The Oceania Games is possibly the most important event on the shooting calendar during the four-year Olympic cycle. It is the last opportunity for Australia to win quota spots for the Athens Olympic Games. For a country to send shooters to the Olympics it must win quotas. Quotas can be won at world cups and world championships, which are open to any country to compete at, or continental championships, which is restricted to countries from that region. We had won four quotas prior to the Oceanias two in men's trap (Michael Diamond and Adam Vella), men's double trap (Russell Mark) and women's double trap (Susie Trindall). A shooter may only win one quota in any discipline, therefore our teams were made up of shooters eligible to win quotas, except in men's trap and women's double trap where we were fully quotered. This was also the last opportunity for several shooters to try to gain their MQS (minimum qualifying score) which must be achieved at an international world event before a shooter can compete at the Olympics.

The tournament was held at the Waikato Gun Club in Hamilton one and half-hours from Auckland. The club is made up of ten DTL

grounds, five skeet, one double trap and one trap range, all situated 10 minutes from downtown Hamilton.

Entry

Entry into the 2004 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2004 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2004 registered shooter record book before nominating.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Mens, Womens, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, excepting the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Mens, Womens, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section only. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors who, on March 31, 2004 will be over the age of 65 years.

Juniors - are those competitors who, on March 31, 2004 will be under the age of 18 years.

Sub Juniors – are those who, on March 31, 2004 will be under the age of 15 years.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger that No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Management Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified - and indication can be obtained for the daily scoreboard. This applies to trap grades, Mens, Womens, Juniors and Veterans divisions.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

- 2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps.
- 3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
- 6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations and are not refundable.
- 14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
- 19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 22. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors and partners only, they being wives or husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
- 23. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.


Does Your Shotgun Fit?



I can't imagine anyone buying a shirt without first checking the size. And yet, many of us purchase a shotgun simply based upon its action type, gauge, and price. Sometimes we even have our dealer order a particular model after reading about it. Even if we handle it at a shop or gun show, how many of us simply throw the smoothbore to our shoulder as a natural reflex, without pausing to analyze where our gaze falls across the rib or whether we have to bob our head back and forth just to center the bead? As long as the gun is well made, looks good, and priced right, we are sold without considering how well its dimensions fit our physique.

And that is why so many of us miss birds.

To be fair, shotgun fit is not something most American hunters take seriously. In Britain, wingshooting is historically reserved for the upper classes who venture afield with 'best' guns measured specifically for them. Here, it's a sport of the people, available to all law-abiding citizens with a scattergun and a hunting license. This has given rise to some wellmade and relatively affordable shotguns, but because they are mass-produced their stock dimensions are, by necessity, designed as a compromise for the 'average' shooter. Consequently, we have been taught simply to adapt and hunt with factory guns as they are.






Trap and skeet competitors have long been aware of the importance of shotgun fit. But proper fit is just as crucial for success in the field. When a cackling pheasant bursts from the corn stubble or a covey of quail explodes from a thicket, we must instantly mount our shotgun, swing, and fire. There is no time to consciously force the gun to fit by hunkering down on the stock or straining to get the bead properly positioned. All too often we blame our misses on poor shooting rather than the fact that our shotgun isn't properly attuned to our physical stature.

Although I am an avid bird hunter with an affinity for side-by-sides, for many

Shotgun Blueprint

years I didn't think much about this subject. Either a gun shot well, or it didn't. I've had smoothbores, like my 1914-era 12-bore Wesley Richards, with which I seemingly couldn't miss. In fact, even though this classic British side-by is bored Improved Modified and Full, I often take it pheasant hunting, as it consistently drops both close and distant birds. On the other hand, I took my 12gauge Beretta 682, which dates from the 1980s and is choked Modified and Full, on a goose hunt in Alberta and had a devil of a time bagging my limit even though the sky was practically covered with geese.

Consequently, I had come to consider myself an adequate shotgunner who occasionally got lucky, sometimes limiting out, other times grateful if I came home with a brace of birds for the weekend. Then I met Bryan Bilinski, who not only changed my outlook on shotgunning, but changed my 'luck' afield.

