

NT State Carnival

The NT State Carnival for Trap and Skeet will be held this month at Alice Springs. This carnival is always popular and well attended, so keep June 7 - 10th free.

N.S.W. STATE SKEET CARNIVAL 2002

With a positive acceptance of the changes implemented at last years State Skeet Carnival where a significant increase in attendance was recorded, the NSWCTA has retained last years program and structure.

The change of date certainly brought much better weather with two magnificent days and the third although not as good, scores were still excellent.

This weekend will be kept for 2002 and the Carnival will be held on Friday 23rd, Saturday 24th and Sunday 25th August at the National Shooting Ground Wagga.

All eight Skeet Layouts have been booked and can be used if required. A practice trap will be available this year as several requests were made last year to have this facility.

Other changes for this year will see the cost to enter the optional purse halved to \$10 overall and \$10 for the grade. Many shooters thought last years cost to be excessive. We were fortunate to have considerable sponsorship last year which allowed organisers to lower the event nominations, this has unfortunately reduced necessitating a slight increase in this years entry. The 50 target events will cost \$25 and the 100 target State Championship \$35. I am sure shooters will agree this still offers good value for money considering shooters have the chance to win a red sash, 65 medals, make State teams and compete for around 15 cases of shells, all for around the same entry charged at the monthly shoot at your local club and more than comparable with other State Carnivals.

The fifteen member team will be selected over the 100 target State Championship on the Saturday, plus the 50 target NSWCTA Championship on the Sunday morning. The shoulder to shoulder team will also use the 50 target Postal Team Competition making a total of 200 targets to select the 2002 team.

The Postal Team Competition for 15 member, plus Ladies, Juniors and Veterans will be shot between the 50 target NSWCTA Championship and the 25 pair State Skeet Doubles on the Sunday.

The High Gun will be over events 2, 3, 4 and 5.

Shooters will also need to note that nominations on both Saturday and Sunday will close at 10.00am sharp.

The NSWCTA hope the slight changes to the program will meet with shooters approval and look forward to increased numbers again this year. The ACTA will control the office and the NSWCTA will supply the tournament Director with Les Aberly and the Shoot Marshall with David Coleman.

2002 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Australian Clay Target Association National Trap Championships for 2002 were conducted again at the ACTA National Shooting ground in Wagga Wagga NSW. The championships ran from Tuesday April 2 to Sunday April 7 and Mother Nature turned on her very best weather with fine sunny days with only the occasional light breeze.

Prior to the Opening Ceremony, teams from all states and territory competed for the Australian Clay Target Association Cup presented to the winning state team in Open, Women's, Juniors and Veterans divisions.



Victoria successfully won the Open team event, being represented by Russell Mark (Capt.), Arthur Crawford, Stephen Atkins, Luca Scribani-Rossi and Roger Duthie with a score of 124/368. Two points down in second place were the team from Queensland with a score of 122/363. Third place went to New South Wales with a score of 122/361



The Ladies from Victoria were successful in winning the Women's Team event. The team lead by Simone Tigani with Lauryn Ogilvie and Sharlene Bertalli scored 73/212 with the team from New South Wales coming in second on a points decision with a score of 73/209. Third place was the team from South Australia with a score of 71/208

Victoria were successful in the Junior division with the team of Marcel Tigani, Daniel Dempsey and Travis Gull recording a one point down score of 74/217 some fine shooting from the Victorian Juniors. Second place went to the team from New South Wales



71/210, with the team from Queensland in third place with a score of 70/202.



Victoria was also successful in the Veterans teams event with a score of 72/208. Alan Blease led his team of Richard Caleo and Norman Hinneberg to victory over New South Wales 68/196. Third place went to the Queensland team on a score of 67/189

This win gave Victoria a clean sweep of all the Shoulder to Shoulder matches.

Our resident piper, Mr. Bob Scott, then lead all the state teams in the traditional march past the crowd. 53RD GRAND AUSTRALIAN HANDICAP

The first event for the 2002 Nationals attracted some three hundred and sixty eight competitors including nine from New Zealand and one from the USA. At the end of the 50tgts twenty possibles shot off for the Royal Blue Sash, Silver Australia Badge and the Gordon Hall Perpetual Trophy. After the dust settled Lars Bager from West Australian Gun Club was the victor with a score of 132/132.

Olin Australia Winchester Division proudly sponsored this event



Ross Walsh, Cairns Qld, 471/472 was overall second and Mark Crevatin, Echuca VIC, was overall third with 344/345.



