





World DTL Championships 2006

Pre Nominations continue to be received in the National Office. Individual Nominations received up to Mid Dec 2004 totalled 136. With 300 places reserved for Team competitors and the field limited to 675 I suggest you consider your situation with regards to nominating as a matter of some urgency.

National Grounds

Advice has been received from Wagga Wagga City Council following representation from our Executive Officer that they have approved a \$3000 grant towards Advertising for the World DTL Championships 2006. Approval has also been given for a \$6275 contribution on a dollar for dollar basis to seal the remainder of the road into the National Grounds.

Skeet National Championship

Recently held at the National Ground. The total numbers of attendants were disappointing. Thanks to the 17 New Zealand shooter that did attend.

Once again very good scores with Mark Newman from Cecil Park taking the Overall High Gun with 448/450. Special mention to Thomas Dent from the NSW Gun Club shooting 435/450 to take both the Sub Junior and Junior High Gun. Well done Thomas.

INTERSERVICE COMPETITION 2004

This event is contested annually in Victoria, between the three services, at HMAS Cerberus and the 2004 contest was held in October. The team captains' draw for shooting lanes then each team member in turn starts from that lane.

Each member shoots at a five target eye opener then in three visits of ten, all shoot 15 metre Double Barrel. The individual score is over the thirty five targets however the Team score doesn't involve the eye opener.

All this happens after a full morning's practice / team selection and a BBQ lunch.

This is shot in six squads of three, one of each service, in a batting order selected by each teams captain and this process takes some time to shoot the thirty five targets. Navy started on lane one, Army on three and RAAF on five.

After the first round of the team's section, RAAF and Navy had scored 54 each and the Army 47. Round two Navy hit 54 again, RAAF 53 and Army 51.

So going into the last round it was Navy by one point over RAAF and ten on Army. The final round saw Navy with 55, RAAF 52, and Army 51.

Final scores Navy 163, RAAF 159, and Army 149.

Winning team members were Chris Long, Hecta Crawford, Chris Carrol, Phillip Andrew, Robert Kinsey & Allan Smith.

The invitation event a 15 tgt Handicap, was won by B. Balow 26/26 second A. Crawford 25/26 third D. Bye 20/21.

Insurance Matters

It would appear that several clubs and registered shooters are having difficulty understanding the current insurance cover held by the Association.

After discussions with Mr. Rob Low from SSAA Insurance Brokers the following explanations hopefully will rectify the problem:

- * Clubs must encourage all their members to join the ACTA as registered shooters.
- * If the club has members that are not registered shooters with the ACTA then it is the responsibility of the club to provide insurance for those members. ACTA held insurance policies do not cover club members that are not registered shooters of the ACTA.
- * ACTA registered shooters are covered by the insurance policies when shooting at any affiliated ACTA club.
- * Club volunteers are covered by the ACTA held insurance policies. These are unpaid people who do the

many jobs required to run a club and are not required to sign the visitors book.

* Visitors are non-members who attend the club to shoot targets only on a recreational basis. Non-shooters who attend and are connected with the shooting activity are also visitors. By signing the visitor's book they are considered to be 'authorised visitors' and are covered by the insurance policies.

* In regards to sporting clays only the ACTA allows members from SSAA and F&G to compete in these events. These members are not required to sign the visitor's book as their parent association holds appropriate insurance to cover these shooters. In all other events competitors must be registered through an affiliated ACTA club before taking part in competition (Rule 4.14(f)).

* The public in general, spectator's etc are covered by the 'Public Liability Insurance' policy held by the ACTA.

Please contact the ACTA office if you have any questions in regards to insurance.

To be staged on the West Australian Gun Club, Whiteman Park International Shooting Complex, Beechboro Road, Western Australia by the Australian Clay Target Association.

Jury Rule 4.26(a) & (b)

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2005 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2005 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2005 registered shooter record book before nominating.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Mens, Womens, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, excepting the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Mens, Womens, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section only. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors who, on April 5, 2005 will be over the age of 65 years.

Juniors - are those competitors who, on April 5, 2005 will be under the age of 18 years.

