Graham Thomas Michell 7/3/1943 to 26/4/2002

It is with great sadness that I report the sudden death by heart attack of well-known shooter and administrator Graham Michell. I am sure all shooters around Australia will join with me in expressing our sympathy to Ruth and his 2 daughters Joanne and Sharon.

Graham was a tireless worker for the sport of clay target shooting. He started shooting in 1982 at the Monarto Gun Club in South Australia. He quickly became involved in the administration of the sport and became South Australian President in 1990 and also an Executive member of the Australian Clay Target Association in the same year. In 1994 he became chairman of the shooting committee and for the last 8 years his efforts with our ISSF shooting teams, junior development and training camps is well known. Graham was recently elected Vice President of the Australian Shooting Association and was also delegate to the Commonwealth Shooting Federation.

As President of the ACTA I probably know better than most the hours of work and dedication that Graham gave to the sport of clay target shooting. He would spend hours on the phone discussing aspects of the sport and planning team selection, etc. The many weeks each year that he gave up to support the sport was probably not appreciated by most. It was fitting that he was awarded the Australian Sports Medal in 2000 for his outstanding contribution to the sport of clay target shooting.

Graham will be a great loss to the sport and it will be very difficult to find administrators who will be able to dedicate the time and energy to the sport that he did. Thanks Graham for all that you did.

To Ruth and all members of the family, our thoughts are with you and rest assured his contribution to our sport will be long remembered.

GRAHAM THOMAS MICHELL 7th March, 1943 - 26th April, 2002

Graham was a legend!

So many times over the past few days these words have been spoken by those who knew him. The definition of the word legend can mean the story of the life of a saint or a person who achieves legendary fame in their own life time, so let us look back to see just how this man has touched so many lives through his actions.

Graham was born to parents Thomas and Marjory Michell in Melbourne on the 7th March, 1943 and the family moved back to South Australia when he was just 3 years of age and they lived at Largs Bay - Port Adelaide territory. Graham's early days were spent growing up with an extended family of many loving uncles, aunties and cousins who all enjoyed camping weekends away together. He attended the LeFevre Boys Technical High School where he excelled in the sports of swimming, football and rowing. His boyhood was brought to a sudden end with the death of his father and Graham, at the age of 16, found himself out in the workforce helping to support his family. His first job was as an apprentice fitter and turner but he gave that away as soon as he was able to get a heavy haulage licence, driving fuel tankers for the Shell Company of Australia and this took him to such far away places as Ceduna and out along the Strezlecki Track.

Graham had a passion for motor bikes and he became involved not only with scramble dirt track riding but also speedway and in 1963 he won the Australian Short Circuit Motor Cycle Dirt Track Championship in Melbourne. It was at the Murray Bridge Speedway in 1965 that Graham met the love of his life - the girl in the office who kept the placings of each race - this girl stole his heart. It was Ruth! The boy in the black leathers on the motor bike soon lost his nerve at being really daring and rather than keeping his mind on his racing he soon earned the nickname of Autumn Leaves, falling many times from his bike, and his mates believed it was because it gave him the excuse to ride back in the ambulance up to the sick bay, which was situated right next door to the office.

Their first date was disastrous. Graham, on helping his best friend Peter on his dairy, drove down to the swamp to get the cows. Somehow his car slid in the mud and he ended up in the irrigation channel - unable to remove his car in time following milking, he ended up borrowing his mate's 'farm ute' and any body who owns one will know what they can be like. As he was now running very late he found himself speeding along Swanport Road, right outside this church, when the Police spotted him. They gave chase and Graham thinking he would give them the slip, shot down a side street but it was a 'one-way' street and he was the one who was going the wrong way. He was caught, fined and subsequently lost his licence for a fortnight. However, on his arrival at Ruth's parent's farm he was given the big look of disapproval by Ruth's father who later said "I don't approve of this fellow, he rides motor bikes and doesn't appear to even own a car so just what prospects has a fellow like this got?" To cut a long story short, they were married in the Lutheran Church at Monarto on the 5th August, 1967 and this was the beginning of their life together.

