took around an hour and a half to ensure that each team member had correctly filled out their nomination forms and had entered everything that they were eligible to shoot for. The following options were selected where applicable;

- All of the open events,
 - The High Overall (separate nominations required),
 - The novice event (only eligible if you have never shoot NSSA targets) only four of the five man team were eligible; Julian, Dave, Laurie and Leigh.
 - Concurrents or age groups for example triple sub (TS) is 30 to 40 years old. This group is then split further on the day into additional groups like TS1 and TS2 etc. This was an optional nomination with the decision to shoot this group being made by each individual team member.
- In addition to nominations there were various sweep options that could be shot and most of the team elected to shoot the following two options;
- Oklahoma's - money is returned to the shooter if they shoot a 50 straight in any of the gauges other than the 12 gauge where 100 straight have to be shot. With each member of the team shooting so well, all decided to take the gamble. For general information there are 3 50 straights in a 100, the first 50, the middle 50, and the last 50.
 - Lewis Class - more of a gamble as it did not matter what score you shot other than a perfect score, which always paid. All the scores of all shooters are split into 6 groups if your score is amongst the top score in one of the groups you will win some money. That's the simple explanation but it's a lot more complicated when working it out.

The rest of the day was used for practice and in my case experimenting with 12 gauge ammo trying to find a low recoil loaded, there are not many one ounce loads available as one and an eighth ounce loads are the normal 12 gauge loads. I settled on "Winchester Xtra Lites" and proceed to do a deal with the NSSA ammo sales warehouse operator to swap a case of Remington 1 1/8 ounce loads generously donated to me by Joshua Daly who had won them at the previous years world shoot as part of the Australian Junior Team.

At this point I would also like to point out that all overseas trips are expensive and when travelling to the US when the Australian dollar only buys 50 cents American makes for a very expensive exercise. The ACTA to their credit fully funded the following;

- Airfares,
- Accommodation for 14 days,
- Rental car for 14 days,
- World shoot entry fees,
- US \$300 allowance, (food, petrol, etc.)

There were however, various expenses that needed to be funded by each of the shooters, this still added up to a large amount of money; self funded expenses included;

- Mini world entry fees,
- Concurrent entries in both the mini and main world events,
- Ammunition for both the Mini and Main world events
- practice rounds.

Both Julian Lucchitti and myself (Scott Wright) both received additional funding through the generosity of the New South Wales Gun Club (our home club), to the tune of \$1000 Australian each, this helped cover those items not covered under the ACTA funding and this gratefully accepted.

Shoot Statistics

There were 1047 total entries this is only 104 less than the record last year, this drop was less than expected due to the World Trade Centre incident.

The 12 gauge Mini- World had 697 entries with 82 perfect scores.

The 20 gauge Mini- World had 705 entries with 77 perfect scores.

The 28 gauge Mini-World had 689 entries with 57 perfect scores.

The Doubles event at the World had 834 entries with 24 perfect scores.

The 12 gauge World had 862 entries with 26 perfect scores.

The 20 gauge World had 860 entries with 123 perfect scores.

The 28 gauge World had 859 entries with 79 perfect score.

The 410 event at the World had 847 entries with 16 perfect scores.

The High Over All (HOA) at the World had 734 entries and no perfect scores.

The Winchester 650 at the World had 578 entries and no perfect scores.

There were a total of 43 medals won by the members of the team. This is one of the best overall performances for an Australian Skeet Team representing at the World skeet titles.

The World shoot complex now has a total of 50 skeet split over 4 levels and a vehicle is required to access each of the levels. The lower range is known as the pig pit as we were to soon find out. One evening whilst watching TV in our rooms the screen started to flash a red banner across it and emitting a high pitched warning sound, this was followed by the following warnings, high winds, heavy hail, flood warnings, and a high level tornado warning for the San Antonio area, primarily the Bexar county district. This added another element of excitement to an already eventful trip. Although the tornado did not eventuate the high winds and hail did. Consequently the ranges known as the pig pit lived up to their name and 3 of the fields were closed due to ankle deep mud.

The main level of the complex has the NSSA offices, the clubhouse, the new hall of fame, the main shoot off arena plus 12 other skeet ranges. At the back of 10 of these ranges are all of the major gun, target and trap manufacturers and retail stores where, you name it, you can buy it, from hats around US\$18 to a 4 gun set US\$53200. That's right, about 1 million Australian dollars. Needless to say a visit to these stores was a daily ritual.

With the shooting nearing an end there were only a couple of things that were left to tidy up. One was the issue of "Elmer Fudd" (known as Elmo) a club mascot only shot for by members of the Greater Houston Gun Club and never to leave the club. However little did they know that we had the gift of the gab on our team and we let Laurie Chelepy loose, with a little persuasion it was agreed that two members of our team would go head to head against two members of the Greater Houston Gun Club in a doubles shoot off in the main arena (big mistake). Elmo now resides in Queensland under the watchful eye of Laurie Chelepy.

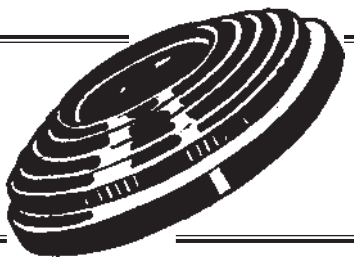

This is one of the best teams that I have had the privilege of travelling with and I thank them for making my job of managing the team a little easier.

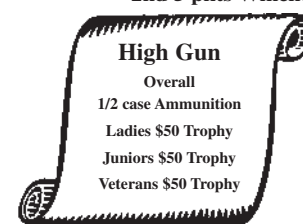

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

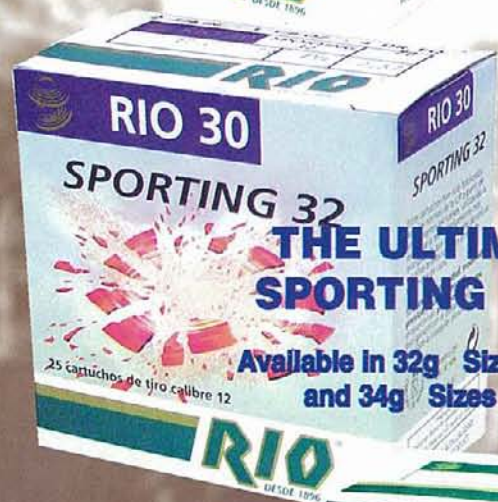
