





The trap team and officials departed Sydney for Granada via Singapore, Frankfurt and Madrid on the 20th June. Thirty-seven hours later they arrived in Granada only to find that Deserie and Michael's guns had not arrived. The Japanese team who had arrived on the same flight from Madrid also had a gun missing. After much drama with the airline we were assured that the guns would arrive the following day.

Our home for the next ten days was to be the hotel Grand Luna which proved to be very comfortable and well situated with restaurants of all types in the near vicinity. Granada is a city of 500,000 located in the southern region of Spain and nestled in a valley at the base of the Sierra Nevada mountain range. The city is very picturesque and sits in the shadow of an 11,000-ft high mountain that has a snow capped peak even in summer.

Our first impression of the shooting range was one of absolute awe. The complex consists of a magnificent clubhouse / admin building with six clay target ranges and full ISSF pistol and rifle ranges. The club has accommodation in the main building, a gym and a pool is planned for the future. With this entire infrastructure it is a very appealing location to utilise as a training camp venue and I'm sure it was built with this in mind.

The clay target range consists of one dedicated double trap range, then five trap fields of which three have skeet superimposed. The whole complex must rate as one of the finest anywhere and is

rumoured to have cost 12 million euros (\$A 21.5 m).

The day after our arrival there was unofficial practice available and while the rest of the team took advantage of this Deserie and Michael went out to the airport to check on the gun situation. We were told that ten guns had been lost in transit. Deserie's gun had turned up, but not Michael's. Despite dozens of calls by Dexter to Qantas in Australia, Germany and the UK as well as to Iberian Airlines all over Spain, the gun could not be traced.

On official trap training day we borrowed three different guns for Michael and finally settled on one with an adjustable stock to use in competition in the event his did not make it in time.

The entries for this event were the highest ever recorded with 250 trap, 215 skeet and 140 double trap competitors taking part. With these huge numbers the shooting schedule started early and finished late, 8.00 am till 8.00pm, with temperatures in the mid thirties.

Michael again proved he is one of the very best trap shooters in the world with an unbelievable 124 in qualifying, with a borrowed gun! His effort was the talk of the tournament and showed why he is held in such high esteem by the shooting world. Unfortunately his final was not up to his usual standard and he finished in sixth place. Adam shot well to post a 121 and 11th place and all three Aussie's shot the second day 50 straight to give us 150 / 150 for the day and propel our team to bronze and showed why Australia is viewed as one of the top nations in the clay target field.

With the double trap and skeet being contested at the same time, and only three ranges for each, the big entries were causing a nightmare. The shoot program was changed at the last minute to have the skeet start at 07.15 and the ladies skeet over two days starting at 14.00 each day.

As can be seen by the scores the men's skeet is incredible and so competitive at this level.

Russell shot a great qualification including a 50 in the first round but had an uncharacteristic 40 in the final (very windy difficult conditions as can be seen by finals scores) to win the silver. Overall a great effort from Russell which should propel him to the top of the world rankings.

As mentioned the huge entries caused massive scheduling problems for the organisers, which saw them change the program several times. It also caused communication problems with competition draws not being available till 9.30pm the night before the event. Luckily the sun sets around 10.00pm as there were still squads shooting at 9.00pm some nights.

Competition for up to 12 - 14 hours a day and temperatures in the mid 30's took it's toll on everyone over the tournament. Thanks go to Dexter for his efforts in trying to locate missing guns, rearrange airline tickets and generally extracting information that was not forthcoming. To Darien who worked his fingers to the bone and generally volunteered for any task that was required. To Nick, the VIS sports scientist who videoed all the performances, kept track of the competition diaries and monitored everyone's hydration levels (he must get sick of checking urine samples every day).

All in all a very taxing trip that produced some of the best overall results ever. A finalist in five of the six events, an individual silver and bronze, three team bronze and most importantly an Olympic quota.

Australia now has two men's trap quotas, one men's double trap quota and now our ladies double trap. With only one world cup, the world championships and Oceania Games left to win quotas, it shows just how close the Athens Olympics are.

In reply to Mr Bevan Reibel's letter (July 2003) I took the opportunity of checking through all my record cards/books, and the following was revealed.

Up to and including the year 1994, ACTA registered shooters were issued with a folding Record Card of a different colour for each new year.

Then, in 1995, the system changed to a small booklet (still called a Record Card) with a different coloured cover for each year, and the membership year actually printed on the front cover. Also attached to the front cover was a white 'stick on' label which had all the member's details.

In 1998 the system was improved slightly when the Record Book, now grey in colour, was issued with the Membership Year also typed on the 'stick on' label along with the member's details.

For the 1999 Membership Year no booklet was issued. Instead a bright Orange 'stick on' label with black printing was issued to each member upon renewal of annual registration. What an Excellent Idea, particularly if your book was a long way from being full. Alas, in 2000 it was back to the old system of a new booklet of a different colour for each year. But at least someone got it right this year when the 'stick on' label was redesigned to match the way the book is opened, read and entries made in it.

