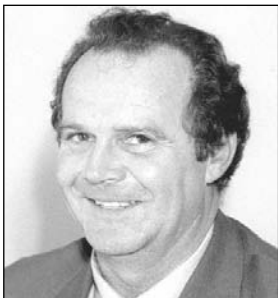

Successful SA State Skeet Carnival

Day 1, Saturday 17th May. Early morning revealed superbly presented grounds by the host South Australian Gun Club. The weather was overcast and breezy, but it did get a little windier with minor rain as the Carnival progressed and fairly bucketed down during and after presentations on the final day. The campers had settled in and were enjoying breakfast around the campfire. The State administrators were optimistically waiting to see if the programme, with doubled cash prizes, thanks to a grant received from the South Australian Government, and increased promotion, was to attract a good field of Skeet shooters. Practice the previous afternoon was very well patronized with some excellent shooting in the perfect conditions.

The effort was rewarded with 59 "Skeeties" trying their luck over the programme, a large increase over last year and the best attendance in the 6 years of the 3-day format.

Sincere thanks to all shooters from near and far for contributing to what was to prove a very successful carnival, with some exceptional shooting. Great to welcome interstate shooters: Laurie Parmenter, Marco Ponta and Clem Bertini from WA; Peter and Carmel Carlon, Bill Attwood and Bob Thorne from Victoria; Colin Sim, John Guberina and Paul Kouroupis from New South Wales and Henry Haythorpe from Queensland. Strong support was appreciated from the Broken Hill region and the South Eastern region.

The State Doubles C/S commenced the Carnival with two 47's leading the way. Kym Retsas (the beginning of the onslaught) and Guy Yoannidis, who was making a return after a long absence that obviously hadn't harmed his form. The shoot off lasted 6 targets with Guy successful as Overall and "A" winner 53/56 from Ray Kimber 46/50. "AA" was won by Kym 52/56 from Robert Dower 57/62 who outlasted 4 in the shoot off. Following a 3way shoot off "B" was won by Ray Mack 51/62 from Ken Atkin 50/62. Dougal Simson won "C" with a fine 46/50 from father Robert 42/50 and Bill Attwood 43/50 was the successful Veteran.

The State Handicap saw 15 shooters commence the shoot off with 7 on the 'wood', 4 with one up their sleeve, 2 with 2, one with 3 and one with 4. After a further 41 targets the dust settled with NSW

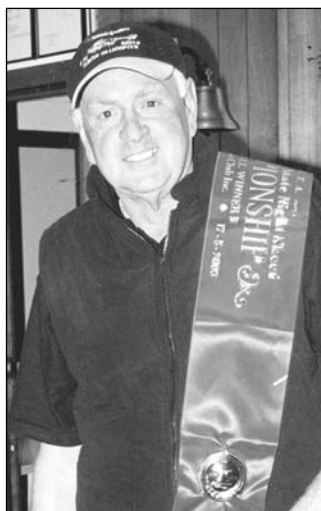

The host Club then conducted the State Night Skeet C/S with 21 starters braving the somewhat chilly and challenging conditions with overall honours going to NSW visitor John Guberina. Detailed results in the SAGC report.

Day 2. More windy and overcast weather. Following the completion of the Open Zones Team Shoot won by the Western Zone (Evan Stephenson, Wayne Channing, Barry Foley, Alan Pearson, Robin Freebairn, and John Holder) after a count back from Central Zone, shooters slipped into Event 3. The Festival City Skeet C/S. Kym Retsas recorded the only possible thus taking overall and "AA" honours from Robert Dower 48/50. Following the shoot offs "A" winner was Les Charles 60/61 from Sim-Hee Neoh 59/61. "B" Peter Hendy 49/50 from Jim Cornwell 48/51. "C" Robert Simson 46/50, Dougal Simson 45/50 and Veteran winner Bill Attwood 51/55.

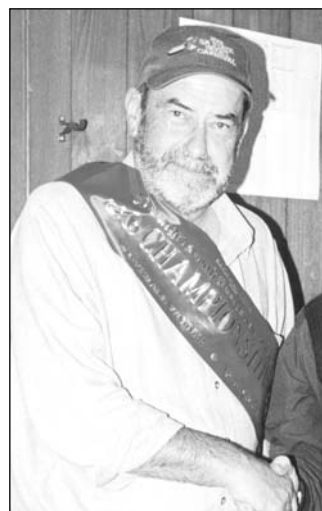
The field then presented for the premier event of the Carnival, the South Australian State Skeet Championship. The wind continued to play tricks with scoring and Kym Retsas (again) and Les Charles recorded the only possibles.

Kym succumbed to high 5 leaving Les with the State title and "A" honours. "AA" was won by Kym 60/61 from Brian Spring 50/51. "A" second Sim-Hee Neoh 65/66. "B" Peter Hendy 48/50 from Craig Bently 67/72. "C" Dougal Simson 47/50 from Junior Bradley Wilksch 42/50. Veteran Ray Kimber 49/50. The Champion Club team was the South Australian GC 247/250, represented by Kym Retsas, Les Charles, Sim Neoh, Colin Jacobs and Ray Kimber.

Day 3. Breezy and overcast. The Adelaide Skeet C/S saw 3 possibles, Kym Retsas (yet again) in "AA" and Evan Stephenson and

Ray Kimber in "A". "B" Darren Beck (a new skeet shooter) 52/55 from Dougal Simson (newly promoted) 51/55. "C" David Woolcock 59/62, Robert Hammat 58/62, Veteran Barry Foley 47/50.

At this point, Ray Kimber and Barry Foley had the difficult decision of deciding whether they wanted to qualify for the Open Team or Veteran Team. They both elected Open and were rewarded by making the Open Shoulder to Shoulder Team.

