PRESIDENTS ANNUAL REPORT 2002



I present the 2002 Annual Report, my third as President of the Australian Clay Target Association.

When looking at the highlights of the year and thinking about who should be mentioned it is a daunting task to not omit someone or an important event. I would like to thank all that have participated or supported our sport in any way.

To my view the highlight of the year has been our ongoing success that our competitors continue to have on the International scene. This helps to keep our profile high and certainly assists the sports reputation in Government circles. We need to focus now on how to better cash in and use the media to better publicise these successes.

My congratulations go to Adam Vella on winning the World Cup final for 2002, a remarkable effort. Michael Diamond finished 3rd, having two competitors in the top 3 is a remarkable achievement. Michael Diamond also finished 2nd in the World Championships and won the World Cup event in Sydney.

The Commonwealth Games saw our competitors win 8 gold medals, 7 silver and 2 bronze. Congratulations to Michael Diamond, Adam Vella, Dianne Reeves, Nessa Jenkins, Lauryn Ogilvie and Natalia Rahman on achieving gold. In DTL we saw Wayne Parkes win the world DTL championship. Wendy Barton the ladies, Travis Vania the Junior and Tim Catling the Veterans to complete a clean sweep at the World DTL titles. In the teams events, we also had numerous successes. The World DTL Open, Ladies and Junior teams each were successful, a fantastic effort. Our World Cup and Commonwealth Games teams also scored several successes.

Our National Championships DTL held in Wagga in 2002 was once again a pleasant and successful carnival. For the last 2 years the standards of scores has been outstanding. We look forward to continuing in the same manner and maintaining the quality of shooting for this year's National Championships. The support for the evening presentation of major prizewinners at the BBQ function has been popular and assists us to give recognition to both our winners and our sponsors.

The 2002 Skeet Nationals were conducted in Western Australia. The grounds and facilities were a credit to the WAGC and WACTA. We thank them for their support and assistance during the carnival. Overall the competition numbers were a little disappointing but the NZ contingent enjoyed the carnival with their competitors successful in several events. Mr Geoff Gallop the Western Australian Premier presented the National titleholder with his sash and displayed a keen interest and knowledge of our sport.

In January 2002 we held the ISSF carnival in its new time slot. This appears to have been a popular move with competitor numbers at Cecil Park breaking records. The 2003 carnival in WA in January also was very well attended. The number of competitors in Ladies and Juniors continues to grow and the standard of shooting also continues to improve. Our success internationally can probably be partly attributed to the depth of standard seen at our own ISSF carnivals.

The World Masters Games conducted in Melbourne in October is also worthy of a mention. The 240 competitors who participated

should be congratulated, the atmosphere and comradeship displayed was outstanding and I must give credit to the VCTA for their efforts in organising this event, well done.

The National shooting ground continues to be developed and improved. I am sure that you will all become aware of the ongoing improvements during the course of this year's national titles. I am sure that any Executive member will be keen to hear your views about the grounds and its ongoing development.

Commonwealth Government funding for high performance competitors continues to be paramount for the support of our ISSF teams and their successes overseas. The Australian Shooting Association now controls all aspects for the management of these funds and the selection of teams supported by this funding. The ACTA needs to ensure that clay target components of these teams are supported in line with the successes of our competitors. Funding for other less successful disciplines should not be eroding the support of our teams.

In recent years the spiraling cost of and the availability of insurance has been a major concern. We clearly understand that it is essential for the ACTA to maintain its cover for clubs and individuals, as the alternative of smaller clubs trying to secure appropriate cover would be untenable. This has resulted in us increasing registration fees by \$7 to assist in covering the cost, an action we believe was warranted to achieve the outcomes we desired.

We seek at this meeting your endorsement of the new constitution, which will address our future needs. This document has taken 3 years to develop to this point and we hope that it can now be adopted, enabling us to move forward.

I thank all executive members for their work on the various sub committees and particularly thank sub committee chairpersons for their leadership. Some of you have spent countless hours organising your areas of responsibility, often without recognition or reward. The sport needs a large pool of willing workers from club level, Zone and State level through to the National body.

During the year we have welcomed 3 new members to the Executive, Mr Peter Field Qld, Mr Robert Andrews South Australia and Mr Robert Fox for the NT. I wish them all well in their involvement and thank retiring Executive members for their efforts. The all important portfolio of finance has again been managed by Vice President Mr Bill Jones. I again thank Bill for his leadership in this area and for his support as Vice President.

Each year we ask everyone to remember those members who have passed on. The age profile of our sport clearly indicates that we frequently need to remember our friends and their involvement in our sport. Mr Graham Michell, Executive member for 12 years, 8 years as chairperson of the shooting committee and Vice President of the Australian Shooting Association, is a prime example of someone who was committed to our sports improvement. I probably better than most know of the hours of work and dedication that Graham gave to our sport. He would spend hours on the phone discussing aspects of the sport and planning team selection. Graham is a great loss to our sport and he will be very difficult to replace. Thanks Graham for all that you did. A special thank you to all personnel in our National Office for your efforts during the last 12 months. The pressure and diversity of your tasks are not appreciated or understood by many. To Andy Sanders as Executive Officer, thank you for your efforts during the year.

