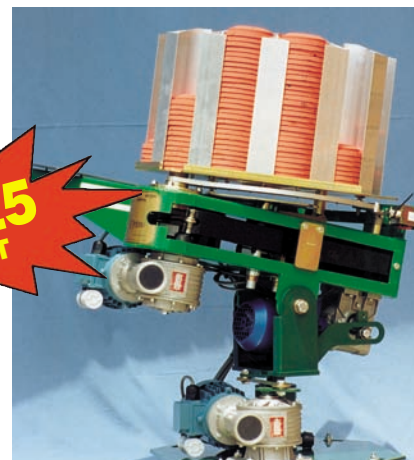

workers. Some good scores were recorded under at times very testing conditions.

Following the AGM your executive committee authorised for the biggest sponsorship agreement ever signed between the ACTA and Beretta Australia.

2005 Commonwealth Shooting Federation Championship **Melbourne 9-19 March**

The Commonwealth Shooting Federation Championships were hosted by the Melbourne Gun Club during March.

16 Commonwealth countries were represented with competitors in Trap, Double Trap and ISSF Skeet, both male and female.

Countries competing came from as far away as Northern Ireland, Scotland, England, Wales, the Isle of Man and Canada, as well as our nearest neighbour, New Zealand, and a contingent from Fiji Norfolk Island and Niui along with India Pakistan, Bangladesh and Singapore. Interesting to note that all the countries that make up Great Britain, compete as separate countries for these championships, this also applies to the Commonwealth Games.

The weather was near perfect, the club had presented the range in a manner we have come to expect from Melbourne Gun Club and an army of volunteers, some experienced and others on a learning curve, made sure that competition ran smoothly to the satisfaction of all competitors.

As usual there are some stories that come from international events such as this, Canada was represented by three skeet shooters, leaving their home where it was - 20 degrees Celsius and arriving in Melbourne to temperatures of 20 degrees +, they had not fired a shot since November last year and were still able to make the finals winning a Silver Medal in the Badge Match, another Silver Medal and a fourth place in the individual Skeet, now how much practice, does one need for good scores!

Our friends from the island of Niui in the Pacific, near Samoa and Fiji, when asked for a copy of their National Anthem for us replied that they didn't have a copy, but if they won a medal they would sing their National Anthem for us, as really they were fishermen not shooters.

As a test event for the Commonwealth Games to be held at this venue in March 2006, the Games will be worth being part of.

The Commonwealth Shooting Federation Championships is the test event for the Commonwealth Games. It is held 12 months before the Games on the range to be used for the Games, to have the opportunity to test the equipment, train the volunteers and allow foreign countries to use the facility.

The Melbourne Gun Club presented the grounds in great condition even though there were signs of recent ground works evident. The Games venue consists of two Olympic traps and skeet ranges superimposed and all equipped with new Mattarelli machines. The setting of this range in the Yarra Valley in the shadow of the Dandenong Ranges makes for a picture perfect scene that will be most appreciated by those who attend next years Games.

This event attracted a large number of countries, the biggest contingents being from India, England and New Zealand, the countries most likely to rival Australia for medal honours in 2006.

Any Olympic trap final is pressure enough when shot with two shots, but change it to single barrel and that is a recipe for disaster. I think the ISSF has got it wrong with this rule change.

Lauryn went into the final in fourth place but a solid final in difficult conditions saw her win the gold medal. Natalia and Cherie both shot well in qualifying but had ordinary finals to let it slip away. This is Cherie's first major competition and the experience will do her the world of good. Lauryn's effort was all the more meritorious as she was 6 months pregnant at this event and showed why she is such a fierce competitor and truly world class.

It will be interesting to see if Australia can maintain its dominance in twelve months or if the rest of the Commonwealth countries can improve enough to challenge.

One thing is certain; the Australian team will not underestimate the competition or be lulled into complacency.

