Alcoa "Coach in Residence" ISSF Coaching Weekend

With Russell Mark, OAM
6th & 7th December 2003

On the weekend of 6th & 7th December 2003, the ISSF fraternity of Western Australia was provided with Coaching support through an unusual source of funding.

Here in Western Australia there a unique program offered by the Department of Sport & Recreation (DSR) which assists sporting Associations to bring International, National or high profile Coaches to or within Western Australia for enhancement and building of the State's competitors skill base. This program sponsored by Alcoa and is called the Alcoa "Coach-In- Residence" Program, which has been in operation for some 27 years and bought into Western Australia countless numbers of Coaches to assist Western Australian athletes.

Last year as the W.A.C.T.A (Inc) ISSF Delegate, I presented the Executive Committee a request for support from this program, in order to bring Russell Mark, OAM, to Western Australian in December 2003. This program was presented to assist our already identified ISSF members with their skills level, particularly the States selected ISSF Representative Teams in Trap and Double Trap. This was a culmination of two years work to finally get Russell across outside of his International representation, employment and media commitments. Assisting Russell with the Coaching weekend was Murray Alexander, OAM (NCAS Level 3) and Christine Alexander (NCAS Level 2).

The outline for the weekend was - Day 1 covered general topics and practical training on Double Trap with Day 2 covering the finer points on ISSF Trap. Included in the weekend were informal discussions on issues relating to travelling, drugs in sport, Rules, concentration / zoning, fitness & diet and the importance of vision training. Once these issues were exhausted on both days, maximum practical training time was afforded the participants so that Russell was able to impart the finer points of the respective disciplines.

Amongst those that attended, were experienced and partial novices plus the State President - Mr Shane Williams and State Coach - Mr David Fox. Invitations were sent out to as many of the people who had participated in ISSF competitions over the past three years, some 70 plus people from all over the State. Those that were farmers were unable to attend due to harvesting and people associated with the fishing industry were also occupied with their season, but they assure me they will be in attendance for the next one organised.

Although some of the participants had been given previously the same or similar information from the home grown Coaches, the fact that Russell (a Gold and Silver Olympic medallist) was imparting the knowledge gave credibility to this information, with the athletes taking notice and absorbing the knowledge more readily. Each day saw 20 plus participants observe, partake and give feedback as to the value of the weekend and of Russell's attendance. Participants of the Coaching weekend paid a nominal sum each day for the Coaching weekend in support of the funds provided under the DSR Alcoa "Coach-In-Residence".

Thanks must go to Russell for coming over and giving us this valuable time out of his busy schedule along with Murray Alexander for assisting in such an important "stepping stone" in Western Australia's ISSF discipline. Thanks also to the West Australian Gun Club (Inc) for having the machinery and facilities up to the quality required for such a program.



I would finally like to thank enormously on behalf of W.A.C.T.A (Inc) and the ISSF participants of Western Australia - Liane Tooth of DSR for the support in accessing the Alcoa "Coach-In-Residence" to in assist in bringing Russell over here to work with our competitors and Coaches. This is the beginning of the ISSF Coaching program and as time goes on, more involvement of the standard discipline members and continued building of the base in the challenging discipline of ISSF, will increase our performance level at State and National level representation.

ACTA OLYMPIC TRAP CHAMPIONSHIP

Seventy-eight competitors nominated for this event. Jeff Tonna was the top qualifier into the final with a score of 117/125. Ben Kelley, Adam Vella, Domingo Diaz, Tony Cantali and Tom Turner also qualified for the final.

Jeff shot a further 23/25 in the final with a total score of 140/150 to take the overall position. Two shooters remained on 138/150 resulting in a sudden death shoot off. Second place being awarded to Domingo Diaz plus 3 from Ben Kelley plus 2 in third place.



AA Grade winner was Adam Vella 114/125; A Grade winner was Tony Cantali 113/125; B Grade winner was Andrew Mintzas 107/125; and C Grade winner was Joe Dematos 108/125.

with a final event score of 144/150. Tom Turner (143) and Ben Kelley (139) also scored a 24 in the final to finish second and third.

