



In the second event, the Palace Hotel double Barrel Championship, only three shooters scored the possible, 50/50, an indication of how difficult the wind made the shooting.

'Jumbo' Brown won AA-grade, 62/63, with Bill Allen from Dalby second on 88/90 and Ballandean shooter Frank Musumeci third, 87/90.

Lex Harland won A-grade with a fine 50/50, and Mike Malone was just one target back in second place followed by Frank Robinson, 62/64, after a shootoff.

B-grade was won by John Pirlo with 49/50, Terry Shelton was second, 55/58 and Willem Smits third, 54/58.

Rob Auger again won C-grade, 46/50, and was again followed by Jarrid Bartley, 44/51, and Steve Boronio, 43/51.

"and the ACTA must be notified of all breaches and responses."

RULE 1.21(v)

Delete - "45 degrees" and replace with "22 degrees"

RULE 2.02

Delete in full and replace with:-

- (a) Each club must appoint an official to handicap and grade shooters, check to see that all 15 metre double barrel and handicap scores are entred on cards and to check that handicap and grade changes are recorded on cards.
- (b) Minimum handicap marks are tied to grades and are as follows: AA Grade 21 metres, A Grade 19 metres, B Grade 17 metres and C Grade 15 metres.
- (c) (i) Backward movement is to apply on high scores according to the following table:

(v) The shooters card is to be ruled off at any handicap change and the 100 targets will then restart.

Note: With earned 1/2 metres no backward movement is necessary until the shooter has earned a total of 1 metre.

- (d) There shall be no group Handicaps.
- (e) All handicap events including Sweepstakes, must be shot to finality broken targets to count and not points to determine the outcome.
- (f) Maximum load for Handicap shooting to be 32g.
- (g) All shooters registering for the first time with the ACTA shall commence on 15 metres.
- (h) Members from other Clay Target Associations will commence from the following handicap marks unless their currentnt handicap is greater that that stated: AA Grade 21 metres, A Grade 19 metres, B Grade 17 metres and C Grade 15 metres.





COACHING SEMINAR — GOLD COAST CLAY TARGET CLUB 29th & 30th June 2002



On 29th & 30th June 2002, the Gold Coast Clay Target Club hosted a Level I Coaching Accreditation Course. This course was presented by the South East Zone QCTA Coaching Co-ordinator, Neal Dimmick.

The course came about as a result of a perceived need for coaches at the Gold Coast Clay Target Club which has a large number of new and relatively new members who required coaching. The existing coaches were becoming overloaded and new coaches are required to even out the workload.

The course was funded by the South East Zone QCTA using funds obtained from Sport and Recreation Queensland under its Sports Development Program.

Seven participants came from the Gold Coast Club while two level 1 candidates came from Toowoomba. Two other coaches took the opportunity to use the seminar to refresh their knowledge and accreditation.

The course followed the ACTA recommended format and a number of extremely interesting speakers gave presentations.

Two presenters spoke on vision. The first was Rodney Woodrow (Coaching Co-ordinator of the Western Zone) who spoke on what a coach should look for in new shooters with regard to vision and associated problems. Vision is Rodney's pet subject and he certainly covered the subject well. His presentation was accompanied with a lot of interaction from the participants.

Later in the day, Justin Durkin, an optometrist with an interest in sports vision, spoke on the causes of vision problems and their rectification. The two presentations complimented one another giving a wide exploration of the subject.

Greg Newey, a Level 2 coach from Warwick club gave a presentation on Gun Fit and the effects of an incorrectly fitting gun on a shooters performance. This was followed by practical demonstrations using the pattern board to show the different effects caused by different guns even with the same shooter. Even some experienced shooters were surprised by the results of this demonstration.

On Sunday the main presenter was Michael Lloyd, a Sports Psychologist from the University of South East Queensland. Michael has had a lot of experience with top athletes including the Australian Swimming Squad. The topic of his presentation was the Correct Mental Attitude for Competition and Practice and how to attain it.


Michael spoke on this subject from the point of view of a competitor and a coach.

Again his presentation was an eye opener to many and I would say most of the participants will be trying to integrate his ideas into their shooting.

