National President's Notes

ACTA INSURANCE

In recent times I have received several inquiries asking if the ACTA will continue to maintain its public risk and insurance policies for clubs and shooters. The costs have certainly increased beyond all expectations and have proved to be more expensive than we had anticipated for this year.

The ACTA executive strongly believe that we have no option but to maintain its current policies. The additional costs will need to be met by a slight increase in registration fees for 2003.

Many clubs would be unable on an individual basis to be able to afford the costs if they are even able to secure a policy. We believe our strength comes from our combined policy covering all clubs and shooters across Australia.

REGISTRATION FEES

At our last executive meeting, we had lengthy discussions about our fees for 2003. The decision is to increase full membership fees to \$75 for 2003. This is an increase of \$7; the increase is based on the estimated increased costs for insurance. Veterans, Long Service Members, 2nd Family members fees will be \$42 and Junior membership fees will be set at \$20.

Club and State affiliation fees will be set at \$165.

While no one likes to see fees increased, we feel that being able to maintain appropriate insurance cover for all was a higher priority that the association must maintain.

NATIONAL CONTINENTAL & MIXED TGTS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 1st National Continental & Mixed Tgts Championships will be conducted on 20th - 22nd September 2002 at the Roma Gun Club in Queensland. This Carnival is sure to be well attended and I am sure the usual Roma Hospitality will be evident for all that attend. Two Queensland State titles will also support the programme.

STATE CARNIVALS

September sees several State Carnivals being contested around Australia. Skeet shooters have the Queensland Skeet Carnival at Rockhampton CTC on 13th - 15th September. The Western Australian Skeet Carnival is on 28th September at the WAGC ground.

The ISSF shooters have the NSW Carnival at Cecil Park on 6th - 8th September and the Tasmanian ISSF Skeet Championship at Hobart on 28th - 29th September. Finally the Western Australian Trap Carnival will be held at the WAGC on 29th - 30th September following their Skeet Carnival on 28th September.

This diverse range of Carnivals should mean that all competitors should be able to find something that is of interest to them.

Event 1: 25T DB Cash Divide saw 20 shooters post the perfect score and share in the cash prize pool.

Event 2: 50T Southern Zone DB C/Ship

After a long shoot off and 254 targets later, Tas Psarakis merged the O/A winner 254/254 from Bill Isles 253/254 and Steve Caltabiano taking 2nd AA grade with 215/216. A grade was hotly contested between two of Sydney Gun Club's locals, Loz Lloyd and Geoff Kidd with Loz taking the trophy 62/63 and Geoff shooting 58/59 to take second. B grade was won by T Wunderlich 53/54 while I McKenzie scored 52/54 to take second.

Illawarra's up and coming shooters tussled for the C grade placings and Paul Lynam scored a magnificent 48/50 to take the C grade win over Michael Smith 46/50, looks like B grade won't be far away for these guys.

Sunday, day 2 of the carnival saw a few new faces turn up with 91 shooters taking to the tracks while once again Illawarra turned on the perfect Autumn's day.

Event 3: 50T Southern Zone PS C/Ship

Bobby Duncan from Shoalhaven CTC grabbed the healthy O/A winner's cheque and sash for this event posting a perfect 50/50 then another 3 targets in the shoot-off with Paul Farrugia 52/53 unfortunately missing his 3rd target. Les Trew managed 48/50 to win A grade from Peter Schreiber, another Shoalhaven shooter who often visits Illawarra for our major comps.

