The 11th National Sporting Clays were again held at


The 11th National Sporting Clays were again held at the ACTA National Ground in Wagga Wagga on the 15th and 16th May. Participation at this years Nationals was down on the previous year however visitors were again attracted from many states within Australia with members from the SSAA and Field & Game also represented.

Saturday saw 75 competitors contest the ACTA Sporting Clays Championship on bright sunny autumn day. The overall winner of this event was Socs Pilipasidis with a score of 97/100. The grade placings for this event were as follows: AA Grade - 1st Peter Tobin 95/100, 2nd Colin MacPherson 94/100, 3rd Rodney Wright 91/100; A Grade - 1st Ian Stewart 88/100, 2nd Peter Rea 86/100, 3rd Arthur Turner 91/110; B Grade - 1st Milton Cartwright 88/100, 2nd Chris Milligan 86/100, 3rd Phillip Craig 85/100; C Grade - 1st Brett Symes 80/100, 2nd Casey Day 89/120, 3rd Christopher Reeckman 88/120. Christopher Reeckman won the Junior section with a score of 75/100, Women's section by Lesley Wojtowyez 74/100 and Tom Harris won the Veteran section on a score of 88/100.

Cairo World Cup April II - 18 2004-05-08

A last minute hitch with firearms permits for Bahrain saw Nathan re routed to Cairo via Frankfurt, while Michael and Greg travelled the original route via Singapore and Bahrain. Nathan departed six hours earlier and arrived an hour later so definitely had the worst of the two trips.

The hotel we were booked into was the Meridian Pyramids which is located 500 metres from the shooting range. Both are virtually within half a kilometre of the pyramids themselves and this makes for a great backdrop to the whole area.

The Cairo range is located on a military base and as you would imagine security was very high. Military buses are used to transport competitors to and from the range as walking the 500m could be detrimental to ones well being. The traffic and in particular the drivers are shocking. There appear to be no road rules and if there are, no one knows them.

The range consists of four trap and skeet fields superimposed with sand dunes as the back ground. The sand is a browny yellow colour which makes the fluoro targets difficult to see, particularly in overcast conditions. As we had arrived only the day before, Michael and Nathan were still feeling the effects of the long flight during official training, but with a good nights rest expectations for the competition were high.

A terrific 25 in his final round put Michael into the final where a solid 24 elevated him into a shoot off for silver which he duely won. A great return to form for one of the best trap shooters in the world and one which will see him qualify for the World Cup Final later in the year. Nathan shot well the first day then shot a couple of 22's which dropped him down in the rankings.

The presentation with the Pyramids in the background was a great sight but there was little time to dwell on it as we were departing Cairo that night for Athens the venue for the Olympic test event. This world cup is the event many shooters from around the world would attend to gain valuable training for the Olympics. The rest of the Australian team were to arrive into Athens a few days later.

The Athens World Cup was the test event for the Olympics to be held in August. Greg, Michael and Nathan had travelled from Cairo where they had attended a world cup and Adam arrived from Australia ahead of the main team to get some extra shooting in before the world cup. Unfortunately the Olympic range was closed for last minute preparations so we trained at another range some forty five minutes from our hotel until we were permitted to use the main range.

Our hotel was the Holiday Inn in Sparta which is located ten minutes from the airport, twenty five from the Olympic range and twenty five from the city of Athens. The hotel was brand new and whilst it had a few teething problems it was very comfortable and well appointed. The only problem with the hotel was the isolation. It was located on the side of the freeway linking the airport with city and in the middle of nowhere. No shops, restaurants, banks etc of any kind within fifteen minutes taxi ride and at the prices they charged too expensive to travel to anyway. The only options were to eat at the hotel which cost an arm and leg, or at the café located in the service station next door. Club sandwiches were certainly popular.

The weather was not as warm as expected ranging between 13 and 16 deg. coupled with overcast conditions. The temperature was not the main factor, it was the wind. The Olympic range is built on the top of a hill and the clay target range is totally exposed to the wind, which was blowing and gusting for most of the event.

The range consists of four trap and skeet fields superimposed and has high dividing fences between each layout. There is a magnificent grandstand that runs the length of the whole range and out the front at the 100m mark there is a 10m high dirt wall. The background and mound were bare and the colour made the fluoro targets difficult to see, however, come August we are assured it will be grassed and the mound covered in green shade cloth. This will certainly aid visibility and keep the dust down as well.