Practical coaching on the tracks using a video recorder to illustrate present techniques and possible changes then followed. This long session also yielded positive results for both the aspiring coaches and their charges.

Neal Dimmick concluded the seminar by thanking the Gold Coast Gun Club, Sport & Recreation Queensland, the participants, and the newer shooters who came to be coached.









CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS October 2002

The two words that when used together in the English language usually provoke the most speculation and debate are undoubtedly: "the greatest". This is probably because the greatest anything is almost always a matter of opinion and that opinion will generally vary depending upon one's viewpoint. The two main areas where different people's viewpoints usually vary are time and bias.

A good example of bias would be to ask an AFL supporter who they considered to be the greatest footballer of all time. Undoubtedly the majority of people would suggest either a past or present player from their chosen club. In relation to time, most young people will usually name a current player, whereas most elderly people would cast their minds back to some great player from a bygone era.

AFL football is probably a good example here because I believe it clearly illustrates one facet of a subject that has three distinct categories. The first is those areas of human endeavour where one individual stands out over all others, regardless of time or bias. The second is where it is difficult to separate great champions of different eras. And the third is where probably no one person at any given time has been able to convincingly outshine all others. I believe that AFL football fits very neatly into the third category, because even though each team has its great champions of both past and present, I don't think there are any individuals who stand out "head and shoulders" above the rest, to the point where even supporters of other teams would have to acknowledge their dominance.

Golf and tennis are probably two more good examples of the latter category, as great players have come and gone in every era and yet no-one has been able to truly dominate the game. Tiger Wood clearly has the golfing world in the palm of his hand at the moment, and maybe he will go on to become the greatest player of all time, but he still has an awful lot of work to do before he can make the likes of Ben Hogan, Arnold Palmer and Jack Nicklaus pale into insignificance. Likewise with tennis. Leyton Hewitt seems to be the rising star of that game at the moment and who knows what he may go on to do. But he has got an awful lot of work ahead of him before the likes of Rod Laver, Bjorn Borg and John McEnroe, just to name a few, will ever take their hats off to him.

Motor racing provides a couple of good examples of the middle category. Notwithstanding what Valentino Rossi may yet do, Mick Doohan is unquestionably the greatest motorcycle racer of the current era. Yet when you compare his accomplishments on paper to those of Giacomo Agostini, who raced in the 60s and 70s, the Italian racked up many more wins and championships. However, when you consider that back in those days the money and the stakes were nowhere near as high and the quality and the competitiveness of the equipment was nowhere near as close as it is today, then who is to say whether or not Doohan could have taken it up to Agostini, if he had been around back then. Or whether if Agostini had been Doohan's team-mate on a Repsol Honda, he could have made it a lot harder for Mick than Alex Criville was ever able to do.

Likewise in Formula One car racing. This year Michael Schumacher has equalled the legendary Juan Manual Fangio's record of five World Driver's Championships. But who can ever say which of the two is the greater driver. Schumacher's supporters will claim that in this day and age of the quality of the car and

the team being all important, Michael has often been able to win in less competitive teams as the under-dog. However, examination of the records will show that even though Fangio won some of his races driving for the all conquering Mercedes-Benz team, he also won a great many races driving lesser cars against the best drivers of his day in much better machinery. And who is to say whether this debate would even be going on now if the mercurial Ayrton Senna had not been tragically killed in his prime, just when Michael was starting to make a name for himself.

However, in some sports one name towers above all others. Ask any group of soccer players who the greatest player of all times is and invariably the name Pele will surface. What this tiny Brazilian player lacked in physical stature, he more than made up for in legendary status. Ask most Americans, regardless of which team they follow, who are the greatest baseballers or basketballers of all time and you will undoubtedly hear all about Babe Ruth and Michael Jordan. Closer to home, if you pose the same question to cricket followers in any country in the World that plays the game, you will be left in no doubt that Sir Donald Bradman is the undisputed master of that game.

Although sport in all its various forms is the natural place for these types of comparisons to be made, there are many other diverse fields of human endeavour where the title of "the greatest" sits just as easily. Ask just about anyone involved in the music industry who the greatest guitar player of all times was and they will undoubtedly extol the virtues of Chet Atkins. And you would not even need to be amongst members of the scientific community to find out that Albert Einstein is universally considered to be the greatest physicist of all times.

