AISL World Championship Junior Team Training Camp June 3 - 4, 2006

The interstate members of the team flew into Melbourne on the Friday evening while the Victorians arrived at the camp accommodation at around the same time.

Frankston Australia Clay Target Club played host to the camp and made available two ISSF layouts to ensure that both trap and double trap shooters were able to receive adequate time on the range.

The camp opened with each athlete being presented with their training and competition diary. This diary is kept as a record of all activity undertaken in relation to their shooting in the lead up to the World Championships in Zagreb in July.

VIS sports psychologist Sean Richardson then opened the camp by presenting a session on mental preparation and skills and how to put them into competition situations.

Massage therapy was introduced by Darien and all athletes were encouraged to try it over the duration of the camp to experience the benefits it offers.

Next came a gun and stock measuring segment utilising a professional measuring machine. With measurements recorded, each gun was then patterned to ascertain pattern height and alignment. If any problems were encountered, the stock was adjusted where possible or recommendations made to have it rectified.

The first practical shooting session was then undertaken with Greg

and Adam providing coaching and assistance. The sports scientists recorded the session on video which was then replayed to the athletes to point out any recommendations or alterations that could be made to their technique.

After lunch came the presentation on physical preparation by VIS sports scientist Bianca Share. All athletes were taken through a warm up and stretching routine that they will be expected to do before each round they shoot whether it be training or competition. Extensive VIS heart rate monitoring of some of our top ISSF shooters has proven that heart rate needs to be moderately high but more importantly under control for shooters to maximise performance.

Another practical session with Russell arriving to assist with the double trap was conducted, again with video recording of all shooters. At the conclusion of the first day the team and support personnel went back to the motel for a barbecue dinner prepared by Mandy followed by a motivational video presentation of the Commonwealth Games and a team meeting to discuss the upcoming World Championships.

This also included a presentation by the AISL sports scientist Nick Sanders on the importance of hydration and travel strategies to cope with the long flights. Results of the urine samples taken earlier in the day to test hydration were revealed with many of the athletes showing signs of dehydration even though it had only reached 18deg during the day.

Day two after their warm up session general nutrition and strategies for nutrition while travelling overseas was the topic for presentation and discussion.

This was followed by another shooting and coaching session with video feedback presented once again.

After lunch a competition for both trap and double trap was held to see if the shooters could put into practice what they had learnt.

At the conclusion of the competition a camp debrief and review was conducted. Again team expectations were emphasised and discussed. The team is charged with the responsibility of emailing in their weekly training and competition diaries with incentives being implemented for those who comply.

These camps are not only about practical shooting and coaching but also educating the athletes that there are ways to improve performance through sports science and all related services that just may add that one target that may mean a medal or not.

To those who just wish to participate I wish you well but don't expect to achieve much if you don't put much in. Attitude and commitment is everything in sport for those who wish to reach great heights.

My thanks go to all those who assisted in making this again a very well organised and run camp.

NSW NORTHERN ZONE DTL TRAP CARNIVAL Cessnock Clay Target Club



Sash Winners at Brewarrina 2006



Psychological Skills for Shooting

MENTAL PRACTISE FORMULA

I have been approached by several readers regarding putting together a "mental skills training program" for them. Whilst for most of us this in an individual thing, specific to our sport there are several common features that we should all know.

So what are the basics of a developing a mental skills training program.

Firstly, set goals. This principle is not surprising. What is the point of training and working hard if you have no idea of where you want to go or how to get there? Goal setting is an essential part of any mental skills training program and any sports psychology textbook has the basics of how to set goals.

Secondly, use a verbal or visual cue. Those readers who have been to any of my workshops will be aware of the importance of using verbal and visual cues. Verbal cues are important in reinforcing our beliefs and abilities. Positive affirmations can assist us when the going gets tough, and can help us redirect our thoughts when we need to. For the shooter visual cues can be very important in narrowing your focus and heightening your level of concentration. I use the visual cue of the gun closing and the top leaver coming across as an indicator that I need to focus on the target that will soon emerge.

Thirdly, focus on the positive. Positive thoughts are necessary to achieve in sport. However there is a big difference between positive thinking and wishful thinking. Focusing on the positive is necessary to eliminate self-doubt. Self-doubt occurs when we believe we cannot do something; shoot this target, shoot a possible, win a championship, etc, and armed with this belief we end up sabotaging our own effort and fail. To eliminate self doubt we need to trust in our own ability.

The next principle is to build in relaxation time. Without relaxation you can end up overtrained. This will lead to not being focused, bored, complacent, unmotivated and tired. Relaxation allows you to focus on your breathing, lowering your heart and respiration rate, blood pressure and gives you time to either focus on your thoughts or to let your thoughts go. Relaxation allows you to recuperate both mental and physically.

Finding the right tension level is the next basic principle. There is an optimum level somewhere between being fully relaxed and hypervigilent. The right level will depend on the individual and the sport. For shooting there is a difference between when we are actually shooting and the time each shot. Between shots is the time when we need to focus on our breathing and where possible relax. Our arousal level needs to arise as we prepare to shoot and as we shoot we should be fully focused on the target and the task at hand. Then after the shot we can relax again.

The sixth principle is to take a look at your opponents. Each of us has strengths and weaknesses and we should remember that those we are competing against also have strengths and weaknesses. We shouldn't give up just because we see a "good shot" drive into the car park. We all have bad days and this could be his. We should visualise ourselves competing, visualise the others shooting and visualise yourself shooting every target and winning.

The next principle probably means more in golf than in shooting but it does have some relevance. Study the course. Be aware of all the good points about this venue and all the possible distractions; trees, power poles, wind, etc. Visualise proper moves. This is the next principle. Each sport has specific moves and it is important to visualise yourself performing the moves necessary to shoot the targets. Visualise the swing, the sight picture, the firing, recoil, the target breaking and importantly your follow through. Visualise yourself doing it all perfectly.