Sub Juniors - are those who, on April 5, 2005 will be under the age of 15 years.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the

Management Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified - and indication can be obtained for the daily scoreboard. This applies to trap grades, Mens, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Major Sponsor

The Association gratefully acknowledge the sponsorship received from sponsors.

Practice

Practice, subject to trap availability, will be available throughout the championships. Tickets may be purchased at the events office.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

If, for any reason, the event cannot be completed on the day it commences, the management reserves the right to stop shooting at any time, if considered necessary. In such a case, the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

Nominations - All Events

All championship nominations (excluding Deauville Doubles) include a contribution to the discipline fund.

Note: Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and partners only, they being wives or husbands, whose nomination must be lodged at the same time as family member paying full nomination fees.

Authority

This program shall control the 2005 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

The Association's Executive Committee, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 2005 National Trap Championships program, to change or modify the program in any way.

Gambling is not permitted on events staged by the Australian Clay Target Association.

Services and Facilities

Catering: Arrangements have been made for meal services to be available with an extensive but practical menu.

Trade Displays: Commercial organisations have supported the tournament by establishing displays of products connected with the shooting sports. These displays will be located in an area specifically designated for trade exhibits. Competitors and visitors to the ground are encouraged to support these trade displays, as, in this way, exhibitors can be encouraged to maintain their support for clay target shooting.

Parking: Ample parking is available for the cars of competitors and visitors. The parking area will be clearly marked. Please do not park in any area as being reserved, as freedom of movement is required at all times - Please co-operate. Souvenirs: In addition to a variety of souvenirs which will be offered by commercial supporters of clay target shooting, the Australian Clay Target Association will merchandise a souvenir 2005 National Championships badge.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

2. Squads of 6 to shoot 75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps.
3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 50 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred in the event concerned.
9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations and are not refundable.
14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or

Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.

18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
22. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors and second family members only, they being wives or husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
23. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.**

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Stress and resilience

I have often mentioned in the articles the fact that we still deal with stress the way our primitive ancestors did; we either fight or take flight. So when we are anxious a primitive part of our brain takes over and we become fearful and the end result for sports people is that we choke: we tense up, our muscles cannot move the way we want them to, we stop focusing on the here and now and our breathing becomes fast and irregular. It's at this point that we usually miss and quite possibly miss again.

As a psychologist, this understanding of stress is bread and butter stuff. This is what we try to teach our clients and what we want people to understand because, if they can understand it, then they can control some of their reactions to these stressors. Earlier in the year a friend of mine who had a very senior position in a government department had several cerebral haemorrhages. He was in hospital for a long time and was in a very serious condition but after several operations, rest, treatment and rehabilitation therapy he is again up and about. I invited him to come and have morning tea with my staff this week and he asked if he could say a few words. In the room was about 70 years of counselling experience and my friend talked to us as if we were hearing this for the first time. Here was a man that lived by deadlines, controversy and was always dealing with numerous problems simultaneously; for him stress was normal and I doubt if he even knew how to relax. He's now a changed man. He wanted to point out to us that it is really necessary to take time to "stop and smell the roses." He urged us all to do something that would give us a break from our day jobs and give ourselves some time out. What saddened me about this morning was that this man should have known this stuff earlier and maybe it wouldn't have happened.

So what can we do to deal with the stressors in our life? Well if you're reading this then you probably shoot and sport is a great way to unwind. Even the pressure of a competition can still be a good form of stress management. Relaxation, exercise, laughing and doing something different can all be effective stress relievers.

Stressors, or the things that cause stress come in all shapes and sizes and we shouldn't just think that it's only the big serious things that cause us to be stressed. Work, finance, relationships, health, etc, are all likely to be stressful at some time or another. But it's the accumulation of small things that can sneak up on us and get us when we least expect it.