The final event, the Carnival Skeet C/S saw only the solitary possible from guess who? Yes Kym Retsas again who had completed

In reply to Mr Bevan Reibel's letter (July 2003) I took the opportunity of checking through all my record cards/books, and the following was revealed.

Up to and including the year 1994, ACTA registered shooters were issued with a folding Record Card of a different colour for each year.

Then, in 1995, the system changed to a small booklet (still called a Record Card) with a different coloured cover for each year, and, the membership year actually printed on the front cover. Also attached to the front cover was a white 'stick on' label which had all the member's details.

In 1998 the system was improved slightly when the Record Book, now grey in colour, was issued with the Membership Year also typed on the 'stick on' label with black printing was issued to each member upon renewal of annual registration. What an Excellent Idea, particularly if your book was a long way from being full.

Alas, in 2000 it was back to the old system of a new booklet of a different colour for each year. But at least someone got it right this year when the 'stick on' label was redesigned to match the

way the book is opened, read and entries made in it.

Mr Reibel has put forward an extremely valid & common sense idea and he is to be congratulated for it. My only comment is this. The 'stick on' labels that contains the shooters details would, as I see it, still have to come from the ACTA National Office. Apart from that all I can say is I fully support the idea, but I still can't figure out why it was discontinued after only being tried for one year.

Maybe it was just too intelligent and/or ahead of its time.

Dear Sir,

I wholeheartedly agree with Vere Storch's letter (May 2003) re her views of the present ACTA handicap rules and rule changes.

But in all fairness to our executive committee/office staff, who would preside over such a census? If the ACTA has say 10,000 members; we could expect say 7,500 returns with some 30,000 suggestions (approx. figures only). Then to sort out these variations in answer would be a mammoth task.

To any person who attended the Rules Committee question night at the National ground (Thurs 03/04/03) would have heard the Rules Committee chairman tell us why we have had to have these changes inflicted upon us. Mark stated that his son was taking up the sport of clay target shooting and wished to travel overseas to America, England and other countries to compete. Therefore Mark wanted his son to shoot exactly the same targets in Australia as he would overseas.

Well, Mark, as I stated at the meeting I wish him all the luck, because here you cannot go to any two clubs and shoot the same targets!!! We are in Australia and I think that we, the shooters, who provide the executive with the money they need, want one set of rules for Australian DTL and Skeet shooting for Australian conditions, not Bloody American rules.

To go back to the say 1970/80 rules whereby you shot at every unbroken target that was released at a 45° angle, went a set distance at a given height. If you won a handicap event you done a meter or two and depending on your ability you progressed backwards, nobody put you back without firing a shot. Why should a shooter be penalised a meter or two because they had a good run over the years off common mark?? When or where can a shooter shoot 600 handicap targets to come in a meter. I feel that this figure should be amended to 200 targets. What about a shooter who goes up a grade because of a good run on a good day and does 2metres, after 600 common mark targets he comes down a grade but what about his handicap?? Why should a novice/junior start on 15m, because they do in America??

To take matters a step further, lets look at the ACTA statement of Purposes & Rules (Constitution). Clause 2 para (a) states that the object of the Association is to create a single uniform entity in Australia for the promotion and encouragement of clay target shooting. Has the executive taken any steps towards this goal? At present, we (the legal shooters) cannot speak with a united voice to any Government of the day. Why can't the various organisations get their fingers out and create a united front?? Forget the internal hierarchy power struggle and promote our sport!

Sub Claus (d) states that the Association will at all times separate with and promote mutual trust and confidence between it and the members. Most shooters that I have spoken to believe that the rules committee are too secretive and need to be more transparent. By this I mean, we never know of any rule changes until they are published in Aug/Sept CTSN giving no time to reply before being enacted in January the following year.

To the rules committee I say let us the shooters have say in your decisions!!

Single Barrel and Double Rise he received \$40.00 for 1st in Single Barrel and \$30.00 for first in the Double Rise

Considering that the Junior Noms were \$40.00 and the Open were \$50.00 this seems to be a totally inadequate return for a National Title. There were approximately 10 open and 8 juniors who shot the Single Barrel in C grade for a pool of \$830.00. This is a return of around 5% for first in C grade, which is an absolute disgrace!

It seems that the ACTA Executive do not want to encourage juniors or grade shooters to attend the Nationals. We feel that the percentage break up of returns to all winners and place getters should be advertised so that shooters are able to see what percentage of money is to be left in their grade pools so they can decide whether it is worth while attending.

We are not impressed with the unnecessary rule changes and the way the ACTA want to Americanize shooting. This seems to be for the benefit of a few at the expense of what the majority wants.

Also combining handicap and common mark percentages where relatively new shooters are shooting off 17-19 meters after having never won a handicap event is not going to attract new shooters into the sport or old ones to stay.

Shouldn't we be looking after the juniors and new shooters, not trying to discourage them?

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS

August 2003

There are really only two items of equipment that are absolutely indispensable when you go out to shoot a round of Trap or Skeet. These are a gun and a box of shells. Both these items are so expansive and complex that I hope to write individual articles giving my views on each of them at some later time. This month I want to examine all the rest of the equipment that I refer to as Shooting Gear.

My reasoning for this is simple. Unfortunately, I see it as just another area that new shooters generally struggle to come to grips with, due to insufficient or contradictory advice in the early stages. This invariably leads them down the time honoured but debris-strewn road of trial and error. For that reason this subject has a chapter all of its own in my Shooting Manual, where I break the topic down into eight sub-sections and these are: Ear Protection, Glasses, Shooting Jackets and/or Pouches, Footwear, Headwear, Toe-tabs, Wet Weather Gear and Gear Bags.