The Hudson Challenge Shield

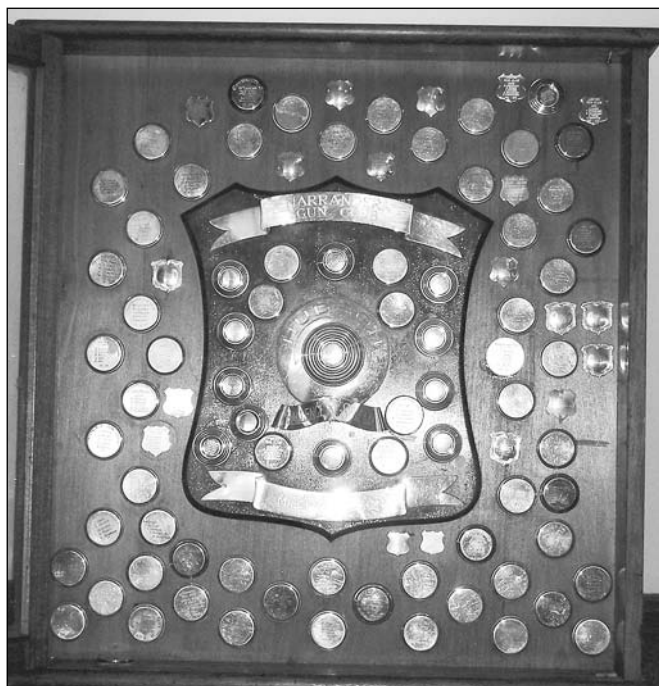
Mrs F.R. Hudson presented the Hudson Challenge Shield (photograph courtesy of The Narrandera Argus) to Narrandera Clay Target Club on 24th March 1954. The inaugural challenge for the shield was shot on 27th March 1954 with the winning team coming from Royal Aero Gun Club. The team members on that day were F. Hudson, J. Newton Thomas, M. Smith, M. Fuller and C. Michael.

The Shield challenge is for a team of five shooting twenty handicap targets. Since its beginnings the shield has been won by teams from; Barellan, Cowra, Condobolin, Shepparton, Yarrawonga, Downside International, Wagga, Leeton, Griffith, Finley, Cootamundra, Wangaratta, Narrandera, Hawkesbury, Rutherglen, Hay, Berridale, Queanbeyan/Canberra, Cosgrove, Young, Young Solferino, Hargrave Park, Ganmain and West Wyalong. Each winning team is depicted on the shield's case by a smaller shield or engraved silver clay target. There is an impressive list of shooters who have been part of winning teams over the years; J. Newton Thomas, W. Charlton, E. Hawkins, L. Bird, J. Headon, T. Salafia, M. Smith, M. Fuller, B. Rooke, V. Ryan, J. Whittakers, R. Bushby and F. Hudson, just to mention a few. In 1974 Hay Gun Club won the Hudson Shield and the team members were Jack Headon, Abby Headon, John Headon, Wayne Headon and Phillip Headon.

Narrandera Clay Target Club has agreed for the shield to make up part of the program for the Riverina Zone Trap Carnival and it will be shot for in 2005 as a five-person team in conjunction with the Riverina Zone Handicap. The idea being that the importance and prestige of this Challenge can be maintained with all Riverina and other zone clubs being able to shoot for the honour of winning it and having their name placed on the shield.

Each year at the Riverina Zone Carnival, the Johnny Cox Memorial Shield is also shot for in conjunction with the Pointscore event. Again, it is open to teams of five shooters and the shield is a memorial to Johnny Cox from Mangoplah Gun Club, which was situated on his property, Mangoplah Station.

The Riverina Zone Carnival is being run at the National Shooting ground in Wagga on the Sunday 29th May 2005.

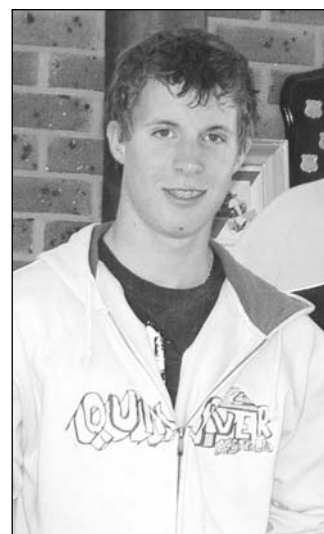

Psychological Skills for Shooting

You can still win, even though you're not the winner.

