



## **Psychological Skills for Shooting**

## WITH WINNING IN MIND

I would like to claim credit for the title of this article, but I can't. It is actually the title of a book by Lanny Basham, President of an international consulting firm on Mental Management and former World champion and Olympic Gold medallist shooter. At the recent NSWCTA trap carnival I was shown some of the latest material on mental skills available by Ray Mack of Earmold Australia. Ray kindly gave me a copy of With Winning in Mind to review.

I now have a substantial library of sport psychology texts and it is hard to pick up a new one and think that there will be some new material that will hold my attention or make me think of things differently. But this book does. It's not all new and it's not all rocket science but it is written with an easy to read style and mixes anecdotes with theory to make the process real for the reader.

The book is written in four sections: Firstly; What is Mental Management? In this section Basham explores Performance. Secondly: Building the Conscious Cycle, next; Building the Subconscious Cycle, and finally: Building the Self-Image Cycle.

Looking at the first section of the book, Basham introduces the reader to what his mental management system is and why he believes that it is important. He believes that the basic tenet of Mental Management is " the process of maximising the probability of having consistent mental performance, under pressure, on demand". Basham provides a series of anecdotes from his own sporting career and recalls that when he won the Olympics the actual performance seemed easy because he was able to balance three mental components: the Conscious mind, the Subconscious mind and the Self-image. The process of developing a mental management system focuses on integrating these components, developing each to its full potential and keeping a careful balance between them.

Basham gives a very good definition of what he means by each component: The conscious mind is the source of your thoughts and mental pictures. It controls all of the senses: seeing, hearing, smelling, tasting and touching. When you think about something or picture it, it is the conscious mind that holds the images in your mind. The Subconscious mind is the source of your skills and power to perform. Most things we do we do subconsciously, we develop them through repetition, learning and the tasks become automatic. It also houses all your past experiences, good and bad. Finally, the selfimage makes you act like you. This is the total of all your habits and

#### A Joint Statement by the Brisbane Gun Club and Tania Burke

As most ACTA members would be aware there has been a dispute between the Brisbane Gun Club and Tania Burke.

The parties regret that the matter has proceeded this far but are happy to advise that the matter has been amicably resolved. The Brisbane Gun Club welcomes Tania back to the Club. your beliefs and attitudes. In here, which is still part of the subconscious, there are also the judgements, good and bad our present and past experiences. When trying to explain the difference between the conscious and subconscious you need to picture a glass of beer. A good beer has a frothy head that's about half an inch and the rest is the beer. If we imagine the froth as our conscious mind and the beer as our subconscious mind then we will begin to see why the subconscious is so powerful. It is much bigger and holds greater influence over our decision making because it is where our beliefs, attitudes and judgements are stored.

Basham believes that there are ten principles of mental management that work for all people all the time and are applicable for sport performance, business success and personal development. The Principles of Mental Management are listed below:

- 1. Your mind can only concentrate on one thing at a time. If you are picturing something positive in your mind, it is impossible, at the same time, to picture something negative. And if you have a negative thought, you cannot, at the same time, think positively.
- 2. What you say is not important. What you cause yourself or others to picture is crucial.
- 3. The subconscious mind is the source of all mental power.
- 4. The subconscious mind moves you to do whatever the conscious mind is picturing.
- 5. Self-image and performance are always equal. To change your performance you must first change your self-image.
- 6. You can replace the self-image you have with the self-image you want, thereby permanently changing performance.
- 7. When the Conscious, Subconscious, and self-image are all balanced and working together, good performance is easy.
- 8. The principle of Reinforcement. The more we think about, talk about, and write about something happening, we improve the probability of that thing happening.
- 9. The Self-image cannot tell the difference between what actually happens and what is vividly imagined.
- 10. We value things in direct proportion to the price we pay for them.

What I found interesting in reading With Winning in Mind is that most of these principles have been explored or dealt with in some way in previous articles that have appeared in the CTSN. As I stated earlier, most of what is in his book is not new but he does incorporate the basics of sports psychology and puts them in an easy to read and easy to apply format. This is a relatively good resource and can form the basis of an individual mental management program if some of the athletes' underlying beliefs, attitudes and thoughts are understood first.

