Not common knowledge is that clay target shooting is one of the world's safest sports, with a safety record second to none. One very pleasing thing for older shooters to see is the number of junior and lady competitors coming through the ranks into top winning positions.

With the recent very wet and wild conditions experienced in the state it was as if the weatherman decided to give us a break and deliver three days of magnificent climate to shoot the State Titles. Over 300 competitors some from other states met at Echuca to battle it out for the winning positions, a lot of families along with them to experience the many attractions available at this popular City.

Eleven trap layouts were available for competition, and with the number of shooters all eleven were needed, with auto traps and auto release phones, the events ran

very quickly and smoothly, almost all shooters commented on how good the grounds and facilities were which made the small band of workers from Echuca very proud.

A vote of thanks for a job well done should be given to the VCTA committee for the big job of coordinating all those shooters, and sorting out the results from the incoming squad sheets apparently with professional ease.

After having discussed the shoot for so long I really should get onto the results, which I will, beginning with Friday 11th November. Day one, which is a working day for most, saw a high of 258 entries for the first event, the 50 Target Handicap. Shooters were from Qld, NSW, Tas, SA, WA, but it was a Victorian who reigned supreme after a short shoot off, Trevor Smith of Tyrendarra gun club shooting off 21 meters, ending on a

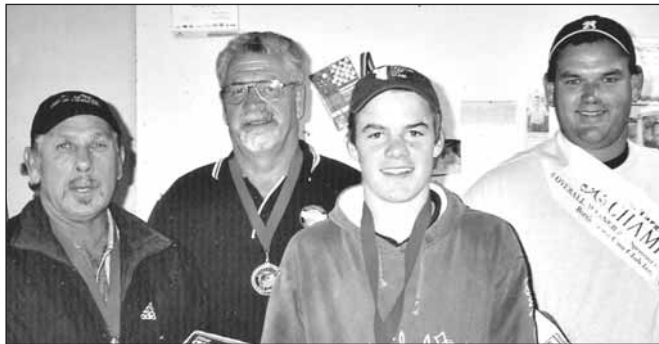

In attendance were Commonwealth Double Rise Champion, Ashley Bolwell; past National Pointscore winner, Max Medhurst; past State team members, Peter Fabris and Trevor Reschke; past National Shooting president, John Byrnes and his wife Sue, who also has represented SA at international level.

However many locals performed well in all grades and as so often happens in shooting, when the going gets tough the tough get going.

With four 50 target events over the two days it was the Handicap that saw the top competitors shine. AA grade shooters were all behind the 21 metre mark.

Three shooters shot 48/50. The winner was Southern Gun Club member Little John Mitchell, second Lyn Beelitz, while third was Trevor Reschke. Seven shooters, mostly back markers including Bob Andrews and Peter Fabris, who didn't make the placings shot a good 47, keeping them in touch for the weekend's High Gun. Day two saw club president, Bob Andrews and shoot marshalls Adrian Steele and Brad Hawker make the decision to start 30 minutes early and to halve event 4 to 25 targets. Fifteen extra shooters arrived for Sunday's events and the sensible forward thinking enabled the program to finish just prior to the rain coming.

Top performances over the two days were by Trevor Reschke, who finished one point behind Ashley Bolwell, Peter Fabris and Bob Andrews in the A grade High Gun. Trevor's performance stood out for a shooter recovering from a serious illness, which sidelined him for six months last year. Also C grade winner, Neil Rolins, who is 70 years of age and relatively new to clay target shooting.

For the pinnacle of achievement, the Overall High Gun, a lengthy three-way shoot off was required between Peter Fabris, Ashley Bolwell and Bob Andrews. At 191/195 it was down to Bob and Ashley and being the true gentlemen they both are, they decided to go by the toss of the coin. It favoured the local hard working president, Bob Andrews. Well done Bob.

Gaye Shale on a score of 331/350 picked up the ladies OHG, Junior was Tom Holt on 332/350, Veteran OHG was Ron Hounsell

with a 329/350, and after one round of nail biting shoot off, local Echuca member, Stephen Atkins proved just how good a marksman he is by winning the VCTA 2005 Overall High gun on an excellent score of 381/390, eight points down over the three days being a very good result in this tough competition.