As the first two items involve health and safety, I see them as basically mandatory. The next two are pretty much a practical necessity. And the last four can make life on the field a whole lot easier, and thus possibly the difference between whether you win or lose on any given day. The very last one, a Gear Bag, is actually the heading of another whole sub-section unto itself, but more of that later. Now I intend to examine each of them in turn in the above order.

EAR PROTECTION

Ear protection comes in two main forms - ear muffs and ear plugs. Of the two, ear muffs will usually provide the best ear protection, but they suffer from the general disadvantages of greater bulk, usually greater cost, interference with the gun stock and being too hot to be comfortable during extreme summer weather. They come in a wide range varying in cost and effectiveness from light simple examples, all the way to very expensive and sophisticated models incorporating selective amplifiers. Ear plugs also come in a wide range from simple foam rubber tubes through finned rubber plugs, with and without valves, and finally to the custom moulded rubber plugs, which are becoming increasingly popular with competition shooters.

GLASSES

Probably the single most important and complex item of shooting gear is a pair of shooting glasses. This is because they serve dual functions. The first is fairly basic and is simply eye protection. The other however is much more complex, and that is target perception improvement. From a safety viewpoint, glasses are desirable for all types of Clay Target shooting in order to protect the eyes from a number of things including gun powder residue, ejected hulls, dust on a windy day and/or metal shrapnel in the unlikely event of a gun blowing up.

Be aware also that a Skeet range introduces two more potential eye dangers that are not so prevalent in the other forms of Clay Target shooting. They are the chances of being struck by target pieces or ricocheting pellets. Due to the layout of a Skeet field, the line of the target flight, and the angle of some shots, the likelihood of being struck by target pieces or ricocheting pellets is greatly increased, especially where adjoining layouts are being used simultaneously. Neither of these hazards will usually have enough striking force to cause any serious bodily harm, except if they strike the eyes. So until the rules are changed to make the practice mandatory, always wear glasses when on or near any Skeet range.

The critical areas of early and clear target perception can be greatly improved by wearing glasses with coloured lenses. Glare and squinting can be reduced by wearing darkened lenses on

bright sunny days, and target vision can be improved by using lenses which enhance the target colour and increase the contrast with the background. When shooting black targets the best lens colour is probably the one that most greatly de-enhances the particular background colour. However if fluoro or orange-domed targets are being used, I believe the best lenses are probably dark red/orange for bright sunny days and light red/orange for overcast days. Plus I always carry a set of clear lenses for very low light conditions and/or night shooting.

Rather than carrying numerous pairs of glasses, the most practical solution is to have a pair of good quality frames that accept interchangeable lenses. Not only does this system reduce the cost and bulk of a good glasses package, but allows the use of the same set of comfortable familiar glasses under all conditions. The three main attributes that glasses require, in order to be suitable for all forms of Clay Target shooting, are wrap-around ear pieces, so that they don't move under recoil, the absolute minimum of exterior framework to minimise distraction, and the minimum possible dimension in the middle between the lenses in order to maximize off-centre vision.

SHOOTING JACKETS/POUCHES

The primary function of either a shooting jacket or a pouch is to provide a method of carrying up to two boxes of shells while you are shooting each round. The advantages of jackets are their greater potential carrying capacity (for both live and fired shells if you reload) and their ability to incorporate a recoil pad on the shoulder. Their main disadvantage, as with ear muffs, is the fact that they become too hot to be comfortable during extreme summer weather. For novice shooters who can most appreciate the shoulder padding, or if you only shoot during the cooler months or in the southern states, a professional tailor made shooting jacket is definitely well worth the extra expense. But don't bother taking it to Darwin for a two-day shoot in January.

Pouches have the general advantages of less bulk, lower cost and their ability to be comfortable in all weather conditions. They are available with dual compartments for those people who save their fired shells and I believe the most practical belt arrangement is a 2" light-weight nylon webbing one with a quick-release catch. The ultimate Clay Target shooting pouch has a velcro flap compartment on the front which neatly holds a hard glasses case and an ear plug holder, and also has a small pocket sewn into the back of the rear compartment for carrying such things as alternate shells, practice tickets, a wad remover plug, lunch money, etc etc.

FOOTWEAR

The last item of practical necessity for a Clay Target shooter is some type of suitable footwear. Such special footwear has two main requirements. It needs to be very comfortable and it needs to provide very sure footing. Leather soled cowboy boots and high heel shoes have no place on a Clay Target range. During a normal two-day shoot, a minimum of three hours will be spent standing on the field, so comfort is paramount. The last thing you need to be thinking about between shots is sore or uncomfortable feet. Soft rubber soles are highly desirable even in dry weather, let alone when standing on smooth wet slippery concrete swinging your gun around and shifting your weight from foot to foot. They are even more desirable walking to your field down a grassy slope or an inclined concrete path where a fall could result in serious damage to your valuable gun or injury to yourself. Most shooters agree that a pair of good quality tennis-shoes or sneakers are the most suitable footwear available. They are light, comfortable, relatively inexpensive, have stable soles, and being generally white, are as cool as possible during the summer.

HEADWEAR

Any hat with at least a brim at the front will suffice. The most widely used and convenient type is a peaked cap. These caps not only look good, but also serve many useful functions. On a sunny day they keep the glare off your glasses and the sun out of your eyes. On a rainy day they help keep the raindrops off your glasses and out of your eyes. On a windy day they keep your hair from blowing in your eyes. In very cold weather a cap made from thick solid material will help keep you warm and in very hot weather a lightweight cap with a mesh-back will keep your head shaded whilst also allowing ventilation.

