



National President's Notes

AUSTRALIAN SHOOTING ASSOCIATION ASA

During the ACTA Executive meeting 10-13 July Mr Nick Sullivan, Executive Director of the ASA, gave a lengthy presentation.

The ASA is the body affiliated with international shooting organisations such as the ISSF and therefore is important to all shooting sports in Australia.

The ASA is supported financially by the Sports Commission and is the Government link to all affiliated organisations such as the ACTA.

Previously the ASA Executives Committee was comprised of 2 persons per affiliated sport.

The Sports Commission has commissioned an independent consultant to review the operation of the ASA and therefore recommend changes to the ASA Constitution.

This review now called the Carlson Report has made various unacceptable recommendations to alter the ASA Constitution and therefore the role of each affiliated sport.

Following input from some of the shooting sports, the SSAA and us in particular, pointing out the unacceptable nature of the Draft Constitution, meetings that were to be held in August to authorise the new ASA Constitution have been postponed.

The ASA have now held a meeting with their Constitution lawyer Rigby Cooke to discuss comments and recommendations resulting in several alterations to the document.

As information becomes available I will publish it in the CTSN.



CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

ENTRY

Entry into the 2003 Australian Skeet Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2003 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors must produce their 2003 registered shooter record book before nominating.

DIVISIONS

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Ladies, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.

A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before sashes/medals/cash/trophies are awarded.

When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.

To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

AGE QUALIFICATIONS

Veterans - are those competitors over the age of 65 years on November 11,2003.

Juniors - are those competitors under the age of 18 years on November 11, 2003.

Sub Juniors - are those competitors under the age of 14 years on November 11, 2003.

STARTING TIME

Each day's event shall commence at 9.00am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squaded towards the end of the event.

Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

CARTRIDGES

For 12 gauge events, load size is limited to 28gr struck measure or equivalent shot size not larger than No.7.

For 20 gauge events, load size is limited to 24gr struck measure or equivalent shot size not larger than No.7.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships.

TARGET AND TRAPS

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Championships Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers.

All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

CLASSIFICATION

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified. This applies to skeet grades, Open, Ladies, Juniors and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

PRACTICE

Practice, subject to trap availability, will be available throughout the championships. Tickets may be purchased at the events office.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A fee of \$20 may be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

- 2. Squads of 5 (or 6 if necessary) to shoot 100 targets per day, in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps, 2nd 50t moving up one trap. eg 1-2, 2-3, 3-4, 4-1, etc.
- 3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets. Shooters are expected to perform changeovers (between rounds as well as between squads) as quickly as possible, and certainly not exceed the maximum time limit allowed of two minutes. Anyone exceeding that time limit may be penalised.
- 5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be resquaded later in the event, but re-squading is not guaranteed, and non-participation is a possibility.
- 6. Should a shooter being late for his squad not be re-squaded or elect to withdraw from the event, any refund of nominations paid is not guaranteed.
- 7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- 8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the loss of one target in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the loss of one target may be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Shooters will be selected from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, any penalty for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 10. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. Optional purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations.
- 14. Optional purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however overall event winners cannot take any section prize.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals, trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
- 19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.

- 20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 22. Reduced Nomination fees are applicable to Juniors and also second Family members, they being wives or husbands, entering into the same event whose nomination must be lodged at the same time as a family members paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
- 23. All competitors must comply with Firearm Licensing Laws in their state of residence and in the state hosting the National Championships.

What's On The Agenda?

With Mark McInnes

The rules committee is looking at several proposals for the 2005 season & beyond, the rules committee has now passed these proposals back to the State associations for further debate. We would recommend that all interested people should contact their zone and state associations. The proposals are as follows:

(1) That ear & eye protection be compulsory for all ACTA disciplines for all employees, volunteers & competitors whilst present at the firing point or trap area.

This proposal is necessary so that clubs meet their obligations under the various health and safety acts that exist within Australia.

