Come & Try Clay Target Shooting

Melbourne Gun Club

Sunday February 5 was a warm summer day in Melbourne, and it was also the day Melbourne Gun Club held a "Come and Try Clay Target Shooting" day. The event was organised and sponsored by the Shire of Yarra Ranges and the Melbourne Gun Club. The purpose was to showcase the venue for the Melbourne 2006 XVIII Commonwealth Games clay target shooting. It is a world class shooting facility located at the gateway to the picturesque Yarra Valley.

Visitors were also provided with the opportunity to experience clay target shooting, first hand.

Invitations to participate in the shooting were organised by Simon O'Callaghan, Michael Faulkner and the team from the Shire of Yarra Ranges, with applications accepted via mail and the Internet. Response to the day was overwhelming with over 500 applications. 311 applicants were placed into squads to test their skills at DTL, Skeet and Sporting disciplines, with almost everyone hitting the odd clay or two. The shooters were varied, with teenagers, young adults, mums, dads and grandparents all eager to take part. For many, this was the first time they had picked up a firearm of any type, but no one seemed to mind especially when they were smashing targets!

The squads assembled in the clubroom

where they were addressed by club President Robert Buchan and given a safety demonstration by Senior Vice President, Linden McKeon. After the safety briefing, the shooters made their way to their ground where their squad instructors met them. The instructors helped each shooter with stance and holding the shotgun, after which the shooter experience the thrill of shooting at a target.

Our local member for Evelyn, the Honourable Heather McTaggart addressed the shooters. She spoke of the State Governments commitment to shooting sports and how her enjoyment for shooting has lead her to become the reigning Victorian Parliamentary Clay

PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT 2005

It is with pleasure I again bring to you my 2005 Annual Report, my third as President of the Australian Clay Target Association.

National Championships were again held in all disciplines with the standard of competition continuing to improve. This year the OD Nationals went to Brisbane where some fine score were produced and visiting shooters from China took many of the titles. The 2005 DTL Nationals were held at the West Australian Gun Club and my thanks go to the committee of that club on presenting of their grounds. It is a credit to the members of your club. Due to the continuing development of the National Ground the Skeet Nationals were held at the Cecil Park clay target club. Again the grounds were excellently prepared and my thanks also go to that committee.

We will show a loss on operations for 2005 with some \$110,00 being spent on the upgrade to the National Grounds in preparation for the World DTL Championships. However a surplus is expected from both the World DTL Championships and National Championships, which will put the Association back in the 'black' for 2006. Those of you that have attended the National Ground will agree we now have a National Shooting Ground to be proud of. This has only been achieved by a few hard working people from behind the scenes.

Staff changes continue at the National Office. In the Accounts Department Tina Hoban has resigned and was replaced by Diane Regan. Unfortunately, Diane has also resigned and she has now been replaced by



Rowena Spiranac. Rowena comes to the Association with a wide range of experience and will be an asset. Despite the changes Andy with the continued help of the other staff members continue to proceed first class efforts. I would like to offer them my thanks on your behalf.

National Executive Members continue to contribute. Glenn O'Brien, former Executive Member from Western Australia, has been appointed as a Director of the newly found Australian International Shooting Ltd (AISL), formally the Australian Shooting Association (ASA). Due to his appointment Glenn was required to resign from our Executive. Glenn continues to represent our association and indeed all shooting in general. Geoff Faulkes replaced Glenn as the delegate from Western Australia. Victorian delegate Len Cook has also been replaced with Lynne Curtis as the Victorian delegate. Many hours of tireless work is put in by the Executive and I would like to extend, on behalf of the members, our sincere gratitude towards those Executive members that have retired.

As mentioned earlier the newly formed AISL replaces the ASA. The AISL is a more streamlined organisation and in my opinion is capable of a better effort in respect of all international shooting events. ACTA representation at the AISL will insure a close working relationship which will be beneficial to the Association.

Membership numbers continue to show a modest increase for the third year in a row. An initiative by the

National Executive was taken this year to introduce "ACTA Complimentary Limited Membership". Since its inception some 236 new members have been introduced to our sport. All clubs were issued with two certificates to use as they see fit. These certificates are an ideal way of introducing a friend to the sport of clay target shooting. These certificates will again be issued to all clubs in 2006 and I encourage all members to use them to bolster their ranks.

