The Australian Clay Target Association National Trap Championships for 2003 were conducted again at the ACTA National Shooting ground in Wagga Wagga NSW with the championships running from Tuesday April 1 to Sunday April 6. With the drought in firm control of the weather warm sunny days greeted the shooters. The new bore at the National Ground had definitely been working overtime as the ground were looking excellent considering the conditions.

Prior to the Opening Ceremony, teams from all states and territory competed for the Australian Clay Target Association Cup presented to the winning state team in Open, Women's, Juniors and Veterans divisions.



South Australia successfully won the Open team event, being represented by Eric Hall, Dino Oliviero, Gavin Height, Kelvyn Prescott and Max Medhurst with a score of 124/366. In equal second place were the teams from Tasmania, Western Australia and Queensland on a score of 123/363.




The Ladies from Queensland were successful in winning the Women's Team event. The team lead by Veronika Forsyth with

Leanne Jarvis and Carol Betteridge scored 73/211 with the team from Tasmania coming in second on a points decision with a score of 73/210. Third place was the team from South Australia with a score of 71/202

Kay then handed over the duties of firing the first shot to Mr. Daryl Maguire M.P. who under the direction from the Shoot Marshal Mr. Adrian Cousens hit the target with his first attempt. Just to prove this was no fluke he did it again with his second shot to the delight of the crowd gathered.

54th Grand Australian Handicap

The first event for the 2003 Nationals attracted three hundred and



fifty five competitors including fifteen from New Zealand. At the end of the 50tgts twelve possibles shot off for the Royal Blue Sash, Silver Australia Badge and the Gordon Hall Perpetual Trophy. After the shootoff, which went for a further thirty targets Barry Bennett from the Hobart club was the victor with a score of 80/80.



49th National Single Barrel Championship


The weather conditions were again perfect for shooting and a field of four hundred and seventeen shooters were attracted to this event, all looking for a win.

The lower number of possibles, with only ten possibles shot reflected the change from double to single barrel shooting.


Overall first was Jon Whittakers

Thirty-eight veterans competed for the Veterans Australia/New Zealand Trap Championship with a shootoff required to determine



4th Veteran National Double Rise Championship


Twenty-five shooters competed for the Veterans National Double Rise Championship. After qualifying Robin from the



Greg and the DT / Trap team departed the Perth World Cup at 1.45 am on the 14th March for Singapore and were joined there by the team doctor Sue Homolka who flew direct form Melbourne. CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS June 2003

The strangest thing happened this year during the shoot-off for the National Double Barrel. It had taken about 280 targets to reduce 130 possibles down to one squad. Shortly afterwards Glen Kable indicated he didn't want to play any more and then Sam Clifford decided that a 300-break badge was all he wanted. This left just four protagonists at the next shell break. However four more worthy combatants would be hard to find in the Southern Hemisphere.

Anyone who reads my column regularly will know that Ray Everett is already a living legend. Kim Nealon had previously won both the National Pointscore and the Overall High-Gun. Roger Duthie is a multiple Silver Australia Badge recipient, a past winner of the National Double Barrel, and a bloke who has proven he can shoot six or seven hundred if he needs to. And last but certainly not least was Russell Mark, whose shooting credentials need no elaboration and whose name is a household word in this country both in and out of the shooting fraternity.



372 targets and all's well.

Thus I am sure that most of the many spectators assumed we were in for a great day, that the attrition process would be long and drawn out, and that a large score would be the eventual outcome. And so it seemed for another couple of boxes of shells. But then a visual spectacle occurred, the likes of which may never be seen again (at least not in a major DB shoot-off anyway). These four "Iron Men" reduced themselves to one winner in the space of a single target each.

Ever the consummate analyst, shortly afterwards I wondered what went through each persons mind as this "pantomime" unfolded in front of them. So over the next couple of hours, I chatted with each of them to gain their individual perspectives. Later it dawned upon me that this aspect may be of interest to others, so here is an abridged rendition of those conversations.

Ray Everett told me that prior to "starting the rot" so to speak, he was very happy with the way things were proceeding, having been having a quite mediocre week by his standards. Immediately after missing his own target, he assured me that the first thing that came into his mind was the word "Knickers". This is obviously some type of unique "NewZealandism" that probably

does not bear translating into Australian, lest I fall foul of the censors.

But when Kim Nealon immediately missed alongside him, his next thought was "Goodness me, I still have a chance to get onto the box". However when Roger Duthie then followed suit and shot two holes in the sky, he assured me that he could barely believe how his own personal position has so suddenly, considerably and unexpectedly improved out of sight.

