

Gleniss brought the Junior team directly to Lonato whilst the seniors flew up from the Rome World Cup. Both groups had their dramas getting there. The Juniors missed their connection in Frankfurt and had to wait six hours for another, and as is the case these days two guns did not arrive leaving Gleniss and two Juniors to wait at the airport till 7:30pm for them to arrive on a later flight. They finally arrived at the hotel at 10:00pm, nearly 40 hours after leaving home.

The seniors only had a 45 minute flight, so how hard can that be I hear you say. When flying with Alitalia, damn hard. They charged us 30 Euro (\$55) for each gun to be put through security for the flight to Verona airport. Fair enough, security comes at a price. Then when we get to Verona, they stiff us for another 20 Euro (\$35) per gun to get them out of security only in Italy.

Our hotel was the Benaco in Desanzano a beautiful town on the shores of Lake del

Garda. We had previously stayed at the Benaco and whilst basic was clean and close to restaurants albeit a one kilometre walk down a steep hill to the centre of town. Walking down, no problems. Walking back up the hill on a full stomach, was another story.

Lonato is the centre of the shooting world as far as passion for the sport and facilities go. It has a great range made up of 7 trap fields and 5 skeet fields with 3 superimposed. It has as a backdrop made up of a 25m high mound at the 100m mark. The mound is covered with green shade cloth and with the grass between the bunker and the mound makes for one of the best backgrounds anywhere. The machines used are the Italian Serena's.

As the entries for this World Championships were also large the trap and skeet was to be contested over 3 days instead of 2. All events carried Olympic quotas for Beijing with them being awarded to the highest unquotered shooter (a shooter may only win one for any Olympics)

Ahmed Almaktoum the Athens Olympic gold medallist backed up with a tremendous performance to win the World Championship. His guns with the 60mm high ribs were certainly a talking point and after his win will probably have a bigger

interest than ever. The Aussies struggled with the quicker, flatter targets and never found their timing and rhythm.

The 16 year old American Vincent Hancock reversed the tables on Falco from the Rome World Cup the week before by just one target. This kid has just won in Korea, second in Rome and now won the Open World Championship, not a bad effort from three starts. He is certainly the talk of the shooting world at the moment. Both the Barton boys were in the mix after the first day but then faded out of contention. Whilst the new reverse double rule on station four has lowered the averages slightly, it hasn't taken the top shooters long to work it out.

Overall the team did not perform to their own high expectations but we cannot afford to procrastinate, as our focus must now turn to preparing for the Commonwealth Games in Melbourne in March 2006.

The Skeet event was completed on the



Firstly, remember much has been done recently to make D.T.L. targets much more shootable and this has in fact created the problem with which we are now faced. Therefore, why not remove the problem by reverting to the previous rules of widening the angles and throwing the target fifty metres? I would be most surprised if there was not a significant decrease in the number of possibles shot and a similar decrease in "long breaks". Long term, we may even produce better shooters.

Another couple of changes for consideration would be to shoot more Continental (possibly points score) and Handicap (meterage) events.

Don't forget that in order for clubs to have funds to buy targets for these extended shoot offs, someone has to pay, so as long as this trend continues so will the probability of increases in club fees or nominations.

As most of us consider ourselves as sportsmen and women and hopefully don't want something for nothing, then those participating in these lengthy shoot-offs would possibly be prepared to reimburse the club for the cost of targets used, if asked.





CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NSWCTA TRAP CARNIVAL

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the Carnival. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A fee of \$20 may be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

- 2. Squads of 5 or 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps.
- 3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
- 5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
- 6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- 8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 10. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 12. When team selection is involved, Veteran, Junior and Sub Junior men are eligible for selection in Mens, but can only compete in Mens team or Section team **not both**. Veteran, Junior and Sub Junior Women are eligible for selection in Womens, but can only compete in Womens team or Section team **not both**.
- 13. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals, trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 14. Nominations will close daily at 11.00 am. or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
- 15. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the NSWCTA Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 16. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 17. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors & Sub Juniors only.
- 18. Double Barrel Shoot off will be conducted as per rule 3.22 (k) Once the shoot off has reached 100 shoot off targets (double barrel), or at the conclusion of any 25tgt bracket after 100tgt, the management then have the option of changing to Pointscore.
- 19. All competitors must comply with Firearm Licensing Laws in their state of residence.
- 20. Club Teams Event 5 competitors affiliated through same club entry fees \$15 per team all monies returned to prize pool split if tied.
- 21. State Team Selection 15 men, 6ea Ladies Junior & Veteran Selected over events DB SB PS. Shoulder to shoulder team then selected from aggregate including DB SB PS & Team Score