Graham continued driving trucks until 1970 when he took on a new job at the Kanmantoo Copper Mine (a division of Broken Hill South Mining Company) which had just been re-opened. He worked there for 5 years starting out as a grader driver and working his way up to the Blasting and Drilling Supervisor. When the mine ceased operating his career path took him back to trucking. He went into business for himself buying his first truck - a Kenworth of course! For the past 28 years he has notched up mil-

lions of kilometres on Australia's highways. For some 8 of those years he contract carted all of the glasshouse produce grown here in Murray Bridge to the Melbourne Markets and one day in particular 11 semi-trailers left this town laden with cucumbers and tomatoes. In recent years Graham's cartage mostly consisted of bulk grain. Another story related to Ruth on the phone was by the young farmer from Lameroo whose grain Graham had carried. He had heard of Graham's passing just before he went out onto the football field and he was shattered. He decided then and there to dedicate his match to Graham and his team not only won the match but he was named best player as well. Ruth was pleased to hear this as it showed just what an influence Graham had on people's lives - not only in the shooting sports.

He was very particular about his appearance, never leaving the house, even when going out to drive the truck, without getting Ruth to check the back of his head to make sure that not a hair was out of place. They often wondered just how he coped when he was away from home. In fact he was known as the 'gentleman truckie' - always dressed neatly in his bone coloured trousers, starched shirts and polished boots - not the usual attire associated with truck drivers.

Following a bad car accident in 1980, where Graham was an innocent passenger, he lost interest in life and although he continued with his business he became depressed and to aid his flagging spirits he was invited, by a friend, to attend the opening of the new Monarto Clay Target Range in 1982. He was instantly attracted to this sport as it was one that could be enjoyed by men, women and children with ages ranging from early teens to the 80's. Graham joined the Club after just one visit, Ruth just a couple of months later and they both spent many happy times at neighbouring Clubs.

It was not long before Graham progressed up the ladder - first as a Committee person and then on to becoming Club President. Over the next couple of years his administrative qualities became evident and he went from being Club Delegate to Zone Delegate and eventually became State President, a position he held since 1990. In that same year he was elected as the State Delegate onto the Australian Clay Target Association's National Executive and once on this body he showed his real talents.

His mother once said, "You are a dreamer and that's all you'll ever be". How wrong she was. Yes, he did dream - as he drove in his truck he had time to visualize how he could help the sport that he loved. He achieved many things over the past 8 years in his role as Chairman of the Shooting Committee, focusing his attentions on the Olympic disciplines. He managed to get a Junior Development Programme up and running where the Juniors were encouraged to take up the Olympic discipline shooting and he also encouraged the girls/women to do the same. Training camps, National titles and eliminations then allowed these shooters to attend World Cups and the World Championships along with the Australian Open Team made up of men. He can also be credited with being the person responsible (after much pushing of all the Commonwealth countries) for the inclusion of women's events at the Commonwealth Games - the first time ever will be at the Games being held in Manchester this year. In his role as Australian Team Manager, Graham had the opportunity to accompany the shooters to both World Cups and World Championships all around the world and just some of the countries he visited were, Peru, Germany, Finland, Egypt, Italy, Cyprus, New Zealand, England, Brunei, Korea, India, Qatar and Hungary.

Some of the many positions he was holding at the time of his death included:

State President

Management Committee - Australian Clay Target Association

Delegate to the Australian Shooting Association

Vice President of the Australian Shooting Association Delegate to the Commonwealth Shooting Federation Chairman, Shooting Committee - Australian Clay Target Association

Australian Level 1 Coach Australian ISSF Referee Australian Trap and Skeet Referee Australian Referee Examiner ISSF 'A' Grade Judge

He was awarded an Australian Sports Medal, specially struck in the Year 2000, for his contribution to clay target shooting.

In a letter received by Ruth from Bill Murray, ex High Performance Manager with the Australian Sports Commission and now living in Germany, Bill described Graham as "Being a tireless worker for the sport and that he was unique amongst his contemporaries". From his point of view, "without Graham's driving force and support at crucial moments, the Australian Clay Target team successes in Sydney and Atlanta, and the many successes they enjoyed in between, would never have happened".

Graham gave his time voluntarily to his sport and as stated by one of the shooters to Ruth on the phone, "I thank you for the time you allowed Graham to spend time away with us when he probably should have been spending time at home with you and your family".