Next month I will continue and complete the review of this book. In the mean time, and without making this sound too much like an advertisement, the book and the other Mental Management System resources: DVD's, and CD's are available through Earmold Australia. I am often asked about articles from previous editions, so I have put together all the articles that I have written for the CTSN,(and some that have not yet been submitted) on CD. Shooters are reminded that the National Executive at its June meeting approved the following rule changes effective 1 January 2006:

Delete in full and replace with:-(b) Grades shall be: AA 93% and over; A 82% and under 93%; B 70% and under 82%; C under 70%.

#### RULE 2.01(e)

Delete in full and replace with:-(e) "Grades shall be: AA 97% and over; A 94% and under 97%; B 87% and under 94%; C under 87%."

RULE 2.01(i) Delete "...at a time."

#### RULE 2.01(m)

Delete in full and replace with:-

(m) A shooter must not shoot in a grade higher than his best performance. Once having attained a grade he cannot elect to remain in a higher grade when due for regrading.

#### RULE 2.01

Add new paragraph (r) at end -(r) Upgrading of shooters is limited to one grade at a time.

#### RULE 2.03

Renumber sub-paragraph (b) to (c)

#### RULE 2.03(a)

Delete " No shooter will reduce more than one (1) metre in any year. Any forward movement is optional."

RULE 2.03(a) Delete "may" and replace with "will"

#### RULE 2.03(b)

#### Add new paragraph (b) -

(b) When downgrading occurs (e.g. A to B) a shooter's handicap will return to the minimum meterage for that grade, providing no earned meterage above the minimum has applied under the handicapping formula.

RULE 3.01(b) Delete "50 targets"

#### RULE 3.22(k)

Delete in full and replace with:-

(k) At the completion of qualification in a Double Barrel event club management have the right to decide on the method for finalisation of the event.

#### RULE 3.24(b)

Delete in full and replace with:-

(b) The High Gun for a shoot shall be over the advertised program comprising a minimum of two events. High gun shootoff procedures can be determined by club management.

#### RULE 3.28(a)i

Delete "100 targets or 125 targets" and replace with "any number of targets"

RULE 3.28(a)ii

Delete "125 targets" and replace with "any number of targets"

RULE 3.29(a)iv Delete in full.

#### RULE 3.31(d)

Delete in full and replace with:-(d) Grades shall be: AA 93% and over; A 82% and under 93%; B 70% and under 82%; C under 70%.

I have been asked to correspond with you to consider an idea or two for D/B events and long shoot-offs.

Firstly, I agree in part with Merve McNight Oct issue, where shooting 200-300 at small clubs is ludicrous to win a 25 tgt event. It's a waste of time and money all round and let's face it, it becomes more of a marathon than proof of best shooter winning.

To reduce the long shoot-offs committee option to revert to P/S after 100, is not popular. In some circles, as they say it is D/B not P/S which I think most shooters would agree with, however, the cost is always borne by the Club. If we wish to retain our unique competition of D/B shooting it is time for serious compromise. We could widen the angles to what they were and increase the distance, like it was??

OR shoot all D/B off 18 metres which has been suggested, OR my humble idea, if you want to shoot large breaks shooter pays for their targets in shoot-off, eg, shoot 50 pay \$7.50. I suggest this idea as long shoot-offs are a financial nightmare for all clubs large or small. We have all seen shooters in long shoot-offs have to buy more or borrow shells to continue, so why not pay for targets??

Just because it has been like that does not mean it can not change. LIKE THEY SAY, USER PAYS, clubs would be able to provide better prizes and facilities if we help.

#### Dear Your Say,

I would just like to quickly comment on two things, the first thing being the Double Barrel debate. I believe that going to Pointscore is not the way to go in all situations. I agree that the smaller country clubs may use pointscore to cut the time and cost of double barrel shoot offs at a club shoot which may only have a few shooters in hand, but at National, State, and Zone level it is not right.

