NATIONAL GROUND

You may have observed the up grade programme at your National Ground. Toilet block, office building, stores shed, caravan site, power up grade, road sealing and new entrance gates. All of which has been achieved over a 4 year period.

The next step is to reconstruct the shooting facilities with new traphouses, shooting lanes and electric's (underground).

To this end 15 all steel traphouses have been constructed with front opening lifting lids. All have been hot dipped (galvanised) and are ready for installation. Our thanks to Don Johnson, NSW Gun club for his help.

The Championship Committee is keen to reorganise the National DTL programme to include 100 targets per day and have requested that traps 12, 13 & 14, over the drain at the western end, proceed as a matter of urgency.

The grounds Committee are now endeavouring to meet this request and hope to have trap 1 replaced and 12,13 & 14 operation before the 2004 DTL Championship.

Now is the time for individuals, Companies, State Associations etc to become involved with the sponsor programme particularly leading up to the 2006 World Championship.

28th Annual Darwin Four Day Shoot

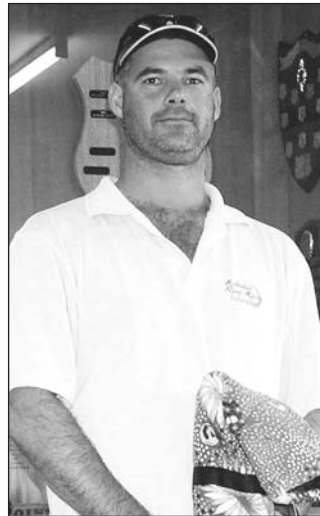

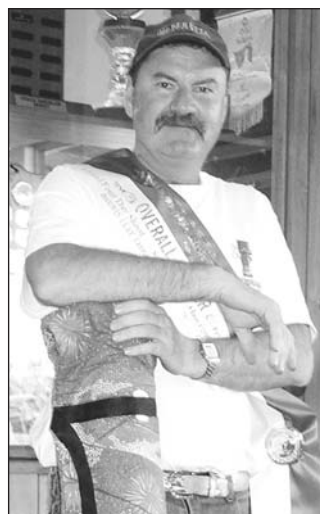
The second event 60 TGT Darwin Clay Target Club Champions of Champions was hotly contested from the word go. The windy conditions kept things interesting "The hardest targets in

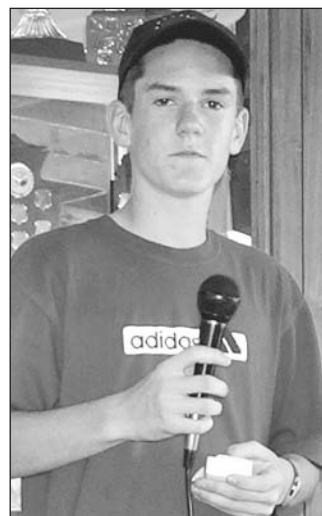

The profile of clay target shooting has risen in the past few years into the public spotlight with shooters emerging such as Michael Diamond and Russell Mark. And while the sport has become increasingly technical and competitive, the social aspect of clay target shooting often outweighs the competition, particularly in the outback where people travel as much to socialise as they do to shoot.

A Trip to the African Grand - Bloemfontein, South Africa

The trip really started at the W.A Gun Clubs Open shoot weekend on the 3rd & 4th May, some 5 weeks before.

Tim Catling, who had attended the African Grand in 2002, suggested to a few that a trip in 2003 would be fun. So after more than a few phone calls, 5 W. A. shooters were set to go.

The group comprised of Eddy Toomey & Stewart Johnston from Geraldton, Ollie McPartland & Dave Knight from Perth & Tim Catling from Katanning.

Accommodation was booked at the College Lodge in Bloemfontein; a mini-bus hired and away went the expectant 5 on the 9th June from Perth at 12 noon.

The trip of 11 hours to Johannesburg dragged a little, but finally we arrived. The formalities with our guns took longer than expected (we were on African work time now) and it was a rush to make the flight to Bloemfontein.

On arrival at Bloemfontein at 8pm (W.A is 6hrs ahead of South Africa) we were met by Wilna and Filip Naude and Willem Van Der Westhuizen, now we had local help, all went faster. Finally we arrived at the College Lodge very tired, but excited to be there.

Tuesday 10th, saw us settle in and a walk around this interesting city took us up to a late lunch and then Wilna Naude called to show us the way out to a Game Farm. Chris Harrison and Bill Weedon from Queensland also joined us for this outing and it was good to see them. Chris and Bill had come for about a 3-month stay, to really see the country and to hunt a bit as well.

Game farming is developing at a steady rate in southern South Africa and the amount of money being invested is quite staggering. Upon arriving at the main gates the first animal to greet us was a very fine Sable Antelope, as if we needed any reminding we were in Africa.

