## 2004 NATIONAL tRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Australian Clay Target Association National Trap Championships for 2004 were conducted again at the ACTA National Shooting ground in Wagga Wagga NSW with the championships running from Wednesday March 31 to Sunday April 4. With a record 56 days without rain the grounds were looking a little worse for wear however fine warm days greeted the shooters so some good scores were expected.

Prior to the Opening Ceremony, teams from all states and territory competed for the Australian Clay Target Association Cup presented to the winning state team in Open, Women's, Juniors and Veterans divisions.


New South Wales successfully won the Open team event, being represented by James Vardangea, Arty Del-Ben, Glenn Castellaro, Arthur Turner and Peter Fitzalan with a score of $125 / 373$. One point behind in second place was the team from Western Australia with a score of $125 / 372$. Third place went to the team from Queensland on a score of $125 / 369$. Forth place went to Victoria $125 / 367$, fifth place went to South Australia 125/363, sixth place went to Tasmania 124/368 and seventh place went to Northern Territory 124/363.


The Ladies from Queensland were successful in winning the Women's Team event. The team lead by Leanne Jarvis with Holly Wilson and Carol Betteridge scored 72/211 with the team from New South Wales coming in second with a score of $71 / 211$. Third place was the team from South Australia with a score of 69/202


In the Junior division two states were tied after the event and a countback could not split the two teams thus for the first time a shoot-off was required to determine a winner. After the shoot-off the team from Western Australia comprising of Sam West, Darren McMichan and Nigel Miller were declared the winners on a score of $75 / 220$. Second place went to the team from Tasmania with a score of 75/220 and third place went to the team from New South Wales with a score of $73 / 216$.


Six Veterans teams competed for their shoulder to shoulder badges with the New South Wales team of Jeff Nash, Ray Kearns and Kevin Heywood shooting 74/219 to take the event from Victoria who shot $72 / 211$. Western Australia was placed third with a score of $72 / 208$.

## Opening Ceremony

Our resident piper, Mr. Bob Scott, led all the state teams in the traditional march past the crowd.

National President, Mr. Bill Jones introduced dignitaries present: Mr. Kevin Wales, Mayor of Wagga Wagga; Mr. Phillip Perram, General Manager Wagga Wagga City Council and Mr. Dean Everett NZ Executive Representative.

Members of the Official party judged the best presented teams and awarded the SACTA Perpetual Trophy to a very well presented Northern Territory Team.

Mr. Kevin Wales, Mayor of Wagga Wagga then welcomed all present to the city of Wagga Wagga and declared the event officially under way. Kevin then attempted to get the event under way proper by

firing the first shot. After several attempts a small chip was seen to come of a target which was received with a roar of delight from the crowd.

## 64th National Champion of Champions

The first event for the 2004 Nationals attracted four hundred and twenty eight competitors and at the end of qualifying five shooters had shot the perfect score. After the shoot-off Glenn Castellaro from the Griffith club was declared the winner on a score of $175 / 175$. Steven Holt from the Colac club placed second with a score of $174 / 175$ and in third place was Nathan McDonnell from the Illawarra club with a score of 149/150.

Sox Pilipasidis representing Winchester presented Glenn with a Browning shotgun.

## The Use of a Video Camera in Novice Coaching

Have you turned up at a coaching session and someone has produced a video camera to assist in coaching? The owner of the camera "watches" some of the novice shooters through the camera and then takes it all back into the clubhouse to play to the crowd. If the camera can be set-up \& plugged into the TV a review could happen like this:
The "stars" of the show can see that their shirts needed tucking in or that their shoelace needed tying but they have trouble getting, good information from the video. Was the camera "bouncing about" too much, focussing on the target rather than the shooter or was it that the operator was concentrating on one or two specific shooters only? Within five minutes of so the "stars" have lost interest for any number of reasons and are looking for another squad to go out \& have another shot!
The loss of interest and the retreat could have been caused by:

* Boredom
* Embarrassment; or
* Peer pressure as the pupils were "copping heaps" from the audience watching the replay.
For whatever reasons the opportunity for the coach and the pupil is lost, so what can we do about this??
When a coach is planning to hold a coaching day for either a group or in a one on one, and it is intended to utilise a video camera to assist, then the following guidelines may be of assistance.