(2) That we modify our existing refereeing system to include "field referees" to supervise the event referees and that we require all new ACTA members to pass a range safety test prior to affiliation so that they can act as event referees.

This proposal is aimed at ensuring that all shooters can safely act as a referee.

(3) That we modify our rules such that Handicap and Pointscore events are shot multiple targets per lane.

This proposal is aimed at conforming with international trap & DTL rules as well as making the sport more user friendly for handicapped and incapacitated members. It will also help with the use of voice release systems on handicap shooting.

use of voice release systems on handicap shooting.

(4) That we add a rule stating that "Handicap cards must be produced upon request by either Club management, zone or state handicappers, rules supervisors, state associations, national executive members or the ACTA. In the event of an investigation by

any listed parties they have the right to retain the handicap card for the period of time necessary to undertake the investigation."

This proposal is aimed at closing a loophole in our rules that could allow cheats to rort our system.

(5) That we adopt a dress code that requires shooters to dress in an appropriate manner with the wearing of singlets and thongs / scuffs to be prohibited.

This proposal is aimed at preventing the degeneration of dress and safety standards within our sport.

(6) That automatic traps be compulsory for Trap & Skeet disciplines from 1st January 2009.

This proposal is aimed at making our clubs safer and reducing the number of accidents occurring.

(7) That we add to our rules an Appeals process for aggrieved

This proposal is aimed at formalising the process for appeals.

The rules committee presently holds two open meetings per year that any member can attend, they are held at the Trap and Skeet Nationals. The next meeting will be at 6:00pm on Wednesday 12th November to discuss skeet rules & general issues. We will also be having a meeting at 6:00pm on Wednesday 31st March 2004 to discuss trap rules and general issues. These meetings are held in the clubhouse at the National ground and everybody is welcome to attend.

3rd - 5th MAY 2003

A total of 205 shooters competed in the biggest event on the Queensland clay target-shooting calendar. Competitors came from all over the State plus a raiding party from NSW.

Conditions at the Toowoomba Clay Target Club were testing with the variations due to wind enough to keep the number of possibles shot down. The weather was cool as was to be expected at this time of year.

The shoot was a little late in starting with shooters showing reluctance to squad up early as the sun was perceived to be a problem.

The first event was the Winchester Point Score of 25 Targets. This event is the eye-opener for the carnival and is traditionally sponsored by Winchester Australia.

However I feel we fail to write and support a good idea that should be taken further, therefore it remains another good idea, which went nowhere. I did expect some support for my previous letter re a common body for all shooting sports. I have heard rumours that for point score and handicap shooting, it will be shot 5 targets per lane then change lanes with the scorer calling out the scores as they change lanes. Give us a break, what a load of rubbish (putting it mildly).

Someone shooting for their first 5 targets on lane 5 then having the pleasure of shooting at their next 5 targets on lane 1 - equality? What equality?

A squad of 6 shooters shooting in the squad system we now enjoy shoots 25 targets quicker than 5 shooters shooting the same 25 targets under the proposed 5 per lane system.

With the 5 per lane system it limits the shooters in each squad to 5, therefore, on a big shoot, the number of squads is increased and each event taking longer and subsequently the last squads shooting in the dark - more equality.

The rules committee needs to take a long hard look at proposed changes and remember that they are in Australia, not America, or elsewhere in the world. We have seen the skeet rules bastardised to conform to America, now taking longer per round due to the changes of station 7 and 8, all because of a handful of shooters that might visit America.

If any shooter wishes to shoot in America or elsewhere in the world then let them conform to the rules that apply to wherever they may be. Don't penalise the grass roots shooter here in Australia because Joe Bloggs wants to shoot overseas.

Could you imagine a shooter from America or elsewhere wanting their local rules changed to Australian rules because he/she was coming down under?

Handicap shooting ... we don't need it!

There is enough competition shooting from 15m to fulfil everybody's needs - AA, A, B, C and if needed, D Grades.

Do away with handicap shooting and you do away with a large majority of the burglars out there who are playing the system.