Mr Reibel has put forward an extremely valid & common sense idea and he is to be congratulated for it. My only comment is this. The 'stick on' labels that contains the shooters details would, as I see it, still have to come from the ACTA National Office. Apart from that all I can say is I fully support the idea, but I still can't figure out why it was discontinued after only being tried for one year. Maybe it was just too intelligent and/or ahead of its time.

A large percentage of the hospital's patients come from outside the metropolitan area and a number of them have difficulty coping with a big city and the high costs of living. This where the hospital's Samaritan Fund comes to the rescue through its Welfare Officers who offer assistance to those who need a helping hand. Assistance in the form of food, clothing, travel assistance, personal items and phone calls home are just some of the small ways the Fund assists people to cope with their unexpected arrival at a big city hospital.

I understand the Gold Coast Clay Target Club is going to have another fundraiser for this cause and I would commend any support they might seek to make the project a success. The fundraising Raffle will run from September to Christmas and will be drawn at the Christmas Shoot.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS

September 2003

After spending most of the previous six years living in the US, upon returning to Australia to live at the beginning of 1994, there were not a lot of things in my life that contained any degree of certainty. I was unsure as to where to even live, let alone what I would do for work or recreation. The only thing I was sure of was that Clay Target shooting had dominated my life for about twenty-five years and that this needed to change.

I was sure that there must be a "life after shooting" and remember wondering what real people actually did in the evenings and on weekends if they weren't reloading, practicing or competing at some Gun Club. My intention was to spend the rest of that year winding down my involvement in shooting, with one last trip to the World Skeet Championships in October probably being my "swan song."

Although this process continued along steadily, it encountered several obstacles and delays. This resulted in my final day of reckoning not occurring until nearly the end of the third quarter of 1995, when I finalised the sale of my competition guns, in order to remove any little temptations that might arise. However, in the interim a couple of complications had occurred.

The first was that I had been drawn back into the politics and administration of shooting by a combination of my conscience and some arm-twisting. A number of my friends and associates convinced me that it would not only be a waste of valuable experience that our sport could utilise, but also that as the ACTA had invested quite a lot of money in me over the past ten years in the way of overseas trips and the like, it would be unfair not to "put something back."

The second complication was that my new partner Karen had developed an intense interest of her own in the sport. This combination resulted in me spending the next eighteen months or so continuing to attend Gun Clubs and major shoots most week-ends without a gun and thus occupying my time between administrat-ing, socialising and card playing.

During the 1997 Trap Nationals, when it had become overwhelmingly apparent that Karen's interest in the sport was not just a passing phase, I decided that you can only swim against the current for so long and gave up and accepted a very generous deal offered to me by Fuller Firearms on a new gun and some shells. Thus my second serious attempt at retirement (the first had been in 1988 and only lasted several weeks) faded into oblivion and life at the Gun Club returned to normal.

More than normal actually, as the following year I began writing this column for the CTSN and later expanded my political interests beyond the local club and into the realms of Zone and State levels. However although my various involvement's in Clay Target Shooting continued to steadily expand, I never saw it as an open-ended arrangement and still always envisaged an eventual retirement.

I guess I always saw my "put something back" phase as never any more than a ten-year plan and when I started to write for the magazine I initially thought that a couple of years would suffice for that venture and certainly never saw it's tenure extending beyond five years. As both these time spans have reached the light at the end of the tunnel, I have been consciously considering my future in the sport for some time and seriously contemplating my third attempt at retirement.

Several recent occurrences in both my personal life and work schedule have clarified and precipitated this decision making process. Additionally, in line with my desire to always try to be a realist, I must admit that even I sometimes wonder how healthy

and constructive it is for our sport to be heavily influenced by someone as different and unconventional as I often tend to be.

There's no doubt that a certain amount of thinking from "outside the box" can often be very creative and there are undoubtedly times when "telling it like you see it" and "playing with your cards on the table" can provide solutions and expediences not other wise attainable. However, you can also have too much of a good thing and thus I am eternally grateful to a handful of close friends who I often needed to remind me that moderation is also a wonderful attribute.

Anyway, after careful consideration, the net result of all this is a finite decision to enter my third and hopefully final period of retirement from nearly all involvement in Clay Target Shooting. I intend to curb my administrative activities down to no more than perhaps helping out at my local club. I have tendered my resignation from all the political positions I currently hold and this will be the last installment of Cuzzo's Infamous Ramblings. I will not be actively seeking any future coaching work and I intend to reduce my own personal shooting down to special occasions only.

I believe this would be an opportune time to thank the ACTA and several of the State Associations for all the help and support they have given me over the years. To the many shooting friends I have collected along the way I say aloha and thanks for many great memories. To my various political and administrative colleagues I say thanks for all your mostly voluntary efforts and "keep up the good work."