Graham had many loves - the first one being Ruth. A story related to her the other night by one of the Australian Team members, Ben Kelly, was that when he heard the news of Graham's death, his first memory (which he felt impelled to ring and tell her) was of their trip to Bisley, England last year to the Commonwealth Shooting Federation Championships. Graham was driving the mini-bus along a particular road on the way to the shooting ground when Ben and Rocky were seen in the rear view mirror by Graham to be hanging out of the back windows, waving to all of the girls. Graham commented, "Listen boys, when you find a girl as good looking as mine, you'll stop all of this nonsense!" On special occasions he always bought for her no less than 3 cards because he couldn't decide just which one to give her - 2 he would give from himself and he would give one from the family pets - the dog, the cats and the birds. His favourite flowers were proteas and banksias and he could never pass a florist shop without stopping to buy her some and many a bunch jolted about in the truck on the way home from Ballarat, for there was a florist right there on his route home from Melbourne.

Graham loved his two daughters, Joanne and Sharon and welcomed into the family both David and Darren, and his life was then further enriched with the birth of his 3 little grandsons, Lachlan, Patrick and Angus and he had the recent joyful news of each daughter telling him that he was to be a papa again later on in the year. He missed his family greatly while on his overseas trips and he loved to play 'Father Christmas' each time he came home, his case laden with presents, and then watching everyone as they opened up their treasures.

He loved seafood, fried tomatoes, home-made chicken noodle soup, roast pork, fig jam and snow balls and he was a dedicated reader of many books - he could get through a new Wilbur Smith in about 3 days. He disliked capsicum and zucchini, swearing in front of women, and people who did not put in 100% into what they were doing - if it was worth doing, it was worth doing properly.

Other than his immediate family, Graham will be sadly missed by his only surviving brother, Philip.

Graham's ambitions in life were to find someone to love, have his own home and to see his children grow up and be married - the grandchildren were a bonus. He achieved all these things and much, much more.

Graham was a good man - what more is there to say!

principally be missed by Ruth his wife, and his immediate and extended family, but he will also be missed by his friends and fellow members at the Monarto-Alexandra Clay Target Club, the South Australian Clay Target Association, the Australian Clay Target Association and the broader shooting fraternity. Just how badly missed is yet to be realized.

Graham became a member of the Club immediately after it opened in 1982 and was soon on the committee or served as President and/or Secretary ever since. In fact, it could be said that he was central to the operation of the Club for many successful years.

The respect with which Graham was held is evidenced by his very large funeral, at which many well known shooting personalities were present. Australia's Green and Gold blazers were everywhere, forming a guard of honour, and members of the Australian Olympic Shooting Team were his pall bearers.

Graham was laid in his final resting place to the sound of bagpipes, the engines and horns of his much loved Kenworth trucks, and finally to a volley of shotgun fire, fired by Michael Diamond. A fitting finale for a man of Graham's ilk.

There are no words that are adequate to thank Graham for his huge contribution to the clay target shooting sports.



MS AWARNESS SHOOT VERY SUCCESSFUL

Local gun club member Peter Mould, who also suffers from MS, shot at targets for a period of twelve hours on Saturday 6th April at the local Gun Club range.



The object of the day was to raise awareness of the disease MS. This disease affects the central nervous system of the body and displays a range of symptoms. The disease can affect people in different ways. The most common symptoms are a disabled walking gait or temporary eyesight problems.

During the day Peter shot at 750 targets only missing 16 of them. He shot from a distance of 15 metres and was as accurate during the final stages as he was at the beginning. Many local and visiting shooters joined Peter during the day to help pace him. Although tired by the end of the marathon shoot Peter was pleased with the support shown to him over such a long period. He was especially grateful to the local club members who made such an effort to keep him on track and who handled the logistics of the day.

IMPORTANCE OF THE FUNDAMENTALS

No one likes to talk about new products designed to improve shooting skills more than trapshooters do. There are always new products and new theories coming out that hold the promise of better scores for all of us. While it's fun to talk about the technical drivel and new gadgets available for improving everyone's trapshooting skills, all too often, a shooter gets it into his head that if he just stumbles on the right combination of little things to tweak his equipment with, he'll magically become the great shooter that he is sure is inside him, just waiting to be discovered.

In most cases, this isn't what brings out that great shooter. It may be possible that some of the small, technical things will add to a shooter's ability to be consistent and break a better score on a regular basis, but they shouldn't be depended on to produce the results most shooters would like. The best way to reach the level a shooter can realistically expect from himself is to begin with the fundamentals.