Psychological Skills for Shooting

INNER EXCELLENCE

What are the characteristics for us developing inner excellence? Not all of us can be champions but we can all achieve inner excellence. According to Mack & Casstevens (2001) inner excellence is a way of thinking and a way of acting; it is a quality of mind, a mentality that says no matter how difficult things become, you are responsible and accountable for your thoughts, feelings and actions. They continue by saying that inner excellence is staying positive in negative situations, and it is dealing with adversity in an optimistic way. It is finding love and joy in what you do and remaining steadfastly committed to your goals, values, and dreams. People with inner excellence look at competition as a challenge and are motivated by the desire to succeed rather than by a fear of failure. They possess an unconditional high self-esteem and self-image. They have a 'can do' attitude and a will to prepare to win.

Inner excellence it seems are those qualities that we see portrayed in movies and in novels. Working harder, refusing to give up, not blaming the game, looking after the smallest detail and giving extra when it is needed. Whilst these qualities are important it is necessary to see that excellence goes beyond winning and losing.

So what are the qualities of inner excellence? Mack & Casstevens outline ten qualities that make up inner excellence.

The person who is a winner within has a dream. Dreams provide a focus from which we can develop goals and action. We need to imagine what we want and what we can do, this will form the basis of our vision. From this we need clear, realistic and achievable goals and an action plan to put them into action.

Commitment. Inner excellence involves being committed to your goals. This means making sure they are real, achievable, measurable and fun. The goals should also be motivating to keep you coming back to training and competition.

Responsibility. This quality means that you don't let what you can't do interfere with what they can do. This means thoughts, feelings and actions; it is important not to let your thoughts create negative feelings that will have an impact on your ability to achieve.

Openness to learning and growing. Inner excellence turns weakness into strength. Challenges need to be seen as opportunities to learn, grow and develop, and not as threats that will limit your performance and enjoyment.

Optimism. It is an essential element of inner excellence that you are optimistic. This doesn't mean that you try to look for some positive when you lose but means that you are able to see the opportunities in life and not the threats.

Self confidence. It is necessary to believe in yourself and your abilities. No one can outperform his or her self-image. Be aware of how you see yourself and remember that if you don't like it when others put you down, then don't put yourself down either. It is important to know that no-one can take away your self-esteem without your permission. Have the courage to grow up and fulfil your potential.

Emotional control. Those of you who are regular readers of these columns will have heard before that we need to let go of our own judgements. Perform at your level without judging it against some unrealistic, external measure.

The adversity quotient. Look at obstacles as opportunities and view setbacks as springboards for comebacks.

Have a backbone of character. Athletes with inner excellence practise good sportsmanship. Elite athletes see success without honour as an unseasoned meal it may taste good but it won't satisfy your appetite.

Be persistent and patient. Whatever you do; don't give up on your dream. Edison had over ten thousand attempts at making the light bulb before he succeeded. When asked if it was a waste of time, he replied, no and that he had learnt ten thousand ways how not to make the light bulb.

Inner excellence allows us the opportunity to perform at our best. It provides us with a vehicle that will give us permission to win.

It must be remembered that working on the inside (working towards inner excellence) shows on the outside (your performance). What lies ahead of us or behind us is of little importance compared to what lies within us.



Yamba Clay Target Club





Myself and the rest of the members of HMAS DARWIN had finished our second patrol in the Arabian Gulf and we were looking forward to some well earned R&R.

The ship had organised a number of tours to allow us to enjoy the city of Dubai in the United Arab Emirates. Believe it or not, one of these tours was a chance to experience clay target shooting. Each session was 25 trap, 25 skeet and 25 sporting with instruction if required. Obviously I have already experienced this sport, but

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

For clay target shooting we were pleased to have the company of teams from Chinese-Taipei, Papua New Guinea (which included 4 juniors) & Brunei (which included 5 women) compete against our local Australians. The 5 days of competition consisted of Day 1 & 2 125TGT ISSF Trap, Day 3 75 Pair Double Trap and Day 4 & 5 125TGT ISSF Skeet.

