

RULE CLARIFICATION

Several shooters have contacted the ACTA in regards to changes to rule 2.01(m) which as of the 1 January 2006 will state:

A shooter must not shoot in a grade higher than his best performance. Once having attained a grade he cannot elect to remain in a higher grade when due for regrading.

This has caused some confusion when read in conjunction with rule 2.01(i) as this rule states:

A shooter must shoot a minimum of three (3) consecutive groups of 200 targets, ie 600 targets, at a lower grade percentage to be down graded. He can only be downgraded one grade. All scores after the last grading must be carried forward onto a new record card. Once attaining A grade a shooter cannot be regraded to C grade and once attaining AA grade a shooter cannot be regraded to B grade. Other that in the authority vested in Rule 2.4(q).

Shooters are advised that Rule 2.01(i) takes precedence over Rule 2.01(m) and accordingly any shooter that has achieved A grade cannot be graded to C grade and any shooter that has achieved AA grade cannot be graded to B grade.

Shooters that feel they are over-handicapped should make contact with their Club Management, Rules Supervisor, State or Zone Handicappers or a member of the ACTA Executive Committee to have their grade re-assessed.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

FOCUSING ON THE RIGHT THING AT THE RIGHT TIME

At a shoot recently, a lapse of concentration cost me a target, the event and the High Gun. On the way home I thought how can concentration vary so much throughout an event or during an afternoon. So I decided to go back to the books and examine how concentration works. The following has been taken from a paper written by Jeffrey Bond, Sport Psychologist with the Australian Institute of Sport (Sport Psychology Department). The paper is called CONCENTRATION; Focusing on the Right Thing at the Right Time.

Bond states that concentration is a term often used by coaches and athletes but appears to be little understood. Bond continues by explaining that Nideffer (a renowned US Sports Psychologist) has developed an applied theory of concentration, which should be considered by all athletes and coaches. To understand this theory it is necessary to realise that for each of us an optimal level of arousal will coincide with efficient use of attentional capacities; this is referred to as our ideal performing state (IPS). At this IPS, we efficiently match the attentional demands of the situation with use of appropriate type of concentration. When we are not at our ideal performing state it is because the types of attentional focus becomes inefficient and mismatched with the situational demands. Nideffer believes that we all have an individual concentration style, which means that we have characteristic ways of using our attentional capabilities. Nideffer describes concentration as being either broad or narrow. An analogy here is like a torch with a variable beam: broad type of concentration is when the beam is broad and wide and narrow type, is when the beam is focused on a small point. Bond continues by saying that Nideffer also sees influences on concentration as either external or internal. We can now measure our concentration style in each of these types of concentration:

- 1. *Broad -External*: awareness of everything that is going on around seeing, hearing, feeling. Necessary for good court/field vision. Probably more critical in team sports than individual
- 2. *Narrow External:* ability to concentrate in a focused way, to focus on the one thing, to narrow onto the relevant aspects of a task. Very useful in target skills and as a way of blocking distractions.
- 3. *Broad Internal*: need to analyse, organise and plan. The ability to mix it with what is going on and draw some logical conclusions. Being able to deal with a large number of ideas at the one time.
- 4. Narrow Internal: ability to focus on a single thought or idea and stay with it. Needed to enhance awareness of aspects of body reactions to stress (tight muscles, too high heart rate, etc) Usually indicates extreme dedication and capacity to follow instructions, to stick to a performance plan.

The above concentration styles sound great if things are working well and we are able to maintain the efficient focus of attention. But when we make mistakes our concentration style look like this:

- 1. Broad -External: these individuals are too busy reading and reacting to the environment to think.
- 2. Narrow External: too narrow field of vision or hearing. The athlete does not see all the things necessary to make a good performance, or narrows onto the wrong thing and persists with this approach (wearing blinkers).
- 3. *Broad Internal:* mistakes occur because the athlete becomes caught inside his head at a time when his focus of attention should be elsewhere. These athletes over analyse and out think themselves.
- 4. *Narrow Internal:* locking onto this focus may result in the athlete becoming distracted by internal bodily processes, or locked into an approach or thought that they may become inflexible. This mistake is choking.