While working on the fundamentals and perfecting their application of same, shooters will find that there are some items which will help them achieve that perfect application of those fundamentals. For example, shooting glasses will aid the eyesight or protect the eyes from harsh sunlight or debris that may be present while shooting. An adjustable stock will help a shooter get the proper fit with his gun so that he is comfortable with it and it shoots where he is looking. But no matter whether the eyes are working perfectly and the gun fit is superb, if the fundamentals of trapshooting aren't applied properly, neither of these will be of much benefit to a shooter's scores. Combined with proper fundamentals and technique, shooting glasses and an adjustable stock can be invaluable.

These are the types of things that shooters come to realize while "paying their dues" in their early years of trapshooting. They will discover other helpful items to incorporate into their game, but none of these should be considered the key to success; they only help each shooter achieve a better or easier way to apply those fundamentals.

Think back, if you will, on all the trapshooting-related items you've bought, used, and either sold or just abandoned over the years and you'll understand that it wasn't any of these items that accounted for your success. Some of these items may have been helpful, but only to the extent that they helped you in your application of sound fundamentals.

At one time, I didn't think I could possibly shoot without wearing a shooting vest. I was convinced that if I didn't have my vest and shot anyway, I would surely arrive back home with my right arm in a sling and blood gushing from my poor, tender shoulder. That was, I was convinced until I went to a shoot and forgot my vest. I shot in a T-shirt and was none the worse for wear. I found it to be more comfortable for me and have been shooting in shirts ever since.

The point to be made here is to caution you against thinking that there is some trivial piece of equipment out there somewhere that will "enlighten" you and turn you into a trapshooting terror. That equipment may be helpful, but only if it assists you in your application of the fundamentals.

Now that we've established how I feel about fundamentals, future articles will offer suggestions and insights on how to apply those fundamentals to improving your skills on the trapline.



CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS July 2002

Part of my charter to write a column for our magazine is to occasionally address controversial and/or provocative subjects. The consensus of opinion seems to be that there is probably no better way to get the ball rolling on these types of issues, than to 'take the bull by the horns' and start out with me airing my biased and slanted viewpoint of them in the CTSN and see where that leads us. This month I intend to take up a perennial favourite and a prime candidate for the type of debate that I try to precipitate with these articles. It is a problem that has been around as long as the ACTA itself, as it is a problem that was created by the people who decided how our organization would be formed and constituted. The issue is non-proportional representation.

When a governing body such as ours is originally created, one of the initial formative decisions to be made is whether or not the total area to be managed, in our case the whole country of Australia, should be broken down into pockets or sub-areas, for ease of administration. Once that decision has been made, and in our case it was to do so, then the next decision is how to draw the boundaries for these sub-areas. The three obvious alternatives are political, geographic or population oriented.

Population oriented makes the most sense as, by definition, it circumvents the problem we are addressing. Bearing in mind the anticipated membership of the organization (being around 10,000) and estimating the number of councillors you see as feasible for a board of management (say 10 or a dozen), you could then either break the country up into four arbitrarily drawn pockets of about 2500 members apiece, from which you would elect three councillors per area, or maybe five pockets of 2000 members with two councillors each, or even ten divisions with one elected representative per sub-area.

If you decide to go geographic, then you draw the boundaries along or between naturally existing features such as mountain ranges, rivers or deserts. However, in deciding where to draw those geographic boundaries, you would still bear in mind an outcome which gave you approximately even divisions of membership numbers, so that a fixed number of elected councillors per area would give you approximately equal member representation. If you didn't or couldn't arrange these boundaries to provide similar population per area, then in order to provide democratic equality, you would need to constitute some form of pro-rata representation.

The third option is to use existing political boundaries. Thus if you were forming a European organization, you would probably divide the continent up into countries, using national borders as the boundaries. However, as Australia comprises only one country, the obvious political divisions are the state boundaries. With political boundaries it is extremely unlikely that you will achieve even approximately equal population division and therefore some system of proportional representation is imperative if you are to achieve democratic equality.

This fundamental point seems to have been lost on the originators of the ACTA, as they went ahead and drew up political boundaries, dividing the country up into six states and the Northern Territory. But then instead of establishing a formula to apply to these divisions of widely differing population, to attain some semblance of proportional representation, they simply allocated two councillors per 'state', to form a lopsided administrative committee comprising fourteen people.

Although far removed from the basic principles of democratic government, such a system could theoretically work in an ideal world if all of the elected councillors were able to put State interests aside and make Nationally focussed decisions at all times during their term in office. Unfortunately this is not an ideal world that we live in and from my perspective it appears that our National administration has progressed in fits and starts of both impartial and parochial management.

