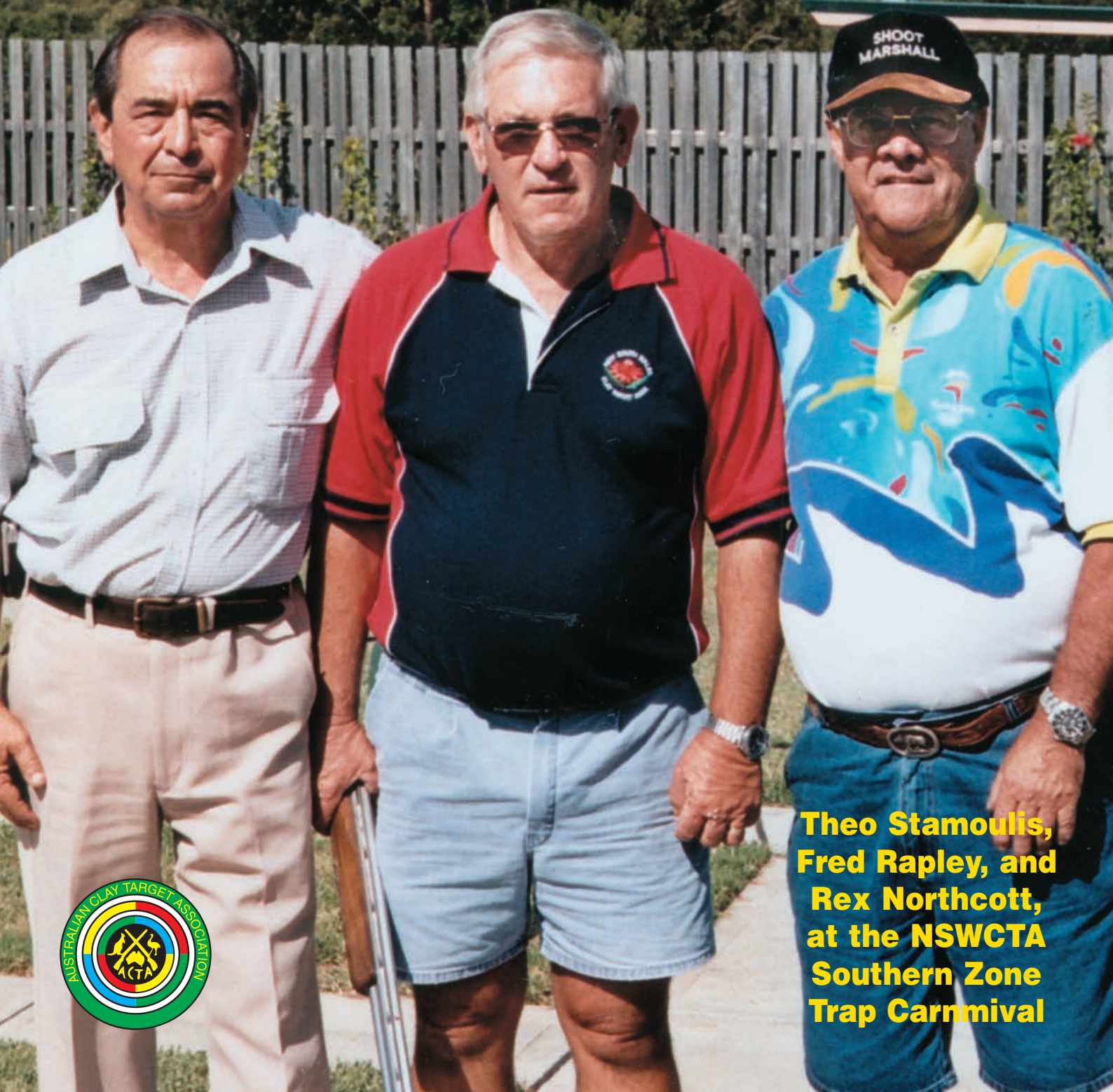

National President's Notes

Ron Trill and myself recently attended the national Ground for inspection of construction progress and also a demonstration of the operation of the Mattarelli DTL Double Rise Trap on loan from Beretta Australia.

Both Ron and I were impressed with the traps' ease of operation and performance. Very positive feed back was received from a number of shooters that had shot over the trap.

