

NATIONAL 20 GAUGE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The first event for the carnival saw a record 72 competitors line up for the National 20 gauge Championship. At the end of qualification Brian Thomson from New Zealand stood alone on a perfect 100/100 to claim victory. Brian received the Royal Blue Sash, Silver Australia Badge and John Withers Memorial Trophy.

After a shootoff for second and third place NZCTA National



President, Ewen Pirie, was declared the winner on a score of 1117/119 from Paul Johnston on a score of 116/119.

Section wins went to Helen Sanders in the Women's 89/100, Hayden Mountjoy 90/100 the Juniors and Neal Dimmick 96/100 the Veterans.

Juniors: Two teams contested for the juniors with the team of Gavin Barry, Hayden Mountjoy and Matthew Smith from Victoria being the eventual winners on a score of 68/75. New South Wales place second on a score of 60/75.



Veterans: Three teams contested for the veterans with the team of Neal Dimmick, Noel Beale and Alan O'Keefe from Queensland taken this event with a combined score of 70/75. Victoria placed

COMMONWEALTH SKEET CHAMPIONSHIP




This 100-target event attracted a field of 103 shooters and At the



<u>Abstract</u> <u>Summary of the Invention</u>

It is therefore an object of this invention to ameliorate the aforementioned disadvantages and accordingly there is disclosed a machine for launching clay shooting targets, said machine comprising a target storage magazine, a delivery plate adjacent the base of the said magazine, a user controllable delivery means adapted to unload either One or a Pair of said targets from the magazine onto a plane of the said delivery plate in a side by side configuration, a throwing arm adapted upon release to move across said deliver plate from a cocked position behind said targets to a discharged position whereby said targets are simultaneously catapulted into the air from the said delivery plate, wherein a leading surface of said throwing arm is curved so as to be in contact with or sufficiently closely adjacent to said targets when in the cocked position to avoid target impact breakage upon release and also provide close flight trajectories for said targets,

Preferable said User operable delivery means comprises a pickup plate which upon activation by the user is adapted to lower said pair of targets through an aperture in the base of the magazine of the said magazine onto the plane of the said delivery plate.

It is further preferred that said delivery means be also adapted to unload one or a pair of said targets at the option of the user.

World Cup Final, Rome Oct 15 - 19, 2003

The annual World Cup Final brings together the top 12 shooters in each discipline for the year. The invitations are extended to the defending champion; the three medallists from the world championships and the top eight qualifiers based on points received for performances at the world cups during the year. It is a highly prestigious tournament and just to qualify is an achievement in itself.

The team departed for Rome via Singapore and Frankfurt on the 12th October and arrived minus guns, which is becoming the norm lately. Rather than sit at the airport for five hours to wait for the next plane, we decided to check into our hotel and return for the guns later.

Our hotel was the Duca D'Este, which is situated around 20 minutes from the shooting range and 45 minutes from the centre of Rome.

The range was built in 1999 and is simply a magnificent complex. The clubhouse sits on the top of a hill and overlooks eight Olympic trap and skeet ranges, five of which have ZZ ranges superimposed. Six of the eight ranges are connected by a tunnel that runs some 350 metres so the shooting is never interrupted by officials or trappers entering the bunker and the skeet houses are on rails to enable them to be moved out of the way when shooting ZZ's. This discipline is very popular in Italy and a recent tournament at this

range attracted over a thousand competitors for one event.

The entire range is covered in grass and this provides a terrific background with the only drawback being that it faces slightly west making it difficult to see targets later in the day. For local events it does not appear to be a problem, they simply turn on the lights and continue shooting into the dark. This actually happened while we were there. In conjunction with the World Cup Final they ran the Grand Prix of Nations and had to shoot under lights in the rain to complete the first days trap competition.

After these discussions it was evident that some categories are being misused necessitating a change in the member categories currently in place. Following are the new membership categories decided on for the 2004 shooting year:

FULL MEMBER:

This level of membership remains unchanged and has been set at \$78.

2ND FAMILY MEMBER:

This level of membership is no longer available.

PARTNER MEMBER:

This level of membership has been introduced to replace the 2nd Family member and is available to the partner of a full member. The cost of this level of membership has been set at \$45.