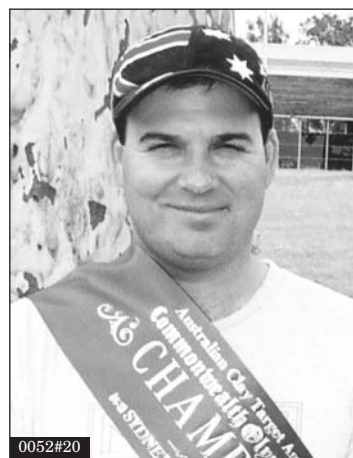

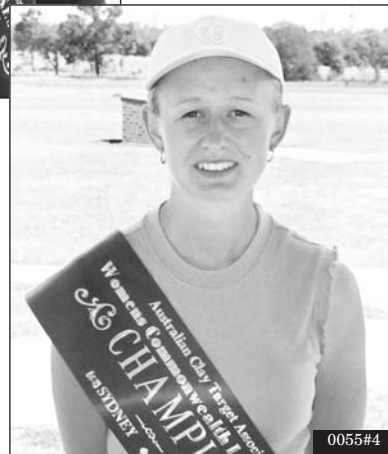

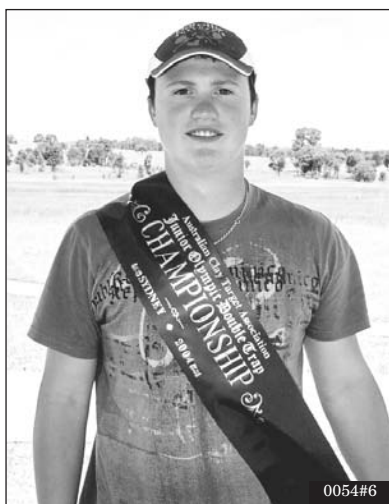

177/200 plus 2 from Tom Turner in third place on a score of 177/200 plus 0.

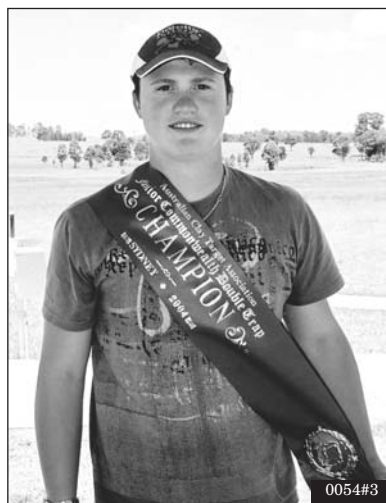

Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

Preparing for the Nationals

As this article is being read, most of us will be preparing for the 2004 trap Nationals. In terms of the mental aspects of the sport, how can we prepare?

In researching this article, I read a paper by Jeffery Bond, Chief Psychologist for the Australian Institute of Sport in Canberra on performance segmenting which argued that you should break up your competition experience into smaller and much more manageable units. These units can then be dealt with one at a time.

For the shooter attending the Nationals what are the segments that are important and need consideration? Firstly, it is necessary to explain that this list is made from my mind and experience and is by no means exhaustive or suitable for every reader. Each person will have to look to him or herself to determine what is important for them.

Goals. I know I seem to harp on this but they are important as they provide a roadmap by which we need to travel to achieve what we want. By the time the Nationals come around most of us should have a clear idea of what we want to achieve. Whilst it is important to aim high it is also necessary to aim for important and achieve important steps along the way. At the recent Olympic Discipline Nationals I had the opportunity to talk with Lauryn Ogilvie. During our discussion it became apparent that her drive and successes were due to her having a major long term goal; namely to win an Olympic Gold medal. She did not discount her other achievements or failures for that matter because for her they were part of the process that was going to help her achieve her desired goal.

An interesting comment she made was that there needs to be for everyone a balance to life and that just doing one thing (for example, shooting) denies you the opportunity to grow and develop as a person because there is more to each of us than having a single focus. Lauryn went further to state that some of her life goals, for example, being fit, working, studying, etc also helped her to shoot and compete and where possible life goals should integrate and not a list of goals for this and a list of goals for that.

TAIPAN SHIELD 2003

Congratulations to the girls from the Werribee Victorian Clay Target Club on claiming victory in the 2003 Taipan Shield postal competition.

Wendy Wellam, Linda Ristevski, Stacey Roiall, Michelle Beecham and Lauryn Ogilvie shot the competition in December with a combined score of 119/125 for a clear win from the Majura Park team on a score of 115/125 in second place.

Third place went to the team from the Burdekin Gun Club with a combined score of 106/125.

Lauryn also talked about having a routine to provide consistency for both training and competition so that you had a vehicle by which you could focus your attention and concentration and a comfort station from which to reduce anxiety that may develop during the competition. She stated that for her it was important to have a pre competition routine and a within competition routine; in both cases this involved visualisation.