As I write this article, I have recently returned from the Nationals in Perth. I had a great time, but when I made my decision to go I was more than a bit tense because of the costs: Air fares, accommodation, hire car, food, ammunition, nominations and those extras that seem to syphon cash from our wallets. The other factor that made me tense was how would I perform? What if I went all that way, spent all that money and shot poorly?

My wife, Barbara bought me back to earth, who said, "Does it matter? You'll still be shooting, out in the sun, meeting people, being with friends and having a good time. Just go!" She was right. The goal of winning was there but there were other goals that were just as important; improving on past performances, getting high-pressure match experience and having fun. Not everyone can win but if we examine what we have achieved by our experience maybe we do all win in some way or another.

Going to the Nationals for me this year involved a fair degree of training that I hadn't done before. I changed my diet, lost 9 kilos, walked every day, kayaked three or four times a week, set goals for "warm up" shoots leading up to the Nationals, regularly relaxing and visualising. I could examine my scores and say, that because I didn't win a national championship, it was a waste of time and that the trip was a waste of money, but I would be missing the main point of why we play sport; to participate and exercise. The work that went into preparing for the Nationals can never be seen as a waste of time or money. By going to the Nationals, I had the opportunity to participate against the best shooters in Australia and New Zealand. I got to experience shooting away from familiar territory (this is important, as the National Ground at Wagga is basically my home turf). I also had the chance to compete in high-pressure events (even though it was my own thoughts that were placing more pressure on it). Overall, I improved on past experiences at the Nationals, and I was happy with the way I shot.

So why would my expectation about the way I would perform increase my anxiety levels? The answer is simple; when the scores go up on the board, your performance is at the scrutiny of everyone else. What's not known when others look at your score; is that this might be a personal best or a significant improvement on last years' performance. It's not unusual that people perform well in practise but the moment they are before an audience they tense up and they fail. This is known as performance anxiety and is due to our thinking not our ability. Our ability to shoot, or putt, bowl, etc does not change just because there are people watching us. What changes is our belief about our ability; we become fearful that we won't look as good or perform as well as we should. This fear produces self-doubt and before we know it we tense up and we cannot perform, as we know we should. I've talked a lot about fear before and will again, no doubt. At the Nationals, I asked a mate how he felt before an event and his reply was that he was scared. "What of" I asked. I then pointed out that all the guns would be pointed away from him and that to the best of my knowledge no-one has ever been attacked by a clay target whilst standing at the fifteen metre mark, so really there's nothing to be afraid of. He replied, "What if I miss." After a while, he understood that missing a target would be bad but it's not the worst thing that can happen to you in your life; let's put this into perspective and go and enjoy shooting as a sport.

In dealing with what others might think about our performance, whether watching us or by looking at the score on the board, I am reminded by a piece of graffiti I once read that said, "What other people think of me, is none of my business."

So examine your performance; not in terms of win or loss, but in terms of experience, fun, learning, achievement, personal best performance, and look at what can be improved on for next time. Once you have done that, start setting goals and developing a plan

that will help you achieve those goals over the next year.

For me, one of the highlights of the Nationals was meeting so many people from other parts of Australia. The number of shooters who acknowledged that they read these articles and took the time to sit and talk about their shooting and themselves touched me. The positive feedback was very much appreciated. We can't all win and be the one with the sash or medal but we can all do well and push our potential. The desire to improve is an admirable goal and that we should all strive to perform better in everything we do.

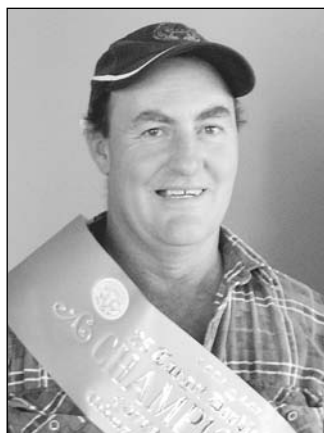

Dear Your Say

In support of necessary change.