To give credit where it is due, I believe that the current administration, along with those of the immediate past, are and have been about as fair and astute Nationally as any governing body derived in this manner could possibly be. However, that has not always been the case. When I first started to become politically aware of the administrative workings of the ACTA and struggled to understand the vast implications of the motivations and processes that occurred behind the scenes, it seemed to me that common sense, justice and fair play were on vacation.

At that time, somehow or another, we had degenerated into a situation where the four less populated states seemed to have formed an unofficial alliance and voted as a block against the three most populous states on any issues that didn't suit them. I remember being particularly angry and frustrated on several occasions when important matters couldn't get approved for this reason. A couple of good National Ground proposals, including one in Canberra promoted by Jimmy Ellis, lapsed around that time and I'm sure that this ludicrous situation played a significant part in that.

It was clearly a case of the tail wagging the dog and when any of the proponents of the system were questioned on it, their justification was that if they didn't stick together, the three bigger states would steamroll them. Whether or not that would have been the case remains to be seen, but what is clear is that even if it were, blocking a potential moral injustice by perpetrating an immoral injustice isn't the answer either. What this dilemma clearly illustrated was the undesirability of non-proportional representation, because 25% of the people just should not be able to outvote the other 75% no matter what. And anyone can see that there is something wrong with a system that puts almost 30% of the voting power in the hands of less than 5% of the people.

The last straw for me was when a fairly serious issue was being blocked in this way and the three larger states decided to push very hard to get it through. When one of the smaller states showed signs of crumbling under the weight of common sense and public opinion, to deflect the thin end of the wedge and shore up the alliance, one of the other members of the 'power block' threatened to secede from the ACTA if the vote went against them. The implication here was that the ACTA would lose its National body representation status and thus possibly its access to government funding. Accordingly the three bigger states backed away and I lost whatever respect I still had for the credibility of the governing body of our sport. From that point until when I relocated to the United States in the late eighties, I lost all faith in ACTA politics.

However, upon returning from the US in 1994, I learned that a major culture change had occurred during the intervening period, to the point where a recent proportional representation vote, which seemed destined to succeed, had only failed when my own State Association had jumped ship at the last minute in exchange for other political trade-offs. To say that I have crossed swords and exchanged harsh words with the VCTA and some of its constituent members over this issue would be an understatement and the matter remains a thorn in my side to this day.

Regardless of the fact that the current system of 'non-parochial integrity by virtue of the honour system' seems to be working OK at the moment, I still believe that we should make the constitutional changes necessary to achieve mandatory proportional representation. It's not a matter of whether or not an incorrect system

isn't malfunctioning at the moment. We need to be seen to have a democratic system of administration that reflects political equality. More importantly, we need to be rid of an imbalanced system where some of the smaller states, with only a couple of hundred total members, struggle to find two people who have the time and inclination to sit on the National Executive, while some of the larger states, with numerous capable and enthusiastic people, tear themselves apart with power struggles to attain those two positions. With such a system we all lose.

How would proportional representation work in practice? As I said before, you simply adopt a representation formula based on membership numbers and apply that to each State to calculate how many elected representative they are allocated. Various different organizations use various different systems. NSSA have a sliding scale, but that works better with numerous small states. I believe the best system for our needs would be: 'one representative per thousand shooters or part thereof'.

Not only would this method achieve more equitable representation, but as the system generates changes in the number of councillors due to fluctuation in membership numbers, it would also provide a powerful incentive for some of the states to implement and maintain an enthusiastic membership drive. With around 200 members each, Tasmania and NT would certainly revert to one representative permanently. And without some major changes in membership, SA would do the same, however, their six hundred odd members would still have a higher representation rate than the shooters in the three larger states.

Although on current membership figures WA would drop back to a single councillor, I'm sure it wouldn't take long to build the membership back up to over a thousand and regain their second representative. NSW with 4500 members would have five councillors and Queensland and Victoria with 2300 and 2600 respectively would gain one member to have three each. Thus initially there would be no change in the total number of National Executive Members elected. And even if WA, and perhaps Victoria, chose to gain another councillor by virtue of a membership drive, wouldn't that be a beneficial outcome? All that is required to make the change from our present distorted method of representation, to an equitable democratic system, is a majority vote to change the constitution by the current Executive. So give the matter some thought and express your views to your State executive members.