When asked if he ever considered that Russell might also miss, he assured me that the thought never even crossed his mind and that anyone who doubted Russell's ability to shoot under pressure obviously knew nothing about the game and was confusing mental strength with the law of averages. When asked for his overall view of the shoot-off result he assured me that "it is a well documented fact that God loves to show off in front of a crowd!"

Kim Nealon, on the other hand, had a much simpler perspective of the drama that continued to unfold around him. He told me that after Ray missed his target he was extremely confident of a good personal outcome thinking something along the lines of "one down, two to go." He said that he was absolutely convinced that he was going to "hammer" his next target.

However after emptying two perfectly good shells to no avail at a left hand quarterer, he was absolutely stunned and that his first thought was "Far Out or something similar." When Roger then missed in turn beside him, his surprise turned into almost dazed disbelief and as Russell slowly converted his "three set points" into the equivalent of a "12-gauge Wimbledon Title", his mind was struggling to collate the information that his eyes and ears were sending it.

Although not wishing to appear to be making excuses, he said that this feeling of unreality stayed with him for quite a while and probably contributed to his early exit from the ensuing "reshoot-off". When asked for his overview of the proceedings he said (about two hours later) that it still felt sort-of artificial and that it would probably take a while for it to really sink in.

One of the many things I like about Roger Duthie is his similarity to Steve Atkins. What you see is what you get and if you can't handle a straight answer, don't ask the question. When asked for his thoughts after Ray Everett missed, he replied: Beauty! That's one less to worry about. And when Kim missed straight afterwards his initial response was: Now I'm laughing, it's down to just Russell and I and I have to be a real chance for another National Double Barrel.

When asked to elaborate, Roger told me that he had been shooting very well lately, that he was happy with the way he had shot yesterday up until "stumps" and that he was very pleased with the way that he had restarted again this morning and with his form thus far. He also said that although Russell obviously has tremendous talent, his absence from continual DTL shooting was showing in the way he was hitting his targets and the number of seconds he was pulling.

He went on to say that after Ray and Kim both missed he felt calm and confident and there was no doubt in his mind that he would not only hit the next target but that he would also go on to give Russell a good run for his money. After the referee announced the result of Kim's shot, he said that he felt no reason to rush into his own shot and paused momentarily to take a deep breath before continuing. In relation to missing his target, he said that he felt that it lifted both times as he fired, causing him to shoot under it with both barrels.

After the referee announced a less than satisfactory outcome for his marksmanship effort, Roger said that initially he was dumbfounded, but as the sad realisation gradually dawned upon him, his first thought was: what a lot of hard work and effort had just gone down the drain! Then as Russell prepared to shoot, all he could think about was what a "gift" he was about to receive and through gritted teeth he mentally pictured himself handing Russell the Royal Blue Sash on a silver platter. He summed up his overview of the situation in one word. Unbelievable!

My interview with Russell was longer and much more profound that I had expected. Also the frame of reference from which he received his version of the events as they unfolded was completely different to the rest. While everyone else could not believe their eyes, Russell struggled to believe his ears. Being the last shooter and having just shot on lane five, the whole scenario played out as he was walking across to lane one without looking up at the other shooters' targets, which totally deprived him of the visual spectacle that had everyone else's eyes bulging.

Russell told me that by the time he had dismounted his gun, removed the shell from the top barrel and turned around, he heard Ray fire two shots. When the referee did not immediately announce the result he simply assumed that Ray had shot a chip and drowned out the referee with his second shot. When however, after a couple of paces, the referee quietly announced "lost" with almost an audible inflexion of amazement, he felt a wry smile cross his face as if to mentally agree. Yes, it is always surprising when a shooter of Ray's calibre misses at a crucial time. His immediate thought was totally predictable. Well, now it's down to three.

Upon reaching the middle of the field and hearing Kim fire both barrels, he assured me that it definitely came as a surprise when the referee immediately called "lost" in a much more authoritive tone, as the situation now clearly had his undivided attention also. His immediate thought was: This now bears out the prediction I made when we got down to one squad. Roger and myself for the last two. He said he thought this because not only is Roger a great shooter, but also having previously won the event, he would be calmer and more confident than the others.

However when he heard Roger fire two shots and the referee instantly called lost so loudly that it surprised him, a kaleidoscope of things instantly flashed through his mind. The first was that because on the previous occasion in Perth in 1980 he had won the National Double Barrel in very controversial circumstances, he had always hoped not only to win the event again, but also to do it in a very ordinary fashion that would not invoke either discussion or debate. He said he clearly remembers thinking that although the former now seemed almost a fait accompli, the latter part of that ambition was totally shot to pieces.

