PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT 2001



It is with pleasure that I present the 2001 Annual Report for the Australian Clay Target Association. When analysing the positive aspects of the year we must start with the continuing success of our members on the International scene. In the ISSF we have seen Michael Diamond, Angelique Psarakis and Susan Trindall win world championships along with several World Cup events also won by other Australian shooters.

Our DTL and skeet shooters have also maintained a high standard winning the Glen Cup and performing well at the Oceanic Championships in New Zealand. The Ladies and Junior teams won the Macintosh International teams match and our open team finished second.

The DTL Nationals held at Wagga in 2001 was reported by many to have been one of the best carnivals for many years. The standard of scores with 15 possibles in both the single barrel and point score events and 135 possibles in the double barrel indicates how well competitors performed. We certainly hope that we can maintain these standards for the upcoming National events. The introduction of major presentations on the one evening accompanied by a BBQ also appeared to be a very positive move. The sponsors appreciated the opportunity to make their presentations in front of a larger audience and successful competitors received more recognition for their efforts. Lets aim to build on this and improve the concept even more in the future.

The change of moving the ISSF carnival from a September / October timeslot to a January event also appears to have been successful. This did mean that we actually conducted 2 carnivals in the space of 4 months to enable the change to be implemented. The change to January saw a near record attendance, the best for many years and also an excellent representation by lady and junior competitors.

Progress has continued with the National Shooting Ground as we develop the facility. I have heard some criticism that this is not happening quickly enough. Our policy is to develop the facility progressively as finances allow. I have also received submissions about the development of a hall of fame for the association. One of these submissions has been very detailed and well thought out and I will table this for discussion at the next full executive meeting.

Funding from the Commonwealth Government has continued to be invaluable in supporting our ISSF competitors. This funding was initially channeled directly to the ACTA for part of the year. This funding has now reverted to the Australian shooting association and we need to lobby via this body for your share for the ISSF competitors. The ongoing success of our International competitors has assisted in this regard.

Last year I indicated that a new constitution was in development and that I hoped to have it ready for adoption at this meeting. The draft was circulated to all Executive members for consideration. Concerns raised by some states saw us organise a 2-day meeting in Melbourne to sort through these issues. The firm of solicitors

then redrafted the document and it has again been issued to Executive and State associations for consideration. After fine-tuning it should be available to all clubs in the 2 or 3 months for consideration. The advice was for us not to try and rush the process but allow everyone time for consultation prior to its adoption at an AGM. It has been a long and tedious process but hopefully it will be a document that will address our needs in the long term.

Insurance is an area of concern; the spiraling cost associated with maintaining an appropriate insurance cover for clubs and our shooters is a high priority. The Executive and Finance group will continue to seek every alternative to maintain this cover. We are well aware that individual clubs would be left in an untenable position if we let it lapse, however the increased costs will need to be accounted for by the association.

Another disappointing area is the number of legal challenges that seem to be arising. Actions over noise and lead pollution by clubs is a worrying trend that seems to be developing. All clubs probably should be proactive by developing a lead management plan to cover their grounds. This coupled with individuals who seem to want to call in the lawyers everytime a decision does not go their way is also disappointing. Several incidents have taken up a huge component of executive time that would have been better directed towards other administration issues.

In the course of a year are many people who should be thanked for their input into the Association. To Andy Sanders and all the staff at the office I pass on a big thank you for your efforts. The diversity of the tasks you undertake is not appreciated by many. Since the association has taken on the running of all National Championships the workload had certainly increased.

To all executive members we also thank you for your work on the various sub committees. The chairpersons need to be congratulated for their work; some of you have put in countless hours in managing your area of responsibility. Often the only feedback you get is when something goes wrong, with no comments about successful initiatives and improvements. I would certainly encourage you to continue with your efforts, time and commitments, the association needs it.

I welcome Mr Len Cook who has been elected by the Victorian Clay Target Association as one of their 2 delegates to the association. Thanks to Mr Gary Cassells for his work while on the association, in particular for his efforts in chairing the coaching sub committee and his work as a delegate to the Australian Shooters Association.

To Vice President Bill Jones I thank you for your efforts and financial leadership. The skills in handling the association's finances are as essential today as it ever has been in the past. I would also like to take the opportunity to thank the officials of all registered clubs around Australia. The strength of our sport is generated by the work done in each and every club.

Sadly each year a number of our members pass on. I am sure all clubs and shooters affectionately remember each of these members and their involvement in our sport.

Mr Laurie Connors a past President of the Australian Clay Target Association was amongst these members. His contribution was spread over 40 years and greatly appreciated.

I would like to conclude by thanking all sponsors for your assistance to the association or club; your support is essential to the well being of the sport and the ACTA.

Personally I thank all members, Executive and office staff who have assisted me in my role during the year, your assistance has been invaluable. I hope the association can move forward in 2002 in a positive manner supported by all sectors of the sport.

Friday did however, give us our third 'hot day' for the summer but this was short lived as it came in cool again and Sunday in particular saw many with warmer clothing on, keeping out the cold wind blowing in from the south. Shooters, numbering 134, came from far and wide to join in the competition and it was pleasing to see each afternoon at Presentation time, a 'full house' - well done to all of those who stayed on - this is greatly appreciated by the sponsors who are present.

Day One - Friday 1st Feb. The first event - the 50 tgt State Handicap (sponsored by John Holder) was won by Kevin Mules with a score of 56/56 (17 m). Second place went to Frank Albanese 77/78 (11m), third place to Ian Campbell on 76/78 (21m), fourth place to Phil Grainer who shot 81/82 (22m) and fifth place went to Peter Hampel who shot 80/82 (11m). Not bad scores for a couple of C Grade shooters off their 11 metre mark - hopefully the State Handicapper caught up with you!

The second event (back by popular demand) was the 25 pair State

Double Rise Championship (Sponsored by Greg and Carmel Watson Insurance) and here we saw Stephen Thompson -AA Grade, (who recently represented Australia at the Oceania Championships in New Zealand) take out the event overall with his score of 46/50. Other grade winners were Pino Marmorale (A Grade) on 43/50, Brenton Deacon (B Grade) on 43/50 and Ivan Hein (C Grade) with his score of 32/50. Leanne Smith took the Women's trophy with 36/50, Brett Menzies won the Junior trophy with 35/50 and Stan Rosetti took the Veteran's trophy after having shot 33/50.

The last event for Day One was a Point Score Cash Divide (graded). AA Grade was won by Max Medhurst on 75/75, A Grade by Lachlan Sinclair on 75/75, B Grade was taken out by Ian Watkins on 74/75 and C grade was won by Ivan Hein who shot 66/75.

