NATIONAL 20 GAUGE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The first event for the national carnival saw 91 competitors line up for the National 20 gauge Championship. At the end of qualification only one shooter stood alone with a perfect score of 100/100. Craig O'Neill claimed victory in this event and was awarded the Royal Blue Sash, Silver Australia Badge and John Withers Memorial Trophy.

Section wins went to Laura Coles in the Women's 91/100, Mathew Maloney 96/100 the Juniors and John Guberina 97/100 the Veterans.

Third place went to the team from Northern Territory on a score of 61/75.

New Tasmanian Record *Phil Turner Shoots 680 DTL*

The November shoot at Cressy is usually a big day and 2005 was no exception. With the promise of good weather, sixty five shooters travelled from all over the state for a chance to pickup a sash & have their name on the honourboard for one of the three championships held at this shoot each year.

The day began with the Fred Blake Memorial Championship and twenty five shooters shot 30/30 to qualify for the over-all shootoff, setting the tone for the day.

Rowan Atkins, 14 year old son of Tim Atkins won B grade after reaching 70 in the shoot-off. (Tim missed his first target) After 90 targets, the shoot-off was reduced to 5 shooters who appeared to be settling into a nice rhythm so the rest of us left them to fight it out in front of the club-house and went off to play on trap 2!

The second event was another 30 target D/B in memory of a previous club president, Mr Jack Hill and the shooting progressed steadily, with referees & scorers swapping in & out of the shoot-off as needed.

The plan was to allow the shoot-off to continue until the "Jack Hill" was within 2 squads of finishing & then convert to Pointscore. This happened at 315 when the shoot-off was down to just three men. Steve Glover was first to go when he missed a target at 318, then Phil Turner pulled a second on his 327th leaving Bernie Smith victorious.

After a quick pat on the back, they were sent off to trap 2 for their 30 "Jack Hill" targets. Meanwhile, the shoot-offs for event 2 were under way. It was now well into the afternoon and with another 23 possibles being recorded the committee reluctantly decided to revert to pointscore after 100 targets. There were five shooters left at this stage; Shane Yates, Derry Freeman, Steve Glover, Phil Turner & Bernie Smith. Shane emerged the winner at 151, but Phil Turner & Steve Glover were still clean after each pulling a second. (For those of you keeping count, previously the club DTL record was held by Rex Meikie on 447. By now, the figure conscious were starting to mutter about state records,

agreeing that the Tasmanian DTL break record was 511, shared by Greg Peck & Stuart French) Other noteworthy performers were Steve Taylor who earned a 75 break & a promotion to A grade. Relative newcomer Greg McBain gave a hint of his potential with C grade wins in each event. Graeme Brain had a wonderful day, winning A grade in both these first two events and shooting himself into AA with a 150 break.

The Presidents Trophy was the feature event of the day and having now concluded the "Jack Hill" shoot-off we could thankfully run over both traps.

Dawn, the canteen lady had done a bread & milk run so she could go on making toasted sangers & we settled into the event with the sort of determination that is brought on by the threat of fading light.

Eight men shot the 50 clean; 5 from AA, 2 from A and 1 from B grade. By now, the sun was getting very low and to complicate matters, 5 shooters had shot the program clean to be tied for High Gun.

After discussions between management and the shooters it was decided to resolve both matters together but the shoot-off would be allowed to run its course without reverting to pointscore. It was agreed that darkness would soon put a stop to this nonsense!

At 140 there were 5 shooters left. Bernie Smith, Tim Atkins, Phil Turner, Steve Glover and Tim Bryan. The sun had now disappeared and the secretary, who knows about these things said wisely, "They'll drop like flies now the light has gone." At 165 there were still 5 left. (But it was so dark now, we sent out an extra pair of eyes to help referee! At 190 there were still 4 amazing people left and it was so dark the people at the fence could hardly distinguish between target and sky. At 199 Bernie and Tim left together At 202, Tim Bryan missed.