TOE TABS

The best way to hold a shotgun whilst waiting to shoot, either on or off the layout, is with it broken open and held by the pistol grip with the muzzle resting on the top of your shoe. The only two disadvantages of this method are that it puts a dirty mark on your shoe, and causes discomfort to the top of your foot after a while. Both can be reduced by wearing a toe tab on the appropriate shoe. Toe tabs come in two types - the leather flaps which have been around for ages, or the newer plastic barrel buttons. Most toe tabs clip onto your shoelaces and both types work well.

WET WEATHER GEAR

Clay Target shooting tournaments continue on in all weather conditions except when lightning is visible. Therefore, sooner or later you will have to shoot in the rain, so carrying your rain-suit with you at all times makes good sense. The most practical type is a separate jacket and pants made from light waterproof nylon, which will roll up into a compact bundle when not being used.

SHOOTING GEAR BAGS

The primary function of a shooting gear bag is to be the central base of operations for a well organized Clay Target shooter. Sounds pretty simple and it really is, but not many people actually get around to setting one up. A Gear Bag has two main functions. The first is to minimise your checklist as you leave the house to go shooting. That checklist should have a maximum of five items.

Gun, Shells, Gear Bag, Shooting shoes and Hat. The last two can be eliminated if you prefer to wear these from the house or choose to utilise a Bag big enough to accommodate these.

The second main function is to have a handy accessible place where you keep all the rest of your shooting gear. Start the contents agenda with every mortal thing that you can think of, that you may need at some time at the Gun Club. Then progressively add every other thing that you find you could use and don't have, along with every other thing you see someone else with, and realise that you may need yourself some day. Obviously the contents will start with your earmuffs and plugs, your glasses and spare lenses, your pouch and shooting jacket and your wet weather gear.

However also add your ACTA handicap card, a hand towel, a biro and/or pencil, a notebook and an ACTA rulebook. Add other items as you see fit and don't overlook a "spare one" of many of the items, in case of loss or breakage. Your contents list should never be finished, but your goal is to work towards a situation where you can never say, "I would have shot better today if only I hadn't forgotten to bring item X", or "I could have won today if only I'd had an item Z." Finally remember versatility. Have a jacket and a pouch. Carry earmuffs and earplugs. No matter which you prefer, use the other occasionally so that you are ready for and comfortable in all situations.

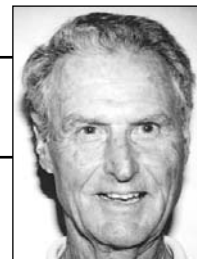

I keep getting asked to restart my piece that I had monthly in CTSN so I will send this one in to give our biggest shoot, the "Heritage City One Day" and the "Maryborough Masters Games" a plug. COMMONWEALTH GAMES 2006

Top Guns and the Law

Shooting is the only sport on the Melbourne 2006 Commonwealth Games program, where athletes will be required by law, to comply with state & territory legislation before they are able to participate in the Games. The Victorian Firearms Act 1966, Act No. 66/1966, concerns firearms and ammunition, which for athletes participating in the Commonwealth Games shooting events, is their sporting equipment.

Under The Victorian Firearms Act, penalties, including the possible confiscation of firearms, monetary fines and terms of imprisonment, may be imposed on any person who fails to comply with or breaches the conditions of their Firearm's Licence or Permit.

There is a need for the Organising Committee for the Melbourne 2006 Commonwealth Games (M2006), to possess a Firearms Procedures Manual, to ensure that all persons concerned with the shooting events of the Melbourne 2006 Commonwealth Games are able to comply with Federal, State/Territory legislative requirements. Currently no such document exists.

As a result, a comprehensive Firearms Procedure Manual has been produced for M2006 to use as the model for the control of firearms, ammunition and spare parts, for the 2005 Commonwealth Shooting Championships and Melbourne 2006 Commonwealth Games. The manual which is designed to assist the M2006 with the successful implementation and delivery of the shooting events in 2005 and 2006, is concerned with the carriage, use and possession of firearms, ammunition and spare parts. It includes the required police forms for the issue of International Visitor Firearm Permit and customs forms for the import and export of firearms, ammunition and spare parts.

The manual addresses international and domestic airline requirements, transportation of what is primarily sporting equipment to and from the competition venue armory, security at the competition venue, carriage use and possession of firearms and ammunition by athlete's and official's at the venue and athletes access for training and competition. It also identifies firearms licensing requirements for competition officials and M2006 staff and volunteers involved with the carriage, use and possession of firearms and ammunition, as well as pre and post-competition storage.

International athletes must possess a valid International Visitor Firearm Permit, issued by the Police Licensing Service of the Australian state/territory in which they arrive, for them to legally carry, use and possess firearms in Australia. National athletes must possess a valid State/Territory Firearms Licence. Few people, apart from those closely associated with shooting, would be aware that the same requirements and penalties will extend to coaches, team managers, competition officials, Melbourne 2006 staff and even volunteers, involved with the carriage, use and possession of firearms at the Games.

Australian athletes, team coaches, specific Games officials and M2006 staff and volunteers involved with the carriage, use and possession of firearms and ammunition, are required to possess a valid Firearms Licence issued in their home state/territory. For persons living in Victoria, the Firearms Licence is issued by the Victorian Firearms Licensing Service (VFLS), a department of the Victorian Police. For persons living outside Victoria, the VFLS, under a reciprocal licensing agreement, recognises licences issued by other states/ territories licensing services.

Under the Australian Customs (Prohibited Import) Regulations 1956, made under the Customs Act 1901, international athletes, coaches and team managers, must possess a Police/Customs' Import Form (B709A) to enable them to import firearms, ammunition and/or spare parts for the Games. Any person arriving in Australia without the required Form B709A will have their firearms, ammunition, and/or spare parts held by Customs, until such time as the Victorian Firearms Licensing Service or its state/

territory counterpart issues the B709A.