The art of rorting the Grade system is widely practised and has become well established in the lower grades in recent years.

Action to address the problem has been minimal from the corridors of power, mainly because it is not a problem in the highly competitive and elite AA Grade, wherefrom most Champions, Overall Winners and Shooters of Note emanate.

It's painfully obviously that the movers and shakers of our sport don't consider that rorting in lower grades is a major problem.

Nothing could be further from the truth as it is clearly and overwhelmingly contrary to good sportsmanship and corrupts fair and equal competition.

That in turn causes ill-feeling and friction between competitors and Clubs as well.

It is well and truly past the time when this unsavoury part of our sport needs to be acknowledged and treated in the appropriate way. For those who haven't yet fathomed out to what I am referring, please read on.

The existing Grade system has little to recommend its continued use because it has been, is being and continues to be manipulated by unscrupulous people.

Many of us are aware of people who "adjust" their percentages by deliberately shooting low scores at certain times.

That certain time usually coincides with an impending re-assessment of their existing grade, a 200 target rule-off.

In some cases, it is very subtly carried out, while others are quite blatant about it, almost as if it's an acceptable thing to do!

When challenged, the reply is generally "you can't do anything about it because the rules say my percentage indicates I should be in such and such grade".

While these circumstances may be apparent to referees, handicappers and people "in the know", the only existing rule that could be invoked, Rule 2.04 (g) is avoided like the plague.

So far I have deliberately avoided use of the word "cheating" although we all know that's exactly what it is, but I don't want to upset anyone!

By cheating (sorry!) the grade rule, they remain within what they consider their comfort zone, the so-called "My Grade".

Within that comfort zone or Grade they seem to win or are among the prize money with monotonous regularity and sometimes shoot unbelievable scores.

"My Grade" is heard more around the traps today than the popular Frank Sinatra hit "My Way" ever was in its heyday!

What is it that makes these people think they own a Grade?

(Michael Kruger-Davis might like to psychologise on that in another issue.)

Sadly, the "My Grade" mentality has caused many prospective new shooters to turn away from the sport and contributed to the drift of members away from Clubs and competitions.

These people unashamedly support the failed system and vehemently oppose rule changes or alternatives that may find them out.

Finally, congratulations to the ACTA Championships Sub-Committee who courageously decided to conduct the 2005 Sporting Nationals under the Lewis Class System. At least those events will be a level playing field for all competitors.

In reply to Pat Loeffler's article (April) regarding "Popular and Wide Spread Cheating" having read your letter a couple of times I found a few errors in its contents.

Firstly with a bit more research you would have found out that not all hammer's have two slots "as you call them" to engage the sear, the two slot hammers would usually belong to old and new Browning, Miroko, Beretta 682 up to the gold series. Perhaps some of the other makes as well, any of the high grade European guns ie MX8 Perazzi, Keman, Beretta DT10, all have only one slot on the hammer, bit hard to only half cock one of those.

Secondly, obviously you have never heard of hard primers. Back in the late eighties there was a green shotshell with a sting in it's tail and it wouldn't be unusual to get at least two shells per box that misfired. Of cause they will fire the second time because the firing pin doesn't have as far to travel to reach the anvil because of the dent in the primer.

Next you said Doug Mitchell collected 4 live shells, did anybody check to see if they were from the same manufacturer?

Then you said, "we are going to modify procedure dealing with malfunctions during competition". Better check with the ACTA Rules Committee first I would think.

Got the next line right, never open gun lost target. Can't find the next paragraph in the Rulebook. Better check out Rule 1.10 (c) and (f) before you call anybody a cheat after one malfunction.

So one Pat Loeffler is an expert on "Popular and Wide Spread Cheating" by competitors who apparently have a particular type of gun malfunction.