Once the competition was completed those that needed to stay on for the Annual General Meeting did so. John Holder (Vice President) stood in for Graham Michell (President) who was at that time flying in to Singapore on his way home from Qatar where he had accompanied the World Cup Final Team to that competition. The drive back home to Murray Bridge (following the AGM) made it a long day.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

2. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.

3. The Organising Committee will decide the order of shooting.

4. Regulation Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rockett rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot official, but shall number five (5) in total.

5. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.

6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets

7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is a possibility.

8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.

10. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.

11. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.

12. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.

13. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

14. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.

15. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.

16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.

17. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

18. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.

19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.

20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.

21. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors and the second family members entering into the same event, they being wives and husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.

22. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.

WORLD CUP FINAL - DOHA, QATAR

25th January, to the 31st January, 2002

The Team assembled in Sydney and Melbourne for their departures to Doha, Qatar, via Singapore and Dubai, flying with Emirate Airlines. The flights over were all reasonably comfortable and the two flights had both a 7 and 8 hour stopover in Dubai. In Dubai, Emirate Airlines, as usual, booked us into 5* hotels, free of charge, with meals included. After showers, a bit of sleep and a good meal, we all met up at the airport for our flight to Doha, Qatar which was a one hour flight - again with Emirates.

Qatar is quite a small State, some 11,437 square kilometres, with a population of some 500,000. Qatar is situated in the north-east of the Arabian Peninsula overlooking the Persian Gulf (this small country which includes some small islands), backs on to Saudi Arabia. The country in general consists of low, arid plains that feature flat, rocky (limestone) surfaces, and these are punctuated with some small hills in the western and northern area. It has a desert climate of long hot summers (averaging 32 degrees C) and a short winter (averaging 16 degrees C) with an annual rainfall of about 100 mm (4 inches). There are some lush oases along the coastline but almost 50% of the country's population live in the capital Doha. Most of the population is Arab and Muslim but Persians, Indians and Pakistanis also inhabit the coast working as itinerants. The mainstay of the economy of Qatar is the production of crude oil and that provides some 90% of the national income (discovered in the 1930's while the country was a British protectorate). Natural gas is piped to Doha and is used for cheap generation of electricity and by the desalination plants being established. In 1971 the country became independent from Britain and is ruled by Sheikh Hamad Bin Khalifa Al-Thani and the royal family. The major industries include the manufacture of fertilisers and cement and this is most apparent by the building of many large hotels (mostly along the sea front) and thousands of new homes in Doha. The Sheikh and his family are very sports minded and since the early 90's have been very keen to have as many high profile sporting Championship events there as they possibly can - car rallies, soccer, tennis, golf, track and field, sailing, volleyball etc.- wishing to make Doha the capital of sporting events in their region. All of the big named hotel chains are already there and the one that we stayed at was the Intercontinental - only built one year ago and very, very nice - equivalent of a 6* rating. The host country supplied our accommodation to us 'free of charge'. The food we had was of excellent quality, with assortments to please everyone's taste.

The income from the oil has changed Qatar from an impoverished desert into a prosperous State with the money going straight back into the country. The roadways are some of the most modern in the world, mainly freeways with plenty of roundabouts. The vehicles are all very modern (mostly 4 wheel drives and left hand drive).

Members of the Organising Committee met us on our arrival at the Doha Airport and they had us through Customs and our Police check in record time. Some of the people quickly learned that you were not allowed to bring alcohol into the country - it was taken from them but it was returned to them upon leaving. The funny thing was you could buy what ever drinks you liked from the bars at the hotels - but they were all very expensive - about \$18.00 to \$20.00 Australian for a mug of beer or a whisky!

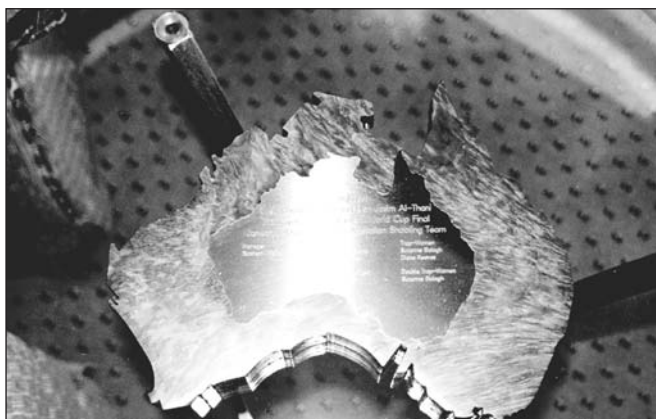

Friday 25th January - Arrival of all delegations and unofficial practice. The ranges consisted of two Skeet layouts and one Trap layout. The targets used were Nasta fluoro, thrown by Spieth traps. The targets were very good. Qatar supplied all Officials and workers at the shooting grounds. Some were a little inexperienced but they soon learnt what was expected of them. The organ-

isation was also very professionally done with very good tents, seating, tables etc., for the competitors, officials and spectators. There were many VIP's present at all times. The food/ facilities were supplied by the Intercontinental Hotel and again proved of

excellent quality. The background at the shooting range was very flat and bare, just white stone except for one of the Skeet grounds which had three small trees out in front. The armoury and ammunition stores were first rate, professionally run with out any problems. Most nights we had dinner together around 7 pm before retiring for the night.

Saturday, 26th January - Official practice day. Everyone was in high spirits. The women were up first for their practice and after having completed their three rounds were confident they would shoot well in the competition. The President of the Qatari Olympic Committee invited all Team Managers and some VIP guests to a luncheon at the Doha Golf Club and a tour of the course by golf buggies. To my surprise I was seated with Michael Knight (Sydney Olympic Chief Organiser) who was in Doha as a guest of His Highness, to help with the organising of the 2006 Asian Games that are to be held in Qatar. Michael Knight and I officially celebrated Australia Day with a 'glass of orange juice'. He was very interested in our Team and was looking forward to meeting with them.

This evening the Opening Ceremony was to take place and we left the hotel at 4 pm. We were taken to Palm Island (a small island in the bay) and our mode of transport was in an Arabian dhow (an Arabian trading vessel formerly used particularly for the slave trade). The Opening Ceremony consisted of folk dancing, speeches, fireworks and a laser light show - plus a banquet. This was all very nice but the nights here were bitterly cold especially when there was a wind (around 30 kilometres an hour) and we had experienced this each night since our arrival. We in fact, did not stop for the banquet but opted instead to return to the hotel for dinner and an early night.