Under the Australian Customs (Prohibited Export) Regulations 1958, as amended, made under the Customs Act 1901, firearms and spare parts imported into Australia for authorised shooting events, cannot be disposed of in Australia and must therefore be exported. Persons who have imported firearms and spare parts are required to present all firearms and spare parts, together with a Restricted Goods Permit (RGP) to Customs when departing the country. Unused ammunition not being exported must be legally disposed of to a licensed person prior to departure.

In addition to the 2006 Games, approximately 400 international competitors will be coming to Australia for the 2005 Commonwealth Shooting Championships, to gain competition experience for the 2006 Commonwealth Games. M2006 has the responsibility to clearly communicate to them, state/territory firearms licensing requirements and Australian Customs' requirements, for the import and export of their firearms, ammunition and spare parts.

A comprehensive information leaflet, containing detailed advice of what is both required and expected of athletes and officials, will be forwarded to International Federations participating in the 2005 Commonwealth Shooting Championships and Commonwealth Games Association's participating in the 2006 Commonwealth Games. Information contained in the leaflet will enable international competitors individual compliance with the conditions of their Firearms Permit.

Prior to their departure for Australia, M2006 will provide athletes and official's participating in the 2005 Commonwealth Shooting Championships and Melbourne 2006 Commonwealth Games, with the appropriate Police/Customs' Import Form (B709A) and International Visitor Firearms Permit application forms.

Will international athletes bringing firearms and ammunition to Australia in 2005 and 2006, face greater requirements to compete in Australia than in other countries? Who better to answer this question than Russell Mark, Atlanta 1996 Double Trap Gold medallist, Sydney 2000 Double Trap Silver medallist and four times Olympian?

Russell, you have been competing internationally now for more years than you may wish to remember and Australia probably has no one more experienced in competing as a shooter in international events than yourself. With the experience that you have gained throughout what has been an outstanding sporting career, your views will no doubt be of interest to our readers.

Do you feel that athletes entering Australia with firearms and ammunition in 2005 and 2006 will find Australian Customs laws, different to those of other countries?

Australia is generally in line with the rest of the world with customs and police requirements. Competitive shooters, irrespective of what country they are from, expect that there will be customs requirements and inspections.

How do you think international athletes will cope with Australian export laws?

The latest Custom Restricted Goods Permit (RGP) form introduced on July 1st 2002, caught people a little off guard because the previous form was so well known to most shooters. Providing they are able to produce their RGP and their firearms for Customs, taking firearms from the country will not be a problem.

Firearms, such as air rifles, which are required to be licenced in Australia, are not required to be licenced in some countries. Do you think that athletes are aware, that they will need to obtain a licence for all firearms when they come to Australia?

Athletes competing in international shooting events are accustomed to having to comply with Police requirements for their

firearms, as are Australian shooters when they travel and compete overseas. The need to obtain an International Visitor Firearm Permit, will come as no surprise to shooters coming to Melbourne for the Commonwealth Games, particularly so for those who took part in the Sydney 2000 World Cup and Olympic Games.

From your experience, will international athletes, team managers and coaches, understand the conditions of their International Visitor Firearm Permit, with regard to what is legally required of them to carry, use and possess firearms in Australia?

As the Victorian Firearms Licensing Service will no doubt clearly describe conditions to apply for International Visitor Firearm Permits and shooters being more aware than most, about what not to do concerning firearms, there should not be any problems in this regard.

Do they think that they understand that penalties could apply, if they fail to comply with the conditions of their International Visitor Firearm Permit? Penalties could include the possible cancellation of the Permit and confiscation of their firearm, which as a result would exclude them from competing. Shooters being responsible athletes have long been aware and understand that they must comply with the firearm laws for the country they are competing in. Melbourne in 2006 will be no different.

Apart from M2006 providing as much early information as possible prior to their arrival, is there anything you believe could be done to ensure that athletes, team managers, coaches and international competition officials do not breach the conditions of their IVFP?

I believe you can only provide the relevant countries with the requirements of our government. The onus is then on the individual to meet these requirements

Russell thanks for your views. Having won the Double Trap

World Cup in Perth in March, which produced a starting placed for Australia in Athens, you are continuing to experience your share of success, all of which is well deserved. Best of luck for selection as a member of what would be your fifth Australian Olympic Team in 2004.

Well there you have it. It seems from Russell's responses, that persons importing firearms in 2005 and 2006 will not find Australian Customs laws much, if any, different from those of any other country. It also appears that athletes do have a clear understanding of what will be required of them when they compete in Australia. Their obligation to meet and comply with these requirements, as Russell clearly points out, is an individual one.

Alan Maher, the author of the Firearms' Procedure Manual, completed a PostGraduate Diploma in Sport Business at Victoria University in 2002. He is currently in the final year of a Masters of Sport Business at Victoria University, for which the Firearms Procedure Manual produced for M2006 is an elective project.

During 2002, he acted as a Contract Consultant to the Victorian Department of Sport & Recreation and Melbourne 2006, undertaking a Shooting Venue Feasibility Study for the Melbourne 2006 Commonwealth Games.

He has been involved with the shooting sports as Executive Director, Australian Clay Target Association, 1985-1992, Chief Executive Officer, National Rifle Association of Australia, 1993-1995, Vice President, Australian Shooting Association, 1986-1992, Competition Manager-Shooting, Sydney 2000 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

TAKING UP CLAY TARGET SHOOTING

So you want to take up clay target shooting, many people have done so and even if they have not become champions, have had many years of pleasant recreation. Much of the enjoyment comes from sharing a common interest in guns and shooting with people with the same interests.