The trouble with his expert opinion is that if a competitor is asked to drop both barrels until pivot is stopped mechanically to his satisfaction then close and shoot over the trap and bang, too bad. Bring the colours down, lights out = lost target, the next thing that will happen is that the competitor will whip out his 20 bucks and write down his protest.

Pat is correct in that the competitor must remain with the gun pointing in the direction of the trap house and not attempt to open it. Now, what should the referee do? Perhaps he should visually inspect the firearm for something obvious like the safety is on then, he can ask the competitor to mount the gun and attempt to fire the gun once. Now a competitor using a gun with mechanical triggers is hopefully going to tell you this fact and if it fires you may ask him or she to try again. If it fires again then the referee can safely call lost target.

However if that doesn't happen or the gun fails to fire at all, the competitor, not the referee, should be asked to open the firearm for inspection for such things as failure to load correctly etc but if there is a shell in the right place then it is a malfunction of either shell or firearm and that is as far as a referee can adjudicate. Any further action such as Pat is suggesting is completely out of order as the sequence of events leading up to the original problem cannot be duplicated beyond doubt.

As for suggesting this is cheating well I fail to see the reasoning as having a firearm malfunction in competition is hardly to the competitor's advantage and any effect on the rest of the squad for repeated malfunctions is covered under Rule 1.10(f).

My final comment on the subject is that a referee is there to adjudicate the event and use some common sense and Pat's interpretation of the rules of a malfunction don't appear to do that, and yes, carry 20 bucks in your back pocket.

Misfires! With regard to Mr Pat Loeffler's letter in April 2005 edition of "Your Say". I can fully appreciate the reasoning behind his theory, but feel a more rational understanding of certain basic principles be understood before adopting rule changes or radical "at range" procedures.

1. From my experience not all Belgian B25 Browning's have secondary safety bents on the hammers. Models with inertia triggers do, models post 1970 (approx.) with mechanical triggers do not. However, all Japanese Miroku/Browning's derivatives do have the secondary safety feature. As one would consider prudent, if for whatever reason the main trigger sear falls into intercept (second groove) it is not possible to fire the gun by pulling the trigger;

2. Very few modern u/o mechanisms have any form of secondary bent, and those that do should be regulated so that if the triggers sear engages said "safety bent" it cannot be dislodged by the pulling of the trigger. A classic fail safe principle at work, and only opening the gun will return the status quo and re-cock the lock work;

3. It has been sound and accepted gun making practice for well over 120 years that break-open sporting guns and rifles be regulated so the hammers are fully cocked before ejection takes place. This quite simply alleviates any possibility of closing a gun on a live round while the hammer is falling forward. Back in the late 1870's first pattern Needham/Greener "Self Acting" ejector systems were guilty of ejecting first and cocking after. Needless to say, the designs were rapidly altered to the "cock first" and eject after principle. Very wise!!!!

4. By virtue of geometry u/o guns have to be fully opened to permit the loading of the bottom barrel. Some guns, especially Beretta, Rizzini et al have an annoying habit of slightly self closing by a small degree making it difficult to load the bottom barrel. These days this is less noticed due to the fashionably long and heavy barrels keeping the action well opened. Gravity at its best. (Loose guns and those with short sear noses are common candidates of self-closing).

5. To return to the original Letter - why do guns misfire? A good question and one that has dogged gun and cartridge makers for generations. Not wanting to become embroiled in the myriad possibilities, one can narrow it down very simply these days. If a gun has been functioning perfectly for years and starts to give a random light strike, it would be sensible to change the main spring and check the striker for wear at both ends. For very little money problems are normally corrected. Springs, especially coil springs can suffer from power fade, so changing them every few years is a sound practice that can avoid any problems on competition days.

To return to Mr Loeffler's penultimate paragraph, there is nothing unusual for a misfire cartridge to successfully fire if re-inserted in the same barrel (or any other barrel), it just happens.

Seeking rule changes on slender anecdotal evidence would do a genuine shooter no service whatsoever. This matter is best left to spirited Clubhouse debate and nothing more.

