

World Masters Games

At the time of writing, I have just returned from the World Masters Games in Melbourne. I was very impressed with the size of the games and the organisation that went into the event. Approx 27,000 competitors participated in a range of sports. The Clay Target section had nearly 240 entrants across the events and it was great to see the medals shared evenly across a considerable number of shooters. I congratulate the Victorian Clay Target Association, the Frankston Australian Gun Club and the many volunteers who made the 6-day carnival a success. The atmosphere and comradeship was very positive and I would suggest that most really enjoyed themselves.

National Championships

As you receive this magazine the Skeet Nationals will be just concluding at the Western Australian Gun Club in Perth. In 8 weeks time the ISSF Nationals will be underway at the same location in Western Australia. As these events will be shot in the school holidays 11th to 19th January, it would be great to see a good attendance of juniors and ladies competing as occurred this year. The full programme will include State teams and National Training Squad selection. I look forward to catching up with many of you in Perth either at the Skeet or ISSF Nationals.

2003 Registrations

A brief reminder to all that your 2003 registrations are now due. The cost of registrations for 2003 is \$75 and \$42 for second family members and veterans. Junior registration costs have been set at \$20. These are up slightly on fees this year to assist in covering the increased cost of insurance that the Association needs to cover on your behalf.

Nearly all clubs will be conducting their Christmas shoots over the next few weeks. These are usually very popular as many clubs make a special effort to capture the spirit of the season. I encourage all members to join in, support your local clubs and enjoy the social atmosphere at this time of the year.

QCTA STATE SKEET CARNIVAL ROCKHAMPTON 13th, 14th, 15th September 2002

The Queensland State Skeet Carnival for 2002 commenced at 9.00am on 13th September. The weather was unusually cool for Rockhampton with a little wind to make the targets unpredictable.

55 shooters contested the first event, the State Doubles Championship. After all had shot their 25 pair, Malcolm Bell and Laurie Chelepy (both from Rockhampton) mastered the conditions to record the top scores of 48/50. Local knowledge may have had some effect. After the shoot-off Laurie Chelepy emerged with the sash and the silver Queensland badge on 51/54 while Malcolm took AA grade with 50/54. Dave Dundon (Gold Coast) was second in AA with 45/50.

Lots of practice paid off for Len Edwards of Toowoomba and he won A Grade with 50/54 from another local, Mark Warnock (48/54).



the demand for Beretta products. Beretta Australia are struggling to maintain supply, which comes as no surprise since the recent launch of some very impressive shotguns by Beretta, (Italy). Scribani-Rossi's background as National coach



with the Australian Olympic shooting team has stood him in good stead, especially since acquiring the services of the gunsmith to that team, Sergei Evglevski, who now works for Beretta, (Aust). Evglevski, since his return from an in-house training session at Beretta, in Italy, has now also furthered his ability as a quality gunsmith and is trained to provide high quality stock work. He has been kept extremely busy servicing Australian and South Pacific customers who have purchased Beretta shotguns and seek a custom prepared stock, built and finished to high standards. Many of his stocks are found on Beretta guns used by

international competitors and teams, including the Chinese.

Born in Belarus, under the USSR regime, he undertook his gunsmith training at one of Russia's finest academies before specialising in pistol and general gunsmith work. Being a keen shooter himself, his 25 years of experience as a fully qualified gunsmith have seen him reap much success over recent years at the highest level of competition - the Olympics. His time in Brescia with Beretta was well spent and he now finds himself building custom shotgun stocks for those who are working towards the pinnacle of their aspirations. To this end, Scribani-Rossi has organised preinletted blank walnut stocks of varying qualities to be exported to Australia from Beretta, in Italy. Under the supervision of Scribani-Rossi, the gun



Presently the stock blanks are already inletted but it is envisaged that suitable equipment to complete this task will be imported to overcome the expense of having the inletting already formed. The quality of the blank wood is virtually

unlimited, for shooters selecting this service will get exactly what they pay for – the more they pay, the more magnificent the woodwork!

The process begins with the purchase of a Beretta shotgun, usually one of the higher-grade trigger or side lock models such as the DT 10 or SO 5. Custom stocks can be made for other models but the laser-cut checkering found on the 682 Gold E cannot be duplicated in Australia. This would require a forend to be built to match the conventional checkering that Evglevski imparts onto the stocks he builds and shapes.