National Ground re-construction continues and is shaping up very well. Only three traps, numbers 2, 3 and 4 are left to be re-vamped with the remaining 12 looking in great shape. New trap houses, concrete lanes with walk around paths are all complete.

The first ACTA Junior Development Squad for 2005 is now formed and the first Camp will take place on 19 to 21 April. A full field of 25 has been accepted. Nominations were received from Victoria, New South Wales, South Australia and Queensland.

I remind all shooters of the new rule 1.01(q) **"Ear and eye protection is compulsory for all ACTA disciplines for all employees, volunteers and competitors whilst present at the firing point or trap area"**.

I also remind all shooters of rule 1.01(k) **"any shooter knowingly breaching any safety rule will immediately be suspended for one (1) calendar month pending an investigation."**

Norfolk Island 25th International Clay Target Championships

152 shooters from Australia, New Zealand and Norfolk Island lined up for this the 25th International Clay Target Championships held from the 6 - 11th February 2005.

Hon. Geoff Gardner Chief Minister and Minister of Sport for Norfolk Island officially opened this annual sporting event. Geoff made particular mention of the many visits to Norfolk Island by Chris Davenport and Barry Casey of Sydney.

The weather was perfect for the weeks events and even though the competition ground has only two layouts the events where progressed through with minimum delays. It did however mean that for the first time in many years the spare day, Friday was

required to finish off the Ball Trap and Single Rise events including shoot offs.

A good number of shooters took advantage of the conditions to also participate in a fishing trip or two. The Norfolk Island Clay Target Association would like to thank our Australian Shooters for their assistance during the week.

Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix"

Olympic Trap and Skeet - Brisbane Gun Club

By popular demand after a break of two years, Australia's premier international Olympic Discipline clay target shooting competition, the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix", returned to the shooting calendar during February at Brisbane Gun Club.

Hot on the heels of the Olympic Discipline National Championships, which were held in Brisbane in January and hailed by many as one of the most successful Olympic Discipline Nationals of recent years, the Australasian Pacific "Grand Prix" again confirmed that Australia is desperately in need of an International competition at which the rank and file shooters of Australia can host and compete side-by-side with shooters of their own standard in a friendly environment in Australia. The international flavour of the Brisbane "Grand Prix" also offers an unequalled opportunity for our own national team members, experienced and inexperienced, to gain valuable international experience without the added expense associated with travelling to international competitions overseas.

Established in Australia during the 1990s and early 2000s as the undisputable premier annual international competition in the country, the Brisbane conceived "Grand Prix" attracted shooters from throughout the shooting world over a period of some 8 years. In 2000, the club established an all time record for an Australian club competition when competitors from 22 nations competed at the club's annual Olympic Trap, Skeet and Double Trap competition. Without a doubt, the competition set a standard which will be very hard for any club to equal or better in the foreseeable future.

After an absence of 2 years, the "Grand Prix" competition was conducted at Brisbane Gun Club on the weekend of 17th, 18th & 19th February and attracted a field of nearly 90 Olympic Trap and Skeet shooters from throughout Australia and Asia.

Included in the field were a large contingent of shooters from the Winchester supported Japan Top Gun Club, a group which have been regular visitors to Brisbane for many years.

In re-establishing the competition, the organising Committee decided on a shortened version of the competition which proved to be so popular in past years. This year, the competition included two events each in Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet, both held at the same time.

The first event in each discipline was a 100 target Badge match held on Friday 17th. These events were graded and also catered for competitors in Women's, Veteran's and Junior sections. In conjunction with the Badge match, competitors also had the opportunity to share in the "Skins" (cash divide) which was included as part of the event.

In the Olympic Trap Badge match, nearly 70 shooters competed in the 100 target event with the Overall winner being Derek Bruce of Cairns who recorded 93/100.

In the ISSF Skeet competition, the first event was well contested by the small field and eventually won overall by Kel Madsen from Kenji Watanabe of Japan Top Gun Club and well known Brisbane member Len Norman.

The "Skins" section of the Skeet event was equally shared in the AA/A section with Kel Madsen taking the money in the 1st, 3rd and 4th rounds. Satoshi Kaneko of Japan winning the 2nd round while Kasuo Suzuki won the money in the 1st round of the B & C section. Len Norman got the money in the 2nd and 3rd rounds and Kenji Watanabe and Akio Yamada shared the spoils in the 4th round

The main events of the 3 day program were the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" events in both Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet. These events were conducted over Saturday and Sunday and saw an increased number of nominations in each event.