To deal with stress effectively we need to have several factors working in our favour. We need to have adequate support from those around us. Whether it is family, workmates or shooting or golf mates, we need to be accepted and have a sense of belonging to a group so we don't feel alone and overwhelmed. Secondly, we need to have realistic and achievable goals. If we are striving for the unattainable then we can often feel we are a failure because we cannot achieve those things we are striving for. Coupled with realistic goals we need to be confident in our abilities and competent in our actions. Next, stress can be limiting if our perception is that the world is against us and we see every change as a threat instead of an opportunity. These factors help us become resilient. Resilience is the ability to bounce back after we have suffered a set back. For shooters it is how we regain our self-control after we have missed a target or lost a championship.

There has been lots of research that has looked at resilience in the workplace and the research is showing that resilient workers will be less stressed, have fewer problems with bullying and harassment, fewer days absent and be less prone to depression. Being connected with an organisation, being competent in your abilities, having the confidence to achieve and having a sense of community all lead to resilience which in turn leads to us being mentally healthy. Resilience is not new; those human's who survive have the ability to look at what has happened to them and deal with the problem and move on. Ric Charlesworth, former Olympian and Coach of the Australian Women's Hockey team has just written another book called "Shakespeare the Coach" where he examines the writing of William Shakespeare and relates it to modern day organisational and sport psychology. In Henry VI, part III Shakespeare wrote "....wise men ne'er sit and wail their loss,

But cheerly seek how to redress their harms"

So the next time things don't go your way, don't sit and cry but happily look at ways that you can fix the problem.

Remember stress doesn't always have to be negative. It can provide useful motivation for us to complete tasks or even perform our best. It is only a problem if we don't learn how to bounce back when things do not go our preferred way. And for my friend, who now has a damaged brain, it has made him look at his life and re-evaluate what is important for him. We cannot always do what we want; there are often constraints that get in our way; family, health, money, work, etc but we can make sure that we don't overdo it and if going to a shoot will make life more enjoyable then we shouldn't be too critical of our decision to go.


Cherry Tree Pool Field Championship 50th Anniversary Weekend at Katanning W.A.

Sport science - assisting our athletes perform at their best

DEHYDRATION

When planning for the 2004 Athens Olympic Games heat was identified as a major factor in many sports, shooting was no different. One heat related issue is dehydration, which can be complex and seriously impact athletic performance. Some simple strategies implemented at the Victorian Institute of Sport (VIS) with our Olympic team were designed to minimise any adverse effects.



Is dehydration an issue?

Dehydration can ultimately impact on shooting performance as it causes a reduction in the circulating blood volume, which in turn can affect:

- * concentration
- * eye sight
- * decision making
- * fine motor control
- * internal temperature control
- * increasing heart rate
- * recovery from one performance to another, on either the same day or the day after
- * recovery from air travel

How do we know this is an issue for our shooters?

We conducted simple field based urine tests at training and competition. Urine specific gravity was the test used and it essentially measured urine concentration. The test works on the physiological assumption that the more dehydrated you are the more fluid the body will try to retain, ultimately increasing urine concentration. These tests established that around 60% of our State and National level shooters were not hydrated.

How did we address the issue in a practical way?

The natural response is often simply to say drink more water but everyone differs according to how much and when they can drink. What you don't want is an athlete unnecessarily breaking concentration by feeling like they desperately need to go to the bathroom as a result of drinking a bottle of water immediately before his/her event. Similarly the athlete should avoid drinking



water just before going to bed as this may result in a disturbed sleeping pattern with the need to go the bathroom during the night.

The strategies

Our strategy targets two aspects for enhanced absorption and retention of fluid. One of the most effective ways for us to deal with the issue was to target the hydration routine athletes undertake the evening before competition and/or training. From our research conducted at the VIS, as well as from other published research, we know that urine output after consumption is high during the first hour after drinking but this continues for another two hours thereafter.


Initially we set a volume of fluid of about 750ml (1 large drink bottle) to be consumed and finished not less than three hours before bedtime. We were then able to tailor the volume consumed individually, as people hydrate differently and lose fluid in the heat at different rates.

We also know that water is in fact a poor method of hydration from an elite sports perspective. One of the main reasons sports drinks contain carbohydrate and sodium is to assist the body to retain fluid as it passes through the stomach. The VIS has, to great effect, been using a sports drink combined with a high sodium product called GASTROLYTE (commonly used to treat diarrhoea).

