

NSWCTA Championship



The Carnival attendance was excellent with over 200 competitors. After the success of the 2002 Carnival we again conducted the carnival over 4 days for the second year including State Champion of Champions event.

The team which had competed at the Lonato world cup the previous week arrived in Cyprus on the 8th Sept whilst the rest of the team including the juniors departed Australia that same day to arrive on the 9th. The team from Oz also had to run the gauntlet of transiting through London and from recent past experiences we were not confident of receiving all the bags. As luck would have it all their guns arrived but not all the bags.

Our hotel was the Beau Rivage in Larnaka about 45 minutes by bus from the shooting range. The Cyprus range is a terrific complex comprising a club house on a hill with separate administrative building, and four separate trap and skeet fields below the club house. The only criticism of the facilities was the lack of shade for the competitors. With a record 670 competitors across the three disciplines the organisers changed the program three times to try to accommodate the huge entries and whilst there was a lack of information and communication the tournament went reasonably smoothly.

The trap and skeet men's competition was to be held over three days (50, 25, 50) and the women's over two (50, 25).

The opening ceremony was held in the capital Nicosia on the night of official training, which happened to be the night before the first competition day. Consequently all trap and skeet shooters were banned from attending, as a late night was not the best thing prior to competing. Team officials and junior double trap shooters made up the delegation.

A fantastic effort by Russell to win the silver. This was one of the best double trap finals ever seen. Low score in the final was 45 and the top three trading shot for shot to all end up with 48's. Eller went in one up and came out with the same lead. Russell did everything possible to wear him down, but to his credit he handled the pressure superbly. Adam's 50 in his third round was a big effort as was Russell's 49 in his last.

The team took out the silver and proved once again that we are among the top double trap nations in the world.

Lonato via Singapore and London. A one and a half-hour delay in Singapore meant our connection in London would be tight and this turned out to be the case. We made the flight but our bags and guns didn't. After arriving in Lonato at 10.45am, we chased our bags for hours, only to be told that they may be on the next flight at 16.30 but there was no guarantee. As it was a two-hour trip from the airport to Lonato it was decided that we would wait for that flight to see if the bags arrived. After thirty-two hours of travelling the last thing you want to do is hang around an airport for another six hours. To cut a long story short, the bags arrived but not the guns, and as they had to be cleared individually by customs, we were required to come back to the airport the next day, again. We finally reached our hotel, the Benaco around 19.30, totally exhausted and faced with the reality that we had to do it all again tomorrow.

Day two in Italy. On the bus again at 09.00, arrive at airport at 11.00, find that guns have arrived overnight, but no one can locate keys to customs safe. 12.30 keys are found, but it is now time for customs and police to go to lunch. 14.00 things start to happen again, and finally we clear guns and arrive back at hotel around 17.00. A whole day lost, including valuable training time. So as to keep in with the rest of the team, Adam and Steve also lost their guns on the same route 5 days earlier.

Day three was official training. On arrival at the range the first thing we noticed was that 90 metres out from the traps they have erected a massive mound 27 metres high and running the full length of the 10 trap and skeet ranges. It is fully covered in green shade cloth and coupled with the grass out to the mound makes this one of the most impressive ranges anywhere in the world. The fluoro targets were just brilliant to see on that background. Everyone thought the scores would be really high, but there was a factor they hadn't counted on, the targets. They were as hard as rock and just as hard to break. Some were picked up with as many as 6 holes in them without breaking.

Another early morning, on the day of the competition, but surprisingly I was very calm and relaxed, thanks to my room mate Emma Eagles.

When I arrived at the Nicosia Gun Club, I prepared myself for my event including receiving a massage from the team masseur, D Roach. I tried to stay relaxed, yet focused on the objective that I set out to achieve. I was focused on my targets and not worrying about what the end result could be. As the conditions were very warm, I had to make sure that I continue to keep myself hydrated. As I prepared myself to shoot my first 25 targets of the trap event, I began to feel anxious. Greg Chan, the Australian Coach, was great as he provided me with some encouragement, moments prior to entering the layout. On the first day of competition, we had to shoot two rounds of 25t trap. Very pleased with myself, I shot two rounds of 22.