In the Olympic Trap event, 12 squads started the first day which would see 100 targets completed by all competitors. The second day would see a further 50 targets for all shooters plus a final for the top 6 qualifiers.

On day one, 24s and 23s seemed to be the order of the day early, with many of the more fancied competitors including Kevin Perkins and young Ben Kelly of Illawarra both carding 24s along with Derek Bruce of Cairns, Rob Machul from Cobar and newcomer Sein-Chau Chu from Brisbane. Jennine Gerrard from Warwick - fresh from the Australia Cup competition at Werribee also started well with a 24.

The second and third rounds of the day continued in much the same fashion until the first 25 went onto the board with compliments of well known local Channel 9 personality, Alex Smith - this being the only 25 for the day's proceedings.

At the end of day 1, Kevin Perkins was showing the way after a good consistent day of 24 - 23 - 23 - 23, a total of 93/100, 3 targets ahead of Norihiro Umezu and former champion Greg Newey of Warwick both on 90/100. After the top 3, the field was pretty bunched with plenty of 89s, 88s and 87s on the board.

With 3 Olympic Trap ranges operating, day 2 was always going to be a breeze with only 50 targets plus the final to be shot. 'Perky' started well notching up a clean 25/25 to cement his position at the top while the rest of the field was left floundering - 23s being the best anyone else could record.

After the sixth round, Kevin Perkins was still in the lead finishing with a 22 and a total of 140/150. Ben Kelly and Toshio Yasuda both recorded 24s in their last round to finish on 134/150 and take up the 2nd and 3rd positions in the final, two targets ahead of Ben Machul while Derek Bruce and Norihiro Umezu filled the final two spots after Umezu had to survive a shoot-off with Greg Newey for the last spot.

For many - including all of the finalists, the final was a new experience, being shot under the new ISSF 'single barrel final' rule. Under this format, low 20s seem to be the norm but 'ever consistent' Kevin Perkins recorded a very nice 22/25 to take the overall honours and the winners spoils. For Kevin it was his first victory at the Brisbane "Grand Prix" after nearly 10 years of trying - the event could not go to a more deserving supporter. Perky has never missed a "Grand Prix" in Brisbane and thoroughly deserved his victory. Fellow Illawarra club member, Ben Kelly also showed that he will be one to watch in the future after surviving the final and a miss-and-out single barrel shoot off with Toshio Yasuda for Japan to take second place.

The ISSF Skeet event also provided some interesting competition with the local die-hard ISSF shooters up against the enthusiasts from Japan. While the field for the skeet event was not as big as it has been in previous years there certainly wasn't anything lacking for those who contested the event.

The Overall winner of the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" event in ISSF Skeet was local Brisbane Gun Club member, Tony Kidman. Tony recorded 132/150 to qualify No. 1 into the final and shot consistently well throughout the two day competition to go into the final 2 targets clear of Kenji Watanabe of Japan and Kel Madsen

who both recorded 130/150. Len Norman, Satoshi Kaneko and James Hashmi made up the field for the final 6 shooters.

Overall, the conducting of the new format Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" competition was a resounding success. All present appreciated the new style events and without exception, the Brisbane Gun Club committee and the competitors who were present have committed to the future conducting of the competition in February each year. As the objective of the competition has always been to cater for the ISSF enthusiast and international visitors, the event will continue to be run along these lines in the future with more emphasis being place on attracting visitors to Brisbane Gun Club from overseas and throughout Australia.

The Organising Committee and the Committee of Brisbane Gun Club wish to record their sincere appreciation of the support of Greg Mitchell and Wayne Pilkington from Winchester Division of Olin Australia Limited, Greg Newey from Warwick Outdoors and Sports and of course the many workers from Brisbane Gun Club including Col Boyd and Darby Munro, Paul Vit, Chad Barrett, Scott and Karen Dobeli, Tom and Thelma Meadows, President Michael Bopf and many, many more, who all contributed to the success of the competition.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Inner Game Revisited

