COMPETITION PROCEDURE

Qualifying

12 competitors will be selected from the National Double Barrel, Single Barrel and ANZ Point Score Championships for entry into the Quarter Final. These will consist of the top ranking competitors from the possible score of 250 points over the three events. The 12 will be broken down in the following classes. The top 3 competitors from AA Grade, 2 - A, 1 - B, 1 - C, 2 - Juniors, 1 - Sub Junior, 1 - Lady, 1 - Veteran. Shoot-offs will decide ties in each class for entry into the Quarter Final.

Quarter Final

The Quarter Final will consist of all Competitors shooting at 25 Targets Point Score from 15 metres. The following Handicap will apply to each competitors "off the gun score" after 25 targets. AA Grade - 0 pts, A - 1 pt, B - 2pts, C - 3 pts, Juniors - 1pt, Sub Juniors - 2 pts, Ladies - 1 pt, Veterans - 1 pt. The maximum possible score with handicap added is 75. Miss and out shoot-offs will decide ties to determine the top 4 competitors that will progress to the Semi Final Stage.

Semi Final

The top 4 competitors from the Quarter Finals will be ranked from 1st to 4th from their 25 target Quarter Final score (with Handicap). If there is a tie for ranking then the competitor with the highest Qualifying score out of the possible 250 points will be ranked higher. If there is still a tie at this stage a sudden death shoot-off will decide ranking positions.

The Semi Finals will consist of 5 targets Point Score with the Number 1 ranked semi finalist competing against number 4 and 2 competing against 3. Ties will be broken by sudden death. No handicaps.

Grand Final

The winner from the first Semi Final will shoot-off against the winner of the second Semi. The Grand Final is 5 targets Point Score, sudden death to decide ties.

***Conditions of Entry**

Only users of Beretta shotguns are eligible to enter. There is no nomination fee. Competitors must register their intention to enter by signifying on the prescribed form available at the point of nomination BEFORE the commencement of the National Double Barrel Championship.

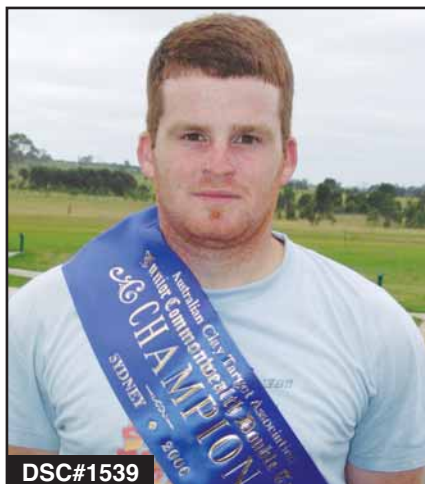

Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

MAXIMUM PERFORMANCE

Since beginning these articles on “psychological aspects for shooting” I have had numerous phone calls, letters and personal inquiries whilst I’ve been at shoots. To date all have been positive about the articles or have shown that the reader/shooter wants to improve by learning more knowledge and acquiring the skills to be able to put better scores together.

I would like to thank those shooters who have taken the time to contact me, and especially those of you who have recommended books or articles I should read. Another question I am often asked is “What is the best book I should read?” Because we all have different needs it is impossible to recommend a single book that will suit everybody at every level of ability.

The one book that goes close is “The Inner Game of Golf” by Tim Gallwey. This book provides an easily understandable account of what creates problems for athletes: self-doubt. This book also looks at the way we judge our performance and how these judgements interfere with our ability to get on with the task at hand. For most shooters, shooting is the easy part. What is hard; is keeping the mind quiet so that the muscles can get on and do the job.

The problem becomes apparent when we doubt our ability to shoot the target, we get instructions from our brain (the left side) that the muscles cannot understand. This leads to our muscles tensing up, we are no longer able to be fluid and we then miss. Gallwey’s other book, “The Inner Game of Tennis”, takes the thesis one step further and explores how we can quieten the mind by improving concentration.

The other book that is well worth reading is “Sporting Body, Sporting Mind” by John Connolly and John Syer. This book is a hands on manual for improving performance. It has very good chapters on goal setting, concentration, relaxation and visualisation. There are also activities and exercises that help the reader develop the skills necessary to improve. The book is a rewriting of an organisational psychological text called “Think to Win”

The last book I would recommend is “A practical Guide to Sport Psychology” by Graham Winter and Cathy Martin. The South Australian Sports Institute publishes the book. The book lives up to its name in that it is a practical guide to sport psychology with chapters on planning, arousal, visualisation, concentration, confidence and coaching.

I was recently lent an old book called “Maximum Performance” by L Morehouse & Leonard Gross. The book was published in 1978 by Mayflower Granada and is a forerunner of the sports psychology of today. A lot of the content of this book is similar to the content of other sport psychology books and it begs the question that most of the material is the same, and may only appear different at first glance because of the renaming or rewording. Whilst it has the same chapter headings as other books it does explore some interesting constructs. One that caught my interest is “Dynamic Relaxation”.

