



Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

FREEZING

The original focus for studying psychological skills for shooting, came from a request by a friend to help with a problem he had freezing on the trigger. At the time I thought I knew a lot about psychology and a lot about shooting; what I didn't understand was the psychology of shooting. So back to the books and the study, writing these articles and talking with shooters, and in the process, I have learnt heaps and hopefully helped some people out along the way.

But even after the study and realising what goes on the minds of most shooters, I still wasn't sure how to help people who would freeze on the trigger. This problem must be worldwide because in the September/October 2005 issue of "Gunshot" the Official Journal of the New Zealand Clay Target Association, there was a reprinted article from Pull! Magazine called Trigger Defrost and looked at three theories and approaches behind freezing on the trigger.

The first theory involves Self-Hypnosis. The article quotes Steve Mycoe a sports psychologist who believes that trigger freeze is a common problem based in the emotional right side of the brain and is a fear response. He continues by saying that "there are several varieties of trigger freeze all of which are unconscious in nature. Some experience random freeze that seems to have no real pattern, some only freeze on the second barrel of a shot and some people are completely disabled from shooting altogether." He believes that in the case of trigger freeze, an unconscious anchor has been set up, and

RULE CHANGE EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

At the May full Executive meeting of the ACTA the following rule was amended due to safety reasons and will take effect from 12 May 2006:

Rule 3.32(a)iii amended to read:

When setting up a sporting clay course, the club concerned must make sure that traps and boundary markers are positioned in such a way that they afford maximum safety, to the trapper, shooters and also any spectators. A penalty of one target can be imposed by club management upon any shooter failing to observe the boundary markers when upon the shooting mark.

fires automatically the freezing response behaviour, when a particular stimulus occurs during or prior to shooting. He believes the way to address the problem is to consider the physical differences and the arousal levels or states that the shooter accesses both when the trigger freeze occurs and when it doesn't. There will be a marked difference between the two. The next step is to use similar strategies that are successful with dealing with phobias. Using a form of systematic desensitisation that allows the shooter to reduce the fear by focusing learning to relax and then using it visualised situations and then in real situations.

The second approach mentioned in the article involves Life Coaching. Life coaching is a cognitive behavioural approach that examines a persons thoughts and how they affect their behaviours. Basically, irrational thoughts and beliefs lead to behaviours which have negative outcomes. According to Life Coach Paul Toms (featured in the article) "trigger freeze can be attributed to self-sabotage. Self-doubt is the underlying cause." I have stated often that the only reason we miss is because of self-doubt. The shooter believes he can't hit the target or that he/she doesn't deserve to win. He continues," therefore to serve this limiting belief they carry out an act of self sabotage; in this case freezing on the trigger and failing to hit the target. This then proves to themselves that their belief in their sense of failure was correct.

The final approach deals with distracting the brain at the time when it would be focusing on freezing on the trigger. This method was included by a reader of Pull! Magazine who is referred to only as T.Poskett. Thinking trigger freeze was due to recoil, Poskett made several changes to guns, stocks, ammunition, etc in an effort to reduce recoil but this didn't reduce the incidence of trigger freeze. He suggests the following method:

"On entering the shooting station adopt the shooting position (with an empty gun) and take a few practise swings along the targets imaginary flight path, but with the index fingers of both hands pointing along the gun parallel with the barrels: one down the forend and one down the side of the action. When composed and ready for your shot, load the gun as normal and call for the target. Again use the method with both index fingers used as pointers. This means the normal trigger finger is used to point-out line and lead and the second finger of the shooting hand is used on the trigger to take the shot. At first this will tend to feel awkward but it can be practised at home until it becomes second nature." What is happening now is that subconsciously the brain is thinking about something else and you can get on to shoot the target. This is like quietening the mind so that you can focus, a bit like humming so that you cant hear the instructions and self-talk going on in your head. I would be interested in knowing if this method works, so if you have a problem with freezing give it a try, and let me know the outcome. Using a combination of all three methods should help in elimination freezing on the trigger.



The 2007 OD National **Championships**

You are the appointed Referee for a 30 target event which is to be shot over three traps. Eg. 10 targets on trap 1 10 targets on trap 2 and 10 targets on trap 3.

This is the second event of the day for each shooter, so no eye opener is involved.

No 3 shooter prepares for his first shot and has an apparent malfunction. Your examine his gun and determine that the safety catch was on. You quite correctly rule "No Target" under Rule 1.07 (viii).