Forty-three keen shooters took to the fields for the Veterans National Single Barrel Championship. After the dust had settled two veterans were left on equal score. After a brief shoot-off Kevin Heywood from the Narromine club in NSW, with a score of 60/62 was victorious over Jeff Nash from the Canowindra club in NSW with a score of 59/62. The weather was again turned on for what would be the last day of qualifying for the Mackintosh Team, the Points Score Championship is always full of interest and four hundred and seven competitors which included eleven from New Zealand and one from the USA, had nominated to try their luck. CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS June 2002

Well, that's the Trap Nationals over again for another year. They say time flies when you're having fun, and that must be the case, as it seems like only a couple of days ago, when I was packing up getting ready to go to Wagga. Actually, on the Thursday night prior to leaving, during the course of loading the car, I caught myself humming and smiling and suddenly realised that, like Big Kev, I was excited about going. You'd reckon after about thirty years or so it would wear off, wouldn't you? Especially when, like the majority of you, I am not one of the twenty or thirty people with a realistic chance of winning one of the events.

So, like the bulk of the people, I look forward to going for other reasons. Reasons like getting away from home and work for a week, to a vacation type lifestyle. An environment where you stay in a motel and someone else cleans up after you and makes your bed, and where you eat out all day long and someone else washes the dishes afterwards. And at the Gun Club you get to socialise with good friends that you only see once or twice a year. You also get to see the largest trade display that gets assembled anywhere during the year, and then in the evenings you get to watch the very best shooters our country has to offer, put on a free shooting exhibition for your enjoyment.

Having said that, when you read the Nationals write-up, you'll find that on the last day I validated another great old saying. The one that goes something like: "Even a blind hog finds some acorns". Then again, maybe this was something other than just a twist of luck. Perhaps Poetic Justice and Fate had decided to drop in on Wagga this year. Because as I walked out onto precisely the same field, at exactly the same Gun Club, to shoot off against the same number of people, on exactly the same score as I had done eighteen years before, I could almost hear that haunting music from The Twilight Zone and I suspected that a time-warp was about to turn full circle and finally close.

Anyway, by winning the Double Rise I proved once again that anything is possible, provided you're prepared to get off your butt, go along, put up your money and have a go. Unfortunately, this is a point that is lost on a lot of people. When I hear shooters saying things like: "I'm not going to the Nationals because I'm not good enough", or "I haven't been shooting well lately", or "there are too many good shooters there for me", I often wonder what they could have done, or might have achieved, if they had been prepared to make the effort and go, but now will never know.

Why? Because the Big Guns don't always win. Sometimes a Little Gun will temporarily expand and run off with the prize. Look back through the previous winners lists and you will see what I mean. Nearly everyone agrees that just about anyone can win the Handicap, but what they don't realise, is that it doesn't stop there. Admittedly the Champion of Champions and the Double Barrel are usually won by the Big Guns, due to the difficulty and length of those events, but even that is not set in concrete. Just ask Brett Dunstan, who lost the Double Barrel shoot-off one year to a very happy C grade shooter.

However, the Single Barrel, Pointscore and Double Rise are different matters altogether. All that is sometimes required to win those events is a little luck for about half an hour during qualifying and perhaps just a handful more targets in the shoot-off. So it's theoretically possible for nearly anyone to go from zero to hero in the space of one day. And trust me, that will be one day in your life that you will not forget, even if you never come "even vaguely close" again. Take for instance the first year I won an event at the Nationals: Melbourne, 1981.

Sure, Trevor Byrne, Jon Whittakers and Ken Lowry won the Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Champion of Champions. But what sort of odds could you have gotten the night before, against me winning the Skeet, or Bennie Scotta shooting nine more targets in the shoot-off to win the Pointscore, or Adrian O'Connell winning the Double Rise outright with 46? Pretty big ones I'm sure. So the next time any of you decide not to go to the Nationals, think about that, because wouldn't it be a terrible shame to have someone else wandering around wearing your Silver Australia Badge.

Anyway, back to this year's Shoot. Reflecting on the week, I am reminded of Jack Nicholson's famous question: "What if this is as good as it gets?" And it could well be! The whole nine days went off almost like clockwork. I hardly heard a grumble all week long about anything at all. To start with, the weather was absolutely brilliant. Eight of the nine days were blue sky, calm and about 20 degrees, and the other was quite a pleasant day that was a little breezy. Even in autumn, which is traditionally the most weather stable period in south eastern Australia, and even in an inland city, far removed from coastal instability, I am still amazed that we can continue to get such great weather for the Nationals.