On day two of the competition, we were required to shoot only one round of 25t trap. Feeling anxious again and knowing how hard I worked the day before to shoot, I began to prepare myself. Once again, I received encouragement from Greg Chan and other team members, moments prior to entering the trap layout. I felt relaxed and just tried to stay focused. As I fired my last shot scoring another 22, I felt a sense of relief. I turned around I noticed several team members had been watching me shoot. I was embraced with hugs and kisses for my effort.

Finally the scores for the other junior women were placed on the scoreboard. Extremely pleased with my efforts, I placed second, winning my first international Silver medal at a World Championship.





Psychological Skills for Shooting by Michael Kruger-Davis

During the NSW State Carnival, I, like a lot of other shooters took the opportunity to browse through the trade tents to look at and even buy something that might help my shooting. Shooting accessories are an essential part of getting in the correct mindset for sport, your favourite hat, glasses, earmuffs or plugs, etc. As I was looking around the Earmold Australia tent I noticed that Ray Mack also sold books. Ray Mack will be well known to most readers as an importer and distributor of quality products and he was only too happy to give me a copy of what he described as a "great book" to review for this article. The book is Mental Training for the Shotgun Sports by Michael J. Keynes.

The book which was published 1996 is a collection of articles written for Shotgun Sports Magazine which is an American Publication. The book comprises of 49 articles or chapters and covers an extensive range of topics. Some of these topics are similar to those that I have covered in past articles in the CTSN such as Relaxation, Visualisation, Imagery, fear, Concentration, Goal setting and self worth. These are generic subjects in sports psychology and basic tenets are applicable to most sports and especially clay target shooting.

There are however a couple of features of the book that are worthwhile noting as very good for the Australian shooter, especially the Australian shooter who plans to travel to the USA to compete. Firstly, this book gives a good overview of shooting in the States and describes some things that would be foreign to non-American competitors. Secondly, there are articles on subjects that are often missed in sport psychology texts and things that we miss in Australia because the depth and breadth of our competition is not as great as that in USA. Some of the more interesting chapters from my point of view were chapters on developing a training plan, time management, keeping a shooting diary. Thirdly there are articles that go beyond shooting and look at aspects that are important for all sport but are usually ignored; nutrition and fitness.

Over the next couple of months I'll examine the book more fully but for now I want to explore the article of nutrition because it's something that I'm often asked about and not being an expert in this field I take what the good Dr Michael Keynes suggests as sound information for the time being. In the chapter Eating to win Keynes looks at the subject of nutrition and the relationship between performance and nutrition, citing his research from the US Department of Defence.

Keynes looks at basic nutrition and the ideal foods. Without going into complex medical reasons, Keynes looks at basic nutrition as getting energy from the foods we eat. He examines carbohydrates because their primary use is to give the body energy; simple carbohydrates are called sugars (glucose) and complex carbohydrates (starches) are linked together, simple carbohydrates are such things as breads and pasta. Sugars, in the form of soft drinks, lollies, chocolates, etc do not need to be broken down by the body so can be readily absorbed into the blood stream. This has the effect of raising our blood sugar level and giving us a high. The problem is that the effects of this high are short lived and we can become tired as the sugar is used up and we crave more; this has a yo-yo effect on our blood sugar levels. Sugars in the forms of starches are not rapidly absorbed but have to be broken down instead and will provide us with a slower release of energy over a longer period of time and does not have the yo-yo effect on our blood sugar levels. Keynes also talks about the use of high carbohydrate meals as a way of promoting relaxation. This effect, called post-prandial dip, is often used by sports people some hours before their match as it allows them to relax as the food is being processed but gives then the energy they need hours later when competing. Finally Keynes talks about how we can use nutrition to reduce the effects of jet lag called the Argonne Diet. High carbohydrate meals promote relaxation while high protein meals are stimulating. If you are travelling east you should eat lightly the day before you travel and then eat a high carbohydrate meal for dinner on departure. This will help you sleep on the plane. Near arrival you should eat a high protein meal that will stimulate you and keep you awake during the day. 

For the second year Maryborough State High School Grade 10 students chose clay shooting as their target external sports activity for the winter/spring term, encouragby teacher and club ed member, John Poulter. 

particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer. (a) the licence or permit number of the seller, (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