You complete that set of 10 targets and move to the next two traps in turn to complete the full 30 targets. However, No 3 shooter has repeated his indiscretion in that at each of the two traps he subsequently visited, you find that his safety catch had been applied for the first of his shots at each of the next two traps

What do you rule in each case?

IT'S YOUR CALL.

If you ruled "No target" on each occasion you would be quite correct.

Rule 1.07(viii) says that "No target shall be allowed for the first target of any visit to a trap if a safety catch is engaged. While many may argue that the intent of this rule is to apply to only the start of the event, the rule is quite clear as it is printed. You will note also that the same rule is mentioned in Rule 1.10 (b)

If you have any questions regarding rules or situations where you were unsure please write to the ACTA. I look forward to hearing from you.

I am grateful to the assistance of our Rules Chairman and his committee for their ongoing advice and encouragement with this project.

READER'S QUESTION

At NSW Gun Club Southern Zone DD in shoot off, caller refused the target (claimed slow pull) Manual Release. Partner shot his but missed callers bird. Refs call was LOST. Caller had previously claimed 2 slow pulls on sighter at commencement of shoot off. Experienced Ref told him he could only get the target out as quickly as trap released them.

Lost seems correct to me and many others including experienced DD shooters in country NSW as Partner accepted target (not a slow pull), shot his but missed callers bird.

Read your ACTA article but it was silent on this issue if partner accepts bird.

A call by Ref after the event to someone in Wagga that night confirmed lost target. But is this the correct answer?

Denis Pearson

Thank you for your inquiry Denis. You have raised an interesting point and one that has some complications as we don't know exactly and entirely what the Referee said to the shooter previously.

Under Rule 1.17(c) the ruling should have been "No Target".

However, you make reference to concerns that the Referee had about the Caller's refusal of targets previously. In this case the Referee may have been exercising his judgement under the Refusal Rule GRTS 17. If this were so, then the call of Lost Target would have been correct and the shooter should have been informed that the decision for Lost Target was made under GRTS 17. It would have been a wise move by the Referee to warn the shooter about the possibility of losing targets if he (the shooter) continued to refuse targets which the Referee considered acceptable. It seems that the Referee relied on his initial discussions with the shooter regarding perceived slow releases to justify his ruling of Lost Target.

As the Referee had informed the shooter that he was unable to get the targets out quicker, and the shooter apparently made no request under rule 4.22 (c) (Replacement of Referee) he should have no further complaints. It is also apparent that the other shooter or shooters were happy with the manner in which the targets were released including the shooters partner.

It is understood that the Referee was very experienced and that a change from Photo Release to manual release had its predictable outcomes where, despite out best efforts with the button, the targets do come out more slowly.

On the facts presented it does not seem at all unreasonable that "Lost Target" was both warranted and proper.

History of the Richmond River Clay Target Club

This club was started at Casino around 1946. The shooting ground was in the Casino Racecourse, now the Showground Racecourse. The club used a square steel tank for a trap house and a hand operated 'Plus Trap'. Singles or doubles could be thrown using this machine. Betting was allowed, and quite large amounts were wagered on each shot, first or second barrel.

The first club was called Richmond River Gun Club. As most of the members and shooters came from Lismore or the Lower Rivers, it was decided to move to Lismore, due to the condition of the road and the time taken to drive over to Casino. The club was then called the Lismore Gun Club. Jim Bruggy, a club member in Casino Street South Lismore, just past D & L Mowers, owned the first shooting area. There is an area behind these buildings referred to as the Duck Pond. Members would shoot over the pond using the Plus Trap.

Around 1949 the club set up a more permanent ground in Three Chain Road, shooting over the original Aerodrome about 500 metres from the Lismore Casino Road. The club had a small clubhouse and toilets, made out of timber with concrete floors. There were two shooting layouts using 'Snipe Traps', which took four people to man and operate.

One man to cock and fire the machine, one to load targets onto the throwing plate, one to referee and one to score. The trap houses were of brick much as today, with concrete tracks measured in yards not metres, 16 yards equals close to 15 metres.

A lever 5-foot long operated the Snipe Trap, 30 yards from behind the machine. A 1/2 inch pipe passed through a two inch pipe underground, under the middle lane. On pushing the lever forward to

cock the trap, and returning it to just past vertical, it was ready for releasing the target. On the shooters' call, the lever was given a sharp pull backwards releasing the target. These traps were geared so that when the lever was worked the trap would change direction, but with care you could be fairly sure where the next target would go. This was called 'reading the trap'. After an extra piece was added to the device, it was near impossible to read.