What you get from a sport is resultant from what you put into it. One does not have to record a win to have a pleasant relaxing day. Far from it, many people, (far more than is realized) do not really like the stresses and effort required for competition and really look for a relaxing day with friends in an atmosphere that they enjoy. This particularity applies to people with very demanding jobs and a lot of responsibilities are in part forgotten.

One does not have to have an expensive outfit to perform well, standard model trap or skeet guns are far superior in ability to what we are. Consequently, we can forget that side of it, and we can perform adequately with the standard cartridge produced for trapshooting by a reputable manufacturer.

With cartridges though, keep away from the heavier loads, as they add to the stress factors created by blast and recoil.

One needs comfortable clothing - a well fitted shooting jacket, good substantial shoes and a cap or hat to keep the sun from one's eyes or face.

Hearing protection is essential and this comes in the form of muffs or ear plus, the muffs being the most effective.

Skeet shooters should always use glasses for eye protection and most shooters will benefit by using anti-glare glasses of some kind.

Early shooting days have a great bearing on future abilities and care should be taken to adopt a comfortable simple shooting style, exaggeration here will only cause future problems.

Take time out to watch the best shots in action and learn from what they do and how they will do it. Most of them are very approachable and will be very willing to help one who is interested enough to ask questions relative to the sport.

Set yourself goals for improvement, and work steadily toward them - when you achieve one, look to the next.

Always compete against your best scores and not the other fellow.

Correct thinking plays a far greater part in competition shooting than most people realize. One must bring the sport down to its most basic level and build a score as one would build a wall of bricks - one at a time and each one of equal value. Shoot twenty matches of one target each instead of one match of twenty targets.

If you have a Coach at your Club, make yourself known to him. He will be able to help you in many ways.

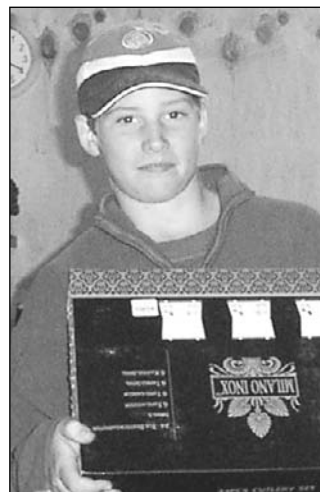

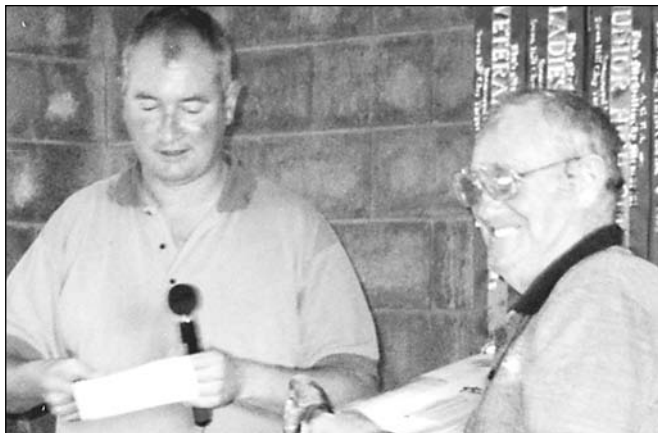

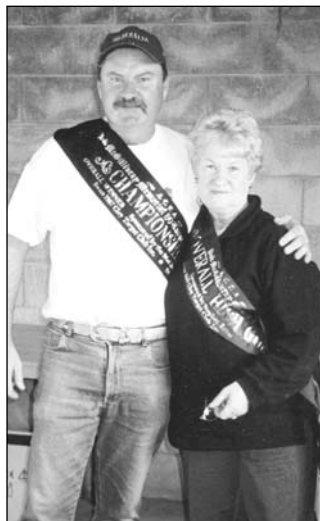

SEARCH FOR SHOTGUN

Joe Wheeler — One of England's best

The lady on the phone was from a local B&B. "I have a gentleman here looking for a shotgun", she said, "maybe you can help".

The gentleman (in the true sense of the word) was Joe Wheeler. Joe was in Benalla (Victoria) to fly gliders. Two years ago at the age of 82 he completed his first solo flight in a glider; he set a British record for being the oldest person to do so. The previous time Joe had been in Australia was to compete as a member of the British shooting team at the 1956 Olympic Games.

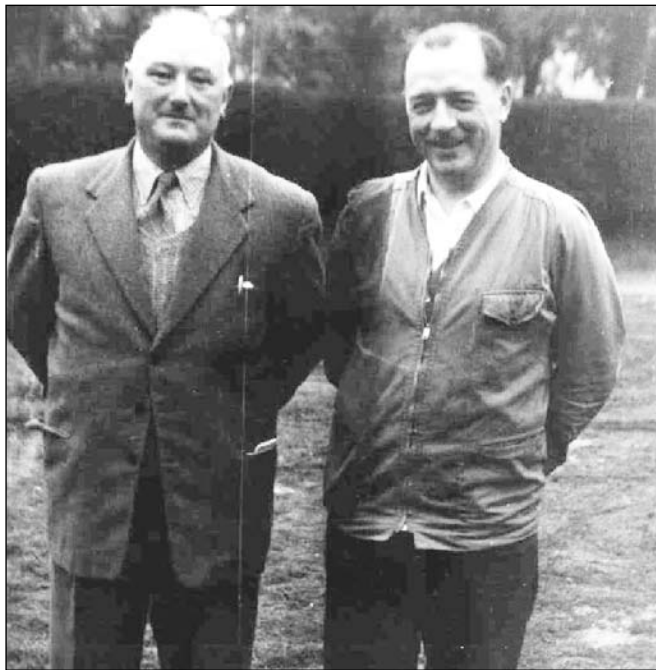
I was living at Barham in 1956 and had first hand experience with the Big Flood. As a youngster I remember seeing Newton Thomas shoot at the Commonwealth Galah Championships at Kerang around the 1950's era. I remembered that an English Olympic shooter had come to Barham with Newton Thomas after the Olympics and shot ducks.