## Preparation

* If possible the coach should not operate the camera, as his/her time will be better spent supporting and guiding the pupils.
* The coach should ensure the camera operator is fully conversant with the operations of the camera, and that does not mean learning while videoing the first pupil.
* A good camera operator will enhance the end result providing they know what to look for. To this end the coach should ensure the camera operator is aware of the coaches requirements. This may require the coach to "script" the operator (eg: I want the pupil to see firstly how they stand on each lane then secondly whether they lift their heads while shooting!)
* The use of a tripod or "brace" is encouraged to reduce unwanted camera jitters.
* Make sure the camera arrives with fully charged batteries and the relevant leads for replay and review operations.
* Have a plan, if time permits start the video process with footage of the coach or a respected shooter, actually shooting on the day "as per the coaches manual" if you like include some specific faults. The coach can use this footage in an initial review process to highlight the benefits of the use of the video and introduce the pupils to the review \& comment process.


## Location

* The coach should ensure the camera and its operator is located in a position of safety where they will be able to capture the required shots. (eg: for right hand shooters as above, the camera should be safely outside lane 5 about a metre in front of the shooters (and similarly outside lane 1 for lefthanders.)


## Capturing the shooting

Following on from the coaches requirements above:

* I would expect to see a full-length shot of the pupil to start, zooming onto the feet on the shooting pad, and then rising into an upper body shot to capture any movement of the head on the gun as it is fired.
* When shooting the video fill the viewfinder as much as possible with each pupil- there is no point looking for head movement on the gun or a pitch related "muzzle flip" problem when the "star" is only a blip in the middle of the screen.
* To identify \& solve a particular problem ensure the operator captures the event in sufficient detail for the coach to be able to use the footage to advantage without having to "visualise" the event on the TV during review.
* When working with a squad of shooters, consider only capturing each shooter as they shoot from a particular lane. Ensure every pupil has an equal opportunity to be "captured" on film. This will not only reduce excessive camera movement but it will also reduce repetition and the period of time taken to review the squad's footage.
* To be successful with a group it may require the use of more than one camera or shooting smaller "five target events" to keep the interest up and the squads moving. This is especially important if you are coaching novice junior shooters.
* If you are coaching "one on one" it may be the pupil will request to keep the recordings from session to session to rate their improvement in style or the mastering of a problem, so ensure you have sufficient video tapes. The coach may require the pupil store and return their own tape each time they come to the next coaching session.


## Review

It is very important to control the review process, as individuals may become quite embarrassed having an audience watch them miss or do silly things:

* Attempt to limit the reviewing audience to the squad of shooters or the individual (if one on one) plus the coach and any assistants.
* Attempt to rotate the pupils from the shooting lanes to the TV as soon as possible after the videoed event while the round is fresh in their minds.
* Allow the pupil to firstly comment on their own technique then have others in the squad comment on each others style before the coach offers assistance.
* The coach should utilise this situation as "experience based learning" for the whole squad as well as reviewing \& discussing specific techniques, difficulties, or gun fit problems with the individual.
* Remember to respect the feelings of the pupils, be supportive, guide and reassure as a rough handed report on their style/capability may well loose them from the sport.
* If you are able to offer repeat sessions on the day then concentrate on the specific concern until it is mastered, do not jump around each time picking up other variations as this will confuse the pupil and devalue the result.
With experience it will be seen that short punchy review sessions will benefit each pupil the most. Their ability to concentrate will not be tested and the message will sink in.


## Conclusions

A coach should always reflect on the positive outcome of a video session, as the camera does not lie, you will see "we are not all perfect". Reaffirm that fact and the benefits of video footage being such a strong reinforcement - "a picture is worth a thousand words."