By now you're probably wondering just how I got onto this subject this month. Well a few months ago I wrote an article about how I came to be a professional Skeet shooter in the United States. In that column I mentioned the name of a shooter called Wayne Mayes and somewhat matter-of-factly stated that he was "the greatest Skeet shooter to ever walk on the face of the Earth". Since that article was published, several people have questioned me on this rather large statement and wondered if I may have been exaggerating or overstating the case.

Well let me assure you that only those people who do not know Wayne and/or have never seen him shoot would ever even contemplate such a thing. What sets Wayne apart from all the other mere mortals who have gained eminence in the sport is not just the degree to which he has dominated it, but also the length of time during which this dominance has existed. Prior to Wayne's rise to fame, the undisputed greatest Skeet shooter of all time was undoubtedly Alex Kerr and he will probably always retain his position of the second greatest Skeet shooter of all times, even if others eventually surpass his shooting achievements.

This is because Alex is unique in that he was a prominent politician in the sport as well as a famous competitor. In fact Alex was president of NSSA from 1960 to 1964, at a time when he was still arguably one of the best Skeet shooter in the World. He won fourteen World Skeet Championships in his heyday between 1941 and 1959 and his fifteenth and last in the final year of his presidency in 1964, achieving a World Championship career spanning 24 years.

By comparison, Wayne opened his account in 1973 when he won the World 28Gauge Title and with his win in the 410 last year, now has a career spanning 29 years, with still no end in sight. During this time he has won the Doubles, Champion-of-Champions, 410, 28Gauge and 12Gauge four times each for a sub-total of twenty World Championships. However, when you add his five wins in the High-Over-All and his unprecedented nine victories in the 20Gauge, including three times back to back, you get an aggregate of thirty-four World Championships. And this is without even considering his numerous wins in the High-All-Around, which as I explained a couple of months ago, for complex reasons, is not ranked as equal in importance with the other seven Championships.

Someone once asked me what I considered to be the area of Wayne's greatest dominance in the sport. After careful consideration I came to the awesome conclusion that it was the fact that there was no single area in the sport where he was not clearly dominant. Not only has he won over twice as many World Championships as anyone else, but he is also the only person to have won every individual event conducted at the World Shoot. And when you consider that the least number of times he has won any one event is four times, this achievement is all the more spectacular.

However, this is just the tip of the iceberg. As I explained in September, NSSA have a computerised ranking system similar to Tennis, which establishes named teams in pecking order at the end of each year. The top team is called the All American Open First Team and the top qualifier becomes the captain of that team. Wayne not only has the highest number of inclusions in that team, but also has been named captain more times than any other person. He has been High Average Leader in every one of the six categories and has won more High Averages than any other person ever.

He is the only person in history to have held the long run record in each of the five categories and currently holds the 410 at 777 straight. He is one of only fifteen people to have broken 550x550 at the World Skeet Shoot and the only person to have done it more than once, three times in fact. He is one of only five people to have broken 650x650 at the World Skeet Shoot and he has broken more 400x400s than anyone else (33 at the end of 2001) as well as more 500x500s than any other person in history.

Having lived, travelled and shot with Wayne for several years, I have many great memories of his dominance and brilliance, but the most outstanding of these occurred in 1989, when I watched him miss a High-Two single with his beloved 12Gauge automatic. Without even a second glance, he reloaded and shot his option almost before the missed target had landed. That alone was quite a feat, as the referee was almost in cardiac arrest as a result of Wayne missing and had slow pulled him horribly on the repeat. Seeming not to notice, he finished the station and then casually strolled back over to where I was standing, and calmly finished off the joke he had started telling me on the walk over from station one. The significance? He hadn't missed for almost two years, was over 2000 straight at the time and had just ended a new 12Gauge World Long Run Record!

Closer to home, it is very interesting to ponder the question of who is the greatest Australian Trapshooter of all time? This is clearly a question that fits the third category mentioned above, as a handful of people have an arguable case. For my personal favourite, see the cryptic clue below.

Former Australian Coach and World Champion Luca Scribani Rossi conducted an informative session on fundamentals and mental training. He also made himself freely available to all competitors for correct gun fit and to discuss their own personal shooting concerns throughout the 3 day carnival.