B grade was once again hotly contested with T Wunderlich shooting a fine 47/50 to walk away with the cash while Norm Wuince added a few more bucks to his wallet taking second with 46/50. Paul Lynam showed us that practice makes perfect, shooting a fine C grade score of 47/50. 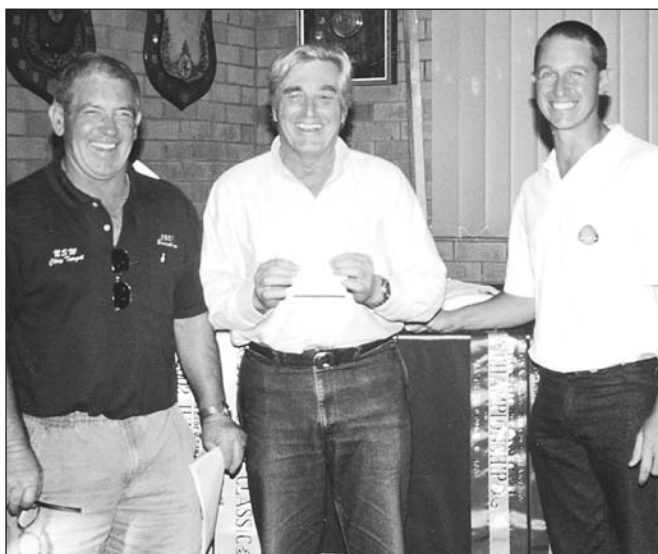

Good Scores again at Dubbo Clay Target Club's Golden Fox Open Championships

Seventy-nine members and visitors enjoyed great weather on 1st and 2nd June at the 18th Golden Fox open shoot. A breeze from the east held the targets up for most of the weekend enabling some outstanding scores to be shot. Shooters commented on the quality of the targets thrown and were very pleased with the shoot in general.

Saturday's events started with a twenty target double barrel cash divide which generated 20 possibles indicating the conditions were right for some hot competition to come.

The first championship event was the Countrywide Industries twenty-five target single barrel championship and thanks to Rod Carr for once again sponsoring this event and showing his support for the Dubbo club. The event was won overall by visitor Paul Turner (33/33) giving him the perfect launching pad for the following point score event. AA grade was won by Steve Caltabiano on 33/34 while local Brian Greenaway came in second with 32/34. In A grade veteran Mick Bajada (27/28) prevailed in a short shoot off to beat Dubbo committee man Garth Hosking on 26/28. Time Bourke (25/26) beat Ian Bjorksten (24/26) to take B grade while Junior Kurt Brodin won C grade with 22/25 over Louis Bonnano (21/28). For the first time this year a Sub Junior class was introduced and an SJ prize provided on each championship event gen-

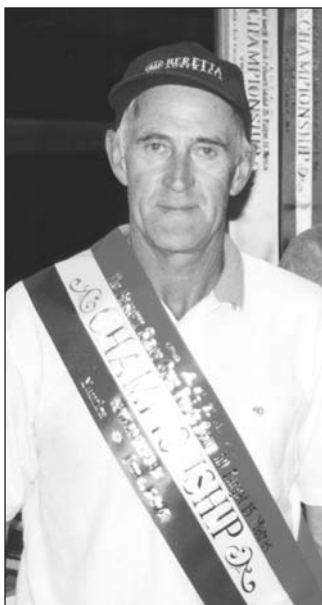
Yamba Clay Target Club Queen's Birthday Shoot

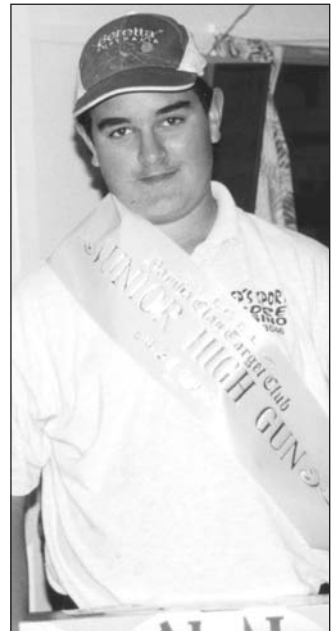

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS

September 2002

People often ask me if there is much difference between the ACTA Skeet shooting we do here in Australia and NSSA Skeet shooting in America, especially since the advent of our recent rules re-alignment. I remember wondering the very same thing when I arrived in the United States, early in July of 1984, for my first two-week stay. As it turned out, there were a great many! Some of those differences were immediately obvious during that first visit and my two later "flying visits" in 1986 and 1987, whereas others were much less apparent and only materialised after I started making extended stays of six months duration in 1988. Initially, such things as selective squadding (a voodoo subject in Australia in those days) professional referees (paid trained people who don't shoot) and pre-set flight times (an arrangement where specific time windows are allocated for your squad to shoot the event) were acutely obvious, along with their associated benefits.