This fluid combination has been used to assist athletes with re-hydration after training, competition and any travel. The GASTROLYTE and sports drink combination is not meant to substitute for the volume of fluid consumed but merely to assist in retaining more of the fluid consumed. When competing in extreme conditions, like the 40°C at the 2003 Perth World Cup, shotgun shooters can easily sweat over a litre an hour, if they shoot over 3-4 hours and don't hydrate correctly the effects can be devastating. In extreme cases where we find high dehydration levels on the morning of competition we also use this combination to aid in hydration immediately before competition.

The results

The impact of this type of information and the strategies designed to reduce any performance issues has been significant. Dehydration is now no longer an issue for many athletes, although there are still some grappling with having to provide daily morning



urine samples! It has highlighted the importance of looking after the body more closely in combination with the specific skills of the sport.

Some practical strategies for maintaining hydration

1. Thirst is a lagging indicator of hydration, so if you feel thirsty you are probably already dehydrated.
2. Urine colour is often a poor indicator of hydration state. It is influenced by some foods, drinks and any vitamin supplements being taken.
3. Set up a night before training/competition hydration strategy. Establish the routine in training several weeks before competition so you are used to it before an important event.

Drink 750ml (standard size drink bottle) of water between 6 and 7pm, assuming you go to bed at 10pm. After a few weeks you may feel you can increase the volume consumed up to about 1.25L (about 5 cups). You will go to the bathroom frequently to start with but it should reduce with practice

4. In order to maintain the hydration levels established by your evening hydration routine, on the day of your competition try to consume about 250ml an hour in the hours before your event. You will have some fluid pass straight through your system, so again trial this to ensure bathroom breaks are not impacting on your shooting competition. A toilet stop before your event is normal, but it is the feeling of busting to go during an event we are all trying to avoid!

5. When you have finished shooting for the day and it has been hot the use of the combination of PowerAde and GASTROLYTE immediately after may help replenish lost fluid. Follow this up with about 250ml (1 cup) an hour until dinner. You may feel a little bloated but it should only last an hour or so. Be aware of the extra energy contained in sports drinks, so don't go overboard.

6. If drinking to rehydrate, when you have a drink take 3-4 mouthfuls rather than little sips. It will make the consumption of the volume needed to rehydrate much easier.

Please note: everybody's physiology is different, so strategies are always refined to suit the individual. These suggestions are possible ways to assist, and by no means the only ways or strict standards to follow. If you are taking any medications or health problems please make sure you consult your doctor for the best solution for you.

Musings on Biodiversity by a Retired Park Manager

Robert E. Fox1

Abstract

Biodiversity continues to decline in Australia despite significant effort by government, industry and concerned citizens. In this essay the author draws upon his >30 years of experience at the sharp end of natural resource management to consider some factors that may be contributing to the relative lack of progress. While national parks and reserves form a small part of the overall Australian landscape their importance in the battle to retain biodiversity is undeniable. However, rigidity of thinking on the part of park managers has limited the support base for parks and thus their potential in leading integrated landscape management at the all-important local level.

The rise of animal libertarianism is further impacting on the ability of parks and wildlife managers to make rational decisions based on the best scientific advice. Animal libertarianism, influential in our western, primarily urban-based society, causes significant problems in wildlife conservation. Anthropomorphic concepts of rights have little application in the animal world and contribute even less to the conservation of species.

Musings on Biodiversity by a Retired Park Manager

Parks and wildlife managers face many problems. While it goes without saying that good science should underpin problem solving, forces other than science too often restrict options. A scientific approach excludes options only after rigorous testing of hypotheses. In the real world, however, societal conditioning of one form or another rather than science may cause options to be excluded. The tribal mentality never quite disappears and people tend to uncritically embrace the tenets of the small groups they belong to whether social or work related. Parks and wildlife managers are no exception. Worldwide they are not overly numerous, share similar professional backgrounds and face similar problems. While this might be good for communications and the essential esprit de corps, it can lead, at times, to some rigidity in thinking.