Those readers who have spoken with me will know the importance I place on relaxation. Being relaxed helps you stay in the Here and Now: Shooting is a here and now sports. To shoot in the past; worrying about the missed target, or the way you shot here last time, or shooting in the future; thinking about a possible, or

the high gun, etc will only lead to failure because you are neglecting what is happening in the here and now: which is to shoot this target. Morehouse & Gross (1978;35) explore the mechanics of relaxation. Basically they argue that mental and muscular tension is interrelated, because it is in the muscles that the tension state is manifested. They also claim that this is good because for most of us it is easier to relax our muscles than it is to relax our minds. What then happens is that when we reduce the tension in our muscles, our minds become more relaxed because the relief of the muscular agitation removes some of the pressure in our head. There are four simple things that can be done to provide instant relief:

1. Pause. Pausing changes the state you are in. It allows you to alter the relationship between you and what’s bothering you. If you only focus on the problem you will be locked into a process that reinforces your tension. Pausing unlocks that process.
2. Breathe. Breathing induces concentration. Shift your focus to your breathing and away from the problem troubling you. A few deep breaths and you will begin to see some physiological changes occurring. Increased blood flow improved circulation, reduced blood pressure, etc. When you breathe focus on four phases:
Feel yourself inhale
Feel yourself pause
Feel yourself exhale
Feel yourself pause again
3. Move. Movement of any kind further reduces tension. Tapping one’s foot, yawning and stretching, etc. Movement helps motorise tension and helps erase it.
4. Take a break. By doing something different or getting out of the stressful situation, will also help reduce the tension. The next part of dynamic relaxation is to make a tension inventory. Where is the tension manifested:
eg. Eyebrows arched
Squinting
Staring
Teeth clenched
Tight neck
Tight belly etc.

Using the same principles applied to focused breathing; eg. Focus on the tension in your shoulder. Next, let your shoulders relax. Tense them again and relax them again. This is similar to a technique called progressive muscle relaxation.

Breathing and relaxing keeps you in the here and now which is necessary if you are to focus on the target

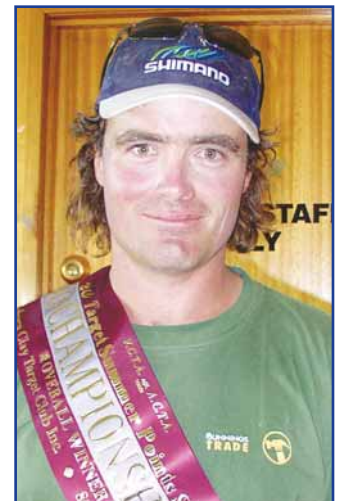

Sydney CTC 2005 Anniversary Shoot and Miroku Super Challenge

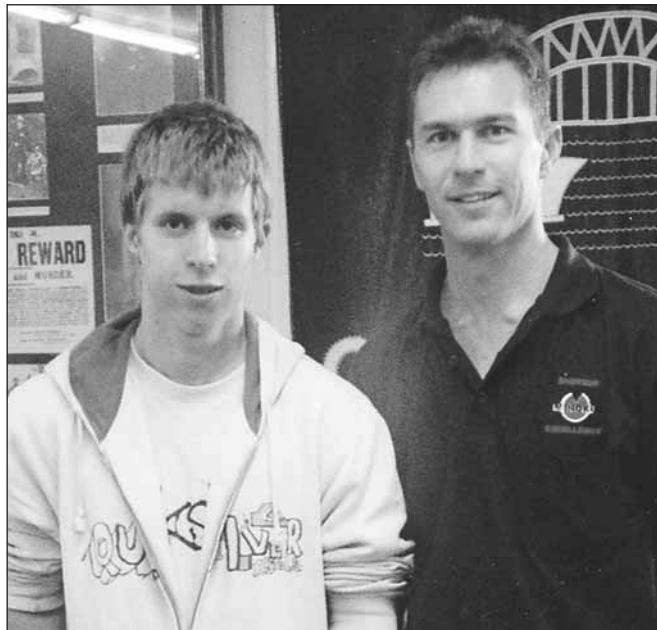
Well after 12 months of planning the big day had come. The 2 Day Anniversary shoot had arrived and all was in readiness for what was hopefully to be a successful two days.

Augusta Gun Club - Home of the Hillview Challenge Field Shoot

Two Day Simulated Field Shoot

Augusta Gun Club held its first two day simulated field shoot on December 3 & 4 2005 incorporating 50 targets on Saturday afternoon and 100 targets on Sunday. Augusta's Hillview Challenge has been held for 8 years as a one day event and has become a firm favourite amongst the clay target shooters of WA. Augusta is situated 350 km south of Perth on the coast adjacent to Cape Leeuwin in the South West of WA and lies at the confluence of the Indian and Great Southern oceans. 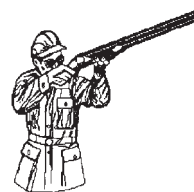

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

Dear Sir

I refer to the letters of Daryl Pasfield (Nov 05 CTSN) and Trevor Gurr (Jan 06 CTSN), both putting good ideas "on the table".