Selective squadding has so many advantages that I believe the bigoted case against it is not even worthy of consideration. Fortunately, the selective squadding embargo that had existed in this country for many years crumbled recently, after a reverse-logic attack by Billy Iles, and Australian shooters are now enjoying a system that the rest of the world has embraced since Confucius shot on the Olympic Team for China. My first visit to the New Zealand Nationals, over twenty years ago, convinced me that we were on the wrong track with squadding, and it's just a shame that our inherent convict culture, combined with the "police state mentality" of a minority of our previous administrators, deprived us of its benefits for so long.

Professional refereeing is very similar to selective squadding in several ways. Until you have experienced it, you don't realise what you are missing. After experiencing it you can't work out how you ever got along without it. And then when you are deprived of it again, you wonder how you ever put up without it in the first place. Returning home from my first visit to the World Skeet Shoot, I immediately saw the enormous inequity of competing in major events under the control of a combined referee/target-puller, who was drawn from a random pool of enforced voluntary labour, by a lottery system that provided you with workers of widely differing quality, which could have such a major impact on your performance.

In Trap shooting, where a fundamental requirement of good shooting is not moving your gun before you see the target, a bad or inconsistent puller is still not a lot of fun, but can be reasonably accommodated and/or worked with by the application of serious mental control. However, the same bad or inconsistent puller in Skeet provides you with an extremely undesirable quandary. You have to either resort to the "Trap Method" of shooting where you don't move your gun until you see the target, which although not impossible, is a much more difficult way to shoot Skeet, and thus seriously reduces your chances of breaking all the targets, or you simply take your chances and try to change your timing and/or make corrections each time you get shafted by the puller.

For those Trap shooters who shoot little or no Skeet and cannot grasp this point, try the following exercise. Switch off the oscillator on your DTL trap and lock it on hard right. Then stand on lane five and try to shoot 100 straight right swingers. After a little while, unless you're completely stupid, you'll probably start holding out beyond the side of the trap and moving your gun smoothly to the right as you call. At this stage you're starting to understand a lot more about Skeet than you ever have before, and then if you get a slow pull when you're about 85

straight, you'll also suddenly realise why Skeet shooters bitch a lot more about slow pulls than Trap shooters do. All I can say is thank goodness Canterbury Voice Release have now made this whole "target-pulling scenario" somewhat academic.

Although pre-set flight times have a lot of wonderful advantages over the "suck it and see" method we use in Australia, it probably evolved as a product of necessity, rather than of invention. Provided the capacity of your facilities is adequate to more than handle the probable extent of your entries, accepting nominations on the day and shooting in that order, when it's your turn, works fine. However, once your entries can potentially exceed the capabilities of your infrastructure, advance entries and pre-set flight times are unavoidable. Your entry capacity is dictated by the number of fields you have, the number of hours per day you believe it is viable to operate those fields and the number of people you can put through each field in the allotted time.

For example, if it takes a squad of five people an hour and a half to shoot 100 targets and you operate the fields from 9.00am to 6.00pm, then you can get six squads or thirty people qualified on every field each day. So if you have ten fields, you can accept three hundred entries before you have to start refusing people or putting them on a waiting list. However, if you are conducting two events per day, then you can only accept 150 entries before you reach maximum capacity. Most of the "major circuit" clubs in the States only have about ten or a dozen fields, yet need to accommodate more than 200 people shooting four events over the program. So all of the circuit shoots have had to expand to three days duration, encompassing Friday, even though this causes practical difficulties, as it is obviously a normal working day. Actually they're really three and a half day shoots if you include the doubles event, which is shot on Thursday afternoon.

Most first timers at the World Skeet Shoot can't understand the High Gun system at all, or why there are two distinctly separate High Guns. One is called the HOA (High Over All) and includes just the four regular Skeet events (12, 20, 28, & 410) over 550 targets, whereas the other encompasses these and the Doubles event as well, totalling 650 targets and is called the HAA (High All Around). Another quandary is why the winner of the HOA, which to the uninitiated would appear to be the lesser of the two aggregates, is hailed as "The World Skeet Champion".