Sunday, 27th January - First day for competition in Trap and Skeet for both Men and Women. Thankfully the wind had dropped with the temperature in the low 20's. Very blue skies. The day started with mixed results. Michael shot brilliantly to post a 75/75. Tom could not get onto the targets and ended the day on 63/75. Suzanne shot a 65/75 and qualified in 5th position for the Women's Final. Diane had a bad start shooting a 17/25, finishing on 56/75 and was very disappointed with her score. The Women's Final was a nail-biting affair with any one of the six competitors being able to win the event. Suzanne was most consistent and at one stage looked like winning but she had a broken target come out and then she missed her repeat target - this left her very disappointed. She then had to shoot off single barrel for 3rd place with a Russian girl, Suzie being victorious. This was the first shoot off she had encountered in an international competition and this was the place to win it. The Presentation Ceremony was possibly the best that I have witnessed - Suzie being very proud of the trophy and cheque that she won, smiling from ear to ear. So ended the first day of the Trap and Skeet competition.

Incidentally, Lauren Ogilvey, our newest Australian Team recruit, shot in her last competition for the USA and made the Final in the Women's Skeet. She finished in 6th position with a score of 67/75 + 23. An 18 year old girl from China who had shot 74/75 was the leader going into the Final and she finished in first place over a Russian shooter. The Chinese girl had the chance to set a new World Record but she dropped 2 targets on station 4 - she still won the event and set a new Junior Women's Skeet Record.

Monday, 28th January - The final 50 targets for the Men's Trap and Skeet. Starting time was set at 9.30 am instead of 8.30 am. The weather was magnificent - no wind, 25 degrees C and a blue, cloudless sky - you could not ask for anything better. The targets were easily seen and flew straight. Tom was first to shoot posting a 24/25 - a better start than the day before. Most of the spectators were waiting for Michael to start shooting and the pressure must have been enormous - yes, he dropped 2 targets ! Michael made the comment that he made the fatal mistake of moving his gun before he had focused properly on the target.

Watching Michael this morning in his preparation was really something. He had watched all of the targets from the previous squad, watching the targets flight pattern as on the previous day some of the left hand targets had not been coming out where you would expect them to be - he is a real professional. Many of our younger shooters could learn a lot by just watching Michael. Tom shot a 23/25 in his second round and this gave him a score of 110/125 putting him in 11th place. Michael then shot a 24/25 giving him a score of 122/125 and this left him leading by one point going into the Final. 117/125 scores and better made the Final.

The Final - Michael was clearly the popular choice to win. He was truly everyone's favourite and was going into the Final one point in front of the Italian, Giovanni Pelliello. The third target out saw Michael missing and this really put the pressure on everyone. Michael had two 'no birds' in the next 10 targets. He missed a target on a repeat and I have said many times, "it does not matter if you are the world's best shooter as Michael is, you must also have a certain degree of luck - and luck on this day was not on Michael's side". Michael today missed 4 targets in the Final but still came in second place shooting a

143/150. We were all very disappointed for him, as I believe most of the people on the range were. The Italian competitor Pelliello shot a 25/25 in the Final and knowing the pressure that was being felt out there, was magnificent shooting in anyone's language. The Presentation Ceremony again was a spectacular affair - but sad.

Michael, Tom and Diane left tonight to catch their flights home. Tuesday, 29th January - Unofficial Double Trap practice and a lay-day for most with a trip to the new shooting range for those who felt like going. I went and witnessed a truly magnificent spectacle. The new range, not yet finished, has 6 ranges, all fitted for Trap and Skeet. A common tunnel connects all of the ranges. There are huge lights for night shooting as it apparently gets far too hot in the summer months - sometimes up to 50 degrees C making it too hot for the Qatar State Team to do their training. The shooting range is one kilometre by one kilometre in area and will eventually hold all shooting and archery disciplines. The government has spent \$45 million on the clay target ranges. All of the buildings, when finished, will be as good as most 5* hotels and I am sure when the lawns and landscaping is completed, will be every bit as good as the Brunei shooting range.

We were then invited to the Al Shaqab Arabian Horse Stud - just 15 kilometres from Doha and established and owned by His Highness The Emir Sheikh Hamad Bin Khalifa Bin Hamad Al-Thani. The aim of the Sheikh on this 400 acre farm is to breed horses that are competitive in the world's best show rings. The stud has imported Arabian, Egyptian, Russian, Polish and Spanish bloodlines to combine with their own native Qatari horses to achieve this goal. What an impressive place.

While at the farm we were also treated to a very luxurious outdoor lunch and I was seated next to one of two Princes who were

there. He soon taught me how to eat Arab style! Horst Schreiber and other dignitaries from the ISSF also attended this outing and ate lunch along with us. Lunch consisted of a whole roast lamb (stomach and all poking out through it's brisket) - not very appetising to look at but it tasted OK. The Prince showed us that you don't use knives and forks - hands only! Hands only for pulling the meat off of the bones! Hands only into the salad bowl to take out your rice/taboulli, etc. etc. He just reached across the table, pulled a handful of meat off the back of the roast lamb and piled it on my plate! I still used the cutlery that was provided to those who wished to use it - old habits are hard to change. It was different! Back to the hotel and then a trip into the shopping mall saw the end to a very interesting day.

Wednesday, 30th January - Official Double Trap practice. The wind came up today and made for some very interesting targets thrown. Both Suzie and Russell were shooting OK. We finished around 1 pm and went back to the hotel to get ready for our 3 pm departure to be guests of the Royal family at a camel racing afternoon.

Now this was an interesting experience. Compared to horse racing the main difference is that the races are 10 kilometres long - a sand track with bitumen roads on both sides. The inside road for television camera crews, ambulances and dignitaries following in their modern 4 wheel drive vehicles and the outside road for the trainers and owners - 20 plus vehicles driving in a bunch up to 30+ kilometres an hour. The jockeys are little boys, around 5+ years of age. All wear helmets and padded vests and carry whips. It seems strange to see them playing normal children's games in the sand pit next to the race track and then go out to ride the camels in the race, their parents carrying them out and throwing them up onto the camels back. It is also quite dangerous for it is not only the racing camels on the starting line but 'lead out' camels with handlers as well. We did see one fellow fall from his camel at the start of the race and be run over by all of those following. There is huge prize money on these camel races and it is apparently not uncommon to see camels sold for huge prices - \$500,000.00 US for champions. The whole sport is a very big industry and a real eye opener to people like us. We all had an early night for the competition of Double Trap the next day.