Now to change the subject. The Victorian Skeet Carnival was held recently and although it ran very smoothly, the issue of Team selection on Friday proved unpopular. To circumvent this, two alternatives were proposed: Delete Friday afternoon's event from team selection or move the date of the shoot to a long weekend, with a preference for the latter. This matter was raised at the recent VCTA meeting and a tentative approval obtained to move the Carnival to Labour Day Week-end in March, with a final decision to be made at the next State meeting in August. If you have any comment on this proposal, please contact me prior to August 18th, so that I can take up the matter on your behalf.


NSW State Night Pointscore Championship 4th May 2002 -Cowra Gun Club

The Melbourne group of trap shooters departed in the very early hours of the 19th April arriving in Shanghai at 15.30 local time via Singapore whilst the Sydney group left later the same day and arrived at 06.30 the next day.

On arrival we were met by ISSF officials and ferried around the hundreds of people queueing at the immigration checkpoints to have the guns checked by the police. After a painless routine we

were then put in a mini bus and taken to the Shooting range some half an hour away. What a great start. If the local organising committee were out to impress us they had surely started on the right foot. As with all good things they must come to an end and it ended as soon as we arrived at the range. Whilst the team were depositing their guns and ammo in the armoury, Greg was trying to sort out our accommodation. It appeared that the hotel we had booked and paid a deposit on was full and we were rebooked into the local bowling club, which happened to be right next door to the range. After much arguing we resigned ourselves to the fact that the bowling club would be home for the duration. On arrival at our hotel imagine our thoughts when we met the Kuwait team in the lobby and they were checking out after one night because the beds were too hard. How hard can a bed be we asked?

About as hard as carpet on the floor, seriously. We were so tired we hardly noticed.

The next morning we walked over to the range hoping to get a shot even though it was an unofficial day, only to be told the range was closed for safety inspection and would not be available at all. We

had a close look around the range and to say it is impressive is an understatement. The main administration building was four stories high and was surrounded by another five or six other buildings housing the pistol and rifle ranges. The rifle range had 80 shooting bays and there was even a 4 story accommodation block to house the full time athletes. We ran in to the Kuwaitis who told us they checked in to a 5 star hotel at a much dearer price, and the beds were just as hard, so we were feeling a little better about our hotel.

The clay target range consisted of 3 skeet fields superimposed over the trap layouts. The background was green grass all the way out to 100 metres then a 15 metre high concrete wall covered in green vegetation. The targets would look great against the green background but may prove difficult when it hit the sky line.

Unable to get a shot, we decided to head into the CBD for lunch and a look around. With steaks at the local Hard Rock Cafe at \$A55 it was obvious we

would have to source cheaper places to eat. We were most surprised and impressed by the cleanliness and general atmosphere of this area although the prices of most things were similar to Australia or dearer. We did however find a small market where Danny proceeded to punish the locals over the price of watches. With offi-

cial practice the next day an early night was in order, especially when we found out back at the hotel practice started at 7.00 am! With Australia top of the alphabet guess who was in the first wave.

Official trap practice. This was the moment we really appreciated the stuff up in our hotel booking. With 14 million people in Shanghai you can imagine the traffic, coupled with the lack of transport organisation, many teams missed their squads and with a 7.00am start scheduled for the entire tournament the 3 minute walk to the range was a blessing in disguise. We had 5.30 am starts every day, imagine what time the others had to get up with a 40 minute trip thrown in. The earlier practice rounds showed there was

I made a prediction this day that scores would be relatively low in all events and this was borne out over the following days. Later that afternoon we attended the official opening which was a simple ceremony with a few speeches and the releasing of balloons and pigeons.

Dee's fine score won her the Women's prize as well. Shannon was hard to beat for the junior prize after shooting a possible.

The Inter-zone Competition was held in conjunction with this event and saw the zone taking out the Open Shoulder to Shoulder comp with a good score in the difficult conditions of 147/150. The team was lead in inspirational fashion by the big man from Herbert River in the shape of Barry Bosworth. Despite all the efforts of the state president to claim these members as western zone shooters Barry Bosworth, Ray Collinson, Gian Vassalini, Wayne Reeves, Matt Iwankiw and Doug Killick went up to collect their medals. Northern Zone almost made a clean sweep of the postal competition as well. The open team of Barry Bosworth, Ray Collinson, Gian Vassalini, Trevor Higgins, Wayne Reeves and Ant Hanna shot a wonderful score of 149/150 leading the other zones to think that the conditions in Charters Towers last year were pretty good.