Imaging coping with extremes. When you are visualising don't just focus on fair-weather situations. Visualise the rain, the wind, the distractions of fellow competitors coughing, spitting shells in your direction, etc. Imagine and visualise what it will feel like to pick up the gun after shooting 100 targets, 200, 300, 400, and so on.

The next principle is to break out the video camera. Videos can be very useful in showing you what you do well and what you need to work on. Another use can be as a visualisation tool. Video tape yourself in competition, especially if you shoot all the qualifying targets. Use this tape as a pre-visualisation technique. This will work much better if it can be combined with relaxing in a tub of warm, salty water such as a floatation tank

Next it is important to see yourself winning. Build a mental picture of yourself shooting all the targets and winning the event.

If you focus on the process and stay in the present you are more able to maintain cool under pressure. Using verbal and visual cues and focusing on your breathing you are more able to remain cool and calm when it is most needed. The other important point here is practise. If you need to practise to revise and improve your technique then this is OK, but what most of us need is to practise being under pressure and this can only come from entering competitions.

The next principle is not easy but it is essential to make your emotions work for you. Emotional responses can derail good performances very quickly. Be mindful of what will trigger certain responses for you and limit thinking about these during competitions.

The last two principles are, develop your own rituals and develop pre-event rituals. Rituals have the ability to help you fucus and redirect your attention when needed. Pre-event routines can be used to narrow the focus and concentrate you attention to the task at hand.

These fifteen principles are the basic tenets of most mental skills training programs, but it must be remembered that any program should be individualised for the sport and the athlete and supervised by a qualified coach or sports psychologist if maximum gain is to be made.




and dragged them to the fire and introduced them to our locals, big mistake! Their minds now corrupted by us southerners they shot below what their card read!

You are the referee of a Double Rise event where a shooter calls for a pair of targets the first target he fires at is an illegal target (not a broken one) and misses it. The other target in the pair is quite legal and he declines to shoot at it. A delicate situation has now arisen.

He claims he has refused the target under Rule GRTS17. You are convinced that the second target is legal. There seems to be a small conflict in the rules.

What do you rule in this case?

IT'S YOUR CALL.

If you ruled "Lost" and "Lost" you would be quite correct under Rule 1.09(g) which states that if a shooter shoots at an illegal first target and the second target is legal, he must also shoot at the second target. Hence, he missed with the first barrel and has declined to shoot at the second target, which he seems compelled to do under Rule 1.09(g). By shooting at the first target he is deemed to have accepted the pair.

Naturally some doubt may have been in your mind about your decision, but in the absence of any cogent evidence of a reason for a refusal of the second target Rile 1.09(g) should stand. Obviously, an allowable baulk would alter the situation but the rule is quite clear on what procedure to follow.

Now if the reverse applies, he is not compelled to shoot at an illegal second target irrespective of whether the first target was illegal or legal even if he had shot at the first target.

Dear Sir

I am the newly appointed Secretary of the Callide Dawson Clay Target Club Inc at Biloela in Central Queensland. I have been making myself familiar with the 2006 Club secretary handbook and have noted on page 13 comments re public liability insurance.

I note that the cover does not extend to a shooting member who is not an ACTA member. This is understood, however, this has raised the query in my mind re novices we might attract both on an occasional basis and our regular "come and try" days where we might have numerous unregistered and unlicensed "shooters" shooting. We ensure they have completed the necessary paperwork, visitors book etc. they are fully supervised however the issue of insurance for these persons is a query I now have. These people are not Club or ACTA members, but could be construed as "Authorised Visitors"

Would you be able to provide or direct me toward some good sound advice on this matter.

The answer to your question is as follows:

The Australian Clay Target Association Inc provides various insurance covers including Liability Insurance to Member Clubs and Members that protects:

The Executive Committees, State Associations and Executives, District Associations and Executives, Member Clubs and Executives, Members, Range Staff, Voluntary Workers and Authorised Visitors for all sums which the insured shall become legally liable to pay as compensation [including claims costs and expenses] as a result of Personal Injury or Property Damage caused by an Occurrence in connection with the Association/Clubs activities.

A visitor can be a novice, a licensed non club member or a person from another association, these people are covered by the policy as authorised visitors. The policy does not cover licensed shooters [non members under the control of the club] who have visited the club more than 4 times in any one year because of a warranty within the policy that states: Warranted that Club Rules & Guidelines must be adhered to. The associations rule that a person must join the club after 4 visits in anyone year would breach this warranty.

I trust this has answered your question without being to complicated.







Dear Your Say,

I write as a Bendigo CTC safety officer to bring to the attention of all shooters of a seemingly convenient habit and potentially fatal accident that could happen as a result.

I was alerted to a young shooter unable to close his gun because the cartridge would not go into the chamber far enough. To cure the problem he was thumping the shell with his hand to force it in. My immediate thought was that a reloader had not resized the shell, but it eventuated that the shooter was in the habit of keeping a few loose coins in his gun case so that he always had coins for practice. Inevitably a \$2 coin ended up in the chamber and was blocking the cartridge. Luckily the gun would not close and a fatality did not happen. Had the forcing cones been lengthened, the coin would not have been detected and we can't afford to lose shooters like that.

So I urge shooters to try a \$2 coin in a gun and after you remove it, you should feel sick enough in the stomach to remember it for the rest of your life, and warn your mates of the danger as well. Coins in a gun case are an accident waiting to happen. Safety is everyone's responsibility and we all have a duty of care.

The adventures of a couple of ordinary blokes in the Eastern Riverina