Double Barrel is not a precision shooting event like pointscore and single barrel, it's an endurance event which requires lengthy bouts of concentration, fitness and stamina. Going to points after a hundred shoot off targets changes completely what double barrel is all about.

Lets look at it from another angle. Its Ok for those who have been in the sport for years and had ample opportunity to shoot a decent break but what about the guys coming into the sport now. There are a lot of new people coming into the sport who want to have the opportunity to shoot a two, three even six hundred but can't do it because of the fact that other people are whinging that it takes too long, or it costs extra money in targets. The problem is particularly bad in DTL, as the angle of the porting seem to match the angle of the lanes and leaves us with no where to go. For me the pressure wave blast can be felt through my face and on my chest and I can actually feel the buffeting on my ear muffs. The problem is less pronounced in Skeet as the shooter can move away and out of the range of the pressure wave blast.

In this litigious society we now live in, it is only a matter of time befor the Lawyers become involved and the ACTA finds itself defending theindefensible.

There is a solution to this in the short term, and that is where possible Clubs squad the users of there offensive devices together, that way they can all beat each other up with their noise and blast waves without causing discomfort to the wider membership. As most clubs I now visit use nomination form to collect shooter information it should be no trouble to add an addition box (PORTED GUN Yes/No), Club officials can then, to the best of their ability, squad these shooters together. The long term solution is to ban there devices altogether.

#### Dear Your Say

Gary Jenkins letter in the November 2005 CTSN highlights the frustration that many of our members share, that our current grading and percentage rules provide a means and a temptation for many to manipulate the system.

Debate is certainly intensifying with regard to the grading system of our sport and the ease in which shooters can remain a grade of their choice.

Clay target shooters are by and large conservative in nature and resist change, however I believe this is one area of common unrest and one area unitedly we seek the ACTA to address.

After much consultation with many of my peers in the sport, I believe the current grading and percentage rules for all disciplines, except sporting, administered by the ACTA, should be repealed and replaced with a running percentage system.

Under this proposal, each shooter would have a current percentage rather than a grade, which is adjusted under current rule arrangements.

For example, Shooter A is 97.5%, shooter B 92.1% Shooter C 86.9% and so on.

At Club level, given the number of competitors, the Club Management would decide on the number of divisions to be contested. For example, 15 shooters nominate, Management decides to split the field into 3 divisions, endeavouring to have even numbers in each division. Division 1 would have 5 shooters, and depending upon their current percentage, this may be from 98.3% to 96.5%. Division 2, the next 5 shooters, which may be 96.4% to 91.7%, and division 3 the remaining 5 shooters, their running percentages being 89% to 81.5%.

The Club Management will decide the number of divisions and therefore the percentage range on the day of competition. A competitor therefore does not know what division he/she maybe in, be it at the top of one division or possibly the bottom of another, until the conclusion of the first event. This would therefore negate the current rule routing and require a competitor to perform at their best alibility at all times.

Under this proposal, it allows for an even distribution of cash divide dividends and trophy value across the divisions, where currently a C grade beating say 2 others in his grade receives the same trophy as an A grader beating, say 20 others in his grade.


At larger Club shoots, Zone, State and National Carnivals, 4 divisions would exist, with even distribution of competitors between the 4 divisions.

Gone will be the shooters prior knowledge that he/she will be the big fish in A, B or C grade because of performance manipulation.

Other advantages of this system would be no longer tying grades to handicap mark, the ability to use our current record book, Club Management will have a greater control over their own procedures given small numbers may be in attendance, and cheating targets will become irrelevant.

Please consider this proposal and I invite your thoughts and feedback through your Zone and State Associations to the ACTA.

Ararat shooter Marc Crimmins won the State A grade Olympic Double Trap championship at Lilydale and is now in contention for Commonwealth Games' selection.



You are refereeing a shooter who has had three malfunctions in the one event. These malfunctions have been for various reasons and you caution the shooter that the next malfunction is a lost target. The shooter accepts your timely warning and decides to shoot on.