An example of rigidity of thinking in Australian park management

Recently I toured the United Kingdom (UK) where I visited many of their national parks and I was struck by the difference in park management philosophy between the UK and Australia. I took particular notice of the management of Dartmoor National Park where I had the opportunity to discuss management philosophies with a senior member of the park management.

According to the park literature, land title to Dartmoor National Park is held entirely by private citizens most of whom live in or near the park. The Duchy of Cornwall, currently Prince Charles, owns approximately 70% of the park. Dartmoor has been occupied by agricultural human settlement for at least 3-5 000 years and hunter-gatherer groups for much longer. Modern land utilisation remains intense, as almost the entire park is either utilised for grazing of sheep, cattle and horses or for forestry plantations. The area was intensively mined for tin and copper in earlier days and a prison was established in the late 18th century "to provide local employment". The park is heavily visited, drawing people from the UK and all over the world. Park recreational activities appear to be

mainly sight seeing, walking and bird watching. I understand that hunting was also quite common until relatively recently.

An Australian park manager reading this will by now wonder how on earth can the title "National Park" be justifiable for Dartmoor? The average Australian park is owned by the state, features no farming, mining, forestry nor hunting. Australian park authorities tend to value "pristine" landscapes and "unspoilt" wilderness above all else. Indeed a park that does not measure up in that sense tends to be derogatively termed a recreational reserve or similar appellation. Do Australian values make Dartmoor less valuable as a park? Depends on your outlook I guess.

Before passing judgement it is useful to consider what ensures a park's future. In Australia, most people think that once a park is declared it is guaranteed for perpetuity. The legal reality is quite different as it is possible for any government in Australia to revoke part or all of any park within its respective jurisdiction. Minor revocations for roads and service easements, for example, are not uncommon, evidence that the requisite legislative machinery exists. It follows then that Australian parks, being the property of the state, will only continue to exist while the political climate favours their existence. Thus, Australian parks, as in any other part of the world, will only continue to exist and be managed properly while they retain the support of the community.

Why is community support important? Consider the many African national parks. Establishment of many, if not most, of these parks involved displacement of the local people, sometimes forcibly, and refusal of access to what was once part of their land (IUCN 1995). The displaced locals not only view the parks with historical resentment, but also share few of the benefits. Not only are they denied access to good agricultural land, the parks are the source of dangerous animals that threaten their crops, their animals and often their lives. In post-colonial times, the well known African parks survive mainly because the foreign currency generated by overseas visitors has become critical to the respective cash strapped national economies. This has resulted in a dangerous imbalance where indigenous support for African parks comes from a small elite usually within the higher levels of government with benefits being rarely, if ever, passed onto those living beside the parks. Increasing populations and weakening economies are daily worsening the situation. Is it then not surprising that poaching is a major problem, official corruption rife and the general management standard of African parks slowly but surely deteriorating (IUCN 1995, see also Goodall 1997)?

In Australia, it is fair to say that the majority of support for the establishment and maintenance of parks comes from the middle class of the nation's capital cities. These people neither directly depend on the land for their livelihood nor possess practical concepts of land management. Green groups and park managers labour under the illusion that our parks enjoy widespread community support, but the reality is that hard-core support for national parks is quite limited. Ask a factory worker living in a small flat whether they would sacrifice the local park if that meant they could have a nice house and garden in the resultant subdivision. Ask a miner or pastoralist or tour operator whether Kakadu National Park in the Northern Territory represents optimum land use. Ask a high country cattleman whether Mt Kosciuszko National Park in southern New South Wales (NSW) represents optimum land use. Ask a forester whether the parks in the east of NSW represent optimum land use. Indeed ask any farmer or resident of rural Australia whether the national park in his or her district represents optimum use of the land. In each case you will find less than overwhelming support for parks.

In most of rural Australia, the locals tend to be devastatingly critical of national parks and their management. Should that be surprising? Consider the disruption to timber towns caused by the exclusion of vast areas of forest from logging. Consider the sense of loss suffered by farmers whose properties and grazing rights have been resumed. Consider the real economic loss suffered by farmers from dingos and other pests coming out of the parks. As in Africa, there is a serious imbalance of support within Australian society for our national parks system.