Our Hall of Fame continues to grow. The induction ceremony that was held in Western Australia was once again a great success with Jack McGrath, Sperry Marshall, Bill Stevens, Jack Headon and Pud Burgess being inducted. Russell Mark and guest presenter Steve Atkins did a great job. The hall of Fame dinner is turning out to be the highlight of the year.

The ACTA Junior Development squad continues to grow. A new pathway from the ACTA Junior Development Squad to the AISL Junior Camp has now been established. This allows for developing juniors to progress through to a higher level of training. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Greg Chan, AISL shotgun coach, for his assistance in developing this program. My thanks also to the ACTA Junior Development Squad staff for their continued support.

As mentioned last year a major sponsorship agreement has been signed between Beretta Australia and the ACTA. Beretta Australia has supplied the ACTA with 15 Mattarelli Double Rise Traps together with 16 skeet traps for installation at the National Shooting Ground. The sponsorship package is by far the biggest ever for our association. This puts our ground in a position of being the premier shooting range in the Southern Hemisphere and will ensure a successful 2006 World & DTL Championships. My thanks to Beretta for their help and I look forward to many years of mutual benefit.

I await 2006, a big and historical year for our Association and salute 2005 as being a year of monumental development.

I thank you all for your support and look forward to your continued effort.

Good luck to all of our shooters at the Melbourne 2006 XVIII Commonwealth Games.



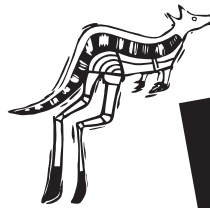

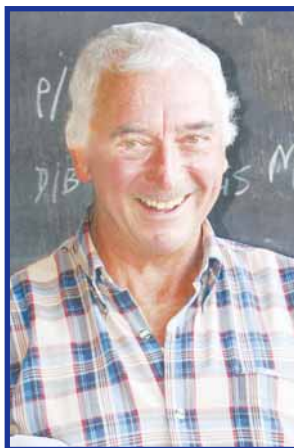

Tasmanian Trap Carnival

The Tasmanian Clay Target Association Inc held its annual Trap Carnival at the Tasmanian Gun Club at Nile Road Evandale over the period 26th - 29th January 2006. Conditions were excellent but quite windy, making the competition reasonably difficult. However the four days were nice sunny days with moderate hot northerly wind, an excellent turn up saw 174 shooters compete over the period. Again, this carnival was very successful and the biggest held for many years.

The carnival was shot over 6 Canterbury automatic traps. There were 53 shooters from the mainland in attendance to keep the locals honesty and from all indications they would all like to be back next year if possible. A large contingent of the mainland shooters made their way from Western Australia and I understand they will be back next year.

The Tasmanian Gun Club has installed two new layouts featuring a full concrete walk around on 15-16 metres. These layouts have two new ultra modern trap houses with lift up lids and swing out backs to make setting the traps a breeze along with reloading of the Canterbury automatic traps. Shooters were delighted by these two layouts which both have excellent backgrounds.

This carnival has now become a truly national event, attracting more and more shooters annually from the northern states.

With the airport and accommodation less than 10 minutes away from the Tasmanian Gun club and, as one well travelled West Australian put it, "the best background I have ever shot over!!!" making it one of the better shooting destinations in Australia.

Some very good competition was seen, again over 40 people shot the 50/50 in the State Double Barrel Championship culminating in a marathon shoot off between Ray Collinson and Phillip Headon with the final score of 555/555 being required to win.

Ray Collinson had to put his hand in his pocket to buy break badges for 400, 500 and 600 straight DTL before the weekend finished.

The Overall High Gun for the three days of carnival was won by Shane Yates with 344/350, dropping only two targets in Double Rise, one in the Handicap and three in Single Barrel and shooting the Double Barrel and the Pointscore events clean, a pretty good effort all round.

State team eliminations were also extremely tight with 7 points down in 250 needed to get a place in the 15-man squad.

The Tasmanian Clay Target Association Inc ran two events on Thursday, Australia Day. A 75 target Champion of Champions and a High Roller Event, which consisted of 100 targets Pointscore with a 25 target Pointscore final. The High Roller event was very well received and should be a feature for all future carnivals. The winner of this event was Mr Geoff Faulkes of Western Australia shooting a 373/375 to win from Nicky Brown of Tasmania with a 372/375.