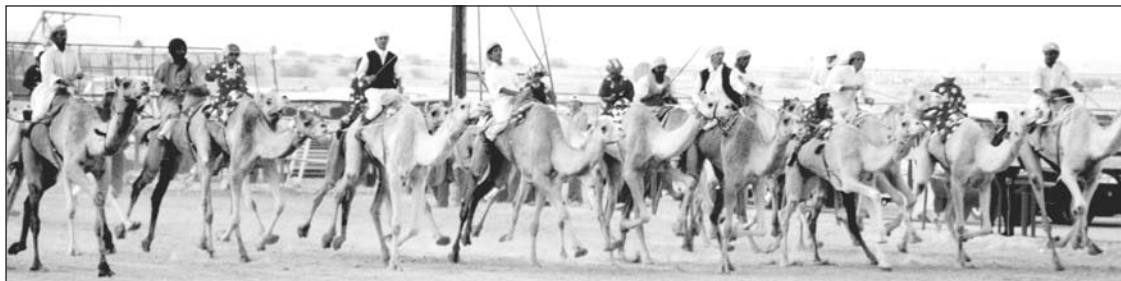
Thursday, 31st January - Double Trap competition. The weather was fine and cool with clear skies and a gusty wind that was estimated at 30 - 40 kilometres an hour making the targets very

erratic and climbing high. Some people can handle windy conditions and some are unable to - Suzie was disappointed but I thought she handled the conditions OK but Russell found it very difficult and could not get into the competition and he was very disappointed. It must be extremely hard for these champions when they have a bad competition when most people expect them to do well. Many of the top people suffered in these conditions and there were some disgruntled faces.

Glenn Eller, a Junior from the United States, a good friend of the Australian Team had been training with both Suzie and Russell

and he was having all sorts of problems in training but he came out and really gave everyone a lesson in Double Trap shooting. In those terrible conditions he shot a 49/50, another 49/50, followed by a 47/50 and this gave him a lead of 7 targets over Li Bo of China who had shot 47,47,44. Glenn shot a 43/50 in the Final winning by 6 targets over Li Bo who shot a 44/50. All scores deteriorated through the day as the wind became worse. At the completion of the Presentation Ceremony we went back to the hotel to pack our bags for our 8.30 pm departure for home.

Friday, 1st February - We were going to be flying Emirate Airlines all the way home with a brief 11/2 hour stopover in Dubai and another 1 hour stopover in Singapore. I managed to get the Team into Business Class out of Doha to Dubai which was great but we were back to Economy Class out of Dubai as the planes were just about full in all classes all the way back to Melbourne. The flight home was very good - I slept most of the way and that was unusual for me.

Saturday, 2nd February - We arrived in Melbourne Airport around 2 am and after going quickly through Customs, Russell and Lauren headed on home. Suzie was to return on a flight to Sydney in the morning and I had my flight back to Adelaide.

So ended another very memorable trip. The Team members were

excellent companions, supportive of each other and great ambassadors for Australia and the A.C.T.A. It was a pleasure for me to be with you.

Attending an event such as this can also be very informative. There are many of the Executive members from the ISSF in attendance and they are all very willing to sit down and discuss topics that are relevant to our sport, and help sort out any problems that we may be experiencing. It is also a good time to find out about coming events. It is also helpful to be able to speak 'face to face' with the Officials of the other countries who are holding events in the year 2002 - things like the availability of cartridges, accommodation, training, make of traps to be used/brand of targets, weather etc. etc. For instance, the World Cup that is being held in Shanghai, China in April, the only cartridges that will be available are Jailing and we can all remember them when they were released into Australia a few years ago - this is just one problem that has to be overcome.

On behalf of the Team, I would like to thank the Qatar Shooting Association for their great organisation and for caring for us so well. Thanks also to the A.C.T.A. for their support and contribution of funds to get us to this prestigious event. Thank you to Bill Jones and the Executive for making this budget available.

FOSTER GUN CLUB

Over the past several years the Foster Gun Club Inc has conducted Junior training and instruction days for students from the South Gippsland and Yarram Secondary Colleges, usually about 20 students from each school. After obtaining their junior shooting permit, they are taught firearm safety and the correct handling of firearms and shown how to break clay targets by the members of our club.

Although our club's aim was to introduce safe shot gunning to these young people, we have had an unexpected reward with quite a number of them joining the club as junior members and registering with the ACTA, a few dads have also joined.

We now have 10 registered junior members which in a club with a total membership in the 30's is very rewarding to the members.

We of course need the cooperation of the Colleges, which we fortunately have. Perhaps this programme could be adopted by other clubs; approach the schools and colleges for they can only say no, but a yes can be beneficial to both students and to your club.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS

April 2002

Within a few days, many of us will be packing up and heading off to the Trap Nationals, which undoubtedly will be a great event, especially as they are once again being conducted at our new National Shooting Ground. Even though this wonderful venue is still in the early days of its construction and evolution, it is already illustrating why a National Ground is such a good idea. I became a staunch advocate of the National Ground concept years ago, after attending only a handful of Nationals on the State Rotation System, and witnessing first hand, the inherent problems.

I quickly tired of attending Nationals at venues that normally handled forty or fifty shooters once a week, or maybe even once a month, which had temporarily expanded their shooting facilities to handle five or six hundred shooters every day for over a week. Although the shooting facilities usually muddled through somehow, amidst breakdowns of borrowed traps, fuse-box meltdowns, flooded extensions and a myriad of other unforeseen problems, the rest of the facilities usually fell well short of the mark and simply illustrated the undesirability of seriously overloaded infrastructure.

Things like makeshift parking, inadequate toilet and washroom facilities, insufficient camping space and/or amenities, clubhouses that were unable to accommodate even a small proportion of the participants, and inadequate shoot offices, designed to accommodate club events, that created huge bottlenecks and frustratingly long lines. And when tents and marquees were erected in the adjoining paddocks, they lacked the heating or cooling necessary to counter the elements, and with their dirt floors, usually turned into either dustbowls or mud wallows.

During the late 70s and early 80s I made several visits to New Zealand, where the Rotation System is only between two islands instead of six states, and where each island had a fixed venue, unlike Australia, where the Shoot sometimes moved around within each state. From this it became obvious to me that by anchoring and reducing the choice of venues, you increase the amount of money that it's worthwhile spending on upgrading the facilities at those venues.

I later visited both the World Skeet Championships and the Grand American Trapshoot, where this idea had been taken to its logical conclusion and a single permanent venue adopted for both sports. Once I saw the scope of the facilities and amenities that this enabled them to provide for the competitors, and compared that to the "tin-pot show" provided by our "travelling circus", I became totally convinced that the creation of a National Shooting Ground should be a priority in this country.