An early finish to the shoot, a result of running 11 traps pleased all shooters, tired but happy, now faced with the prospect of a home journey. Until next year, thanks to all who attended, and thanks to the many valuable volunteers.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

WITH WINNING IN MIND – PART 2

In last month's article I began to explore the book by Lanny Basham called "With Winning in Mind". Lanny Basham, who was an Olympic shooting champion has gone on to produce a Mental Management System for helping athletes improve their mental skills.

Last month I examined the ten mental management principles that underpin the Mental Management System. This month I want to examine the part of the book that involves the development of what Basham calls "the Conscious Cycle".

The first part of this cycle is goal setting. I know I have talked often about goal setting but it really is the foundation from which all achievement stems and can be measured against. This article is being published in the January edition of the CTSN, therefore it is timely to look at goal setting. It is probably a good time to evaluate last year's goals and performance and look at developing next year's goals, especially with the nationals and the world championships being held in a few months time. Basham outlines ten steps in goal setting:

1. Decide exactly what you want. Find goals that excite you and identify exactly what you want.
2. Decide when you want it. Putting a time limit on your goals will help you formulate a plan to achieve them.
3. List the pay value. Why do you want the goal? List the reason that are important to you for achieving them.
4. Determine the obstacles in your way. Be specific, what must you do to reach these goals. What habits and attitudes do you have to change to reach your goals.
5. What is your plan to get your goal? Wishes and goals are not the same thing. Goals have a written plan. Wishes don't always come true, but goals will if you write them down and develop a plan to achieve them.
6. Ask yourself some important questions. It is important to ask if the prize is worth the effort. Do I really believe my plan will work?
7. Schedule your plan. Put your plan on a calendar or planner. This means it will get done.
8. Start now. You should be ready now so start straight away.
9. Never reach a goal without first setting another one. After climbing Everest, Hillary was asked what is what he could do now that he climbed the highest mountain in the world. He pointed to another mountain and said: "I haven't climbed that one".
10. Never, never quit. Just because you miss a target, don't drop your bundle. Just make that target the only one you miss.

The central part of the book goes on to look at reinforcement. Basham believes that if you believe that something will happen then you increase the probability of it happening. This happens for both positive and negative beliefs. According to Basham, people perform as we expect them to perform. For example, if you praise a waiter for good service, you'll increase your chances of getting good service every time you eat there. Basham goes on to explain that the next important aspect of the conscious cycle is to behaviourally rehearse what you expect to happen. You should see exactly what you want to happen when you perform. Next Basham says to properly implement the Mental Management System, you need to understand that everything we do has three phases. Firstly, there is the anticipation phase which is what you think about immediately before you perform. Next, is the action phase which is what you think about

as you perform, and finally, the reinforcement phase which is what you think about immediately after you perform. If the shot is successful then say "That's like me", if it was not good then forget about it and go on to the next shot.

Based on Basham's theories the way to become the best shot in the world is to learn two things:

Number 1: Perform well by hitting THIS target.

Number 2: Repeat Number 1.

Winning requires you to develop a consistent mental picture. To do this you need to concentrate and run the same series of mental pictures before every performance. By running a mental program two crucial functions are accomplished. Firstly, the mental program is a series of thoughts, that, when pictured will trigger the subconsciousness to perform the appropriate action. Secondly, the mental program controls the thought process occupying the conscious mind. An occupied Conscious Mind cannot pressure out, choke, or have a break in concentration.

I could go on about this book, and I may revisit later and deal with the parts I have left out. It is worth reading and is available through Earmold Australia. Finally our new skeet coach recommended that we contact ISSF direct in Germany. Recognition within 3 days, with publication in the International ISSF magazine but nothing from Australia. This was also a new Oceania record. This has upset my daughter and I expect an apology and rectification of this matter and hope that something like this does not occur to anyone ever again.

This was an unfortunate situation that will have to be addressed for future combined competitions. The Oceania Games will again be hosted by Australia in 2007. This time it will be held in Sydney and have Olympic quotas attached. If held at the end of the year, it will be our last opportunity to win quotas so in reality becomes the most important tournament in the Olympic cycle. Without quotas there is no Olympics, so rest assured we will be treating this event in 2007 with the importance it demands.