With a laugh he added that the other thing that suddenly struck him was the significance of the number three. Last time it was three ammunition misfires and now it was three unprecedented consecutive misses. When I asked why he hesitated so long before firing the deciding shot, he confirmed that it was the result of all these abstract thoughts occupying his mind and that he had to intentionally clear it, and concentrate fully on one more shot, in order that he did not make the situation any more memorable than it already was. And as for his first thought after winning, he assured me that it was sorrow for the other three guys, who now had the unenviable task of having to go back out and try to make the best of this fiasco.

During the course of our conversation, Russell had mentioned how emotional his father Brian had become on the previous occasion in 1980, actually begging the relevant people in authority to forgo the Malfunction Rule and allow the shoot-off to continue, so that either his son or Doug Smith could attain a real and moral victory, rather than a hollow technical one. Although Brian once used to be a "fixture" at the Trap Nationals, performing many roles including MC at presentations and chief joke teller, as well as representing Olin-Winchester, he is rarely seen around the circuit these days.

However, as luck or fate would have it, he was on the grounds to

see his son fulfil his destiny and I could not resist the temptation to also gain his insight into the situation. Unable to hide either his obvious satisfaction with the day's proceedings or his insatiable sense of humour, when asked what he thought after the others had all missed, he said "I thought - In a minute Russell will put a couple of bullets in his gun and then those other three blokes will be in a lot of trouble." And in relation to his overview of the drama, he added with a laugh "I always said Russell was a lucky shooter."

As for my thoughts, I reckon that the only thing missing was for Rod Serling to have walked out onto ground five and announced that none of this was really happening and that it was just an extract from The Twilight Zone! On a more serious note I was tickled to death to see Steve Atkins single-handedly resurrecting Newton Thomas's custom of wearing his Silver Australia Badges on McIntosh Day. If I attend next year's shoot, my three will be proudly adorning my jacket. And on a lighter note, I now need to find a new name for Mark (I will win a National Title) McInnes, as his triumph in the Double Rise has pretty much invalidated the old one.

To Ray and Pat Mack for their support and to Bob and Linda Andrews who celebrated their 40th wedding anniversary with us, my heartfelt thanks for your attendance. It was a very emotional weekend for me, receiving the Presidential Medal and the giving out of the trophies on Graham's memorial event, but I got through it, and I thank everyone for the support shown, from my family as well as from friends. 

These are the main changes for the 2003 New South Wales Clay Target Association State Skeet Carnival to be held at the National Shooting Ground, Wagga from Friday 22nd to Sunday 24th August. The same basic program with the State 20 gauge and State handicap shot on the Friday each of 50 targets, The 100 target State Championship on the Saturday and concluding with the 50 target NSWCTA Championship and the 25 pair Skeet Doubles on the Sunday.

Great new sponsorship has been offered by Sydney Skeet shooter Colin Sim and includes a new Shield, "The James Miatt Memorial Shield", to be shot in conjunction with the 100 target State Championship. The sponsorship also includes \$1000 cash to be divided \$500 overall, \$100 first each grade and \$100 first junior. This sponsorship is guaranteed for the next threeyears. Thank you Colin on behalf of the Skeet Shooters of NSW.

Again another first for NSW with Free nominations being

offered to sub juniors this year. It is hoped we can attract an increased number of our younger Skeet Shooters with this new initative. Also reduced nominations of half price are offered to juniors again reducing the financial strain on parents for our shooters of the future. To the Editor

Dear Sir.

I write in support of the letter of Ken Knuth, which was printed in the April clay target news. This is a wake up call to all people who have any interest in any type of shooting related sports of any kind and one that has been voiced by thinking persons for many years.

As a dealer in firearms for thirty plus years, as well as a participant in full bore, small bore, pistol, shot gun and always involved in field shooting and vermin control I have seen the gradual erosion of the freedom to follow such pursuits and the increase in costs bought about by stupid and ineffective legislation most of which has come about to pacify a vocal minority and leave our law makers in peace. Truth and common sense are not readily discernable in most of the changes forced on us in the last 10 years or so.

As a dealer I made contributions to an association as well as to calls for financial support when requested to fight proposed changes and making steady support when a large wholesaler added a small percentage to every invoice to support a fighting fund.

I eventually refused to make any further contributions to any such funds until such time as all shooting related sports came together under a common banner, sighting the American Rifle Association as my personal example of the way to go.

That letter bought little effective response as witness the present situation (and it will get worse).

Nor for that matter do I expect that this letter will produce any greater effect than my earlier efforts.