Nicky was finally able to sleep on the Thursday night after psyching himself for the previous week so as not to disappoint his backers.

Geoff has already said he will donate a prestigious Belt Buckle each year to the winner and the TCTA will maintain a trophy with annual winners names inscribed. Next year's event is sure to draw a much larger contingent of shooters making it a very worthwhile purse for the winner.

Spare a thought for the wheelchair clay target shooters who never have the advantage of having both feet firmly planted on the lanes. Merely rubber tyres kissing the concrete at best. Phillip Consalvo of the

Richmond River Gun Club is one such sportsman. Phillip served his country in the Australian Army serving a sixteen-month deployment in South Vietnam in 1968.

Three months after returning to Australia Phillip was a passenger in a vehicle, which was involved in an accident. He received injuries, which left him a paraplegic. About six years ago, after trying many sports, Phillip took up clay target shooting with the Richmond River Gun Club. He now holds the position of Assistant Secretary/Treasurer. Psychological Skills for Shooting

LIES WE LIVE BY

One current approach to dealing with everyday problems that human's face is called "cognitive-behaviour therapy". Put simply, this approach refers to our behaviours being influenced or affected by our thinking. If our thinking causes problem behaviours, then changing the thoughts will lead to behaviours changing.

As a cognitive-behavioural therapist, this is important when helping clients deal with the issues they bring to counselling. This is also important in helping athletes improve their skills and performance. For example, if a shooter doesn't like right hand swingers, then it's likely that his thoughts will tell him he cannot shoot them. This may cause him to tense up and doubt his ability to shoot the target when he sees it. The combination of tension and self-doubt will lead to him miss the target and reinforce his belief that he cannot shoot these targets.

Recently my wife, Barbara, bought a book called "Great Lies we live by" written by Dr Stephanie Burns. This book, is essential reading as part of the Parelli Natural Horsemanship course that Barbara is completing. This course looks at being a better horseman by understanding how horses think and behave. Stephanie Burns has a background in teaching adults and together with Linda and Pat Parelli they have put together a program to get people to enjoy their sport more by understanding both the horse and themselves more. The book is written in two parts and in this article I want to examine the first part which explores the lies we tell ourselves that hinder our ability to learn, grow and develop. As you read down the list of lies that impact on our ability, remember that when we shoot we are in fact learning and trying to improve: be it to win a national championship or achieve a personal best. These lies get in the way of learning, improving and having fun.

Lie No. 1 I am stupid. Whilst you might think you are stupid, look at what you have learned over your lifetime. We are all learning all the time. Believing that your stupid only gives you an excuse not to try to learn because you think that you will not be able to achieve what you are expecting.

Lie No. 2 I am a failure. Failing is an interesting concept. Whilst it is possible that we do not pass an exam, this doesn't mean that we are a failure. It may mean that we didn't prepare properly, we were anxious, or we hadn't generalised the skills well enough. Burns believes that learning requires incorporating all the steps needed in moving from incompetence to competent. Getting something wrong or failing may be an important step in eventually learning the skill. Failure often occurs because we haven't learnt to think differently and we keep trying to do the same thing and thereby continue to make the same mistake.

Lie No. 3 I need talent. Most people who perform well do so because they were taught properly, practise often and persevere. They also have a belief in their own ability. Talent is something that comes once you've learnt the skill because you are able to effectively set goals and are persistent in achieving them.

Lie No. 4. Learning just happens. Learning happens when we make

the choice to improve a skill, concept or knowledge. This choice may be a subconscious thought but it happens easier if we are able to break the task up into smaller parts and learn the foundation skills first and then when these have been mastered move onto the more complicated parts. An important aspect is that learning occurs faster and easier if we are having fun at the same time.

Lie No. 5. I am not bothered by what other people think of me. I said earlier in a previous article "what other think of me is none of my business". Whilst this is a great credo to live by it is very difficult to attain because we all have expectations of our self and often believe that we need to live up to the expectations of others as well. Tim Gallwey, author of the Inner Game of Golf, believes that to perform well we need to rid ourselves of the judgements of our performance both our own and those of others.