Cost of nominations were about one third of a weeks wage at that time, around \$48.00 to \$50.00, making nominations \$16.00 to \$18.00 for around 70 to 75 targets (and people complain about the cost today!). Open two-day shoots were held on the last week of January. Up to 70 competitors would line up to shoot, with canteens of cutlery as very popular prizes.

Clay targets came parked in old wooden banana cases, with 200 targets per case. 5 clays were wrapped together in white newsprint paper and then packed in sawdust. These had then to be unpacked, unwrapped and packed into the trap house. A lot of clays arrived broken, but clubs were allowed a 10% discount for these, which were probably added onto the price before hand. Targets were always black or white, only becoming available in colours over the past few years

The grass at that ground was cut with a scythe and later with a hand model Victa Mower. A power walk behind mower was given to the club, a dangerous piece of equipment, as there was no protection around the solid cutting blades.

Night shoots were held now using the large lights, which are at the present ground and white clays were always used. A couple of complaints came from motorists, as the road went behind the Williams River Steel building in those days and came straight



towards a 1500-watt light. These lights were designed especially for night shooting and were used for the 1956 games in Melbourne.

During the early period only a few members had under and over shot guns, Side by side and automatics were the go. 30 inch barrels with full choke and Icil special cartridges with 1 1/4 ounces of shot (men had to be men to stand up to these). Around 1956 Japanese under and over shot guns started to arrive with chrome lined barrels and newer designed stocks, making this type of gun more suitable and cheaper for the sport of clay shooting. Cartridges then came back to 1 1/8 ounces of shot. Clothing was mostly collars and tie, long trousers and golf type shoes with rubber soles.

The first electric trap to be purchased was a DAMO (Dan Mott), which the club still has. It was on wheels so that it could be Wheeled back to the clubhouse, as the smallest amount of rain would see it standing in water. During the 1974 flood there was 5 1/2" of water inside the clubhouse (along with a couple of black snakes!)

As the law was then, prior to 1958, no shooting of any kind was allowed on Sundays. This was later changed to allow competition shooting on Sundays. We were then permitted to carry guns to and from and use while at a registered club. This made it easier to hold a full day of shooting. Club days before this were held on Saturday afternoons as most people worked on Saturday mornings. We often went to Ballandean on Sundays, but were taking a risk by just having a gun in the car. It was a rush to get to the club and shoot 70 targets in the afternoon. Night shoots were held Friday nights but with only about 35 targets.

Events began with a 5-target eye opener. 20 target events were shot 10 per layout, or if it was a 25 target event, they were shot 12 first trap and 13 the next. You were not allowed to move from the track you were on until the last in the squad had fired. Then the referee would say change and everybody would move over one lane with No 5 moving around to No 1 track. To shoot 50 straight was to be penalised 1 yard, 100 straight 2 yards, but this was quite rare. Most shooting was from handicap, as the common mark was not heard of. Championships were off 16 yards but were not graded. There were around 100 rules and regulations in those days, now there is closer to 200.

During.1975 the club was told it would have to move (we paid no rent for that ground), so a search was on for a new site. When the Lismore Council was told that the Casino Council had offered land next to the Casino Rifle Range, they quickly offered the area we now own, if our club paid the cost of the transfer of the deeds of this land. The club owns another 100 metres or so north of No.3 trap house.

Bill Durheim, a past club member and secretary and council employee, was able to procure machinery to level the present ground for both trap layouts and clubhouse. All moveable goods and equipment were moved from South Lismore.

The old clubhouse was sold for removal, giving us a bit of cash to start the present grounds. It has been said that where we are now is a new club altogether, but as history shows it is the same club which has enjoyed 53 years of continuous shooting in four different venues.

Plans were drawn up for the first trap house and tracks for No 1 layout. Working bees were held to get the ground ready for the first shoot. An official opening day was held in 1977. The then Mayor and a Member Of Parliament were present with the mayor firing the opening shot. Only one shoot day was missed owing to the move

Money was borrowed from the National Bank to improve and enlarge the grounds and equipment six members went as guarantors. The clubhouse was built but had no front verandah or kitchen/storeroom at the back. These were added, as money became available.

Number 2 Layout was next to be built, with the third trap house coming later and the ball trap was the last to be constructed. Around this, time the name was changed again to The Richmond River Clay Target Club as a couple of business, people from other towns who were asked for donations, would not support anything with the name Lismore attached.