Although a lot of people agreed with the idea in principal, it was unfortunate that most of them were either too selfish or too short-sighted to support it, unless the selected venue was in their own backyard. Thus it has been very frustrating, over 25 years, to watch many good National Ground proposals, for places all over the country, wither and

die as only those people who lived within a one-day round trip of the location would support them.

Logically, the real choice of locations is extremely limited, as the huge expanse of our country means that anywhere other than very close to the centre of gravity of our population could not be viable. That geographic parameter occurs somewhere in south central NSW. Thus I will remain eternally grateful to the members of our National Executive, about five or six years ago, when they had the strength and the vision not to allow a wonderful offer from the Wagga City Council to waste away.

That proposal involved not only taking over the lease on the existing land occupied by the Wagga Gun Club, but to provide for substantial future development, also included the Council's intention to purchase a further 35 acres that adjoined it on the western side. The addition of that land to our lease, without any increase in our annual rental, would then give us a total of 85 acres. All the land is zoned "special purpose - sporting" and is secured on a maximum term agreement for the princely sum of \$100 per annum.

In order for both the Wagga Council and the ACTA to become equally and totally committed to the success of the National Ground project, talks took place between the two parties regarding an added incentive to relocate our Head Office to Wagga as well. These discussions culminated in the Council agreeing to give us the freehold title on a 5-acre block adjoining the National Ground, which was valued at \$200,000 and for which we would only pay the total sum of one dollar.

The advantages of our Head Office adjoining our National Shooting ground are enormous, a small example of which is the time, money and effort saved in not having to pack and ship the multitude of perpetual trophies to and from the Nationals venue each year, not to mention the repair bills for damage in transit when they get back. Now we simply walk them over to the Clubhouse in the morning, present them that afternoon and carry them back to their glass case that evening.

The timing of Wagga City Council's offer could not have been better. Our existing office in Melbourne was nothing more than a poorly converted shop and was basically a shambles. It had been unwisely purchased, for top dollar, during the peak of the real estate boom, in an undesirable area with no possible chance of appreciation and it continued to devalue every year. Additionally, it was so inadequately small that it reminded me of a sardine can, and it badly needed repairs and/or renovations that would not have increased its value by their cost. In short it was a total disaster and the only smart thing we ever did with it, was cutting our losses and getting out of it.

Thanks to the generosity of the Wagga Council, the almost \$200,000 loss that we carried out of Melbourne, was completely offset upon payment of the dollar for our new Office Block. And from there we have gone from strength to strength. About \$400,000 later, and courtesy of the fruits of Col Burt's labour and expertise, we now have 60 magnificent squares of fully fitted out, air conditioned, purpose built office, complete with car-park and landscaping, which recently won a commercial beatification award for the local area.

Unlike our Melbourne property, this asset will continue to appreciate every year and when you compare its cost to the \$330,000 we paid for our previous location, it must surely be the bargain of the century. Following on from that, the expenditure of another \$100,000 provided not only an Events Office that is the envy of every Gun Club in the whole World, but also a store area for the Wagga Gun Club, so that the "old shed" could be bulldozed and the open treed area thus gained, earmarked for a shaded seating area, come picnic ground, come outdoors presentation area.

Capital works projects then proceeded with a huge new Toilet and Shower Block adjoining the Clubhouse, allowing the roofing over of a large veranda area behind the Clubhouse for meals, parties and the like, and then a 2400 square foot Workshop/Garage/Store to the west of the Events Office. Amongst other things, this store should allow us to maintain an adequate stock of proven quality, tested targets thus

ensuring the elimination of one of our previous sources of heartache: the last minute arrival of substandard batches of targets spoiling the Nationals.

Another positive offshoot of the National Ground project occurred when the NSWCTA abandoned their plans to establish their own State Shooting Ground and contributed the funds they had accumulated for that project, to the purchase of \$100,000 worth of the DTL traps and other associated equipment for the Wagga complex. And to ensure the ongoing viability of the National Ground, they decided to conduct their State Trap and Skeet Carnivals at Wagga for the foreseeable future.

Many people ask whatever happened to the Wagga Gun Club in all this evolution. Actually they couldn't be happier, as they converted most of their fixed assets into cash by selling them to the ACTA, and then signed a new deed of agreement, on very favourable terms, to be able to continue to operate at the National Ground. And when the ACTA purchased enough additional self-loading Skeet Machines to equip all the fields, Wagga's famous Two-day Skeet Shoots got even better.

The only dark cloud that appeared throughout the whole affair was when certain people, who were opposed to the National Ground project for various reasons, began spreading unfounded and scandalous rumours regarding the source of financing. Claims were made that the Finance Committee had pirated the Legislation Fighting Levy Fund or mortgaged us against huge loans. None of these things were ever done, or even contemplated, and all work has been funded from accumulated consolidated revenue.

And how was that possible? Well I'll tell you! About ten years ago NSW elected a quiet unassuming man by the name of Bill Jones to the National Executive. Although Mr Jones's credentials indicate that he is an industrial chemist, he obviously missed his calling and should have been a New York Investment Banker. Within a very short space of time he became frustrated with ACTA's financial reserves and management and worked his way into becoming Chairman of the Finance Committee.

During the intervening ten years he has revolutionised the ACTA's finances to the point where not only was no money ever borrowed for the National Ground project, but he has taken the nett worth of the ACTA, of less than half a million dollars, after correction of asset values (which was the result of more than 50 years of trading) and almost trebled it to the approximately 1 1/4 million dollars that shows on the bottom of our balance sheet today. Thank you Bill.

Future development? The sky is the limit. Projects currently on the drawing board are the sealing of our access road and the car park and further redevelopment of the recently revamped camping sites. The existing ten shooting grounds are to be rebuilt and standardised and an additional ten layouts added on the western end, accessed by a bridge over the main drain, which is currently our natural boundary. These improvements alone will make Wagga not only a show piece for the ACTA, but also the biggest and best Clay Target Shooting facility in the Southern hemisphere.

project currently being planned is the establishment of permanent purpose-built trade display buildings, similar to those utilised at the World Skeet Championships and The Grand American Trapshoot. A new and bigger clubhouse is being considered, along with ISSF facilities and on-site cabin style accommodation. Even such things as a swimming pool, tennis courts, golf driving range and child minding facilities are not out of the question. If shooters continue to vote with their feet and support Wagga, nothing is impossible. So take the time to contact Bill Jones or Andy Sanders or John Byrnes or your local Executive member and give them your thoughts on how and where your National Ground should be heading in order to meet your needs and expectations

Well known Cowra shooter, Peter Mould is going to attempt a marathon DTL shoot at the Cowra Gun Club on April 6th 2002.