Lawrence Falco, Warren Smith and Sam Coco made up the winning veteran team with their score of 66/75. Junior teams are always hard to guess the winners but Scott McDowell, Matt Gall and Kylie Lee made up our junior zone team and won with 68/75. The women's team didn't disgrace either taking second place with 69/75 only one target from the winners.

Psychological Skills for Shooting: Trusting and Letting go.

I've been pleased by the number of people who have contacted me or have asked me at shoots when I am going to write more articles for the magazine. My apologies for the break. I have found some interesting material and will produce articles that will continue to explore psychological aspects of sport and shooting.

In previous articles about the psychological skills for shooting, I have examined self-doubt, goal setting, concentration, relaxation, visualisation, peak performance and motivation. Whilst it is easy to separate these aspects of preparation and performance for the purpose of writing, it must be realised that each component is an essential ingredient that needs to be integrated so that a mind set will be developed that allows for and encourages improvement in performance.

In this article I will explore two important aspects of competition; trust and fun. Trust can be defined as the "letting go of conscious control". Instead of trying to make ourselves trust our ability to shoot the target it is necessary to just let go and believe that we can do it.

The problem with trusting in our own ability comes from several directions. Firstly, confidence can easily slip away even when we have practiced and trained. Our ability to perform muscular activities well means that we must be able to do them without tensing up; our muscles must be relaxed and fluid. However, when we evaluate our performance, be it good or bad, our first response is to work harder. This is an understandable reaction but usually leads to a belief that we can correct mistakes by working harder, trying harder or training harder, Tim Gallwey, in the Inner Game of Golf, stated that "trying fails", meaning, that if you are doing the best you can, then pushing yourself further will lead to your "tightening up". This then leads to a loss of conscious control (trust) and you are likely to fail again. This is evident everytime we look at the score sheet and see two zeros next to each other, or worse still

Secondly, trust can be difficult to achieve because of negative and self-defeating self-talk. The difference between a good performance and a poor performance is the type of self-thoughts, self talk and attitudes we carry around with us. Past events, previous experience and performance can hold incredible power over our ability to achieve success. A poor score at a particular club on a windy day may lead us to believe that we will always shoot poorly at that club when it is windy. Thoughts, beliefs and emotions have a way of becoming self fulfilling prophesies. Positive self-talk and positive affirmations, therefore are essential tools in obtaining peak performance. Being able to build on previous success, not worrying about poor performance and having confidence to achieve are essential components of success once the mechanics of the sport have been mastered. The definition of "good" and "poor" performance needs to be clarified. It is easy to equate good performance with winning and a bad performance with losing but each performance should be evaluated against more objective criteria; such as did I meet the goals I set for practice or competition, have I improved on my last performance, did I see the targets leave the trap earlier, and so on. A good or bad performance can be measured against a range of criteria and not just against winning or losing.

Finally, we can be "psyched" out by our opponents or by our thoughts about our opponents. We often think that if we are alongside someone we know or believe to be very good, then we can not be good. Why? In most sports, the greatest gains come when we are up against opponents that have the skills and abilities to make us work harder to remain with them.

So, if we have confidence in our ability, can quieten our mind to reduce negative self-talk and believe that our opponents can actually help us, then we are on track to perform well.

The second aspect of this article is fun. Most of us shoot because we enjoy it. We enjoy the open air, the smell, noise and feel of shooting, the comradeship and the excitement of the competition. When we have fun we actually learn. When we learn we improve our performance and when we improve, we enjoy it more and have more fun. Fun is a positive driving force and means that we will come back for because the experience is good. Fun also helps us retain control; if we are enjoying our experience then we will work harder at it. Fun, allows the targets to appear like dinner plates, the gun to feel lighter, easier to control and the targets are turned inside out not just broken. Fun allows us to let go of conscious control and do things on automatic pilot, so to speak. When we are having fun we are more likely to take risks and because we are not as concerned about the consequences, the risks pays off. Rick Charlesworth, former Australian Women's Hockey Coach believes you can't win if your not prepared to lose. Having fun also helps us to focus our attention better and concentrate more because we are not consciously thinking of winning, the result or how we might look.

To shoot well, like most sports, involves us doing the activity with the minimum of thought; because thinking about what we are doing interferes with our muscles ability to just do it.