As more cash became available, mainly from shooter licences and

later gun buy back, more traps were purchased. The club now had a total of 8, plus a few hand models for sporting clay shoots. A ride on mower was purchased with the help of a landowner to do the mowing. Previously it had been done by a large walk behind power model had been said was a danger to any who came too close. These have helped the appearance of the grounds. Electric fence equipment was purchased to try and keep the cattle out, but it wasn't until a four barbed wire fence was erected was this achieved,

Building up of the club has never been easy and without voluntary labour and donations of all types, the club would not be at the stage it is now. It has been said the further we go the steeper the hill and the harder the push. Most people do not realise the amount of work needed to keep a club such as ours moving forward. They also believe most of the nominations paid are profits, but things like council rates and insurances take a large portion of money received.

If any person can help toward making the club any better, it is a sure thing that they will not be knocked back, as there is always something that can be done.

A large amount of free timber for building and cement boxing for the tracks came from 55kms west of Casino. North Coast Plasterers lined the clubhouse and Casino Roof Trusses supplied the framing for the kitchen storeroom. Most of the tables, stools and benches were donated or built by a club member. So it can be seen that without these donations, labour and assistance from club members, we would not be as we are today

There have, only been two complaints regarding the club one from an elderly lady who did not understand what all the shooting was about, and another from someone who believed that people should not be allowed to own firearms

As points of interest the original name of the A.C.T.A. - Australian Clay Target Association was A.C.P.T.S.A. or Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association.

It has always been advisable to leave out any word that may lead people to think we are using live game, words like 'birds' and 'kill' should not be used.

The office staff has not been forgotten, but there have been too many over the years to mention everyone here.

Since finishing the history of the Richmond River Clay Target Club in 1999 the club is still going forward thanks to voluntary labour and the donations of willing working club members.

The clubhouse was completely painted outside by a club member and a garden established. The fence at the northern end of the grounds was shifted for the third time to allow more space for vehicles to park inside and a better eye to be kept on cars and equipment in them.

Two automatic traps were made and installed eliminating the worry of a person staying in the trap house at all times to load clays onto the machines. A cement pathway was laid from the clubhouse to layouts 1 and 2. Lismore City Council donated \$2000 towards this work and Tursa Employment Services donated the labour force while a club member supervised. Cement walkways were laid around the shooting lanes so it would be safer to walk between the shooting lanes.

A very large shipping container was purchased to house the clay targets; these can be off loaded into the container instead of double handling as in the past. The container will also house club equipment and the trap for low house skeet. It will save the cost of a protective wall between the skeet and other shooting layouts. Electric power cables have been laid for the skeet machines, this work was done on a cost for parts plus voluntary labour arrangement with quite a few club members and a couple of machines to dig the trenches for the under ground cables.

The skeet ground had to be levelled, this was done on a reciprocal basis with the company doing the work to dump filling at the northern end of the club grounds in case the club at sometime wants a trench layout as well. The building of the skeet high house is well under way and it is hoped to have a working bee in the near future to finish the skeet ground. A special elevated seat has been made for referees and scorers to be able to see over the competitors during events.

The club is now in the process of raising money to purchase a high grade DTL trap that does everything except for loading it's own clays. A new ride on 17 1/2 HP mower has just been purchased which will make mowing the grounds much easier and quicker.

We were saddened with the loss of an old stalwart of the club Ken Gibbon owing to a motor vehicle accident during January 05.

We now have installed a Canterbury trap and may have another mid 06.

ISSF WORLD CUP QINGYUAN - CHINA

Dear Your Say

In the last few editions of the CTSN there has been much written on the inequality of prizes, sweepstakes cheating and the grading system.

Have I bored you yet?

Too much emphasis is being employed for a handful of so-called cheats, bandits - whatever you want to call them, and forgetting about the majority with regard to all the new rule changes.

I refer at this stage to Rule 2.01 (in) regarding compulsory downgrading.

Example A AA-grade shooter shoots at 600 targets, three consecutive groups of 200 at less than 97%. Rule 2.01 (in) downgrades the shooter to A grade. We all have bad days, which may include bad weather, windy conditions and the like.

Example A AA-grade shooter shoots eight consecutive rounds of 25 targets double barrel clean - 100%, however loses every shoot-off early, therefore shooting below 97%. This scenario, along with the example above, makes it virtually impossible for a AA-grade shooter to shoot better than 97% over a period of time.

