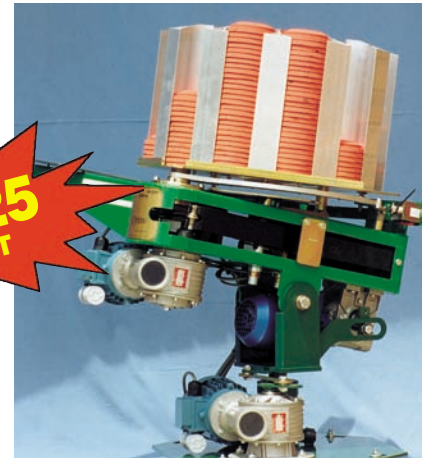

There were sunny skies and a perfect shooting background together with top class facilities and smiling faces, it was a great western zone venue for the QCTA's 2005 Trap Carnival. It should have been obvious on the Thursday afternoon prior to the shoot that this was going to be a good carnival - there were people everywhere on the grounds. To the host club (Roma Gun Club) congratulations on a job well done. You started catering for customers needs on the Thursday and went right through until "late" each day and competitors went home Monday afternoon with a smile on their faces, regardless of how they performed, they simply had a good time.

NATIONAL PRESIDENT'S NOTES

An Executive Meeting was held in June at our National Office where all Sates were in attendance. Some of the more important decisions taken were in regards to rules and in particular:

Rule 1.01(q) will now read "Hearing & eye protection is strongly recommended"

Rule 2.01(e) Grades shall be AA 97% & over. A 94% & under 97%. B 87% and under 94%. C under 87%.

Rule 2.01(m) A shooter must not shoot in a grade higher than his/her best performance. Once having attained a grade he/she cannot elect to remain in a higher grade than due for regrading.

Membership

Numbers for the month of June 2005 show a very pleasing trend. Our total registration is up by 600 and in particular Junior registrations are 205 higher than June 2004 with a total of 878 juniors being registered. A very pleasing result.

National Ground

The construction program is currently on time. All 15 shooting lanes and traps are now complete with a ring main water supply system next on the list. This system will enable the use of either Bore or Town water. I feel confident that the National Ground will be in first class condition for the 2006 World DTL Championships and National Championships.

World DTL Championships

Entries for this event continue to be received at our National Office. We currently have 445 entries and unfortunately we have had to commence a waiting list for this event. It is anticipated that when the invited countries have confirmed their attendance all spare spaces will be made available. Four countries so far have confirmed their attendance.

Junior Development Camp

The second camp for 2005 was held July 5th, 6th & 7th at the National Ground. 21 Juniors attended and all are showing great form. The third and final camp for 2005 will be conducted immediately prior to the NSW State Championship, dates to be confirmed are 27th, 28th & 29th September. Application for the 2006 Development Squad will be called for in the September and October CTSN's.

The Zone Shoulder to Shoulder Team events were contested on the first event of the carnival and the Open was won by the Northern Zone. The Western Zone won the Ladies, the Juniors by the South East Zone again and the Veterans was claimed by the Northern Zone.

A record two hundred and fifty competitors assembled to tussle for Event 2 the 50t State D/B Championship title held by Colin Witt in 2004. This year we saw the emergence of a new perpetual cup, the Ossie and Doug Smith Cup - actually, we didn't really see it until the "official unveiling" Saturday night,

but more about that later. As the dust settled late on Saturday afternoon 55 shooters were filling their pockets to commence the shoot-off. At the completion of shooting on Saturday there were almost four squads required at 7.30am on Sunday.

The second day dawned and a couple of hot contenders stumbled and fell by the wayside early, and the form shooters progressed. At 200 there was a squad of six, and conspicuous by his diminutive size in this group was 12 year old Andrew Clarke (one of the Green Team from Monto). What a great display of shooting and his presence created a spectacle for the crowd to ponder on. He may not have won overall but his personal best of 207/208 was something to behold. The eventual winner Brett Pile from Condamine was elated when he smashed his 289th target to claim the new cup for the first time over Robert Caban from Mackay.

Dubbo's 21st Anniversary Golden Fox Open

The Fox

Two perfect fine and mild days - some rain would have been more than welcome - provided ideal conditions for this year's annual Golden Fox. Shooters remarked how dry and bare the range is, no green grass, just dull red-brown earth under a clear sky.