So, after shooting 680 targets in a row and establishing a new state record, Phil Turner finally managed a win. Congratulations on your amazing achievement, Phil.





CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2006 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2006 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2006 registered shooter record book before nominating.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Mens, Womens, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, excepting the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Mens, Womens, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section only. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors who, will be over the age of 65 years at the time of competition.

Juniors - are those competitors who, will be under the age of 18 years at the time of competition.

Sub Juniors – are those who, will be under the age of 15 years at the time of competition.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event a \$5 requad fee shall apply. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger that No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Management Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified - and indication can be obtained for the daily scoreboard. This applies to trap grades, Mens, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledge the sponsorship received from sponsors.

Practice

Practice, subject to trap availability, will be available throughout the championships. Tickets may be purchased at the events office.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

Where necessary, shootoffs will be conducted under lights until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament Director decides. In such a case, the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

Nominations - All Events

All championship nominations (excluding Deauville Doubles) include a contribution to the discipline fund.

Note: Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and partners only, they being wives or husbands, whose nomination must be lodged at the same time as family member paying full nomination fees.

Authority

This program shall control the 2006 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

The Association's Executive Committee, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 2006 National Trap Championships program, to change or modify the program in any way.

Gambling is not permitted on events staged by the Australian Clay Target Association.

Services and Facilities

Catering: Arrangements have been made for meal services to be available with an extensive but practical menu.

Trade Displays: Commercial organisations have supported the tournament by establishing displays of products connected with the shooting sports. These displays will be located in an area specifically designated for trade exhibits. Competitors and visitors to the ground are encouraged to support these trade displays, as, in this way, exhibitors can be encouraged to maintain their support for clay target shooting.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

- In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
 - Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps.
- Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
- Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations and are not refundable.
- 14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. Mackintosh Veteran team selection is open to 60 years of age and over.

- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at the discretion of the Tournament Director.
- 19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behavior of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 22. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to Juniors and second family members only, they being wives or husbands. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
- 23. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State/Country of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.



Dear Your Say

I refer to the December issue of the ACTA news and some previous issues regarding shoot offs. But first, great to see Ross Walsh and Arty Del Ben on the front cover of this issue, but one seldom, if ever sees C, B and struggling A graders taking out similar wins even though they are major financial contributors to these events.

High gun events 99% of the time only benefit AA shooters and a small minority at that. These sorts of large cash prizes should be split amongst the grades and not just for the top shooters to

constantly collect the cash. This type of distribution system does not encourage increased member enthusiasm.

Prolonged shoot offs are boring and costly to clubs in money and time. When we drop the odd target that means we are out of that event and the first thing we think is what is the next event because shooters travel to shoot, not watch others and worse contribute to the cost of it. This does not encourage new shooters or lower grade shooters to regularly attend carnivals and compete in competition. In fact they despair and drop out as disinterested members.

Starting. earlier is impractical and charging for shoots off clays, although a good idea, would not prevent lost time and I'm sure shooters would prefer an extra event rather than watching others. A system of changing, to single barrel after 25 targets and in addition the next 25 a 3 metre handicap with an extra 2 metres for each addition 25 Would create far more audience interest in a shoot off and cut out these marathon and costly time wasting shoot offs, whether they be Zone, State of Commonwealth shoots,

I notice in world soccer in the event of a tie they (get down to a lone goalie and single kicker and a quick result is achieved. With today's better-designed guns and softer shooting, conditions we too must tighten up on shoot offs or members loose interest. The rule book should be specific and state this and not leave it to a club decision.

I read too, member Richard Rackerman moaning about noisy ported guns. Dear dear, he should stay home with mummy and take up knitting. He then won't have to worry about litigation and those guns going bang.

We are now 2006 and we have to consider any change to keep pace with current trends to ensure our sport remains viable, mutually enjoyable, interesting and equitable,

Rules and Grading.

To whom it may concern.