Scribani-Rossi relies on his 25 years as an international shooter and time spent with Beretta, (Italy), to be able to judge and assess a shooter's

Since many shooters decide to keep their original stocks it is merely a matter of making adjustments from the original dimensions—these are all marked onto a data sheet for record

and checked as work progresses. Beretta, (Australia), have purchased a very simple apparatus from Italy that affixes the barrel of a gun to a calibration unit that enables all stock measurements to be precisely detailed. It has two adjustable slides that enable the drop at comb and drop at heel to be measured and a calibrated, adjustable Perspex overlay that enables the cast to be assigned. Once the inletted stock is attached to the receiver and barrels and the barrels then mounted on the apparatus, precise measurements can be followed to exacting tolerances, (at least to the capabilities of the stock maker).

This was exactly how the stock was started. Once an overlay pattern was placed over the blank, (a little over-

sized than intended), the shape was outlined and a band saw then used to cut-out the basic shape. The next procedure was to

determine the pitch of the stock from measurements gained from the data sheet. This was achieved by taking measurements from the trigger to the toe and heel of the gun.

Once this was cut on a sliding mitre saw the recoil pad was then scribed from an original pad. As it happened the customer wanted a Sorbothane Kick-Eez pad and this was shaped to the size and contour of the stock using a linisher. The line marks on the stock were then referenced with the attached recoil pad in its measured position and the whole process of shaping the stock began. Whilst most of the work up to this stage was performed using time-saving band and mitre saws, the more precise work of shaping the stock required manual labour. This was undertaken using

a selection of files and rasps to shape the stock to the lines determined from the calibrating apparatus, ("calibrator"). Every now and again the gun would be locked into place on the "calibrator" and various adjustable measuring slides were moved into place to keep check on the progress. Another measurement after 20 or 30 minutes, shaping and rasping with a coarse rasp before returning to a finer file or a specialist chisel or wood knife would be used to construct the pistol grip or shape the flutes that lead rearward from the front of the comb. This continued from one stage to another and all was done by hand! At regular intervals a set of callipers would be used to ensure the correct thickness, as stroke by stoke,

shaving-by-shaving the stock began to take its form.

Watching the work was indeed a pleasure for I had previously watched stocks made on pantographs, (copy lathes), whereby a master stock is copied with modifications adjusted as required. I have also seen the inletting performed by a manual pantograph and also computer CNC, (Computer Numeric Control) servo milling machines, but watching Evglevski shape the stock by hand with mostly traditional hand tools was quite an experience, as the adjustable vice was turned from side to and the jaw protectors changed from one set to another, always taking care not to remove too much wood and to ensure the curves of the various surfaces were not compromised. Masking tape was required quite often to ensure the razor sharp chisels and knives did not score the blued metal surface of the receiver. In Italy, remarked Evglevski, they would have an old action or die that would be used instead of the original action, if you struck the metal work it would not be so consequential. He removed an old band-aid and re-applied a new one - not because he had cut himself but to protect his fingers from blisters as he controlled the progress and depth of various chisels, knives and rasps.

Having shaped the bulk of the stock and pistol grip he then traced around a template to mark out the flats on the sides of the stock where the action fits. Shaving-by-shaving the walnut was

skillfully removed as the finished shape of a custom stock neared completion. I looked at some of the shavings whilst Evglevski gently stoned his chisel to a razor's edge. The shavings removed from the stock were no more than five thousandths of an inch. As the final moments arrived there was more activity with decreasing grades of special sandpaper as rough surfaces became smooth. Some more knife work or a gentle trim with a chisel as the final product emerged, and still some more sanding.

Final sanding was undertaken mostly with the sandpaper wrapped around a flat surfaced ruler as the small lumps, bumps or minuscule hollows were sanded to an exacting finish. Again, a little trim with a rasp, and then a finer rasp or a cutting blade and the sanding would begin again until the artisan was pleased with the final result. More measurements on the calibrator and a knowing feel about the pistol grip as the palm swell was created. With wood, you do not build-up these areas; you remove the surrounding wood with gentle and deliberate strokes to expose the final shape. Again, more sanding, this way and that way a check on the flatness of the stock's surfaces with a straight-edge or a qualified gaze down the length of the stock to compare the shaped sides, a knowing open hand passing over a surface until the stock maker was satisfied with his final product. And if the stock is not right when the customer has a later fitting, the process must be started again, from scratch! To this end Evglevski also likes to spend some time with the client after they have had their data sheet prepared so he can determine any peculiarities they might have or any special requests with regard to recoil pads, recoil or shooting style that he, as a stock maker, feels he can assist.