Eighty-one competitors from the three eastern States faced five automatic traps which threw some of the best targets yet. Three new Canterbury and two old faithful Western white flyers combined a hopper capacity of 2000 high dome clays.

Ted Quick taking second with 25/27. Joe Galea (Cecil Park) won C Grade with 35/37 from Bob Glasson (Coonamble) on 34/37.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

COLOUR VISION AND ITS DISORDERS

A couple of months ago I mentioned that approximately 5% of males had red vision defect. Since then I have had several phone calls and have been approached at shoots by people wanting to know more about this issue. I also noticed in the July/August issue of the "Gunshot", the NZCTA Journal that shooters were concerned that a number of the competitors were just not seeing the orange targets. So I have done some research on this topic and readers may find the following of some interest.

Now, I'm not an optometrist and if anyone feels that they have a problem with their vision then I strongly suggest that they should see an appropriate professional. The following text was taken from the following website; <http://www.patient.co.uk/showdoc/40002001/>

The website explains colour vision defect thus:

There are three types of cones: red cones, blue cones and green cones. Each type of cone has a different range of light sensitivity and stimulation of the cones in different combinations enables the perception of colours, eg. the perception of yellow results from a combination of inputs from green and red cones, and relatively little input from blue cones. If all three cones are stimulated, white is perceived. Normally the cone population consists of 74% red cones, 10% green cones and 16% blue cones.

Colour blindness is the inability to distinguish certain colours. It occurs when one or more of the cone types are absent or present but defective and unable to send correct signals to the brain.

Types of colour vision defect:

Trichromatic: all three cone pigments are present and colour vision is normal.

Dichromatic: complete deficiencies in one cone pigment but the remaining two are normal. There are three types of dichromatism depending on which one of the three normal pigments is missing. Protanopes are the most common and lack red sensitive receptors. Deuteranopes lack green receptors and tritanopes (rare) lack blue sensitive receptors. Protanopes and deuteranopes cannot distinguish red from green light and tritanopes cannot distinguish blue from yellow.

Monochromatic: only one cone pigment. Relatively rare (incidence of about 1 in 30 000).

Achromatopic: no functioning cones. Can only see black, white and shades of grey.

Most cases of colour blindness are hereditary but are occasionally acquired as a result of eye disease. The commonest hereditary colour vision defect is X-linked failure of red-green discrimination (prevalence is 8% in males and 0.5% in females). Failure of blue-yellow is rare and is more commonly acquired.

Risk Factors: The gene for red-green colour blindness is X-linked recessive. This means that both parents must be carrying the genes.

Colours which look different to people with normal colour vision can look the same to people with defective colour vision, eg. grass may appear green with normal colour vision, but appear to be the same colour as orange for people with certain colour defective vision. There is also a marked reduction in the number of separate colours that can be distinguished in the spectrum.

No treatment can correct or prevent inherited colour vision deficiencies. Treatments that slow or reverse the course of an eye disease may also improve colour vision.

Disorders of colour vision cause difficulty at school and affect the choice of certain jobs and careers that require some degree of colour identification. The list of affected careers includes:

certain grades within the armed forces
civil aviation - pilots, engineers, technical and maintenance staff, air traffic controllers
customs and excise officers
railways - drivers, engineers and maintenance staff
fire service officers

hospital laboratory technicians and pharmacists
workers in paint, paper and textile manufacture, photography and fine art reproduction.

Whilst the above text gives a clinical and factual account of colour vision defect it is important to look at what can be done about it. Most shooters wear glasses and most shooting glasses; High Scorers, Randolph, Beretta and so on make their lenses in several colours to maximise the potential for the wearer to see the target and discriminate the colour from the background.

So what can shooters who believe that they have red vision defect do? Well, as stated above there is no cure so the way to deal with it is to lessen the impact if possible. Firstly, it is very simple to test for the defect but is knowing going to help? It may give some shooters the reason for their sometimes low scores. Probably the best option is to shoot at clubs that uses black targets or banded targets. The other option is to focus on the movement of the target rather than on seeing the colour. Movement is very easy for the human eye to pick up and the brain can use the movement to discriminate the form against the background rather than the colour. The final option, especially if the colour of the targets cannot be changed is to use glasses that help. Shooting glasses come in a range of different colours and some offer better discrimination of colours against backgrounds better than others. The advertising information that comes with the Randolph Range suggests that the vermilion offers some help for those with red vision defect.