The afternoon was just wonderful and many different animals were seen. Cape Buffalo, Kudu, Spring Bok, Giraffe, Eland, Water Buck and Cheetah, As the sun set it got very cold, but a few drinks on the Veld, and a little Biltong to munch on fixed everything, along with the great company. So a tired group got to bed early.

Wednesday 11th, we woke to minus 50 and the heaviest of frosts. We went out to the Maccauw Gun Club for a little practice. Then off on an afternoon trip to an historic homestead, where we saw the famous tree under which the Boer Nation decided to go to war against the British over a 100 years before. We fired old Henry Martini rifles and tried out the Bar; it was a wonderful afternoon.

Thursday 12th, more frost and a little more practice, then off again. This time to shoot a few birds off a farmers crops and then a mad rush to change and arrive (not too late) at the Naude's home for the most wonderful meal and evening. The Zimbabwe shooters were there and much fun was had by all. Wilna and Filip are wonderful hosts, as were all the South African people we met.

Friday 13th, the first day of competition with 100 A.T.A. Bonus event, followed by 100 D.T.L. as they call it, which is the same as our D/B Points. The Bonus event is just a fun thing that works like this: at the completion of the event on of the 4 rounds is drawn out of a hat and this year it was round 4. Then the shooter takes the difference between his score and the possible -25. He then takes 70% of that difference, multiplies by 4 (because there are 4 rounds) and adds it to his total score. The High Gun scores were Jaco De Wet and Filip Naude on 99/100. Jaco De Wet won the D.T.L. (Points) Event with 300/300. This man is a class act, as you will see by his scores from other events.

This was the South African Mackintosh Team shoot for their score and after the teams had shot the rest of the field joined in for an overall event - not a bad idea. Jaco De Wet was there again with 299/300 to high gun the event and their team. Tim won the Veterans with 291/300, with Eddy and Bill, second and third. Then followed 50 prs D/Rise for those who had any shells or energy left.

900 targets were shot over the 4 days and it was a credit to the organizers that all ran smoothly without any holdups. In all nearly 80 shooters competed at some stage and if any shooter in Australia wants a good time and something a little different in a trip, then go next year to this great event.

We all packed up and were ready to go, when someone made the offer of some bird shooting early next morning, Ollie, Dave and Tim (who had already said he didn't want to shoot again for at least a week) took up the offer.

Tuesday 17th, up early for the bird shooting. Eddy and Stewart went of to buy presents for those at home, while the others took to the birds. Dave Knight is of an English Game Shooting background, and he reckoned it was the best morning he had ever spent in the field.

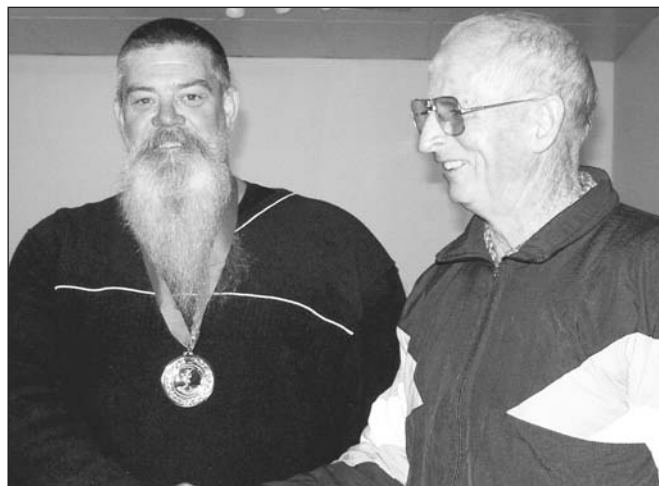

As he says, he is past his prime now, but if he can just get to his son John's stock with a wood rasp, "I know I

can make it better by just taking a bit more wood off here or there". Tony has now taken up rural fencing as a hobby and can be contacted for quotes or advice on fencing, although if the fencing requires the use of a tractor then the price you ask for is per kilometre, not by the hour. The reason for this is that Tony has a very limited working knowledge of tractors. This is evidenced by recent events where Tony had purchased a tractor and shipped it over to French Island where he was going to dig some post holes with a post hole digger attached to the tractor. After spending the best part of a day going over everything he still could not get the power take off [PTO] to engage to drive the post hole digger. He hired a tractor expert at great expense and took him across to the island to "fix the PTO on the tractor". COACH AND CHILD PROTECTION

Coaching athletes at any level is a huge responsibility. It is important to understand that you, the coach, play a leading role in their lives. Many athletes spend more time with their coach and respective training groups than they do with their families while they pursue their sporting dreams.

Athletes deserve to be in a safe, professional environment - the same situation you would demand of a coach whose responsibility it was to guide the athletic development of your child.