Lie No.6. Concentrate on your mistakes and not on your achievements. This has to be the greatest lie of all. If you focus on what you do wrong then you'll keep making the same mistake. For the shooter, it is important to look at what you are doing right when you hit the targets. Then explore what happened when you missed. Correct the problem and then go back to what you did right and do that again. Focus on the success.

Lie No. 7. We all learn the same. It would be easy here to become very technical and explore differences in perception and information processing, learning styles; visual, auditory and kinaesthetic. But I won't because it probably doesn't matter. What matters is that as a learner you are motivated, encouraged and enjoy the teaching/learning process.

Part of learning is to take risks. However formal education usually teaches us that risk taking is dangerous. By dangerous, I mean dangerous to our self-esteem or self- concept. If you were to walk into a kindergarten class and ask, "who can sing or who can draw?" The whole class would enthusiastically put up their hands. By year three, the same questions would be answered by only half of the class putting up their hands. By year six, it may be only five or six children, and by year twelve, it would be one or two at best. To effectively learn, be prepared to take risks, try differently and have fun. If we think that we can do something, then our thoughts will lead to actions that will prove ourselves right.

Next month I will continue to explore Stephanie Burns book "Great Lies we live by" by looking at the eleven essential lessons.

Short Gun Shoot at Echuca

A 50 Target Skeet Championship was the first event shot over two layouts and although there was some dedicated Skeet shooters competing not one possible was posted, also no shoot off was required as scores were able to determine all winning positions. 48/50 was the top score and it gave Bendigo member Darren Hansford the Overall & AA grade trophy. A 1st was Deniliquin shooter Rob Collicoat on 47/50. B 1st Echuca member Peter Sing on 45/50. C grade 1st was another Echuca shooter Ian Gebhardt with a score of 46/50.

Event two was a 25 Target Victorian North East Zone Single Barrel Tower Championship. These events was never going to be easy with the targets pre-set to 75 meters and a north wind pushing them another 15, and with only one shot allowed scores were never going to be brilliant. However two shooters managed to come in with only two targets down. Rob Collicoat and Murray Roberts both on 23/25, and after a very short shoot off which lasted only five targets Rob let his fifth escape giving Murray the Overall and A grade Sash and trophy on a 28/30 score. B grade 1st was M Gribben 18/25, and Rob Collicoat took out C grade with his 27/30 score. The Handicapper was

looking very closely at his scorecard for future adjustment after his excellent shooting.

The third event was a 25 Target DTL Pointscore. Rob Collicoat was this time shooting in DTL as a AA grade competitor collected that grades trophy on a clean 75/75 score. A grade was collected by Max Gribben on 73/75. Another perfect score shot by Echuca member Warrick Kelvy gave him the B grade trophy 75/75. Warrick has only been a shooter for a short time but he is improving so fast that he should be in the top grade before too long. It is very pleasing for older shooters to see new shooters like Warrick coming into the ranks, and particularly shooting so well. C grade was not contested in this DTL event which is a concern, although new shooters today seem to be of a quality that ensures they only stay in C grade a very short time before moving up a grade. Another enjoyable day of Clay Target sport ended in early time at 5pm to allow travellers an easy trip home.

It's Your Call

There are many occasions where the question of foot position occurs and the question of when a violation has occurred. Most Referees are able to use commonsense but we seem to get many requests for interpretation of the Rule.

In the first instance we have a shooter with one of his feet outside the shooting mark. His front foot is as close as possible to the actual firing mark allocated to him but his other foot is well back and protrudes into the handi-cap mark behind him. You are aware that there is a requirement for the shooter to have his feet within the square. In this case you know that the shooting square in question is of the Regulation 1 Square Metre. You now want to make a judgement and ruling on this matter for Trapshooting. Is it legal or do you caution the shooter and call Lost Target if he continues.

IT'S YOUR CALL.

If you rule that the shooter can continue in this manner, you are quite correct.