VETERAN MEMBER:

This level of membership is available to persons who are over the age of 65 years at the time of registration and has been set at \$45.

LONG SERVICE CONCESSION:

This level of membership is available to persons who are over 60 years of age at time of registration with 30 years or more

continuous membership with the ACTA. The cost of this level of membership has been set at \$45.

JUNIOR MEMBER:

This level of membership is available to persons under the age of 18 years at time of registration and has been set at \$23.

CLUB ONLY MEMBER:

Insurance issues have required the Executive to introduce a level of membership that allows shooters to participate without the hassle of clubs obtaining further costly insurance's to protect their interests.

This level of membership has been introduced for persons wishing only to participate at their home club and not in competition. This level of membership is available to new members only and not persons that have been members of the ACTA within the last 5 years. Club Only Members will be afforded full protection under the insurance policies currently held by the ACTA.

Club Only Members will be issued with a card denoting their status and the cost for this level of membership has been set at \$30.

Members with a Club Only membership can convert to another membership category at any time on payment of the balance in the membership fee.


Marconi Marathon 100

State Coaches and State Coaching Coordinators Seminar held in Melbourne 23rd - 26th October 2003

This year the 2003 National State Coaches and State Coaching Co-ordinators Seminar was held over 4 days in Melbourne. It was decided from the outcomes of the 2002 coaching seminar that Coaches would need two full days at a Gun Club to put forward ideas and demonstrate structured standardised coaching procedures.

Metropolitan Clay Target Club at Epping was an excellent choice of venue as it created a very relaxed and workable environment and those who attended were made most welcome by the Club President Mr Cliff Milroy.

Those present at the 2003 seminar:

Gienn O'Brien Chairman Coaching Council Len Cook, Coaching Council John Holder, Coaching Council John Harmer, South Australia Zone Coach David Fox, Western Australia Coaching Director Sue Green, Western Australia Coaching Co-ordinator Jim Niland, Northern Territory Coaching Director John Doyle, Northern Territory Zone Coach Colin Witt Queensland Coaching Co-ordinator Stuart Browning, Tasmania Coaching Director Glenn Woodhatch, Victoria Coaching Co-ordinator David Coleman, NSW Coaching Co-ordinator Elaine Bennett, Tasmania State Secretary Greg Chan ASA Elite Shooter Program Coach

We discussed the achievements of last year and why some people felt coaching appeared to stall. Perhaps coaching did stall in some States but I believe that coaching has consolidated in most States, which is partly attributable to the outcomes of the 2002 Coaching seminar. It became obvious very early the major problem experienced by the group has been a lack of communication and information dissemination. We are looking at a number of ways to improve all levels of communication as we consider this to be the vital link to a successful program.

After our 2002 Coaching Seminar I attended a meeting of all ballistic sports convened in Melbourne. The purpose of the meeting was to develop a "generic" Level One Coaching Manual to cover all shooting sports with Sport Specific Units inserted for Clay Target shooting.

Armed with the outcomes from our 2002 conference we were well prepared for the meeting with documentation of recommendations that our sport wanted to include in the new Level 1 Coaching Accreditation booklet. Consequently most of our suggestions from the 2002 seminar were adopted.

However one specific area not adopted was the acceptance of a two tiered coaching accreditation system. This was a recommendation from the 2002 seminar and was not considered suitable by the other ballistic sports. (You can't win them all)

The new Level One Manual has now been released and was available at the 2003 seminar for State coaches to assess. General consensus is that it is a modern publication that fits today's needs for the Level one coach.

The accompanying booklet for the level one coach is the Basic Coaching Manual, this booklet was also found to be wanting in a number of areas. The group discussed the publication at length and following a significant amount of work an updated Basic Coaching Manual is almost complete. The Level 2 Accreditation course is also currently being dissected and up-dated for a first draft copy to be ready for vetting by each state coach in the very near future. Plans to "fine tune" the "Introduction to Clay Target Shooting" booklet which is given to all new shooters are also under way.

The Coaches Corner in the CTSN will continue. Although not strongly supported it will now be used for the Coaching Council to air coaching issues and to also publish articles written by State Coaches on a rotation basis around the country. Feed back from shooters will be most welcomed.