The next shot is a double discharge.

Now we all now that a simultaneous discharge is a "No Target". However, we also area ware that a simultaneous or near simultaneous discharge is a "Malfunction".

#### IT'S YOUR CALL.

Our way of thinking indicates that the purpose of a double discharge being a "No Target" is one of equity so that both barrels are not discharged as one shot at the target simultaneously or near simultaneously. Hence, the "No Target" ruling. The reason behind the malfunction connotation is that clearly the gun is faulty. It is obvious that the shooter has been warned and it is now a matter of absolute fact that there has been a forth malfunction and a "Lost Target" is the result.

The claim of "No target" in this case is invalid.

However, as an addendum to that scenario, it is clear if the simultaneous discharge occurs where no other malfunctions have been recorded for that event (in the first 100 targets). The shooter would have "No Target" entitlement for three targets.

If you have any questions regarding rules or situations where you were unsure please write to the ACTA. I look forward to hearing from you.

# FIREARMS REGULATIONS IN NSW -LICENCE CHECKS

Due to the conditions in the NSW Firearms (General) Regulations 1997, all entrants in ACTA run competitions held in NSW MUST present their shooters licence to be able to participate. If the entrant does NOT present their shooters licence, they CANNOT participate. This regulation applies to ALL persons shooting or in the possession of a firearm at a NSW range or on club premises.

In addition to participants producing their shooters licence for inspection, NSW licence holders must satisfy Target Shooting as a genuine reason. For example, if your licence states Primary Production or Recreational Hunting only, you cannot participate in clay target shooting events.

In regards to interstate competitors the NSW Firearms branch has advised that interstate shooters must produce a valid shooters licence or permit to participate whilst on a NSW range.

Shooters are also reminded that Statutory Declarations and photocopies will not be accepted. If you have physically lost your licence or your licence has been stolen and you are in the process of obtaining a replacement then a letter from the firearms branch in your state stating the circumstances will be accepted.

## **Remember NO LICENCE - NO SHOOT**

Officials will only allow participation in events run by the ACTA on the production of a valid shooters licence or documentation as indicated above. Failure to comply with these requirements will place the range approval in jeopardy.

ACTA highly recommends all shooters have their licence in their possession at all times whilst carrying or using their firearms.

The squad assembled at the Lilydale Motor Inn on Friday the 23rd having arrived by car or plane depending on home locations. Being the AFL grand final weekend, flights in and out of Melbourne were difficult to find so arrival times were scattered across many hours. The determination award went to Ben Kittle who with absolutely no flights available out of Alice Springs, had his Dad drive him to Melbourne for the two days. That's dedication!

The aim of the squad and camp was to introduce some of the ACTA's best young DTL shooters to Olympic shooting as well as broaden the knowledge of the squad members who had previously competed in these disciplines.

This would be accomplished by way of technical coaching and sports science-related lectures spread throughout the weekend.

The ISSF junior athlete pathway was detailed and explained as per the diagram below.



The pinnacle of a junior ISSF shooter's career is to make a team to compete at a World Championship. To achieve this they must attend the Olympic Discipline National Championships, win selection points to gain entry to the Australia Cup, then finish in the top three of their discipline having achieved a travel score to qualify for the team.

To gain selection to the ISSF Junior squad, shooters can qualify via the Nationals / Aus Cup series, the ACTA Junior Development programs or be selected by the AISL's High Performance Committee. Preference is given to those who have shown interest in ISSF previously.

The linking of the ACTA's Junior Development program with the AISL's ISSF junior program has been a fantastic innovation as it now gives DTL shooters a clear pathway to go on to the Olympic events as juniors as the age limit is higher at 21. It also gives the AISL a much broader base of juniors to work with which is ideal, as we know that most good Australian ISSF shooters have had a solid background in DTL prior to switching to the Olympic events.

Technical Coaching - every shooter had their gun accurately measured and recorded. Each gun was pattern tested to establish pattern height and alignment, vital in Olympic trap where the targets vary from 1.5m to 3.5m and travelling at nearly 100km per hour. Alterations were made where possible but most importantly, each shooter knew where their gun shot, not just where they thought or had been told it shot.