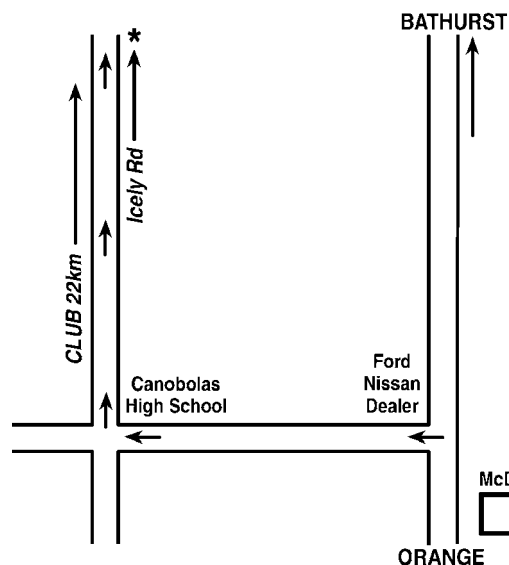

Event three was the single barrel championship which was won by Roger Lehmann 34/34 from Jamie Elliot on 33/34.

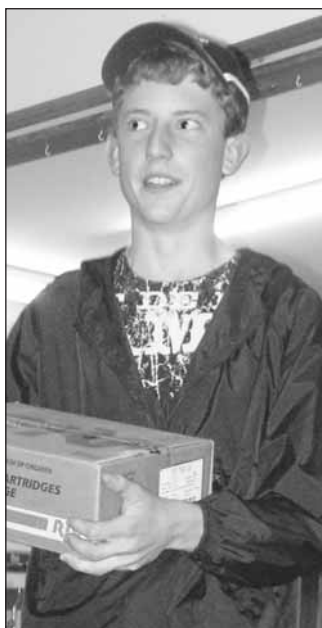
Event four was the pointscore championship and with it the aspiration of the high gun.

Here we go again. At the beginning of 2005 we were given the selection criteria for the year, or so we thought. The traveling scores are what we as competitors needed to shoot in order to have any chance of traveling overseas. (This needs to be clarified that just because you shoot a Traveling Score, doesn't necessarily mean you will be given a trip.) The newly named AISL (formerly ASA) mid year this year have moved the goal posts on everyone, allowing the top 10 shooters in each discipline an opportunity to earn their traveling score during the Commonwealth Games Selection Trials. Not only that, the team members for the Oceania Games in Brisbane were also given an opportunity to earn this as well. Call me cynical, but while the rest of the nation was at home a select few have been able to gain an advantage for the up and coming 2006 team selections. What peace of mind knowing that when you are vying for team selection next year, you have already earned your "Traveling Score", thus easing the pressure and allowing certain shooters the ability to worry about breaking targets rather than shooting a certain score? I will have my critics on this, but when you look at the next lot of FACTS, something stinks to high heaven.

The Traveling Scores have been increased for every discipline:

Men's Trap 118; Jnr Men's Trap 112; Women's Trap 67; Jnr Women's Trap 62; Men's Double Trap 134; Jnr Men's Double Trap 123; Men's Skeet 119; Jnr Men's Skeet 113; Women's Skeet 68; Jnr Women's Skeet 63.

Next years ISSF National Titles are being held at Cecil Park, one of the toughest layouts in Australia. Proof of the difficulty - Sydney 2000 Olympics, only 2 competitors shot 118 or better, Michael Diamond 122 & Ian Peel 118 - Sydney 2004 World Cup, again only 2 competitors shot above 118, every other international shooter was under our men's National traveling score.

ARE WE as competitors starting 2006 on a level playing field?? The true answer is NO. Why introduce a system mid year giving a select few an advantage??

Are You Fairdinkum??

This month I had to pinch myself for are you fairdinkum. I couldn't believe my luck when a little pearly appeared on page 43 of the CTSN - "Ararat shooter wins at Lilydale" - I am all for good publicity for our sport, but shouldn't it be factual. The article implies that Marc Crimmins beat Adam Vella, Russell Mark & Tom Turner. For the record the Victorian State Team is Adam Vella, Russell Mark & Craig Trembath for Double Trap. These 3 shooters finished first, second & third respectively. Marc finished 4th Overall. And the Commonwealth Games Team is Russell Mark & Craig Trembath. I think in literature they call this "poetic licence"...I love your work Crimmo!!

When writing this article I went over the AISL web site looking for the 2006 ISSF Selection Criteria. 7 weeks out you would think we

would have an idea how the team will be picked. I hope they get on there soon!!