The single element that constantly recurred over the entire seminar was the need to keep the coaching procedures simple. A number of articles around these procedures have been written by the State Coaches and will be published in the CTSN over the next few months. We once again identified the 3 areas of coaching. Novice, Beginner and Advanced. We felt that the elite shooter is at a stage where he or she has developed their own network of coaches that can help them.

One aspect of the communication issue that was discussed at length was the importance of the club using the State association and particularly the State Coach to assist Zone and club coaches and keep these coaches updated with the latest information available. The idea of Coach the Coach sessions was discussed and generally thought to be a worthy concept. However given the reality of some states having to cover large distances between gun clubs the idea of a "Trouble Shooters Guide for Coaches" was raised.

The purpose of this booklet is to offer support to the newer coach with suggestions on how to deal with a problem. All Coaches are asked to send in their coaching problems and associated helpful suggested solutions for publication in this booklet.

Greg Chan the ASA elite shooting coach spent the Saturday with us and from his presentation the group gained some very valuable information. He spoke about how ACTA, ISSF, and ASA could strengthen the bonds of co-operation to ensure the continuing success that has been achieved at an International level. Greg sees the ACTA as the "talent pool" for identifying a potential elite shooter to take into the ASA Elite Shooter Program.

He would like to see a program operating in each State that will identify and groom a talented DTL / Skeet shooter to eventually take up a place in the ISSF/ ASA Elite Training Program. This talent identification plan would not be limited to junior shooters but would target any shooter that has suitable attributes to make an elite shooter.

From this initial presentation we are now discussing the availability of funding such a program through the ASA and if successful will become another vehicle coaching can utilise.

The Coaches / Co-ordinators who attended this seminar are all enthusiastic and are working towards improving the network of coaches and getting coaching out to the clubs and to the shooter. I would like to sincerely thank all those who participated in the seminar and I can assure all Shooters that the time spent by these dedicated individuals has been a very worthwhile experience.

From the seminar a basic standardisation in coaching principles has been developed, dissemination of information and support for our Coaches will continue to grow and the systems we use in coaching are well into the process of being updated and streamlined. All of these outcomes auger well for the future of coaching within the ACTA and will ultimately make our sport stronger.

Coaches Corner...

VISION

The first thing to understand is which is your dominant eye and this is easily accomplished by pointing with your index finger or making a circle with your index finger and thumb. With your arm out stretched, with both eyes open, point at an object or look though this circle at the same object somewhere in the distance. Now close one eye and if your finger is still pointing at that object or you can still see the object through the circle then this is your dominant eye. If not try the other.

The next thing to check is if your dominant eye corresponds to the same shoulder you shoot off. ie Right eye, right shoulder. If they correspond then seeing double may mean equal strength in both eyes and this may have shown up doing the dominant eye test. If they don't correspond, then obviously all the strength in your vision is coming from the eye that is not looking straight down the barrel.

Depth perception and peripheral vision are the two main losses in using one eye only against clear and concise sight pictures. The ultimate in shooting targets is to see a true, clear and correct sight picture (the end of your gun in relation to the target) every time. Once you have ascertained how you achieve this goal then using one eye only or both eyes is purely a personal choice.

Without seeing you personally, the short answer to your question is; if you have equal vision or a wrong sided dominant eye, stay with one eye only for the above reasons. If you wish to use both eyes, providing your dominant eye corresponds with your shooting shoulder, ease into shooting with both eyes by firstly patching your non-dominate eye. (Attach a small opaque patch on your shooting glass lens in a position to cover your pupil's view of the foresight) when in the shooting position.

Your local coach will be able to assist you with this and help you understand the above answer to your question.

HAVE YOUR SAY -FEEDBACK WANTED

From the recent National Coaching seminar as part of our standardisation of coaching practices we would like to put forward what the State Coaching Directors considered to be the 10 basic principles of shooting. We are asking for comments and suggestions from shooters as the final layout will be printed in poster format for distribution to all ACTA clubs. This will assist coaches and shooters in general, as "the basics" are always the best place to start or return to when a problem arises.

The 10 Basic Principles of Shooting - The 10 F's

1. FEET - positioning

- 2. FORWARD LEAN transference of weight to the front leg.
- 3. FIREARM FIT gun mount, fit to face, free and easy, no force
- 4. FRONT OF TRAP gun hold position
- 5. FOCUS OF EYES out past trap.