We must provide an environment where everyone involved is safe from harassment of any kind, abusive behaviour, discrimination or victimisation.

So how do you ensure you are providing this environment?

Let us look at a few practical tips:

Make sure you undergo member protection training, which is usually provided by government and administered by your national or state sporting association.

Learn and understand what the member protection policy means and if you are not sure about any aspect of it, make sure you follow up any questions.

If you are the leader (head coach) of a club or state-based program, ensure that each and every person involved either in an employed or voluntary capacity within your program receives member protection training. This could include people who are officials, masseurs and volunteering parents, as well as people who serve on boards or committees.

In certain states now involved in administering the member protection policy, police checks are mandatory for volunteers and paid officials who work with children in sport.

As a responsible coach, you are required to have the credentials of people involved in your sporting organisation checked.

This preventative action is an important step in creating and maintaining a safe environment.

It helps minimise the risk for you, your sporting organisation and most importantly, the athletes with whom you deal directly.

I believe this is all based on common sense, it protects the health, safety and wellbeing of all coaches and athletes.

Legal requirements

(Extract from Child Protection Overview, Australian Sports Commission 2001)

Child abuse is illegal in all states and territories of Australia with each having their own laws that cover the reporting and investigation of cases of child abuse.

Mandatory reporting of child abuse (also called 'notification'), where some professions are legally required to report any abuse they suspect or notice applies in all states and territories (with the exception of Western Australia) although the professions involved are different.

In New South Wales and Queensland, specific-child protection and intervention legislation now applies to the sport and recreation industry. The Victorian Government is currently developing a Working with Children Check scheme based on the NSW and Queensland legislation. The South Australian Government

recently commissioned and released a review of child protection. It is now preparing legislation based on the recommendations of the report aimed at improving methods of protecting children.

Legislation alone is not enough to protect children. Sporting organisations need to adopt several basic principles and implement a range of risk management strategies that address the above points. These strategies are listed on the ASC web site: www.activeaustralia.org/hfs.

An organisation's ability to use all these processes will depend on the available resources. However the most effective resource is informed people. Increasing an adult's awareness of how abuse can happen, what to look for, and fostering a sense of responsibility for the welfare of children under their care are the most effective strategies an organisation can implement.

As a coach, you are one of the most important people in the lives of our young athletes. Don't take it lightly.

Child protection legislation makes it mandatory for sporting organisations and individuals involved in sporting organisations and individuals involved in sport as a paid employee or a volunteer to meet certain requirements. These requirements also apply to individuals and organisations originating outside of the states with child-protection legislation in place. For example, if a sporting organisation sends junior players to New South Wales or Queensland for training camps, competition or other activities, those travelling with the teams may have to undergo the relevant checks. If organisations based outside New South Wales and Queensland want to conduct police checks on personnel in, or applicants for, child-related positions, they will need to get advice from their relevant state police jurisdiction as to the procedure to be followed.

What's on the Agenda?

Over the past few months there have been numerous letters received in the "Your Say" section of the Clay Target News where the authors obviously didn't or don't understand either the role of the National rules committee or the systems the ACTA has in place for Rule changes. So this month I would like to try and explain the roles and systems.

What is the Rules Committee?

The rules committee is a sub committee of the ACTA that is responsible for the management of rules, safety & referees.

What is the Role of the Rules Committee?

The rules committee receives proposals from the state associations and ACTA executive members in regards to issues concerning rules, safety & referees and makes recommendations to the National executive.

It is not the role of the rules committee to make the rules, the national executive has that role. It is the role of the rules committee to make recommendations to the National Executive.

Who are the Members of the Rules Committee?

At present the members of the rules committee are Mark McInnes (NSW), Ron Traill (Vic), Bob Andrews (SA) & Elaine Forward (WA)

The rules committee meets three times per year, there is also one rules supervisors meeting per year and a number of open meetings per year, these include an open meeting at the Trap & Skeet Nationals and an open meeting at each states trap carnival every three years. We also meet with representatives of international trap & DTL associations.

What are the Systems that are used?

Proposals are received from the State associations or ACTA executive members and are debated by the rules committee, if

approved then the proposal is forwarded to the other state associations for debate.

The proposals are then returned to the rules committee for further debate and if approved the proposal is then passed on to the National executive for approval or rejection.

This system is applied in the majority of cases, however if multiple states or executive members are putting forward the same proposal then the proposal is passed directly to the National executive for approval or rejection.

However John Wild had once again set a very testing layout with broken targets hard to come by.