As well as these errors that occur because the athlete has either mismatched his concentration focus with the demands of the situation, or is unable to produce the correct focus, other sorts of errors occur because the athlete becomes overloaded or confused. Internal overloads occur when there is just too much going on in the head of the athlete. Too many coaching points, too many negative comments, etc. Internal overload takes our focus away from the target and positions it back in our head. Unfortunately the target isn't in our head; it's in the air, flying quickly away. External overload is where there is too much noise (from the coach, crowd, team mates, opposition, etc.), or too much movement around (from competitors, spectators, etc), or just too many complex things to watch and /or listen to. How do we deal with these overloads: have a good and clear performance plan. The plan can help refocus your attention back to where it needs to be.

So how can we train our concentration to improve our weak areas? Athletes need to develop self regulation skills: arousal control skills, attention control training, thought control techniques and performance planning. These skills need to be developed and practised out of competition so they can be easily used during competition. Internal overload can be assisted by doing those simple things that can refocus the shooter. Focusing on your breathing, thought stopping, humming and specific awareness focus can all be used to bring the shooters attention back to the here and now. For external overload shooters may need to be able to visualise a different scenario, used guided imagery, hypnosis, etc to assist them to ignore or at least see little relevance in the external factors involved.

So whilst it is easy to say: "I just wasn't concentrating", the solution is not so easy. Use the above to work out what your concentration style might be and determine whether it is the internal or external factors that affect you the most. Remember that these factors can change from day to day, club to club or even event to event.





The club appreciated this gesture, as we all know the costs to small clubs of long shoot offs.

We then moved onto the Fishing and Outdoor World sponsored 25 Single Barrel. F&OW had donated the very desirable trophies of Shimano fishing reels for all grades. Gunsmith Tim Robertson who not so long ago arrived in Darwin was the only shooter to shoot the possible so took out overall and AA unchallenged. 

Your Say,

As a ex-pistol shooter where every score counted and you could never go back in grades I'm amazed at how DTL shooters tell me how they drop clays to stay in their grade, or are trying to drop a few to go back a grade, or tell me to drop a few clays because I'm going up through the grades too quick, I now realize this is accepted as part of DTL shooting. Why do they do it? Because they can, because the rules SUCK!

The changes to the handicap percentages that are to apply from Jan 06 will achieve absolutely NOTHING, as we have seen, changing percentages up or down only moves everyone up or down a grade. The other factor is this ridiculous rule of not counting ALL scores (S/B, D/B, P/S & Cont) against your 200 thus making it easy for some shooters to stay in their grades for eternity. If I wanted to stay in a particular grade e.g. "B"grade, I only have to shoot D/B and P/S and there would be no other higher score in column 2 to swap with the lowest in column 1, this would allow me to become a professional "B" grader.

The only other option would be to use the Lewis system, no grades, therefore no cheating, whoops sorry, that word is a no, no isn't it "professional"

The other factor is that by dropping the distance thrown from 50m to 46m and 45deg to 22deg either side of centre, the ACTA has made DTL too easy to shoot, which in turn has bought in these high shoot offs that members are complaining about. Maybe the ACTA should look at going back to 50m which will only speed up the clays slightly and change to 33deg either side of center. You can't have a situation where you are making the event too easy and then only counting half of the disciplines shot towards your grading, regardless of whether you shoot D/B Cont S/B or P/S, 25 clays is 25 clays and should count as such.

Well I'm off to drop a few clays and play the game to stay in MY grade and become a professional until the ACTA come up with decent rules.

FIREARMS REGULATIONS IN NSW LICENCE CHECKS

Due to new conditions of the NSW Firearms (General) Regulations 1997, all entrants in ACTA run competitions held in NSW MUST present their shooters licence to be able to participate. If the entrant does NOT present their shooters licence, they CANNOT participate. This regulation applies to ALL persons shooting or in the possession of a firearm at a NSW range or on club premises.