I would like comment on the letter which appeared in the November 05 Shooting News from Gary Jenkins and Russel Mark's column in the November 05 issue of Sporting Shooter magazine. Both these writers outlined criticisms of the DTL grading system and the angles and the distances the targets are thrown for this discipline.

I would totally agree with them that the settings currently used for DTL targets are far to easy and has resulted in distortions that are negatives for the sport. As matters stand, too many shooters who are perhaps really a B grade are now aggregated into the higher gradings, where given that the relativities of abilities still exist, they have little chance of successfully competing against some of the similarly graded top shots. This undoubtedly serves to discourage those so affected but it also makes protracted shoot offs more likely to occur, which particularly in the context of a minor level of competition, does nothing for the profitability of the club conducting the event.

It is good of course that shooters can achieve high scores but when this occurs too frequently and in relatively low level competition it merely serves to pander to the egos of a minority of top shooters. It is not unreasonable to say that any DTL break badge achieved under 2005 rules does not constitute the same achievement as those obtained in the days when targets were thrown harder and at wider angles. Might I suggest that the targets should be thrown a few metres further and out to a angles of 35 degrees. This could I believe go some way to positioning shooters in a grade more appropriate to their abilities.

The issue of grading is a perennial and vexed question but I do not agree with Mr Jenkins view that gradings should be scrapped. If a one level of competition situation were to be implemented, then I find it difficult to imagine that the average shooters would nominate for an event if their assessment of the opposition indicated the chances of success somewhat remote.

I readily acknowledge that the grading system has faults in that

contrary to the spirit of sportsmanship some individuals will manipulate it to seek advantage. It is always the case that some will abuse the rules but this is not sufficient reason to abandon the system, and if done, would I believe alienate many lesser shots and have them leave the sport. Whatever the shortcomings, I do not see any alternative to applying some form of ability grading if the objectives of equity and fairness are to be maintained.

In concluding I would suggest that the issue of limiting the extent of down grading be reconsidered. I understand the intention is to try to foil the cheats but it contradicts the overriding principle that gradings are essentially a function of scores shot. Scores should be the primary determinant of gradings and not some arbitrary limitation that assumes a lower level of performance is indicative of an artifice employed to unfairly gain an advantage. There are many factors contributing to lower performance that must be considered in regrading and unless there are good reasons to do otherwise then scores should be the basis of making a determination.

It is sometimes good to experiment and modify rules to see if a change is beneficial as without experimentation no progress can ever be made. The objective of a change should, however, be to encourage and if it doesn't achieve this then it is pointless to persist with it.

Let's fix an ongoing problem

I can only speak of experience at my club, and do not know if the problem exists at other clubs.

It appears that in the past the problem has not been seen as of any consequence. But let me assure you it is going to be, unless we as shooters show a little respect for our sport and the people working behind the scenes to make a successful shoot.

At the recent Nationals held at Cecil Park Clay Target Club, the

problem of fired cases left on the ground was compounded, by a lack of volunteers.

Even with bins provided I observed one shooter carefully remove the fired cases from his gun and then proceed to throw them about 3 metres in front of him. Still other shooters I think delight in seeing how far their ejectors can throw a case.

The cleaning up of fired cases has always been seen as a job some volunteer(s) from the host club would do.

The trouble with this line of thinking is that the cost of time is increasing, to a point where it is becoming very hard or nearly impossible to find volunteers, because the ordinary man in the street can not afford to take the time off. And if he can get the time off he wants to shoot.

This of course leaves it to 2 or 3 of the old blokes! Who are usually at a point in their life where bending over is damn impossible, and if they do they are usually out of action for the next week recuperating.

I am talking from experience, it took 2 of us 3 hours each day to have the layouts ready for the next day. I will not be volunteering; to do manual labour for an extended period again, it is not worth it. I love to shoot too.

This of course will result in an increase in the cost of shooting because labour will have to be employed, and/or expensive equipment purchased.