Was it the same Joe Wheeler, the man regarded as possibly the greatest English clay target shooter of the 1900's. It was!

Joe Wheeler was born in England in 1918. His father was head game-keeper on a 13,000-acre estate. Joe describes him as the best shotgun shooter he has ever seen. He, however, would not shoot clay birds. When asked why his stock answer was "When you can eat 'em I will shoot 'em" Young Joe graduated from a slingshot to a single barrel 410 shotgun at age 6. About two years later he stepped up to a double barrel 16 gauge. For quite a while he was only allowed to load both

barrels for special occasions such as fox hunting. His father was a tough taskmaster. Joe would be sent out with instructions to bring home a set number of duck or rabbit etc. He was issued with the same number of cartridges as the game to be brought home.

There was an order to the way that game was hunted. From August 12th Duck and Snipe were shot. Partridge started from 1st September and Pheasants 1st October. During these hunts some

rabbits and hares were usually taken as well. Some foxes were shot but care was taken that enough stayed around for hunting with hounds. Hunting with hounds, or more specifically some of the practices that sometimes occur, is not looked on favorably by Joe. From February 1st gamekeepers were tasked with reducing rabbit and hare numbers. In the 1935 cull the Wheeler father and son combination shot 11000 rabbits with shotguns.

Joe's first experience with clay target shooting came in 1930. Taken to a shoot by his father he borrowed a competitor's gun and won the event with it. He borrowed the same gun to shoot in competitions in 1939 and 1947 winning once and coming second in the other.

Joe joined the RAF in 1937, wanting to train as a pilot. Rejected for pilot training he instead trained as an armourer. He got regular flights in aircraft testing armament systems. Joe kept his shotgun with him on the base right through the war (and his dog

while based in England). 1943/44 was spent based in Iceland. In the summer period waterfowl were there in huge numbers. If a special event like a ship coming in or high Brass coming was imminent; Joe would be issued with a case of 500 cartridges and told to stock the larder. Service life was tough.

Post war Joe worked in the gun trade and bought a gun and sporting goods business in 1950. He expanded into other businesses over the years.

From 1949 to 1972 Joe competed in major shotgun events in most parts of the world. He was one of an elite group known as the "Internationals". Olympic Trench, Skeet and down the line were all shot. Joe was a competitor in 4 Olympic Games, and was team manager for the Irish team twice. This created a hazardous situation when they were billeted close to the Israeli team at Munich in 1972.

Live bird trap shooting was also done in France, Spain, Portugal, Italy, Belgium, Egypt, Lebanon and Mexico. 'The only shooting I could make a bit of money' on commented Joe. Right through this period there was no money in sport, unlike today.

Joe tells of one competitor who was so disgusted with the trophy he got for winning a major event that he threw it up in the air and blasted it to pieces with his shotgun.

During Joe's shooting career he won well in excess of 400 major championships. These included:

Coronation Cup (high gun of Great Britain) 11 times

British Championship 8 times

German Championship 4 times

Belgian Championship 3 times

His best run was in the late 60's when he won 9 shoots in succession in 7 countries.

In 1957 Joe established a record for break open shotguns which he believes still stands. Using side by side game guns with double triggers, he broke 1000 clays in 42 minutes and went on to break 1308 in one hour from 1454 shots. Eley had given the club 3000 cartridges to try to beat the previous record. As Joe had beaten the



old record so convincingly the club decided to present the unused cartridges to him. However when they went to get the cartridges they had been stolen. All Joe got for his effort was a place in the record books.

Although he retired from competition shooting in 1972, Joe still indulged in a little Game shooting and even found time for some Salmon fishing. In 1988 he sold his business interests except for the Gun shop, he bought a small farm and set up shooting ranges and established a shooting school. He instructed men, woman and children in most types of clay target shooting. In 1997 the sudden death of Joe's wife was a huge blow. Following this he closed the school down. Joe retained the Gun shop until last year.

At Melbourne in 1956, Edward Fear and Joe were the members of the British shotgun team. From previous encounters they knew, and were friendly with, Newton Thomas, Fred Burns and Jock Wilson, who were Australian Officials and well-known local shooters. At the completion of the games Joe and Edward were taken as guests of Newton Thomas to the family farm north of Barham in NSW.

Joe's recollection is of a long drive from Melbourne in a fairly large car. They took provisions with them and had a picnic lunch along the way. 1956 was an extremely wet year, and large amounts of this country were still covered by remnant floodwaters. The home-stead was a considerable distance north of the Murray and had barely escaped the recent floodwaters. Water had been lapping at the doorstep.

Just prior to their arrival a sheep had been killed and butchered. Breakfast the next morning consisted of lamb chops at an outdoor barbecue. They were then introduced to galah shooting and the habit of galahs of circling a downed comrade. One can only imagine the holes that three of the world's top shooters must have cut in these wheeling mobs of galahs. Probably with ammo supplied by ICI. (Newton Thomas was an ICI professional).

In the evenings they valiantly defended the rice fields from attack by ducks. These had bred in large numbers on the floodwaters. At one stage a kangaroo was shot with a .243. This was skinned, probably for dog tucker. The .243 was also used to remove some white cockatoos from their customary perches at the tops of tall trees.