The very first article I wrote for the CTSN back in 1999 was called: "If I miss; is it self doubt?" and basically explored the notion by Tim Gallwey, author of *The Inner Game of Golf* and *The Inner Game of Tennis*. Gallwey's idea is that we construct doubt about our ability to do what we have to do and therefore we find we can not do it. For shooters, we doubt our ability to hit the target even though we may have shot thousands or hundreds of thousands in the past. In a recent workshop for Newcastle Lake Macquarie Clay Target Club I reinforced the idea that shooting the target, hitting the ball, sinking the putt, etc is not the hard part. The hard part is trying to keep our minds quiet long enough to be able to just get on and do the task. If you can cast your mind back to the first article; Self 1 (or the left side of the brain) continually tries to give Self 2 (the right side of the brain) instructions on how to shoot the target. Because self 2 does not understand what is said, self 2 becomes stressed and the muscles tighten up and we cannot do what we have to do; which is just shoot the target (even though we've shot thousands before). The purpose of the workshop was not to go over the physical aspects of shooting; gun hold, gun fit, stance, etc but to get the participants to understand what was going on in their heads; what sort of internal conversations they were having with themselves that would lead to tension and self doubt.

Regular readers will know the difference between self 1 and self 2 and the importance of letting self 2 get on with the job and the necessity of keeping self 1 quiet. If self 2 is allowed to get on with the job, and shoot the target, it can do it well and over and over again. But if self 1 is allowed to stick its' two bob's worth in then self 2 will feel threatened, judged and will naturally tense up and make the task of shooting the target more difficult. Tension will lead to anxiety which will in turn lead to doubt. Doubt will lead to failure.

So what gets in the way of us shooting well? We do! If we take the simple action of shooting a trap target; the shooter sees the image of the target, then responds by moving the gun and pulling the trigger, producing the results of smoking the target. Perception, response, results; the basic elements of any human action are summarised in this simple sequence of events. But is it simple? Gallwey believes that it isn't. Between the perception and the action, there is some interpretation. After the perception and before the next action, there is interpretation. And even more thinking occurs between the next shot and so on. At each stage meaning is being attributed to each part of the action and often to the performer himself. These meanings can have a huge impact on the shooters' performance.

How can we change and break the cycle of interference by self 1. As a coach, Gallwey found that the traditional coaching methods were not working. By traditional I mean that a student coming to a coach with a problem and asking for advice. Usually the coach or the teacher will observe the student and then offer a series of should and shouldn't commands. This is based on the model that the teacher's way is correct. It is at this point that the student's behaviour becomes predictable. The student places trust in the judgemental feedback of the teacher and the

student's responsibility is merely to do what he is told. The student then tries hard not to do what he shouldn't do and make himself do what he should. In this model change is viewed as moving from bad to good, defined and initiated by someone other than who is making the change. Change, this way, is done in a judgemental context that usually brings with it resistance, doubt, and fear of failure on the part of the student. The student's innate eagerness and responsibility for learning is also undermined in the process.

Gallwey saw it necessary to change his way of coaching; to move away from learning that focused on behaviour or skill and focus on the real problem the shooters distortion in perception. After all it is a perception that a particular target is a threat. Gallwey believed that individuals would change and improve if their judgement of themselves and their performance could be replaced by a non-judgemental observation of fact. Gallwey believed that awareness; trust and choice were the principals that had to govern the way both the coach and student functioned.

Gallwey gives a tennis example of this process; I'll paraphrase Gallwey's example and put it in shooting language. If a right handed shooter complains about not being able to shoot right hand swingers then he would tell the shooter that he will fix that problem later. In the meantime he would get the shooter to focus on some aspect of the target; is the target flying smooth, is it absolutely straight away, for example. The idea is that the shooter should be now absorbed with watching some aspect of the target and self 1 should be distracted so when the right hand swinger emerges the shooter should be able to shoot it because it is part of the exercise and it is not being judged by self 1 as a threat. Once the perception of the target as a threat has been removed, then the elements of defensive behaviour also vanish. The shooter should notice that he is moving much more freely and because the action feels better the results should improve. Gallwey believes that as long as focus was maintained on some neutral but critical variable, then steady and relatively effortless improvements could occur without a single technical instruction.

Exercising trust in self 2 seems like you are losing control, but in fact you are gaining control because you are letting go of an inferior method of control. Trusting in your ability allows you to be fluid in your movements and shoot with effortless ease. Why shouldn't you trust your own ability? You can once you let go of those judgements that limit your ability. Trust and let go.