Five Key Dimensions

Bryan is managing director of Fieldsport, a wingshooting school and importer for AyA, Ithaca Classic Doubles, and Kemen. He is also one of the country's leading shotgun fitters. Our meeting was prompted when I maxed out my credit card by ordering an NID Ithaca 7E from Steve Lamboy, president of Ithaca Classic Doubles. These hand-built sideby-sides are reissues of the famous New Ithaca Double shotguns that were so popular—and are now so collectible from 1926 through 1948. Rather than purchasing a gun already in stock, this one was to be highly personalized, featuring special engraving, double triggers with specific pulls of 3 and 3½ pounds for right and left barrels, respectively, and chokes of Improved Cylinder and Improved Modified.

'With such definite ideas about what you want,' Bryan said over the phone, 'Steve felt the gun should be tailored to your exact measurements.'

I had to agree. It would be downright embarrassing if I got my customized Ithaca and couldn't hit anything with it. Besides, I also rationalized it would be a cost-effective move, for with a properly fitted shotgun, I would be using fewer shells per bird and over a period of time, could theoretically recover the price of my gun. At least, that's what I told my wife. I also realized that the benefits of proper fit could be applied to any shotgun, whether it was a Remington 870 or a Winchester 21.

Shotgun fit breaks down into five basic categories: 1) length of pull-the distance from the trigger to the rear of the stock; 2) drop at comb—the distance from an imaginary line extending straight back from the rib and over the comb down to the top of the comb; 3) drop at heel—the measurement of this same imaginary line extended even farther down to the heel of the stock; 4) pitch—which is the way the stock 'twists' in relationship to the receiver and affects how securely it will fit into your shoulder; and 5) castwhich is the slight bend of the buttstock as it angles either to the left or the right of an imaginary line running down the length of the rib. 'Cast off' describes a stock that angles to the right, away from the shooter's face, and is typically the measurement used for right-handers. 'Cast on' refers to a stock that bends to left of the receiver, and thus, away from the left cheek of southpaw shooters.

For hunters, a shotgun lacking the correct drop causes you to shoot too high or too low. Improper cast results in patterns tossed to the left or right of the quarry. Either discrepancy means lost birds.

Most gun fitters use a 'try gun' to achieve a perfect fit for their clients. A try gun is a shotgun with a buttstock possessing numerous knuckle adjustments that can alter the length of pull, drop, cast, and pitch. Normally these measurements are made in a gun store by someone skilled in this practice. In a way, it is like being measured for a suit of clothes by a tailor; the more skilled the tailor, the better the suit will fit. By mounting the shotgun again and again, and checking your stance and sighting back down the barrels from the muzzle end of the unloaded gun, the fitter is able to adjust the stock to your exact measurements.

Surprisingly, there are no 'try gun fitting schools.' Every fitter learns as an apprentice from someone else, and then perfects his techniques by constant practice. Bilinski began learning his craft back in the 1980s under some of the best fitters at the Orvis Shooting School. But Bilinski, who was instrumental in helping establish sporting clays in this country, is also a shooting coach, and quickly realized that proper stance is equally important as proper gun fit.

'It's impossible to do a good gun fitting if you can't also coach and teach proper shooting,' he says. 'I can't let you stand incorrectly and expect good things to happen with an improper gun mount, no matter how well the shotgun fits.'

Thus, Bryan differs from most gun fitters by having you shoot his try gun once all the measurements are made. In this way, he is able to fine-tune the stock dimensions based upon the shooting ability of customers. In the process, he invariably improves their shooting. Obviously, this hands-on approach goes beyond the traditional fitting procedure and involves a second session at the range. Most of Bryan's customers visit his Traverse City, Michigan, location in conjunction with purchasing a custom shotgun or schedule a fitting before going on one of his fall bird hunts.