Regular readers of this column and those who have attended workshops will be aware of the importance of having a routine that cues and focuses your attention. The importance of using visualisation techniques is that you are able to give your right side of the brain the message you want to convey without resorting to talking to yourself which is most likely to foster self doubt. This routine may involve making sure you've got all your gear; favourite glasses, jacket, etc as well as the rituals you undergo as you wait for your squad to shoot. For some it might be sitting quietly on their own, for others it might be stretching or talking with other squad members.

So in preparing for the Nationals some fundamentals need to be adhered to. Firstly, have your goals clearly defined in your own mind. It may be you are striving to beat your previous best performance or win a national title. It doesn't matter what your goal is; make it your goal, make it achievable and make it fun to achieve. Anything better than what you set for yourself will be icing on the cake. Secondly, cut the Nationals experience up into smaller segments of pre-competition, competition and post competition so that you can adequately prepare for each stage. Next, look at the Nationals as a series of events that go together to make a whole and look to see what you achieved with each section rather than look at the whole and be disappointed. Fourthly, have a routine, which you can use to focus your attention both before and during the competition. Next, arrive at the Nationals fit; mentally fit, physically fit and match fit. Lauryn expressed this as being confident in your ability; to both achieve and to improve, as there is always room for improvement. It is no good turning up to an event not believing in your own ability to achieve. There will be enough shooters out there trying to beat you, don't help them by beating yourself. Be positive and realistic about your ability. Sixth, as well as having confidence in yourself you need to have confidence in your equipment; gun, ammunition, accessories. You need to also be aware of comments that others may make can effect your thinking and produce doubt. Stay focused in the here and now. You can't shoot in either the past or the present. Finally, you have to enjoy the competition and remember that your whole world should not revolve around whether you win or lose.

For those experienced shooters the Nationals are an important part of their shooting calendar. What surprises me is the few B and C grade shooters that ever turn up to either the Nationals or a state carnival. Coming to these shoots should be an important part of your learning process for the sport. Firstly, after competing at a shoot, with the calibre and size of the competition that attends the Nationals, will help you shoot at your local club because the prospect will not seem as daunting. Secondly, there is a good chance of taking home a section prize in one or all of the events, and thirdly, shooting alongside the best Australia has to offer will lift your game as well.

Remember, go to the Nationals prepared. Have your goals clearly defined, be confident in your ability and your equipment, break up the whole experience into manageable segments, stay focused in the here and now and most of all have fun.

Having recently released the Canterbury Trapmaster trap into Australia, we would like to assure potential customers that this US designed trap does not infringe any existing patents. In fact, our machine holds its own US patent # 6,588,410 B1, issued in July 2003. Anyone is free to check this on the Internet via site www.uspto.gov

The unique aspect of our trap is the fact that it is the only fully automatic singles/doubles trap machine in the world that throws two targets using an arm and does not throw off a plate. All other machines, to the best of our knowledge, use a plate from which to sweep two targets off. The Trapmaster also uses the same straight arm as has been used for over 50 years on the handset Winchester 1524 (White Flyer) trap. The patented invention on this trap, is the delivery mechanism of the two targets onto the arm - something that has never been solved before now.

What this means in target presentation, is that you are seeing the same doubles targets as off the old handset trap, i.e. what has

become accepted in the sport as a perfect pair. Both targets travel the same distance, at the same speed, with both targets following the same trajectory, time after time - there is no variation in the flight from one pair to the next. Even after just a few months use in NZ, doubles scores are rising and shooters are enjoying this discipline again. In the USA, shooters are seeing the same doubles as they have always seen - no change from the old handset to the new automatic.

One other significant aspect of this trap is its chassis, which allows full windage adjustment. This means that in windy conditions the trap can be adjusted to compensate, so that a level pair of targets is thrown even in adverse weather. Of course, on the old handset trap, you were able to adjust the target finger position to compensate for weather - but you can't do that with an automatic.

It is our pleasure to bring this trap to Australian shooters and we look forward to supporting you at your events across the country. Check us out at our full trade display at the forthcoming DTL Nationals in Wagga.

He installed the first trench layout at the NSW Gun Club in NSW and was always available to sort out any problems and with his interest in new traps and equipment kept our club at the forefront of technology. He was the supplier of all the shooting equipment of the 2000 Olympic Games and was always looking at ways to keep the cost of shooting affordable.