On any major issue or issues the general membership of the ACTA should be given the chance to voice their opinion via a questionnaire or similarly published in the CTSN, not just have new unworkable and unwanted rules thrust upon them.

Dear Sir

So many letters complaining about Handicap, so many known to me who refuse to shoot a Handicap event.

I'm 74. Use heavy prescription glasses. No Handicap wins in 3 1/2 years. I'm so far back I need binoculars to catch them coming out of the trap. I can see young "A" graders standing 4 x 1/2 metres closer to the trap than me and I would like someone to tell me why. We need 3 things to make Handicap popular:

- 1. Things have not only got to be seen to be fair. They have to be fair.
- 2. Now we have to protect those shooters having one really good day from excessive and unnecessary penalty at the hands of one person wallowing in regrade power, without even looking at a score book under rule 2.01(i). In this case I would prefer to see one person's right to do this replaced by a jury system.
- 3. Also my system at the same time would be able to deal with shooters who prefer a certain grade and are happy to drop an event or two to remain where they prefer.

If we can work out a fair to all percentage grading for common mark shooting, then surely we could come up with a fair to all percentage Handicap distance grading.

A possible way is:

You are given your Handicap based on a full year's average - minus the lowest 20% and it carries Xmas to Xmas. It's that simple. New book - new Handicap. Good for a year.

Finally why write this? Well I'm back at 21 metres despite no wins in Handicap and never will thanks to a double bump [B to AA via rule 2.01(i)], which makes a joke of rule 2.01(m).

You can come back to A grade in time, but stay AA in Handicap forever. Small wonder clubs are pushing for support, as we lose shooters in droves.

With the continuing debate over the time infringement rule for skeet I would like to make the following comment:

Rule 1.02(e) clearly states "it shall be considered a time infringement if a shooter deliberately delays more than 15 seconds for each for each shot on a station". So therefore if a shooter takes his shooting position on Station 3 is the shooter entitled to take 15 seconds for each shot or 15 seconds to shoot the station? I would suggest that it comes down to how the rule is interpreted. I look forward to further comment.



After these discussions it was evident that some categories are being misused necessitating a change in the member categories currently in place. Following are the new membership categories decided on for the 2004 shooting year:

FULL MEMBER:

This level of membership remains unchanged and has been set at \$78.

2ND FAMILY MEMBER:

This level of membership is no longer available.

PARTNER MEMBER:

This level of membership has been introduced to replace the 2nd Family member and is available to the partner of a full member. The cost of this level of membership has been set at \$45.

VETERAN MEMBER:

This level of membership is available to persons who are over the age of 65 years at the time of registration and has been set at \$45.

LONG SERVICE CONCESSION:

This level of membership is available to persons who are over 60 years of age at time of registration with 30 years or more

continuous membership with the ACTA. The cost of this level of membership has been set at \$45.

JUNIOR MEMBER:

This level of membership is available to persons under the age of 18 years at time of registration and has been set at \$23.

CLUB ONLY MEMBER:

Insurance issues have required the Executive to introduce a level of membership that allows shooters to participate without the hassle of clubs obtaining further costly insurance's to protect their interests.

This level of membership has been introduced for persons wishing only to participate at their home club and not in competition. This level of membership is available to new members only and not persons that have been members of the ACTA within the last 5 years. Club Only Members will be afforded full protection under the insurance policies currently held by the ACTA.


Club Only Members will be issued with a card denoting their status and the cost for this level of membership has been set at \$30.



Psychological Skills for Shooting

THE DYNAMICS OF DOUBT

In the very first article I wrote for the Clay Target Shooting News: "When I miss; could it be self doubt?" I explored the somewhat basic tenet that performance was attainable when the interference of the mind on the functions of the muscles was reduced. Doubt is the "lack of certainty of the truth or the reliability of something." The problem with doubt is not that it questions your ability to do something that is difficult or even impossible, say for example shooting 750 targets straight or 100 Pointscore targets but it is lack of trust to perform actions required to shoot one target; the one that will appear when you call pull. According to Gallwey in the Inner Game of Golf, self-doubt is a uniquely human quality of negative thinking that needlessly questions ones ability.