As a qualified referee, you should be aware of all matters surrounding Single Barrel shooting. In particular Rule 1.10(d) which states, that a shooter cannot load two cartridges in his gun. We have to assume naturally that a shooter doesn't fire at a target with the two cartridges or snap cap etc in his gun. Just loading them and taking them out before he closes his gun and shoots would not attract a penalty.

Whilst refereeing a Single Barrel event you note a shooter has in fact loaded two cartridges and has fired only one cartridge at the target. You call "Lost Target" under Rule 1.10(d).

The shooter turns to you and says "What about GRTS 13"

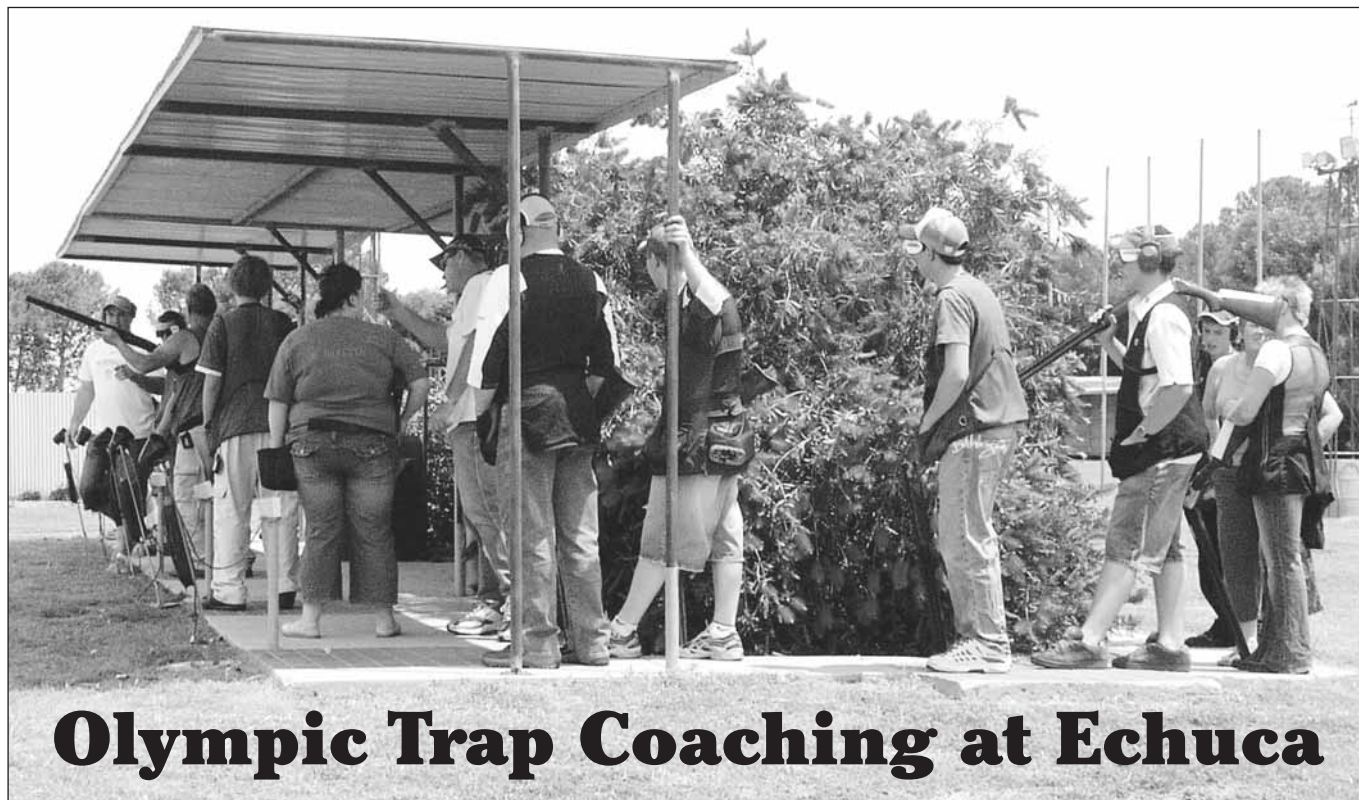
which states in single barrel shooting the Referee must ensure that one cartridge only is placed in the gun. The shooter further claims that as you (hopefully) had the "on off" or "release" button in your hand you could have prevented the shooter from firing at the target. Moreover, it was the first target and I didn't hear you say it was a Single Barrel event."