Sir, the practice of prolonged shoot offs needs to be addressed. The present system where a shoot off can take anywhere from 100 to 600 targets is expensive in both club costs and time. At the Roma annual this year one shoot off lasted over 2 1/2 hours, before the remaining squad was shoved off to another trap to continue shooting. In the mean time, shooters just sat around for the 2 1/2 hours. Shooting is not really a spectator sport but rather a participant sport.

Today's guns with different chokes, back bored, adjustable stocks and various technical improvements can only mean more and longer shoot offs. Also specialised ammo and hi dome targets painted to contrast with the background and with closer angles will ensure future shoot offs will be longer still.

This is a major expense and someone has to pay for this AA or AAA group of prolonged shooting, so either clubs loose out or there are increased nomination fees and charges to pay for this minority to enjoy free shooting.

I suggest all shoot offs be shot single barrel irrespective of the event, right from the start. For the next 25 targets go back 3 metres and a further 2 metres for each additional 25 targets. Any shooter that can shoot 100 targets straight is a good shot, so we don't want a prolonged marathon on who is the best stayer, we want the best shot and this will sort them out.

I notice that all trench shoot offs are single barrel right from the start so why not D.T.L?

The prolonged shoot off does nothing to promote the sport it detracts from it. Travelling shooters don't travel hundreds of kilometres to just sit and watch others bang away at their expense of both money and in particular time.

SOUTHERN GUN CLUB

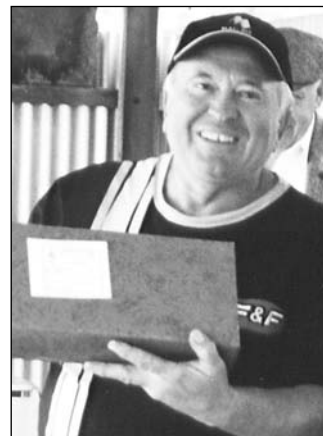

A note to all ISSF shooting clubs of Australia. If there are any big shoots coming up or there is something you would like me to write about from your club, please feel free to drop me an email. It's a big country we have here, and I don't always hear what is going on in Darwin, TAS, WA, SA or QLD...

When travelling overseas with a firearm, there are a few things that you need to complete prior to leaving. Australian Customs have made some new changes to exporting requirements and have implemented the new Integrated Cargo System, which means that everyone leaving with a firearm must now become a registered client in the Customs System. Registering is a one off thing, whereby you are issued with a unique registration number, but it would pay to make sure you do it well before you leave. Once that is done you need to do the following:

1. Import Permit (B709) - This form you get from your Firearms Registry. Complete it, send it in and they will mail out the permit to you. This form is very important, as it allows you to bring your

gun back into the country upon arrival home.

2. Restricted Goods Permit - This form is obtained from Customs

3. Export Declaration - This form too is also obtained from Customs.

These last 2 forms are completed once you have your flight details, and then physically taken to Australian Customs prior to your departure date. You will need to take a copy of your firearm registration, copy of shooter's licence & your passport. This may vary slightly between states. Then on your departure day, you again see Customs for a second time to verify the serial number on your gun matches your Export Documents.

KOREAN WORLD CUP

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

AUSTRALIAN TEAM SELECTION

I see Geoff Clarke asked a question about selection into the ISSF Australian team in the "Your Say" section. Geoff, I have just spent the last 3 years myself trying out for the Trap Team so I will give you and everyone else the "BASIC" version according to Dustin Clay:

1. You must compete at the ISSF National Titles, comprising of 3 events.
2. You must compete at the Australia Cup, comprising of 2 events.

After the 5 events, the top 3 qualifiers on points are selected to the team for that year.

Now there is a small point, in order to travel overseas for Australia, you MUST have shot an Australian travelling score at any of the 5 events. Depending on your level of experience, for example, Men's Trap it goes like this:

1. No previous Australian Representation 113 from 125
2. Less experienced Australian Rep (Oceania) 115 from 125
3. Experienced Australian Rep (World Cup, Olympics etc) 117 from 125

Currently even if you finish first on points, but failed to achieve a travelling score in 1 of the 5 events, you can't go overseas. Also, depending on the year, they may pick a bigger squad to develop other shooters, or form a "Development Squad" to give up & comers a chance for some experience.