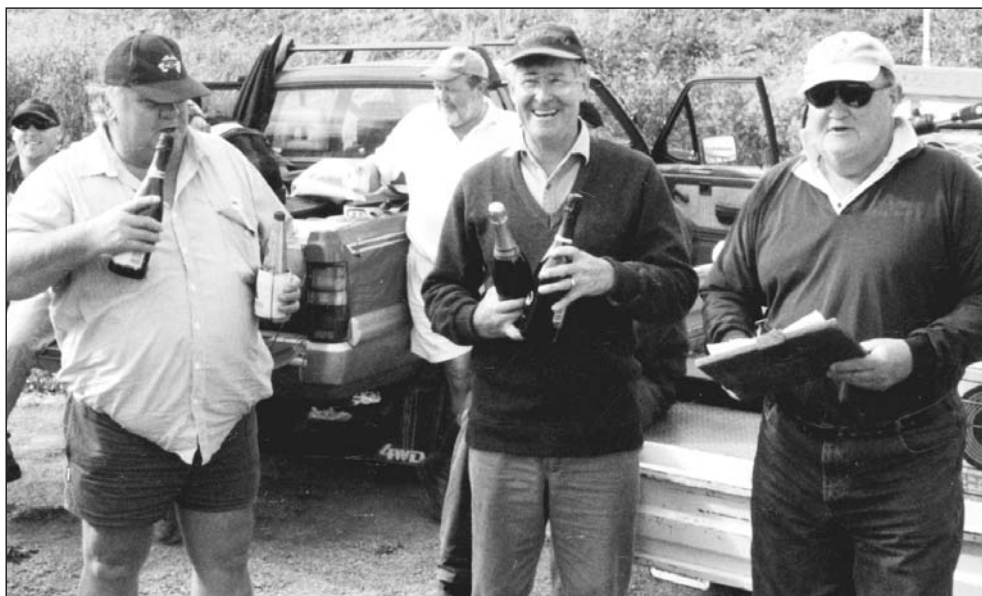
John and Alan, the legendary Illawarra Cooks once again prepared lunch and following the "sky rocket" the games began.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Since the Nationals I haven't shot. I damaged a tendon in my right arm during the double barrel and have not been able to pick up a shotgun without pain since. I have missed several shoots I was planning to attend, so on the advice of my physio (which was to go back shooting - surely you can deal with a bit of pain) I decided to attend the 23rd Australian Police and Services Championships in Wagga.

I often talk to parents, teachers and clients about what our needs are as human beings. William Glasser, a famous American Psychologist, believed that humans had five main needs that were necessary for our existence and wellbeing. The first of these is a primitive desire to survive; find food, shelter and sex. The other four however are not as basic and if we do not meet these needs (or if they are met in a negative fashion) then this will tend to lead to maladaptive behaviours. The first of these needs is belonging. We all as humans want to belong or be part of a group. This group may be a family, social group sporting group, church group or a group of work colleagues.

The second need is for approval. We all need to know that those around us, those whose opinions we respect and value approve of us and our behaviour. The third need is for freedom. This usually means the freedom to make choices or being empowered to choose those things that will make us a well adapted person. The final need that human beings have is the need for fun. If you enjoy what you're doing you will learn and improve, and life will be more enjoyable.

The 23rd Australian Police and Services Championships met all of Glasser's needs. Shooters whether Police, services or civilians felt that they belonged. The atmosphere was friendly and welcoming; like being at your favourite club. Approval was afforded to all; it didn't matter what grade you were, what handicap you were on, what score you shot, whether you were Police, Services or civilian; you were made to feel important because you were there. With respect to freedom; I was not aware of anyone who was made to feel disempowered because they didn't want to shoot single barrel in gale force winds or night skeet with fluro targets that had black undersides.

Targets seem to become far more difficult when all you can see is the rim that is facing you. As for fun; well the camaraderie (especially those police who had been attending for the past 23 years), the program which included night skeet and crazy points, the weather and the constant ribbing and banter between people, without being malicious or vindictive, provided a recipe for a great time. I've always wondered why people like going to the veterans games or masters games, etc as opposed to the big shoots and now I know why; belonging, approval, freedom and most of all fun.

What a great four days. The organisers did a great job. Good targets, good prizes (thanks to the sponsors), good food and great venue. What the organisers didn't plan for was the additional benefits that I (and I'm sure so many others) got out of the shoot. You cannot plan to make sure people enjoy themselves, you can't plan to make people feel sense of belonging and acceptance, but when your able to provide these needs to those that attend you will always have people feeling positive and happy about being part of the event.

What I haven't mentioned was that the weather decided to throw a real tantrum and the scores, well, they were nothing more than ordinary. But that didn't appear to be a problem for anyone because with all these other needs being met, big scores were not the focus.

Last year I wrote an article called "Is wining everything?" where I examined the difference between being product orientated (going for gold) and being process orientated (going for gold but enjoying the journey if you don't win) at the Police Championships both orientations were there. Shooters were trying to win but it wasn't their only desire because their needs of approval, belonging, freedom and fun were being adequately met by making the process enjoyable.