He manufactured clay targets and ammunition to keep the opposition on their toes. He also sponsored several young promising shooters, Russell Mark, Michael Diamond, Ben Kelly to name a few. He was a donor of many prizes for shoots all over Australia. He will be missed not only by our members but also by the whole of the shooting community Australia wide.

SERGIO ZUFFO

With the recent passing of Sergio Zuffo, the Australian Clay Target Association, NSW Gun Club and clay target shooters, have lost one of their most ardent supporters, one whose influence, contribution and commitment to the sport over many years will be greatly missed.



Sergio, who joined the Australian Clay Target Association on 11 February 1975, will be fondly remembered in shooting circles for the outstanding contribution that he made to the growth and development of clay target shooting throughout NSW and Australia. In particular his home club, NSW Gun Club, which he served well both as a club member and club captain. His contribution to the development of the sport, particularly at club level, will also be fondly remembered by the many clubs' across the country that benefited by their association with him.

Sergio's last active involvement in the sport was with the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games, for which he provided the Mattarelli clay target equipment and played an instrumental role in the delivery of the clay target events. He was a proud man during the Olympic Games, when two shooters who had benefited from his support in the early days of their international development, Michael Diamond (gold) and Russell Mark (silver), won medals for Australia.

Sergio's funeral took place at St Cecilia's Catholic Church, Balgowlah, NSW on Friday 2 January, when family and friends gathered to pay a final tribute to a man whose life had been devoted to his wife Ursula, and daughters Annamaria and Rebecca.

Friends of long standing, Bill Humel a friend of 48 years from the building industry, Hank Theunissen, NSW Gun Club and Robert Smith, a long time friend from the sport, had little difficulty in recalling and sharing with those present in the church, some of the pleasant memories they each had from their friendship and long association with Sergio and their knowledge of some of the many personal attributes that he possessed.

One of four children of Livio and Maria Zuffo, Sergio was born in Dolo, Italy, on 11 November 1931. While being very proud of his Italian heritage and having a deep appreciation for his native home, he was also very proud to be an Australian and prouder still of the country that adopted him.

Following his arrival in Australia in 1954, Sergio successfully established himself in the building and plastering industry, where his determination and aptitude for hard work became evident with his business becoming one of the most successful of its kind in Sydney. In later years and in a move away from the building industry he established a thriving clay target and cartridge manufacturing business, where the names Olimpyc Targets and Scorpio Cartridges soon became household names in the sport of clay target shooting

His many friends in Australia and around the world who admired and respected him for his integrity, hard work and determination and who would have been saddened by the news of his passing have lost a true and valued friend.

Sergio, who above all had a profound love of his family, is survived by his loving wife Ursula, daughters Annamaria and Rebecca, sister Silvana (Italy), and brother Daryo (Sydney), to whom we extend our deepest sympathy.

GUN FIT

by Tim Catling Level 2 Coach

So Shooter X comes to you with a new gun and asks your help to see that it fits:

Use the following steps:

1. **Check the pull:**
367mm or 14 1/2 inches
2. **Check stock length** with gun mounted
The line of fingers and the nose and chin. Then look at the gap, it should be 40mm or 1 1/2 inches.
3. **Eye - Rib alignment:**
Have the shooter mount the gun with eyes shut. When he is comfortable, open the eyes. The pupil of the eye should be straight down the rib.
4. **Comb Height:**
With the gun mounted, place 2 x 20 cent pieces on the rear of the rib and the shooter should be able to see over them to about half way along the rib.
5. **Pitch:**
is the relationship between the line of the kick pad to the line of the barrel rib. The gun will need negative pitch. Check this in a doorway. Start with 50mm or 2 inches. Many shooters need more than that.
6. **Patterning:**
pattern from 30 to 33 metres. Have the shooter shoot at the mark as he would a straightaway target. Don't rifle shoot it.
Continue patterning until the centre of the pattern is 60/40 above. Then the top barrel will be about 70/30.
To change the pattern centre downwards, place a wedge in the heel of the kick pad, 2mm or 1/8 inch will move the pattern a fair amount, keep at it until 60/40 is reached.
7. **Now Test** it by having the shooter mount the gun straight out from the body and fire the gun. By standing to one side you can then observe the barrel.
It should remain still.
8. **Last Test:**
Set the trap straight. Have the shooter shoot the straightaway at 6 O'Clock on the target. He should break the target very well.
The shooter should have the feeling that the gun shoots itself.

THE GUN NOW FITS.