Luca discussed important issues such as the sacrifices one has to make to become a world champion such as family, socialising and alcohol intake also the ever popular question about extra recreational activities before a competition! Nutrition was also another very interesting topic discussed. The importance of correct gun fit, proper eye and ear protection, stance, and dealing with the mental aspect of competition. All the shooters could relate to his discussion on how do you shut out that little man who sits on your shoulder during competition reminding you of what can go wrong and doing anything to destroy your concentration!

Also the role that family members and friends can play to help support the shooter who is just that more competitive than others. Explaining the reasons why it can be a good idea to maintain a very low profile during competition and not stress the shooter out in anyway. Parents in any sport whether it is shooting, tennis or football just as an examples have a responsibility to act in a proper manner as children learn by best example.

It was pleasing to see 2 shooters who are under accreditation for their Level 1 Coaches accreditation attend this seminar along with many other Level 1 and Level 2 Coaches. After the seminar the shooters said it was great to have someone like Luca discuss these issues with them and it is what their local coaches have been also telling them for years but coming from a former World Champion and highly respected coach like Luca they were listening more intently. The two hour session was not long enough as shooters would like to have more a one on one coaching session and Luca has kindly agreed to return next year to conduct a longer coaching session.

The Western Australia Clay Target Associationis in association with the Department of Sport and Recreation is extremely grateful to Luca Scribani Rossi for donating his time to assist his fellow shooters. W.A.C.T.A. would like to sincerely thank the Geraldton Club for allowing us to conduct this coaching session prior to their carnival. Handicap & Angles

Handicap

A handicap is something that puts a person at a disadvantage, a hindrance. In sports the poorer contestants are given special advantages and the better contestants are given special disadvantages in order that all contestants have an equal opportunity of winning the event.

In 1970, for those who do not remember, handicaps were initiated with this in mind. A new shooter with no shotgun experience commenced at the 12-yard mark. A shooter with some experience began on the 14-yard mark.

Yardage was increased by winning levels and all shooters advanced one yard at the beginning of each year.

Skeet in the same period had a maximum handicap of 10 targets.

For both disciplines you earned your shooting handicap.

Unfortunately, we had changes to both disciplines under the guise of "sorting out the sandbaggers" as Adrian has chosen to brand a minority.

The previous changes had detrimental impacts on shooting. Can you honestly believe these will be any less detrimental?

You cannot justify a system of handicap using common mark as your base.

That is what started the mess. We do not shoot handicap on a regular basis as we did in 1970, in fact many clubs only once a year. This is basically due to the fact that the handicapping system does not work. Most of us have not earned our handicaps; rather we have had them imposed illogically.

Ego has directed our changes as it did before. The power to make changes is corruptible. We have been given changes that address the needs of a few rather than create equal opportunity. We justify as honourable men rather than fix a problem that was created by similar motives.

Only a complete fool does not learn by mistakes made, whether by themselves or by others.

Look at the demise in skeet shooters, with the handicapping there. Look at the continued quests for quality of opportunity down the line.

Before it is too late, admit the folly of the rules committee and consider returning to the Australian Clay Target rules of the 70's. This will allow more equity and hence encouragement.

Angles

Here we see another stupidity, again I believe under false presentation. Ego again. In your declining years you cannot truly compete on an even plane with younger more fit, more disciplined.

I again suggest wake up before it is too late for the sport. Talk to shooters not others past it, living in the past. Keep the sport active to encourage new shooters rather than attempting to continue perpetuating your own glories.

How about the thought of convincing me of your integrity and the true need to make the changes, then convince a group who are not hell bent on self gratification.

If I have offended Adrian or any of the rules committee, I do not apologise. If offence is been taken it is warranted.

To Whom It May Concern:

In the October 2002 issue of Shooting News, President John Byrnes made reference to the "Increases in television coverage" of the Commonwealth Games shooting events.

It should be highlight that such coverage was achieved only after intensive phoning, faxes and emails to Channel 7 by shooters and friends, and that this was coordinated by the Sporting Shooters Association of Australia through their "activist" list. Eg: I received my email from Gary Fleetwood (SSAA) on 26th July advising that Channel 7 were not planning to broadcast any shooting events!