The team all flew in to Sydney from their respective home towns and boarded a Qantas flight to Frankfurt via Singapore. A tight connection in Frankfurt had us running from the international terminal to the domestic to catch an Alitalia flight to Rome. With so many bad experiences travelling with firearms over the past few years we were very sceptical that our guns would arrive with us, but to our surprise they did – a positive start to the tour.

Our hotel was the Duca Deste, a well-appointed establishment that had most requirements covered. The only problem was that it is located in a semi industrial area and the lack of restaurants meant finding a decent meal outside of the hotel was difficult. This was in

Spring in Italy brought with it lots of pollen in the air and many of the team suffered with acute hay fever as well as signs of colds and flu. Legal drugs to combat the effects were at a premium as everyone tried to shake off the inevitable symptoms before they had to compete.

The veteran Italian Ennio Falco won the event and an Olympic quota with a tremendous 149, but all eyes were on the 16 year old wonder kid Vincent Hancock from the USA. He had already won the World Cup and Olympic quota in Korea a month earlier with a 149 and here he was again running one of the best skeet shooters the world has ever seen right down to the wire. With the World Championships the following week the anticipated showdown was the talk of the tournament. George and Clive shot consistently but would need to lift the scores to stay in touch with the top group.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2005 Australian Skeet Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2005 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2005 registered shooter record book before nominating.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for, Womens, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, excepting the National Skeet Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Womens, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section only. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Australia/New Zealand Skeet Postal team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors who, on November 13, 2005 will be over the age of 65 years.

Juniors - are those competitors who, on November 13, 2005 will be under the age of 18 years.

Sub Juniors - are those who, on November 13, 2005 will be under the age of 15 years.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 9.00am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

Dear Your Say,

In reply to the June Article by Michael Collins I must say I fully agree with all of his comments.

I have been to several club shoots where 25 target DB events have developed into marathon 400 target plus shoot offs, these not being finalised until after 9:00pm under lights. Only a few people stayed to watch the shoot offs.

Now it is not unusual for some DB shoot offs to reach up to 600 targets in some areas of the country in good weather conditions.

I believe these marathon DB shoot offs are more a test of endurance and physical fitness, rather than of shooting skill, and they are repetitive and boring for spectators and overly expensive for shooters because of the cartridges used, and for clubs because of the targets thrown.

When the so called "winners" finally collect their trophies, they soon realise they have lost money on the events due to the hundreds of cartridges they have fired.

I suggest the whole programming format of DB events needs to be changed at club level. My suggestion is for clubs to programme pointscore and single barrel as their main D.T.L. events, with an occasional DB event.

I write in response to Peter McDonald's letter in the August edition of the CTSN in order to correct the apparent misunderstanding that has arisen. Certainly some of what is said is correct, but much is not.

Due to the fact that the Victorian Clay Target Association receives no financial support from our State Government (unlike most other states and territories, some of which also charge levies) and the per capita rebate to the states has been halved and might possibly soon be abolished, the VCTA is experiencing a shortfall of funds. Future and existing programs such as the \$2000 per Zone Junior Coaching Grants cannot continue under the current financial situation.

I can assure you that none of the State membership fee will go to the elite shooters at the VCTA Trap Carnival. This Carnival has a formula of returning a certain percentage of event nominations to the winners and only funds generated by this Carnival are used. Any profit from this Carnival is used to administer and promote your sport for all registered Victorian shooters. Should anyone have any questions in regard to this matter could they please ring and talk to me before putting pen to paper. Below is a copy of the memo sent to all Victorian Club secretaries in June.

Notice To All Club Secretaries And Members

Due to the ACTA insurance premiums trebling, the ACTA per capita rebate to the states has been reduced, and might possibly be abolished. This will result in a shortfall of funds for future and existing programs.