# Psychological Skills for Shooting 

by Michael Kruger-Davis

## SAMENESS

There is an interesting psychological construct called sameness. As babies develop they see objects and place them into categories or schemas. As their language develops they learn the names of these things and they start to differentiate between things that are the same but may look different; for example; a child sees a chair and puts the concept into the schema "of something you sit on with four legs." It doesn't matter from what angle we look at a chair it is still a chair. If we turn it upside down, back the front, look at it from above we can still recognise that it is a chair. From then on everything with four legs that you sit on goes into that schema until the child has to recategorise things because the new objects do not fit into an existing schema. A horse for instance, has four legs and you sit on it but it cannot be called a chair, so as the child grows older and has more and more experiences, the child constantly orders and reorders the schemas to fit what is logical for the child. The schema for chair may now include stool, lounges, benches and so on. The only time that children (and some adults for that matter) have difficulty with the concept of sameness is when they are learning to read: the letter "b" when reversed becomes a "d", and when turned upside down becomes a " p " and when reversed again becomes a "q".
So eventually most human beings can recognise those things that are the same and those things that are different. This is the case for clay targets. Clay targets are easily recognisable and the sameness principal applies for standard targets, high dome targets, minis, midis, rabbits, etc. Most shooters are able to recognise a target when released and most shooters can tell if the target is legal or it is a "no target".

I found the recent trap nationals fascinating. Apart from just enjoying the shooting, I was able to meet with a lot of readers and talk about shooting and mental skills necessary for shooting. What intrigued me was the overall positive attitude towards the 2004 national championships. I never heard a single person complain about the targets. The ACTA picked a winner in using CORSIVIA American Trap Hi-dome targets. Without exception, everyone I spoke to thought the targets were excellent; they were easy to pick up, they flew straight and they seemed to sit up in the air just waiting to be hit. What was even more intriguing was the fact that no-one I spoke to, complained about the traps either. Whilst there have been grumblings about the traps in the past,

the way the Gemini traps presented the Corsivia hi-dome targets was faultless. Criticisms about the traps that have been made in the past, about the flight of the targets off the Gemini's or the inability to shoot high scores, lost all credibility when the last six shooters in the double barrel all shot over 400 and the winner, well done Arthur, went on to shoot 611. That consistency of shooting says something positive about both the traps and the targets. Matching Corsivia hi-dome targets to Gemini traps appears to have worked well at Wagga and I've also heard locally that other clubs are going to order the Corsivia hi-dome targets because of the positive experience at the Nationals. Consistency and good target presentation is what brings shooters back to your club.
The psychologist in me is always looking to see what the research is saying about this or that and during the Nationals I discussed with some shooters an experiment that I would like to conduct. The hypothesis would be that because of "sameness" shooters could not tell what type of trap was throwing the targets. The method of the research would involve getting one of each trap commercially available in Australia and, if for example there were 10 different traps, randomly allocate one to each on the 10 trap houses. Shooters would then be given a sheet with the names of the traps and they would have say what type of trap was in which trap house. It would be interesting to see if shooters could, after shooting five targets from each trap, tell what make of trap they were shooting over. I would argue that most, if not all shooters would not be able to correctly identify the type of trap they were shooting over. If we extended the research to include targets, and asked shooters to identify what make of targets they were shooting, there might be a slight improvement in there ability to pick one or two types but in general the principal of sameness would help shooters recognise the object as a target and they would shoot it before they could discriminate what make of target it was. This is assuming that anyone could discriminate between different makes of targets in flight anyway. What would be possible is that the Corsivia Hi-dome targets may stand out differently from other standard targets because of their ability to fly straight and the fact that there is more target to be seen.
So if you take the targets, the way they were presented, the weather, location, ground presentation, the new program, trade displays and the social events; couple these with some great shooting, a feeling of belonging, acceptance, freedom and fun then the 2004 Nationals, for me anyway, were a resounding success. What was also indicative of success was the great crowd that turned up to shoot. I was delighted to see a new shooter, whom I had met two weeks before at Albury turn up. He had won a C grade championship at Albury and I said to him that he should come to the Nationals because if he shot like that he could easily win his grade. He turned up and he was placed somewhere in C grade. I've said in the past that B and C grade shooters should attend more of these big shoots because your chances of winning something is far greater than AA grade and it will improve your shooting back at club shoots. Also the new program of two events per day probably helped this as shooters could spend more money on shooting and less on accommodation, food, etc. Whilst there were some bugs this year because of the crowds I hope the ACTA looks at how they resolve these small problems but still retain the concept.