The solution to me seems simple, have the shooter be responsible for their own equipment (including pods) and if they do neglect that responsibility then perhaps they could be penalized in some way, maybe a target as I believe they are in some overseas countries. I see no reason why even an auto shooter could not pick up their shells after the squad has finished their round.

Sure we can enforce this requirement at a local level, but unless it is looked into at a national level then what's the point.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

CHANGE

The one subject that will fuel a great deal of discussion and debate is coaching. Now I do not want to say what system should be used or what programs should be adopted but there are a few essential features of coaching that I wish to examine.

Firstly, I think coaching is vital. The problem is when a new shooter arrives at a local club there is not always a formal process in place that can assist the shooter to learn the basics properly. Usually, they have a few goes, think the sport is great and start competing. What happens is that the new shooter usually learns to compete before he/she learns to shoot properly. If he/she stays in the sport long enough, then they start to look beyond the fundamentals of turning up to a shoot with a gun and some shells. They get a gun that fits ammunition that is appropriate for the task and get some help usually from someone they recognise as a "good shot". Whilst this is a start, effective coaching is much more.

Secondly, I believe we all have a responsibility to improve so we can enjoy our sport more. That's the reason why these articles appear each month, to help shooters improve their shooting through an awareness of the psychological aspects of the sport.

The coach faces two main problems: firstly, the adult learner, and secondly, the persons reaction to change. On a one to one coaching session, adults are more responsive but when part of a group, adults are more likely to sit back and observe rather than ask questions, explore new ways and take risks. Group coaching sessions need to be structured in a way that participants have the opportunity to take risks in a safe learning environment that does not challenge their dignity. Adult learners need to take the learning at their own pace. Trying to rush or get through too much without the skills or concepts being generalised may lead to participants saying they know or understand when really they don't. This creates anxiety and interferes with further learning.

Humans don't like change. Changes in the workplace, health, relationships, family, finances, ability, etc all have the ability of developing anxiety. Yet some people do not develop anxiety, they take the changes in their stride, see them as an opportunity and move on. In my practice; teaching, coaching and therapy are often one and the same thing. For most part I use a solution focused brief therapy approach as taught by Michael Durrant from the Brief Therapy Institute of Sydney. The principles of a solution focus approach are as follows:

- a. Focus on what's working. I am often heard to say at shoots, "yes you missed one, but what did you do right the other 49 times". Look for differences that are positive. Don't dwell on the missed target but try to be mindful of what you were thinking, feeling, smelling, hearing, etc when you shot the other targets well.
- b. Focus on future success. Ask yourself questions, "How do you want things to be?", How will you know when you are a confident trap or skeet shot?", "If your world were perfect what would be different to tell you that everything was going well?"

Let's imagine that this difficulty is solved.....what will be happening? How will you know? It is important here to develop a PICTURE in detail of what it will be like.

c. Assume movement and change. On a scale of zero to ten, where 0 is "I can't do this" and 10 is "I'm on top......" Where are you now?

What will be happening when you are one or two steps higher up the scale? Who will notice? What will they notice?

In a solution focused approach there are some basic assumptions about change.

- There is not necessarily a logical relationship between the problem and the solution. This is important because you don't have to know what is wrong in order to fix it. If you can see a better way of doing it then do it differently, and enjoy the success.
- The client, who is the shooter in this case should define the goals of the coaching session. Coaching is about helping the shooter get to where they want to go, not knowing what is best for them.
- 3. People have within their experience a wealth of skills, resources and strengths, both known and unknown to them, the coaches job is to get the shooter to recognise these skills and strengths and how they can be used to facilitate improvement.
- 4. Problems are a way of describing things, they are not you.
- 5. Look at solving the problem rather than working out why the problem exists. Knowing why you've got a problem doesn't help you solve it.
- 6. Change is inevitable. You cannot stop change but you can act to increase your number of choices.
- 7. Change happens by people experiencing themselves as competent and successful. We often get stuck, and coaching can help us see ourselves, or the solution, differently. We then maximise opportunities for experiencing or noticing success.
- 8. Motivation is more likely when we view ourselves as competent. If we view people as competent they are more likely to behave that way. People cooperate when they believe they have a say in the change process.
- If it work's don't fix it.... If it doesn't, do something different. Encourage others to do more of what is working and less of what is not
- 10. A focus on the possible and changeable is more helpful than a focus on the overwhelming and intractable. Don't focus on the past (problem), look at what is happening in the present (exceptions) and focus on future for what can be different.
- 11. Complex problems do not necessarily require complex or lengthy solutions. Look at changing a small portion of what is happening, examine what is different and move towards further change.
- 12. Focus on the future without a problem is more helpful than a focus on the past with the problem.