Once the final sanding is completed, next comes the checkering, then the staining before up to 40 coats of Tru-Oil will be applied, with light sanding, (2000 grit wet and dry), in-between. I watched Evglevski hand-file sharpen the cutters of his checkering tool before tracing the pilot lines on the stock with a lead pencil. There were no templates here, the stock maker judged from his wealth of experience the lines and contours of the wood as he drew out the outline of the pistol grip checkering pattern, in pencil. A view from one side and then to the other, a look down the stock for evenness, a rubbed out line here and a new line struck with the dark pencil lead were all considered long before a checkering tool was introduced to mark the wood forever!



Some stock makers use hand-held machine checkering tools, I have seen these and computerised machines overseas that follow a zigzag pattern as they cut their patterns as finely or as coarsely as programmed. Evglevski picked-up the double lined cutting tool and skillfully followed the pencil lines as the tool gouged out a set of two lines for the border. Ever so carefully proceeding to ensure the points of the converging lines were precisely cut, with no overruns. Once the borders were cut a couple of diagonal lines were struck in the middle of the pattern before more lines were furrowed as the tool was worked from the middle to the outer side of the pattern. All completed at 27 lines per inch!

Starting from the centre of the grip each way to the borders the stock maker skillfully applied his trade until the pattern was completed and the stock then rotated to its other side to begin the tedious task again. At this level of stock making it was certainly imperative to have a steady and unerring hand. There were no patterns to follow, no rests to steady the hand or guide the tool as line by line the checkering was completed. Next came the staining and finally the tedium of applying a coat of Tru-oil and then a light sanding when it was dried. This process continued for a month. After each coating the stock was placed in a rack to dry before another coat was applied around eight hours later. Only two coats could be applied per day, the reason the finish took so long. With several stocks on the go at the one time it was not difficult to see how easily time is consumed. During my final visit there were another three orders awaiting a start.

Sergei Evglevski was in my mind no doubt a master craftsman of his trade. He had assisted with final adjustments to Michael Diamond's Perazzi stock before he went on to win the Olympic Gold medal for Australia and he had prepared handgun grips for successful pistol shooters, including his wife who was also an Olympic medal winner for her homeland, Russia. The most obvious quality of Sergei was his pride of workmanship. His dedication to his work and skill as a stock maker were obvious as he carved a magnificent stock to exacting dimensions before my eyes. His dedication and unpretentiousness were qualities I well appreciated as he went about his daily work, with me looking over his shoulder taking photographs at every opportunity. His hands were steady and at the end of my time with him he had truly created a magnificent stock that I feel sure any owner would be proud. He certainly has my respect as a craftsman and I feel sure there will be many Beretta owners lining-up to experience the wonders he can create with select grade walnut from Turkey and a chisel, knife and many other tools of his trade.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS October 2002

A few weeks ago Karen and I made our annual October pilgrimage to Wagga for the running of the NSW State Trap Carnival. I think this is my fourth year of doing that particular job for them, which I think also coincides with their decision to make the National Shooting Ground at Wagga, their State Shooting Ground. I realise that this decision wasn't, and probably still isn't, all that popular with some of the NSW shooters who live in the northern part of that state.

However I firmly believe that once the ACTA made the decision to put the time, money and effort into establishing a National Shooting Ground, then a moral responsibility arose for the State fortunate enough to have it in their own backyard, to get behind the project and support it to the hilt and I congratulate the NSWCTA for making that commitment and meeting that responsibility.

No decision by any governing body is ever going to suit all of the people all of the time, and no governing bodies ever make absolutely astute decisions on all occasions, particularly when viewed from the advantage of hindsight. The fact that I agree with both the ACTA and the NSWCTA over these recent decisions is no real indicator of whether they are right or wrong, but the fact that I don't live in NSW and both Melbourne and Canberra would have been a lot closer and easier to access for me than Wagga, at least eliminates a vested interest from that view.

One of the worst things for impeding the progress and growth of any organization is members who dig in their heels and endlessly drag the chain on any decisions or matters that do not suit them personally, regardless of whether or not they are in the best interests of the majority. The Wagga Shooting Complex is now a reality and is already producing the advantages that only a "primary venue" can provide and continue to expand upon.