IT'S YOUR CALL.

The "Lost Target" rule stands. The shooter must accept responsibility for his own actions both in ascertaining the type of event, carrying sufficient cartridges and (despite having bad hearing and eye protection) the responsibility of listening to the announcement of the Referee which may or may not contain alterations to the event or other matters relating to that event or further safety considerations.

Although GRTS 13 appears to give a Referee some responsibility in this matter it is usually not possible for him to observe the breech of every shooters gun. The clear message from the rule is its intention to bring to the attention of the Referee that the loading of two cartridges in a Single Barrel event etc attracts an appropriate penalty.

Does your licence have SPORT/TARGET SHOOTING (T/S) OR CLAY TARGET SHOOTING (C/T) as a genuine reason on your licence?

Genuine reasons are shown on the rear of the licence. For licences with the word "multiple" written on front only, licence holders should peruse their paper copy of licence 'conditions and authority' or contact the Firearms Registry to check.

IF YOU DON'T HAVE T/S OR C/T ON YOUR LICENCE IT'S AS EASY AS 1-2-3 TO ADD

1. Ring the Firearms Registry on 1300 362 562 and dial Option 1.
2. Relevant paperwork will be provided to you, please complete and attach evidence of your current club membership and return to the Firearms Registry.
3. You will then receive a photo-licence advice to attend a RTA Office, pay the fee of \$40 and receive your replacement photo licence.

If a club member is shooting at an approved range without either sport/target shooting or clay target shooting genuine reasons (eg. Primary Producer only), they may be convicted under Section 7 (2) (a) of Firearms Act 1996 and revocation of your firearms licence for a period of 10 years applies. We want to avoid this at all costs!

Members who do not have sport/target shooting or clay target shooting as a genuine reason are not authorised to shoot in approved NSW Clay Target Club events.

By not being licenced correctly & shooting at a Club you also put the club approval and/or the range approval at risk.

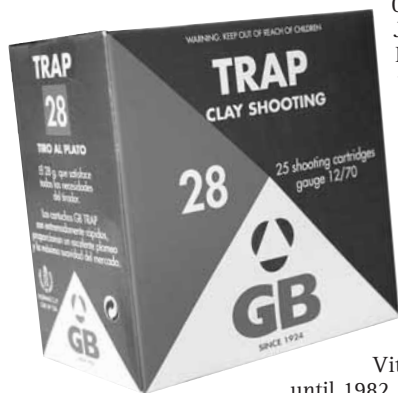
The Clubs Unit of the NSW Firearms Registry has and is continuing to conduct random audits to validate member's genuine reasons for holding a firearms licence.

Ballistic properties for all shotshells are determined on our test benches under C.I.P. standards. In order to arrive at these test results cartridges are conditioned for 24 hours at a temperature of $21 \pm 1^\circ\text{C}$ and $60 \pm 5\%$ of moisture. The shotshells are then tested using our test guns. In order to attain consistent results we use the same tests and same environmental conditions to ensure results do not change.

Felmingham dominates at Euroa

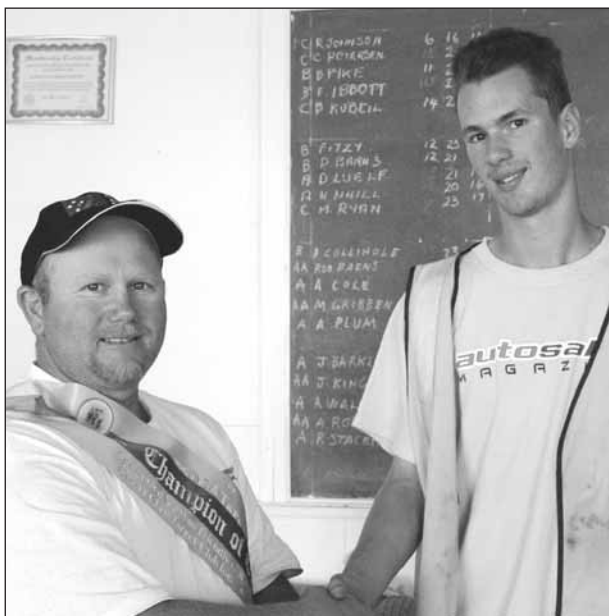
Russell Felmingham, the North East Zone Secretary, paid Euroa a visit on Saturday 26th November and ended up completely dominating the day's events.