From January first 2006, the VCTA is introducing a State Membership of ten dollars for all club members excluding Juniors and Intermediate Members. This fee will be collected by the Clubs at the same time as the ACTA annual registration and club membership. Each club will be invoiced by the State on January 1st each year, based on number of club members for the previous year. eg. January 1st 2006, State Membership fee will be based on 2005 club membership

A minimum State Membership fee of fifty dollars will apply.

Clubs will have until march 31st each year to pay their membership to the, State.

Dear Your Say,

With the first Six months of Club Competition now behind us, we are now seeing some of the results of the new Handicap Percentages implemented in January.

Clubs in the south west of Victoria, are now finding numbers in AA Grade very low. With the declining numbers it will be difficult for Clubs to maintain four grades of competition.

Weather conditions in Western Victoria can be very demanding on the best of competitors therefore to shoot or maintain the new percentages is very difficult. It also has been brought to my attention from fellow shooters, that they are no longer competing on a regular basis due to the fact that they are a solid middle range competitor in their grade, now shooting against bottom end shooters from higher grades which is taking their chances of an occasional trophy away.

With falling numbers and rising costs, we need to be very focused on the future of our Sport. Hopefully the right decisions will be made to promote this Great Sport of ours across all Australia.

- (q) "Hearing and eye protection is strongly recommended for all ACTA disciplines whilst present at the firing point or trap area."

Delete in full and replace with:-

- (b) Grades shall be: AA 93% and over; A 82% and under 93%; B 70% and under 82%; C under 70%.

RULE 2.01(e)

Delete in full and replace with:-

- (e) "Grades shall be: AA 97% and over; A 94% and under 97%; B 87% and under 94%; C under 87%."

RULE 2.01(i)

Delete - "...at a time."

RULE 2.01(m)

Delete in full and replace with:-

- (m) A shooter must not shoot in a grade higher than his best performance. Once having attained a grade he cannot elect to remain in a higher grade when due for regrading.

RULE 2.01

Add new paragraph (r) at end -

- (r) Upgrading of shooters is limited to one grade at a time.

RULE 2.03

Renumber sub-paragraph (b) to (c)

RULE 2.03(a)

Delete - "No shooter will reduce more than one (1) metre in any year. Any forward movement is optional."

RULE 2.03(a)

Delete - "may" and replace with "will"

RULE 2.03(b)

Add new paragraph (b) -

- (b) When downgrading occurs (e.g. A to B) a shooter's handicap will return to the minimum meterage for that grade, providing no earned meterage above the minimum has applied under the handicapping formula.

RULE 3.01(b)

Delete - "50 targets"

RULE 3.22(k)

Delete in full and replace with:-

- (k) At the completion of qualification in a Double Barrel event club management have the right to decide on the method for finalisation of the event.

RULE 3.24(b)

Delete in full and replace with:-

- (b) The High Gun for a shoot shall be over the advertised program comprising a minimum of two events. High gun shootoff procedures can be determined by club management.

RULE 3.28(a)i

Delete - "100 targets or 125 targets" and replace with "any number of targets"

RULE 3.28(a)ii

Delete - "125 targets" and replace with "any number of targets"

RULE 3.29(a)iv

Delete in full.

RULE 3.31(d)

Delete in full and replace with:-

- (d) Grades shall be: AA 93% and over; A 82% and under 93%; B 70% and under 82%; C under 70%.

It is with deep sadness that we announce the passing of .

Verlie was well known to many of the older members of the shooting world. Her involvement in our sport was well described in the eulogy given by her son Colin. In describing the late 1950's he conveyed the following:

"Around this time mum and dad also became heavily involved in the sport of clay target shooting. Dad as a competitor and mum as his number one supporter. Mum and dad were part of a small group of families who established the Hawkesbury Gun club at South Windsor. The Hawkesbury Club very soon established a reputation as a popular venue, with competitors travelling from around the state and interstate to attend the events that were held every second Saturday. Part of that reputation was due to the hospitality shown to all the visitors, especially by all of the women in the kitchen, who provide their sumptuous afternoon teas and refreshments. I'm sure that's what attracted people more than the competitions. We grew up as kids regularly tagging along with mum and dad at home events and other times visiting other clubs throughout the state and interstate. It became part of our life. Dad progressed rapidly to become one of the best and most revered shooters in the country, winning many Championships and representing Australia on many occasions. Mum was always there supporting him and as my brothers and I became old enough to compete, we too became part of that environment. Mum took so much pleasure from our achievements. But apart from the pleasure we all got from the competition and social contact, the main thing was that it provided an opportunity for us to do things together as a family. As they travelled, mum and dad built up a