Effective wildlife conservation can only occur in the long term with the support of the local people and the simplest way to obtain local support is to ensure that the locals obtain real economic benefit from the conservation program. Goodall (1997) states that the only possible solution in Africa is to involve the local people. Unfortunately this seems to be the exception rather than the rule.

Consider again the Dartmoor example. The presence of farming and forestry may offend an Australian park manager's sensitivities and its effectiveness in conserving natural values may be questionable. However, Dartmoor enjoys solid support both at the local and the urban level: support from the farmers who depend on the landscape for their livelihood and support from the urbanites for its wilderness values. Surely this is an enviable position for a park manager?

While national parks and other conservation reserves provide iconic inspiration to dedicated conservationists, as well as being "nice places to visit", they form only one small part of the biodiversity equation. While their importance is undeniable in the long-term battle to keep Australia's natural biodiversity from a slippery-slide to oblivion, it is essential that we do not lock ourselves into any particular mind set. Parks need to be subject to regular critical review within the broader debate on biodiversity conservation. We need to return to some of the common objections to national parks, or at least to their management, such as the commonly perceived "limited usefulness" of parks. Why cannot Australian parks embrace a range of land uses wider than picnicking and walking? Why cannot some of the former uses to which the landscape was subjected be retained? These are reasonable questions for which park managers do not, in my opinion, always have reasonable answers.

Broadening the user base has already started to happen with at least one icon of Australian conservation: Kakadu National Park, like Dartmoor, is almost entirely privately owned. Most of the park is Aboriginal Land as defined by the Aboriginal Land Rights (Northern Territory) Act 1978 and is leased back to the Commonwealth Government for the purposes of a national park. Despite popular perceptions, Kakadu is by no means a pristine wilderness. The biological landscape has undoubtedly been shaped by arguably 40 000+ years of human occupation through active use of fire and hunting. The human cultural and social changes of the 19th and 20th centuries further impacted on Kakadu's biota.

During the late 19th and early 20th century, most of what is now Kakadu was carved up into the pastoral leases of Mudgenberri, Munmarlary, Kapalga, Goodparla and Gimbat stations. Cattle, horses and other stock were run on these leases and feral buffalo and pigs roamed the whole of the current park. Parts of Kakadu were extensively logged during and after the Second World War for cypress, bloodwood and paperbark. (The first park centre was sited within the remnant infrastructure of an old timber mill.) Tin, silver, gold and other metals were mined sporadically from the 1890s onward in different parts of Kakadu and uranium was extensively mined in the 1950s in the upper South Alligator River valley. The Ranger Uranium Mine, while not part of the park, has operated successfully within Kakadu boundaries for the last 20 years. Jabiluka is set to go. Coronation Hill, the iconic focus of the major anti-mining battle during the Hawke Government, had previously been repeatedly mined. (The most obvious feature of this small hill was not the spirit of Bulla, but mining excavations.) Hunting and fishing remain widespread within Kakadu. A large proportion of the annual harvest of Magpie Geese *Anseranas semiplumata* and Barramundi *Lates calcarifer* in the Northern Territory occurs inside the park. A small buffalo grazing and culling operation, based at a rough camp reminiscent of early pastoral homesteads, also exists within the park for the purposes of providing meat to the traditional owners.

I would like to make it clear that I am not opposed to the above - on the contrary I think it shows extraordinarily forward thinking by the park managers. As in Dartmoor, the people who have been directly dependent on the resources of Kakadu still live there and remain free to derive their livelihood as they have for generations. This ensures a long-term local support base for the park in addition to the urban support base. Other Australian park authorities would do well to take notice.

North American park management philosophies are not always appropriate for the Australian landscape. State park authorities tend to be under funded and are widely criticized, fairly or unfairly, in the media for inadequate management of large tracts of land. Such criticism is further evidence of the imbalance in public support for Australian national parks. Most parks occur in rural areas and the most trenchant criticism of parks I have experienced has come from rural people. If a national park has alienated the neighbours, what hope is there for integrated biodiversity protection across the district? Australian park managers, similarly to their African counterparts, have a limited support base, only here it is not an elite but an affluent urban middle class with little practical knowledge of park management.