The main team arrived on the 18th and while the trap shooters prepared and competed in their event, the double trap and skeet shooters trained at the other range.

The cold, windy, dusty conditions took it's toll in the first event with scores well below average and 114's shooting off for the final. Adam's third round hiccup cost him dearly but his four 24's in the other rounds were enough to get him to the shoot off for the final where he missed his second target to finish in seventh place. Nathan posted a 111 to end up in 22nd spot and Michael showed why he is regarded as one of the best around by winning his second world cup silver medal in the space of ten days. Alipov the Russian shot brilliantly in some of the most difficult conditions and deserved his win, but Michael's return to form was the talk of the tournament.

Again blustery conditions played a major part in the event with scores below average. Suzy started well with a 22 and finished solidly, but the ordinary second round cost her any chance of making the final. Her final placing of 15th shows she will be competitive if she can find some consistency.

Di Spigno made light of the conditions to shoot a great 144 in qualifying to take a five shot lead into the final and emerge with the gold medal by the same margin. Tom and Steve struggled with the conditions and will come away knowing there is time to attain the improvement required for the games.

Although the wind was up, Suzy shot well for her 99 which saw her qualify in fourth place for the final. Her final was a round to forget , but the experience of shooting a final on the Olympic range will be of great benefit come August. Susie Trindall failed to handle the conditions and struggled with her timing but she is too talented a competitor not to bounce back for the main event in four months time.

The weather saved it's worst for ladies skeet day. It was a shocker ! The lowest scores seen at a world cup for ages were posted in this event. The high score into the final was 67 and the low 64 unprecedented at this level. The best round in the final was a 21 and the winner shot a 19 and still won, which is indicative of just how difficult it was. In this event no 25's were shot and only one 24, so Lauryn's 60 which included a last round 23 when put into perspective was better than it indicates. She is one of the toughest competitors in women's skeet and will be there at the end come August.

Finally the weather cleared some what for the men's skeet and the scores reflected this with a 124 leading into the final and 122's shooting off for the last place. George shot well for his 120 and tenth place in a red hot field that included all the best skeet shooters in the world. He has continued his good form that saw him top the Olympic qualifying trials and reach the final of the Sydney world cup. Paul started brilliantly with a 25 but faded as the tournament progressed. If he can recapture the form he showed at the selection trials, he will be very competitive at the Games.

The conditions for much of this world cup were extremely difficult and most had difficulty handling it. There is room for everyone to improve and those that put in the hard work and leave no stone unturned to give themselves the best possible chance for success at the Olympics will be in with a show.

The Athens world cup was a long trip for everyone, particularly those who competed at the end of the program. This is exactly what will happen at the Olympics some valuable lessons were learnt. When we return in August, this should be a better prepared Aussie team, ready to compete for Australia to the best of it's ability.

The Southern Zone Junior Coaching Clinic, held on the 17-18th April, was a great success. 14 juniors, with parents, rolled up at the Yass Clay Target Club at 10am on the Saturday morning, to meet with zone coach Fred Schmetzer and President Fred Rapley for the start of what was to be a very informative and enjoyable weekend. Fred Schmetzer started by assessing the shooters and splitting them into 2 groups. From there they progressed through various aspects of DTL shooting. He covered safety, foot position, gun mount, mental preparation and much, much more before they got out on the lanes and put there new found knowledge into practice. 


ROBERT WILLIAM LEWES GOLDEN (BOB)

With the old "Black Hawk" hand crank trap, Bob would have the gun broken across his knee and two shells in his hand He would kick the release mechanism and at the same time throw the gun off his knee, catching it, loading it and then shooting the target. He would do this four or five times in a row to prove that it was no fluke.

Bob was a regular visitor to the Roma Gun Club and his travelling time home was usually around dusk. His old Mercedes suffered paint burn around the driver's window and he finally worked out that it was caused from muzzle flash from his pistol as he used to clear his road of wallabies on the way home.

No record has been kept of Bob's shooting achievements but they were many and in the tough era of Doug Smith, Newton Thomas, Pud Burgess and others. He never spoke of his achievements, but would rather have a good rum and a yarn about what was happening with the weather and recall the good and bad times of yester year.

These field archers shoot an event called 3DAAA, which means they compete using 3D, life size, high density foam animal targets at ranges from 10yards out to 50yards.


Their archery equipment ranges from bare bows and no sights up to compound bows with magnified sights counter weights and





Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

Here and now.