*Looking at **Rule 1.10(e)** it requires a shooter to have his feet within the 1 metre square shooting mark allocated to him. However, we should also be aware that in many of the older shooting facilities some of the shooting squares are less than 1 square metre. Sound judgement and a cautionary approach to apparent stance violations are very necessary in these instances because the shooter is entitled to have a full square metre in which to stand and shoot. The major violation is where his front foot is forward of his shooting mark.*

*As an addendum, I had an instance referred to me for regrading a shooter who had a flinching problem and who, after missing with his first barrel involuntarily stepped forward and discharged his second barrel with his foot forward of the mark. The result of the second barrel naturally was **Lost Target**.*

I am glad that Bill Allen has bought up the issue of shooting in sandals (March 06, Pg 54 CTSN). There is no doubt that this issue has probably been discussed at a number of Clubs and some members may wear or attempt to wear shoes with no upper protection whilst shooting.

The ACTA Shooting Rules clearly indicates a requirement in respect to footwear and dress in general (Rule 4.14j). In interpreting this ruling, shooting in thongs/scuffs is prohibited. There are no 'definitions' within the Rules to assist in interpreting the Rules in general. As this is the case and Mr Allen has specifically referred to sandals, one must turn to the Oxford Dictionary to get a meaning for this word. The dictionary clearly states that a sandal in part is, 'a kind of shoe, consisting of a sole of leather or other material fastened to the foot by thongs or straps'. From this definition it can clearly be seen that sandals belong to the 'thong family' and therefore should not be worn on the tracks whilst shooting.

One could only imagine the criticism that would be levelled at the Association or the embarrassment to members in a Civil Court proceeding should a person be seriously injured whilst wearing inappropriate footwear. I would expect blame would be levelled towards club management for allowing open footwear to be worn. Therefore the onus is on management to ensure that the Rules are adhered to at all times.

P.S. I'm sure that 'Roman Sandals' (Pg. 58) would not meet the criteria also.

Dear Your Say

Last month I spoke of the problems with our current grading system - identifying them and rectifying them.

Now I would like to finish this submission by detailing a system that will benefit clubs, and will give some incentive to lower grade shooters to better themselves.

As previously mentioned, most clubs put on identical trophies for winners of graded events. Because of this, it is not unusual to hear some shooters say they don't see any benefit in going up a grade because the trophies are still the same. Now, if you knew you could win a lot more by going up a grade, would you stay in a low grade and shoot for a pittance? I don't think so! Unless of course you are a "Professional A, B or C Grader" with more money than sense, who picks and chooses which events to lose, and which ones to win, or try to win.

Now to my suggestion that can benefit clubs and shooters alike.

In order to give our new shooters (novices) and the lower grade (C and B) shooters some incentive, there must be a reward for going up a grade, and there is only one real way of doing that - by putting on cash prizes.

Now some clubs already do that, but they still put on equal amounts for each grade, which doesn't solve the problem and is not all that conducive to self-improvement.

The following however, is an example of what I would call a 'progressive percentage prize system' and is I believe, something most clubs should have a good look at, or better still, trial for say three, six or even 12 months so they can see the benefits.

A club puts on a shoot where 50 shooters nom up for a graded D/B event off 15 metres and pay \$12.00 each, giving the club a pool of \$600. The club then takes sixty percent, \$360, to cover costs etc which leaves a prize pool of \$240. They then divide the prize pool up as follows:

	<i>First Only</i>	<i>First</i>	<i>Second</i>
AA Grade - 35% =	\$84.00	\$50.00	\$34.00
A Grade - 30% =	\$72.00	\$43.00	\$29.00
B Grade - 20% =	\$48.00	\$29.00	\$19.00
C Grade - 15% =	\$36.00	\$22.00	\$14.00

The figures for first and second are calculated using 60/40 of first only and rounded to the nearest dollar.

The main advantages of this system are:

1. Club Managements don't have to spend unnecessary time and effort shopping all over town looking for trophies that are different from last weeks/months competition - cash is the prize.
2. There is less work for the Club Secretary or Treasurer to do, which makes this system more efficient and makes their jobs less demanding.
3. The more shooters who nom up, the more the club has for a prize pool, and the more that can be won by shooters.
4. Shooters love cash as a prize because cash pays for, or goes towards paying for noms for future shoots, ammunition, petrol, food and any other shooting related expense.

Finally, I look forward to feedback on these suggestions over the March and April issues of the CTSN, and hopefully other shooters might come up with even better ways of doing things that benefit clubs and shooters alike.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