Consequently, winning the HAA appears to have much less significance and is effectively forgotten once the cheque has been cashed. The source of this mystery originates from practices established at the year-long circuit shoots, where many of the competitors have enough difficulty making it on Friday, without even thinking about another day off. Thus probably only half the field contest the Doubles on Thursday afternoon, so a HAA is often not even included in the program and the HOA champion is looked upon as the main winner of the Shoot.

Once I expanded the length of my stays from two weeks to six months, to include the whole shooting season, rather than just the World Championships, the reasoning behind the High Gun system and a bunch of other differences started to become a lot clearer. Such as why there appears to be a lot less "sandbagging" in the US. Sandbagging is a term the Americans have coined to describe people who find ways to shoot in a grade which is below their true ability. Unfortunately in Australia we don't have a commonly used term for this most distasteful practice, and even more unfortunately we tend to condone it by inaction to address it.

Me? I simply call it for what it is. Cheating! Whenever I encounter it, I try to lead by example and conduct personal mini-vendettas against the perpetrators. So far I have only managed to make quite a few enemies and haven't really received much general support in this area. But the way I see it is everyone needs to work to their own standards and live with their own conscience. So if you're busily trying to create a legend for yourself as one of the best A, B or C grade shooters in the World, your best bet is to probably try and avoid crossing paths with me if you possibly can.

The reason this type of behaviour is far less prevalent in American shooting is two fold. Firstly their general outlook on life is diametrically opposed to the "tall poppy syndrome" that unfortunately seems to have a hold on the Australian way of life. Most American sports people tend to constantly strive for improvement, rather than be prepared to lay back and operate comfortably at a level below their true capabilities. And rather than try to "knock" their champions and attempt to pull them back to the field, they tend to idolise them and strive to emulate them. Secondly they have derived operating systems and reward opportunities that make this type of behaviour somewhat pointless.

For a start, every competition score shot by every competitor in each of the five individual events at every NSSA registered shoot throughout the whole shooting year is forwarded to NSSA headquarters by the host club, where it is entered on the master score computer program. Then, at the end of the year, two things evolve from this. Firstly the person with the highest broken target percentage in each of the five events and the HOA, is rewarded by being entered into the history records as the "High Average Leader", for that event, for that year, and then honoured by receiving a plaque to commemorate this hallowed achievement at the following years Hall of Fame banquet. And secondly they publish full lists of everyone's averages in descending order in the Records Annual every year. This makes it somewhat difficult to strut around telling everybody what a great shooter you are, when your name doesn't show up until page seven or eight in the averages section, because you've been languishing back in A grade poaching some immoral wins.

And that's not all. If sandbagging is your forte, there's still more bad news to come. Every shoot you attend also submits to NSSA the names of all the winners, runner-ups and first three placegetters in both AA and AAA grade, in every event, along with the total number of competitors in those two grades. These figures are then factored by a degree of difficulty and entered into another program in the master computer, which uses this information to calculate "ranking points" in a similar way to Golf and Tennis. This program also produces a descending order list at the end of the year, which is used to segregate people into "named teams" which are also published in the Records Annual and which clearly establish the pecking order in the shooting fraternity for that year. So it's a little difficult to strut around telling everybody how you're a much better shooter than Billy Bloggs, when Bill's name appears half way down the second team and yours can't even be found at the bottom of the honourable mention section.

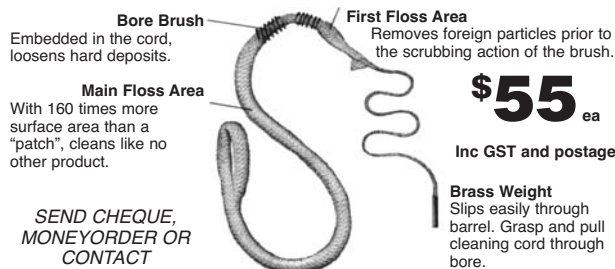

Eastern Region 3

Southern Region 3

Central Region 2 Again the tyranny of distance

Western Region 1 (could go to 2 on a membership basis)

Alternate proposal for WA, SA and NT is that you could combine the lot as one region (Western) and allocate 3 Representation places and let the Region decide who will service them best on the National Executive.