Gallwey believes that his experience with the three principles - awareness, choice and trust - showed they were inextricably connected like three sides of a triangle. They were three parts of a whole. Awareness was about knowing the present situation with clarity. Choice was about moving in the desired direction in the future. And trust in one's own resources was the essential link that enabled that movement. Each side of the performance triangle complemented and supported each other; the more you trust the easier it is to be aware, the more aware the easier it is to see your choices.

So the next time you address a trap and face a target trust and let go.

"New " Auto - Rise DTL Trap House at New South Wales Gun Club

With gun club range facilities always at a premium, NSW Gun Club looked for ways to utilise its existing facilities more efficiently. The logical approach was to come up with a system that would allow a conventional trap to be used in conjunction with the Club's trench layout, without interfering with the operation of the Trench.

The concept of a raise and lower trap house was discussed over a period of time. In 2003, Don Johnson, NSWGC member, was asked for his input based on his experience as a professional engineer.

This "New" trap house would need to Rise at least 850mm above the level of the Shooting Lanes and then retract some distance below ground level with controlled and true vertical movement. Don Johnson suggested that a hydraulically operated scissor lift would be one of the most appropriate mechanisms capable of fulfilling this function effectively.

In late 2004 a 1000 Kg Capacity Scissor lift with 900mm Maximum Lift Height was ordered and work commenced on excavating and building a pit in front of the Trench Layout. The pit's internal dimensions were specified at 2500mm wide x 3300mm long x 1800mm deep. NSWGC Member John Diamond did the construction. The pit has a reinforced concrete base with six courses of concrete blocks forming the walls. Drainage and electrical conduits were also installed during construction.

Since the Scissor lift Base and Platform is relatively small (1350 x 1000 mm) in comparison to the new trap house (2400 x 2000 mm) it was necessary to position the scissor lift so that in the raised position, the centre of gravity of the fully loaded trap house and the raised scissor lift would approximately line up. To further help stabilise the scissor lift base a larger fabricated steel frame was fitted under the Scissor lift.



In the lowered position, the Trap House is below ground level and out of sight.



The front opening Trap House is easily accessible and has a high safety factor as trappers are always visible.

The "New" trap house was designed by Don Johnson to comply with ACTA specifications 800mm high in front and 650mm high at the back when raised. Total height of the trap house is 1400mm in front and 1350mm at back, allowing 600mm to remain below ground level when in the up position.

RHS Duragal sections in various sizes ranging from 100 x 50 to 50 x 25 x 2.5mm thick were used to construct the trap house frame and it is sheeted with 1.6mm thick galvanised steel, pop riveted in place. Eight guide rollers attached to the lower sides engage steel channels secured to the pit walls to steady the trap house in its up position.

One of the main features of this trap house is the fully opening lid and back. This provides an easy access into the Trap house, allows the trapper to stand behind the trap and remain in full view while loading the trap magazines

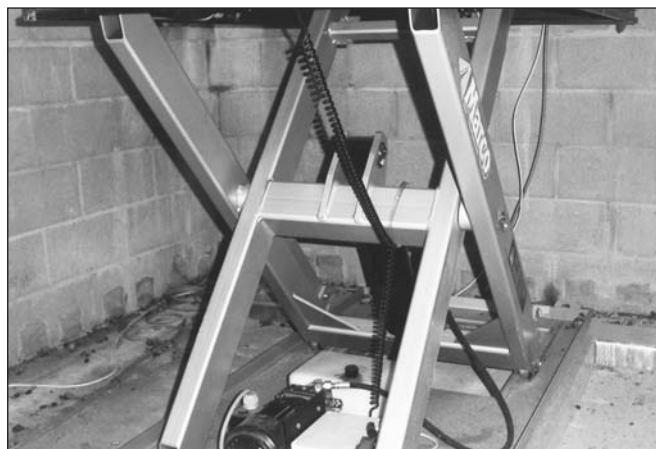
With further modifications to the front wall of the pit with the provision of a ramped exit area, it will also be possible to shoot Ball Trap from this facility in its lowered position

The construction of the innovative raise and lower trap was a team effort. Other NSWGC members involved were Dave Morgan who assisted with the installation and completed the wiring of the voice control system, Tim Wunderlich who assisted with the installation and Arty Del Ben who constructed the DTL Shooting Lanes.

The construction of the raise and lower trap at NSWGC effectively gives the Club another trap layout at minimal cost, using voluntary labour. No additional real estate or buildings were required, with the additional benefit of being able to add another event (Ball Trap) to the Club's shooting program.

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