If our sport is to grow, then what the Police Championships offered should be an integral part of club, zone, state and national competitions; shooters of every grade should want to attend because being there makes them feel good. Maybe we should all give thought as to how we can make people welcome at our own clubs, zones and state championships and try to encourage more participation; from all shooters C, B and A grades and not just AA shooters. A measure of achievement would then be seen in the participation by everyone and not just big breaks. So if you're a B or C grade shooter who feels that your not good enough for the Nationals or State carnivals, think again. Forget your scores and do something positive for your mental well being; be part of the fun and the community.

I don't know how the organisers of the Police Championships will evaluate the success of the four days of competition (and I'm sure they haven't thought of looking at it from a psychological point of view) but my belief is that it was a big success. Thank you, I enjoyed my time and I look forward to when I can compete at the next Police and Services Championships.

Tower events over, the next event a 15 Target Double Barrel, graded with no overall so no shootoff required for the only two shooters who shot a possible.

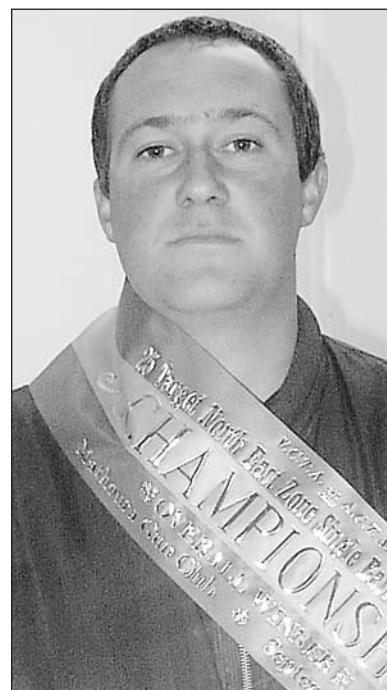

Fastfire at the National Clay Titles

From The Australian Outdoors, July 1956. First Trap Nationals in New South Wales

The fast-flying clays and poor visibility tested the ingenuity of Australia's finest marksmen in the classic gun event of the year.

For the first time, these championships, the premier event of the Australian trapshooting year, were set down this year for a Sydney venue, and were fired from 9th to 13th March (both dates inclusive) at the

Bankstown grounds of the Royal Aero Club of NSW (Gun Society). In this year, therefore, they provide a particular interest for the NSW shotgunner.

Clay-pigeon shooting in Australia has reached a stage of high development, under the general control of the national organisation, The Australian Clay Pigeon Trapshooting Association, with many

affiliated clubs firing throughout the country. The movement is very vigorous, total membership being probably second of the various firearms organisations only to the National Rifle Associations. The sport has taken over almost completely from its predecessor, live bird shooting (which latter is, it is understood, now generally illegal).

Equipment in the way of guns, is quite severely limited by the general rule of the Association prohibiting the use of shot charges of greater weight than one and one-eighth ounces, and, to a lesser extent, by the restriction of size of shot to not larger than No. 6 (English measurement). In view of the general popularity of the 12 gauge gun, the general scarcity of ammunition for larger gauges, and the illegality (in NSW and Victoria, at any rate, in which States are constructed the greatest strength of the movement) of guns of gauge larger than 10, this has come to mean that the 12 gauge is the standard gun for this sport. Of course, other gauges, notably 16, are used to some extent; but the 12 enjoys an overwhelming popularity. And rightly so: the shorter the shot column as it passes through the bore, the better the pattern delivered at the target. The 12 gauge thus has a distinct advantage over the smaller bores, and it is in fact the largest bore which is generally used and sold and for which, as I mentioned, ammunition is readily obtainable. Recognizing this, special grade trap ammunition is manufactured in this gauge.

The need for sustained hitting power and dense patterning is one dictated by the size of the target and the ranges at which the game is shot. Clay pigeons are in the form of a saucer-shaped disc, some four inches in diameter and little more than an inch deep. Quite frequently the bird is thrown side on to the shooter so that his pattern must be extremely dense if he is to have a reasonable chance of a kill (which requires the breaking off from the clay a piece of substantial size a target which is merely "dusted" being called "lost"). Generally, one pellet will do it, if of sufficient size, but even this calls for dense, even patterning.

The scratch markers stand sixteen yards

behind the trap, while more expert shots are progressively handicapped, so that their initial ranges may be of the order of twenty-five yards, perhaps even more in some instances. As the trap is protected by a bank and is thrown at an angle such that it is at least ten feet from the ground at ten yards; flight, and not more than fifteen feet at fifteen yards flight, it follows that it is at about twenty yards' range before coming into the field of view of the scratch marker, possibly thirty yards from the limit marker. The time taken in pointing, the gun tripping the trigger and for the shot to reach the target probably means that clay pigeons are shot at a minimum range of thirty yards.