Another way to look at this is Television coverage, eg 90% of Western Australia's viewing audience is covered by Metro TV, whereas in Queensland only 45% of the viewing audience is covered by Metro TV.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Is winning everything?

I recently had the pleasure of spending a couple of hours talking with the Head of the Psychology Department at the Australian Institute of Sport in Canberra, Jeffery Bond. I went there to look at what the Psychology Department does for their athletes and hopefully learn some new skills and techniques that I could pass on to shooters, as well as use myself.

I didn't get any great programs, because there aren't any. What I learned however, was that what I have been doing, writing about, teaching and helping others with, exactly what the psychology section of the AIS does with their athletes. Aspects such as goal setting, relaxation, concentration, visualisation, arousal control, mental rehearsal, etc are all integral to being mentally fit and successful in any or all sports.

What was fascinating was a discussion we had regarding winning. Regular readers of these articles will recall an article written last year entitled Motivation. In this article I examined why we compete as part of Achievement Goal Theory. To recap according to Nicholls (1984) achievement goal theory suggests that two major goal perspectives operate in an achievement context such as sport: a task orientation and an ego orientation. Put simply, a task orientation implies that one participates in an activity for its own intrinsic properties. The enjoyment of the game, the way we feel when we smoke the target, or catch a great wave, or sink a tricky putt. There is a great inner sense of satisfaction when we do well or when we have achieved a personal best. Ego orientation (or outcome goal orientation) on the other hand has participants striving to demonstrate superior ability compared to everyone else or avoiding the demonstration of incompetence.

In our discussion, Jeffery said that a lot of his work involved assisting athletes who had trouble reproducing what they could easily do in practice or training when they were at very important competitions. It was easy to see the parallel here for shooter; how often have we seen someone shoot very well and proficiently in practice only to falter in the competition. How often have we seen a shooter smoke every target in qualifying and then miss the first target out in the shoot off. So why do we choke?

According to Jeffery Bond, some athletes appear to have difficulty transferring all their physiological and psychological skills from practice to a major competition. He continued by saying that it would appear that the athlete is faced with two related problems; both centered around the pressure of competition and its effects on: firstly, the athlete's ability to remain in control and self regulated, and secondly, the well prepared athlete's ability to reproduce consistent high quality skills under intense pressure. This is the difference between a good club shot and a state or national champion.

So faced with these two problems, how does the average shooter become better than average? Will it happen with experience or can we learn to control pressure situations by learning certain psychological skills that will help.

Jeffery Bond believes that it is essential to explore the athletes attitude to competition and develop a logical and consistent attitude. From his experience in the AIS and overseas, Bond believes that athletes who choke have a particular way of thinking about their competitive performances which is different to successful, experienced non-chokers. Non-successful athletes have an outcome focus which leads to a situation where the athlete or shooter becomes controlled by external factors (thoughts of winning, medals, money, glory and consequences of losing etc). Thinking that he/she is controlled by outside factors the shooter is going to lack confidence, consistency and control. This will cause lapses in concentration, which in turn will effect performance.

So if losers and chokers are outcome focused and externally controlled, how do successful athletes think? Bond states that successful athletes when asked about their focus of attention prior and during an event emphasise the importance of task relevant or process thinking. The process means the doing part of the activity. If the athlete is focused on positive aspects of the performance (the "doing" part), therefore he/she is automatically "blocking out" irrelevant and distracting negative high pressure thoughts. He continued to say that it is important to keep in mind that our task is to produce our best quality in all aspects of our performance; unfamiliar venues, crowds, opponents, etc are irrelevant factors. You as the shooter have to produce your performance.

This article, my previous article on motivation and an article by Jeffery Bond "Winning isn't everything ... nor is it the only thing" offer a simple explanation to the difference between the thinking (often at a subconscious level) of successful and non-successful athletes. Changes of thinking are not easy and will take most of us years to see the need to focus on the process rather than the product. Society doesn't help here; the media is keen to focus on winners and everyone else are losers; so those who are primarily outcome focused will encounter feelings of failure if the goals they set for themselves are all or nothing. Bond therefore believes that it makes more sense for athletes to be multi-goal orientated; which requires the athlete to have many goals which can be evaluated after a given performance; technical, physiological and psychological.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer:

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