I hope this gives you a general idea of how the selection works, but I suggest you first go the ASA Website for a list of their policies, and even contact Greg Chan the National Coach. He will better explain it for you.

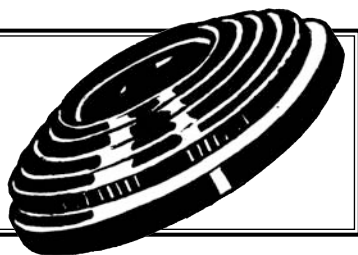

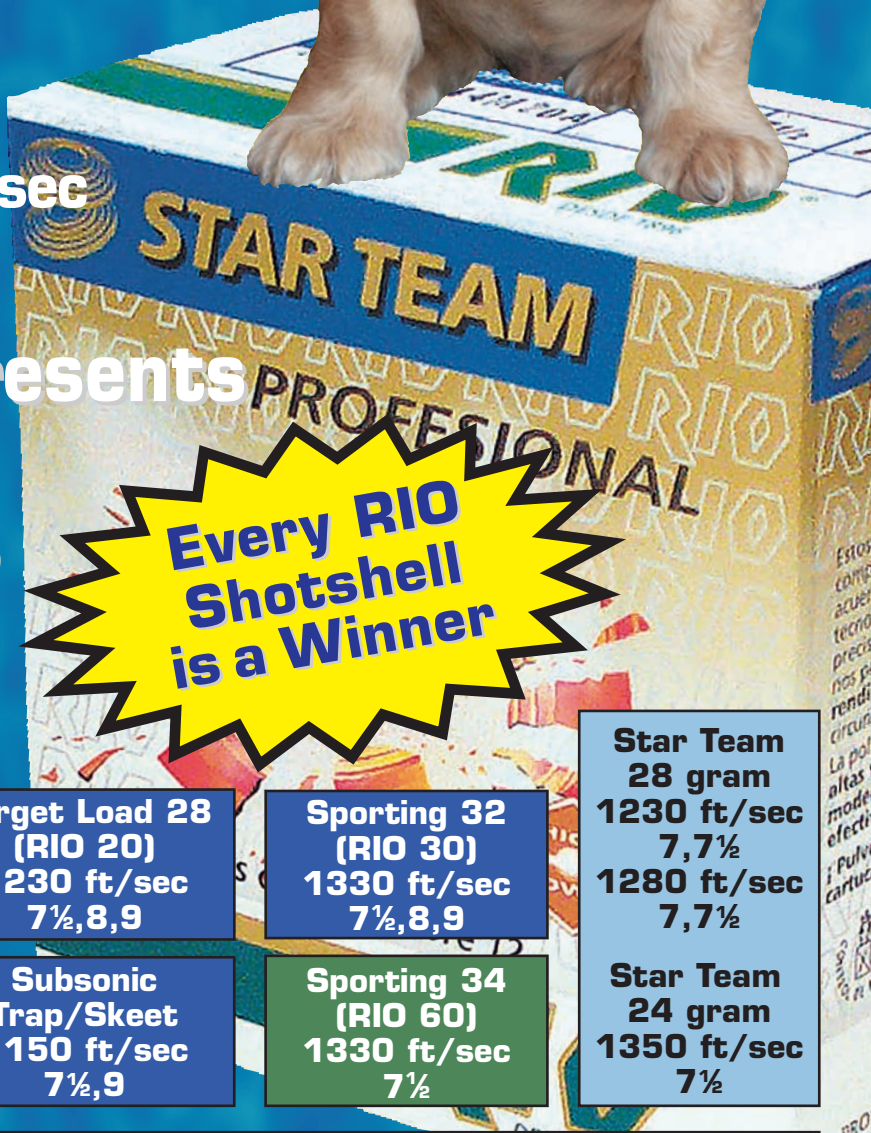