Those in charge of or control of the units which make up the shooting sports seem ever reluctant to give up or share the power base they have, while, we, the members, who pay the costs, are content to enjoy our own section of our sport while we are left alone even if our brothers in another section are getting it where the chicken got the axe.

What will be the present outcome for pistol shooters legislation which is currently under review. Nothing good or helpful you may be sure and what have we as clay shooters done to help their cause if anything. If we have been in there helping I have not heard about and if such, was case I should be reading about it in my clay news every month as ought to be the case for any shooting organisation that prints a journal am also sure that any effort of benefit to shooters would be gladly taken up by the Australian Shooters magazine (I am also a member of long standing in this organisation). Their publication has at heart the well being of all aspects of shooting sports

and I believe the greatest circulation of any such paper in this country - therefore - greater publicity and interest. I have no doubt they would give their greatest co-operation that would further our interests.

Thankyou Ken for what I hope is in time for a wake-up call.

To all other sections of firearm related sports, I also say "wakeup" and let us unite to hold shut the stable door to enable us to keep what we have and to regain lost ground to improve the lot of responsible firearms use and ownership.

If we do not join to do so the horse will not only have truly bolted beyond recall, but the powers that be will take away the stable as well.

At nearly eighty years of age I may not have much shooting left but I wish for my son and grandsons that they are able to continue to know the pleasures of such sports, as they now do and I have done since firing my first shot at the age of seven.

Also, with three years of infantry service, including front line service during the Second World War, I can vouch for the advantages of the ability and confidence in firearms training and the use gained in civil life. When the enemy is at the gates it may be too late and there is no future.

To the Editor

Dear Sir,

I have just completed assisting at the World Cup in Perth, mainly in Skeet. Conducting Skeet Practice as well as refereeing skeet in the main events.

Having also assisted Adrian and competing in the National Skeet Championships, followed by the Olympic Discipline Nationals at which I was also shooting, as well as assisting. Some aspects of the rules became very apparent that had me write this letter.

Firstly the professionalism of all of those who competed in ISSF Skeet both at National and International level.

Secondly the clarity of the rules, that left no areas of doubt in interpretation.

Thirdly that infringement of the rules carried a warning backed up by a penalty.

There arose at the Skeet Nationals an incident where a shooter was warned for taking more than 15 seconds to prepare to shoot. The referee warned the shooter and on a subsequent infringement declared that he had forfeited a target.

On appeal to the jury this decision was over ruled and the shooter in question continued to shoot and eventually won the event after an extensive shoot off.

I personally timed the shooter and he never took less than 17 seconds and on one occasion 32 seconds to shoot his target (admittedly he was brushing our very friendly flies away on

that occasion) But mostly he took 20 or more seconds on each stand

The jury was correct in reversing the referees action, because rule 1.02 (e) states "that a shooter shall be warned once in each round with out penalty and the rule should be interpreted in conjunction with rule 4.16 (e) which enables a slow moving squad to be moved to another layout to complete so as to not hold up the competition."

I fail to see the value of a rule where a warning is given, that does not have a consequent penalty to back it up.

Rule 1.02 (d) gives 10 seconds for a trap shooter to call for his or her target after the shooter preceding them has completed firing. One warning then loss of one target if they do not comply.

Having been shooting for 50 years and seen all of the changes to the rules in that time, this incident highlights in my opinion a major inequity to fair competition and I urge the rules supervising committee to redress this rule (1.02 (e) to make it comply with best practice as demonstrated by world standards and give this rule some reason for having the 15 second time limit and bringing it in line with the preceding trap rule.

Since I started shooting clay targets as a C11 shooter in January 1980, I have never had to write to this column, mainly because other shooters have beaten me to it, and / or have said better than I could at the time.

However, since the rule changes (effective Jan 1.2003), I feel it necessary to add my weight to the comments made by Ronald W. Fenwick (Nov. 2002) and more recently by Vere Storch (May 2003).

Mr. Fenwick's letter hits the nail right on the head, in particular the sentence quote - You cannot justify a system of handicap using common mark as your base - unquote.

Vere Storch's was not only truthful & straight to the point, but echoed my feelings on these matters completely. There was one point however where I respectfully agree to disagree with her and that is the old system of handicapping where trophy value was involved. If my memory serves me correctly, this system was changed because of the fact it was open to manipulation by both Clubs and Shooters.

Many Clubs in Australia are no longer putting on Handicap events. The main reason for this is very simple. Club managements / members don't want them and won't shoot them. Why? Because of the book of rules!

In essence, the Rules Committee got it WRONG once more, which comes as no surprise to me or the many other shooters that I come in contact with on a regular, and sometimes irregular basis.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