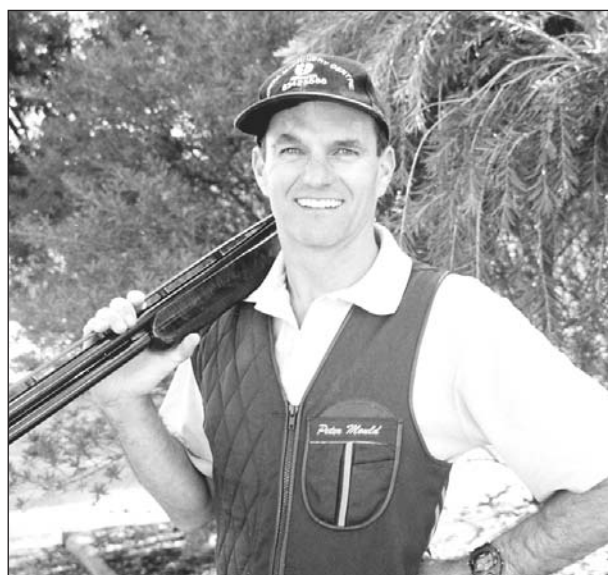

Gordon Morrison (1941 - 2002)

More than 400 people attended Gordon's funeral service. A small extract from the clubs tribute to Gordon follows.

Gordon first came to our Club in the early 1980's, some 20 years ago. Initially, his involvement was in a sponsorship support role through the Morrison Motors business. This, subsequently turned into many years as an active participant, sponsor and supporter, after Gordon joined the ACTA in 1987.

Gordon was identifiable without difficulty, no matter what the weather. Rain, hail or the occasional Mount Gambier sunshine, his shooting attire consisted of his favourite blue Mount Gambier Gun Club shooting shirt & grey shorts.

Gordon was not just a member of the Mount Gambier Gun Club, he was an active member. He took an active role in club matters, and whilst not part of the management committee, he was always there.

Gordon was a conscientious contributor and reliable member, often inquiring as to how he could help. It was as a result of one such inquiry that led him to be appointed custodian of the Club's BBQ. His culinary skills fed shooters month in month out for many years and will be greatly missed.

Saddened deeply by his untimely departure, Gordon has left each of us with many vivid and happy memories of his achievements at and for our Club, and above all else, those of a true sportsman, a dedicated and active club member, and a great and unselfish mate.

Round 1 Vic South East Zone Teams Events

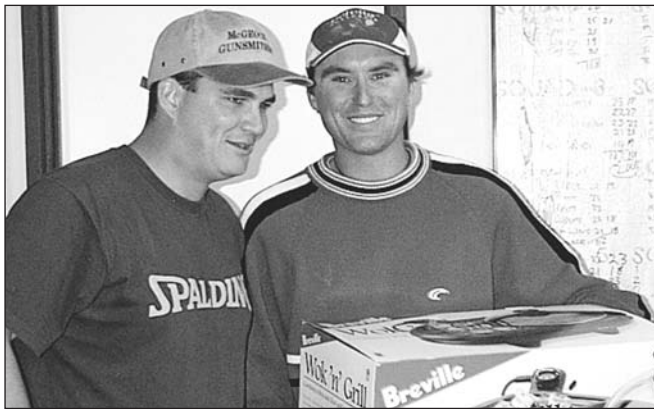

We all look forward to the next round on April 20 at Morwell, maybe the home ground advantage will get Morwell over the line.