Since my last visit there earlier in the year, I noticed a number of changes and improvements, including the addition of quite a few more powered camping sites. So I'm appealing to all the NSW shooters who live in areas other than the southern zone, to get behind your State association and support their visionary decision. Likewise to the shooters from other States. Please support the ACTA by attending as many events at Wagga as you can, as I'm sure our descendants will be grateful to us for it, when they have access to one of the finest Clay Target Shooting facilities in the World.

The trip to Wagga is almost a full day's travelling for us, particularly around winter when the snow and ice on the Great Dividing Range makes the trip a lot more challenging. Just ask Karen about the time we got caught in a total "white-out" on top of Mt Hotham. It was sort of like flying an aeroplane through an endless cloud. Or the day she spent part of the time looking out the side window to see where we were going, part looking out the windscreen at the thousand foot drop over the edge and part looking back to see if I could get any more opposite lock on the steering of our overloaded Commodore wagon. Like some of my shooting accomplishments, luck played a bigger part than skill in the successful completion of that little excursion.

For these reasons I usually like to get away by morning tea time to arrive in Wagga for dinner. This year though, I got held up and we didn't get away until after lunch. Fortunately the road was "user friendly" and we didn't have to fit snow chains, but by the

time we got to Albury it was dark. So instead of afternoon tea with the infamous "Boydie", we stopped for dinner with our old friends Phillip and Peter Jackson at their newly acquired Matador Motel, which is conveniently located on the Hume Highway in the middle of town. Phillip is a very keen Clay Target shooter, who I first met some years ago at a junior development camp I was doing for NSWCTA, and I'm sure he would be very pleased to have the opportunity to accommodate and chat with any shooters who are visiting the Albury area.

This year's shoot was very well attended, particularly on the Friday when a new event was added to the program. Previously the format was two events each day for the first two weekend days, with the Pointscore and Team Shoots on the Monday, which is a public holiday in NSW. Adding the State Champion of Champions on Friday afternoon expanded this to three and a half days of shooting. Total carnival attendance is usually around 240 shooters, so I figured that with Friday being a working day as well as a new addition that wasn't included in the High Gun, then about 80 entrants would probably pull it up. So when 160 people nominated and we had to open up another ground, it was a very pleasant surprise for all concerned and pleased the organisers no end.

NSW has thus become the first body to incorporate all the events conducted at the Trap Nationals into their State Carnival program, effectively providing a mini mirror image of our annual Main Event. I suspect that this could be more than coincidence or a random happening and that NSW could well be trialing the format that is rumoured to be in the pipeline for the Nationals. I believe that there is currently some pretty serious discussion going on about rebuilding and expanding the shooting grounds to incorporate another five new trap layouts. Once this is done I reckon that two events per day at the Nationals could become a reality, with the whole program including the Deauville Doubles and the MacIntosh Teamshoot, being finalised over four days.

Two events per day would certainly add to the atmosphere of the Trap Nationals and tend to keep people on the grounds all day. The high priority of additional camping sites is another indicator of this desire, which would go hand-in-hand with a condensed program in making a trip to the Nationals a much more affordable exercise for a lot more people. With the recent addition of such things as an outdoor coffee cafe and an ice-cream van and the ACTA sponsored shooters party, the word "carnival" could eventually take on a whole new meaning.

NSW inducted another two "living legends" into their State Hall of Fame this year and it was great to see five of the six previous inductees present for the occasion. Only Pud Burgess couldn't make it and had to send an apology due to a clash with an immediate family wedding. Dick "the silent assassin" Piotrowski and Mark "I will win a National title" McInnes have now taken their place alongside some of the finest shooters this whole country, not just the State of NSW, has ever produced. I was only sad that I didn't get more time to chat with the likes of Warren Charlton and Jimmy Ellis. These people, who were my idols and role models when I was learning to shoot, are truly both State and National treasures and tremendous characters in their own right, and it's a great shame that they are seen so rarely on the shooting tracks these days.

The only mildly disappointing aspect of the Shoot was the usual absence of lower grade shooters and the minimum number of people who entered the optional purses. It always amazes me that

the majority of lower grade shooters don't attend the likes of their State Shoot and the Nationals on the basis that they aren't good enough to win. The reality is that they also probably can't win an event at their local club shoot either, but at the major shoots their chance of winning their grade is almost as good with a much larger potential reward.