The combination of relatively long range (which may be quite long range for the back marker), small target (as little as about four square inches) and tough target (shot smaller than No. 7 cannot be depended upon to break the clays consistently, even with multiple hits) presents a three-fold problem of selection of choke, full pattern with adequate hitting power, and ease of hitting. Now the maximum spread of a fully choked 12-gauge gun at thirty yards is nominally 26 inches; in practice, I have seen few guns that would even approach this degree of tightness and regularity. It is probably more of the order of thirty inches for a very good gun and a circle of this diameter has an area of 707 square inches; to ensure a pellet to at least every two square inches (to ensure hitting) this calls for a pattern of 353 pellets. One and one-eighth ounces of No. 6 contain 306 pellets, so this size is hardly plentiful enough, even in a really good full choke, for even the scratch man; the limit man is likely to need 481 pellets to secure a distribution of only one pellet to four square inches over his 1965-square inch spread of shot. No. 7 contains about 284 pellets to the one and one-eighth ounce load, and will break clay at fifty yards; hence this seems to give the best compromise between density of pattern and breaking power. I notice that it is a very popular size at the traps, though many shooters continue to use No. 6.

As most clays are rising birds, the most suitable gun for the purpose is one that tends to throw high. A gun with little drop is such a gun; hence such a gun is generally selected. This helps to account for the popularity of the over and under, which tends to throw higher than the side-by-side double. This popularity, however, tends as yet to be concentrated in NSW; while side-by-side guns are quite rare at trapshooting meets around Sydney. I would think that the current series, attended by shooters from all over the Commonwealth, would show that half the guns in use are over-and-under doubles, and the remainder are about equally side-by-side doubles and self-loaders.

It seems strange to me, with the need for high-shooting guns, that the very short barrel does not seem to be favoured greatly. Most of the guns I have seen at these meetings would have barrels around twenty-eight to thirty inches in length; it would seem that the twenty-five inch gun would be superior for the purpose. Tradition, perhaps; the very short barrel has been seen very little here.

A matter of technique also influences this need for a gun which shoots high. Unlike field technique, where it is regarded as good practice to swing past the bird, hitting the trigger as the muzzles blot it out, I am informed by expert trapshooters that one never so blots out the bird at the trap. The reason for this appears to be largely that one very frequently is allowed a second barrel should one miss with the first: reference back to the preceding comment in regard to pattern-density will show that such a miss

must be recognised immediately and the second barrel, if required, be touched off at once. Blotting out the bird could occasion sufficient delay to lose it with the second barrel, even if perfectly centred; there is sufficient difficulty already, particularly for the backmarker (who, it seems to me already depends to quite a large degree on luck to get a pellet into the clay) without unnecessarily extending the range. So the trapshooter keeps his bird in view at all times, I notice that not a few shooters tend to send along the second barrel even though there has been a clean kill with the first; no doubt in such circumstances the movement is purely reflex.

Equipment, then, as selected by the shooters, seems to be in line with what the theory of the matter would indicate to be the optimum; a fully choked 12-gauge, most frequently of over-and-under design, followed in popularity about equally by the side-by-side double and the self-loader, using carefully loaded ammunition containing NO.6 or No. 7 shot. It would seem to me, not as an expert trapshooter (that game is too expensive for my pocket), but weighing all the considerations, the barrels could with advantage be shortened considerably, by up to six inches, with consequent improved scores.

Conditions for 1956 were, most regrettably, little short of atrocious. Sydneysiders will recall with bitterness the reprehensible action of the Gumsuckers in exporting their weather to us in February and March, and stealing our own good Australian weather for themselves (no doubt in the hope that, should the Yarra stop flowing for a time, on recommencing flow it might possibly revert itself so that it no longer flows with the bottom on the top). This was no doubt a plot to persuade the authorities that the Olympic Games had been set down for the correct venue after all.

On the first day, Friday, 9th March, shooters stood in up to three inches of water to fire their rounds. On Saturday, 10th March, a howling easterly early in the morning veered into a southerly of equal intensity later. Now Bankstown tracks face, more or

less, to the south; so that early left quartering shots flared high before dropping almost vertically, right quarterers came out low and fast; I saw many a charge of shot whistle harmlessly behind those right-quartering birds. Later, with the traps throwing into the teeth of the wind, birds came slowly, but flaring high, and very nastily. A dull-grey background above the dull-green belt of trees across the aerodrome made it very difficult to pick up the targets until they rose quite high, and were therefore far out; Bankstown slopes away to the south.

Come Monday, 12th March, and conditions improved quite appreciably; winds were still tricky, making the clays float and flare, but light became much better as the day wore on, to fall away again in mid-afternoon.