Shooting In The Fit

Luckily Bryan and I were able to get together at the Beinfeld International Sporting Arms Show, held every winter in Las Vegas to showcase some of world's finest rifles and shotguns. Meeting at his

Fieldsport booth, we took the first step, using his try gun, a side-by-side 12-bore made by the Midland Gun Company, in Birmingham, England, and fitted with Briley chokes. Interestingly, no company makes a try gun, per se; they must be custom ordered, just like factory cutaway salesmen's models of various firearms that were so popular in the last century. Speaking of which, at this same gun show I saw a Winchester Model 21 try gun priced at \$16,500!

My session, which took approximately 15 minutes, involved a number of adjustments, with Bryan making alterations to the gun every time I threw it up to my shoulder and looked down the rib.

While being measured, I learned that an average length of pull for a straightgripped shotgun with double triggers was 14½ inches, that the typical drop at comb was 1½ inches, and 2½ inches is average for drop at heel. However, many factory guns do not allow for any cast off or cast on of the stock, opting for a middle-of-the-road compromise that, unfortunately, benefits neither right- nor left-handed shooters. By comparison with these typical stock dimensions, my trygun session resulted in a 14½-inch length of pull, a 1½-inch drop at comb, and a 2%-inch drop at the heel.

The next part of this measuring session was the most enjoyable, for it involved Bryan and I breaking away from the show and driving out to the Nellis Trap & Skeet Club at nearby Nellis Air Force Base. There, we quickly set up a steel plate at 16 yards from the firing line. The plate was sprayed with white paint and then marked with a bright orange dot in the center. As I shouldered the try gun for the first shot, Bryan looked at my feet and said, 'You're basically a rifle shooter, aren't you?'

Sure enough, both feet were pointing perpendicular to the target. I was reminded that wingshooting is not the same as riflery. I quickly corrected my stance, quartering towards the target, with my left foot pointing towards the orange dot (the perceived point of break) and my right foot on a 45-degree angle to my left. I was glad Bryan was there.

'You can't fit yourself for a shotgun stock any more than you can fit yourself for a suit,' he said. 'You need someone else to observe.'

I put the try gun to my shoulder. With the correct drop of the stock, I could see the bead resting on top of the rib. I placed it over the orange paint and fired. The pattern, which showed up admirably against the large white plane, was slightly to the left and low. I then fired four more times to make sure it was the gun and not me. At 16 yards, for every inch your point of impact is off, you must calibrate the stock 1/16th of an inch in the opposite direction. Bryan took the gun back to his portable bench and made some minor tweaks. We discovered I actually shot better with a slightly longer length of pull than had been established in his booth; my readjusted LOP was 141/8 inches. The solid obliterations of the orange spot with my last five shots confirmed those measurements.

'Depending on a shooter's skill, we usually have to spend three to four hours at the range,' Bryan said. In between respraying the target and reapplying the orange spot, our entire session took slightly less than an hour. It was just as well, for by then the sun was starting to set and the bright muzzle blasts from the barrels were distinct in the fading twilight.

Final Adjustments

Back home, I measured my two shotguns. Whoever ordered my Wesley Richards in 1914 must have been 5 foot 10 inches tall and weighed 165 pounds just like me, because that stock fit my dimensions exactly. Which explains why I was able to shoot it so well. By contrast, my Beretta had a 14 inch length of pull and not enough drop. Fortunately, length of pull is the easiest measurement to correct. It is also the most important, as it affects trigger pull and gun mounting. Pull length can be increased by installing a recoil pad of the desired thickness, such as those offered by Pachmayr, or a removable slip-on leather pad made by firms like Galco. Wearing bulky clothing will also affect LOP, so if your shotgun measures 141/2 and you need 14³/₄ inches, don't make any alterations if you plan any cold-weather hunting; the bulkier clothes will make up the difference. To decrease LOP, simply shorten the stock or replace a thick recoil pad with a thinner one.

For the more complicated adjustments of drop and cast, hot oil stock bending may be the only solution. However, stock bending is an expensive process, and there is always the danger of cracking the wood, especially on older guns. But with many shot-guns, a good gunsmith can simply pull the stock and shave a predetermined amount of wood from one side or the other to change the angle of drop or cast. When the stock is refitted back onto the receiver, it will be correctly repositioned left or right, up or down. As for my Beretta, which needed major adjustments, I sent it to gunsmith Les Pittman, an expert in stock bending, to have a thicker recoil pad installed and to make adjustments in both cast off and drop.