I would like to add to these two masterpieces, and will start with Daryl's proposal for a running percentage system.

After studying this proposal, talking to shooters, using my own knowledge of how clubs operate, and of course talking to the author of this proposal, I have come to the conclusion that from all the evidence at hand that this proposal would not work successfully. My reasons are as follows:-

1. Lower grade shooters simply would not nominate if they knew they would be competing against seasoned 'A' or 'AA' graders, just because the limits of a running percentage and the numbers in each group dictating that decision made by Club Management. In short, their chances of success would be ZERO!

2. The current practice of legal manipulation of the RULES will not cease under this proposal, and in fact may very well increase because shooters who would normally try their hardest, will see the futility of the situation, and Not Perform to their best ability dropping targets, or just Not Shoot - both actions being detrimental to our sport & clubs respectively.

3. The additional workload that would be placed on office staff, whether it be at Club level, State or Nationals competition is totally unwarranted as these dedicated ladies & gentlemen already have enough to do without having to figure out percentage ranges that don't have 'C' graders shooting against seasoned 'B' graders or even average 'A' graders. Our current grading system tells the office staff whatever they need to know - ever so easy!

I will move on to discuss Trevor Gurr's detailed letter.

After studying this masterpiece, I found Trevor's ideas were basically the same as mine. However, having said that, I would like to take his ideas one step closer to solution with my own thoughts on the matter, and maybe other shooters will be able to agree with us or make even better improvements.

The basic problems with our current grading system are quite simple to identify & quite simple to rectify. They are: -

1. The ease at which shooters can legally manipulate the RULES in order to remain in a grade or go down a grade or even two grades as has been discovered recently.

2 The major lack of incentive for shooters to go up a grade, due to attitude of CLUBS who, "like water, take the easy way out", insist on putting identical trophies for each grade - winners and where indicated, second placegetters.

Now how do we rectify these problems? It's quite simple!

In the case of the first problem, the key word here is RULES! The only way to attack this problem is by the Rules Committee biting the bullet and implementing the following suggestions:-

1. Delete all rules covering downgrading, and replace with a provision for a periodic review of a shooter's performance by a three (3) or five (5) person jury or a panel appointed by the authority of the ACTA by a relevant State Association, and comprising at least 1 Rules Supervisor, 1 State Handicapper & 1 Zone Referee Examiner or 1 Zone Handicapper instead of the State Handicapper.

2. Insert a provision whereby shooters who feel they have a case that warrants review must apply to their Club Handicapper in the first instance. The Club Handicapper must then refer the case to the relevant Zone jury as soon as possible.

3. The Upgrading by a least one grade of known "habitual" Professional shooters for a least five (5) years, with no recourse available to them during this period, except under extreme mitigating circumstances. Shooters cards to be annotated and stamped accordingly by an authorised ACTA jury member.

4. Combine the current two (2) columns in the DTL Shooting section of the current shooter's record book to form one column for all scores (except Eye Openers, Double Rise and Targets Only) just as it was up till the end of 1994 (pre 1995).

5. Increase the distance thrown for targets from 46 metres to 50 metres in still air (maximum distance).

6. Increase the angle from 22 degrees to 35 degrees either side of the centreline.

7. Amend the current rule 2.01(h) by increasing the number of bad scores to be deleted for grading purposes.

In the case of the second problem, the key words are Incentive and Clubs. Lower grade shooters are given no incentive to go up a grade when they see the club they are shooting at putting on identical trophies for all the grade winners. The end result of this is that they either drop targets to stay in their grade, or walk away from their sport totally dissatisfied, taking others with them & telling potential new shooters the truth of the way the grading system works in Clay target Shooting. Some shooters actually make it up the grading ladder, some taking longer than others, but when you see just how many shooters are in each grade, the figures speak for themselves.

Clubs have got to start thinking differently and operating in a manner that encourages shooters to improve their grades.

Next month I hope to be able to finish this submission by a detailed explanation of a system that will benefit clubs and shooters alike.

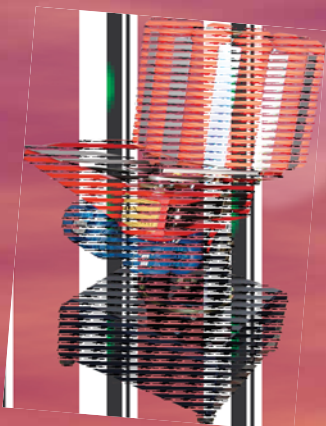