If these assumptions are part of the learning process in coaching then the shooter being coached may feel more empowered and motivated to change and embrace new skills and knowledge with the goal to seeing an improvement or some difference in his/her performance.




Brad Webb, AA High Gun Winner

FIREARMS REGULATIONS IN NSW - LICENCE CHECKS

Due to new conditions of the NSW Firearms (General) Regulations 1997, all entrants in ACTA run competitions held in NSW MUST present their shooters licence to be able to participate. If the entrant does NOT present their shooters licence, they CANNOT participate. This regulation applies to ALL persons shooting or in the possession of a firearm at a NSW range or on club premises.

In addition to participants producing their shooters licence for inspection, the licence must satisfy clay target shooting as a genuine reason, known as Target Shooting. For example, if your licence states Primary Production or Recreational Hunting only, you cannot participate in clay target shooting events.

Officials will only allow participation in events run by the ACTA on the production of a valid shooters licence

ACTA highly recommends all shooters carry their shooters licence at all times when carrying or using firearms.

Open Day at Darwin Clay Target Club Interested onlookers watching Suzy smoke a few at double trap

Darwin Clay Target Club currently has about 82 members of whom only about four are women. The Committee decided to hold an open day in an attempt to increase membership and redress the imbalance between men and women in the club. A Come and Try Day aimed primarily at women and juniors was held on Saturday 3 December 2005.

The NT Government came to the party by approving a "Grass Roots" sports development grant of \$2315 to assist with costs. Olympic gold medallist Suzy Balogh kindly agreed to come up here to host the event. A lot of work went into pre-publicity including sending flyers to over 6,000 private letter boxes in the greater Darwin area, hand delivery to over 800 homes and delivery of flyers to a wide range of businesses, youth hostels and motels. The local media gave us great coverage and there was much interest in the fact that Suzy was in town.

Despite being disgustingly hot and humid, 95 people signed the Club' visitors book. About 70 had a go with everyone hitting at least one target. About 80% of the visitors were women and visitor reaction was overwhelmingly positive. Of course one of the attractions was that the event was entirely free. The NT Minister for Sports and Recreation, the Hon Delia Lawrie came during the morning. We were pleased to see her, as Delia has been supportive of the club since she assumed her portfolio earlier this year. She opened our annual shoot

in July and also approved the grass roots development grant mentioned above.

Suzy Balogh did a magnificent job of welcoming visitors, talking to groups about her experiences along with gun safety and shooting techniques. She also staged shooting demonstrations at both double trap and trench. The dozen or so club members were kept flat out introducing people to the fine art of clay busting at the two DTL and the two skeet layouts. Suzy directed proceedings and indeed her input was the key to the success of the day.

Local ABC radio sports commentator Charlie King covered the event as well as the ABC TV film crew. We featured on the ABC TV news that night with Suzy showing a local girl how to shoot. This prime time media coverage capped a great week with promotional articles appearing in the daily NT News, the weekly Darwin Sun, the Palmerston Sun (which featured a colour photograph of Darwin member Rachel Fox on the front page) and in the rural Litchfield Times. Announcements were made on all Darwin radio stations community notices during the week.