In previous articles about concentration and quieting the mind I have stated that what is important is to stay in the present; the here and now. But for most human beings this is difficult to do for more than one minute. Most of us choose to resist the ability to stay focused on the present and at that moment when we let our mind wander we usually miss the target. Why, because the target is in the here and now and when we think of the past, about the target we may have missed in the last event or last time we shot at this club, we are shooting in the past. When we focus on the winning the event or getting the high gun trophy then we are shooting in the future and again are likely to miss the target. Thinking about both the past and the future can deny us the ability to stay focused and enjoy the perfection of the moment.


According to Caroline Robertson, writing in Well Being Magazine (2003) in her article Moment Meditation, states that ascertaining whether we drift to the past or the present indicates our psychological tendency. She describes the following exercise to see

High School Girls Smash Targets

April 2004 and Echuca Secondry College girls PE class, accompanied by their teacher Ms Petra Ogden, made two visits a week apart to Echuca Clay Target Club for some Coaching in the sport of clay target shooting.

The club coaches that supplied their time on the visits were pleasantly suprised at the girls ability to handle the heavy shotguns, and to actually score quite a few targets.

On both visits the girls were given a task of attempting to shoot ten targets single barrel, and several achieved seven out of ten, Anna Nilbett and Sarah Marchment among the girls that did. With the heavy shotguns and the very light cartridges used, the students were very suprised how low the recoil was, and that

Echuca Clay Target Club run quiet a number of coaching clinics throughout the year mainly to promote the sport to the younger generation for future members, and also to ensure the young students

learn the correct and safe handling of firearms.

if you lag in the past or flee to the future. You will need to carry around a small notebook and whenever you are aware of your thoughts categorise whether you are thinking about the past, moment or the future. Write down P for past, M for moment and F for future and at the end of four hours tally the results. Robertson claims that while there can be a productive side to our time travelling inclinations it can also have perpetuate negative patterns of thinking and feelings. An abundance of F's you may have excessive future consciousness and you may be more prone to anxiety, frustration, anger, worry, restlessness, irritability, impatience, fear and dissatisfaction. Those with a majority of P's are more attached to the past concerns and experiences and this can be a disposition to depression, guilt, judgement, bitterness, hopelessness, self-pity, and a judgemental outlook. (It must be remembered that these observations of Robertson's are generalisations and it doesn't mean that you will necessary feel these ways if you think in the past or the future.)

Robertson continues on by saying that these negative feelings will dissipate when you refocus your mind back to the present. She believes that predominately happy people have the ability to spend a majority of their lives in the present, thinking about the moment in which they are living right now. Happy people she believes make friends with the present and do not allow the pressures of time to impinge on pleasant pleasures. When we live in the present we experience pleasure with our full presence. When we mentally remove ourselves from the present we are unable to appreciate the fullness of now and we become dissatisfied with life. For the shooter, when we mentally remove ourselves from the present we are unable to focus on those important things; targets.

Robertson's article is interesting in that it is trying to teach the reader that to be fulfilled and to reach your potential one should remain anchored in the present. Again this is vital for the sportsman; when we ponder the past or fret over the future we lose our present power and we create confusion, which affects our ability to make decisions at this moment. The secret to empowerment is to focus on what we can influence rather than worrying about what we can't. We can influence the present but there is nothing we can do about the past and if we think we can influence the future we will only develop fear of what might happen.

So what can you do to stay focused in the present. Firstly, breathe. For human beings this is one thing we can only do now. So focus on your breathing. Feel each breath and what effect it is having on your body and mind. I take several deep breaths between shots; this allows me to stay focused on what I am doing and where I am at this moment. A common sport psychology technique is called centreing. This was an approach developed by American Sport Psychologist Nideffer. Basically it is taking several deep breaths and as you breathe feel where the breath starts from in your body. You should practice this technique whenever you can; for example, when lining up at the checkout, post office or bank, etc. The second thing you can do as you are about to shoot is focus on a part of you body as it feels at this moment. For example, feel the pressure on the soles of your feet, or the feel on the gun in your hand. You can also focus on the pressure of the pad against your shoulder or the feel of the gun as it recoils.

Think about your personal tendency; it is for the past or the future. Look at what you are doing when you are shooting and develop ways to keep yourself focused on the here and now. Being focused on the here and now will quieten the mind and allow you to concentrate more fully and on more targets.







As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless: (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