The situation is made all the more tenuous through animal libertarians opposing aspects of practical wildlife conservation on ideological grounds (media reports) and exacerbating the not unrelated gap between urban and rural perspective's (personal experience). Tidemann and Vardon (2002) reviewed difficulties with research proposals meeting ideologically based opposition. In the following I would like to illustrate similar issues in wildlife management.

How influences other than science can dominate natural resource decision-making

The electoral reality of Australia is that the urbanites of the capital cities dictate government policy. While in some ways that is not necessarily a bad thing, the down side is that policies, that have little basis in practical reality, are commonly forced upon land managers. Urbanites who have never seen a cow milked or an animal slaughtered or other realities of farm management tend to be susceptible to animal libertarian doctrines. After all, milk, meat, fish and eggs come from the supermarket in convenient plastic packaging. There is no blood, no gore, no dirt, no excreta and "of course we could not possibly kill anything". Is it any wonder that the current generation of urbanites have no concept of what animals are really like? Is it surprising that people exhibit naive anthropomorphism when their main wildlife experience in early childhood was watching Walt Disney cartoons? Bambi, Lion King, Mickey Mouse and countless other animal caricatures inflicted on the western world have been pre-conditioning our children for years. And when the nonsense of the "Bambi syndrome", well known to wildlife managers worldwide, becomes semi-sanctified by misanthropic academics is it any wonder that we are in trouble?

Biological scientists have been singularly unsuccessful in getting the message across to the general public that populations and habitats, not individuals, are the key to conservation. Despite the fact that saving individual animals has little effect in ensuring the survival of any species, caring Australians expend enormous effort in trying to resuscitate orphaned and injured animals. If this effort could be redirected to habitat conservation or feral animal/weed control, Australian biodiversity would be a lot better off. Individual 'right to life' has little place in wildlife conservation.

From discussions with Dr Grahame J.W. Webb2, I suggest that there are three main problems with the animal libertarian view:

1. it focuses attention on individuals rather than populations;
2. it tends to concentrate only on the cuddly and furry animals such as koalas and kangaroos; and
3. providing rights for animals means reducing rights for humans.

Yet animal libertarianism, covertly or overtly, strongly influences conservation philosophies expressed by the majority of the current conservation activist groups. Animal libertarianism forms the basis of the anti-hunting and anti-wildlife/animal utilisation movements throughout the affluent western world. It is the kind of mindset where one can proudly denounce the killing of animals while enjoying a fillet mignon. Wildlife becomes synonymous with

iconic or noble animals. Urbanites rarely have knowledge, understanding or sympathy for the vast majority of the animal kingdom, let alone plants. Public sympathy is readily generated for koalas, an obvious iconic species, but it would be less easy to raise support for, say, honeyeaters. Enormous public angst is generated when a park service decides to shoot a few feral horses in a park - witness the uproar created by the NSW national parks service horse-culling program in 2001. Horses are obviously seen to be noble animals. If the NSW park managers had decided to shoot feral pigs, for example, there would have been no protest, as pigs are not, presumably, noble animals (although the film "Babe" may have had some contrary effect).

Virtually no one protested at the culling of hundreds of thousands of feral donkeys, buffalo and cattle in the national brucellosis and bovine tuberculosis eradication campaign (BTEC) campaigns conducted during the 1980s and 1990s in northern Australia. Yet, when the Conservation Commission of the Northern Territory proposed to shoot a few drought-stricken horses on a station near Alice Springs in 1988, all hell broke loose. The uproar reached international dimensions with the NT Government being convicted of crimes against animals by a self-appointed European Court for Animal Rights. The Franz Weber Foundation, a driving force behind this self-appointed court, consequently purchased Bonrook Station near Pine Creek with the intention of relocating and thus saving wild horses from the murderous Territorians. Strangely, when the BTEC campaign came to Bonrook Station, the Franz Weber Foundation actively cooperated with NT Government officers to shoot the resident feral cattle on the Station. It would appear that the ox is also not a noble animal.