Joe thinks their stay was about 5 days, but is very clear about the fact that lots of ducks and galahs were shot.

Unfortunately, low finances forced Joe to sell his shotgun before returning to England. Now all these years later one of Joe's remaining ambitions is to trace his old gun. He thinks the person he sold it to was a farmer in Victoria. The sale took place at the shooting range.

Psychological Aspects of Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

ANXIETY AND FEAR

In my last article I explored the elements of mental toughness which is defined as a set of beliefs about yourself, your work, your sport and how they interact. Those behaviours and beliefs; competitiveness, confidence, control, commitment, composure, courage and consistency are all skills that we can learn and adopt easily. Why then don't we all have them? Why aren't we all mentally tough all the time? What gets in the road of us being mentally tough?

The simple answer is that we get in our own way. Our own self defeating thoughts and behaviours are the roadblocks that undermine our ability to perform: fear, anger, anxiety, self-consciousness, perfectionism, stubbornness, lack of motivation, competitiveness, distractions and persistence.

Fear is a mental response to a perceived danger or threat. It's a primitive response that allows us to fight or flee from a threat. The fight/flight response was necessary when as cavemen we wandered the jungle and had the threat of sabre-toothed tigers lurking behind every bush. We had to develop a system that allowed us to either stay and fight or get the hell out of there. The threats have now gone but as modern man we have retained the fight/flight response when the majority of our fears are not life threatening at all.

So what is so fearful about clay target shooting? Most readers will probably have answered this question with "missing". But is it? Is it not the thought of missing?

The thought that you might miss is what causes self doubt and leads to flinching, baulking, depressed self image, and feelings of failure and poor self worth.

Whilst missing a target may seem bad at the time and may deny you the opportunity of winning, your world as you know it will not come to a screaming halt just because you missed a target. There won't be lightning bolts or terrible troubles that will beset you.

The only thing that will happen is that you may be too hard on yourself: and the more you punish yourself the poorer you will perform and the fear of missing will be greater next time. This will happen because fear will lead to failure and the failure will lead to the fear of failing again and this will manifest itself as anxiety

Anxiety and fear are not the same; anxiety is your response to fear - apprehension, heightened vigilance, hyperventilating, dilated pupils, sweating, racing pulse and running faster than a speeding bear. (Farnbach, 2001) Farnbach defines anxiety as a state of heightened arousal of the mind and body, associated with a belief that the individual is at risk and that he/she has a diminished capacity to control what is happening, or what might happen, to him or her. Anxiety can range from mild to severe.

The effects of anxiety can be on the mind and/or the body and can involve;

- * The emotions or feelings - effects can be irritability, apprehension, uneasiness, fear, panic and terror.

- * Mental or cognitive functioning; the mind can be racing, frozen, disorganised, inability to attend, concentrate and remember.

- * Physiological or body reactions - can be either increased muscle tension and can be shaking, jerky movements and poor co-ordination, or over activity of the sympathetic nervous system - can be sweating, shaking, palpitations, etc.

- * Behavioural patterns - including restlessness, talking excessively, irritable behaviour and self medicating with alcohol or drugs.

The problem with fear and anxiety is that they have the ability to interfere with what we like to do. Because humans do not like being in an anxious state we often subconsciously do things to avoid it. If we are shooting well and are starting to get nervous

about shooting so many straight, then when we miss a target we subconsciously feel relieved because now we do not have to worry any more about missing a target. The same thing happens when we freeze on the trigger; the fear of missing a target creates anxiety that stops our ability to move our muscles and therefore we can't even pull the trigger. This then makes us more anxious and so on and so on.

Where does this anxiety come from? When I ask shooters what are you afraid of if you miss, they usually say that they are not scared of missing, but subconsciously there are four types of irrational beliefs that are interfering with their ability to shoot well and enjoy themselves, and thereby developing anxiety and fear within the shooter.

These irrational beliefs are:

1. I must act competently and correctly at all times.
2. I must be approved of and accepted by everybody.
3. Everyone must act competently and correctly.
4. Life must give me what I want.

In my next article I will explore how each of these irrational beliefs effect our ability to perform by producing fear and anxiety and what we can do.

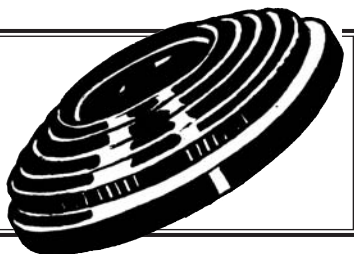

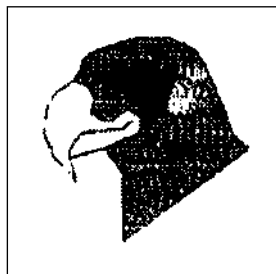

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

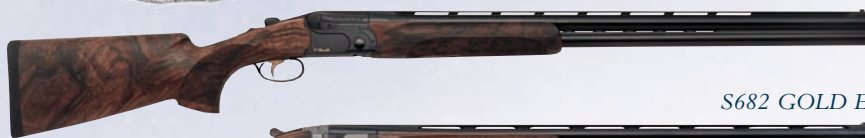

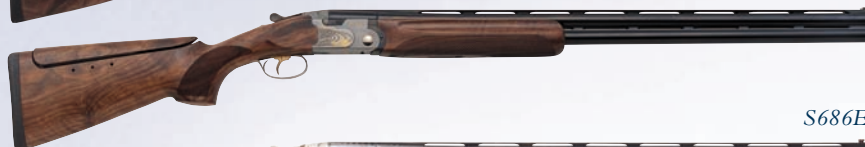