## Gun Fitting

It is not my practice to become embroiled in matters published under Letters to the Editor (Your Say), but I fancy some logic needs to be applied to the complex matter of Gun Fitting. The original article by Rick Hacker (see Feb.2004), was interesting, informative and gave a light insight into the practice.
The reply to said article, by Pat Loeffler (see April 2004), gave a clear indication of his thoughts on the matter, but did precious little to illustrate how a process which has been carried out for some 200 years with proven success can be such a vital constituent in the art of "Shooting Flying".
I respect Mr Loeffler's view that he would not want his stock bent under any circumstances, but too my mind putting a band-saw through the comb of a fine piece of walnut, inletting a myriad of plates, tubes, rods, screws and allied paraphernalia would disfigure and scar a gun far more than professional altering by "setting". Albeit that the wood be suitable.
As far as stocks moving after setting, I agree they can and do, but any stock at any time can move if the mood takes it. Has anyone had a door warp and jam for no apparent reason?
Wood is alive and if it is not alive it rots. It takes in moisture in humid climes and gives up moisture in arid climes. If it choses to move it will, as no wood is immune to the forces of nature.

Readers maybe amazed that any one of their stocks could have taken on different measurements over the years without them even knowing, especially if the stock has been removed for any period of time.
Have you ever known a Shooter experience a sudden unexplained slump in form? This slump is usually redressed by altering recoil pads, moving adjustable combs or sticking bits of leather or the like here and there.
The truth is the stock has most probably moved
Just attend any Trap competition, and as the day goes on up pop the stock fiddlers, beavering away for all they are worth. Remember world class Shots rarely alter their stocks, and if any change is detected this is corrected in a calculated methodical and professional manner.
Alteration by setting does not change how a gun feels it alters where it shoots. Moving an adjustable comb alters where it shoots and alters how it feels, a subtle but important difference which should not be ignored.
An example of how fickle stock dimensions are can be illustrated in pairs of game guns. These are always made to match in every respect, but over time a Gentleman would adopt a greater liking for either one of the pair.
He does not know why he just tends to shoot better with it. If a single gun day were on the cards the favourite gun would be used. Eventually the pair would be taken to the gunmaker for service, and measurements checked as a matter of course, only to reveal that one of the stocks had moved. The second gun would be set to match the favoured gun and the status quo returned.
I hardly think the fitting of an adjustable comb to one of a pair of guns would be a sane proposition, the setting by experienced craftsmen is always and always will be the favoured route.
Of late I have noticed the trend for modern gun makers to use highly figured stock blanks often with unsound grain structure in the head/hand area on guns with stock "through bolts". Obviously the logic being the bolt will hold everything together! Stocks with unsound cross grain in the head or hand should not be set for fear of breakage. However, it is not unknown for stocks of this nature to crack of their own volition, especially if the stock bolt is overly tight, loose, or the gun having experienced overly rough usage.
As always nothing in life is guaranteed!
I hope this letter gives Readers food for thought and in some small way assists them to attain success in this fine sport.

The club has been located at the current site under lease for the past eight and a half years, but through a $\$ 25,000$ state government grant they were recently able to purchase the property from Dr Robert Kirkby.
Club president Ian Piddington said it was a great day for the club knowing they had the security of owning the land.
"The biggest thing for us is to know that now the land can't be taken away from us," he said.
"And all the hard work and money invested in the land hasn't been for nothing."

"The whole future of shooting ranges depends upon the clubs owning the land," he said.
"Of the 396 ranges in NSW only 12 own the land."
Mr Tingle said the ownership of land was critical to the perpetuity of the clubs with only very limited land available for future range development.

"They need the land for the guaranteed tenure. Most leases are only five to 10 years and at the end and after all the hard work the clubs have done they can just take back the land if they want."

NSW Members and Dealers
As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:
(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".
The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.
(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of $\$ 5,500$.