 $6.\ {\rm FINGER}$ ON TRIGGER - firm pressure, feeling first joint of index finger.

7. FORGET OUTSIDE INFLUENCES - your call for the target should be a flowing forceful fierce call (due to the Phono-pulls) NOT faint, feeble or faltering. Be flexible, relaxed but alert.

8. FIRE AT TARGET - Focus on target, not foresight in front, target may break if behind, forever flying! (See the target move - shoot the target)

 $9.\ {\rm FOLLOW}\ {\rm THROUGH}$ - Go to next station for your first target of the rest.

10. FEED BACK - self-assessment.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

TIME MANAGEMENT

Last month I started looking at a book that Ray Mack gave me at the NSW State Carnival on mental training for shotgun sports. This month I want to examine this book a little further. Because this article will be appearing in the January issue I wish to deal with those aspects of mental training that need to be taken into account at the beginning of each season.

Unfortunately, our sport does not have an off season; there are always shoots happening somewhere but each year at some point each of us needs to look at a point in which we say; that was last year and now I'm going to prepare for this year.

So what sort of preparation needs to occur. Firstly, you need to set goals. Regular readers of this column can go back to October, 1999 when I looked at how to set goals. Briefly goal setting involves looking at what you want to achieve and developing steps that will help you achieve your goal. The first step is to look at your lifetime goals; what you want to have achieve throughout your life. This is basically your vision of where you want to go. Next look at where you want to be in five years time. This can be in sport, health, finances, relationships, career, etc. Then, look at what you want to achieve this year, and finally look at what your doing this month. Your goals for this month should be directed at achieving your yearly goals and you yearly goals should be focused towards achieving your five-year plan and your five -year plan should be working towards your lifetime goals. Basically, what you are doing in practice and competition now should be part of a bigger picture. My goals for each shoot I attend is to shoot the possible in the event. If I can do that then I stand a chance of winning, and it will help me shoot a possible at the next big pressure shoot I attend. But to shoot a possible, I have to break the my goals down even further to "shoot this target." Because if I can "shoot this target" every time I face it, I can go on to shoot the possible and then continue on in the shoot off.

Michael Keynes, the author of Mental Training for Shotgun Sports, takes the issue of goal setting and achievement a little further and includes chapters on Keeping a Shooting Diary, Time Management, Developing a Training Plan and dealing with procrastination. There is also a chapter on winter goals and planning which would be an important component of competing in the northern states of America.

Keeping a Shooting Diary is an important part of being able to monitor your performance, successes and not so successful shoots (I have intentionally avoided the word failures). Keeping a diary can be as simple as monitoring your registration book or it can be more complex. The amount of detail you wish to keep is up to you. A good example of a diary is the page developed by Jim Shepherd, Level 3 coach from Victoria.

This is a simple to use single sheet that can keep most details that are relevant. But just don't keep a record of shoots, keep a record of practice as well, because the diary can become an important part of mental skills exercises in its own right because you can use it to problem solve and as a monitoring of events, facts, weather, range conditions and feelings. Don't forget to monitor your feelings, thoughts and physical conditions, for example, tiredness, jetlag, hangover, etc.

In the chapter on time management, Keynes examines the use of time to set a realistic and productive training schedule. Keynes argues that people waste time because they have no idea of what to do next. Therefore it is important to be organized and remain on task. He details some simple rules. Firstly, concentrate on one thing at a time. Secondly, know when to stop a task or training procedure. There is a difference between learning a task and maintaining it. Some things do not need to be practiced once you know how to do them; over practicing an individual component will mean that you will never learn to shoot without thinking about it. Thirdly, keep things simple. This has to be the golden rule in life as well as shooting. Complexity invites indecision and splitting of concentration. Next, insure your practice sessions have a purpose and a time limit. Finally, document everything, because unless you know where you've been, you wont know where to go next.

So as the new year approaches, evaluate where you were this year and plan where you want to be at the end of the next year. Your plan may not be to win the National High Gun it may be to increase your average and move into a higher grade. Keeping pushing for personal bests; be they breaks, championships or state or national titles. Because each time you reach a new personal best you are moving towards achieving your next goal.