In addition to participants producing their shooters licence for inspection, the licence must satisfy clay target shooting as a genuine reason, known as Target Shooting. For example, if your licence states Primary Production or Recreational Hunting only, you cannot participate in clay target shooting events.

Officials will only allow participation in events run by the ACTA on the production of a valid shooters licence.

ACTA highly recommends all shooters carry their shooters licence at all times when carrying or using firearms.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

THE SPORT OF CLAY TARGET SHOOTING

The following is an excerpt from The ACTA History and Records 1936 - 1992 Written by George Biggs

This book is available from the ACTA free of charge (except for postage and handling).

THE BEGINNING

Australia's history of trapshooting involvement goes back somewhere in the 1890's. We have evidence of gun clubs operating in New South Wales, Tasmania, and Victoria as early as 1867 they were of course live bird shooting clubs.

It was a follow on from the sport of shooting in England where live pigeon shooting first became fashionable in England and on the Continent around 1850 and even earlier. We have reports that as far back as 1810 live pigeon shooting was gaining favour in some parts of the Continent.


W.W. Greener in his book "The Gun and its Development", published in England in 1900, briefly traces the origin of trap shooting. He writes that the origin can be traced back to the ancient pastime of Popinjay shooting, a game practiced by the ancient Greeks and the expert bowmen of medieval times. The Popinjay was a stuffed parrot or fowl placed upon the top of a pole, and used as a target. In some instances a live bird was used, a certain amount of liberty being give to it by a length of cord to secure it to the pole. The Toxophilite Society during the last century held frequent meetings for Popinjay shooting. The last recorded took place near Highgate in September 1792.

TRAP LAYOUT FIELDS




The drawing shows a comparative example of vertical target angles, illustrating differences between international trap and American trap.

About the year 1856 live pigeon shooting was patronised by Lord Huntingfield, the Earl of Stamford and other noblemen and suddenly became fashionable. Since that time clubs were formed and grounds were reserved for this sport wherever the Anglo-Saxon race are found. The first fashionable resort for pigeon shooting near London was the 'Old Hats', a public house on the Uxbridge Road; it obtained its name from the pigeons used for shooting being placed in holes, covered with old hats which were the primitive pigeon traps used.

About the year 1879 a new type of trap shooting came into being; it was to be known as Glass Ball Shooting. Ira Payne and Captain Bogardas made this type of shooting fashionable in America. In England catapults were used to spring the balls, but in America spring traps were invented; these traps could be set to throw balls in any direction and at any height. At first the balls were of coloured glass, and filled with feathers so that there could be no dispute when they were broken. A special set of rules was drawn up covering the competition of glass ball shooting.

Australia's first registered clay target club, the Nobel Clay Bird Club, first came into being through the efforts of a small band of enthusiastic clay target shooters who in 1926 decided that they would prefer to shoot clay birds rather than live birds. So after seven months of fun shooting in a quarry at the back of I.C.I., a factory in West Footscray, a Melbourne suburb, it was decided that a club should be formed.

In the years between 1927 and 1936 numerous clay bird clubs were formed. They were affiliated with what was known as the Gun Clubs Association of Victoria. This was a live bird shooting body with headquarters at the original Melbourne Gun Club at Tottenham.


Although our early days of clay target shooting were centred in Melbourne in the 1920's, it was not long after that other parts of Australia followed on. Queensland was quick to join in with Townsville in 1920, St. George in 1937 and Cunnamulla 1938.

1936 was the year when Australia really began to shoot clay targets in an organised manner. Up to this time the Live Bird Association controlled clay target shooting and for obvious reasons it was apparent that we had to control our own type of trap shooting. At this time an association was formed to control the sport, it was known as the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association (ACPTSA), formed in 1936.


The outbreak of World War II in September 1939 brought to a halt the growth of clay target shooting in Australia. However, four or five clubs did hang on and managed to shoot at intervals throughout the most part of the war whenever it became possible to obtain targets or shells, which was not often.