Tuesday, 13th March, the last day of the shoot, was generally brighter, and winds were of much lower intensity.

The shoot opened on the Friday with the Australian National Single Barrel Championship, a scratch match with all competitors firing from sixteen yards, for the W. Rainbird Perpetual Trophy (presented by Mr. W. Rainbird, Launceston, Tasmania) and ash, valued at £35, with fourteen more trophies valued at from £15 to £5. In addition, special trophies, valued at £5 each, were available for the competitor (not winning any other trophy in this match) registering the best performance, and whose Association handicap was, respectively, 16, 17, 18, 19 and 20 yards and beyond. A special trophy was available for the best lady performer in the event.

This event required each competitor to fire one shot at each of fifty visits to the tracks kills only to count. In view of the atrocious conditions, the winner, Sid Lamb, of NSW, did extremely well to register a perfect score, 50 kills out of 50 shots. Hard on his heels came the next three placegetters, who had to shoot off for second, third and fourth; in order, they ran J Newton Thomas (NSW - 64 kills from 65 shots), L Lupp (NSW - 63/65), L Hasler (QLD - 63/65). Running down the remaining trophy winners, in order, we have G K King (QLD - 61/65), T Stone (QLD - 57/60), K Cameron (QLD - 54/55), J Nunn (QLD - 54/55), D Fleetwood (SA - 54/55), N Mitchell (NSW - 48/50), T R Thompson (NSW - 48/50), J Smith (QLD - 48/50), W Mackay (NSW - 52/55), and C Nichols (NSW - 52/55).

The 16 yard handicap award was not won, due to rules, but W Duddy, of NSW, won the 17 yard handicap award with 46 out of 50, E E Alberts took the 18 yard award with 45/50, the 19 yard award went to R Jorgensen of Victoria with 46/50, while the 20 yard and over was won by D Cassin, of NSW, with 46/50.

The Ladies Trophy went to Miss Pam Coxon of Queensland who registered 39 kills out of her 50 shots.

A further trophy was available for competitors from each State other than NSW, to the best performer from each such State, provided that his State had three or more entries in the event. These went to B Moore (QLD - 44/50), C Mudford (VIC - 47/50), S Marshall (TAS - 51/55), R Mules (SA - 45/50), C Ferguson (WA - 46/50), and K Soames, Jnr, turned on the best performance for NSW entrants with 51 out of 55. The same restriction in regard to winning other trophies in the event applied to these winners.

Saturday, as mentioned, dawned dull and windy, and 236 entrants lined up to contest the Australian National Double Barrel Championship. Another scratch contest, in this event shooters are permitted to load with two rounds, and if a miss with the first barrel results the second may be fired. Two points are awarded for a first barrel kill, on point for a kill with the second try. Again conditions called for two visits to the tracks. 25 clays to be shot at on each visit, for a total possible point score of 100.

First prize for this event is the J M (Jock) Wilson Perpetual Cup (presented by Mr J M Wilson, of Kew, Victoria, President of the Australian Clay Pigeon Trapshooting Association, conductors of the meet), with fourteen more awards for placegetters, handicap awards, ladies' trophy and interstate trophies, exactly as for the Single Barrel Championship.

This event again saw some very fine shooting, despite the very poor conditions, being won on a shoot-off by J W Raleigh, of Queensland, with a score of 117/120. Other placegetters, in order were W N Bullen (NSW - 114/118), E R Ginty (NSW - 115/120), M Burgess (NSW - 114/120), S Marshall (TAS - 95/100), C Nicholls (NSW - 95/100), N Mitchell (NSW - 95/100), R W Moore (QLD - 104/110), W Warren (NSW - 104/110), A Ray (NSW - 104/110), J Meadway (NSW - 104/110), J R Bushby (NSW - 104/110), J

Nunn (NSW - 103/110), W Commins (NSW - 112/120), L A Martin (NSW - 112/120).

The sixteen yard award was won by J Simpson of NSW with a score of 92/100, the 17 yard by R Morris of NSW, with 93/100, the 18 yard by D Burton of NSW, with 101/110, the 19 yard by W Catt of NSW with 93/100, while J Wishart of Victoria took the 20 yard and over award with a score of 111/120. Miss Pam Coxon of Queensland again won the ladies trophy, scoring 77 out of 100.

For Queensland, T H Stone and J Smith scored 92/100, R Hering took the award for Victoria with a score of 111/120, the award for Tasmanian shooters was shared, while R Mules scored 90/100 in winning the South Australian award and W Elliot of Western Australia scored 91/100. Shot concurrently with the Double Barrel Championships was the Club Teams' Championship, teams to consist of four men from any one affiliated club, each of whom must reside within fifty miles of the centre where the club is situated. In the case of Sydney and Melbourne shooters, such members must shoot with the club nearest to their permanent residence. Scores on the first 25 targets released to each competitor only apply.