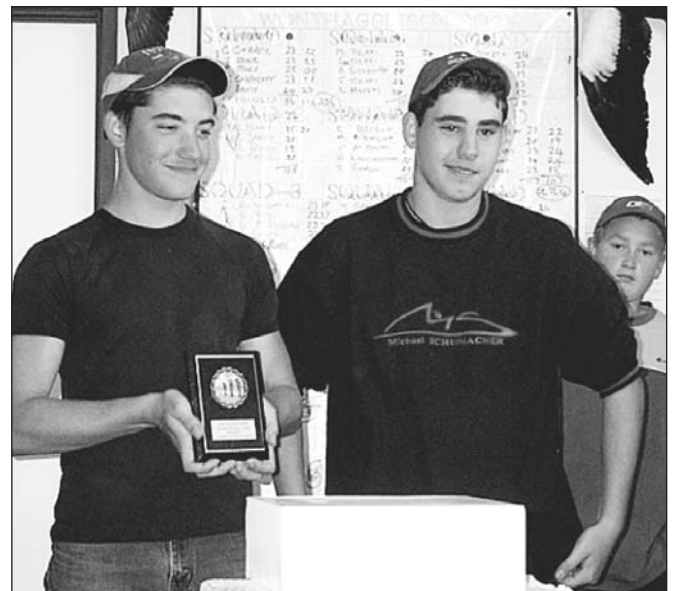

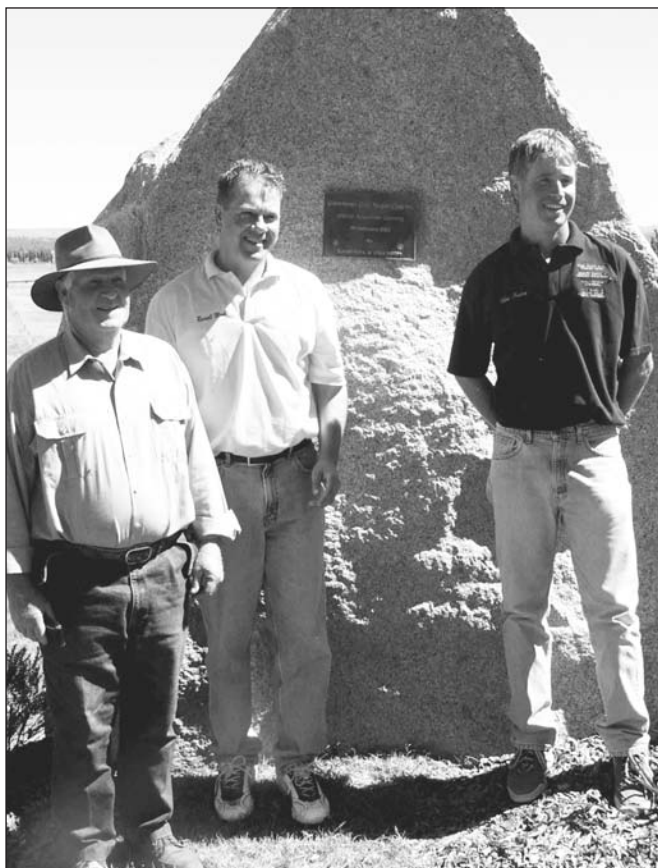

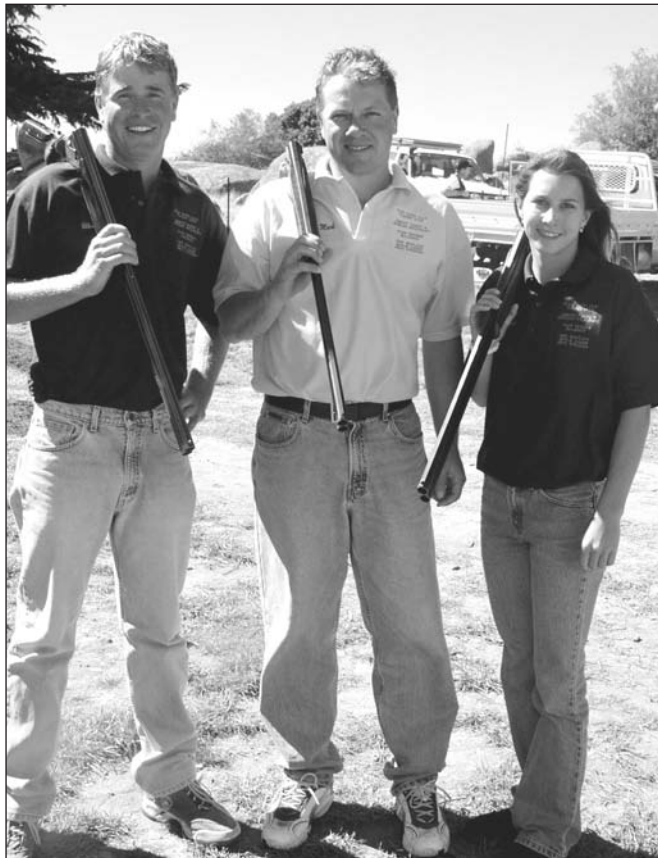
In Sunday's Pointscore event (sponsored by Kings Fuel Supply). Russell Mark was level on 149 out of 150 with Geoff Lancaster

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts and maximum fine of \$5,500.

Conducting Open Shoots

By Tim Catling, WA

General Comments:

Many clubs create problems for themselves by blindly having the President, Captain, etc do the important jobs at the Open Weekend.

If the main office bearers are inexperienced, then there is nothing wrong with them becoming assistants to others, to make sure the club's big events runs well. They will also be able to learn for next year. We practice to learn to shoot, so practice to learn to run the bigger events. Therefore club shoots should be used as the practice ground for the annual open weekend.

Club shoots should be run in a business like manner. This can be achieved without the members feeling that they are unduly pressured.

Check that:

1. Club shoots start on time
2. That the rules are always followed, etc

It is important to have a meeting or two to plan your open weekend. Include as many members as possible, so they feel needed and part of the organisation. Issue a work sheet to all members, so there are no misunderstandings as to the jobs allocated.

Try to have the presentations done each day. This will achieve two main things:

1. The shooters who have won trophies will be present.
2. The presentations will not take so long.

Also consider the idea of having only the overall winner make a speech, on behalf of everyone in each event. This will shorten the presentations and is of advantage, particularly, if you are going to have the presentations at the end of the two days.

Tournament Director:

The club needs an experienced person here. This persons duties are to see that all other personnel are doing their jobs properly.

In the heat of the moment, it is easy to overlook something, so by having a Tournament Director just wandering about checking on proceedings is most important. He will be able to pick up the little forgotten things that will turn an average shoot into a really great event and that is what brings shooters back next year.

Shoot Marshall:

This person needs to be experienced and to have one or two assistants, so they can learn for future years. The Shoot Marshall is there to see that the rules are followed and that every shooter gets a "fair deal".

Nothing will destroy your credibility faster than to be seen to favour a top shot or friend. Try hard to be respected for a job well done, forget about being everyone's friend. The following check list should be adhered to.

1. Outline the day's program.
2. Make sure that the score sheets are out at the layouts, much time is wasted by having to go and look for score sheets.
3. Boards indicating squad shooting and next to shoot, must be kept up to date. This will make the shoot run smoothly and also strengthens the shoot Marshall's position if he has to deal with latecomers.
4. Never have a Trap idle. This advice should be adhered to. Don't be afraid to move a squad to another layout to speed things up.
5. Shoot Marshall's should never:
 - a) Repair traps
 - b) Referee
 - c) Score
6. Never be afraid to change the colour of the targets if they will then be easier to see, particularly if the shoot off runs a bit late.
7. Make sure that the rules are followed at all times.
8. When announcing any shoot offs, clearly tell everyone what the shoot off is for. This adds interest to those who are

watching, which after all is the majority.

9. If possible run the shoot offs on the layout nearest the clubhouse, so that everybody can be involved.

Office:

The office needs to be a quiet area if possible. Keep the shooters out, as often the person wanting to know something is usually directed to some other official. These few points should help.

1. Make sure that the better shooters are squadded through the field, so as to have more even refereeing.
2. Referees are best picked out and highlighted on the score sheet. Having 1&2, 3&4&5&6 do the refereeing is not the best way to get consistent refereeing.
3. Re-squad for each day – shooters in general enjoy shooting in a new squad on the second day.
4. Writing up of handicap cards is a real chore, so an undisturbed area is a must.
5. Giving each shooter a number will help when updating the master sheet or High Gun board.

Trap Settings and Maintenance:

Again experience is needed here. If a trap breaks down then only two people are needed, ask the "hangers ons" to move away. Setting of targets should be kept to a minimum, making sure:

1. Target angles are equal each side of centre and from trap to trap
2. Targets set into the wind are often not set to allow properly for that wind. This guide will help:
 - a) Into a strong wind set to 42 – 43 metres
 - b) Average wind set to 44 – 45 metres
 - c) A light breeze set to 46 – 47 metres
 - d) Calm conditions set to 48 – 50 metres

Also be aware that some makes of traps warm up after about a squad and will throw targets a greater distance.

Winchester White Flyer traps are noted for this and can gain as much as 4 metres. Other makes are not as bad, but make sure you know the characteristics of the traps you are setting. Using the idea that "is OK, it's the same for everyone" is just a poor excuse for not having done the job properly in the first place.

Trying to get the targets set perfectly, will probably meant that they will be adequate.