network of friends and acquaintances all over Australia, New Zealand and the United States. These were enduring friendships and I know there wouldn't be a city or town in this country that mum and dad did not know someone through their association with the sport. During this time, Mum also became actively involved in the administration of the sport. She was the first secretary of the newly established NSW Clay Target Association, and was subsequently made a life member. She was also awarded Honorary Life Membership of the Melbourne Gun Club in recognition of her contribution to the sport."

Verlie is survived, and will be deeply missed, by her husband Ernie, three sons, a daughter and seven grandchildren.

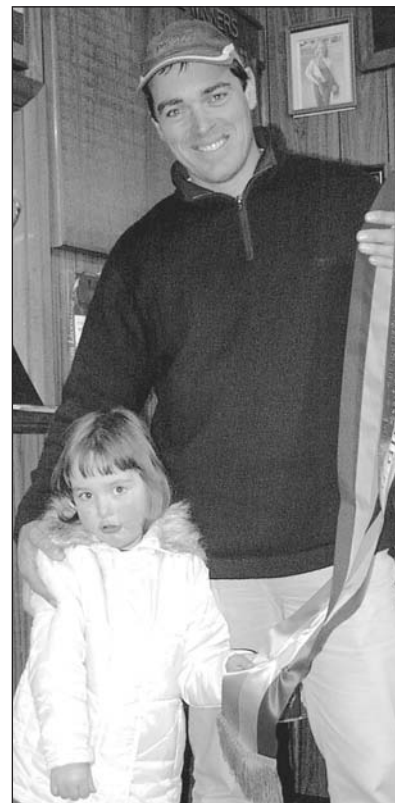
Shooting conditions were excellent, although cool, it was clear and sunny with very little wind, and scores were excellent as

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

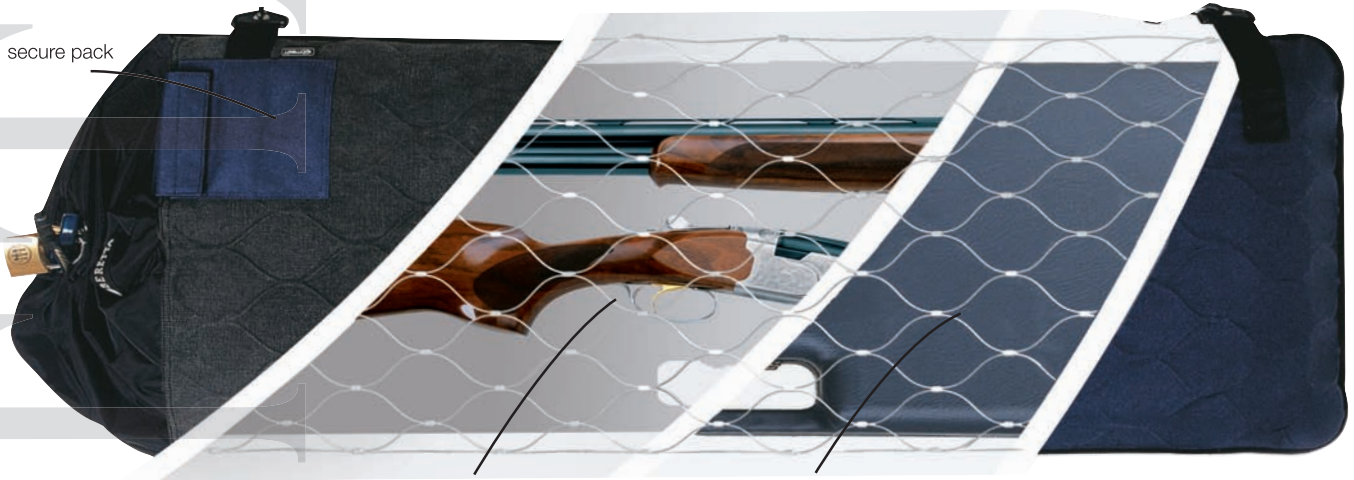