Hypocritically inconsistent attitudes are unfortunately all too characteristic of animal libertarians. While it is not denied that many if not most of them have a genuine concern about "the environment", the expression of that concern causes as many problems as it addresses. Any objective overview of the Australian landscape indicates that biodiversity continues to decline despite public statements by politicians, significant expenditure by all governments, commitment by industry, direct action by citizens and continual media coverage. I suspect the following significantly contribute to this situation:

1. pre-occupation with the individual or small end of conservation that is, iconic species, rare and/or endangered species and orphaned and/or injured animals;
2. subversion of practical conservation by animal libertarianism, for example, opposing fox furs being used in fashionable clothing and banning of hunting on ideological rather than scientific grounds;
3. lack of support from people dependent on natural resources, that is, those in the agricultural, forestry and mining industries.

Various combinations of the above factors have militated against real advances in biodiversity conservation in Australia. Agriculture and mining together contribute enormously to the wealth and security of this nation; yet evoke little sympathy from urbanites despite the fact that these sectors are most affected by policy change. Recher (1999), in outlining the continuing decline in Australian avifauna, stated the obvious: "without changes in community attitudes to land management, the current trends in habitat loss and degradation will continue". Such changes will only

be possible with the support and cooperation of those directly dependent on the nation's natural resources.

Conclusions

Successful biodiversity conservation needs to be all embracing and include all land uses and land users. Current Commonwealth initiatives towards developing integrated catchment planning for river systems may signal a way forward but Australian park managers will need to rid themselves of their current myopia before they can play a useful role in such initiatives. Park managers must shed their current overzealous and precious attitudes about what constitutes a park and what is acceptable within a park. They must understand that conservation does not end at the park boundary and that parks, in total, represent a remarkably small component of the overall landscape. Long-standing human uses of natural resources do not necessarily compromise biodiversity conservation. They must intelligently resist management options based on ideology rather than science. Above all, they must strive to become an integral part of the local community with the objective of enabling local people to benefit materially from biodiversity conservation. Merely asking for comment on management plans is woefully inadequate.

I am less sure about how anthropomorphism in wildlife management may be countered. The prospect of facing down the enormously influential media and entertainment industries is rather daunting. However, we can take the first step within our own ranks of conservation professionals. Without for a moment endorsing current movements toward fundamentalism, nevertheless now might be a suitable time to promote a "return to basics" ethos. Let us promote only options that are biologically sound, cost effective, practical and, most importantly, directly involving those people immediately affected. Let us also promote the goals of genomic survival that we have in common with the animal liberationists, but fearlessly draw a line in the sand against their more anthropomorphic demands.

The Trophy was originally commissioned by a Mr. Fred Birkby and presented to the Harrogate Gun Club, Yorkshire, England in 1937 for a competition shoot as a preliminary to the opening of the English game shooting season each year.

The Harrogate Gun Club was sadly disbanded in the 1970's and the magnificent trophy was returned to Mr. Birkby's widow (now Mrs. K. M Marshall). As luck would have it, Mrs. Marshall was the aunt of Bob Ellison (an enthusiastic shooter and member of the NSW Gun Club). Mrs. Marshall, knowing of her nephew's keen interest in the sport, gave Bob the trophy to use as he saw fit.

The Trophy contains some 2.4kg of sterling silver and is valued at \$25, 000, has been refurbished by Mr. Ellison. The six events for which the trophy was originally contested are depicted in bas-relief on the outer panels making The Yorkshire Trophy an absolute work of art.

Not only has Bob Ellison presented The Yorkshire Trophy to The NSW Gun Club but he continues to sponsor the annual event for which the Club is extremely grateful. The event was first contested in Australia in 1984 and the name of the winner each year is engraved on the Trophy. The winning shooter is presented with a boxed silver replica.

The Yorkshire Trophy is an open event and is an extremely worthy contest. It has an international pedigree and is certainly one event on the national calendar to catch your attention.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.