With fantastic, clear calm 28C conditions,

With only one target separating 1st, 2nd & 3rd in the juniors, the competition was tough right down to the final shot. Coming out victorious with the gold medal was local shooter Tom Hamilton, followed closely by Darren Short of PNG, with another PNG junior Angus Donald taking bronze.

The first squad of Day 3 for the double trap started with a few interruptions due to a trap hiccup, but after a quick set up of our second layout, we were back in action with minimal time loss. Once again our local boys Christos and Dwayne took an early lead, with Saiful Japar and Yakub Batong of Brunei not far behind. The Brunei women, once again, showed their expertise shooting some quality scores, while new PNG junior Israel Yama started shakily but found his feet and finished Tagal of Brunei with team mate Kamis Juing and Australian John Doyle equal second while Dwayne Devanney and Richard Schmidt were not too far behind.

Day 5 saw the wind pick up in the morning and with the targets dancing around more than normal the first round saw everyone's scores drop a little. By the second round the scores were getting back to normal and the top six shooters to qualify for the final were: Razali Tagal (Brunei), Kamis Juing (Brunei), John Doyle (Aus), Dwayne Devanney (Aus), Richard Schmidt (Aus) and Peter Reeve (Aus).With the top four shooters in the final shooting the same score the medal positions didn't change with the gold going to Razali Tagal of (Brunei), Kamis Juing (Brunei) winning the silver and local skeet legend John Doyle winning Bronze.

The official medal presentations were held at

the central hub of the Arafura Games, with prominent Government VIPs presenting the athletes with their medals whilst the national anthems played in the background. competition began under the watchful eye of A grade Judge and Tournament Director Elaine Forward. Consistent scores from Dwayne Devanney, Christos Despotis and Vincent Mollica saw the Australians take a healthy lead on day one from Yao-fu Tsai of Taipei, and Rizal Salleh and Mohammed Hanafi of Brunei. In the junior section Angus Donald of PNG had a one target lead with local junior Tom Hamilton and Darren Short of PNG hot on his heels. Leading after each of their 3 rounds in the women section, Brunei shooter Norsah went into the final ahead of fellow team mates None & Aishah with a 7 target lead. None fought back in the final to within 2 targets, but Norsah held on to win the gold, with None silver and Aishah winning the bronze. It was Aishah's first attempt at ISSF Trap and shot a well deserving score.

Day 2 started with perfect conditions once again, and all shooters got down to business for the final 50 targets. With similar scores posted as the previous day, the final six were, Vincent Mollica (Aus), Christos Despotis (Aus), Dwayne Devanney (Aus), Yao-fu Tsai (Taipei), Rizal Salleh (Brunei) and Mohammed Hanafi (Brunei). After the single barrel final, which saw some good and bad scores, the gold medal went to Vincent Mollica (Aus), with silver to Christos Despotis (Aus) and strongly. The ladies final was once again a three way Brunei affair with Norsah (gold) too strong for None (silver) and Zella (bronze).

Going into the double trap final, Christos held a 14 target lead over the fellow finalists of Dwayne Devanney (Aus), Saiful Japar (Brunei), Yakub Batong (Brunei), John Williams (Aus) and Chi-Hsing Wu (Taipei). Dwayne Devanney shot the best score in the final, but it wasn't enough and he fell short of the target to take silver while Christos Despotis held onto his lead for gold, with a close struggle for 3rd from the two Brunei shooters with Saiful Japar winning bronze.

Day 4 saw four squads take to the walks for the first 75 of 125 targets ISSF Skeet. Brunei shooters Razali Tagal and Kamis Juing took an early lead from Australians John Doyle and Dwayne Devanney. First time Skeet shooters James Fallon, Steve Patrick and Israel Yama of Papua New Guinea, found the going a little tough early on but got back on the tracks and posted some good scores. Women shooter Aishah of Brunei finally got her chance to shoot her discipline and took no time at all to take a convincing lead over fellow team mate Zella. In their final both women shot the same score therefore giving Aishah the gold and Zella the silver.