I know it's fraught with danger to single out individual people to thank, as it will surely offend all of the undoubtedly deserved people I leave out, so to all those I say sorry and thanks anyway. To Bill Jones I say congratulations on your new position as National President. If you do half as good a job of running the show as you've done looking after our money, we'll be in good hands. To Glenn Woodhatch I say thanks for a job done long and well, and especially for the confidence and courtesy you always extended to me when I worked under you.

To Andy Sanders I say thanks for always trying to give me an understanding of discipline and for always being a good mate even when needing to give me a reaming. To Mark McInnes, whose passion for the betterment and advancement of the sport are probably even stronger than mine, you have both my respect and my appreciation. And finally to Ronnie Trill for many things, but above all for giving me a true appreciation of the dictionary's definition of the word "gentleman."

Quote of the Month: I was chatting with my old mate Ken Lowry the other day and he made a statement that I believe qualifies. He said: "When I was at my best I could have whipped the backside off both Russell Mark and Michael Diamond" to which he added "However, it should be remembered that at that time Russell was still in primary school and Michael was crawling around in nappies."

RULE CHANGES AS OF JANUARY 1, 2004

The National Executive meeting held in July approved the following rule changes effective 1 January 2004:

RULE 1.22(e)

Amend to read - "Distance - the low target shall be thrown 46 metres (+/- 2 metres) in still air."

RULE 2.01(e)

Amend to read - "Grades shall be: AA 98% and over; A 95% and under 98%; B 88% and under 95%; C under 88%."

RULE 2.01(i)

Add at end of paragraph - "Once attaining A grade a shooter cannot be reggraded to C grade and once attaining AA grade a shooter cannot be reggraded to B grade. Other than in the authority vested in Rule 2.4(g)."

RULE 3.01(c)

Delete - "Ties to stand"

RULE 4.03

Add new paragraph (d) at end - "Trap houses shall be used to give full protection to the trappers. All traphouses constructed after 1st January 2004 shall be 0.8 metres high in the front, tapering or sloping to 0.65 metres at the back and shall be 2 metres from back to front and 2.5 metres wide. A tolerance of 10 centimeters either way is permissible on these dimensions. All height measurements shall be taken from the level of the centre lane. The trap shall be mounted in a manner which will bring the top centre pivot point of the throwing arm 25 centimeters above the level of the centre lane and 0.5 metres from the front of the traphouse and 30 centimeters left of centre. A tolerance of 10 centimeters either side of this dimension is permissible."

Psychological Skills for Shooting

IRRATIONAL BELIEFS

In last month's article I examined the concept of fear and how this could lead to anxiety. Fear and anxiety have the impact of affecting performance. Performance anxiety is a common problem for most people and can affect us in a variety of ways; in sport, at work, public speaking, giving a performance, in relationships, etc. At the end of last month's article I stated that fear and anxiety were often the results of irrational beliefs about ourselves.

So what do I mean "irrational beliefs"? All of us have the potential to behave in a rational and irrational way. When we think rationally, we get our thoughts from things that we know to be facts and not from subjective opinions. Rational thoughts are likely to help us survive and will allow us to define personal life goals more quickly. Rational thoughts will also produce less inner conflict between what we think is real and what we see to be real and these rational thoughts will prevent us from getting into conflict with whom we live and associate. When things go wrong the rational thinker will be concerned not anxious, be saddened not depressed and be annoyed not angry. Rational thoughts and beliefs about ourselves allow us to behave and perform in a manner that will allow us to work towards our fullest potential. Several articles ago, I wrote about the difference between the end product and the process involved. If we focus only on the product it is possible that irrational thoughts and beliefs will develop and intrude on your ability to perform.

So what are "irrational beliefs"? These are beliefs about ourselves that lead to us having an unrealistic picture of ourselves. These beliefs will interfere with our defining goals, will put us in danger and will generate both inner turmoil and outer conflict. Irrational beliefs lead to anxiety, depression and anger.


As I stated at the conclusion of last month's article there are four irrational beliefs:

1. The idea that you must have love or approval from people you think are important.
2. The idea that you must prove thoroughly competent, adequate and achieving.
3. The idea that when people act obnoxiously and unfairly, you should blame and damn them, and see them as bad, wicked and rotten individuals.
4. The idea that you have to view things as awful, terrible, horrible and catastrophic when you get seriously frustrated, treated unfairly, or rejected.

Most sports, but shooting in particular, are excellent vehicles for developing irrational beliefs. Think about yourself and people you compete with. Do you or they seek approval from others and see that shooting the possible is a way of getting that approval? Do you or your shooting friends believe that you must shoot a possible all the time and that you or they must win every event. Thoughts such as these will limit your ability because you will begin to construct irrational beliefs when things do not go your way or when you think things are unfair. What tends to happen is that these beliefs about yourself make it difficult for you to remain calm and as a result you become anxious; and that anxiety will lead to fear and be manifested by baulking, flinching, lapses of concentration and so on.

So next time your anxious; explore your belief structures. Next time you do not win, look hard at how you see yourself. If you are angry because you must win or you're depressed because life seems so unfair, then maybe it is time to look at your irrational beliefs and challenge them.





As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations."

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.