Score Boards:

You need a person in charge that knows what is required regarding the events being shot and the shoot off that will be needed. His helpers can do most of the work but an overall controller is needed. Remember the score board is the hub of shooter interest and a neat colourful board is a great asset to your shoot. Use coloured chalks for"

1. H'Cap column
2. Each different event
3. Possibles

Make sure the scoreboard is updated quickly. If you have a very neat printer in the club, then use them.

Remember the score board will always be correct, because if a mistake is made, then someone will tell you about it.

Trappers:

These are important people.

Make sure they are trained in the job, so a day prior to the big event will be needed to show them what is required and to let them gain confidence. Make sure:

1. The targets are easy to reach; small trappers can have trouble here.
2. One trapper only in the trap at a time.
3. If the club has auto traps then the trapper should stay in the trap house for one squad and come out for one squad. That way the trap will always be full and a lot of time can be saved by the end of the day.

Frozen in Time

I am sitting in a club at the Sunshine Coast, from Hervey Bay it costs \$10 for the coach, morning tea, lunch and raffles. And the country western singer said something about frozen in time and I thought in my years on earth there has been several times I felt I have been to places that have been "Frozen in Time".

It was World War Two I was a scout and all the scout masters were away in the service. There were plans made for a forty mile hike, but with no scout masters it was put on hold. But as Easter came closer there was a dozen of us who decided we would still do this hike.

So on Thursday night on the old ten to seven we were off forty miles down the line, where we slept on the platform that night. No need to set an alarm as we woke to the sound of steam and brakes as the early goods train pulled up.

So getting a bit to eat it was pack up, study the map and get a compass reading and we were heading for Sugar Loaf Mountain. We were carrying a full size tent with our own supplies so it was not easy.

It was getting around lunch and we came out on a gravel road and to our surprise there was a truck coming down the road it was an old Fargo truck with canvas hood over from front to back, and it was the same as my father drove on his mail run.

So this fella stopped and got out, we had a drink out of his water bag, which he had under the side of his truck. So we showed him our map and asked if we were on the right course and he said 'I am going past where you spend your last night if you want to make it tonight instead of Sunday night.' So next thing we were in the back of this old truck and our forty mile hike was turned into a twenty mile ride.

So setting up camp along side a running stream we set about making our last meal with fresh food from here in it was flour, salt and tin food and as the daylight was going I said to the boys there is a house up the gully and that we will pay them a visit in the morning.

Next morning all fit and well into the creek for a skinny dip then dig up the damper we had put under the fire when we went to bed and a good piece of damper and jam. Then it was off to visit our

neighbors, ok it was the forties but this place went back to Captain Cook, no modern cons, the lights were kerosene and the phone was party line with about twenty people on the same line and your own private ring. These people had three rings as they explained.

Anyway they may not have had any modern cons but it wasn't long when the old lady bought a big tray of fresh hot scones with plenty of butter, jam and cream. And we took the ones that were left over back to the camp.

I think we made their day as the old fella went to the bedroom and bought out his sweeze box and played us music for about an hour while we ate his scones. On the way out the old lady said 'Dad catch the boys a couple of those chickens for their lunch.' So it didn't take us long to catch a couple of roosters.

So if any time you meet up with folk like that I would say they have been "Frozen in Time".

It is now after the war and the service men are returning and my family have left our home town and I am at a boarding house and at night I spend my time at the Greek Café where I cut my teeth on 12 gauge. I don't think people from any other country liked field shooting like the Greeks, we went fox shooting after closing the café, duck shooting before opening it the morning, we were shooting mad.

After shooting with these fellows for many years I was asked to go on a Sunday shoot with every Greek in the country. I always knew these shoots were high on the Greek shooting list but I though any non Greek wasn't able to attend and being a very good friend didn't bother to ask. In my years with my Greek mates I didn't try to learn any Greek as they never spoke Greek unless they had to, which sometimes seemed to get to the point quicker.

So the day of the big shoot came and about thirty miles along a gravel track we went off the road and another fifteen miles and way in the bush was the slab hut. The house was made of cedar slabs about eight foot high, eighteen inches wide and three inches thick. There was no power and smoke coming from the chimney. I didn't go in but the boys said they had nothing worth pinching. But every year from the year dot these fellows would meet here for a shoot. There were the best cars in Australia and the best of world guns, all side by side. I found out why they bought me, the back of a straight eight Buick was a bar and I was the barman.

But as I left this lovely couple in their slab hut, I think now that these people were "Frozen in Time".

Years were now going by and by now the café was sold, people move and I was now shooting with a doctor. As we left that Saturday afternoon to go shooting we were in his wagon with both dogs on board and he said I had some new people in to see me yesterday and we have a new place to shoot. So I said where is it and he said you know that place off? where we can't shoot, well it is the other side of the creek. So I knew the shooting was going to be good as we did shoot that area until it was sold to the bloke who didn't like shooters. But it was now in the late sixties and after driving to get around to this shooting spot we came off the main road and arrived at his house it was hard to tell the house from the barn. We were met by the old couple, her with a patched apron and him with his flannel shirt and patched can't tear 'em's. They in this time still didn't have power, just a Lister motor and a battery for a few lights. They had to crack corn by hand. Milk 60 cows by hand and separate cream from milk by hand. We had a good shoot and left them a couple of their own ducks and I can remember now I would have thought, they have been "Frozen in Time".

Instead of playing pokies, as I lost my cash at the shoot the yesterday, I have put pen to paper. It is now time to get ready to go home.

Good shooting to all till next time see you at the shoots.

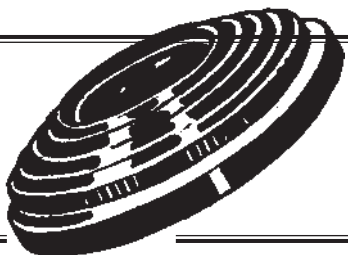

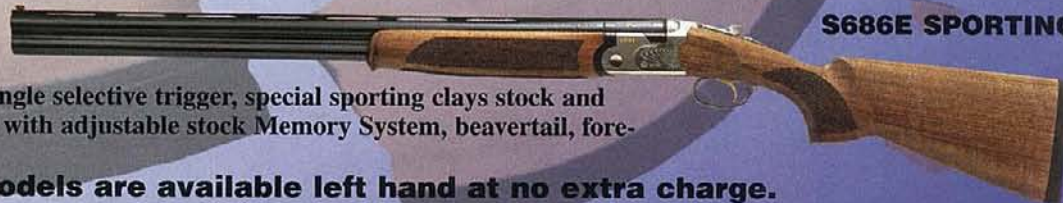