Bryan informed me that a pistol grip stock requires a %-inch shorter LOP than a straight grip stock. After our session, in which I was using a straight-gripped try gun, I called Steve at Ithaca Classic Doubles and shortened my custom shotgun's LOP accordingly, as my work order called for a pistol grip. Twentygauge guns require a %-inch longer LOP than 12-gauges due to the shorter receivers on the smaller bores; the difference must be made up in the length of stock that it takes to reach your shoulder.

Once you know your correct measurements, simply take a tape measure with you to the gun shop or gun show and see how close a coveted scattergun comes to matching your physical requirements. I have since passed up buying an otherwise attractive and affordably priced Parker because it did not fit me. Of course, unless you are considering a custom gun, or happen to get lucky, as I did with my Wesley Richards, no shotgun is going to meet all of your qualifications. But while I am waiting for my custom NID Ithaca to be delivered, I am shooting a lot better with the Beretta since having its stock altered.

Which brings me to the only downside of owning a properly fitted shotgun: There is no longer any excuse for missing.

Coaches Corner...

THE SEVEN "P's"

What is the seven "P's"?

The seven "P's" is a saying that comes from the military and it stands for; PRIOR PLANNING PREPARATION PREVENTS PISS POOR PERFORMANCE.

What this means is that when you undertake any given task or activity you should take the time to plan what it is that you are about to do. In our sport of shooting clay targets this could include:

TRAINING FOR MAJOR EVENTS:

Knowing that a certain event is X weeks away gives you the opportunity to start a training regime that suits your work, family and other lifestyle commitments.

This could include physical, diet, mental and/or target practice to give you the edge over other competitors.

EQUIPMENT:

Ensuring that the equipment you use is in the best possible condition is essential. From the shoes you are wearing to the fit of your gun all needs to be in order for good results. Guns should be cleaned and serviced at regular intervals and kept in quality cases to protect them from the elements and damage. This will ensure that optimum performance is achieved from your firearm.

Other equipment such as glasses, jackets, hats etc should be kept in a bag or case that you can fit all of the items that are needed into, so that they are always together and you don't need to run around trying to find things at the last minute, or worse forgetting that all important item.

BEING PREPARED FOR ALL POSSIBLILITIES:

This is having the wet weather gear in case of rain, that spare ejector spring just in case or any number of other possibilities that may arise. Although it is impossible to prepare for everything, by doing a bit of homework on the club or venue that you will be attending it may be possible to eliminate some potential problems.

When at a club that you have never been to before take the time to have a look over the traps and take note of the targets, trajectory, height, angles, etc so that there are no surprises when you start the competition.

ENSURE THAT YOU ARE CLEAR HEADED AND READY FOR COMPETITION:

To give yourself the best possible chance of success you need to be at your mental best. To arrive at the firing line in this state is essential and that the athlete must not be hung over or in any other state of intoxication. Other factors that may cloud your mind are work, family, or monetary problems. These factors need to be worked through before you go to the firing line. It is handy to have a mental switch that can be turned ON as you make your way to the line, so that your only thoughts are on the task ahead.

Try to be as positive as you can.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Lifting the Bar.

In his opening remarks to the shooters gathered at the Advanced Coaching Clinic recently held at Maryborough Gun Club, Jim Shepherd, the organiser and level 3 coach, believed that taking part in the day would "lift the bar" for those who attended. The problem with advanced skills coaching, mental training, etc is that you don't see the results immediately. By learning the skills,

knowledge and concepts you will be better over time and you will be able to lift the bar.

The Advanced Coaching day was organised jointly by North-West Zone and North-East Zone of the VCTA and I believe that the day was a resounding success. I'm not just saying this because I happened to be one of the presenters; the programme was interesting and informative, the speakers were credible in their fields, the food was delicious and the organisation especially the timing was excellent.