HELPFUL HINTS

GETTING KICKED IN THE FACE:

The SHOOTER comes to you complaining of getting kicked in the cheek.

This is usually caused by incorrect mounting of the gun. That is if the gun fits him in the correct way. What the shooter is doing is taking the face to the gun, instead of the gun to the face.

Try the following two remedies:

1. Have the shooter mount the gun pointing to the sky at about 80f. Then bring the gun down to the trap house. This seldom fails.
2. Have the shooter mount the gun to the jaw line and then run the stock up the face to the cheek, picking up a little "meat" to cushion the cheekbone. This will reinforce the

gun coming to the face, not the face to the gun. This method will take more practice.

Different shells will pattern differently in different guns, but not always.

So encourage the shooter to use the same shells all the time, after you have got it right for him.

The main thing here is that faster shells will generally lower the pattern.

This is why that sometimes a shooter will change his shells and have trouble. He will complain that his timing has gone, when really it is that the **pattern centre** has changed.

Kick Pads: Encourage shooters to use straight kick pads because when the gun is not mounted **properly** it will not really matter.

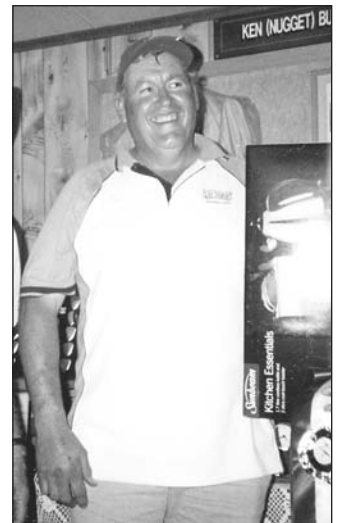

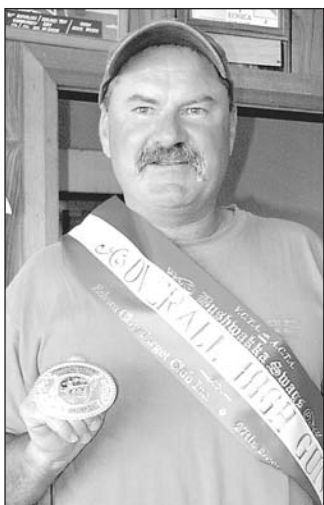

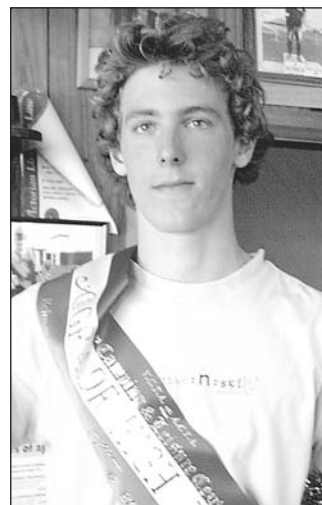

INDIGENOUS LADIES CLAY TARGET TRAINING PROGRAM

11TH OCTOBER - 22ND NOVEMBER 2003 AT THE WEST AUSTRALIAN GUN CLUB (INC)

An approach was made by the Department of Sport & Recreation (WA) (DSR) Indigenous Development Officer - Mr Errol McGrath about the possibility of conducting a clay target training program for indigenous women. This came about because the ladies wished to participate in sports other than the identified "main stream" activities in which they were involved. Basically each of the women wanted to try a sport where no networking existed for their families or friends or other members of the communities and therefore could relate the experience and promote the virtues of the sport back within their communities.

DSR provided some funds towards the training program and each lady paying the balance of the program. The Club had reservations and was very clear with its responsibilities or considerations. The DSR representative was equally supportive of the ramifications, being that it is a firearm related sport and that the Club is in an isolated area. It was explained that these requirements were part and parcel for all and not just for this program specifically. Once all had been settled and the program accepted, the very first indigenous ladies program commenced with a total of seven (7) ladies in training.

The program was formulated for shooting both domestic Skeet and Trap and broken into two (2) identified segments of three (3) sessions per discipline with one week's rest between the two segments. Training started with the Skeet first, running from 11th - 25th October 2003 each Saturday morning commencing at 9:00am. The ladies went through a safety and awareness session each day, but the first consisted of understanding the cartridges and firearms being used and also the method used for shooting Skeet. At all times SAFETY was noted as being the paramount object of clay target shooting. Once the ladies finished with the classroom session, they then went to the Skeet layout and commenced the practical part of training. As with all new shooters, we started them on Station # 7 low house target. Over the three (3) week period, the ladies undertook two new stations and a few targets on one previous (just to get their memory triggered for hitting targets). They shot two rounds each segment with the last week's program culminating in a full round of Skeet under competition conditions. Some very credible scores were registered with the highest being 18 and lowest being 14. After this they then

had their weeks break whereby they undertook cycling around the "bridges" of Perth.