Upon phoning Channel 7 I was told that the reason was that the Shooting events were at "some other place - not Manchester" so after I explained that Australia could win around fifteen medals they said they might just show some highlights.

I know that within two or three days Channel 7 had received hundreds of phone calls, emails and faxes from SSAA "activists" - not only clay target shooters, but pistol and rifle shooters as well

It is only by concerted effort by all shooters to push the media to promote our sport that we will receive favourable publicity. Such publicity, which gives all sports shooting a higher profile, should be then exploited to increase membership, which will then lead to high profile sponsorship, which will then come back to automatic increased publicity.

May I propose a vote of thanks to Gary Fleetwood at SSAA for organising such publicity.


Western Australia's Premier Skeet Carnival







Self Worth and Performance

Psychological Skill for shooting by Michael Kruger-Davis

In this article I wish to examine the relationship between self worth, self-confidence and performance. Well renowned American Sports Psychologist Barbara Waite believes that although the relationship has not been scientifically studied; how we feel about ourselves relates to many things like selfabusive or self-sabotaging behaviour, drug and alcohol use, mental and physical health, fitness, life satisfaction, and performance.

Our society has established an appearance or achievement orientation. We continually read in newspapers and magazine stories about beautiful people or high achieving sports stars; we are continually bombarded with the message that the popular press allow us to develop beliefs about ourselves and the way we should look or perform. These beliefs can either be good or bad. It is good that to achieve success or look good can be very motivating and can push us to achieve and keep achieving. The down side is that the belief that we have to be the best will actually get in the way and we will never learn how good we can be.

If we accept this belief that self worth depends on great performance, then we are subjecting ourselves to two very defeating psychological handicaps. Firstly, a loss of concentration, and secondly, increases in debilitating emotions like anger, fear and depression. Waite believes that loss of concentration is due to the preoccupation with concerns about the future or the past of negative possibilities, and a keen memory for past failures or present shortcomings. These negative preoccupations destroy confidence, which in turn destroys motivation and performance. Anger, fear and depression are inevitable reactions to failure and making mistakes. If self worth is tried to success then we cannot avoid these emotions and the lowered confidence that is associated with them. Low confidence leads to lapses in concentration and therefore leads to failure.

So how can we beat these self-limiting beliefs? Irrational beliefs such as; I must win, I should have got that target, I only feel good about myself when I shoot a possible and so on.

Dispute them. We need to give ourselves self-accepting and positive messages that reinforce that our self worth is not dependent on always winning. Our lives won't come to a screaming halt if we miss a target. Sure it's unpleasant but it's not the worst thing that can happen to us. In challenging these irrational beliefs we need to give ourselves some positive self-accepting messages that will allow us to make mistakes and have failures from time to time. Allowing mistakes frees us up to focus on the present because we are not stressed over what has happened in the past or what might happen in the future.

If you are going to accept a new belief about yourself then it is essential to know that these new beliefs are hard to maintain. You will need to be on guard about your self talk and accept a commitment to non-judgmental attitudes and an acceptance of our making mistakes without mentally beating ourselves up. To achieve at accepting these new beliefs you will also need to surround yourself with others who also have positive and accepting attitudes.

The intention of this article is not to say that competition or success is unimportant. On the contrary, success is a worthwhile goal but it should not be the only goal. The process of achieving the goal is also important.




GOLD COAST CLAY TARGET CLUB AUGUST CARNIVAL 2002

Nothing was left to chance, most every person in the club




John Mack of the Gold Coast, the Overall winner of the Lee Hogarth Single Barrel Perpetual Trophy.

We dropped Arthur and Peter off at the Howard Johnson Motel while the rest of us went back to set up camp at Peter and Jackie Streuber's home. This was to become our home away from home and I can honestly say the trouble they went to make us

feel at home was unbelievable.

9 August 2002

Yesterday was the first day of the Preliminary but Program started shooting today. After a breakfast that was fit for a King and definitely more like a banquet, we headed off to the National Ground at Vandalia. Today's events were 100 target 16 yards, 100 doubles and 100 handicap. Arthur and I top scored with 98 x 100 in the singles while Sam, Lynne and Arthur all shot 93 x 100 in the handicap.