The attendance was about on par with last year, which surprised me. I was worried that with the constant decline in shooting generally, due to the government and the media hammering us from every conceivable angle, the clash with Easter and the proximity of the World DTL Championships in New Zealand, we may have fallen off by 40 or 50 shooters. But not so! Nearly every event had about the same number of entrants as last year. This could in part have been attributable to the increase in the camping facilities, which I hope will expand again even further before next year. To a lot of people on a limited budget, the difference between less than a hundred dollars for a campsite, and around a thousand dollars for a Motel room, combined with the additional savings associated with the ability to do their own cooking, can mean the difference between being able to afford to go or not.

The targets were absolutely spectacular, both in their quality and their presentation. Fred and Josso had performed some creative and much needed modifications to the mounting systems in the traphouses, during the weeks leading up to the Carnival. This allowed Ludwig's now famous Geminis to be able to function flawlessly all week long, and present "shootable" targets, regardless of wind direction or strength. And this was clearly assisted by Olimpyc, who supplied us with one of the best batches of black targets, regardless of brand, that I have seen for a very long time. Practically no breakage in transit, combined with no buckling, warping or sticking together, and a mixture strength that was almost perfect, meant a constant stream of "smokable" targets and very few perforated pick-ups. Even one pellet skidding across the top of a target was creating puffs of dust and occasionally a discernable piece.

Both major advertised changes to the program format seemed popular and worked well. Many people commented on the practicality of containing the entire program into one working week. And the movement of the Champion of Champions from the last event to the second, meant that not only were the non 15 meter events tidied up before the common mark events started, but this also eliminated one full trap setting change. Ever since I took over the Shoot Marshalling at the Trap Nationals, I've toyed with the idea of conducting the McIntosh Team Shoot on the afternoon of the Pointscore day, rather than the next morning before the Double Rise. This year we trialled it and I doubt if we'll ever change back.

Not only did it allow us to conduct the Team Shoot while the shooters were "hot to trot", but it provided the double benefit of being able to start the Double Rise earlier and eliminate the time loss of a full trap setting change during the day, as the only full change now required could be done in conjunction with the normal early morning trap setting routine. And as this day has now become the final one, due to the shift of the Champion of Champions event, it also meant a previously unheard of early finish on the last day, allowing all the travellers to get on the road before dark. I'm sure that many people saw this as the icing on the cake of an already great week.

This year also saw the start of a brand new event. The National Deauville Doubles Championship. The "family" Deauville Doubles has been going for over 20 years and is extremely popular with all those people eligible to enter. However, there has been a mounting groundswell over many years to conduct a similar event that is open to all comers. After the 2000 program reshuffle, to accommodate the official opening of our National Office, allowed the Commonwealth Deauville Doubles to be conducted at the Nationals that year, I always thought that it would only be a matter of time before this came to pass.

The family Deauville Doubles has now been moved to the new timeslot of the second day of the pre-Nationals, following the pre-National Double Rise, and the new event has taken it's place on National Double Rise day. As most of the qualifying for this event is able to be done while the National Double Rise is being shot, it does not add much extra time to the day, but certainly adds a lot of extra fun and excitement. I put my money on those two old warhorses, Billy Iles and Jon Whittakers. Fortunately I took them as an each-way bet, as although they didn't win, they at least finished on the dais. When the dust finally settled, Lynne Curtis was able to trump Russell Mark's quote of "I'm the best partner saver" by quietly adding "Yes, but I'm the best partner picker".

During the entire week I can only recall two incidents that I would have to describe as lowlights. The first was the oversight (read stuff-up) made by the Shoot Marshall during the Handicap shootoff, early in the week. For this I can only humbly apologise to those people who were affected by it and promise to try not to ever let it happen again, as although I may not be perfect, I at least try to learn from my mistakes. The second was the fact that a very good party and barbeque on Friday night was terminated early and thus partially spoiled by a lack of any musical entertainment. To the various ladies who brought this to my attention, I can assure you that I will speak with Bill Jones about getting at least a jukebox for next year.



Day 2 dawned and all were hoping the temperatures would be cooler, but alas the weather man informed us we were in for another scorcher, just what you need when you have mixed targets