Thank you to all sponsors for your assistance at club, State and National level, your support of our sport is appreciated.

I conclude by thanking all members, Executive and office staff who have assisted me in my role during the last 3 years. I will not be seeking re-election to a 4th term as President in July for a number of reasons. I wish the new President and the Association every success in the future and hope that our sport can continue to move forward in 2003.



CONDITIONS OF ENTRY NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 2. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25...
- 3. The Organising Committee will decide the order of shooting.
- 4. Regulation Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rockett rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot official, but shall number five (5) in total.
- 5. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets
- 7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is a possibility.
- 8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 10. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
- 11. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 12. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 13. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 14. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 15. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
- 16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 17. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
- 18. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 21. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors and the second family members entering into the same event, they being wives and husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
- 22. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS April 2003

Whenever I give shooting lessons, one of the most frequently asked questions is "Do you think my gun fits me?" The answer to that question is almost always yes and no! Yes because with the mount and stance that is currently being used to compensate for any degree of "non-fit", it is superficially fitting. But no, with a technically correct mount and stance the gun would not fit and would need some alterations.

Then when I go on to explain the various aspects of gun fit, much of the technology and terminology is not understood. For that reason I wrote an article on Shotgun Stocks and Gun Fit about ten years ago, to explain all the technicalities and concepts involved in this critically important aspect of our sport. I often use this article as a hand-out at my shooting classes. This month I have decided to share my thoughts on the subject with CTSN readers.

The full article is over 3500 words long and thus far too big for one edition, so I have broken it up into two halves. The first, which I will publish this month, is an explanation of mechanics of gun fit, and the second, which I hope to publish next month, gives my ideas and theories on the subject. As I alluded to above, Gun Fit is one part of a three-piece "jigsaw puzzle", which also incorporates Stance and Gun Mount. For my thoughts on the latter two points, please refer back to the article I wrote on that subject in the July 1998 issue of the CTSN.

Almost all shotgun stocks are of the two-part type, comprising a forearm (or fore-end) and a butt stock, which is usually referred to as simply the stock. The size and shape of the forearm has very little to do with the performance or operation of the gun and provided it's construction stays within the generally accepted guidelines, then it's dimensions and style are purely a matter of taste or personal preference. Its main function is to provide a convenient and comfortable handle by which the non-dominant hand can control the direction of the gun.

The stock, on the other hand, although a seemingly simple and rudimentary attachment, is actually a very complex and complicated device, which requires a number of very carefully calculated dimensions in order to be able to serve two very important functions:

- 1) To transfer recoil to the shooter as gently and as comfortably as possible.
- 2) To correctly align the shooter's eye with the sighting plane of the shotgun.

The main parts of the gunstock are:

- 1) The **grip** the portion between the trigger and the comb, which the dominant hand wraps around to hold the gun. Grips come in three styles:
- A) Straight grip sometimes used on double trigger guns;
- B) Semi-pistol grip used on some field guns;
- C) Full pistol grip some field guns and most target guns. Grips come in two shapes:

- A) Straight sided traditional shape found on most stocks;
- $B)\ Palm\ swelled$ custom feature found on some target guns.
- 2) The **comb** the top of the stock, which the face rests upon. The front of the comb is called the nose and the rear of the comb is called the heel. Most combs are straight, but some target guns have a variation called a Monte Carlo comb, where the comb is usually higher and straighter than normal but drops away near the heel so that the butt remains in the conventional position relative to the line of sight.
- 3) The **butt** the back of the stock, which rests against the shooter's shoulder. Sometimes the butt is simply the back of the wooden stock, whereupon it is usually chequered. Usually the butt is covered by either a butt plate made from metal or plastic, or a recoil pad, which is made of rubber and will vary in thickness, shape and design, depending upon the usage of the gun. The top of the butt where it joins the comb is the heel and the base of the butt is called the

The main dimensions of a gun stock are:

- 1) Length
- 2) Drop
- 3) Cast
- 4) Pitch

Length is the distance from the hollow of the trigger curve to the centre of the butt and is thus a simple single linear measurement.

Drop is the distance from the extension of the sighting plane to the comb. If the comb was straight and parallel to the sighting plane then this would be one measurement. But as the comb usually slopes down and away from the line of sight then the measurement changes over the length of the comb and is usually expressed by giving two measurements. These are drop at comb (which really should be called drop at nose of comb) and drop at heel.

As the only measurement that is really relevant is the drop at the point on the comb where the face contacts it, and as this point is usually about midway between the nose and the heel, then by deduction the effective drop at comb is about halfway between the two quoted measurements. When a Monte Carlo type stock is measured there can be three possible dimensions. Drop at nose of comb, drop at rear of comb, and drop at heel of stock. However, as the theory behind a Monte Carlo stock usually calls for the comb to be parallel to the sighting plane, this may be reduced to two dimensions - drop at comb and drop at heel.