In relation to the optional purses, one is already graded, one is split between the highest qualifying scores, which doesn't necessarily preclude the grade shooters, and the other, although a winners purse, is probably more relevant to the lower grade shooters in the Handicap event, than it is to the top guns. And the only initial complaints that I overheard about the Shoot was in relation to the cost of nominations, but once it became known what percentage of that entry fee was paid back to the overall and grade winners, most people then decided that it was very good value for money.

As usual inland NSW turned on some great weather for the event, with only the last day initially threatening to dampen our spirits, but then deciding against it and providing a fourth consecutive pleasant day. Ludwig's famous Geminis performed faultlessly once again under the watchful eyes of Fred and Josso, throwing a continuous stream of the finest Queensland targets the Tunney brothers can produce. A lack of operational problems has settled down to become par for the course recently, with shooters now going to Wagga and realistically expecting everything to run like a Swiss watch. This was in no small way assisted by Andy Sanders and his tireless bunch of toilers in the administration office. All in all I thought it was another great shoot and like most of the other people I'm sure, I look forward to our next visit back there in April for the Trap Nationals.

Now to change the subject. The Skeet Shooters Association is currently attempting to compile a list of all the previous State Skeet Champions and High Gun winners, before this information becomes too old for anyone to remember and thus gets lost forever. Our eventual aim is to collect all this data, update it annually and make it available for posterity via our website. If anyone has any information, be it comprehensive lists or even individual winners for any year from any of our seven States and/or Territories, I would be most appreciative to hear from you via phone, mail, fax or e-mail. My various phone numbers are regularly published in the CTSN at the end of my column and in my Shooting Lessons advertisement and my e-mail address is cuzzo@a1.com.au.

This month's Shooting Trivia Question: Who is the only person to ever win the NSW State Double Barrel Championship back to back (on two consecutive years)? Mail your answer to Shooting Trivia, P.O. The correct answer to October's STQ is: The last person to shoot 650x650 at the World Skeet Shoot was Wayne Mayes in 1994. The real significance of this feat is lost on a lot of people until it is put into perspective by viewing it against familiar comparisons.

Our current National Skeet format is 450 targets over five days, without shooting either the 28gauge or the 410, and the best score ever recorded to win the High Gun is 7 points down. Similarly our National Trap program is 325 targets for 475 points over six days and the highest tally anyone has ever managed to record for the High Gun is also 7 points down. So to shoot at 650 targets over six days at the World Skeet Championships, including 100 doubles and 100 with the 410, and finish zero points down is certainly a feat that I would have had difficulty believing if I had not seen it with my own eyes. The first correct answer drawn was submitted by Julian Lucchitti from Georges Hall in NSW who wins a free entry to next year's National Skeet Doubles Championship. Congratulations Julian. If anyone has a good trivia question or an interesting topic for discussion in this column, I would enjoy hearing from you.





WA Gun Club and the Ballistic Sports Open Day - Sunday, 13 October 2002

Last year there was hesitation amongst the ladies, but this year all the ladies, including one very pregnant one, turned up enmasse to try clay target shooting using the 410g shotgun. They learnt a lot about having to totally change their thoughts and stance, due to the requirement to be relaxed and forward when moving the gun through the target. All of the ladies thoroughly enjoyed being coached in a sport that they would never have deliberately sought out and try. This year the ladies numbered 30.

It seemed husbands were quite happy to let their wives try clay target shooting as they occupied the 12g shotgun Trap and Skeet stands. The men enjoyed the shooting and were keenly stamped on if they looked like breaching the safety rules, even though we also had protective cages set up on these layouts.

Over the day, there were demonstrations of Trap and Skeet, fully commentated so the public was aware of what is involved and the difference between disciplines. Involved in the demonstrations were members of varying ages with Nicholas Wells (13) shooting Skeet and Terry OíBrien (wheelchair athlete) shooting Trap. It showed the public that clay target shooting is suitable for all people. Safety announcements were made constantly along with listing the other sports available around the Complex for the public to try.

It was an excellent day of promotion for all sports involved and comments such as iit has been a very cheap day out for us as a family and a place whereby there are sports that every one of us

At the end of the day the Club members involved were tired, enjoyed wetting their whistles, talking about the days activities and achievements. For some it was the very first time to be involved and thought that the concept was an excellent idea. 


Victorian 2002 South East Zone Carnival