Arthur managed 96 x 100 while Rob and I shot 95 x 100 in the doubles. We had just watched Kay Oh ye puff 100 x 100. There were 8 possibles one being a 'D' class senior veteran, that really knocked our arses in. At the conclusion of the shoot off, the winner was Dan Murphy at 200 x 200 not a bad score for double rise we thought.

100 singles Lynne, Peter and Arthur shoot 99 x 100. Sam and Rob 98 x 100 and I shot a blistering 97 x 100. Handicap Lynne 93 x 100, Arthur and I 90 x 100, Rob and Sam 87 x 100 and Peter 80 x 100. More ammunition required!!

11 AUGUST 2002

Today we have a 100 target Perazzi Handicap followed by 100 doubles. Lynne punches a 96 x 100 which if he had not of shot at an extreme no target he would had a 97. Rob shot a 95 x 100, the last 50 straight, Arthur 95 x 100, myself 92 x 100, Peter 89 x 100 and Sam 87 x 100. Number 5 was the lucky number pulled from the barrel which meant Rob and Arthur had another crack at a Perazzi Shotgun along with 380 others. Would you believe it, a guy called Steve Hawkins shot 100 x 100 off 27 yards along with one other guy. The prize money on this event was \$1,500.00 but because he played all the options he picked up \$21,818.00 US. Not a bad days work if I say so myself.

The shoot off was in brackets of 10 birds. Rob looked pretty good until he missed his eighth target whilst Arthur dumped two birds in his ten targets, car park time. This shoot off went 60 targets before they got a winner. In the doubles, Arthur shot a respectable 97 x 100 while the rest of us put in a pretty poor effort.

12 AUGUST 2002



were given the OK for entry with our firearms arriving soon after at the Crowne Plaza Motel. We indulged in a spa, swim and shower to freshen up before we were off again to Santa Monica for the rest of the morning.

We stacked a few Z's in the afternoon as we were all feeling fairly shabby by this stage. Finally after an exhaustingly long day we hit the cot at 11.00pm, none of us feeling like sleeping.

6 AUGUST 2002

At 8.30am the phone rings. Lynne, Sam and Rob are keen to pick up a hire van and get out to Universal Studios. Peter and I have had about 3 hours sleep thanks to Arthur's snoring and we were not so keen. Arrived at Hollywood at 10.30am put in a big day, sent on all the major rides and tours we could fit in, tried to go to bed a bit earlier as we were off to Tijuana Mexico the next day. 7 AUGUST 2002

5.30am came around too quickly and after a swaggies breakfast, we took off. We couldn't resist a brief stop at 'Corvette Mikes' in Anahiem to check out a few parts. At approximately 11.00am we turned our clocks back 30 years as we went over the border. For Lynne, Sam, Rob and Peter who had never been there before, it was a real eye opener. We put in a huge day buying the local wares and checking out how some people, not so fortunate as ourselves, live. We really do live in the greatest country on the planet. We did a heap of haggling, kidding ourselves we did OK but found out later they didn't see us coming, they rang us up. Back to LA after a long day, we dropped the hire van off then realised we had another early start (4.30am) ahead of us and the troops were not impressed.

8 AUGUST 2002

After we failed to get the 4.30am wake up call, hard to believe

Only one event today, 200 targets off 16 yards. Sam was the first bloke in our group to shoot 100 straight, he then missed three in the next 25 targets and ran the rest for a 197 x 200, Arthur also shot 197×200 .

Our host Peter Streuber showed us how it should be done, smoking 200×200 , he then had to shoot off under lights against three other Veterans. After another 50×50 Pete was declared the winner. Had a few jars to celebrate a terrific win by an absolute gentleman.

13 AUGUST 2002

Feeling a bit shabby and quite dehydrated, we had to front up to 100 doubles first up in the morning. After 25 pair I was clean and Rob was one down. On my 38th pair I let one go followed quickly by another two birds. Rob finished on 96 x 100, as did Arthur and Lynne. Next up was 100 targets handicap Lynne, Arthur and myself shot 95 x 100, Rob 94 x 100, Sam 90 x 100 and Peter 82 x 100.