Practical coaching of all three disciplines was given by very experienced coaches and changes and tips offered.

Video - each shooter was video taped during practical sessions and the footage reviewed during breaks. This is a great tool to use, as often shooters will not understand some of the problems until they see themselves on the screen. This footage is kept on file for future reference to ascertain if there have been any changes over a period of time. Each shooter will also receive a copy of the footage of their shooting.

Strength and Conditioning – a warm up program was introduced for all to participate in prior to competing. This also included a segment on stretching. The need to raise the heart rate prior to competing is a vital pre match strategy that all the shooters were encouraged to utilise to enhance performance.

Hydration - urine samples were tested to ascertain the level of hydration of each shooter. The importance of hydration was

explained along with the effects on performance of competing in a dehydrated state. Testing can establish exactly how dehydrated a berson is and how much fluid is required to rehydrate, however the best scenario is to not let oneself reach that point and strategies were but in place to combat that situation occurring.

Travel - tips on how to overcome the effects of long plane flights were discussed. Dehydration on planes is a major issue, which can be exacerbated by excessive consumption of alcohol and coffee. Stretching and exercise on the flights was emphasised as well as the need to stay awake the day of arrival no matter how tired, until after dinner that night to reduce the effect of jet lag.

Nutrition - a nutritionist gave a talk on the need to not only eat a healthy diet on a daily basis, but to have a plan in place when travelling. This included taking some food from home, particularly to countries where the food is likely to be totally different or of questionable health standard. Many a trip has been spoilt by a dose of the runs that may have been avoidable with a little planning.

Sports Psychology – common issues that arise in shooting include competition nerves, self-confidence, motivation, pressure, focus and obstacles. Over the weekend these issues were all addressed at various times and advice and tips from our sports psychologist and coaches were presented. The athletes were given mental skill's strategies to help maintain focus involving breathing exercises, thought stopping processes and the use of cue words to assist in maintaining focus.

Training Diaries - each athlete was given a training diary that had a record of all the camp presentations, a stock measuring record and training camp debrief. This will be used to record future sessions and as a pocket-sized reference diary to remind them of strategies put in place.

Saturday night after a barbecue dinner a presentation entitled the "Road to the Olympics" with video and photographic use was made to the athletes to motivate them to want to strive for the pinnacle of all shooting – the Olympic Games.

The expectation is that many of these juniors will take a greater interest in the Olympic disciplines, try for selection in the junior world championship teams and go on to represent Australia at senior level some time in the future.

My thanks to all the people who contributed to the camp and especially the AISL and ACTA whose new found spirit of cooperation has ensured the future of ISSF shooting in Australia can move forward with a new generation of enthusiastic juniors.



Sunday, 16th October was our chosen date. We started registering prospective shooters at 9:30am. After registration, candidates were invited to grab a "cuppa" but most chose to gaze in awe at a couple of our Club members who were putting on a bit of a show (It's surprising how often you miss when your trying to show off!!)

Next followed a talk about the live pigeon origin of our sport, which was carried out in front of the trap house. Those still left after a graphic description of trap boys clubbing poor wounded birds to death were submitted to a safety lecture by Charlie Strike, Riverina Zone Coach, who was good enough to travel from Wagga to lend a hand.

By this time our Office Staff had placed the 24 candidates into squads ready to give some clays a fright.

The first squad fronted up and a Club member was allocated to each candidate to lend a gun and feed ammo to the shooter one at a time (we reckoned we would have Buckley's of persuading the Firearm Registry to let us run an Open Day in'06 if someone's backside got peppered with number eight pellets!!) Charlie Strike moved around providing specialist help wherever needed. Two traps were used. Each


All in all, a very enjoyable and successful day which we will run again in '06 if the Firarm Registry Deity permit.







NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless: (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.




Despite all this Carol shot extremely well and missed out on the Overall Women's High Gun for the Titles by four targets to an on fire Margaret Denton.