The winning team holds the Hartley Perpetual Teams' Championship Cup for twelve months, and each member receives a trophy valued at not less than £5/5/-, these awards coming from Hartley's Sports Stores, Melbourne. The winner was Royal Aero Club (NSW) with a total score of 184/200, members of the winning team being C Gibbons (46/50), C Nichols (47/50), Michael (45/50), F R Hudson (45/50).

The thirty highest scorers (being Australian citizens of at least twelve month's standing) in the Australian Double Barrel Championship comprise the Australian team to compete in a cable match for the Mackintosh International Trophy against teams from England, Ireland, New Zealand, Scotland and Wales. This event calls for 100 birds in four visits to the tracks of 25 birds each, a Double Barrel event with two points for a first barrel kill and one for the second barrel, fired from sixteen yards' rise, and restricted to 21/2 inch cartridges with not more than 1 1/2 ounces of No. 6 shot (English measurement) and only the ten highest scores count in the competition. Scores will not be available for some time.

The highest scorer in the Australian Team, J Nunn of Queensland, secured the Hartley International High Gun Cup (presented by Hartley's Ltd, Melbourne), which he will hold for twelve months (or until the next International Match) and a special trophy, presented by the same firm, valued at £5/5/-, together with the International High Gun Sash. Second place was shared by S Marshall of Tasmania and G Biggs of Victoria.

In addition to these, each member of the Australian team received a special "International 1956" badge.

Following the International teams' Match was the Eighth Grand Australian Handicap, 133 shooters competing from their Association handicap marks for the first prize of £50 and Sash (Sash donated by Mr J

M Tyquin, of Brisbane, Queensland), second prize of £30, third prize of £20, and fourth to thirteenth prizes of £10 each. This event calls for forty targets under double barrel conditions, with kills only counting in this case, irrespective of whether one shot or two is required.

Prize-winners, with their scores, were as follows:- H. C. Hollow (Victoria - 40/40), R. A. Richardson (Victoria - 39/40), A. N. McIntosh (Queensland - 39/40), C. Poxon (Tasmania - 39/40), E. H. Harris (NSW - 38/40), L. Haseler (Queensland - 39/40), W. Reid (NSW - 38/40), A. W. Headon (NSW - 39/40), J. Strauss (NSW - 38/40), W. E. Willard, L. Lupp, W. Gibbs, J. Seis, R. Powell, W. Schooley and C. Owers, all with a score of 53/55.

Shot concurrently with the Grand Australian Handicap was the Commonwealth Teams Match, comprising teams of four men from any affiliated club, scores off the first twenty targets released in the Handicap counting. Each member of the winning team receives a trophy from Hartley's Ltd., Melbourne, valued at £5/5-. This event was won by Hay Gun Club, with a score of 368/400, individual scorers being J. Headon, R. Headon, A. Headon and N. Milliken, all with a score of 92/100.

Tuesday dawned, fairly bright, and will less wind, and 175 shooters lined up for the Champion of Champions Cup. Contrary to the name of the event, no championship qualifications are required for entry and I think it could well be renamed "Australian Open Championship" or something such; we have come to know a Champion of Champions match as one open only to club champions. Be that as it may, the event calls for 50 birds from 20 yards rise, under double barrel conditions, kill only counting, irrespective of whether one shot to two is fired for a kill. The winner holds the Mackintosh Perpetual Silver Cup for twelve months and receives a replica of the Champion of Champions Cup, the A.C.P.T.S.A. Champion of Champions Sash, and a Special Trophy valued at £30. Second, third, fourth and fifth placegetters receive trophies valued at £15, £10, £10, and £5, respectively. Winner this year was C. Mudford, of Victoria, with a score of 94/95, followed by W. A. Commons of NSW who scored 93/95.

Following the Champion of Champions event came the A.C.P.T.S.A. Intermediate Championship, restricted to shooters whose Association handicap did not exceed sixteen yards on 13th March, 1956, and calling for 25 targets from 16 yards under double barrel conditions, kills only to count, irrespective of shots fired. The winner receives a trophy valued at £15 (presented by Mr S. E. Lamb, of Goulburn) and Championship Sash, with second, third, fourth and fifth trophies valued at £10, £7/10/-, £5 and £5 respectively.

Placegetters, with scores, were as follows:- W. Edwards (NSW) 58/60, E. H. Harris (WA) 57/60, I. Constable (NSW) 39/40, H. Vickers (NSW) 37/40, D. Mott (NSW) 44/45.

At the conclusion of the meeting prizes were presented by the Governor of NSW, Lieut. - General Sir John Northcott.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