14 AUGUST 2002

Today was the big one! The Clay Target Championship of America with the State Team Race being on this event as well. After the 200 targets in wet and windy conditions, Arthur had qualified for the most prestigious DTL Championship in the world. I missed my 19th target out and ended up on 199×200 , Sam 196 x 200 while Rob and Lynne ended up on 194×200 , which gave us a team score of 983 x 1000. To our surprise this gave us 11th place out of 45 teams. The Kansas team won with a score of 994×1000 . Shoot off started at 9.30pm with 40 competitors busting 200×200 . After 3 rounds of 25 targets 27 shooters had all dumped at least one bird. Arthur looked like he might give them a real push, but we spoke too soon and in round 4 he missed his 17th target and this left Arthur as "AA" class winner, high foreign shooter and 5th overall on 299×300 . What a top effort!

I was then surprised to be called up to shoot off with 3 other guys for 2nd and 3rd in "A" class. One of these was Sydney's Allan Jones. Allan didn't hang around for the shoot off as like me he didn't think 199 x 200 would get a look in for a prize. After 3 rounds I was lucky enough to pick up the crumbs.

15 AUGUST 2002

Today first up 100 doubles. Rob shot 97 x 100, Arthur and I 96 x 100, Lynne 94 x 100, Sam 91 x 100 and Peter 84 x 100. We then had the 100 target Vandalia handicap. Arthur was again the star performer missing only one target in the first 80 but dropped three in the next 20 for a 96 x 100 in fairly windy conditions. Allan Jones strapped it on for the best win of his career. He shot 98 x 100 from 25 yards and shot a further 25 targets in the shoot off to take 3rd place overall. This was a magnificent result when you consider there are over 4,000 shooters in this event.

16 AUGUST 2002

Today was the Preliminary Handicap and Lynne proved once again he could post a competitive score in the hardest discipline over here with another 96×100 .

17 AUGUST 2002

Last event on the program was the "Grand American Handicap". I managed 95 x 100 after missing two in the last dozen, Rob 93 x 100, Arthur 92 x 100, Sam 89 x 100, Lynne 87 x 100 and Peter 84 x 100. The winner was a guy from Vermont who shot 100 x 100 from 27 yards and then a further 50 x 50 in overtime. Unbelievable!

After shoot offs they announced High Gun winners and All Around winners. Allan Jones completed a great 10 days shooting by capturing the "A" class High Gun. Gary Kennerson also shot well during the shoot highlighted by his win in "A" class in one of the early singles events. I won "A" class in the All Around High Gun with 390 x 400. I am the first to admit none of us should be in "A" class but until they re-grade you that is what you are in.

For anyone who is thinking of going over to the Grand American

or any other major shoot and think they are going to show them how it is done, think again! The Americans collectively are the best DTL shooters in the world.

Anyone who can win or even gain a place in overall competition in a major shoot in the USA has really achieved something.

It is not like winning one of our National Titles, it would be ten fold or greater, but until you see it, it is hard to comprehend.

As for the five blokes I travelled with, they were fantastic company. Arthur did what he does best, takes over and runs the show, without his organisational skills, we would probably still be at Tullamarine Airport. Lynne was sensational, easy to get on with and always had something funny to say especially when we wet the beak. "The Mansfield Mauler" is absolutely unique, a fair dinkum "bushie" and real family man. Along with Peter the two of them together would give the two Ronnies a run for their money. As I have indicated, Peter had us all in tears of laughter all the time, he was our court jester and made team moral very high. Sam should get a special mention as he is 20 years younger than the rest of us yet showed maturity beyond his years and fitted in well. I hope everyone else had a good time, as I did and I thank the ACTA for making this trip available.


For anyone who is lucky enough to win a place on a team to the "Grand American" in the future, they can look forward to the trip of a lifetime.

WINCHESTER/VCTA STATE SCHOOL PERSONS CHAMPIONSHIP



In spite of poor conditions, both boy and girl students put on a great display of single barrel shooting to register excellent scores.



Big Mick Shields had to go to a conference and the calculator had been left at home, so that Ninedool were even more confident.


Double rise sparrows, the first event, followed by a single sparrow and full clay on report had a few contestants shaking their heads.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts and maximum fine of \$5,500.