Cast is the lateral deviation of the butt from the line of sight. Cast off bends the stock away from the face of a right handed shooter, and conversely, cast on bends the stock towards the shooters face, and is thus more likely to be encountered on the stock of a left handed shooter. Cast can be affected by the thickness of the stock. A shooter who

required no cast off with a stock of average dimensions, might need some cast off if he purchased a gun fitted with a custom stock which had been made to generous proportions. Sometimes a stock will be deliberately made with more cast at the toe than at the heel, thus creating a twist in the stock and causing the butt to be at an angle to the gun. This will usually give much the same effect as increasing the pitch.

Pitch is a measurement that is relevant to the angle of the butt from the line of sight. It would be quite simple if it was expressed as such - the number of degrees from square that the extension of the butt line intersected the line of light. However this is not the case. English stock makers don't even use the word pitch. They encompass this dimension by specifying two additional measurements of length - length to heel and length to toe - in addition to the normal length to butt. American stock makers approach this dimension from a somewhat indirect and complicated-to-define direction. They first establish the butt line, and then establish another line at right angles to the butt line, which extends past the top rear point of the action to the muzzle. The pitch measurement is then given as the distance from this extended line to the top of the muzzle. Although this is somewhat complicated to visualize and define it is fairly easy to measure. You simply stand the gun squarely on its butt on the floor near a wall with the trigger guard away from the wall. Then slide the gun towards the wall until the receiver comes in contact with the wall. Now you can easily measure the distance from the muzzle to the wall and this is your pitch dimension. Even though it controls the angle of the butt it is measured at the muzzle.

Most shotguns are used for field shooting and field stocks are designed so that they can be mounted and fired quickly from a gun-down starting position. Over the years gun manufacturers and stock makers have come to a general consensus of opinion as to what the optimum dimensions for a field stock to suit the average person. These are:

Length	14"
Drop at Comb	1 1/2"
Drop at Heel	2 1/2"
Cast	0-1/2"
Pitch	2" - 4"

Up until 1954 Skeet was shot from various gun down positions and thus the optimum field stock and the optimum skeet stock were pretty much one and the same item. However, from 1954 onwards, the rules allowed premounted guns as in trapshooting. Trapshooters had long since deduced that for target shooting with a pre-mounted gun, the optimum stock dimensions were somewhat longer and higher than the ideal field gun. Thus, you would imagine that within a short space of time most skeet guns would have had their stocks altered or been retro-fitted with a trap stock and that most new skeet guns would have started wearing trap stocks. This did not happen for a number of reasons.

Some shooters were simply resistant to changing their established shooting style and continued to shoot from a dismounted or partly dismounted starting position. Others, who eventually conceded the wisdom of shooting with a premounted gun, and thus eliminating a potential self-imposed handicap, were resistant to changing their tried and trusted equipment. Still others, who both conceded the premounted gun and admitted the virtue of trap stock dimensions for skeet shooting, were disinclined to change for

practical reasons. Their skeet guns were also used for bird hunting or vice versa, and the fitting of a trap stock would have been advantageous only to the game birds when the gun was used for hunting.

However, as surely as change is slow, it is also equally eventual. Ever since it's inception as a hunting practice exercise, Skeet has been slowly evolving into an end within itself, such that today a great many Skeet shooters almost never hunt, and of those that do, most look at Skeet primarily as a separate entity. Nowadays the cutting edge of Skeet technology is pretty much free to concentrate on breaking higher scores without having to compromise to the attainment of other goals. Thus, whereas the optimum skeet gun of yesteryear was a 7lb. field gun with 26" barrels and very little choke, today the general consensus of opinion on the ideal Skeet gun would probably be a 9lb. trap gun with 30" barrels and an appreciable degree of choke.

The ideal Trap stock and the ideal Skeet stock have now become pretty much one and the same thing and could be just as well referred to as a Target Stock. Thus the ideal Target Stock these days is probably a Monte Carlo comb item with the following dimensions:

Length	14 1/2"
Drop at Nose of Comb	1 1/2"
Drop at Rear of Comb	1 1/2"
Drop at Heel	2 1/4"
Cast	0"
Pitch	1" - 2"

Q: I am a keen DTL shooter and my question is that in every double barrel event I can shoot the whole 25 targets straight single barrel, but in a single barrel event I usually get about 20/25. What am I doing wrong?

A: The mind is a powerful thing!! When you are shooting double barrel the second barrel is your security blanket and because you know its there if you need it you are relaxed, concentrating and letting it happen, so the 25 is easy.

When you then shoot a single barrel event you might be tightening up and try too hard due to the perceived extra difficulty. Possible solutions: - 1. Shoot single barrel in the same way as you would double barrel, 2. Practice single barrel not double barrel, 3. Relax and concentrate on hitting one target at a time and not the whole 25.

P.S: It may have helped to know where in the 25 that you may have missed, ie: is it always in the beginning, end, middle or random. For instance if the beginning you maybe missing due to nervousness or anxiety, at the end by being jumpy, loss of concentration, lack of application.

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.