There were a number of Victorian coaches were available; John McVitty, Glenn Woodhatch, Jim Shepherd, Steve Atkins, Gary Cassells, Terry Boucher and the VCTA president, Ron Trail. The day started with Kevin Wright explaining how to fit a gun. His talk was informative and he explained, in simple language, what gun fit was about. He demonstrated where and how a gun should fit. The next session was of my session on motivation and goal setting. This was followed by a practical, hands on, shooting session where shooters had the opportunity to have one of the coaches assist their shooting technique. This session was assisted with the generous support of RIO Oceania who provided shells for the participants to try. Three types of shells were available and this gave the shooters, especially the juniors, the opportunity to try RIO subsonics, RIO 20s or RIO Star Team. Back inside and it was time to look at the importance of the eyes

in shooting. While initially this topic was a bit clinical it improved when people started asking shooing specific questions about glasses, glass colour and so on.

After a fine lunch, Ian McGeoch, gave a fascinating session on how to look after your gun; cleaning, maintenance, patterning, choke selection and then the final session was again looking at mental skills training and involved learning out of sport concentration exercises and some visualisation techniques to improve dealing with distractions.

What was interesting about this coaching concept was that involved aspects of shooting

that went beyond how to shoot. Coaching is an interesting phenomenon. Any readers who are interested in Rugby League or Union, Aussie Rules or Cricket are well aware of the role of the coach in these sports. The coach may help with some technical skills but usually the coach's job is to mould the team into a productive and manageable unit. It's often the case that the coach of these sports are not even players or ex-players; Allan Jones, former coach of the Wallabies is a good examples of this.

So if the role of the coach in team sports is to motivate and lead the team, what is the role of the coach in an individual sport such as shooting or golf? Initially, for every sport the role of the coach is to teach and refine technique; but most shooters, once they

understand the fundamentals, are able to shoot some targets, and improving technique will only lift the bar so high. So what is the coach's role after the shooter has learnt to shoot. It's here that the role of the coach changes from teaching techniques, to facilitating life skills or in the case of a sportsperson; match skills. Aspects such as goal setting, performance logging, motivation, visualisation, out of sport relaxation and concentration exercises, dealing with defeat and injury and retirement issues are all components that the serious sportsperson should have support with. Most shooters perform well without a personal trainer or coach because they have the skills and abilities to achieve the results. However, if your



motivation is to achieve higher results then using a personal coach will provide guidance to help you reach a higher level. Most level 3 coaches have the skills and the training to be able to provide individual programs for sportspeople in their care. The coach is able to view your performance with a level of objectivity that you cannot do.

So what should you look for in a coach or personal trainer. Coaches need not be champions in their own right, in fact this can distract you from your goals of achieving personal bests if you are in awe of your coach; that persons performance will always be a barrier to you achieving your own potential. Ex-champions are great for teaching you the technical stuff, the how to. But if you are to go beyond this, then the coach needs to have knowledge. This knowledge has to involve the game, its' rule, the exceptions. The coach needs to have knowledge about people; what motivates them, fears, irrational and rational beliefs. There needs to be a sound understanding of the psychological skills for the sport you are doing. Secondly, coaches need to be organised. Coaching sessions, practise sessions and matches need to have a purpose and a structure that will allow for the development of skills and concepts. Thirdly, coaches need to have good communication and interpersonal

skills. Gone are the days when coaches screamed and belittled players. Coaches need to be genuine, warm, caring, congruent and respectful.

What did the Advanced Coaching Clinic achieve? It provided for shooters an opportunity to go beyond the mechanical aspects of being able to hit a target. It explored those issues that will help shooters lift their own personal bar and achieve better results more consistently. It showed shooters that just coming to the competition with the aim to win is not enough. To win you must be prepared, organised, have set realistic and achievable goals to help you along the way. It gave shooters the opportunity to talk about aspects of their shooting they may have been scared of asking. It provided a sense of belonging, acceptance and fun. If we can lift the bar, then as we compete with each other we will all start to achieve better results. The organisers need to be congratulated for coming up with the idea of an advanced coaching skills day and even more so for their ability and hard work in making it such a success.

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm

that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned." The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.