Now he/she then shoots at another 600 targets, three consecutive rounds of 200 targets at less than 94%. Rule 2.01 (in) clearly states that the shooter must be downgraded; however, rule 2.01 (1) says that a shooter can only be downgraded ONE grade. A shooter having attained AA grade cannot be downgraded to B even though he/she has shot the scores to do so.

Whilst all this is going on all the shooter wanted to do was remain in AA grade.

Who is he cheating by wanting to stay in AA grade? Only himself. Now he must come down a grade and when he walks to the trophy table at presentation time the murmurs start, "Bloody AA grader in A". Makes you feel right at home, all fuzzy inside.

Getting back to the query:

Which rule overrides which, Rule 2.01(m) or Rule 2.01(i) I would like to hear the judges verdict in a court of law.

My Solution: A shooter can only come down one grade per calendar year, so long as he/she has shot at 1000 targets, five consecutive rounds of 200 targets double barrel from common mark (15m) at the lower percentage.

It would not matter when the first downgrade occurred; they would not be eligible for further downgrading for twelve months from that date.

Delete: Last sentence of Rule 2.01 (in). Once having attained a grade, he/she cannot elect to remain in a higher grade when due for regrading.

What I have noticed at clubs is they are using the brackets of 200 targets before the 01 January 2006 to determine the downgrading rule Rule 2.01(m).

Now this new rule took effect on 01 January 2006; therefore, the first bracket of 200 targets should start from that date, and targets shot before then play no part.

On the subject of sweepstakes:

Rule 1.29 (c) clearly states: When running graded sweeps/cash divide, each grade monies to be divided between that grade. If your club is not doing this, then it is up to the shooter to complain to club management.

Either/Or - which one is it?

Rule 1.29(d) - note at bottom.

In all events, including handicap events for cash prizes or trophies INCLUDING sweepstakes, trophies and placings shall be decided by shoot off.

Then Rule 1.29 (c) - Last sentence.

Sweepstakes at ANY competition shall be determined by scores off the gun and shoot offs shall not apply.

What the?

Cheats, Burglars, Whatever

Everybody within a club knows who these people are. It is up to the club, zone, or state handicapper to do their jobs that they have accepted to do. If not, then resign and let someone else do the job.

Can someone please find for me Rule 2.4 (g) as mentioned in Rule 2.01 (i)?

All these rules - oh what fun and jollyment!

Aren't we all having fun!

With regard to Ron Russell's letter April issue of CTSN, lower grade shooters paying the same nomination fee as AA-grade shooters are entitled to the same cash/trophy amount as the AA-grade shooter. It's called equality.

We have enough trouble keeping shooters in the sport, especially lower grade shooters, without the likes of Rule 2.01 (in), where they see much better shooters being downgraded to their grade. Some shooters will never move above the grade that they are in; they have reached their peak and for them to see much better shooters being downgraded under this rule - what hope have they, unless they do likewise and be downgraded.

Cheating! Who me?

Dear Your Say

In the April issue of the CTSN, I wrote an article suggesting a way in which both shooters and clubs alike could easily benefit. Unfortunately, I made an error which, I might add, was only picked up by two very observant individuals.

My sincere thanks goes to Walter Spackman (May CTSN) and Allan Green (June CTSN) for bringing this mistake to my attention. Well done Gentlemen! You are the only two people in Australia to notice the mistake and write your feelings on the matter.

The following is what I should have submitted for inclusion in my article, and replaces the paragraph starting with words "A Club puts on" and finishes with the words "to the nearest dollar".

A Club puts on a shoot where 50 shooters nom up for a graded D/B event off 15 metres. The Club charges different noms for the grades as follows:

AA Grade -\$15 A Grade -\$14 B Grade -\$13 and C Grade - \$12

The breakdown of shooters, by grade, is AA - 12 A - 12, B - 16 and C - 10, giving the Club a pool of \$676- The Club then takes fifty (50) percent, \$338, to cover costs which leaves a prize pool of \$338. They then divide the prize pool up as follows:

	First Only	First	Second
AA Grade - 35% =	\$118	\$71	\$47
A Grade - 30% =	\$101	\$61	\$40
B Grade - 20% =	\$68	\$41	\$27
C Grade - 15% =	\$51	\$31	\$20

The figures for first and second are calculated using 60/40 of first only and rounded to the nearest dollar, whilst the figures for first only are calculated taking the exact percentage amount to the nearest dollar.

to compete overseas and usually in No 1 position. In my book he and Bill Iles stand alone in making these teams with Roger Duthie, not that far behind them.



CONDITIONS WET AT MATHOURA