Back they came on the 8th November for their second session of the program - undertaking shooting DTL. It was managed under the same system as the Skeet, but we started them on # 3 track and straight away targets. It was five (5) targets per person on lane # 3, then we moved them on to # 4 and # 5. With them undertaking Skeet first, it got their eye in for hitting targets sooner and therefore we were able to move them through the lanes in the initial round of 25 and then concentrate on their next round being a full round, but still on straight away targets. In the next session they were given five (5) targets each of straight away from one lane then the machine was put to oscillating. Ladies that had excelled at Skeet, confused themselves with the DTL and the others registered good hits and scores. It certainly showed that out of the seven (7) ladies participating, that with their talents during the program, half were "skeeties" and the other half "trappies". We finished the program on the 22nd November and all of the ladies were invited to undertake a round of ISSF Trap at their own expense. Again good results were achieved with those that had shown they were more attuned to Skeet, registered the better scores.

Children of the participants were also given the opportunity to try clay target shooting, using both 410g and 12g shotguns, where appropriate and the Winchester 1200's or the new Low Recoil ammunition was used for all of the program

Thanks must go to our Club members who volunteered their time for this auspicious event, making it a very professional program. Present were Norm Atkins, Ian Young and Mr Bill Foy. We are proud, that through DSR's Indigenous Development Officer - Mr Errol McGrath, the very first clay target training program in Australia for indigenous ladies was conducted at the West Australian Gun Club (Inc). Congratulations to Sharmaine Nelson, Lola McDowell, Sharon Page, Sharmaine Sands, Juanita Simcock, Yvette Alger and Pam Thorley for trying a very different and challenging sport. All were presented with Certificates of Safety and Achievement and we look forward to a couple becoming members under the new "Social" category.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

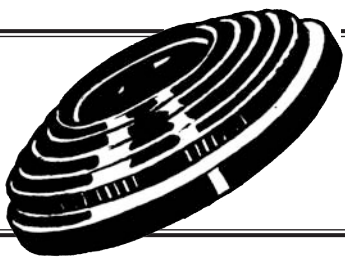

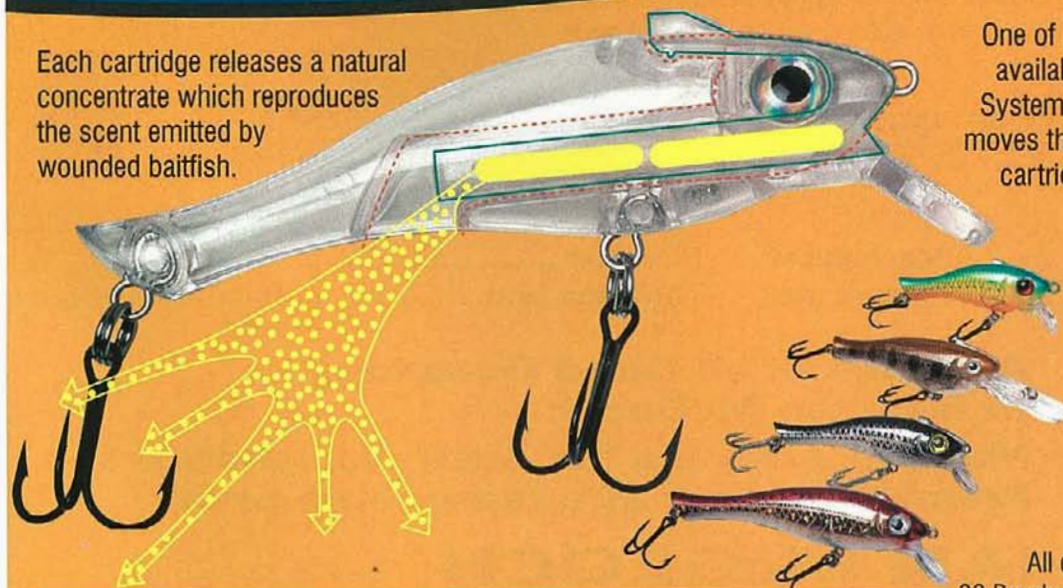