Clay targets and cartridges continued to be a big problem for several years after the war. It was getting on to 1950 before I.C.I. were able to produce the Australian made target and ammunition. Prior to this clays came from England, and our shells, mostly Winchester and Remington came from the U.S.A.

The Melbourne Olympic Games in 1956 was an excellent boost to Australian clay target shooting. We fielded a two-man team in



International trench shooting for the first time in our history. Standard trap and skeet were still the most popular disciplines of shooting, and by this time there were approximately 280 clubs affiliated with the ACPTSA.



Later in 1973 when the Melbourne Gun Club staged the World Moving Target Championships did the Australian shooter gain the opportunity to become International. It then became apparent that International Trap and Skeet Shooting was here to stay.

The Disciplines

Trap shooting is a sport where a shotgun is used to shoot inanimate targets. A clay target is made of limestone and pitch it is shaped like an inverted saucer about 10cm in diameter and 2.5cm in height. It is brittle enough to be broken by pellets from the cartridge fired upon it.

A machine known as a trap, hence the name 'trap shooting' throws the target. This trap causes the target to rotate as it skims through the air in a horizontal position. It travels to a distance of a minimum of 45 metres,

maximum 55 metres. It leaves the trap, velocity wise, about 80 kilometres per hour. A 12 gauge shotgun fires a shell containing 28 grams of shot which spreads out as it travels towards the target. The target is usually hit when it has travelled around 30-35 metres from the gun, depending on how quick the shooter is.

Most targets are shot at from 15 metres behind the trap house, the main exception 'handicap' shooting where shooters are handicapped by metreage marks ranging from the 11 metre mark to a maximum of 25 metres. The shooters proceed through five lanes (tracks) behind the traphouse when in competition.


Skeet shooting originated in America in 1920. Its name is derived from the English spelling of the Scandinavian word for shoot. In the very beginning it was designed to provide a kind of substitute for live bird and game shooting, however it went much further than that to become a popular clay target shooting game.

A round of standard skeet consists of 25 targets. The targets fly the same direction path. The field layout consists of a high house, a low house and eight shooting stations. At each station the shooter fires a target from the high house then one from the low house. Doubles are then shot from stations 1 2 6 & 7. This takes up 24 cartridges. The 24th shot is a repeat of his first miss, in the event the shooter breaks all his first 24 targets he then shoot his 25th from station 8 low. Only one shot at each target may be fired.

International Disciplines

Known also, as the Olympic Disciplines of Trap (Trench) and Skeet (ISU) are competitions of 125 targets plus a 25 target final for the top six placegetters. The maximum shot load for both is 24 grams with a maximum pellet diameter of 2.5mm.

International Skeet uses the same field layout as Standard Skeet, with a different procedure of shooting from stations. The low gun position is used until the target appears this means that the gun holding position, prior to calling for the target, has the stock of the gun touching one's hip below the elbow. A variable target release system is used and the target is thrown up to 66 metres as against 50 metres for standard skeet. A three-second time delay, or part of, on the target release after the shooters call is another hazard for the shooter to contend with.



International Trap shooting has the trap house roof on the same level as the shooting stations and contains fixed type trap machines. The traps are fixed in groups of three in front of each shooting station. The centre trap of each group is adjusted to throw targets within an area 15^∞ right or left of its centre line. The left trap throws within an area straight forward to 45^∞ to the right and the right trap throws within an area opposite that of the left trap.

Elevations are individually adjusted so that at 10 metres from the trap the target has a minimum elevation of 102cm above the trap house roof to a maximum of 4 metres. Shooting stations are laid out on a straight line six metres to the rear of the centres of the machines. The release of targets is controlled by an electronic sensor so the shooter does not know which of the three traps immediately in front of him will release the target. Two shots may be fired at each target to score.

South West Zone/VCTA School Student Championship

Amid screaming winter sunshine 237 students representing twenty three Schools/Colleges within the Zone competed at Noorat Clay Target Club in Western Victoria with two competitors achieving the possible 20/20.

The number of competitors was encouraging to the clay target sports and to the future.




After presentations a delicious Webber tea and sweets concluded the day.