The open day was to run from 9am to 12 midday and, amazingly for laid-back Darwin, about 60 people arrived right on 9am. One of the problems with running an open day is that it is difficult to process large numbers of people in a reasonable time, without compromising safety or the experience for the visitors. We had long lines of people waiting to have a shot at each of the layouts. We speeded up the

process somewhat by having members show people next in line how to hold the gun etc before they came up to the mark so that the person supervising the shooting just had to put a cartridge into the gun and say "Shoot the target". Nevertheless it all took time and we would be interested to hear how other clubs have managed open days as we now intend to make this a regular event.

Most of the visitors took away membership application forms, a club brochure and a fact sheet on Suzy Balogh. Many promised to come along to our



Whilst refereeing a Pointscore event a shooter appears to have a malfunction in his first barrel and breaks the target with his second barrel where it was possible for the second barrel to be discharged.

What action do you take and what rulings would you make in the following two scenarios:

1.In the first instance you examine the competitor's gun and note that there are components of the load in the first barrel. Do you rule "One" ie 3 Points or "Two"?

2. In the second example you examine the competitor's gun and note that there has been no discharge of the cartridge at all. The primer has not fired and the cartridge is fully intact. What then do you rule?

IT'S YOUR CALL.

In the first instance You would call "Two" under Rule 1.12(b)
In the second instance you would call "One" i.e. 3 Points under
Rule 1.12(a)

Rule 1.12 talks specifically about abiding by the result in any type of event. It is clearly stated that where the malfunction occurs and a shooter elects to shoot with his second barrel he must abide by the result. Shooters should note that they can place themselves at a disadvantage where they elect to shoot at the target with only the second barrel. A legitimate malfunction in the first barrel will give them the opportunity of using both barrels again, (provided they haven't had 3 previous malfunctions in that event) because if they miss the target with the second barrel then the target would be scored as "Lost".

When we then look at Rule 1.12(a) some of us may find it difficult to understand the rationale behind the award of a first barrel hit. Clearly, there must have been a malfunction of some description in the gun. Hence, one could argue that there is no difference between the two scenarios. Nevertheless, our rules state quite clearly the procedure we are to adopt.



MARYBOROUGH QLD ANNUAL CHAMPIONSHIP






Coach, Craig Scott helping Lisa Sinclair

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless: (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

COMPETITION PROCEDURE

Qualifying

12 competitors will be selected from the National Double Barrel, Single Barrel and ANZ Point Score Championships for entry into the Quarter Final. These will consist of the top ranking competitors from the possible score of 250 points over the three events. The 12 will be broken down in the following classes. The top 3 competitors from AA Grade, 2 - A. 1- B. 1 - C. 2 - Juniors, 1 - Sub Junior, 1 - Lady, 1 - Veteran, Shoot-offs will decide ties in each class for entry into the Quarter Final.

Quarter Final

The Quarter Final will consist of all Competitors shooting at 25 Targets Point Score from 15 metres. The following Handicap will apply to each competitors "off the gun score" after 25 targets. AA Grade – 0 pts, A – 1 pt, B – 2pts, C - 3 pts. Juniors - 1pt. Sub Juniors - 2 pts. Ladies - 1 pt. Veterans - 1 pt. The maximum possible score with handicap added is 75. Miss and out shoot-offs will decide ties to determine the top 4 competitors that will progress to the Semi Final Stage.

Semi Final

The top 4 competitors from the Quarter Finals will be ranked from 1st to 4th from their 25 target Quarter Final score (with Handicap). If there is a tie for ranking then the competitor with the highest Qualifying score out of the possible 250 points will be ranked higher. If there is still a tie at this stage a sudden death shoot-off will decide ranking positions.

The Semi Finals will consist of 5 targets Point Score with the Number 1 ranked semi finalist competing against number 4 and 2 competing against 3. Ties will be broken by sudden death. No handicaps.

Grand Final

The winner from the first Semi Final will shoot-off against the winner of the second Semi. The Grand Final is 5 targets Point Score, sudden death to decide ties.

*Conditions of Entry