To understand self doubt it is necessary to look at how the brain functions. Basically and for the purposes of this discussion, the brain is divided into two halves; the right side and the left side. These different sides play an important role in our ability to shoot, play golf, tennis etc. The right side of the brain is responsible for muscle movement and co-ordination. In shooting this involves seeing the target, identifying it, tracking it, moving the body, holding the gun correctly, pulling the trigger and following through. The right side of the brain does and can continue to do these functions effortlessly and continuously. All that it requires is that the muscles need to be relaxed.

The left side of the brain however, houses our language, analytical and judgmental skills. The left side also believes that our right side is incapable of doing what is necessary and therefore provides it with a barrage of instructions and "coaching tips" so that it can do it properly.

In his book, The Inner Game of Golf, Tim Gallwey identifies these two sides of the brain as ego states and calls them self 1 for the left side and self 2 for the right side of the brain. Gallwey found that when he was involved in a competition he would have to continually listen to a range of self-instructional thoughts. On closer analysis of these thoughts he determined that it was self 1 doing the talking, it thought he knew how to play and was supervising self 2, the one who had to hit the ball or hit the clay target in respect to shooting. Self 1 did not only give self 2 instructions but criticised self 2 for past errors, warned self 2 about probable future ones, and harangued him whenever he made a mistake. These instructions and judgements increase tension, which in turn tightens the muscles; the result is that we are no longer fluid or relaxed and therefore we cannot perform to our potential.

To summarise self 1 - talking thought producing self - is a lousy boss when it comes to control of the body's muscle system. When self 2 - the body itself - is allowed control, the quality of performance, the level of enjoyment and the rate of learning are all improved. Self 2 is the total human organism, the natural entity. Self 1 does not have a physical existence; it is a phenomenon of mental self-interference that can and does interfere with our ability to perform.

For the brain to function closer to its potential the interference needs to be minimised. This means that the basic premise of the inner game is; Performance = self 2 (potential) minus self 1 (interference). The object of the inner game is to limit the interference of self 1 and trust self 2 can perform and achieve.

Doubt is easily confused with anxiety and fear. Whilst doubt and fear are close they are not related. We experience fear when we are faced with real or imagined danger; that is when we are vulnerable to harm. Self doubt relates neither to our vulnerability nor to external danger but to our competence to avoid or deal with the danger. No matter how much pressure is riding on hitting this

target, we do not feel anxiety if we do not first doubt our ability to hit the target. Anxiety increases as our competence decreases and therefore if we can lesson self doubt we can reduce anxiety.

How does doubt manifest itself? The first physical symptom of doubt is weakness. In a shoot off a shooter may feel weakness in his knees, lightheadedness and a general loss of feeling and muscle memory. Faced with these symptoms the shooter may react in two ways; either to give in to it or to resist it. Giving in to the challenge or avoiding it, according to Gallwey, decreases effort reduces motivation and affects attention. The other reaction to self doubt is to resist it by trying harder. What happens here is that trying fails because we increase mistrust of our ability.

The first step to inner game success is to let go of the judgements that question our ability. The second step is to trust self 2's ability and to stop trying. When we give ourselves the instruction to try harder, what we are really doing is tensing and tightening our muscles. In short trying fails. Once we can let go of our judgements and trust in self 2 we can go onto quieten the mind.

STRESS GETTING THE BETTER OF YOU?

Shoot off tension? Right now, practice breathing deeply and slowly, with authority. You cannot be nervous if your breathing is smooth and relaxed! You have to practice this a bit, and often, at home to get into the mood of it all.

Every trapshooter needs to learn breathing control. Inhale slowly. Make this a habit as you shoulder your gun. Incorporate it into your set-up right away. Take that deep slow breathe and it will give your eyes an extra burst of energy (oxygen) to see the target clearer and quicker!

Don't forget to yawn. When you do this it triggers the brain to calm down and so you will. Try it and you'll see it works.
